THE SERIES

STORYLINES

- Penn State (10-8, 1-4 B1G) has its second road game of the week, traveling to Northwestern for an 8:30 p.m. ET Saturday matchup on ESPN2.
- The Nittany Lions, who had three of their first five Big Ten matchups vs. Top 25 foes, are coming off back-to-back losses to ranked teams. Northwestern has won each of its last two contests.
- Penn State has defeated NU on the road in two of the last three outings. This is the fourth-consecutive meeting to take place in Evanston and the sixth out of the last eight. The Wildcats will visit University Park March 3 for the first time since 2013 and just the third time since 2011.
- Three Nittany Lions are scoring in double-figures: Brandon Taylor (16.2 ppg), Shep Garner (14.6) and Payton Banks (10.8) with Taylor controlling the boards (6.0) and Garner also leading in assists (2.8).
- Brandon Taylor is one of just three Big Ten players to rank in the Top 15 in both scoring and rebounding. He became the 32nd Penn State player to pass the 1,000-point mark with his 18 points vs. Michigan Jan. 2. and now has 1,061 over his four-year career to rank No. 24 all-time.

CHAMBERS AVAILABILITY

All interview requests for head coach Patrick Chambers should be directed to Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office. Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Alissa Clendenen. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8. Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Alissa Clendenen one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided one phone line and one ISDN line.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

The Wildcats enter Saturday with a 15-3 overall record and a 3-2 mark in the Big Ten after a 70-65 win over Wisconsin at home Tuesday. They have won each of their last two games after falling to Maryland and Ohio State in back-to-back games at home. Northwestern opened the league slate with four of its first six games in Welsh-Ryan Arena, traveling only to Nebraska and Minnesota to date.

Bryan McIntosh leads four scorers in double-figures with 16.1 points per game to go with a Big Ten-leading 7.1 assists per contest. Tre Demps (14.0), Alex Olah (12.8) and Derek Pardon (10.3) are also producing an average above 10 ppg. Led by Aaron Falzon's 40, three NU players have 30 or more 3-pointers on the season. The Wildcats average 9.1 treys per game and are 8-0 on the season when converting on 10 or more.

SERIES HISTORY

- » This is the 44th meeting between the teams with Penn State owning a 28-16 advantage in the all-time series. The Nittany Lions also lead 12-10 all-time when playing in Evanston.
- » This is the fourth-consecutive meeting to take place in Evanston and the sixth out of the last eight. The Wildcats will visit University Park March 3 for the first time since 2013 and just the third time since 2011.
- » PSU has defeated NU on the road in two of the last three outings.

CURRENT ROSTER VS. NORTHWESTERN

LAST TIME VS. THE WILDCATS

EVANSTON, Ill. (Feb. 21, 2015) - The Nittany Lions fell to Northwestern 60-39 in a game where they struggled from the field. Geno Thorpe scored 13 points for Penn State, which scored a season-low point total and shot a season-low 27 percent. D.J. Newbill, the Big Ten's leading scorer at 21.1 points per game, finished with three points on 1-for-6 shooting and nine rebounds. He scored his first points on a 3 with 1:25 remaining to cut the lead to 56-39. Vic Law scored 17 points, Tre Demps added 16 for Northwestern.

NOTABLE GAMES IN THE SERIES

Feb. 25, 2012 (NU, 67-66): The Lions held a one-point lead for much of the final 2:48 until a foul call sent John Shurna to the free throw line with :03 to play. Shurna hit both to seal the win for the Wildcats, who hit 15 free throws in the contest.

Feb. 28, 2010 (PSU, 79-60): Talor Battle had 16 points to lead Penn State to what was the Lions' largest margin of victory since 2007. They shot 68 percent in the first half and ended the night at 57 percent.

Jan. 28, 2004 (PSU, 63-61-OT): The last of five overtime games between the teams went to Penn State when Marlon Smith posted 23 points and Ndu Egekeze converted on a lay-up with :01 remaining in the extra period.

UP NEXT

Penn State hosts Wisconsin at 8 p.m. Thursday in the Bryce Jordan Center in the lone home game in a five-contest stretch. The Nittany Lions have at least two-consecutive road/neutral league contests four times in the 18-game league slate with a stretch of seven out of the first 10 away from University Park.

