

#### **LOOKING AT OHIO STATE**

Ohio State heads into the regular season finale sporting an overall record of 10-5-3 and a record of 4-3-3 in Big Ten play. Last weekend, Ohio State topped Michigan, 2-1, in Ann Arbor, Mich. The OSU win on Saturday in Ann Arbor, Mich., spoiled a then-unblemished home record for the Maize and Blue (7-1-3).

In the Big Ten regular season standings, Ohio State is currently tied for seventhplace with Indiana and Nebraska with 15 points apiece.

Senior Lindsay Agnew has netted 27 points on the year, which is a team-best and is tied for the Big Ten lead. Agnew has tallied 27 points on 10 goals and seven assists. Also for the Buckeyes, Nichelle Prince and Sammy Edwards lead the OSU offense with 15 (5g, 5a) and 12 (5g, 2a) points, respectively.

Among the Big Ten leaders, the Buckeyes rank second in points (92), second in goals (32) and tied for second in assists (28).

Three goalkeepers have seen time in net for the Buckeyes during the 2016 season. Jillian McVicker started 10 matches before she suffered an injury during the Minnesota match on Sept. 18.

With McVicker sidelined, Megan Geldernick and Devon Kerr have split time for the Buckeyes. On the year, Geldernick has played in eight matches, including six starts, played in 519:40 minutes, allowed six goals, recorded a goals against average of 1.04, tallied 16 saves and has a save percentage of .727. Kerr has played in six games, including two starts, played in 333:04 minutes, allowed four goals, recorded a goals against average of 1.08, made 15 saves and has a save percentage of .789.

#### **WEEKEND REWIND**

The Nittany Lions are coming off a 3-1 loss against Michigan State in East Lansing, Mich., on Saturday, Oct. 22. In the game, junior Frannie Crouse netted her 12th goal of the season and the 33rd of her Nittany Lion career. The loss Saturday snapped an 11-match unbeaten streak for the Nittany Lions in Big Ten play.

#### **B1G STANDINGS AND RANKINGS**

With one game remaining in the 2016 Big Ten regular season, the Nittany Lions are currently tied with Minnesota and Northwestern for the league lead with 21 points.

Statistically as a team in the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions rank third in shot attempts (279), third in points (86), fourth in goals

(29) and are tied for second in assists (28). Individually, Frannie Crouse leads the league in goals (12), is tied for the league lead in game-winning goals (five) and ranks third in points (25). Also among the Big Ten leaders, Nickolette Driesse is tied for fifth in assists (six) and freshman Amanda Dennis is fifth in goals against average (0.84).

#### **DECISION DAY 2016**

For the second-straight season, the Big Ten women's soccer regular season title will be decided on the last day of play. The Nittany Lions and Wisconsin Badgers shared the 2015 Big Ten women's soccer regular season title. On Oct. 28, 2015, the Nittany Lions defeated Michigan, 3-1, and then Northwestern topped Wisconsin, 2-1, in double overtime in Madison, Wis., later that night.

Minnesota, Northwestern and Penn State each have a chance to clinch a share of the 2016 Big Ten women's soccer regular season title. Minnesota hosts Maryland in Falcon Heights, Minn., at 7 p.m. (CDT), and Northwestern hosts Illinois at 7:30 p.m. (CDT) in Evanston, Ill.

#### **B1G TITLE SCENARIOS**

Penn State can clinch the outright Big Ten title with a win versus Ohio State and ties by Minnesota and Northwestern.

Penn State can clinch at least a share of the Big Ten title with a loss versus Ohio State only if both Northwestern and Minnesota also lose on Wednesday.

#### **DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE**

Heading into the weekend, the Nittany Lions have posted a record of 9-2-3 over the past 14 games. Over that span, the Nittany Lion defense has allowed one goal or less in 12 of the 14 games, which includes seven shutouts.

Penn State opens the 2016 Big Ten regular season at No. 10 Minnesota (Sept. 16) and the 2015 Big Ten regular season co-champion Wisconsin Badgers (Sept.

Penn State then travels to Indiana (Oct. 6) and Maryland (Oct. 9) before returning home to Happy Valley to host Rutgers on BTN (Oct. 13) and Purdue (Oct. 16).

The Blue and White close out the 2016 Big Ten regular season at Michigan State (Oct. 22) and host Ohio State (Oct. 26) for the regular season finale.

Due to a rotating schedule, Penn State does not play Northwestern or Michigan during the regular season in 2016.

