OUICK HITS

SETTING THE SCENE | Penn State looks for its ninth-consecutive win when it takes on in-state foe Drexel at the recently-opened PPL Center Saturday in Allentown, Pa. The game will tip at 2 p.m. and be broadcast on ESPN3 with Tim Neverett and former NIttany Lion Brian Allen on the call.

DYK? | The Nittany Lions are 10-1 on the season and riding an eight-game winning streak, both of which are the best marks since the 1995-96 season when the Lions started 13-0 en route to making the NCAA tournament.

EARNING VOTES | Penn State received votes in both the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll for the first time since the 2011 season. The Nittany Lions have not been ranked in either since 1996.

THE SERIES | The game Saturday will be the first meeting between Penn State and Drexel since 1992 and will be the first of two scheduled off-campus contests. The Nittany Lions are the host team at the PPL Center, while the Dragons will be the home team next year at the Palestra (Date: TBD). [MORE: Page 2]

DREXEL | The Dragons enter Saturday with a 2-7 record after dropping each of their last three games. They have two mutual opponents with the Nittany Lions in USC and Cornell as participants in the Charleston Classic. [MORE: page 2]

GAMEDAY INFO

NON-CONFERNCE WINS | Penn State has hit 10 conference wins for the first time under Patrick Chambers and first since 2008-09. The record for wins before league play is 11, set during that 08-09 campaign.

BEST IN THE B1G | At eight games, Penn State has the longest winning streak among all 14 Big Ten teams and is tied with Maryland and Wisconsin for the highest win percentage (.909). The trio are tied for 10th in Division I.

HOME SWEET HOME | Penn State is 6-0 in the Bryce Jordan Center this season and has won each of its last 11 non-conference games in the BJC.

CHAIRMEN OF THE BOARDS | Penn State is third among league teams in rebounds with 39.7 per game, up from 35.2 last season. The Lions have outrebounded its opponent in eight of 11 games. Ross Travis is second in the Big Ten with 7.9 rpg and an average of 8.8 in the last four games.

AMONG THE BEST | The Nittany Lions are ranked among the Big Ten and NCAA best in several categories, including win percentage, rebounding and field goal percentage defense. [Chart: Page 5]

KEEPING IT CLOSE | Through 11 games, Penn State has had four decided by one possession, winning each of them. Last season, the Lions had eight games decided by three points or fewer in the regular season. They lost each of the first five and won the last three, giving them a seven-game win streak in regular-season, one-possession games.

COMEBACKS | The Lions have battled back from second-half deficits of 14 (Akron), 13 (Cornell), 8 (Virginia Tech) and 6 (Southern California) in recent wins.

UP NEXT | Penn State closes out the non-conference slate with Dartmouth at 4 p.m. Monday in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Big Green is 4-5 on the season with a game vs. Northern

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING DREXEL

- The Dragons enter Saturday with a 2-7 record after falling to Buffalo, 80-70, Tuesday on the road. Their two wins came vs. Cornell, 61-59, in the Charleston Classic, and at home against Southern Mississippi, 59-36. Drexel's other mutual opponent with Penn State is Southern California.
- Damion Lee leads the Dragons with 20.7 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game. He is the lone Drexel player averaging in double figures and has led the team in scoring in all but one game on the year.
- Rodney Williams is the team's leading rebounder with 8.0 per game, while tallying 8.9 ppg.
- The Dragons are coached by Bruiser Flint, who in his 14th season with the program.

SERIES HISTORY

- Penn State is 4-0 in the all-time series, though the teams have not met since 1992. The last meeting was a 73-64 win for the Nittany Lions Dec. 21, 1992 in Rec Hall. John Amaechi had the first 20-point game of his career in the win.
- This game is the first of two off-campus games scheduled.
 Penn State will be the home team at the PPL Center, while the Dragons will play host next season in the Palestra on a to-be-determined mid-December date.