LAST TIME OUT » Vince Edwards scored 19 points, Isaac Haas had 14 and Caleb Swanigan added 13 as No. 24 Purdue defeated Penn State 74-57 Wednesday night at Mackey Arena. Penn State was led by Brandon Taylor, who finished with 21 points despite playing most of the second half in foul trouble. Donovan Jack scored 12 in the Nittany Lions' second straight loss. The Boilermakers finished the first half on a 10-3 run to build a 38-25 lead, then opened the second half on an 8-3 spurt to make it 46-28 with 17:09 to play, sealing the outcome. [BOX/NOTES: Page 40]

SO5 » According to ESPN RPI figures, Penn State's conference strength of schedule is third in the league, trailing only Iowa and Illinois who have played just four conference games to date. The Nittany Lions have played three ranked teams within the first five games of the Big Ten season.

ELITE COMPANY » Brandon Taylor is one of just four players in the Big Ten to rank in the Top 15 of both scoring (7th) and rebounding (14th), joining Iowa's Jarrod Uthoff, Michigan State's Denzel Valentine and Wisconsin's Nigel Hayes.

1,000-POINT SCORER » Brandon Taylor became the 32nd Penn State player all-time to pass the 1,000-point mark when he scored 18 against Michigan Jan. 2. He has 1,061 career points and is ranked No. 24 on the Penn State all-time scoring chart. [Page 28]

TAYLOR TRANSFORMATION » Brandon Taylor has more 2-point buckets (79) this season than all of last year (55) and has converted on more than twice as many free throws (63) than were even attempted (30) last season. He is shooting 71 percent from charity stripe, as opposed to 63.3 percent as a junior.

BANK ON IT » Payton Banks is third on the team in scoring with 10.8 ppg, showing the biggest increase in scoring among members of the team last year (+9.1 ppg). He has produced double-figure scoring in all but six games this season after tallying career-high point (24), field goal (8), free throw (6) and steal (3) totals against Minnesota (1/5).

ROAD WARRIORS » Penn State embarks on back-to-back road trips this week, taking on No. 24 Purdue and Northwestern. The Nittany Lions will play seven of its first 10 league games away from home, including back-to-back road or neutral games four times in that stretch.

VS. RANKED TEAMS » The Nittany Lions are 0-3 vs. teams ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting this season, falling to No. 4 Maryland and No. 5 Michigan State and No. 24 Purdue within the first five Big Ten games. Including Wednesday vs. Purdue, the Lions have eight games scheduled against teams either ranked in the Top 25 or receiving votes in the current polls.

LESS THAN 70 » The Nittany Lions are 6-0 when holding their opponents below 70 points this season. Opponents average 61.8 points in PSU wins with Penn State outscoring them by 8.1 points.

UNDER 40 PERCENT » Seven of Penn State's 10 wins this season have come when holding opponents below 40 percent shooting. Foes are shooting at a 36 percent clip in PSU victories with the Nittany Lions hitting 42 percent of shots in the same games. Penn State holds a 43-17 record under head coach Patrick Chambers when limiting opponents to a sub-40 percent field-goal percentage, and a 7-2 mark this season, after the losses to Colorado and Maryland.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES » Brandon Taylor tallied his third double-double of the year against Maryland Dec. 30 with 15 points and 10 rebounds. He previously tallied double-doubles vs. Eastern Michigan Dec. 5 with career highs in points (27) and rebounds (12) and Bucknell (19/11). His previous double-double was vs. Drexel last season (12/20/14) with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

LINEUPS » Penn State has used four different starting lineup combinations this season and over 70 in-game combinations. The lineup of Shep Garner, Josh Reaves, Payton Banks, Brandon Taylor and Jordan Dickerson started in nine games this season. [Page 11]

BOSTON THREE PARTY » Shep Garner's performance at Boston College Dec. 2 produced eight 3-pointers, the second-most in a single game for a Nittany Lion in program history, trailing just Pete Lisicky's nine tallied vs. Penn in 1996. The effort tied the Conte Forum record, set previously by two players.

COMEBACK » Penn State battled back from a 17-point deficit against Drexel Dec. 19 in Philadelphia, its largest comeback for a win in at least 15 years. Since the 2000-01 season, the Nittany Lions have come back from at least 14 points down to win 10 times, three under head coach Patrick Chambers.

CENTURY MARK » Brandon Taylor played in his 100th career game against Bucknell Nov. 28 and has now seen action in 114. He has started 91 games, the most of any current Nittany Lion, and is averaging 9.2 points per game over his four-year career. Donovan Jack saw action in his 100th career game against Michigan Jan. 2 (103). He has 42 career starts over his four-yr career with a scoring average of 4.2 ppg.

