SETTING THE SCENE

- » Penn State men's lacrosse is set to open the 2016 Big Ten conference slate on the road, traveling to Ohio State to square off against the Buckeyes Sunday, April 3 at noon on ESPNU.
- » The Nittany Lions improved to 6-3 on the year last week, defeating then-No. 1 Denver, 15-10 in Dallas, Texas to capture the 2016 Patriot Cup. The victory marked the program's first win over a No. 1 ranked opponent and also snapped the Pioneers' 20-game win streak.
- » Following a career-high outing against top-ranked Denver, sophomore Ryan Keenan earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. Keenan was one of two Nittany Lions to register a hat trick in the win against Denver, adding two assists for a career-high five points.
- » Penn State owns a 13-6 record in the all-time series against the Buckeyes, but is 0-1 in conference action following last year's inaugural Big Ten lacrosse matchup. Three of the last six meetings between the two teams have gone into an overtime period, with all six outings decided by just under two goals per game (1.8).
- » Having notched at least five assists in all but one game this season, Penn State is averaging 7.89 assists per game, which ranks seventh nationally and second in the Big Ten conference.
- » Both Nick Aponte and Grant Ament have double figure goals and assists. With one assist in all but one game this season, Aponte has totaled 15 helpers, dishing out at least two in three of the last four outings.
- » Saturday's matchup marks the start of the Creator's Trophy competition, an annual contest featuring the first three Big Ten member schools to start lacrosse (Penn State, Ohio State, Michigan). The trophy is presented when a team is 2-0 against the other schools - no trophy is awarded if programs are 1-1. The Buckeyes captured last year's trophy.

CREATOR'S TROPHY ENTERS YEAR FIVE

Penn State, Michigan and Ohio State compete for the Creator's Trophy, an annual award presented when a team is 2-0 against one of the other programs. The trophy was created to honor the rivalries among the first three Big Ten lacrosse schools at the time Michigan added the sport in 2012. Today, Native Americans still refer to lacrosse as "The Creator's Game," as the trophy is intended to pay homage to the heritage and rivalries of the Big Ten schools. PSU won the 2012 and 2014 titles, while OSU earned the trophy in 2013 and 2015.

KEENAN PICKS UP BIG TEN AWARD

Following a career-high outing against top-ranked Denver, sophomore Ryan Keenan earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. The award is the first of Keenan's career, as he shares it with Maryland's Connor Kelly this week.

Keenan was one of two Nittany Lions to register a hat trick in Penn State's 15-10 win against the top-ranked Pioneers last weekend. He also dished out two assists for a career-high five points in the victory. With multi-goal outings in two of the last four games, Keenan has totaled six goals in the span, as well as four assists, averaging 2.25 points per game in the four-game stretch.

NITTANY LIONS UPSET NO. 1 DENVER

Penn State put an end to a 20-game Denver winning streak, upsetting the top-ranked Pioneers, 15-10, to capture the 2016 Patriot Cup at SMU's Gerald Ford Stadium last weekend. The Nittany Lion victory marks the first win over a No. 1 ranked opponent in Penn State program history. Penn State is now 3-0 on the year against ranked teams at the time of meeting.

Junior Dan Craig and sophomore Ryan Keenan powered a group of five Nittany Lions with multi-goal outings, scoring a pair of hat tricks. Penn State out-shot the Pioneers 33-26, putting 23 shots on goal to Denver's 16. Penn State also won the ground ball battle, 31-27 as Billy Lombardi finished 13-for-28 from the faceoff "x."

After trailing in the first quarter, Penn State used a six-goal surge to enter halftime leading, 8-6.

The Nittany Lions out-scored the Pioneers 4-1 in the third quarter to build the lead to as many as five, 15-7. Denver looked to get back on track with three goals in the final four minutes, but Penn State held off the pressure to secure the win.

LENDING A HELPING HAND

Having notched at least five assists in all but one game this season, Penn State is averaging 7.89 assists per game, which ranks seventh nationally and second in the Big Ten conference.