CONNECTIONS

- Patrick Chambers and Drexel coach Bruiser Flint both played at Episcopal Academy in Philly for the legendary coach Dan Dougherty. Flint graduated in 1983, while Chambers finished in 1989 before going on to play at Philadelphia University, where he remains the all-time assists leader.
- Chambers and Flint will pay tribute to Dougherty, who retired as the winningest coach in Philadelphia City League history, in a pregame ceremony.
- Shep Garner was a high school teammate with Drexel's Rashann London at Roman Catholic in Philadelphia. The pair played together for six years; this is the first time they will face each other as opposition.

ABOUT THE PPL CENTER

The PPL Center is a state-of-the-art multipurpose arena in downtown Allentown, Pa. The arena seats more than 10,000 for concerts and more than 8,500 for Phantoms professional hockey games, making it the region's largest events venue. The amenities-packed PPL Center will host more than 140 events each year. PPL Center will be the heart of the Lehigh Valley and is currently the main catalyst to the revitalization and growth of downtown Allentown.

LINEUPS | Penn State has used two different starting lineup combinations this season and more than 70 different in-game combinations. The lineup of Shep Garner, D.J. Newbill, Brandon Taylor, Ross Travis and Jordan Dickerson has wins in each of the last four games. [MORE: Page 24]

ATTENDANCE ON RISE | Attendance for non-conference home games this season is up nearly 60 percent from where it was a year ago. The Lions are averaging 7,766 fans per game in 2014-15, compared to 4,895 a year ago.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic. The Lions went on to the Sweet 16 that season.

STANDOUTS

D.J. NEWBILL | is averaging 22.1 ppg, tops in the Big Ten and ninth in the country among DI players. Through Wednesday games this week, his 241 total points and 8` made field goals were the second and third-most of any DI player, respectively. [More: Page 16]

With 1,329 career points at Penn State, **Newbill** holds the record among players to spend just three years in the Blue and White and is No. 12 all-time. [More: Page 23]

SHEP GARNER | is second on the team in both scoring (10.5 ppg) and assists (2.3 apg) as a freshman. He has scored 10+ in all but three games this season, but has seen increased assist and rebound numers when limited in scoring. [More: Page 11]

BRANDON TAYLOR | has scored 17 points in two of the last three games and is third on the team in scoring with 10.4 points per game. In games when BT scores in double figures, the Nittany Lions average 78.8 points per game with a +6.8 scoring margin, compared to 64.2 as a team and a margin of just +4.2. [MORE: Page 17]

DONOVON JACK | is averaging 5.8 points per game in the last four games since coming off the bench, compared to 3.5 as a starter. He has been an asset around the rim, picking up several points off a rebound and put-back. Against Marshall, there was a 30-second span with an offensive rebound, bucket, defensive rebound and two made FTs to help seal the win late in the game. [MORE: Page 12]

GENO THORPE | led the Lions with a career-high 19 points vs. Duquesne. He has produced and then topped career highs twice this season. Thorpe leads the team and is seventh in the Big Ten with 86 percent free-throw shooting (among players with at least 20 attempts). He is 42-49 from the line, including a personal-best 11-14 showing vs. the Dukes.

ROSS TRAVIS | is second in the Big Ten in rebounding with 7.9 per game after leading the team in each of the last four games and eight this season. In the last four games, he's grabbed an average of 8.8 per game. Travis is 12th all-time at Penn State and with his career average produced this season, will end up in the Top 3. [More: Page 19]

SEASON NOTES

PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

THROWBACK UNIS

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and. vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season — D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

CHAMBERS BEGINS YEAR FOUR

The 2014-15 season marks the fourth in University Park for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native has seen his win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season as he racked up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State, a road win at Indiana and his first PSU postseason appearance last season.

ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

OFFSEASON TRAINING

The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week.

Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

PENN STATE OPENS THE 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.





Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State — a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia — before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It was also shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

SCORING

D.J. Newbill has 1,349 points in his third season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 12 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

With his junior point total (604) replicated, Newbill would enter the Top 4 at Penn State. With at least a 500-point season, Newbill would become just the second PSU player to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

REBOUNDS

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last two seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, entered the Top 15 in career boards at Penn State. He curently has 690.

By producing the average of his last two seasons (7.2), Travis would entrench himself in the No. 3 spot all-time.

