**LADY LIONS ADVANCE TO FACE PURDUE IN SECOND ROUND OF B1G TOURNAMENT**

**GAME 30 NOTES**

- // Teniya Page moved into No. 4 on the Penn State freshman points list after scoring 18 points vs. Illinois. She passed Tyra Grant (452, 2006-07) and now has 455 career tallies through 30 games.
- // Page connected on 6-of-7 shots from the free throw line to push her season total to 105 made free throws, which makes her just the fourth freshman in program history to eclipse the 100 made free throws mark.
- // She handed out a career-high nine assists against Illinois, pushing her season total to 127 helpers. Her nine assists helped her move up two spots to No. 5 on the freshman charts, helping her pass Helen Darling (119, 1996-97) and Alex Bentley (125, 2009-10).
- // Page made her 30th start of the season vs. Illinois, making her the ninth freshman in school history to reach the 30 start mark. She is tied for No. 7 on the list with Kahadeeja Herbert (1981-82) and Bentley.
- // With her three made three-pointers, Lindsey Spann becomes the 14th Lady Lion to reach the 100 career made three-pointers mark.
- // Spann pushed her season total to 63 made shots from distance, moving her into a tie with Zhaque Gray (2010-11) for No. 12 on the single season charts.
- // Peyton Whitted pulled down nine rebounds to move her season total to 242 boards, which is now tied with Julia Trogele (2010-11) for No. 25 on the single season rebound charts.
- // Kaliyah Mitchell becomes the 32nd player to eclipse the 500-rebound mark in a career after grabbing five rebounds vs. Illinois to move her career total to 504 boards.
- // Penn State improved to 26-19 all-time at the Big Ten Tournament, including 15-13 at Bankers Life Fieldhouse.
- // Penn State is now 32-15 all-time against Illinois, including a 5-2 mark at the Big Ten Tournament.
- // The 18 assists for Penn State are the second highest total of the season (19, Fordham).
- // With seven turnovers, the Lady Lions now have eight games with 10 or fewer turnovers this season.
- // The win was the 899th in program history, as the Lady Lions look to become the 16th program in NCAA history to reach 900-win plateau.

## TEAM NOTES

**Balanced in the Scoring Column**

// Penn State has seen at least three players reach double figures in 24 of 30 games this season.

// Four Lady Lions have eclipsed the 10-point mark in 16 games - including five games with five players scoring 10-plus points.

// At USF, Penn State placed all five starters in double figures, as **Brianna Banks, Kaliyah Mitchell, Teniya Page, Lindsey Spann & Peyton Whitted** all topped the 10-point mark.

// It was the first time since Jan. 25, 2015 that five different Lady Lions scored 10 or more points in the same game.

// The same five players tallied 10-plus points vs. Nebraska (1/13), at Iowa (1/20) and vs. Purdue (1/30).

// At Northwestern (2/17), **Candice Agee** joined Mitchell, Page, Spann and Whitted to account for five players with 10-plus points.

// **Perspective:** In 2014-15, Penn State had four players reach double-figures in the same game on seven occasions, including two games with five players in double-digits.

**Limiting Turnovers**

// Penn State has limited its turnovers this season, averaging just 14.4 per contest.

// Only four Penn State teams have ever averaged less than 15.0 turnovers per game; 2003-04 (13.1), 2004-05 (13.8), 2002-03 (13.9) and 2011-12 (14.4).

// Penn State has eight games with 10 or fewer turnovers this season, their most game since the 2003-04 team accomplished that nine times.

// Penn State's six turnovers at Nebraska are tied for the lowest single game total since at least 1990-91. The other six-turnover games include;

// Under head coach Coquese Washington, the Lady Lions now have three seasons with five games of 10 or fewer turnovers. This year's team joins the 2007-08 and 2011-12 squads.

// **Perspective:** The 2014-15 squad did not have any games with 10-or-fewer turnovers. Their lowest turnover output came at Minnesota on Jan. 28, 2014 with 11.

