The No. 18 Penn State field hockey team is on the road again as they travel to Ann Arbor, Michigan for their next two games. Friday, Sept. 18 the Nittany Lions Big Ten play against the Michigan Wolverines at the Ocker Field in Ann Arbor, followed by a non-conference Saturday match against Kent State at 4 p.m.

Last Time Out

With less than five minutes left in the game, the Nittany Lions seemed to have their game against California under control. Both **Aurelia Meijer** and **Gini Bramley** had scored their first career goals and Penn State looked poised to collect their third win of the season. California had other plans as the Golden Bears rallied to score two goals in the final four minutes of regulation extending the game into overtime. Cal kept the momentum on their side needing only 6:49 to score the winning goal.

Michigan Series History

Penn State is 24-17-0 against Michigan in a series that dates back to 1992. Last season, the No. 6 Nittany Lions fell to the Wolverines. 3-2 in an overtime loss at home.

Scouting Michigan

- The Wolverines return after finishing 2014 13-7 and 7-2 in Big Ten play. Michigan returns 19 players from last season.
- The team returns senior Lauren Thomas, who is a three-time All-Big 10 and NFHCA All-West Region selection.
- -Michigan's defense has been one of their strengths this season, holding opponents to 1.52 goals per game and 4.85 penalty corners per game.
- Senior forward, Shannon Scavelli returns as Michigans top goal scorer tallying seven goals and

four assists last season.

- Michigan's freshman class combined for three All-America, and 10 all-state honors during their high school careers.

Kent State Series History

Penn State is 2-0-0 all-time against Kent State in a series dating back to only 2000. The Nittany Lions have not lost to the Golden Flash since the series opener, picking up a 3-1 win at home in 2002.

Scouting Kent State

- The Golden Flashes return after posting an overall record of 11-11 and 5-1 in Mid-American Conference play last season.
- Kent State was selected as the regular season and tournament favorite entering the 2015 season for the Mid-American Conference. last season, just seven goals
- The Golden Flashes lost their top-two scorers from last season to graduation, but have seen Ines Delpech step up as the offensive threat, leading Kent State in shots Senior Stephanie Hussey, on goal.
- Midfielder, Ines Delpech, was MAC Freshman-of-the-Year in her each named to the 2015 Big 2014-15 season.
- Goalkeeper Andrea Rinehart had a 3.13 goals against average and 119 saves while playing every minute of the 2014 season.
- This will be the third netural site game if the season for Kent State, currently holding an 0-2 record in the previous two neutral site games.

Postseason Fixture

The Nittany Lions return after making the NCAA Tournament field each of the last five seasons. Penn State has been at the top of the Big Ten in those seasons as well, being named co-conference

regular season champions in 2013 and the outright winner in 2012. The squad won the Big Ten Tournament in 2011 and 2012.

Youth Movement

- Penn State opens the 2015 season with a young roster comprised of 10 freshmen, eight sophomores, five juniors, and two seniors.
- The squad returns just three starters from 2014 in junior Carly Celkos, junior Emilee Ehret and sophomore Cori Conley.
- Of the 25 players on the roster, 15 had never played in a regular season game for the Lions before 2015.
- Of Penn State's 57 goals and 36 assists (150 points) tallied and seven assists (21 points) are returning.

junior Carly Celkos and sophomoroe Cori Conley were Ten Field Hockey Players to Watch List.

Remaining Elite in the Rankings

The Nittany Lions were selected No. 7 in the 2015 Penn Metro/ NFHCA Division I Preseason Poll. The squad holds the second-highest ranking of any Big Ten team in the top 20. Maryland (No. 3) is the only conference foe ranked higher. Penn State plays eight teams ranked that are ranked in the preseason poll.

Both a USFHA and NFHCA Hall of Fame inductee, Charlene Morett-Curtiss ranks as the longest tenured coach in the Big Ten and the sixth-longest tenure at a single school in Division I field hockey history with 28 seasons completed as head coach of the Penn State field hockey program. Morett-Curtiss boasts a remarkable resume covering her time both as the leader of the Nittany Lions. Over the last seven years, Morett-Curtiss has led the Nittany Lions to three Big Ten regular season titles, two Big Ten Tournament championships and six NCAA Tournament appearances.

She also ranks as one of the top players in program history, as she was a three-time first-team All-American and an Olympic medalist.

Morett-Curtiss currently ranks fifth all-time in Division I history in wins with 474 and is one of just six DI coaches to accumulate 400 career wins. She has led the Nittany Lions to the NCAA Tournament in 25 of her 28 years at the helm and has helped maintain the program's distinction as the No. 3 ranked school in all-time NCAA Tournament appearances with 30.

Morett-Curtiss' teams have also produced a run of success in Big Ten games that is unparalleled since Penn State joined the conference in 1992. Since that time, the Nittany Lions own the most Big Ten regular season wins, the highest Big Ten regular season and tournament winning percentage, the most Big Ten Tournament titles and the most Big Ten Tournament wins.

Morett-Curtiss' 2002 and 2007 teams reached the National Championship game, her 1990, 1991 and 1993 teams reached the NCAA Semifinals, and her 1988, 1992 and 1994 squads missed joining the Elite Foursome after one-goal losses in overtime. She has guided the Nittany Lions to seven Big Ten Championships (1993, 1997, 1998, 2005, 2008, 2012, 2013), six Big Ten Tournament titles (1995-1998, 2011, 2012) and two Atlantic 10 Conference championships (1989, 1990).

One of the best teachers of the game, Morett-Curtiss' success at PSU has led to numerous coaching honors. She has been voted the Mideast Region Coach of the Year seven times (1990, 1991, 1993, 2000, 2005, 2007 and 2010), The Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year in 1989 and the Big Ten Coach of the Year five times (1993, 1998, 2005, 2008 and 2012.)

Morett-Curtiss' teams have not only excelled on the field but also in the classroom. Penn State has produced 216 Academic All-Big Ten selections since 1992 and is the only school in the Big Ten to have 10 or more Academic All-Big Ten selections for 14 of the past 15 seasons. The 2012 squad produced a record 16 athletes named Academic All-Big Ten. Additionally, a record 16 members of the team were named to the NFHCA National Academic Squad in 2008, a then-record 14 the year before, and in the two years previous to that, a total of 12 players were named to the squad in each season.

Three different student-athletes have received Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors since 2000, and Kelsey Amy (2011-12) and Laura Gebhart (2014) have given the Lions first-team representation

Most recently, the team boasted the highest women's GPA for the 2013-14 season. The program has also earned public recognition from the NCAA during the last eight consecutive seasons for high scores in the Academic Progress Rate (APR) compilation, and has been recognized in nine out of the 10 years of the program.
