## QUICK NOTES

- Duquesne, coming off a 95-75 win over New Orleans on Monday, hosts Penn State on Friday, Nov. 20 at 7:00 p.m. at CONSOL Energy Center in its most challenging game of the young season. The Dukes, who have scored 96 and 95 points in their first two games, will be facing a PSU team that has given up an average of 56.0 ppg. in wins over VMI (62-50) and DePaul (68-62 on Tuesday). This is the first road game for the Nittany Lions. It is the first of two games at CONSOL Energy Center (vs. Pitt on Dec. 4) this season for Duquesne.

- DU is 2-2 in non-conference home games at Palumbo Center (6th season), where the Dukes have split with both Penn State and West Virginia (Jim Ferry is 1-1 in those games with a 60-56 win over WVU on Dec. 11, 2012 and a 68-59 loss to Penn State on Dec. 11, 2013)

- The Dukes return four starters - senior Gs Derrick Colter & Micah Mason, senior F Jeremiah Jones and junior C Darius Lewis - from last year's 12-19 team (6-12 in the A-10/11th place). Duquesne was picked to finish 11th in the 2015-16 Atlantic 10 annual preseason poll of coaches and media. Colter, Mason and Lewis had 15 points each in Friday's win over Seton Hill.

- The Dukes are in their fourth season under head coach Jim Ferry. Ferry, who came to DU after leading LIU Brooklyn to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances (2011 & 2012), is the 16th coach in school history. This is the 100th season for Duquesne basketball.

## 100th SEASON

Duquesne is celebrating its 100th season of men's basketball in 2015-16. DU, which played its first game on Jan. 9, 1914, disbanded the program for three seasons (1944-45-46) to assist with the World War II effort. Here are some Dukes basketball historical highlights:

### Duquesne Did You Know?

DYK • Duquesne was the first program to play in both the NIT and NCAA tournament in the same season (1940).

DYK • DU's Chuck Cooper was the first African-American drafted by an NBA team (Boston Celtics in 1950).

DYK • Duquesne produced one of the first two African-Americans to win an NBA title in Jim Tucker. Tucker and Earl Lloyd were both members of the 1955 NBA Champion Syracuse Nationals. Tucker is also part of another NBA footnote. On February 20, 1955, the rookie forward posted the fastest triple-double in NBA history (17 minutes) - in a 104-84 win over the New York Knicks. Tucker finished with 12 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists.

DYK • Duquesne is one of only four current Atlantic 10 schools that has reached the top of the Associated Press poll. The Dukes were ranked No. 1 in the country for two weeks in 1954.

DYK • Duquesne was at the forefront in the recruitment of African-American athletes. Loyola's (Ill.) 1963 team is credited by the NCAA as being the first to field a five-man, all black lineup. Nine years prior, the 1954 Dukes came close to doing the same with a team whose top four scorers were black: starters Dick Ricketts, Sihugo Green & Jim Tucker along with sixth man Fletcher Johnson. DU's first recorded African-American athlete was Cumberland Posey - who played under the name Charles Cumbert - from 1915-18. Posey, who went on to greater fame as the manager and later owner of the fabled Homestead Grays of the Negro Baseball League, was honored for his contributions to the game by being one of 17 Negro League greats inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame on Feb. 27, 2006. Posey, along with Harvard grad Edwin Henderson, is considered to have been instrumental in introducing basketball to the black community in the early 1900s.

DYK • Duquesne is the only school in NCAA history to produce the No. 1 overall pick in back-to-back NBA Drafts (Dick Ricketts by the Milwaukee Hawks in 1955 & Sihugo Green by the Rochester Royals in 1956).

DYK • Duquesne, led by consensus All-Americans Ricketts and Green, won the 1955 NIT. DU is one of five current A-10 schools with an NCAA or NIT title.

## NOTING THE DUKES

• 2015-16 marks the 100th season for Duquesne basketball.