BLOCKS

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He has 66 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 53 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

With six blocks vs. George Washington, Jordan Dickerson saw his average jump to 1.5 per game, which ranks 11th in the Big Tehn.

Last season, Dickerson produced 31 blocks in the 24 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.



Game 1: Penn State 61, Morgan State 48

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Behind a trio of double-digit scorers, Penn State men's basketball (1-0) earned a 61-48 season-opening victory against Morgan State (0-1) Friday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill (Philadelphia, Pa.) scored 17 points, while freshman Shep Garner (Chester, Pa.) added 14.

Morgan State was led by Cedric Blossom's 10 points and Blake Bozeman's 9. The Bears shot just 18 of 58 from the field and were only 3 of 18 on their 3-point attempts.

Tied at 4-4 in the opening half, Morgan State used a 12-4 run to go up by as many as eight, 16-8, with 9:41 remaining in the frame. Penn State rallied back with a 12-2 stretch to lift the Nittany Lions on top, 21-18, with six minutes left in the period. The Bears answered with a 5-2 strike to keep the frame knotted, 23-23, but PSU regrouped with an 8-2 run to go up by as many as six, 31-25, heading into the intermission.

Garner came out firing to start the second half with his first 3-pointer for a nine-point Penn State lead. Bolstering the lead to as many as 16 in the second half, the Nittany Lions did not let the advantage dip below 10 as PSU powered to a 61-48 win.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State has now won its last 10 season openers. Having not lost a season-opening contest since 2004, the win also marks the fourth consecutive for head coach Patrick Chambers.
- Penn State moves to 89-30 all-time in season openers and 79-10 in yearly home openers.
- The Nittany Lions improve their advantage to 5-0 in all-time series against Morgan State.
- Penn State moves to 13-1 all-time against current squads in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Shep Garner made his first collegiate start for the Nittany Lions against
 Morgan State. Garner is the first true freshman to start in a season
 opener since Trey Lewis in 2011, who made his rookie debut for the
 Nittany Lions Nov. 12, 2011 vs. Hartford. Both Garner (14) and Lewis
 (17) recorded double figure scoring in their debut outings for PSU.
- D.J. Newbill hit the court for his 66th consecutive start in the Blue and White, as he's started every single contest since arriving on campus as a sophomore transfer.
- With 17 points, Newbill recorded his 10th consecutive double-digit scoring outing, having posted double figures in every game since notching 22 against lowa Feb. 15, 2014.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Four Nittany Lions scored in double figures as Penn State men's basketball (2-0) powered to a 73-54 victory against Fordham (1-1) Sunday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill scored 18 points, freshman Shep Garner added 12 on four 3-pointers. junior Brandon Taylor and senior John Johnson each scored 11 as the Nittany Lions sank 25 of 53 field-goal attempts and seven of 18 3-pointers. The Lions held the Rams to 17-of-55 shooting, including just 8-of-26 3-pointers.

Nemanja Zarkovic scored 14 points for Fordham and Chris Sengfelder added 10.

The Nittany Lions won the rebounding battle (40-37) and held the Rams' Eric Paschall to just seven points. Paschall, who scored 31 against New York Institute of Technology Friday night, fouled out with 12:56 remaining. Senior Ross Travis had nine rebounds and eight points.

Tied up at 10-10 in the first half after some early back-and-forth action, senior John Johnson sparked a 6-0 run with a three-point play that lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by as many as six, 16-10. The Rams cut off the streak with a free throw, but Penn State surged ahead with eight more unanswered points capped off with a dunk by Newbill to stretch the advantage to double-digits, 24-11.

POSTGAME NOTES

- PSU limited Fordham to 29.3 percent shooting from the field marking the first time that the Nittany Lions have held a team to less than 30 percent from the field since Dec. 23, 2012 against New Hampshire (22.6%).
- Four Nittany Lions recorded double-figure scoring in the win including, D.J. Newbill (18), Shep Garner (12), John Johnson (11) and Brandon Taylor (11)
- Penn State's four-guard rotation of Newbill, Garner, Thorpe and Johnson combined for 62 percent of the Nittany Lions' offense scoring 45 of 73 total points.
- The Penn State victory extended the Nittany Lion winning streak to six straight when playing on Nov. 16, as PSU moved to 7-1 all-time on the day.
- Penn State improved to 3-2 in the all-time series against the Rams in the first meeting between the two teams since 1973. The Nittany Lions also move to 1-1 at home in the series against Fordham.

