PENN STATE SET FOR FOURTH ANNUAL MACK BRADY MATCH

The Penn State men's soccer team will host the Fourth Annual Mack Brady Match Tuesday, Sept. 13 when Ohio State comes to town for a 7 p.m. match up at Jeffrey Field. The Nittany Lions and the Buckeyes will meet for the second time in a Mack Brady Match as the Blue and White defeated OSU 1-0 on a **Kyle MacDonald** goal in 2014.

HISTORY OF MACK BRADY MATCH

This Tuesday, the Nittany Lions will host its fourth Mack Brady Memorial Game when Ohio State visits Jeffrey Field. Brady passed away on Dec. 31, 2012 due to an unexpected blood infection at the age of eight. To honor his life and love for soccer (specifically goalkeeping), Mack's parents, Christian and Elizabeth Brady, created the "Mack Brady Memorial Soccer Fund." The fund is an endowment for Penn State goalkeepers to help in recruiting, equipment and other needs.

UNDEFEATED IN MACK BRADY MATCHES

The Blue and White have always found a way in Mack Brady Match, coming in undefeated this season. The first year, Penn State tied with Cal 1-1 in double overtime before defeating OSU 1-0 in the 2014 campaign. Finally, the Nittany Lions defeated then-No. 10 Indiana in the 2015 Mack Brady Match off a **Robby Sagel** goal.

2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

PENN STATE IN B1G OPENERS

Penn State is 13-9-3 in Big Ten openers since joining the conference in the 1991 season. The 2016 season marks the 14th time that the Nittany Lions have opened B1G play at Jeffrey Field and they hold a 7-4-2 record on opening day in Happy Valley. Furthermore, Penn State is 8-6-1 at Jeffrey Field when taking on Big Ten teams in the past four seasons.

NITTANY LIONS LOOKING TO BOUNCE BACK AFTER SFU LOSS

After falling in a 3-1 match against Saint Francis, Penn State is looking to bounce back in its Big Ten opener against Ohio State. The Blue and White were down 3-0 against the Red Flash before freshman **Christian Sload** found his first collegiate goal off a pass from **Noah Pilato**.

SLOAD SCORES FIRST COLLEGIATE GOAL

In his first collegiate appearance late in the match against Saint Francis, freshman **Christian Sload** found the back of the net on his first shot. The freshman traveled up the right side of the field as **Noah Pilato** gathered the ball in the middle of the field. Pilato brought the ball up about six-yards before passing it up to Sload who shot the ball past the keeper to net his first collegiate goal donning the Blue and White.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

The reigning Big Ten Champion Ohio State Buckeyes have had a slow start to the 2016 campaign coming to Happy Valley with a 1-4-0 overall record. However, in its Big Ten opener the Buckeyes picked up its first win of the season against Northwestern. The Buckeyes have scored just two goals in 2016 with Nate Kohl and Ben Fitzpatrick scoring one apiece. In goal, Parker Siegfried has played every match for the Buckeyes, giving up six goals and making 15 saves on the season.

WARMING EARNS 450TH CAREER VICTORY

Head coach **Bob Warming** notched his 450th career victory as a head coach when the Nittany Lions picked up a 2-1 overtime win over Oakland Sept. 5. Warming ranks second among active Division I coaches in victories just behind South Carolina's Mark Berson who has 484 career wins as a head coach. Furthermore, Warming was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after leading PSU to a pair of league titles. Moreover, Warming leads all Division I active coaches with a 28 combined regular season and conference tournament championships.

PSU REMAINS PERFECT UNDER WARMING IN HOME OPENERS

Under the tutelage of head coach **Bob Warming**, the Nittany Lions are a perfect 7-0 in home openers since he arrived at Penn State in 2010. Furthermore, his squads have outscored opponents 10-1 on opening day and have not given up a goal since Warming's inaugural season in 2010 when they defeated Bucknell 2-1.