#### FOR CLUB AND COUNTRY

The 2016 Penn State women's soccer team will be without the services of five Nittany Lions as they prepare for the 2016 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup, Nov. 13-Dec. 3. Maddie Elliston, Ellie Jean, Emily Ogle and Kaleigh Riehl will not be on the roster this fall, while Rose Chandler will continue to train with the Nittany Lions during the fall semester. The Nittany Lion quintet were named to the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team on Oct. 13.

#### **B1G HONORS**

Four Nittany Lions have garnered weekly honors from the Big Ten during the 2016 regular season. Laura Freigang received Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Aug. 23, Frannie Crouse was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 13 and on Oct. 18, Laura Suero garnered Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week honors on Sept. 20 and Amanda Dennis was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Sept. 27.

#### **BIG TEN SUCCESS**

Since joining the Big Ten conference in 1994, the Nittany Lions have amassed a record of 186-27-13 in Big Ten play, including a record of 101-6-5 at Jeffrey Field. Under Coach Dambach, the Nittany Lions have a tallied a Big Ten record of 86-15-6.

#### PACING THE PRIDE

In 2016, junior Frannie Crouse leads the team in points (25), goals (12) and has recorded one assist. She also ranks second in shots (49) and shots on goal (23). Her 12 goals this season are a career-best as she recorded 10 during her freshman season and then scored 11 goals in 2015.

Among the leaders in the NCAA, Crouse is tied for 12th in game-winning goals (five) and she is tied for 18th in goals scored (12).

#### STANDOUT SOPHOMORE

On the year, sophomore Charlotte Williams has tallied 10 points on three goals and four assists. During her freshman season in 2015, Williams netted 13 points on three goals and seven assists.

Williams leads the team in shots attempted (52), shots on goal (27), ranks second in assists (four), ranks third in goals (three) and points (10).

#### SHUTOUT SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED

Penn State closed out the 2015 season with eight-straight shutouts, which spanned 733:32 of play. During the season opener against No. 6 West Virginia, the Nittany Lions kept the Mountaineers off the board until the 76:59 mark. The WVU goal at 76:59 snapped Penn State's shutout scoreless streak of 810:31, which

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

The Penn State women's soccer team has a record of 62-5-6 at Jeffrey Field since the start of the 2011 season.

Over the past six seasons, Penn State has not lost twice at home in a single season.

All-time at Jeffrey Field the Penn State women's soccer team has an overall record of 222-25-12.

Penn State kicked off the 2016 campaign setting an attendance record against No. 6 WVU. A Penn State women's soccer record 5,791 fans made their way to Jeffrey Field to watch the Nittany Lions and Mountaineers play to a 1-1 draw. The previous mark of 5,117 was set in 2012 against the top-ranked Stanford Cardinal.

As of Oct. 25, the Nittany Lions rank ninth in the nation in average attendance with 1,518 fans per game.

Last season, the Nittany Lions finished sixth in overall attendance in the nation with 21,856 fans, which was a programbest. The 2015 season featured two of the top-10 home field crowds in program history.

Penn State opened the 2015 season with a crowd of 3,175 against Hofstra and 4,207 fans packed into Jeffrey Field to watch the Nittany Lions host Duke.

#### **NITTANY LIONS WELCOME NINE**

Head coach Erica Dambach welcomed nine freshmen to the Penn State women's soccer family for the class of 2020.

Amanda Dennis and Emma Hasco enrolled early to Penn State during the spring of 2016.

Becca Hamilton, Madison Moroi, Bristol Pizzuto, Laura Suero and Sarafina Valenti joined the Nittany Lions back on signing day in February.

Grace Fisk and Laura Freigang were the last to join the Penn State women's soccer family as they joined the program in August.

#### **NITTANY LION CAPTAINS**

Brittany Basinger, Nickolette Driesse and Megan Schafer will captain the Nittany Lions for the 2016 season.

#### **MILESTONE VICTORIES**

The 2016 season marks the 23rd year of varsity women's soccer for Penn State. The Nittany Lions captured their 400th program victory with a 3-1 win over the Hofstra Pride on Aug. 21. Overall, the Nittany Lions boast a record of 409-106-33.

Coach Dambach captured her 200th win on Sept. 9 in a 3-0 victory against San Diego State. During her time as a head coach at Dartmouth (2000-02), Harvard (2006) and Penn State (2007-Present), Coach Dambach has tallied a record of 207-81-17.

#### **MIDSEASON HONORS**

Seven Nittany Lions were named to Top-DrawerSoccer's Top 100 Midseason Lists. Amanda Dennis, Grace Fisk and Laura Freigang were named to the TopDrawer-Soccer Freshmen Top 100 List. Dennis checks in at 15, followed by Freigang at 35 and Fisk at 74.