**Lineup Shuffle**

// Head coach **Coquese Washington** has used eight different starting lineups this season.

// The most used lineup is **Brianna Banks, Kaliyah Mitchell, Teniya Page, Lindsey Spann** and **Peyton Whitted**, which has been used 19 times, including in 11 of the last 12 games entering today.

// Over the last 19 games, Penn State has used just four lineups - including one on Senior Day.

// Page has started all 30 games as a true freshman, while Whitted has started 29 contests in her junior year.

// **Perspective:** Washington used only seven different lineups total during the 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons combined.

**Triples Falling in 2016**

// Penn State has connected on 149 three-pointers this season, a total that eclipses its total of 74 from the entire 2014-15 campaign.

// The Lady Lions made the 75th three pointer of the season in game No. 16 vs. Nebraska on Jan. 13.

// The 149 makes from three-point range sit No. 13 in school history with a top-10 finish in sight. Spots 10-13 on the single season school record charts are below;

// **Lindsey Spann** has 63 triples this season - more than her total (37) from last season as a freshman. Her 63 triples rank 13th in single season history at Penn State.

// As a team, Penn State is shooting .340 from long distance, compared to .254 last season.

// Penn State has three players with 20-plus three-pointers made after having just one player eclipse that mark in 2014-15.

**Lighting Up the Scoreboard**

// The Lady Lions reached 75 points in five of the first seven conference games, the first time that happened since 2002-03.

// The 2002-03 squad scored 75 points or more in five of the first seven conference games that season. Only five other Penn State teams have accomplished that in their time in the Big Ten (1992-present).

// For just the second time in program history, Penn State has had two different players score 30-plus points in a single game in the same season.

// **Lindsey Spann** netted 30 points at Minnesota (1/3/16) and **Teniya Page** scored 31 points vs. Michigan (1/17/16).

// In 1999-2000, Maren Walseth netted 35 points vs. Michigan (1/27/2000) and Lisa Shepard had 31 points vs. St. Joseph's (11/27/1999).

**Injury Bug Strikes**

// Junior guard **Sierra Moore**, junior guard **Keke Sevillian** and freshman guard **Amari Carter** will all miss the 2015-16 season due to injuries (knee).

// Moore averaged 12.1 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.8 assists, and added 15 blocked shots and 35 steals in 30 games last season.

// Carter also missed her senior year of high school due to a knee injury.

// Sevillian played in 10 games this season before suffering the injury in practice in late December.

- // Penn State has played two overtime games this season; vs. Holy Cross (11/13) and against Purdue (1/13), the 12th time in school history there have been multiple overtime games in one season.
- // Penn State opened the season with an 86-82 overtime victory vs. Holy Cross before dropping an 88-78 decision to Purdue in double overtime.
- // The Lady Lions are 1-1 in overtime this season and are 21-19 all-time when playing bonus basketball.
- // Under head coach Coquese Washington, Penn State is 7-6 in overtime.
- // The season opening overtime contest marked just the third time PSU opened a season with extra time.
- // The Lady Lions are 2-1 all-time in season opening overtime games. The also won at Dayton, Nov. 12, 2010, but lost, 93-84, to Connecticut on Nov. 25, 1989 in a game played at Iowa.

- // The double overtime game was the first for Penn State since a Nov. 12, 2010 victory at Dayton (112-107). Overall, Penn State is 3-2 in multi-overtime games.
- // The double overtime contest marked the second longest game in PSU's Big Ten history, behind only a three overtime affair with Iowa on Feb. 1, 2009.

**Rally in Sparta**

- // Penn State trailed by only five at halftime at Michigan State, but the No. 15/17 Spartans reeled off nine straight tallies to open the third period.
  - // Trailing 42-28 with 7:25 to play in the third quarter, Penn State began the comeback.
  - // Over the first 24 minutes, Michigan State was shooting 16-of-32 (.500) with 11 total turnovers. In the final 16 minutes the Spartans connected on just 9-of-26 shots (.346) and turned the ball over nine times.
  - // On the flip side, Penn State shot 12-of-33 (.363) with 12 turnovers in the first 24 minutes. The Blue and White connected on 15-of-25 shots (.600) with only three turnovers during the final 16 minutes.
  - // **Brianna Banks** helped get the comeback started, scoring nine points in the third quarter and 12 points overall in the second half.

