THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

Penn State welcomes Canisius College to Pegula Ice Arena for the first-time this weekend as they play a pair of 7 p.m. contests against the Golden Griffins on Friday and Saturday evening.

LAST TIME THEY MET

The Nittany Lions travelled to Buffalo to open the 2015-16 campaign with a 6-1 win over the Griffins.

• Senior **Ricky DeRosa** potted what would eventually become the game-winner while sophomore **Chase Berger** registered the first goal of his collegiate career in the first period as Penn State opened up a 5-0 advantage through two periods before Canisius got on the board.

• **David Glen '16** scored twice while **Curtis Loik '16** and senior **David Goodwin** added the other scores for the 6-1 final.

THE HOUSES PEGULA BUILT

• Buffalo Sabres owner and PSU Alumnus Terry Pegula was the driving factor behind funding both the Pegula Ice Arena and the HARBORCENTER in Buffalo which is home to the Golden Griffins.

• The \$172.2 million HARBORCENTER has been the home to the Griffins since the 2014-15 season just one year after the \$98 million Pegula Ice Arena opened its doors for Penn State in 2013-14.

UPSET CITY

• The win on Saturday over No. 3 Notre Dame marks the highest ranked opponent Penn State has ever defeated in their brief history. it is also the second top-5 ranked opponent they have taken down as they also defeated No. 4 UMass-Lowell, 4-1, On November 15, 2014.

• The win against the Riverhawks was the 200th in the coaching career for Guy Gadowsky. The Penn State Bench Boss currently has 236 career victories after Saturday's win.

• Both of those victories have come on the road as the highest ranked team the Lions have defeated at home was No. 10 Michigan on February 8, 2014 a 4-0 shutout victory. The shutout is currently the only such game against a nationally ranked opponent.

GOING STREAKING

• A pair of Nittany Lion newcomers have announced their presence with authority so far this season as both freshman forward **Denis Smirnov** and junior defenseman **Trevor Hamilton** are riding 5-game point streaks, registering at least one point in each game so far this season for the Blue and White.

• Both players have registered one goal and five assists for six points to tie sophomore **Chase Berger** for the team lead through the first five games.

• All three players currently tie for the Big Ten lead with their five assists while Hamilton leads all Big Ten defensemen in scoring with his six points.

• Smirnov is also tied for the Big Ten lead for freshman scoring.

JONES EARNS B1G FIRST STAR

• Freshman goaltender **Peyton Jones** showed extreme poise and confidence in net this past weekend against one of the top offenses in the country. In doing so his performance earned him the Big Ten First Star of the week.

• This is the second consecutive week the rookie has been honored after taking home Third Star accolades last week following his first collegiate shutout.

• For Penn State he becomes the fourth player to earn First Star recognition and first since another goaltender, Eamon McAdam, earned that distinction last December.

LEAGUE LEADERS

• With four goals on the season both sophomore **Andrew Sturtz** and freshman **Nate Sucese** are tied for the Big Ten lead while the two game-winning goals off the stick of Sturtz place him in solo-first in the league.

PUCK ON NET

• Something Penn State does not struggle with is getting off shots as they are always toward the league lead in shots per game and this year is no different. Through the opening three weeks of play the Lions are currently leading the nation averaging 38.6 shots per contest.

• Their 4.0 goals per game also places them top-10 in the country as they sit at seventh.

PENN STATE FEATURED ON TOP PLAYS

• For the second time over the first three weeks of the regular season the Nittany Lions have had a play on NCAA Ice Hockey's Top-5 Plays of the Week.

• It comes as no surprise as it was the overtime winner against Notre Dame by **Andrew Sturtz**, who is also making his second appearance on Top Plays.

• The play came in a #5 after they captured the top spot during the opening weekend.

RECAPPING NOTRE DAME

Penn State never trailed in the series against the Fighting Irish as they scored early each night even possessing a two-goal lead at one point on Friday night.

• Senior **Dylan Richard** collected the 13th multi-point game of his career with his two goals on Friday while freshman **Nikita Pavlychev** scored the opening goal for the second straight game after starting the scoring the previous weekend against Mercyhurst.