2012 & 2015 NSCAA NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR THREE-TIME BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR (2009, 2012, 2014)

Head coach Erica (Walsh) Dambach enters her 10th season at the helm of the Penn State women's soccer program in 2016.

Dambach and the Nittany Lions are coming off their best season in program history in 2015. During the fall of 2015, the Penn State women's soccer team recorded a 3.49 GPA in the classroom to go along with the program's first NCAA title and a pair of Big Ten titles.

In program history, the Nittany Lions have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of the past 21 seasons, won 17 of the last 18 Big Ten regular season titles and own six Big Ten Tournament titles.

Dambach's squad finished the 2015 season with a 22-3-2 record, its eighth 20win season, by defeating No. 20 Duke 1-0 in the College Cup Final on Dec. 6, 2015, in Cary, N.C. The NCAA title was the first in program history and the first by a Big Ten women's soccer program.

The Nittany Lions outscored the opposition 20-0 during their 2015 NCAA Tournament run and the Nittany Lions did not allow a goal over the final 733:32 of the season.

Raquel Rodriguez capped off her historic Penn State career by scoring the lone goal in the NCAA title match in the 72nd minute. Rodriguez followed up her game-winner in the title match by claiming the second MAC Hermann Trophy in program history in January 2016 (Welsh – 2001).

To go along with the MAC Hermann Trophy, Rodriguez garnered NSCAA Scholar Player of the Year honors, the Honda Sport Award winner for women's soccer and was named a NSCAA First Team All-American.

Following the 2015 season, Dambach received NSCAA Coach of the Year honors for the second time in her Nittany Lion career (2012).

In January 2016, all three Nittany Lion captains were selected in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) draft. Rodriguez was selected with the No. 2 pick by Sky Blue FC, Mallory Weber went to the Western New York Flash at No. 14 and Britt Eckerstrom was the first goalkeeper selected at No. 26 by the Western New York Flash.

In 2014, Dambach led the Blue and White to its 10th NCAA Tournament semifinal appearance and the seventh 20-win season in program history. Penn State, which had an 11-member freshman class, earned its third outright conference title in four years, maintaining a top-11 national ranking throughout the season and defeating five top-25 opponents.

Under Dambach's direction, who picked up her third Big Ten Coach of the Year award, Penn State collected three of four Player of the Year awards. Whitney Church, the conference's Defender of the Year, was named a M.A.C. Hermann Trophy semifinalist and an NSCAA All-America first team selection before she became the 30th overall pick in the NWSL draft by the Washington Spirit. Also earning individual Big Ten awards were Raquel Rodriguez, who bagged Midfielder of the Year honors and Emily Ogle, the Freshman of the Year.

The Nittany Lions appeared in their 19th-straight NCAA Tournament in 2013, due in part to the success of senior Maya Hayes. The sixth-overall selection in the WPSL draft, Hayes set Penn State's single season record for points (79) and finished her career ranked third in goals scored (71) and points (163), sixth in game-winning goals (17) and seventh in shots (291). Hayes also became the seventh M.A.C. Hermann Award Trophy semifinalist in program history.

Dambach's 2012 Nittany Lions were the most successful team in program history after advancing to their first-ever national title game. The Nittany Lions won 21 of 27 games and were unbeaten in Big Ten action with a 10-0-1 record. The Lions registered their 15th consecutive Big Ten title and 18th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The 15-title mark stands as the most consecutive Big Ten Championships by a women's program, along with the present Northwestern

Senior Christine Nairn became just the seventh Nittany Lion to finish as a finalist for the prestigious Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy in 2012 under Dambach's tutelage while junior Maya Hayes was named a semifinalist for

Dambach's success was recognized at the conference and national level as she earned Big Ten Coach of the Year and NSCAA National Coach of the Year

Her 2011 team was a dominant force, winning 21 of 26 matches, while outscoring opponents 70-24. The Nittany Lions were 10-1-0 in Big Ten action and posted the seventh undefeated season at Jeffrey Field (9-0). Dambach helped guide the Lions to their 14th-straight Big Ten title and a spot to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2007.

With Dambach's guidance, sophomore Maya Hayes became the nation's most prolific scorer in soccer in 2011 and was a finalist for the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Hayes led the nation with 31 goals and 70 points, breaking the Penn State single-season record for points.

During the 2011 summer, Dambach had an extraordinary experience of being one of the top assistants to Pia Sundhage and the 2011 United State women's national team at the FIFA World Cup in Germany. The U.S. made a sparkling run through knockout play to the final, falling to eventual champion Japan.

