FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

- 1. UMass rallied from an early 15-2 deficit on Tuesday to come back to defeat UMBC 77-60 at home in the season opener.
- 2. Trent Buttrick scored 13 consecutive points in the second half of the UMBC win, helping extend the lead from five to 14 during the run.
- 3. The Minutemen fell in their first game away from home on Friday, a 91-71 setback at Yale.
- 4. UMass welcomes in six transfers to the roster for 2021-22. The newcomers include two transfers from Power 5 conferences in Trent Buttrick (Penn State) and Rich Kelly (Boston College) and features five upperclassmen.
- 5. UMass was the Atlantic 10's top-scoring offense a season ago with 76.7 points per game.

SETTING THE STAGE

Last Time Out

The Minutemen fell on the road at Yale 91-71 in their first game away from home on Friday. Noah Fernandes scored a team-high 13 points with Rich Kelly (11) and Trent Buttrick (11) each finishing in double figures. Greg Jones hauled in a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with his nine points while C.J. Kelly added nine on 2-of-3 from range in his first UMass appearance.

The Season Opener

UMass rallied from an early 15-2 deficit to comeback to beat UMBC 77-60 on Tuesday in the Mullins Center. Trent Buttrick and T.J. Weeks each poured in 16 points and added seven boards to help the Minutemen grab their first lead of the night with 15:50 left in the second half, which they held for the remainder of the game. Noah Fernandes scored 12 and dished out four assists while Rich Kelly recorded a game-high six assists.

UMass, Meet Trent

Graduate forward Trent Buttrick scored 13 consecutive points for the Minutemen in the second half of the season opener to help UMass extend its lead from five to 14 in the span. Buttrick knocked down six of his final seven shot attempts and finished the night 3-of-8 from range with 15 of his 16 points coming in the second half. The forward also added a career-high five steals in the win and picked up two more steals early at Yale on his way to finishing with 11 points and four boards.

Series vs. Penn State

UMass and Penn State meet for the 24th time and for the first time since 1991 on Monday. The Minutemen are 7-4 against the Nittany Lions at home but trail the all-time series 13-10.

New Faces

The Minutemen welcome in six transfer student-athletes, including five upperclassmen, to the roster for the 2021-22 season. UMass has two transfers from Power 5 schools in Trent Buttrick (Penn State) and Rich Kelly (Boston College). Fellow upperclassman Greg Jones (Southern Connecticut State/James Madison), C.J. Kelly (Albany/Norfolk State) and Michael Steadman (Montana/San Jose State) in addition to underclassmen John Kelly (Fairfield) also join the team for 2021-22.

Opening Games In The McCall Era

UMass improved to 5-0 in season openers under head coach Matt McCall on Tuesday as they picked up a 77-60 win over UMBC in the Mullins Center. The Minutemen are 4-0 against America East teams during the span.

2020-21 Season In Review

The Minutemen finished the 2020-21 season with a 8-7 overall record with a 7-4 mark in Atlantic 10 play on their way to a fourth-place finish in the conference. UMass was the top offense in the A-10 with 76.7 points per game. The Minutemen rattled off three straight wins after starting the season with a 2-3 record, picking up wins at home over La Salle and Rhode Island before a road victory at Fordham.

High Powered Offense

The Minutemen finished the 2020-21 season averaging 76.7 points per contest to lead all Atlantic 10 teams. UMass ranked 51st nationally in scoring and and 55th in assist to turnover ratio. The Minutemen reached the 100-point mark for the 45th time in team history and the first against an A-10 opponent since 2016 in an A-10 Tournament win over Saint Joseph's.

The Journeyman

Graduate student Rich Kelly joins the Minutemen after three seasons at Quinnipiac and one at Boston College. Kelly has scored 1,386 points during his four-year collegiate career and has racked up 445 assists. The guard is a 42-percent career shooter from the field and a 37-percent shooter from behind the arc.

Commonwealth Kid

Massachusetts native Noah Fernandes joined the Minutemen for the 2020-21 season following his freshman season at Wichita State. Fernandes averaged the third-most minutes per game on the team last season with 30.8 minutes per game while scoring 11.1 points per game to go along with 4.4 assists and 4.2 rebounds per night. The junior ranked fourth in the A-10 and 62nd in the country a season ago with a 2.19 assist to turnover ratio.

The Kelly Bros.

UMass welcomed in brothers Rich and John Kelly in the offseason to the team. The Shelton, Conn. natives both join the Minutemen following stints at other schools, with Rich spending three seasons at Quinnipiac and one at Boston College while John spent last season at Fairfield.

Welcome Home, Ricky

UMass Basketball alum Ricky Harris ('10) returned home to Amherst in the offseason and is now on the staff as the Director of Basketball Operations. Harris was a four-year letterwinner for the Minutemen from 2006-10, helping UMass to a 73-58 record during his four years and a pair of NIT appearances. Harris averaged 19.8 points per game in his senior season before embarking on an 11-year professional career overseas.

Staff Shuffle

Jacob Kurtz was elevated to an assistant coach following two seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations and two as the Assistant Director of Basketball Operations/Assistant to the Head Coach. Kurtz also spent two seasons on Matt McCall's staff at Chattanooga as the Mocs' video coordinator following his collegiate career as a walk-on turrned part-time starter at Florida.

Distributing The Ball

The Minutemen ranked third in the A-10 and 63rd-nationally in assists per game with 14.9 in 2020-21, led by Noah Fernandes' 4.4 per contest.