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP) - Led by a career-high 35 points from senior D.J. Newbill, Penn State men's basketball (2-1) fell short in a 106-97, double overtime loss to Charlotte (2-0) on the road in the Charleston Classic Thursday evening at TD Arena. The Nittany Lions rallied back from behind by as many as 17 points in the second half to send the game into two overtimes.

Four Nittany Lions posted double digit scoring, led by Newbill's career-high mark. Newbill is the first Nittany Lion to notch 35 points since Pete Lisicky put up the tally against Penn in 1996. Junior Brandon Taylor finished second on the squad with 19 points, including 11 in the first half.

Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, while freshman Shep Garner rounded out the group with 12 points. Senior Ross Travis and Taylor led the team with nine rebounds apiece.

This one looked like a runaway with Charlotte up 63-46 with 11:46 left in regulation. But Penn State used a 37-20 run to the buzzer and tied the game on senior John Johnson's 3-pointer with 1.6 seconds left.

Penn State had a chance to win in the first overtime, but Newbill's drive to the basket with the game tied at 90-all was blocked by Cameron Blakley. Ogbueze got the 49ers going in the second extra session. Thorne added two foul shots and a jam and Charlotte was up 97-93.

- Penn State erased a 17-point deficit in the second half to force the game into overtime (83-83) with a clutch three-pointer from John Johnson with two seconds remaining.
- A second overtime was forced (90-90), marking the first double-overtime game for Penn State since March 7, 2009 vs. Iowa (Iowa, 75-67).
- With a career-high 35 points, senior D.J. Newbill notched his first career 30-point game. The 35 points stand as the most by a Penn State player since Joe Crispin tallied 35 vs. Iowa Jan. 6, 2001.
- Newbill used 33 field-goal attempts in the process, the second-most in program history behind only Gene Harris' 37 vs. Holy Cross in 1962
- Newbill has 1,178 career points, which vaults him into 19th place on the Penn State all-time list. He needs just six more points to match Ron Brown (1972-74) for 18th all-time.
- Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, marking the second time this season he's reach double figure scoring.
- Senior John Johnson scored his only three points of the game with a clutch 3-pointer with two seconds remaining in regulation to send the contest into overtime.

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 26 points including the driving layup as the buzzer sounded to lift Penn State to a 72-71 victory over Cornell at the Charleston Classic on Friday night.

Last FG - PSU 2nd-00:00, COR 2nd-00:44. Largest lead - PSU by 2 1st-17:38, COR by 13 1st-05:11. PSU led for 00:07. COR led for 32:39. Game was tied for 07:10.

The Big Red (2-3) were up 71-70 with four seconds left but threw the inbounds pass into the backcourt to beat the five-second clock. Geno Thorpe picked it up and passed to Newbill on the left side. Newbill dribbled the baseline and went up for the winning shot before time ran out.

It was the first lead for Penn State (3-1) since going up 4-2 less than three minutes into the game.

John Johnson had 17 points, including a high arcing 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that drew the Nittany Lions to 71-70.

Galal Cancer and Robert Hatter had 17 points each for Cornell, which faces Drexel for seventh place game Sunday.