Both Nick Aponte and Grant Ament have double figure goals and assists. With one assist in all but one game this season, Aponte has totaled 15 helpers, dishing out at least two in three of the last four outings. Leading the team with 20 assists, Ament's averaging 2.22 per game, which ranks 11th nationally and second in the conference. Ament's 20:8 assist-to-turnover ratio ranks second among a group of 13 NCAA DI players with at least 20 assists on the year.

THE THIRD QUARTER

Penn State is outscoring its opponents 32-23 in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions have also held both No. 18 Cornell and No. 8 Harvard without a goal in the third frame, on the way to wins against both teams. Most recently, Penn State out-scored No. 1 Denver 4-1 in the third frame, to build a five-goal lead. Against the Crimson, the Nittany scored back-to-back goals in the third quarter within exactly two minutes of each other, holding Harvard without a goal in the frame. On the offensive side, PSU used a nine-goal showing the third quarter at Furman to secure a comfortable second half lead that led to a 16-7 win.

SUTTON STEPPING IT UP

Since entering the starting lineup for the first time this season at Penn, junior midfielder Mike Sutton has stepped up his offensive production for the Nittany Lions. Sutton logged his first hat trick of the season with three goals in the opening quarter against UMass and scored once against No. 1 Denver to stretch his streak to four straight games with at least on goal. He's also notched multi-goal performances in three of the last four games.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE BUCKEYES

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

Ohio State enters the weekend having wrapped up non-conference play with a 5-5 mark, having lost each of its last four straight. Austin Shanks is currently atop the team standings with 24 points, including 11 goals and 13 assists. Carter Brown is leading the team with 13 goals. At the faceoff "x," Jake Withers is 117-197, with a team-high 78 ground balls.

SERIES HISTORY vs. OHIO STATE

Penn State owns a 13-6 record in the all-time series against the Buckeyes, but is 0-1 in conference action following last year's inaugural Big Ten lacrosse matchup. Three of the last six meetings between the two teams have gone into an overtime period, with all six outings decided by just under two goals per game (1.8).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State scored half of its goals in the fourth quarter of the program's first Big Ten lacrosse game, but the Nittany Lions were unable to get past No. 16/15 Ohio State, 10-8.

Mike Sutton scored led a group of seven goal-scorers with two goals. On the defensive side, James Burke and Drake Kreinz posted four ground balls each. OSU out-shot PSU 32-28 and won the ground ball battle, 23-20. Penn State went 12-10 from the faceoff "x" led by an 11-8 showing from Kreinz.

The Buckeyes jumped out to a 5-1 lead after the first quarter to take over the lead. Penn State struggled to settle in to an offensive rhythm, before scoring four goals in the fourth quarter to arrive within two, 10-8.

GOALS ON GOALS ON GOALS

Penn State is outscoring its opponents 114-96 on the year, with a scoring offense that's ranked 12th nationally and second in the Big Ten conference, averaging 12.67 goals per game. Penn State's .374 shot percentage is also slotted third nationally and first in the conference.

Penn State has scored at least 10 goals in five of nine games this season, at 5-0 in outings with 10 or more goals. The Nittany Lions are also 3-0 on the year when limiting their opponent to less than 10 goals per game.

Penn State scored 37 goals in just the first two games of the season, marking the most amount of goals in the first two games of the season in program history. The 37 goals were the most since Penn State scored 36 in the first two games of the 1987 season and the first 30-plus scoring through two games since the Nittany Lions had 33 goals in 2013.

FORCE OF THE FROSH

Through nine games, the Nittany Lion newcomers have continued to make their mark, contributing 31 goals and 27 assists for nearly 32 percent of the team's total point scoring this year.

At least one freshman has scored in all nine games this season for the Nittany Lions. Kevin Hill logged his second multi-goal outing at Furman after scoring his first two collegiate goals against Villanova.

In the road-win at Cornell, Grant Ament logged his third multi-assist outing, leading the team with two helpers. Ament has scored at least one goal in each of the last six straight games, netting two in the win against No. 1 Denver and tallying four assists against UMass. Against Hobart, Ament recorded his first collegiate hat trick with three goals against Hobart, while also tallying a pair of assists for a team-high five points. Chris Sabia also led the team with three caused turnovers.