• Jones collected a career-high 30-saves on Friday night.

• The penalty kill unit went a perfect 9-for-9 on Friday for the second straight game as they started the

SCOUTING CANISIUS



This marks the second straight season that the Nittany Lions and Golden Griffins will face-off after a single contest last year at the HarborCenter which the Lions won 6-1.

• Canisius finished 12-22-5 last season including a 10-13-5 mark in Atlantic Hockey finishing seventh in the league standings. They hosted Niagara in the quarterfinal round of the Atlantic Hockey Championship and won the series in three games. However, their season ended the following weekend as they were swept by Air Force in the semi-finals.

• The Griffins bid farewell to their top two scorers on last season's roster as Ralph Cuddemi graduated while Shane Conacher decided to forego his senior season and signed a deal with the Toronto Marlies of the American Hockey League. Both Conacher and Cuddemi potted 20 goals last season accounting for 43% of the Canisius offense.

• Luckily for the Golden Griffins the next eight players who registered double-digit points last season where either freshman or sophomores including this year's leading scorers Felix Chamberland and Ryan Schmelzer.

• Chamberland and Schmelzer each have five points while Chamberland leads the way with three goals to Schmelzer's two.

• Chamberland was named Atlantic Hockey Player of the Week after scoring a hat-trick during a 6-3 victory over Robert Morris last Friday night.

• The Griffins have a few new faces between the pipes this season and are led by graduate student Charles Williams who spent the last four seasons on the roster at Ferris State. Williams has started four games and posted a 2-1-1 record with a 2.43 goals against average and .927 save percentage. Williams was also named Atlantic Hockey Goaltender of the week after a 1-0-1 weekend against Bobby Mo.

• Both Williams' .927 save percentage and 2.43 GAA are good for third in Atlantic Hockey early on in the season.

• Canisius possesses one of the best defenses in Atlantic Hockey only allowing 2.83 goals per contest, however, their offense ranks last in the league only putting up 1.83 goals per game over their first six contests.

• The Griffins also have one of the better powerplays in the conference as they have converted 7-of-31 for 22.6 percent good for second in Atlantic Hockey. Their penalty-kill, however, is more middle-of-the-pack as they have killed off 24-of-30 at an 80 percent clip.





season a perfect 26-for-26 before Notre Dame broke through on Saturday night.

- Junior James Robinson collected his first goal since March 14, 2015 as he opened the scoring on Saturday night.

- Freshman **Nate Sucese** collected his team-leading fourth goal of the season which was later matched by Sturtz with his overtime game-winner for the 3-2 victory just 1:20 into the extra session.

- The Nittany Lions are riding a modest three-game unbeaten streak (2-0-1).

CRACKING INTO THE POLLS

- After a win and a tie against then No. 3 Notre Dame, Penn State made their season debut in the uscho.com top-20 coming in at No. 19 to open the week.

- This marks the first time since March 14, 2016 that the Nittany Lions have been nationally ranked.

HOME SWEET HOME

- After back-to-back weeks on the road Penn State returns home for the remainder of the fall 2016 semester as they host 10-consecutive games inside the friendly confines of Pegula Ice Arena

- The Lions next hit the road on January 6-7 when they travel to Ohio State to resume Big Ten Conference play following the semester break.

RECAPPING 2015-16

Penn State put together its best season during it's young existence earning the first 20-win campaign for Guy Gadowsky as the Nittany Lion Bench Boss with a 21-13-4 record while posting their second-straight winning season in Big Ten play (10-9-1-0).

- Penn State set 7 new single-season program standards during 2015-16 including most wins (21), most points (366), most goals (140), most assists (226), most shots (1,579), most shots/game (41.55) and most goals/game (3.68).

- For the third straight season the Nittany Lions won their opening Big Ten game by defeating Michigan State at home, 4-2. They followed that up with a 6-1 victory the following night to earn a sweep in the first conference series for the second straight season after doing the same to Wisconsin in 2014-15.

- Nittany Lions climb to as high as No. 14 in the uscho.com poll on numerous occasions while also earning their first-ever USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine ranking debuting at No. 15 in the December 14, 2015 poll.