It was a dramatic change of fortune for the Nittany Lions in Charleston. They rallied from 17 points down against Charlotte on Thursday night only to fall 106-97 in double overtime.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State trailed by as many as 13 before erasing an 11-point second-half deficit to earn the win with a buzzer-beating layup from D.J. Newbill.
- The 13-point deficit is the largest comeback for a win since the Nittany Lions overcame a 13-point disadvantage to defeat Indiana on the road, 66-65, Feb. 12, 2014.
- Penn State led for all of:07 in the entire contest. The game-winning bucket was its first advantage since the 17:38 mark in the first half.
- The game featured seven ties and three lead changes. Cornell led for 32:39 of the game
- Penn State moves to 6-5 all-time against the Big Red, while head coach Patrick Chambers moves to 3-0 against Cornell in his career at both Penn State and Boston University.
- With 26 points, D.J. Newbill recorded his second-consecutive 20-plus point outing this season and 22nd of his career.
- Newbill tallied 15 first-half points going 3-3 from 3-point range and 4-8 from the field. He finished the evening 4-5 from the 3-point line.
- John Johnson set a season-high mark with 17 points, shooting 6-9 from the field and 4-4 from the free-throw line.
- Thirteen of Johnson's 17 points came in the second half, including a 3-pointer with:04 on the clock to make it a one-point game, 71-70

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - If Penn State wanted to close the Charleston Classic with a victory, coach Pat Chambers knew D.J. Newbill would have to make the biggest plays.

Newbill came through with 16 of his 22 points in the second half in the Nittany Lions' 63-61 win over Southern Cal in Sunday's fifth place game. He finished the three games with 83 points to set the tournament scoring mark, surpassing the 78 scored by St. Joseph's Carl Jones in 2011.

Penn State opened 4-1 for the third time in Chambers' four seasons.

After the Trojans (2-3) built a 49-43 lead with just under 10 minutes left, Newbill scored 10 of Penn State's next 13 points in their go-ahead run. His second 3-pointer put the Nittany Lions ahead to stay at 56-54.


Southern Cal was still within 62-60 on Jordan McLaughlin's foul shot with 1.3 seconds left. But Shep Garner made a foul shot with 0.7 seconds left to provide the final point.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The two wins at the 2014 Charleston Classic mark the first time Penn State has won at least two games at a neutral site tournament since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Nittany Lions knocked off Princeton, 65-52, Dec. 26 and Hofstra, 74-71, Dec. 27 before going on to the NCAA Sweet 16 that season.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Trojans to 27.3 percent from the field marking the second time this season Penn State has held a team to less than 30 percent from the field.
- PSU matched a season-high mark with seven team 3-pointers, marking the second-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have reached the mark.
- The Nittany Lions did not attempt a free-throw until the 7:57 mark of the second half. USC had a 22-0 advantage in free-throw attempts to that point and finished with a 27-10 margin.
- With 83 points across all three games of the Charleston Classic, D.J. Newbill now holds the scoring record for the most points in tournament history. The previous record was held by Saint Joseph's Carl Jones (2011) with 78 points.
- Newbill averaged 27.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals over the last three games, while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range, 47 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw line.
- Shep Garner registered 12 points in the first half, shooting 4-5 from both the field and 3-point range. He concluded the night ranked second on the team in scoring with 13 points.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) -- Patrick Chambers made it clear to his Penn State players that their first 20 minutes of play against Akron Tuesday night were not acceptable.

His players made it clear in the second half that they heard him. D.J. Newbill scored 29 points, Penn State outscored Akron by 19 points in the second half and the Nittany Lions defeated the Zips 78-72.

Brandon Taylor was 4 of 11 from 3-point range and added 14 for the Lions, who trailed 45-32 at the half. Geno Thorpe scored 10 points. Penn State (5-1) opened the second half by holding Akron (3-2) scoreless for 6:19 and built a 47-45 lead off a 15-0 run.

Deji Ibitayo scored 17 points and Noah Robotham 16 for the Zips, but Akron's second-half shooting woes opened the door for the Nittany Lions.

The Zips, who shot 58.6 percent from the field in the first half, went 6 of 29 in the second (21.2 percent). Penn State was 14 of 22 and shot 45.6 percent overall.

The Lions also got four blocked shots from Jordan Dickerson and three more from Taylor as Penn State increased its pressure on Akron around the rim.