All 16 Nittany Lion rookies saw action in Penn State's 2016 season-opening victory against Robert Morris. Making the most of their debuts, a total of six newcomers combined for seven goals and six assists. Defensively, Sabia made his first collegiate start at defense, tallying three ground balls. Trevor Scollins also saw action in goal, notching two saves in 10:50 seconds between the pipes.

SANDERS NEARING ANOTHER MILESTONE

With a team-high four goals in Penn State's win against Robert Morris, senior TJ Sanders notched his 100th career goal to join an elite group as just the seventh Nittany Lion all-time to amass 100 career goals. As the first Nittany Lion to hit the mark since Jack Forster in 2013, he needs 11 more goals to tie for first all-time. Sanders has scored at least two goals in all but two games this season.

SOLIDIFYING THE ATTACK UNIT

Penn State's starting attack unit consisting of veterans TJ Sanders and Nick Aponte and freshman Grant Ament has combined for 45 goals and 45 assists, for just under 50 percent of the team's total point-scoring this year.

Leading the team with 20 goals, Sanders has proven to be the top goal scorer among the trio, with Ament and Aponte posting at least 10 goals and 15 assists, serving as a duo that can successfully distribute and finish.

In the last three games, the trio has logged 15 goals and 18 assists for 33 of the team's 63 points during the stretch, that included wins over two Top 10 teams. Ament notched at least two goals in all three games during the stretch, while Sanders had a hat trick against then-No. 8 Harvard before registering two goals vs. then-No. 1 Denver.

DUO EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

After helping Penn State to a pair of wins at Furman and against No. 8 Harvard, sophomore Will Schreiner and freshman Grant Ament earned Big Ten Weekly awards. Schreiner earns his second career Big Ten Co-Specialist of the Week nod, while Ament also picks up his second career Big Ten Freshman of the Week laurel. The pair of awards marks the sixth time a Nittany Lion has been selected for a Big Ten weekly honor this season.

Schreiner averaged 9.5 saves per game for the Nittany Lions in a 2-0 week that featured wins at Furman and against No. 8/7 Harvard. After recording nine saves in the win against the Paladins, he led the team with a career-high 10 saves in a thrilling overtime win over the Crimson.

Ament finished second on the team with eight points during the undefeated week, as one of two Nittany Lions to total five assists across both outings. He dished out two assists at Furman, adding one goal. Against Harvard, he logged three assists and scored two goals, marking his fifth straight game with at least one goal.

APONTE LEADS PSU PAST NO. 8 HARVARD IN OT

Behind junior Nick Aponte's game winning goal, Penn State knocked off No. 8/7 Harvard 13-12, for a thrilling overtime victory last week. A total of eight Nittany Lions found the scoring column, led by hat tricks from Aponte and senior TJ Sanders.

Sophomore Josh Wellman highlighted the game with a career-high outing from the faceoff "x," winning 18-of-29 attempts, while also collecting 10 ground balls. Penn State shot out to a 6-3 lead in the first quarter before allowing a 5-2 Harvard run. The Nittany Lions held the Crimson without a goal in the third quarter as Mike Sutton and Dan Craig scored back-to-back goals, but Harvard battled back with four straight to tie the score, 12-12, forcing overtime.

Penn State held off early pressure from the Crimson in the opening part of the overtime period, but Ament found Aponte for the game winner with 2:59 remaining to secure the win.

2016 PENN STATE MEN'S LACROSSE

A FAST START

Following Penn State's 8-7 win on the road at No. 18 Cornell, the Nittany Lions improved to 3-0 on the year, marking the best start for the program since 2002. The 3-0 start to the 2016 season marked a first for head coach Jeff Tambroni, who has directed the Nittany Lions to back-to-back wins in the first two weeks of the season twice in the last four years. Penn State is presently 6-3 after the first nine games for the second time under head coach Jeff Tambroni and first since 2013.

SCHREINER EARNS BIG TEN LAUREL

Penn State's Will Schreiner earned Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors after helping direct the Nittany Lions to their third straight victory on the road at No. 18/15 Cornell. He becomes the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors. Schreiner logged seven saves in Penn State's thrilling 8-7 victory against the Big Red, marking the team's first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season. He registered three saves in the fourth quarter alone, including one huge save in the final minute of the game to keep the Nittany Lions on top for the win. He also led the team with three ground balls.

