HEAD COACH JOHN GONDAK

John Gondak enters his third year as the head coach of the cross country and track & field programs after being named head coach on Sept. 17 2014. Gondak's résumé while with the Blue and White - which can be matched by few middle distance mentors in the country - includes 27 First Team All-Americans, 29 Big Ten Champions, 31 Penn State records, four Big Ten Freshman of the Year honorees, 10 Penn Relays victories, and three sub-4:00 milers.

Aside from his athletes' efforts on the track, the Doylestown, Pa., native has also had a huge impact on the Nittany Lions' success on the cross country course, including a Big Ten title by the women's squad in 2009 and 2015, and an NCAA Mid-Atlantic regional title in 2012 and 2015. Over

the years, Gondak has assisted in NCAA-qualifying efforts by the women's squad in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012,2013, and 2015 and by the men's team in 2008, and 2010. On the men's during the 2013 season, Matt Fischer posted the highest finish at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships in school history (third), placed fourth at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional and finished 78th overall at the 2013 NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships.

The Nittany Lion women's squad placed 13th at the 2011 NCAA Cross Country Championships - the highest finish in nearly two decades. In fact, the Nittany Lion women have enjoyed NCAA-qualifying performances in five of the last six cross country seasons, capturing top 16 standings on four out of six occasions, including individual All-American Tessa Barrett in 2015.

Gondak has also been widely recognized by the coaching community as he was named United States Track and Field/Cross Country Association (USTFCCCA) Mid-Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year during the indoor season in 2009, and again for his efforts during the 2010 outdoor season. Gondak swept the Mid-Atlantic awards in 2013, winning the USTFCCCA Mid-Atlantic Men's Assistant Coach of the Year award during both the indoor and outdoor seasons. He was most recently named USTFCCCA Mid-Atlantic Men's Assistant Coach of Year during the 2014 indoor track & field season, and earned the USTFCCCA Mid-Atlantic Region Head Coach of the Year award for his efforts during the 2015 cross country season.



ASSISTANT COACH ANGELA RECKART

Angela Reckart enters her second season as the assistant coach for the Nittany Lion cross country/track & field program following coaching at North Carolina for three years. Reckart assists with the cross country and distance event areas.

Immediately adding experience and value to the Penn State track and cross country programs, Reckart helped guide the Penn State women's cross country team to Big Ten and Mid-Atlantic titles in her first year in Happy Valley.

Reckart joins the Nittany Lions following a three-year stint as the assistant cross country/distance coach at North Carolina.

The Tar Heel cross country program is coming off a historic season as both teams tallied top-25 NCAA finishes for the first time in school history.

The Tar Heel men's cross country program advanced to back-toback appearances at the NCAA cross country championships for the first time in almost 40 years. At the 2014 NCAA Cross Country Championships, the men finished 12th, their highest finish since 1985 and the women placed 22nd. The men also posted a 17thplace finish at the 2013 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

On the track for the Tar Heels, Reckart coached both indoor 3,000-meter run champions at the 2014 ACC Track & Field Championships (Annie Le-Hardy and Isaac Presson), she also coached 11 NCAA indoor championship qualifiers and 17 NCAA first round qualifiers during the last two years.

|| HARRY GROVES || NITTANY LION LEGEND

Today's event is named after long-time Nittany Lion men's track and field and cross country coach Harry Groves. Groves spent nearly forty years at the helm of the men's program, beginning in 1968 until retiring at the conclusion of the 2006 track and field season. Groves is a 2001 USTCA Hall of Fame inductee, was named national Coach of the Year on five occasions, and is a 26time Regional Coach of the Year honoree. Throughout his Lion career, Groves coached 11 American record holders coached 11 American record instant and 21 national champions. On the international level, 14 Groves-coached athletes made Olympic teams. Groves has also made countless international appearances of his own, including a trip to Barcelona, Spain, where he served as an assistant coach of the 1992 Olympic staff