• Duquesne returns four starters - 5-11 Sr. G Derrick Colter (15.0 ppg., 93 career g.), 6-2 Sr. G Micah Mason (21.5 ppg., 88 career g.), 6-4 Sr. F Jeremiah Jones (9.0 ppg., 93 career g.) & 6-11 Jr. C Darius Lewis (9.5 ppg., 43 career g.) from last year's 12-19 (6-12, 11th in Atlantic 10) team. Colter & Jones - who were part of Jim Ferry's first recruiting class - have played in every game in their Duquesne careers. Mason, who transferred to DU after one season at Drake, is on pace to be the second most-accurate 3-point shooter in NCAA history (.495). Colter (1,116 points), Mason (866 points) and Jones (664 points) have played in a combined 274 games with 244 starts.

• DU's roster consists of: 4 seniors, 2 juniors, 6 sophomores and 4 freshmen. Four scholarship players have made their debut this season: sophomore transfer Rene Castro (Butler), freshman transfer Mar'Qywell Jackson (UTEP) and true freshmen Nakye Sanders and Josh Steel.

• Duquesne was picked to finish 11th in the Atlantic 10 in the annual preseason poll of coaches and media.

• Colter & Mason shot a combined .438 from the 3-point arc in finishing one & two on the team in scoring last season. A guard either led, or tied for the team lead in scoring, in 28 of 31 games in 2015. The lone non-guard to lead the Dukes in scoring outright were returnees L.G. Gill (twice) and Jeremiah Jones.

• The 3-point shooting of Colter (60-141, .426) and Mason (88-197, .447) helped the Dukes finish with the third-best single-season mark in school history (.370) - and best by a DU team since 1992 - last season. DU's 7.9 3-pointers per game was the fifth-best mark in school history. DU is averaging 10.0 3-pointers per game so far in 2015-16.

• Mason, who led the nation in 3-point shooting percentage in 2014 (65-116, .560), finished seventh nationally last season (88-197, .447). Mason has hit five or more "3s" in a game 10 times (eight at Duquesne and two as a freshman at Drake). Mason is the second most-accurate 3-point shooter in NCAA history (201-of-406, .495).

• The Dukes prepared for the 2015-16 season with a nine-day, three-game trip to Ireland August 4-12. It was the second foreign tour by a DU team (the Dukes played four games in three days in Toronto over Labor Day weekend in 2007).

• Despite its 12-19 record in 2015, Duquesne was outscored by an average of just 2.9 points per game last season. Duquesne was 1-4 in games decided by three or fewer points, including a 1-2 mark in Atlantic 10 play.

• In conference play, DU averaged 74.7 ppg. at home and 67.7 on the road. The Dukes outscored A-10 opponents by +1.3 ppg. at home and were outscored by 14.7 ppg. on the road. DU held A-10 opponents to .411 shooting at home. On the road, A-10 foes shot .490.

• Three of DU's A-10 games - all at home - came down to the last possession: a 71-68 win over Saint Joseph's, a 61-60 loss to Rhode Island and a 100-97 OT loss to St. Bonaventure (the Dukes led Rhody by 13 and the Bonnies by 15 in the second half). In addition, DU had the ball down two with under two minutes left in a 70-64 "home" loss to No. 17 (AP) VCU at CONSOL Energy Center on Jan. 17. The Dukes were also tied with UMass with under three minutes left at Mullins Center on Feb. 14.

• DU's five home-and-home Atlantic 10 opponents are unchanged from last season. The Dukes will face Davidson, Dayton, George Washington, St. Bonaventure and Saint Louis twice as part of the 18-game Atlantic 10 schedule.

• Duquesne will participate in the eight-team Gulf Coast Showcase Nov. 23-25 at Germain Arena in Estero, Fla. The field includes: Central Michigan, Drake, Milwaukee, Murray State, Pepperdine, Weber State and Western Kentucky. Duquesne will face Pepperdine in the opening round and either Milwaukee or Murray State on day two. The third round opponent is TBD. The Dukes will also face two Atlantic Coast Conference schools (at Georgia Tech and vs. Pitt) and one Big Ten school (Penn State) in non-conference play. The Pitt and Penn State games will both be played at CONSOL Energy Center.

## TRENDING

• Duquesne has scored 96 and 95 points on .578 shooting in its first two games. DU is 20-of-49 (.408) from the 3-point arc over that span.