POLL POSITIONING

Since entering both the USILA Coaches Poll and the Inside Lacrosse Media Polls, the Nittany Lions made significant movement in the poll. This week, Penn State moved back in to the Top 20, coming in at No. 18 in both polls.

The Nittany Lions opened the season receiving votes in both polls, working their way as high as No. 15/12 by the second week of the season. In total, Penn State has been ranked within the Top 20 in four of seven poll releases this season, having most recently spent last week receiving votes.

DUO NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

Penn State's Nick Aponte and TJ Sanders have been named to the 2016 Tewaaraton Award watch list. The Nittany Lion duo is among the top players across all three divisions of NCAA Lacrosse to be recognized as early contenders for the prestigious award, presented by Under Armour. The Tewaaraton Award, annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. On April 28, the field will be narrowed to 25 men's and 25 women's nominees.

PENN STATE HOLDS OFF CORNELL, 8-7

No. 20 Penn State held off No. 18 Cornell for a thrilling 8-7 victory on the road at Schoellkopf Field. The Big Red jumped out to a fast start, scoring two quick goals, including one just five seconds in to take over an early lead.

Mike Sutton and Matt Florence responded for the Nittany Lions to tie the score, 2-2 with 1:30 remaining in the first. Penn State and Cornell kept it close in the second quarter until the Big Red broke open the tied score with a goal to pull ahead 3-2 as time expired in the first half.

The Nittany Lions came out of the intermission firing, using a 5-0 scoring streak to take control. James Chakey opened the stretch, followed by back-to-back goals from TJ Sanders. Kevin Fox and Ryan Keenan followed with a pair of goals to widen the advantage to four, 7-3 with 2:41 left in the third quarter. The Big Red came storming back with four consecutive goals, scoring the last two 38 seconds apart to knot the score, 7-7 with 5:13 left in the game. Florence came through in the clutch with his second goal of the afternoon to send the Nittany Lions ahead for good, 8-7.

PENN STATE RALLIES PAST HOBART

Helped out by an offensive surge in the fourth quarter, Penn State rallied past Hobart to earn its second straight win. Penn State's offense fired on all cylinders in the fourth quarter as the Nittany Lions came from behind to close out the game with nine goals in 11 minutes to secure the win.

Grant Ament, TJ Sanders and Ryan Keenan led the team with three goals apiece. Both Keenan and Ament's multi-goal scoring outings marked career high efforts for the pair. Ament also added two assists to lead the team with five points.

Matt Florence and Dan Craig posted multi-goal outings, registering two goals each. Brian Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Billy Lombardi and Mike Sutton all logged one goal apiece to round out the balanced group of goal scorers.

AMENT EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

Penn State's Grant Ament earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after helping guide the Nittany Lions to a 20-7 victory against Robert Morris. Ament is the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and the fourth conference weekly award-winner all-time.

Ament recorded two goals and led the team with five assists for a seven-point outing in his collegiate debut in the Blue and White against the Colonials. He put away his first collegiate goal in the first quarter, just one minute after registering his first collegiate assist. After tallying four consecutive assists in the second quarter, he closed out the afternoon with Penn State's 17th goal of the game for a multi-goal outing against Robert Morris.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Penn State Lacrosse's expansive alumni base is bound to produce a few connections among current Nittany Lions, and this year's team is no exception. Matt Florence's father Tom was a goalie at Penn State from 1982-85. J.J. Pearl, who ranks fifth in career saves (557 from 1989-92), is also sophomore Hunter Pearl's father.

PENN STATE IN SEASON OPENERS

The Nittany Lions improved to 21-17 all-time after downing Robert Morris 20-7 in this year's 2016 season-opener. With the victory, Penn State has won each of its last four season opening games.

HOME SWEET HOME

The 2016 Penn State men's lacrosse schedule features double the home dates this season as the Nittany Lions are set to welcome eight opponents to University Park this year.