During the 2010 season, Dambach's young club made a remarkable turnaround mid-season, overcoming a two-game deficit in the league standings over the final weeks to capture a share of its 13th straight Big Ten title.

After a tough 2-4 start to the 2009 season, Dambach led the Nittany Lions to a remarkable turnaround, going 10-1-2 in the last 13 games of the regular season, earning her the 2009 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award for her efforts.

With the impressive end to the season, Dambach and her charges captured the program's 12th-straight Big Ten Championship. By winning the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions continued their string of NCAA Tournament berths, making their 15th-straight appearance in the 64-team field in 2009. For the second time in three years, Penn State hosted the first and second rounds of tournament play.

Dambach also orchestrated one of the finest awards seasons in Penn State history when Katie Schoepfer, Alyssa Naeher and Christine Nairn swept the year-end Big Ten Player of the Year awards. Schoepfer was named the Offensive Player of the Year, Naeher the Defensive Player of the Year and Nairn the Freshman of the Year. Danielle Toney was named to the All-Big Ten first team, while Lexi Marton garnered second team mention. Dambach has now coached two players of the year to three awards as Naeher was also the 2007 recipient of the Defensive Player of the Year honors in Dambach's first year in Happy Valley.

Dambach continued her success from the 2007 campaign into a 16-8-0 record that saw Penn State capture its 11th-straight Big Ten Championship and the 2008 Big Ten Tournament crown.

Her transition to Penn State was quite smooth as the 2007 team finished 18-4-2, including a 9-1-0 mark in conference play, and was ranked 12th in the final NSCAA poll of the season.

When she came to Penn State, Dambach brought with her a wealth of experience at both the international and collegiate levels. She already has coached at six different universities, including three stints as head coach as well as serving as an assistant for the U.S. U-19 team in 2004. Dambach served as head coach of the U-17 team from December 2004 until her hire at Penn State in February 2007.

As of January 2009, Dambach was appointed as a member of the Panel of Instructors and Lecturers for FIFA Courses. In addition, she was appointed as the Chairman of the Women's Technical Committee for the period of January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

In January of 2008, Dambach was named as the assistant coach by Pia Sundhage for the U.S. National Team. With Dambach's help and guidance the U.S. team completed its historic run with a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Even sweeter was that Dambach's main responsibility was the U.S. Team's defense, which held fellow world power Brazil scoreless in the gold medal game.

The head coach at Harvard University as well as the U.S. Under-17 team prior to her hiring at Penn State, Dambach has consistently been active among the coaching ranks both at the Division I level and the U.S. Youth National Team program for nearly a decade. Prior to her time with the Crimson, she was part of a Florida State staff that led the Seminoles to one of its most successful year to date. FSU joined Penn State in the 2005 Women's Soccer College Cup, with both programs reaching the national semifinals.

Dambach's coaching path began in 1997 as a graduate assistant with Bucknell University. In 1998, she accepted a position at Dartmouth, where she was an assistant coach for two seasons. After helping the team to a final NSCAA ranking of No. 8 at the conclusion of the team's 1998 NCAA quarterfinal run as well as an Ivy League championship in 1999, Dambach assumed head coaching duties before the 2000 season.

As head coach, Dambach led the Big Green to back-to-back Ivy League cochampionships in 2000 and 2001. Her squad was ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 each year, rising as high as No. 13 in 2001. In her three seasons as head coach, Dartmouth was invited to the NCAA Tournament each season and reached the round of 16 twice. All three of her teams earned the NSCAA's Academic Team Award

Dambach left Dartmouth to earn her Master's in business administration at Lehigh University where she served as a graduate assistant from 2003-04.

Beginning in the spring of 2004, Dambach joined the United States Under-19 team as an assistant coach where she helped with preparations for the Under-19 World Cup. The U.S. finished with the bronze medal in Thailand after defeating Brazil in the third place match. After the World Cup, Dambach was appointed the U.S. National Team's U-17 head coach, a position which she held for three years.

As a player, Dambach was an NSCAA All-Region selection at William & Mary. A two-time first team All-CAA pick, she propelled her team to four NCAA Tournament appearances as well as two CAA regular season and two CAA league championships. In March of 2010, Dambach's alma mater, William & Mary, honored her by inducting her into the W&M Athletics Hall of Fame.

A high school All-American at Lower Moreland, she was also a member of the U.S. Under-17 National Team.

Dambach earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997. The Huntingdon Valley, Pennsylvania, native holds an NSCAA Advanced National Degree and a USSF "A" Coaching License.

The former Erica Walsh married Jason Dambach in January 2016 and they currently reside in State College, Pa.