• Junior center Darius Lewis, who averaged 3.1 rebounds per game last season, has pulled down 11 boards in each of DU's first two games ... Lewis had nine points (including three dunks) and eight rebounds in 14 minutes last year at Penn State.

• Guard Micah Mason was 10-of-13 from the field and 6-of-9 from 3-point in scoring a career-high 28 points in 34 minutes on Monday night vs. New Orleans. It was his 10th career game with five or more 3-pointers.

• DU tied Jim Ferry Era highs for first half points (54), first half margin (+27, 54-27) and 3-pointers made (14-29) in Monday's win over New Orleans.

• The Dukes have limited opponents to .392 shooting.

• Six Dukes: Micah Mason, Derrick Colter, L.G. Gill, Jeremiah Jones, Darius Lewis and Eric James, have posted double-digit scoring games this season.

## IRELAND TOUR

Duquesne went 4-0 on its nine-day trip to Ireland on August 4-12. The team, which played in Galway, Cork and Dublin was led by guard Derrick Colter who averaged a team-high 13.0 ppg. L.G. Gill, who averaged 12.8 ppg., led the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg.) and 3-pointers made with six. First-year transfer Rene Castro averaged a team-high 3.5 assists/g. The Dukes won their four games by an average score of 87.5 to 48.8. All four games were played under FIBA rules which included a 25-second shot clock and 6.75m 3-point arc (approx. 22.15 feet).

On the road, A-10 foes shot .490.

- Posted his first career double-double (15-11) in the opener vs. Seton Hill. The 15 points were a career high and the 11 boards were one shy of his career-best set last year vs. George Washington
- Followed the Seton Hill game with 11 more boards vs. New Orleans
- Had nine points (with three dunks) and eight rebounds in 14 minutes off the bench last year at Penn State

## RECAP

Geno Thorpe came off the bench to score a game-high 19 points as Penn State survived a last-second shot attempt to defeat Duquesne 64-62 at Bryce Jordan Center. Penn State had the ball up two with 34 seconds left when a D.J. Newbill airball was ruled out off bounds off a Duquesne player with three seconds on the shot clock. Brandon Taylor missed a 3-point attempt at the shot clock buzzer and Duquesne's Darius Lewis rebounded. DU advanced the ball to the frontcourt where Micah Mason's 3-point attempt from beyond the top of the key was short of the rim as time expired. Jordan Stevens came off the bench to lead Duquesne with 18 points, TySean Powell added 11 and sophomore center Darius Lewis set career highs for points (9) and rebounds (8) for DU. There were four ties and seven lead changes in a first half that ended with Penn State up 29-28. The Nittany Lions built the lead to 10 as DU hit just one of its first five shots to open the second half, but Duquesne wouldn't fold as Stevens, who scored 11 in the second half, repeatedly scored on drives to the rim. The Dukes cut it to one on a three-point play by Lewis with 7:59 left. DU cut it to one two more times, but could never regain the lead as Penn State scored 12 of its final 16 points from the foul line. Thorpe, who was 11-of-14 from the line for the game, made 10-of-12 in the second half. Duquesne, which shot 40.4 percent, had three more field goals than Penn State, which finished at 37.7 percent. Both teams were 4-of-19 from the 3-point arc, with the difference coming at the foul line where PSU was 20-of-28 and DU finished 12-of-21.

Duquesne held Penn State's D.J. Newbill, who entered the game averaging 23.3 ppg. to 11 points on 5-of-17 shooting ... DU outrebounded the taller Nittany Lions 38-33 ... the loss snapped a three-game road winning streak for Duquesne. It was also PSU's tenth straight win over the Dukes at home ... Darius Lewis set new career highs for points (9) and rebounds (8) in 14 minutes off the bench.