PSU hosts back-to-back games at home in the first two weeks of the season for the first time since 2014, hosting Robert Morris and Hobart. Other non-conference dates include Villanova (2/27), Harvard (3/12) and UMASS (3/19). The Big Ten slate is also set to take place mostly at home with Penn State hosting Maryland (4/10), Johns Hopkins (4/17) and Michigan (4/30).

PSU PICKED FOURTH IN BIG COACHES POLL

Penn State has been voted fourth in the 2016 Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll with Nittany Lions redshirt juniors Matt Florence, Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders named Penn State's Players to Watch. Johns Hopkins claimed the top spot in the 2016 poll with a unanimous selection from the league's head coaches. Maryland and Ohio State rounded out the top three at spots two and three, respectively. Michigan and Rutgers were selected fifth and sixth.

BIG TEN PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH

Redshirt seniors Matt Florence and Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders earned Penn State Big Ten Preseason Player to Watch honors. The preseason nod is the second straight for Kreinz and Sanders, who both earned 2015 Player to Watch honors prior to the first year of Big Ten lacrosse.

Florence earns his first career Big Ten preseason honor, having capped off the season with Big Ten All-Tournament team honors. A 2015 Academic All-Big Ten selection, Kreinz served once again as Penn State's top faceoff specialist in 2015, playing in 13 of 14 games. A USILA All-America honorable mention, Sanders returns as one of the Nittany Lions' top offensive contributors in 2016, having earned both All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction and Academic All-Big Ten awards last year.

TRIO TO LEAD AS 2016 CAPTAINS

A trio of midfielders will lead the team during its 2016 campaign. Seniors Tommy O'Neill and James Burke and redshirt junior Drake Kreinz have been voted as captains. The process for choosing captains has remained unchanged for years and Jeff Tambroni is confident in the system he has in place.

"There are a number of different factors going into the captains process," Tambroni said. "One is a consensus vote from last years team, we want to get exiting seniors, graduating seniors opinions on who they believe will lead this team most effectively."

After the team vote, Tambroni and fellow assistant coaches evaluate upperclassmen during the fall semester before making a final decision. Penn State men's lacrosse has experimented with the number of captains the team has every year. In 2014 three seniors led the team but in 2015 the task fell solely on senior Kyle Zittel.

TAMBRONI SIGNS 11 TO NLI

Jeff Tambroni has announced the signing of 11 newcomers to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. From U.S. Lacrosse All-Americans and MVPs to state champions and honor roll athletes, this year's class features a talented group poised to join the team in 2016.

Three of the signees are ranked within Inside Lacrosse's list of top 25 recruits with Arceri ranked No. 11, O'Keefe tabbed No. 23 and McEvoy slotted No. 25.

SNAPSHOT: LOOKING BACK AT 2015

2015 was a historic season for Penn State men's lacrosse as the team kicked off its first official year of participation in the Big Ten conference. The Nittany Lions opened the season with a non-conference upset win over No. 16/11 Penn and earned a pair of Big Ten wins over Rutgers and Michigan to qualify for the first ever Big Ten Tournament.

WHO'S BACK?

Penn State returns nearly all of its offensive production from last year, including Nittany Lion top scorer and USILA All-America honorable mention, TJ Sanders, who led the team with 29 goals and 13 assists in 2015 for a team-high 42 points. Mike Sutton also joins Sanders as one of two 20-plus goal scorers from last year. Sutton closed out the year second on the team with 24 goals, including eight multi-goal outings. Both Sanders and Sutton both earned 2015 All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction.

Another top returner at attack is Nick Aponte, who transitioned from midfield to attack late in 2015 season. Prior to the move, Penn State averaged 8.9 goals per game, but since transitioning in the first meeting against Johns Hopkins (4/17), the team improved to 10.33 goals per game, with Aponte highlighting the remainder of the season with three goals and one assist for four points in a close 10-9 victory against Michigan.

In the midfield, Penn State returns Big Ten All-Tournament Team honoree Matt Florence, who finished third on the team with 16 goals in 2015. Also moving positions last year and returning is Dan Craig, who transitioned from attack to the midfield mid-year. He scored 11 goals and finished second on the team with nine assists. Craig also enters the 2016 season with at least one goal in the last four consecutive games. Other returners at midfield include Brian Prestreau and Chris Young. Prestreau saw action in 13 of 14 games, notching five goals including one in each of the last two games of the season.