- Penn State trailed 45-32 at the half, but came out of the break scoring 16 unanswered points and took a 48-45 lead with 13:55 left in regulation
- The game featured three ties and three lead changes with Penn State taking the lead for good with 8:56 to play (56-54).
- After allowing Akron to shoot 17-of-29 (58.6 percent) in the first half, the Nittany Lions held the Zips to 7-of-33 (21.2 percent) shooting in the second half.
- The Nittany Lions have battled back from deficits of 14 (Akron), 6 (Southern California) and 13 (Cornell) in its three-game winning streak.
- Penn State had a 46-27 advantage in the second half. The Lions are outscoring opponents 236-191 (+45) in the second frame through six games this season, opposed to being outscored 198-194 (-4) in the first period.
- Penn State improved to 5-2 all-time against Akron and 3-0 in games played at home.

Lewisburg, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 28 points and Penn State pulled away late for an 88-80 victory over Bucknell on Friday. The Nittany Lions (6-1) never trailed but never led by more than 12.

Bucknell (2-5) tied the game once, at 66-all, with 6:19 to play. Penn State answered with a 12-4 run and held steady from there with Newbill scoring six of the Nittany Lions' last 10 points to secure the win.

Ross Travis added 14 points, and Brandon Taylor and Geno Thorpe had 12 apiece. Penn State was 8 of 15 from 3-point range and 30 of 54 from the field.

The Bison used a 16-6 run to pull even late in the second half, but Chris Hass and John Azzinaro turned the ball over on consecutive possessions to halt the momentum.

Haas cut the deficit to 83-78 on a 3-poiner with 1:07 left and the Bison would get no closer. Penn State led 39-33 at halftime, and Newbill scored 21 of his 28 in the second half. Taylor's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the first half gave Penn State its largest lead at 31-19. The Bison answered with nine straight points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- · With the 88-80 win on the road at Bucknell, Penn State improves to 6-1on the year, marking the second consecutive year PSU has opened the year with a 6-1 mark under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-1 away from the Bryce Jordan Center and 1-0 after their first true road game. The team has won their first true away game in each of the last two seasons.
- · The win also extends the current Nittany Lion winning streak to four straight, marking the third consecutive season PSU has put together a four-game winning streak.
- The Nittany Lions went 30-54 from the field for a season-high 56 percent mark in the win. Penn State also made 20 of 26 attempts from the free throw line for a season-high 77 percent from the charity stripe.
- In the first half alone, Penn State shot 86 percent from the 3-point line, nailing six three's, while also shooting 54 percent from the field in the opening half.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Patrick Chambers was eager to point out that Penn State's defense played a huge role in the Nittany Lions' 61-58 ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Virginia Tech Wednesday night. D.J. Newbill scored 18 points and Shep Garner added 13 for Penn State (7-1), but the Lions crafted a 47-38 edge in rebounding. They were led by 10 from Ross Travis, eight from Jordan Dickerson and seven each from Brandon Taylor and Donovon Jack.

Penn State limited the Hokies (4-3) to 38.5 percent shooting from the field and 28.6 from 3-point range during the back-andforth game in which a 16-2 second-half run turned momentum in Penn State's favor. It was the fourth one-possession game Penn State has played this season.

Joey van Zegeren scored 18 points for the Hokies and Justin Bibbs added 16. But Tech hit only 4 of 14 free throws and 4 of 14 3-pointers. The Hokies (4-3) led by as many as eight points early in the second half but Penn State's Newbill scored 13 second-half points after a 1-of-5 first-half shooting performance.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Penn State victory extends the Nittany Lions winning streak to five in a row, putting PSU out to its best start (7-1) under head coach Patrick Chambers and for the program since the 2008-09 campaign.
- · Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points in the win, led by D.J. Newbill and Shep Garner, who each recorded double figure scoring.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Penn State has gotten off to its best start in more than a decade because it's been able to finish.

The Nittany Lions took the lead late in the first half and never trailed in the second en route to a 64-62 victory over Duquesne Wednesday night. Their seventh straight victory is the longest streak since 2007-08 and is the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.

Geno Thorpe scored a career-high 19 points, freshman Shep Garner added 13 and Penn State upped its record to 9-1, its best start since the Lions' 2000-01 Sweet 16 season.