- // At Northwestern (2/17), Page became the third PSU freshman to ever score 400 points and hand out 100 assists as a rookie. She joined Suzie McConnell (415p, 321a) and Corinne Gulas (411p, 235a) on the list.

// She hauled in 10-plus boards in each of her first four games, making her the first player since Nikki Greene (2013) to post four straight games with at least 10 rebounds.

// Whitted pulled down 12 boards at Nebraska (2/2) to go along with 12 points for her fifth double-double of the season.

// Her sixth double-double of the season came at Northwestern (2/17) with 14 points and 12 rebounds.

// In just 28 minutes vs. No. 5/5 Maryland, Whitted hauled in 10 rebounds.

// After her two-point performance vs. BYU, Spann reached the 10-point mark in five straight games, including a pair of 20-point efforts.

// Spann has scored 10-plus points in 19 of her last 25 games, including three 20-point efforts and one 30-point game.

// Her first 20-point effort of the season came vs. Virginia Tech on Dec. 3, pouring in 20 points before adding 23 points vs. Sacred Heart on Dec. 20.

// She reached the 20-point mark in Big Ten play for the first time in 2015-16 and third time in her career with 21 tallies against No. 6/7 Ohio State.

**Long Range Lindsey**

// Sophomore **Lindsey Spann** had quickly moved up the single season and career charts for three-point shooting at Penn State.

// Her 100 makes from three-point range to make her the 14th player in Penn State history to hit the century mark from distance. She is just 14 shy of passing Lynn Dougherty (113, 1989-92) for 13th.

// Her 63 make from long range this season sit tied with Zhaque Gray (2010-11) for 12th. Kelly Mazzante is next on the list with 75 makes in 2000-01.

// Spann's seven three-pointers at Minnesota are the most in a single game this season for Penn State.

// She connected on at least two three-pointers in six straight games from Jan. 10 - Jan. 27, before going 0-for-3 against Purdue (1/30).

**Spann Solid From The Stripe**

// In two seasons, sophomore Lindsey Spann has moved her name into the discussion of the top free throw shooters in school history.

// Spann has made 114-of-146 shots from charity stripe in her career to rank No. 16 on the career free throw percentage charts at .781.

// Her .873 free throw percentage (55-of-63) on the season currently ranks No. 9 on the single season charts.

**Agee Sending It Back**

// Senior **Candice Agee** blocked two shot vs. Illinois (3/2) to move her career total to 117 rejections.

// She trails Tori Waldner (120, 2012-15) for the No. 8 spot on the career charts.

// Her three blocks at Cal State Northridge helped her become just the 10th Lady Lion to record 100 career rejections.

// Agee has 33 career games with two-plus blocks.

// The Victorville, Calif., native enjoyed a 13-game streak with at least on blocked shot in 2014-15. She rejected shots in each game from Jan. 6 - Feb. 26, 2015.

// Agee recorded a career-high five blocks in a win over Rider on Dec. 14, 2014.

// Agee is looking to become just the 10th player in Penn State history to register 1.0 blocks per game for a career. She is currently at 1.0 bpg.

**Seniors Close Home Careers in Style**

// Penn State honored it's two seniors, **Candice Agee** and **Brianna Banks** on Feb. 24 vs. Iowa, and the duo didn't disappoint in their final appearance at the Bryce Jordan Center.

// A strong first half from Banks - including 11 first quarter points - helped the Lady Lions take an 18-point lead, 41-23, into halftime.

// Banks ended the night with 17 points, adding a career-high five steals in the game.