## RECAP

Allen Roberts came off the bench to score 15 points as Penn State limited Duquesne to 27 percent shooting in a 68-59 win at CONSOL Energy Center. Ovie Soko had 19 points in 22 minutes before fouling out with 5:37 left and Dominique McKoy posted a 12-10 double-double for the Dukes. Penn State also got 13 points from D.J. Newbill and 11 points and 13 assists from Tim Frazier. Duquesne, which shot a Jim Ferry Era-best 59.6 percent in its last game, a 94-88 win over UMBC, shot a Ferry Era low against the Nittany Lions. Duquesne which fell behind 30-19 on a Roberts 3-pointer with just over six minutes left in the first half, rallied to cut the lead to 30-25 on a Jeremiah Jones fast break layup two minutes later. PSU built its lead back to 35-26 at the half. The Nittany Lions stormed out of the blocks to take a 43-28 lead just over three minutes into the second half. McKoy scored five-straight points to pull the Dukes within nine. A pair of Soko free throws made it 47-40 with 10:40 to go. Desmond Ridenour threaded the needle to Isaiah Watkins for a layup to make it a five-point game. Roberts ended the mini-run with a 3-pointer that made it 50-42. The Dukes trailed by six when Soko, who had 18 points and 9 rebounds at the time, picked up his fourth foul with 7:52 left. Newbill hit a 3-pointer on PSU's next possession and Donovan Jack followed with a layup off a pass from Frazier to push the lead back to 11. Ross Travis added another 3-pointer to make it 58-44 with just under six minutes left. Soko re-entered the game, and fouled out after hitting a free throw with 5:37 to go and the Dukes down 58-45. Roberts hit a jumper off a pass from Frazier to make it a 19-point game with 2:14 to go. A steal and dunk by McKoy with 27.8 seconds left capped a frantic Duquesne rally that made it 67-59, but the Dukes could get no closer as Frazier added a free throw for the final margin.

Dominique McKoy's 12-10 double-double was the first of his career ... McKoy was 5-of-6 from the field ... Ovie Soko, who entered the game on a school record pace for free throws attempted per game (9.5), went 12-of-14 from the stripe ... the rest of the team was 9-of-20 ... ## DUKES SIGN THREE:

Duquesne signed the trio of **Mike Lewis** (St. Louis, Mo./Chaminade), **Spencer Littleton** (Rochester Hills, Mich./Rochester Adams) and **Isiah Mike** (Scarborough, Ontario/Trinity International) to National Letters of Intent in November. Lewis is the starting point guard for a powerful Chaminade team that was ranked 14th in *USA Today's* preseason Super 25. He averaged 11.5 points per game and shot 48.7 percent from the 3-point arc (55-of-113) for last season's 26-4 team which finished third in the Missouri Class 5 state tournament. The Red Devils have four Division I recruits on this year's team including Duke signee Jayson Tatum and Iowa commit Tyler Cook. Littleton was named Associated Press Class A honorable mention all-state and MLive Detroit honorable mention in helping lead Rochester Adams to the district finals last season. The 6-4 guard averaged 19.5 points, 4.8 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.4 steals per game as a junior. Mike, a 6-7 forward, was rated No. 10 in North Pole Hoops' Canadian National Player Rankings this spring. He averaged 14.8 points and 7.4 rebounds per game for 33-8 Trinity International in Las Vegas, Nev. last season. Mike helped the Thunder advance to the National Christian Schools Athletic Association (NCSAA) Division 1 championship game.

## WAITING IN THE WINGS:

Nebraska transfer **Tarin Smith**, a 6-2 guard from Ocean Township, N.J., will be sitting out the 2015-16 season. Smith, who was one of only four players to see action in all 31 games for Cornhuskers as a freshman last season, averaged 4.5 ppg. He showed steady improvement, averaging 5.3 ppg. on 48 percent shooting in UN's last nine games. The St. Anthony HS product averaged 7.3 points and shot .643 (9-of-14) in consecutive late-February starts at Maryland, vs. Iowa and at Ohio State. He has three seasons of eligibility remaining.

# Jim Ferry

## Head Coach • Fourth Season at Duquesne 18th Season Overall

Jim Ferry, who led LIU Brooklyn to back-to-back NCAA Championship appearances in 2011 and 2012, is in his fourth season as head coach of the Dukes.