At defensive midfield, the Nittany Lions have a veteran crew of seniors: James Burke, Tommy O'Neill and James Chakey, with Burke at the longstick. Burke registered a team-high 12 caused turnovers to go along with 34 ground balls. Defensively speaking, Penn State has Peter Triolo returning at close defense, who played in 13 games, starting the final 10.

Penn State is also solid at the faceoff "X" with returner Drake Kreinz who finished 129-237 on the year with a .544 winning clip.

WHO'S GONE?

Penn State is tasked with replacing standout goalie Connor Darcey, who passed away suddenly last summer. Darcey played all 14 games, recorded 176 saves with a .553 save percentage on the year. The Nittany Lions also saw departures from defenseman JP Burnside and Pat Manley at attack. Manley played in 13 of 14 games, tallying 12 goals and six assists for 18 points.

WHO'S NEW?

Ranked No.12 nationally by Inside Lacrosse, Penn State welcomes 16 newcomers in its freshmen class this year. The class includes five All-Americans, eight all-conference honorees, three all-league picks and a Canadian national champion. Defenseman Tommy Wright was slotted No. 12 in Inside Lacrosse's Power 100 Freshman Rankings while attackman Grant Ament came in at No. 31. Midfielder Drew Petkevich was slotted No. 67, while Kevin Hill (midfield) and Robby Black (midfield) rounded out the group at No. 81 and No. 93, respectively.

Penn State returns home from its two-week road trip next week to host No. 6/5 Maryland in its Big Ten home opener Sunday, April 10. The evening matchup will broadcast live on the Big Ten Network at 7 p.m. ET.

After guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni returns for his sixth season as Penn State's head coach in 2016.

Tambroni guided the Nittany Lions through a historic season in 2015 that brought Penn State's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament following the first ever season of Big Ten lacrosse. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 14 in the USILA DI Preseason Coaches' Poll and knocked off No. 16/11 Penn during the 2015 season. Tambroni also led Penn State to its first two Big Ten conference victories as well as a berth to the conference tournament. He also mentored rising senior TJ Sanders to USILA All-America honorable mention honors.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins from March through May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.

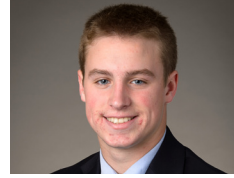

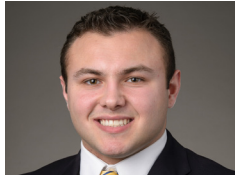

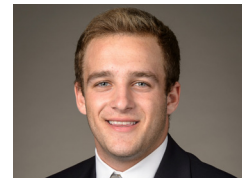

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State kicked off the 2016 season with a dominant 20-7 victory against Robert Morris Saturday afternoon at Holuba Hall.

"We're thrilled," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "I thought our guys came out of the locker room and from the start of the game at the first whistle they played a very inspired game of lacrosse and gained a ton of momentum in the second and third quarter."

Penn State jumped out to an early lead in the first quarter as Matt Florence found the back of the net off an assist from Nick Aponte less than two minutes into the game to spark a 5-0 scoring streak. Aponte, Grant Ament, James Chakey and Brain Prestreau all added goals during the stretch.

Looking to spark some momentum, Robert Morris' Eric Rankel popped in a goal to cut the Nittany Lion advantage to four with less than two minutes remaining. Florence answered with his second goal of the quarter to send Penn State ahead 6-1 at the end of the frame.

The Colonials opened the second quarter with a goal from JonPatrick Kealey to trim the gap back to four, 6-2. Penn State came storming back with 11 consecutive goals spanning the remainder of the second quarter and into the third to surge ahead by as many as 15, 17-2.

TJ Sanders kicked off the scoring streak with back-to-back goals, scoring his first on an extra-man opportunity after the Colonials were whistled for cross-checking. Sanders powered the charge with a total of four goals in the offensive push, while Mike Sutton, Aponte, Florence, Robby Black, Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Ament all chipped in a goal apiece to bolster the lead.

