NOTES

PENN STATE SERIES PRIMER

Michigan and PSU will close out their regular season series in State College this weekend. The teams split back in December during PSU's annual visit to Yost, with the Wolverines winning on Friday (4-1) before falling on Saturday (1-3). Overall, U-M leads the series 16-13. Michigan is receiving votes in this week's USCHO poll after last weekend's sweep of Notre Dame while Penn State stays firm at #6 in the nation after defeating Robert Morris in Pittsburgh. U-M is in sixth place in the Big Ten entering this weekend, with 13 points to first place Penn State's 28.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Leading the way in scoring for Penn State are a trio of seasoned forwards in Nate Sucece (8-19-27), Evan Barratt (7-18-25), and Alex Limoges (7-10-17). The high-powered Nittany Lion offense, ranked second in the nation entering this weekend, also features a very deep supporting cast. Brandon Biro (18), Denis Smirnov (17), Sam Sternschein (16), Liam Folkes (16), and Arne Talvitie (15) all have 15 or more points on the season while 6'7" Nikita Pavylychev is a constant presence in front of the net.

On the blue line, Cole Hults has broken out on offense with a 4-15-19 scoring line while senior Kris Myllari has set the tone defensively with a team-leading 46 blocked shots. Minnesota transfer Clayton Phillips has also provided depth on the back end. In the blue paint, senior netminder Peyton Jones has been a constant presence while posting career-best numbers thus far with a 2.37 GAA and a .926 save percentage.

WEEKLY SPOTLIGHT

College Hockey News tabbed the University of Michigan as its "Team of the Week" following the Wolverines' sweep of Notre Dame last weekend in South Bend. U-M's two conference wins to kick off 2020 nearly doubled the team's BIG point total to 13, jumping Wisconsin to enter this series in 6th place.

SEEING STARS

Strauss Mann picked up several weekly honors following his stellar series between the pipes at Notre Dame. The sophomore was named the Big Ten hockey conference's weekly "First Star" before being tabbed as the country's "First Star of the Week" for all of college hockey by the NCAA in recognition of Mann's exquisite weekend (two wins, one shutout, and a .983 save percentage).

LAST TIME OUT (FRIDAY)

SOUTH BEND, Ind. -- Sophomore Strauss Mann made 32 saves for the University of Michigan ice hockey team as it blanked No. 14-ranked Notre Dame, 3-0, on Friday night (Jan. 10) at Compton Family Arena. It was the Wolverines' first shutout there since it opened in 2011. At 6:40 in the first period, he thwarted Mike O'Leary on a 2-on-1 with linemate Trevor Janicke, who made a pass to O'Leary on the right side and Mann made the slide in time to push the puck aside with his right pad.

Less than a minute later, Michigan got on the board as it converted on its first power-play opportunity at 7:04. Senior Nick Pastujov scored his second goal in as many games, and now has five on the season. The Wolverines moved the puck well on the man-advantage with the elder Pastujov scored the goal with his brother, junior Michael Pastujov, and freshman Eric Ciccolini earning the assists.

Mann closed out the first period with a series of highlight-reel saves before Jake Slaker was able to clear the puck out of the defensive zone.

Mann continued his solid play in the middle frame with a big stop on Cal Burke just 19 seconds into the period. Senior Will Lockwood had the team's best chance to score in the second period when he tried to bury a pass from Johnny Beecher, who came around the back of the goal and got his own rebound for a second-chance effort, both denied by Notre Dame goalie Cale Morris. The new line of Nick Granowicz, Beecher and Lockwood had a breakaway opportunity with Morris clamping down on Lockwood's try on the right side with three minutes left in the second.

In the third period, after the Wolverines killed off their third penalty of the game, Granowicz scored his first career goal with assists by Beecher and Lockwood to push Michigan ahead, 2-0, at the 1:47 mark. Morris was pulled for the extra attacker at 16:44, and after five saves by Mann, graduate student Jacob Hayhurst gained possession of the puck and made his way down the ice playing a give-and-go with Garrett Van Wyhe. Hayhurst buried the puck into the empty net for his second goal of the season to cap the scoring at 17:47 in the third period.