Entering his seventh season as Penn State's 11th coach in its storied history, Bob Warming has made his impact known in his first five years. Twice named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 by leading the Nittany Lions to back-to-back Big Ten titles, Warming has added a pair of trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2010, 2013), and led the Lions to three straight postseason appearances.

Warming led the Nittany Lions to a 7-8-3 overall record and a 2-4-2 Big Ten Conference record in the 2015 campaign. The Blue and White earned an overtime victory over Michigan State in the Big Ten Tournament play in match before falling to eventual Big Ten Champion Ohio State in the quarterfinals in overtime. Junior Connor Maloney paced Penn State, starting 17 matches with a team leading 17 points that included seven goals and two assists en route to his second First Team All-Big Ten honor. Freshman Austin Maloney also made his mark on the program, earning All-Freshman team honors after starting 14 games with two assists and a .800 shots on goal percentage. Of its seven wins in 2016, six of them came by way of the shutout with senior goalkeeper Matt Bersano tallying five and junior Evan Finney earning one.

2014 was a banner year for Warming and his Nittany Lions as they won 13 matches for the second straight year, going 13-6-1 overall and 5-3 in the Big Ten. They also recorded their 800th win in program history over Penn (Sept. 24), with a 6-2 win at Jeffrey Field. The team got out to a sizzling 10-0-1 start, it's best ever and won seven straight matches for the first time since 2005.

SIGUE RETURNS FROM COSTA RICA TO SCORE GAME-WINNER

Junior transfer **Aymar Sigue** made a week-long trip to Costa Rica to play for the Canadian Nationa Team, missing two regular season games for the Nittany Lions. The junior transfer missed Penn State's contest against Cal and its match against JMU before returning in time for its Labor Day match against Oakland. Playing just seven minutes in the second half after 10 hours of travel, Sigue found the ball six yard outs from the net in the first minute of overtime. Sigue blasted the ball right at the keeper who was able to make the save. However, the shot was too hard as it squeaked out of his hands, allowing Sigue to rip a shot into the lower half of the net for the game-winner.

AMMANN NAMED BIG TEN DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the second consecutive week, Penn State men's soccer has been awarded with the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as freshman **Arie Ammann** earned his first career honor getting the win in both matches this past weekend.

Ammann earned the nod for both starts after an injury to senior goalkeeper **Evan Finney** and proved to be a good choice for the Nittany Lions as he played 181:42 minutes on the pitch and conceded just one goal in two matches.

The Round Hill, Va. native made his first start donning the Blue and White in Friday's home-opener against the JMU Dukes in which he made a career-high five saves in the match and tallied his first career shutout. Moving into Monday's contest, Ammann gave up one goal late in the match but held on in the remaining minutes as the Nittany Lions went on to a 2-1 overtime victory over Oakland. Ammann made two saves in the match and picked up his second victory in as many games.

On the week, Ammann tallied seven saves and gave up just one goal. The freshman keeper has made a total of nine saves in 191:01 minutes on the pitch and carries a .818 save percentage.

MALONEY FINDING THE NET

Senior **Connor Maloney** has found ways to score in the 2016 campaign, scoring one goal in each of the last three games for the Nittany Lions. Maloney scored the first goal of the 2016 for the Blue and White at UC Berkeley before returning to Happy Valley for the final home opener of his collegiate career. The senior captain netted what would be the winning goal against JMU as he tapped the ball into the lower half of the net as he fell to the ground. Maloney's scoring continued into Penn State's match against Oakland as he again scored the first goal of the match in the off a free kick just outside the 18yard box.

Penn State has enjoyed success at Jeffrey Field with over 300 victories at the famed field. Impressively, the Nittany Lions have never posted a losing season at Jeffrey Field in 43 years, going 322-84-35 all-time for a winning percentage of .771. Last season, PSU went 4-3-1 at the Jeff and over the past four seasons the Nittany Lions are 30-10-4 en route to a pair of Big Ten titles in 2012 and 2013. In the 43-year history of the stadium, Jeffrey Field has welcomed over 540,000 fans through its gates.