Robert Morris looked to halt the momentum with a pair of goals from Luke Laszkiewicz, 17-4, with 5:09 left in the third but the rookie duo featuring Nick Spillane and Jimmy Nowoswiat answered with a pair of goals to push Penn State up 19-4 at the end of the third quarter.

Just a few minutes into the fourth quarter, Matt Donnelly put away his first collegiate goal to give the Nittany Lions their largest lead of the game, 20-4. The Colonials looked to rebound with three consecutive goals, but could not recover as the Nittany Lions claimed a 20-7 win as time expired.

NOTES: The Nittany Lions put up 20 goals for the first time since downing Michigan 22-7, Feb. 8 2014 ... Penn State improves to 21-17 all-time in season-openers and 11-5 when playing at home ... PSU is also 5-1 in yearly openers under the direction of sixth year head coach Jeff Tambroni ... Penn State improves to 2-2 in the all-time series against Robert Morris and 2-1 when playing at home ... Sanders' four goals are the most for a Nittany Lion since Pat Manley had four at Johns Hopkins April 11, 2015.

Penn State (4-2) and Furman went back and forth in the first quarter until Hill broke open the scoring for the Nittany Lions with an extra-man goal with 7:32 remaining in the stanza. Sutton picked up the ball and shot again, finding the back of the net for the second time for a 9-3 Penn State lead.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Behind Nick Aponte's game winning goal, Penn State knocked off No. 8/7 Harvard 13-12, for a thrilling overtime victory Saturday afternoon at the Penn State Lacrosse Field.

With Harvard leading 2-0 early in the game, Aponte sparked a 6-1 scoring streak to send the Nittany Lions into the second quarter leading 6-3. The Crimson looked to hold off the run with a goal following Aponte's first of the game, but two more from Sanders and one from Hill, Florence and Ament rounded out the strike for the Nittany Lions.

Penn State continued its momentum into the second quarter as Wellman won the faceoff and charged straight for the net, scoring his first collegiate goal to lift the Nittany Lions up by four, 7-3 with 14:51 remaining in the first half. Ament added another to widen the PSU scoring streak to seven straight, as Penn State pulled ahead by as many as five, 8-3, with 9:57 left in the second quarter.

Harvard came storming back, using a 5-2 run to cut the Penn State advantage back to two, 10-8, scoring two of the goals in the span within the last 2:20 seconds of the half.

The Nittany Lions held the Crimson without a goal in the third quarter as Sutton and Craig scored back-to-back goals within exactly two minutes of each other to build the Penn State advantage back to four, 12-8, with 7:30 remaining in the third quarter.

Penn State could not shake the Crimson for good, as Harvard held Penn State without a goal for 23:30, scoring four goals in the fourth quarter to tie the score, 12-12, with 4:04 remaining in regulation. The two teams exchanged turnovers for one last shot at possession within the final minute of play, but neither squad put away a goal as time expired.

Penn State held off early pressure from the Crimson in the opening part of the overtime period, but Ament found Aponte for the game winner with 2:59 remaining to secure the win. Penn State held off the attempt as the Quakers came away with the win as time expired.

NOTES: Penn State moves to 2-0 on the year against ranked opponents, while also earning its first win over a Top 10 opponent since 2014 ... The Nittany Lions move to 2-1 in the all-time series against Harvard, picking up their first program win over the Crimson in history ... PSU improves to 4-0 on the year when scoring at least 10 goals ... Nick Aponte has now registered at least one point in 25 consecutive games dating back to April 5, 2014 ... TJ Sanders has also scored at least three goals in four games this season, with at least two in all but one of seven outings ... Josh Wellman highlighted the game with a career-high outing from the faceoff "x," winning 18-of-29 attempts, while also collecting 10 ground balls.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 20 Penn State fell short in an 11-9 loss to UMass Saturday afternoon at the Penn State Lacrosse Field.

"We put a lot of pressure on our defense today, again, and I credit UMass -- they did a really good job of being very deliberate in the offensive end and that put us in a very impatient state offensively," head coach Jeff Tambroni said.