- Penn State sweeps Wisconsin January 15-16, 2016.

- Penn State beats Minnesota, 5-3, at Mariucci Arena marking the first Nittany Lion victory in Minneapolis, February 6, 2016.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH

• Penn State, entering its fifth season of varsity hockey, was picked fourth for the second consecutive year in the Preseason Coaches' Poll behind Minnesota, Ohio State and Michigan, but ahead of Wisconsin and Michigan State in the preseason poll.

• The Nittany Lions were picked sixth in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. Penn State exceeded expectations last season, leading the Big Ten for stretches of the season and finished third in the regular season and advanced to the Big Ten semifinals.

GOODWIN, PEDRIE NAMED BIG PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Forward **David Goodwin** and defenseman **Vince Pedrie** were among the 13 athletes named to the Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch List on Monday, Sept. 26.

• Goodwin, returns as the leading point scorer from last seasons roster with 38 on 11 goals and a career-best 27 assists. His 27 helpers was also a new single-season program record.

• Goodwin is currently the career leader in points (90) and assists (57) while his 33 goals rank him third all-time. His 90 points in currently 8th in all of college hockey for current players.

• The senior's 72 points over the last two seasons are the most in a two-year stretch in program history as he boasts the second and third best scoring seasons behind Casey Bailey's 40-point outburst in 2014-15.

• A double major in economics and Spanish, Goodwin has benn an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention the past two seasons.

• Pedrie, a communications, Arts and Sciences major, missed the final six games last season due to injury, but was still a unanimous pick for the Preseason Watch List by the opposing coaches.

• The strong d-man with a wicked shot returns as the leading goal-scoring defenseman in conference games last season with seven. He finished the year with eight goals and 14 assists for 22 points, good for eighth on the team.

O CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

• On Sept. 8, head coach **Guy Gadowsky** announced that senior forward **David Goodwin** would be the fourth Nittany Lion to wear the 'C' in 2016-17.

• Goodwin was joined by senior classmate **Ricky DeRosa** and junior **James Robinson** who will serve as alternates.

• All three will be wearing letters for the first time.

NITTANY LIONS TO MAKE AT LEAST 12 TV APPEARANCES

• The Big Ten released its 2016-17 television schedule on Monday, Sept. 26 and Penn State will have at least 12 televised games, for the second consecutive season.

- Both forwards migrated to the U.S. and to Pennsylvania in their early teen years, playing youth hockey in the Keystone State.

PACKING THE PEG

- Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 54-of-56 home games, including all 18 during the 2015-16 season.

- More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 35 occasions including 15 games last season.

- In 2015-16, Penn State ranked seventh in average attendance (6,093) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (105.4 percent).

- Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 109,681 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena, which is the most in the facilities short three-year history.

WELCOME HOME

- Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

- The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

- The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

- Penn State has 27 players on the 2016-17 roster and after dealing with injuries throughout the majority of last season they are excited about this added depth. With 16 forwards and eight defensemen the internal competition and confidence is high.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

- The Big Ten is in its fourth season entering 2016-17. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 20 league games, including 10 home contests.

- Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a shootout win and one point for a shootout loss.

- Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

- The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only major football conference to sponsor men's hockey.

- The 2017 league tournament will take place at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. with the tournament champion earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 17th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2016-17. Gadowsky is currently coaching his fifth Penn State varsity team.

AT PENN STATE

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions rise continued as Gadowsky led Penn State to their best finish since making the leap to NCAA Division I status. The Lions secured their first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

Those 2015-16 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of

the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign had gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten teams (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL arena (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, pre-





sented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

While at Princeton, Gadowsky had more than 20 players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalembe (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, who were ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

In addition, Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

In addition, Gadowsky spent a portion of the 1993-94 season competing with the Canadian National Team and also played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.

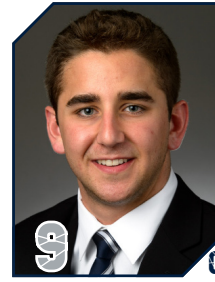