FINNEY NAMED BIG TEN DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior goalkeeper **Evan Finney** was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for the period ended Aug 28. The award marks the first of its career and the second consecutive season that the Nittany Lions has earned B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors in opening weekend.

Finney had an outstanding weekend in net for the Nittany Lions, playin 191:32 minutes in goal. The San Francisco, Calif. native returned to his home state to keep the defending National Champion Cardinal scoreless through 110:00 minutes of play. Finney stopped six shots in the match and helped the Nittany Lions to a 0-0 double overtime tie over the No. 1 ranked Stanford Cardinal.

The senior keeper continued to look strong in net for the Blue and White in Sunday's match against UC Berkeley, stopping two shots and allowing just one goal before coming out due to an injury in the second half of play.

Senior **Connor Maloney** netted his 20th career goal and first of the 2016 for the Blue and White in the sixth minute of the match to give Penn State the early lead, but Cal was able to come away with the late win over the Nittany Lions.

2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

SENIOR CLASS LOOKING TO GET BACK ON TOP

Three of the members of the 2016 senior class have been a part of a championship squad as the Nittany Lions nabbed a Big Ten Championship in the 2013 campaign. Then-freshman **Connor Maloney** paced Penn State with seven assists, while scoring two goals for the Blue and White. Also seeing time on the pitch in his freshman season for the Nittany Lions was **Mason Klerks**, who dished out three assists.

COACHING CLOUT

Among the elite coaches in the sport for the last three decades, head coach **Bob Warming** is back for his seventh season at Penn State. Warming has an incredible coaching pedigree, including 450 career Division I victories -- second all-time among active Division I coaches and ninth all-time at DI. He was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after leading PSU to a pair of league titles. Furthermore, Warming leads all Division I active coaches with a 28 combined regular season and conference tournament championships.

TOUGH SCHEDULE AHEAD FOR PENN STATE

Head coach **Bob Warming** scheduled one of the toughest slates for the Nittany Lions in 2016 as they will take on six teams that were ranked in the top-25 of the NSCAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Penn State kicks off the season with No. 1 Stanford, Aug. 26, before taking on No. 18 Ohio State for its Big Ten Conference opener, Sept. 13. The top-25 tour continues Sept. 18 when Penn State travels to No. 4 Maryland before meeting up with No. 15 Indiana, Oct. 8. Finally the Nittany Lions will go up against No. 2 Akron and No. 25 Rutgers in back-to-back matches, Oct. 18 and Oct. 21.

Last season, Penn State took one from then-No. 10 Indiana in the Third Annual Mack Brady Match off a goal from defender **Robby Sagel** and earned a 2-0 victory over Rutgers with goals from **Brian James** and **Riley Grant**. The Nittany Lions fought to a 1-1 double overtime tie against the eventual Big Ten Champions Ohio State but were unable to overcome Akron and Maryland in the 2015 campaign.

THREE NITTANY LIONS LAND PRESEASON HONORS

Seniors **Evan Finney**, **Connor Maloney** and **Robby Sagel** each earned Big Ten Preseason Honors as announced by the conference office. Finney closed out the 2015 season as the starting keeper for the Blue and White tallying a 2-2-1 overall record. The San Francisco, Calif. native earned one shut out and made 22 saves in his junior campaign, playing 476:10 minutes in the net. Maloney heads into the 2016 after earning First Team All-Big Ten for the second time in his career. The starting midfielder scored a team-high seven goals in 2015 and tallied two assists for a team-best 16 points. Finally, Sagel will take the pitch for his second season with the Nittany Lions after transferring to Penn State following his sophomore season. Sagel manned the backline for the Blue and White in 2015 and scored the game-winning goal against then-No. 10 Indiana at the Third Annual Mack Brady Game.