Mike Sutton opened the scoring for the Nittany Lions, sending a rocket into the net to put Penn State on top, 1-0 with 11:46 remaining in the first quarter. The Minutemen answered back to even the score, 1-1, but Sutton spun around and hit the top right corner of the net for his second goal of the frame to lift Penn State ahead 2-1 with 5:18 left in the quarter. Grant Ament followed with another goal just 2:05 later to send the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 3-1.

UMass broke up the scoring streak with a goal with less than three minutes remaining in the first quarter. Penn State regrouped and responded with another goal from Sutton with 2:09 left on the clock in the first quarter, sending the Nittany Lions into the second quarter with a two-goal lead, 4-2.

The Minutemen opened the second quarter with back-to-back goals to tie the score, 4-4 with 10:45 remaining in the stanza. Ament looked to spark some momentum with his second goal of the afternoon, but UMass responded with two straight to take their first lead of the game, 6-5 with 1:18 remaining in the first half.

A pair of man-up goals from Kevin Hill and Brian Prestreau in the third quarter were not enough to get the Nittany Lions back on track as UMass added three more goals to widen the deficit to two, 9-7, heading into the final quarter.

The Minutemen scored two consecutive goals in the fourth quarter to pull ahead by as many as four, 11-7, with 11:09 remaining in the game. Aponte looked to open a scoring streak with a goal with 10:34 left in the quarter, but the Nittany Lions could not settle into a rhythm. Florence made one final attempt spark the comeback with a goal with 1:19 remaining, but UMass held off the pressure as time expired.

DALLAS - Penn State put an end to a 20-game Denver winning streak, upsetting the top-ranked Pioneers, 15-10, to capture the 2016 Patriot Cup at SMU's Gerald Ford Stadium.

"I think there are two sides to this, number one is just being very proud of the way our guys prepared coming out of last week's disappointing loss and just preparing the way they did showed great resiliency this week and great discipline throughout the course of today," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "But there is another side of perspective to this and that's our guys and our team needs to keep coming out of this, it was a week ago we lost one game and now we're coming off a very exciting win."

Prestreau opened the scoring for the Nittany Lions, putting his second straight man-up goal of the season in to the net to give Penn State an early lead, 1-0, with 12:58 left in the first quarter. The Pioneers answered back with a 3-0 streak to take over a two-goal lead, 3-1, with less than four minutes remaining in the frame. Sanders broke up the stretch with his first goal of the afternoon with 29 seconds left quarter to keep PSU within one, 3-2.

The Nittany Lions used back-to-back goals from Florence and Sanders in the second quarter, separated by just over a minute to go back up, 4-3. Denver looked to halt the run with a goal to even the score, 4-4, with 12:03 remaining in the first half. The Nittany Lions responded a 3-0 spurt featuring goals from Keenan, Craig and Hill to pull ahead by three, 7-4. The Pioneers followed with two goals in between one from Craig to arrive within two, 8-6 heading into the intermission.

Penn State used a dominating 4-1 stretch in the third quarter with two goals from Keenan and one from Ament and Craig to take control of a five-goal lead, 12-7 heading into the final stanza. The Nittany Lions also went 6-for-6 from the faceoff "x" in the third frame.

The Nittany Lions continued the momentum into the fourth quarter, as Florence, Sutton and Ament all scored unassisted to bolster the advantage to as many as eight, 15-7, with 4:13 remaining in the game. Denver looked to mount a comeback with three consecutive goals in the last four minutes of play, but Penn State held off the Pioneers to complete the upset.

NOTES: Penn State's win marks its first victory over a ranked opponent in program history ... The win is also the first win over a USILA top 5 team since February 22, 2014 when The Nittany Lions defeated No.4 Notre Dame on the road, 8-7... Ryan Keenan and Dan Craig both notched their first hat tricks of the season ... With two assists, Nick Aponte has now recorded at least one point in each of the last 27 consecutive games, dating back to April 5, 2014 ... The Nittany Lions are now 3-6 all-time against Denver, having earned their first win against the Pioneers since 2013 ... Penn State also improves to 3-0 on the year against ranked opponents and 5-0 when scoring 10 or more goals against a team.