LAST TIME OUT (SATURDAY)

SOUTH BEND, Ind. -- Strauss Mann made 25 saves as the Michigan ice hockey team defeated No. 14-ranked Notre Dame, 3-1, on Saturday night (Jan. 11) at Compton Family Arena to complete a sweep of the Irish. The Wolverines earned a crucial six points over the weekend, and the sweep was their first on the road since January 2018 when a sweep at Minnesota propelled a run to the Frozen Four.

Notre Dame opened the game-two scoring less than two minutes into the game with an early deflection. With the puck at the left point, Mann was in position to make his first save before Graham Slaggert skated near the blue paint and redirected the point shot to flutter over Mann and into the back of the net. Slaggert's third goal of the season gave Notre Dame a 1-0 lead just 1:45 into the game. The Maize and Blue pressed throughout the first 20 minutes but could not tie the game before the first intermission.

The early portion of the second frame was marked by each team's third unsuccessful man-advantage opportunity, but the fourth power play turned out to be the charm for Michigan. Defenseman Nick Blankenburg quarterbacked the ensuing power play, waiting at the point for traffic to develop in front of the Irish net. Seconds later, Blankenburg unleashed a wrist shot through traffic labeled for the corner of the net to tie the game with 8:32 left in the second. Cam York picked up his sixth assist of the year on Blankenburg's third tally.

Five minutes later with Michigan channeling the momentum from their game-tying goal, Lockwood received the puck from Nick Granowicz and went on a skate around the Notre Dame zone. After swooping behind the net and gliding past the half-wall, Lockwood circled toward the Big Ten logo just inside the blue line. As he reached the center of the zone, he sent a perfectly placed backhand saucer pass through several defenders onto the tape of defenseman Jack Summers cutting toward the front of the net. Summers made a move to his backhand and finished a highlight-reel goal to put the Wolverines in front, 2-1, with 3:27 left in the middle frame. After two, Michigan held onto a one-goal lead while extending its advantage in shots to 28-16.

Early in the final period with U-M protecting a one-goal lead for the second consecutive night, Notre Dame thought it had the game-tying goal when an ND forward sent a wrist shot square off the right post. The puck then dribbled through the crease before being cleared away to safety by a retreating Michigan skater. With just under 90 seconds remaining in the game, the Notre Dame net was emptied as six UND skaters began to cycle the puck around the Michigan zone, pouring everything they had at Mann.

With time dwindling and three Big Ten points on the line, a loose puck in the Michigan crease was diverted away from danger by Blankenburg. Hayhurst received the cleared puck and quickly dished it back to Jake Slaker, waiting to fire the puck 150 feet down the ice toward the empty net. The gamble paid off as Slaker's heave found the back of the net with 20 seconds left to seal the series sweep. Mann made 25 saves and earned his ninth win of the season while U-M ended the game with 35 shots. With the weekend victories, Michigan has doubled its conference win total as it heads into next weekend's showdown against first-place Penn State.

MANN OF STEEL

Strauss Mann ranks ninth in the country in save percentage at .935, stopping 565 of 604 shots faced. He has three shutouts to his credit this season, tied for fifth in the nation, while his 1.90 GAA also has him at ninth.

PRESTIGE WORLDWIDE

Michigan's pair of first-round draft picks, Cam York and Johnny Beecher, missed the GII while representing the United States at this year's World Junior Championship. The pair were U-M's 50th & 51st participants.

SNIPING SLAKER

Senior Jake Slaker scored two goals in the GII semifinal against Ferris State, his first multi-goal game since November of 2018 when he potted two against Penn State. Slaker's 12 points (6-6--12) lead the team.