The Elmont, N.Y. native, who came to the Bluff with over 250 wins as a head coach at the Division I, Division II and Division III levels, is the 16th head coach in the 99-year history of Duquesne basketball.

Ferry's inaugural Dukes team, which finished 8-22, managed to post the school's first win at Temple in 18 years as well as produce Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team member Derrick Colter.

In 2014, Ferry guided a roster that opened the season with eight first-year scholarship players to 13 wins. The Dukes notched seven road victories for just the fifth time since 1955, including the school's first road win over a Top 10 team in 52 years - 71-64 at No. 10 (AP) Saint Louis in late February.

Ferry transfer recruits Ovie Soko (UAB) and Micah Mason (Drake) had outstanding seasons in 2014. Soko led an Atlantic 10 Conference - that sent six teams to the NCAA Tournament - in scoring on his way to earning third team all-league honors and Mason became the first Duquesne men's player to lead the nation in a statistical category when he shot an NCAA-best .560 from the 3-point arc.

In 2015, with a roster that featured one senior, the Dukes won six of their last 12 games - including the school's third Atlantic 10 Championship first round win in 20 years - in finishing 12-19.

Ferry came to DU after engineering one of the top rebuilding projects in NCAA Division I basketball at LIU.

He took over a 5-22 Blackbirds team in 2002-03 and guided it to 52 wins, including a 34-2 record in Northeast Conference play, in his final two seasons. In the process, Ferry's LIU teams consistently ranked among the top scoring squads in the country.

In 2011, the Blackbirds were the fourth-highest scoring team in the nation in finishing 27-6. The 27 wins were the most by an LIU team since 1937.

LIU ranked second nationally in scoring at 81.4 points per game in posting a 25-9 record in 2012. It was the first time since 1941 & 1942 - then under legendary head coach Clair Bee - that LIU won 25 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

Ferry left the Brooklyn campus with a 27-game home win streak - second only to 2012 national champion Kentucky's 52 consecutive home victories at the time. He also left behind four returning starters - including 2011-12 NEC Player of the Year Julian Bond - to come to Duquesne. The 2013 Blackbirds went on to make a third consecutive NCAA appearance under former Ferry assistant Jack Perri.

Ferry earned a number of accolades during his time at LIU including a pair of NEC Coach of the Year honors (2005 & 2011). His players also received numerous honors including NEC Player of the Year (Julian Bond) and NEC Rookie of the Year twice (James Williams & Julian Bond). In all, Ferry coached 11 all-conference honorees and eight all-rookie selections in 10 seasons at LIU. Among his top recruits was guard Jason Brickman, who finished his career as one of only four players in NCAA history to accumulate 1,000 assists.

Prior to taking over at LIU, Ferry was highly successful at the Division II level where he led Adelphi University to an 82-11 record in three seasons from 1999 through 2002. He led the Garden City, N.Y. school to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2000 and NCAA Elite 8 appearances in 2001 and 2002 and was named NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Division II Coach of the Year all three seasons.

Ferry's Adelphi teams went 62-4 in winning three-straight New York Collegiate Athletic Conference championships. His 2001 Panthers won 31 consecutive games in posting a school record 31 wins (31-1).

Ferry got his head coaching start at Division III Plymouth State University in Plymouth, New Hampshire where he led the Panthers to a 22-8 record and an appearance in the New England Tournament finals in 1998-99.

He was named New Hampshire Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year following the season.

Ferry reached the 100-win plateau (104-19) in his first four seasons as a head coach.

A 1990 graduate of Keene State College in Keene, New Hampshire, Ferry started his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater in 1990-91.

He served as an assistant coach at Bentley College in Waltham, Mass. for seven seasons prior to taking the head coaching position at Plymouth State. As an assistant, he helped the Falcons to a 1992-93 Northeast 10 regular season championship and trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Ferry, the son of a New York City transit police officer, played one year at New York Tech before transferring to Keene State, where he posted a double-digit scoring average for his career. Ferry led the Owls in scoring as a junior and was team captain as a senior. He earned his undergraduate degree in public safety science.

Ferry and his wife, Kelly, are the parents of four children: Victoria, twins Hannah and James, and Leo.