The Dukes (3-3), who were led by 18 points from Jordan Stevens and 11 from TySean Powell, took a potential game-winning shot at the final buzzer, but Micah Mason's 3-pointer fell short.

D.J. Newbill and Donovon Jack each added 11 for Penn State, and Jack made good on four free throws in the final two minutes.

Penn State, after a 5-of-10 first-half performance at the free throw line, sank 15 of 18 in the final 20 minutes. Penn State led by 10 early in the second half but Powell and Stevens teamed up for an 8-2 Duquesne run to close to 46-42, and Duquesne got to within 52-51 when Darius Lewis made good on a three-point play.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State matches its best start, 9-1, since the 2000-01 team also started 9-1. That team finished 21-12 and made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen
- Penn State has now won seven straight games, its most since winning seven in a row in 2007-08 and the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.
- The Lions have had five games decided by five or fewer points and four by just one possession. They have won all of them this season and have been victorious in each of their last seven games decided by three or fewer points, dating back to last season.
- The Nittany Lions held Duquesne to just 4-of-19 from beyond the arc (21.1 percent). The Dukes came into the game shooting 45.8 percent collectively from 3-point range.
- The 35 bench points for Penn State are the most since posting 44 vs. Central Connecticut State on Nov. 22, 2010.
- The Nittany Lions, who led by just one (29-28) at the midpoint, started the second half on an 11-2 run to take a 40-30 lead at the 15:59 mark in the second half.
- Penn State improved to 27-19 all-time against Duquesne.
- Geno Thorpe scored 19 points, a career high. His previous best was 14 against Charlotte on Nov. 20, 2014.
- Shep Garner had 13 points in the game and has now scored in double figures seven times in 10 games this season.
- Garner posted four assists, tying his personal best, which he also did at Marshall (Dec. 6, 2014).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - A solid defensive effort enabled Penn State to inch closer to its coach's season-long goal of playing a complete, 40-minute game on Sunday. DJ. Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor added 17, and Penn State defeated GW 64-51 for its eighth straight win. The Nittany Lions (10-1), who also got 10 points from Shep Garner, shot 38.7 percent (18 of 53) from the field and were 9 of 9 from the free throw line. But six blocks from Jordan Dickerson - out of 11 total blocks - and 10 rebounds from Ross Travis helped shut down a Colonials team that averaged nearly 74 points per game.

George Washington (6-3), which was led by 15 points each from Kevin Larsen and Patricio Garino, consistently shot from under the basket but made good on only 18 of 53 shots for 34 percent. The Colonials failed to score on eight 3-point shots and were just 15 of 23 from the free throw line.

Penn State's start is its best since the 1995-96 team jumped to a 13-0 record and ultimately advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions outrebounded GW 40-35. Its 16 offensive rebounds, many of which came late in the second half, enabled Penn State to kick the ball out to the backcourt and kill time while holding leads that ranged from 10 to 15 points down the stretch.

- Penn State extends its winning streak to eight in a row with the win against George Washington to move to 10-1 on the year, marking the best start for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season. The streak also is the longest for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season (13).
- Having posted wins in its last eight non-conference games, Penn State's 10 non-conference wins are also the most for PSU since the 2008-09 season (11).
- PSU's eight-game winning stretch is the longest among all 14 Big Tenteams
- The Nittany Lions registered a season-high mark with 11 blocks in the win, marking the most for PSU since posting 13 against Duquesne in
- Penn State grabbed a season-high 16 offensive rebounds, posting a 40-35 advantage against GW on the glass.
- GW did not hit a 3-point field goal in the game, going 0-8 from behind the arc. The last time Penn State held an opponent without a trey was Feb. 5. 2013 vs. Purdue.
- Penn State held the Colonials to 34 percent shooting on the game, its fourth opponent to shoot below 35 percent this season, and to a stifling 29 percent in the second half.
- Improving to 20-11 all-time against the Colonials, Penn State has won eight of the last 10 games in the series, having claimed a win in the first meeting between the two teams since 1991.
- The Nittany Lions also improve to 6-0 at home, having won its last 11 non-conference games in the Bryce Jordan Center.