B1G OPENERS » Penn State is 7-17 in conference lidlifters with the last opener win coming Dec. 27, 2010 at Indiana, 69-60. This was the sixth time in the last seven years the Nittany Lions have opened the conference slate on the road and the second-consecutive season they have done so vs. the No. 4 team in the country.

CLOSE CALLS » Penn State's four-point win over Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 12 was the eighth-consecutive win in non-conference play decided by five points or fewer, dating back to last season. The Nittany Lions had six non-conference games separated by 1-5 points in 2014-15, winning each of them, and are 2-0 so far this season, also winning vs. Bucknell (62-58). The loss to Colorado ended that streak.

SINGLE-DIGIT SEPARATION » Penn State is 7-2 this season in games separated by nine or fewer points after defeating Minnesota by nine, 86-77. The losses came within a span of three games, vs. Colorado (-1) and at Maryland (-6). Last season, the Nittany Lions had 24 of 34 games decided by single-digits with the team going 13-11 in those contests (8-1 in non-conference play).

WEST COAST LOVE » The two games in Las Vegas as part of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic were the first trip to the Pacific Time Zone for the Nittany Lions since playing in the Golden Bear Classic to close out the non-conference slate during 2001-02 season. They defeated Coppin State, 66-49, Dec. 28 before falling to host Cal, 76-73, Dec. 29.

EARLY-SEASON TOURNEYS » Penn State is 76-89 in early-season tournaments after going 3-1 in the Las Vegas Classic to finish in third. The Lions have participated in at least one each season since 1981 and have captured 10 tourney championships, 12 second-place and 27 third-place finishes.

IN THE CHALLENGE » With the win over Boston College Dec. 2, Penn State moves to 6-3 in its last nine Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and has won four of its last five Big Ten/ACC Challenge road games. The Lions hold a 7-8 record in 15 Challenge appearances.

SEASON NOTES

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SUITS AND SNEAKERS

Head coach Patrick Chambers will don suits and sneakers for every game during the 2015-16, in honor of the 20th season of Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State. The school's chapter of CVC is consistently ranks among the Top 10 CVC organizations in the nation. It was started in 1995 under then head coach Bruce Parkhill and raises funds to support the American Cancer Society as well as the Bob Perks Fund (BPF), a local initiative that provides direct support for community members and families fighting cancer. Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State has raised nearly \$2.5 million to date through a series of year-round events. To get involved please visit CVC.PENNSTATE.ORG or call 814-234-1023.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Penn State basketball program recently moved into new training table and video room facilities in the Bryce Jordan Center. The \$1.2 million project was propelled by a generous gift from Peter and Ann Tombros and allows the Nittany Lions to utilize state of the art technologies. The concourse of the BJC also got a makeover in the offseason, and features Nittany and Lady Lion basketball graphics surrounding the circumference, as well as at the main entrances.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players – Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack - were selected team captains for the season by a player vote. Combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, the group makes up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reaves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zengulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reaves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reaves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zengulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson entered the season tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor was 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. In the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State took part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas, falling to Colorado by one, 71-70, before defeating Kent State, 75-69, in the consolation game. Each team played four games in the Classic – the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series. The Lions finished the tourney 3-1.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

TWENTY SEASONS IN THE BJC

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.

120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, who they will face for the fourth-consecutive season and the 102nd time overall. Penn State has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 27 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

SEASON OPENERS

Penn State has won its last 11 season openers dating to 2005, including all five under Patrick Chambers. The Lions are 89-30 overall in season openers and 79-10 in home season openers.

Penn State men's basketball coach Patrick Chambers inked the highest-rated recruiting class in program history, signing four standout players to NCAA Letters of Intent to play for the Nittany Lions on Nov. 11.

Nazeer Bostick, Tony Carr and Lamar Stevens, all products of Philadelphia's Roman Catholic and AAU Team Final, along with Oak Hill/DC Premier export Joe Hampton will join the Penn State squad for the 2016-17 season. Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Is the youngest of 12 children
- Has 3 of 11 siblings who graduated from Penn State.
- Spent 10 years as a highly-successful salesman and part owner of his family's printing business in Philadelphia.
- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

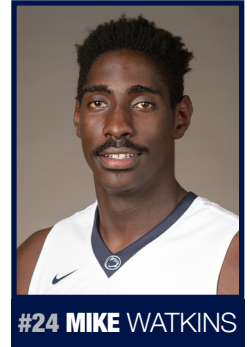