MILESTONE MARKER

Michigan earned its 600th all-time victory at Yost Ice Arena in a 4-0 victory over Lake Superior State on Oct. 18.

GOOD OLD HOCKEY BARN

Yost is tied with Baker Rink (Princeton) as the second oldest arena in college hockey, trailing only Northeastern's Matthews Arena. *Yost did not serve as a hockey rink until 1973

UP NEXT

Michigan will return to home ice next weekend with a single exhibition game on Saturday (Jan. 25) against the US National Team Development Program's U-18 squad. Puck drop is scheduled for 7:30 at Yost Ice Arena. The following weekend, the Wolverines will welcome Ohio State to Ann Arbor for a home series on Jan. 31 and Feb. 1.

COACH PEARSON

THE PEARSON FILE

- Mel Pearson was named the ninth head coach in University of Michigan hockey history on Monday, April 24, 2017.
- During his first season as the Michigan Head Coach, led the team to a 22-15-3 record, and a Frozen Four berth. He was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award.
- In that first campaign, the Wolverines only suffered losses to three teams following the annual Great Lakes Invitational that concluded January 2, 2018. Michigan won its last five regular season games in regulation before heading off to the Big Ten Tournament.
- Pearson led the Wolverines to an NCAA Northeast Regional Championship, defeating Northeastern and Boston University to return Michigan to the Frozen Four for a record 25th time.
- Pearson became the first coach in history to lead two different programs to NCAA Tournament berths in consecutive seasons and one of five coaches to lead a team to the Frozen Four in their first season at the helm in the past 20 years.
- Pearson returned to Ann Arbor following an impressive six-year stint as head coach at Michigan Tech. There, he led the Huskies to two NCAA Tournament appearances in his last three years while winning a WCHA regular-season title and a WCHA Championship in that span.
- Under Pearson's leadership, the Huskies finished the 2016-17 season ranked in the top 20 for a third consecutive year, all of them featuring 20-win campaigns. Pearson also earned two WCHA Coach of the Year honors in his time at Michigan Tech, which claimed the program's first-ever No. 1 national ranking on Nov. 17, 2014.
- Pearson served as a U-M assistant coach from 1988-89 through 1998-99 and as associate head coach from 1999-2000 through 2010-11. He played an integral role in developing the Michigan program into one of the most successful in the country.
- During his first tenure in Ann Arbor, U-M posted a 667-243-71 record while capturing 11 Central Collegiate Hockey Association regular-season titles, nine CCHA Tournament crowns, two NCAA championships (1996 and 1998), and making 11 NCAA Frozen Four appearances.
- After he helped Michigan to the 1999-2000 CCHA regular-season championship, Pearson was awarded the Terry Flanagan Award by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, which honors an assistant coach's career body of work. Pearson also served as a coach with the 1996 United States World Junior Championship team, and helped the Americans to a silver medal, the country's second-best finish at the event.
- Pearson's prep (Willard Ikola) and college (John MacInnes) mentors earned varsity letters as goaltenders at Michigan. Pearson was a standout high school player for Ikola (1952-54) at Edina East (Minn.) High School, while playing his collegiate career out at Michigan Technological University under MacInnes (1946-50), one of college hockey's legendary coaches.