// Agee ended her Bryce Jordan Center career with a career-high-tying 21 points, marking the third time in her career she netted 21 points, doing so at home against both Seton Hall (11/22) and USF (12/21) in 2014-15.

// Agee added six rebounds, two assists and three steals to her stat line, as well.

**Walk-ons Seeing Work**

// Freshmen **Leah Knizner** and **Sarah McMurtry** both joined the Lady Lion program in October as walk-ons and each have seen action this season.

// Due to injuries, Knizner has been a main part of the bench for Penn State, seeing action in 19 games this season, including 15 Big Ten contests.

// McMurtry has appeared in eight games - five in B1G play - and connected on her lone points of the season with a three-pointer vs. No. 5/5 Maryland.





**Freebies For Mitchell**

- // Junior Kaliyah Mitchell was the team's top free throw shooter last season and has continued that trend again in 2015-16.
- // Mitchell sat No. 3 in the Big Ten and No. 24 in the NCAA entering the Big Ten Tournament with a .860 free throw clip.
- // Mitchell made 19 free throws in a row from the third quarter vs. Central Connecticut State to the third quarter against Youngstown State, including a 6-of-6 effort vs. BYU on Nov. 28.
- // For her career, Mitchell is a .766 shooter from the charity stripe, making 206-of-269 free throws. That percentage currently sits No. 20 on the all-time list at Penn State.

**Mitchell's Double Digit Streak**

- // After not reaching the scoring column in the season opener vs. Holy Cross, junior **Kaliyah Mitchell** secured double figures in each of the next five games.
- // She has 15 double-figure scoring games this season after notching 12 points at Michigan (2/20) and ranks fourth on the team with 9.8 points per game.
- // Mitchell led the team in scoring at USF with 18 points, just two points shy of her career-best effort.
- // Mitchell posted her first double-double of the season on Tuesday, Dec. 8 against Youngstown State with 16 points and a game-high 12 boards.
- // The junior added 15 points and 11 rebounds on Dec. 20 vs. Sacred Heart for her second double-double of the year.
- // Her 10-point, 11-rebound effort against Purdue was her third double-double of the season and the eighth of her career.

**Kaliyah Entering Career Charts**

- // Junior **Kaliyah Mitchell** has been steady in her career at Penn State, seeing action in all 91 career contests, including 51 starts.
- // With five rebounds vs. Illinois in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament, Mitchell became the 32nd player in PSU history with 500 career rebounds.
- // Her 504 rebounds are 31st on the list, one more than Tori Waldner's (2012-2015) 503 boards.
- // She is on pace to become just the 17th player in school history to eclipse the 300 made free throws mark, as well.
- // Mitchell is also on pace to become just the 54th player in Penn State history to reach 700 points, needing just 22 more tallies.

**Bucking The Trends**

- // Penn State kicked a couple of trends during Big Ten play, including earning its first wins of the season away from home.
- // The win at Iowa on Jan. 20 was the first road win of the season for the Lady Lions, who also won the first game of 2016, snapping a five game losing streak.
- // The win at Iowa was the first time Penn State led wire-to-wire in a Big Ten game since beating Minnesota, 83-53, on Jan. 26, 2014.
- // Penn State won its first game in 2015-16 when being out rebounded in a game. The Lady Lions entered the game 0-9 when losing the battle of the boards.
- // The Lady Lions had been 0-11 when tied or trailing on the scoreboard with 5:00 to play before rallying for the win at Illinois on Jan. 23. PSU trailed by two points, 51-49, when the clock hit 5:00 in left in the game.
- // Trailing by 11 with 5:11 to play in the third quarter, Penn State rallied for the win at Illinois. It was the first double-digit deficit overcome for Penn State since rallying from the same margin (11) vs. Wichita State on March 23, 2014.
- // Ironically, the last time Penn State trailed by 10-plus points before coming back to win a Big Ten contest was Jan. 9, 2014 at Illinois (down by 12 at 12:46 in 1st half). They eventually claimed an 82-76 decision.