**RECAP**

Darius Lewis led a balanced attack with a career-high 15 points to go along with 11 rebounds as Duquesne tipped off its 100th season with a 96-71 win over Division II Seton Hill at Palumbo Center. Micah Mason and Derrick Colter also scored 15 for the Dukes who held SHU to 38.0 percent shooting. Noah Davis led Seton Hill with 15 points - all on 3-pointers. The Dukes held the Griffins scoreless for nearly eight minutes in building a 20-4 lead. SHU, which missed 16 of its first 18 shots, scored nine unanswered after DU went to its bench, to make it 20-13 with 8:30 left. SHU pulled within six on a Davis 3-pointer, and kept the margin at six before the Dukes hit six straight shots, including 3-pointers from Colter, Mason and L.G. Gill and a dunk from Jordan Robinson, to make it a 20-point game with just over a minute remaining. Seton Hill's Zach Herman hit a 3-pointer at the first half horn to make it 45-28. SHU heated up in the second half, going 9-of-18 from 3-point, but failed to put a dent in the Dukes lead which never dipped below 15 points. Eric James, who came off the bench to score 14 points in 13 minutes, had 10 in the second half. Seton Hill, whose tallest player was 6-8, didn't have an answer for the 6-11 Lewis who went 6-of-8 from the field and 3-of-4 from the foul line. Duquesne, which shot 54.7 percent, outscored Seton Hill 54-22 in the paint. Gill, the fifth Duke in double figures with 11, tied his career high with nine rebounds.

**NOTES**

The win gave Duquesne a 78-4 record in home openers ... ten players saw action in the first 8:15 ... all ten who played logged at least 14 minutes ... Lewis finished with 15 points and 11 rebounds in posting a career scoring high and his first career double-double ... Lewis' previous scoring high was 11 points vs. UTPA last season ... freshman Nakye Sanders had seven rebounds in 14 minutes in his Duquesne debut ... Eric James' 14 points were three shy of his career high ... Duquesne went 13-of-15 from the foul line in the second half and 20-of-29 (.690) for the game ... the Dukes were whistled for just six fouls to 24 for SHU ... Duquesne finished with seven dunks, including one by the 5-11 Colter ... DU, which was tipping off its 100th season, wore its late 1970s "Norm Nixon Era" throwback uniforms.

**RECAP**

Micah Mason scored a career-high 28 points - including a career high-tying six 3-pointers - as Duquesne rode an early 3-point barrage to a 95-75 win over New Orleans at Palumbo Center. The Dukes hit six of their first eight 3-point attempts - including three by Mason - to jump out to a 21-7 lead. DU hit 11-of-12 shots over a 10 minute span to make it a 38-14 game with 5:25 left. All 10 Dukes who played, scored in a first half that ended with Duquesne up 54-27. Five players hit at least one 3-pointer as Duquesne shot 70 percent in the opening 20 minutes. UNO briefly pulled to within 20 in the second half before Mason, currently the second most-accurate 3-point shooter in NCAA history, drilled a pair of 3-pointers to make it a 25-point game with just over 8 minutes left. Derrick Colter added 15 points and Jeremiah Jones scored 12 for the Dukes who finished at 61.5 percent. Mason finished 10-of-13 from the field and 6-of-9 from 3-point. Colter had seven assists and Mason five for the Dukes who assisted on 25 of 32 field goals. Darius Lewis had a game-high 11 rebounds for DU. Michael Zeno led New Orleans with 23 points.

**NOTES**

Mason's previous career high was 24 set against George Washington last season ... it was the third time in his career that he has hit six 3-pointers in a game ... Duquesne scored 18 of its first 21 points via the 3-pointer with Mason going 3-of-3 in the first 6:40 ... Duquesne's largest lead was 29 points (54-25) with three seconds left in the first half ... DU assisted on 16 of its 19 first half field goals ... Darius Lewis grabbed 11 rebounds for the second time in two games this season ... he averaged 3.1 rpg. last year ... the Dukes tied Jim Ferry Era highs for first half points (54), largest first half lead (+27, 54-27) and 3-pointers made (14).