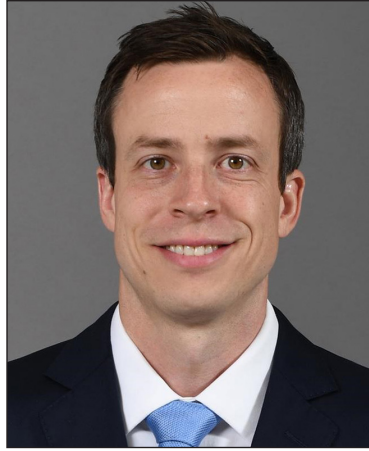


ASSISTANT COACHES



BILL MUCKALT

- Muckalt is in his third season as associate head coach for the Wolverines. A four-year letterwinner (1995-98) and two-time national champion at Michigan, Muckalt returned to his alma mater after spending two seasons as head coach and general manager of the Tri-City Storm of the United States Hockey League.
- In his two seasons with Tri-City, Muckalt's team was 49-46-16-9 and captured its first Clark Cup in franchise history in 2015-16.
- In 2014-15 alongside Pearson, Muckalt helped guide Michigan Tech to a 29-10-2 record, which tied for the most wins in college hockey, and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Huskies earned their first No. 1 national ranking since 1976 that year.
- Began his coaching career at Eastern Michigan with its American Collegiate Hockey Association DI team in 2006-07 before moving up to head coach the following season.
- Had a five-year NHL career with the Vancouver Canucks, New York Islanders, Ottawa Senators and Minnesota Wild. Muckalt tallied 97 career points (40 goals, 57 assists).
- In four years, he helped the Wolverines to 133 wins and two national championships while posting 105 career goals and 226 total points.
- Ranks seventh in U-M history in points, sixth in goals, and ninth in assists (121). First-team All-American and a Hobey Baker Award finalist as a senior in 1997-98.
- A Surrey, British Columbia, native, Muckalt graduated from Michigan in 1998 with a degree in sports management and communications.



KRIS MAYOTTE

- Kris Mayotte enters his first season as assistant coach for the University of Michigan ice hockey team in 2019-20 after being named to the position in August 2019.
- Mayotte spent four seasons at Providence College, serving as associate head coach the past two seasons. A member of the 2015 NCAA National Championship coaching staff, Mayotte worked primarily with the Friar goaltenders as well as with the penalty-kill unit, while handling all aspects of recruiting.
- Under his guidance, Friar goaltenders and penalty-kill units have ranked among the nation's best each of the last three seasons. Last season, the Friars finished tied for sixth in the nation for fewest goals against per game (2.00) while its penalty kill unit ranked fourth (87 percent).
- Prior to joining the staff at Providence, Mayotte spent two seasons (2012-13 and 2013-14) as an assistant coach at St. Lawrence University. Mayotte served as the primary recruiter and worked closely with the goaltenders and penalty-kill unit during his time with the Saints. Prior to St. Lawrence, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Cornell (2011-12) and a full-time goalie coach in Maryland (2010-11).
- As a collegian, Mayotte spent four seasons at Union College (2002-06) as its starting goaltender. Mayotte finished his college career with 116 games played and a 2.69 goals-against average while earning ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team (2003) and ECAC Second All-Star Team (2006) honors.
- After graduation, Mayotte spent five seasons playing professionally, which included American Hockey League (AHL) stints with Lowell, Hershey, Bridgeport and Adirondack. He also played in the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL) for San Diego, Fresno and Johnstown and in the Central Hockey League (CHL) for Arizona.



MATT HUNWICK

- Matt Hunwick is in his first season on Michigan's staff, returning to his alma mater following 12 years in the National Hockey League.
- Hunwick was a four-year letterwinner at U-M, leading the Wolverines to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and three CCHA championships. Hunwick served as team captain during his senior year in which he earned AHCA West Region All-American honors, CCHA First-team and CCHA Defensive Player of the Year honoree.
- A 2004 NHL Entry Draft selection of the Boston Bruins, Hunwick has spent the last 12 years playing in the NHL where he accumulated 535 games played with six franchises (Boston, Colorado Avalanche, New York Rangers, Toronto Maple Leafs, Pittsburgh Penguins, and Buffalo Sabres).
- Most recently, Hunwick played for the Buffalo Sabres during the 2018-19 season, who's General Manager is Wolverine alumnus Jason Botterill, '97.
- Hunwick is a native of Sterling Heights, Michigan. His younger brother, Shawn, played at Michigan from 2007-2012, and led U-M to the 2010 CCHA Tournament Championship and an NCAA Title Appearance.