NCAA First Round

Matt McCall was named the 22nd head coach for University of Massachusetts men's basketball on March 29, 2017, and enters his fourth season at the helm in 2020-21.

McCall's 2020-21 squad saw a three-win improvement from the prior campaign, posting a 14-17 overall record, including an 8-10 mark in league play to finish the year with their most conference wins since the 2014-15 season to earn the No. 8 seed in the A-10 Tournament, its highest seed since 2015. UMass was playing some of its best basketball of the season, with wins in four of its final six games of the regular season, until the Atlantic 10 Tournament was cancelled due to COVID-19.

Led by freshman Tre Mitchell, who became the sixth player in team history and first since 2004 to be named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year, UMass earned a first-round bye to the Atlantic 10 Tournament for the first time since 2016 and won 11 games at the Mullins Center. Mitchell set the UMass rookie record for field goals in a season with 206, was nine points away from breaking the program record for freshman points in a season, and was a six-time A-10 Rookie of the Week selection, the most for a Minuteman since 2004.

In his second season at UMass, McCall's squad scored 70.7 points per game on the year to rank fifth among Atlantic 10 teams while ranking second in the league in field goal percentage from beyond the arc at 35-percent. Jonathan Laurent led the way in the A-10 with a 46.7-percent clip from deep with Carl Pierre posting the third-best percentage in the league. The Minutemen picked up a home win over rival Rhode Island behind Pierre's 22 points and added a win over league-leader Davidson.

UMass had early signature wins over Georgia and Providence during McCall's first year at the helm, adding a pair of wins over A-10 foe Dayton to mark the first time in series history that UMass has earned two wins over the Flyers in the same season with the first set of consecutive wins for the Minutemen in over 10 seasons. Sophomore Luwane Pipkins was tabbed all-region and the A-10's Most Improved Player after averaging more than 20 points per contest to join the likes of Julius Erving and Marcus Camby as players to average 20-plus in a single season.

Spending the previous two seasons at Chattanooga, McCall holds a head coaching record of 48-18 with marks of 25-11 in league action and 24-4 at home. Under his tutelage, Justin Tuoyo was a two-time Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Pacing the Mocs to a 19-12 record in 2016-17, Tuoyo led the conference in blocks while ranking sixth nationally at 2.9 per game.

In his first campaign at Chattanooga, McCall's squad set a school record with 29 wins, captured the SoCon Regular

Season and Tournament Championships and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The 29 wins were the most in the nation by a first-year head coach in 2015-16. The total is tied for seventh-best since 1962.

The tourney crown and NCAA appearance were the first for UTC since 2009. The regular-season league title was the Mocs' first since 1994. The previous wins record of 27 dated back to the 1982 season (27-4), matching the total the 1977 NCAA Division II National Champions posted (27-5).

In 2015-16, the Mocs generated momentum with victories at Georgia, Illinois and Dayton. The win over the Flyers snapped their 26-game home winning streak. McCall earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors as the squad featured All-SoCon performers in Tuoyo and Tre' McLean.

McCall spent 11 seasons, over two stops, with Billy Donovan at Florida. After five seasons as a manager and graduate assistant, he was named Director of Basketball Operations (2006-08) before returning to Gainesville as assistant coach prior to the 2011-12 season.

In total, McCall was part of four SEC titles, four SEC Tournament titles, two NCAA Elite Eights, a Final Four and two NCAA titles. The 2013-14 Gators won 30-straight games, with an 18-0 SEC ledger, before a loss to eventual National Champion UConn in the Final Four.

In four seasons with the Gators' coaching staff, he helped land a top-five recruiting class in 2013, which included two McDonald's All-Americans in Chris Walker and Kasey Hill. The Gators also had a top-10 group in 2014. McCall was instrumental in adding All-SEC guard Michael Frazier and DeVon Walker in the 2012 class.

Between stints in Gainesville, McCall was an assistant under Mike Jarvis at Florida Atlantic for three seasons. The Owls went just 6-26 in that first season (2008-09), accumulated 14 wins in 2009-10 and put together the school's best Division I campaign with a 21-11 mark in 2010-11.

FAU's 2010-11 squad won the Sun Belt Regular Season title and earned just the second postseason berth in FAU history (2011 NIT). McCall's recruiting efforts netted such notables as Greg Gantt, Dennis Mavin and Raymond Taylor. Gantt ranked among the league and national leaders in scoring and three-point shooting during his Owl career.

McCall and his wife, Allison (Rios), are the parents of daughters Brooklyn and Kylie. He earned his undergraduate degree in exercise and sports science from Florida in 2004 and went on to earn a master's degree in the same concentration in May 2006, also from Florida.

Lucious Jordan Assistant CoachFifth Season | Albany '06

Lucious Jordan enters his third season as an assistant coach on Matt McCall's staff in 2020-21, and fifth overall with the UMass basketball program. Jordan spent his first two seasons in Amherst as the director of operations before being promoted to assistant coach prior to the 2019-20 season.

During his first year as an assistant coach in 2019-20, Jordan helped guide the Minutemen to a three-win improvement from the prior campaign with a 14-17 overall record, including an 8-10 mark in league play to finish the year with their most conference wins since the 2014-15 season to earn the No. 8 seed in the A-10 Tournament, its highest seed since 2015. UMass was playing some of its best basketball of the season, with wins in four of its final six games of the regular season, until the Atlantic 10 Tournament was cancelled due to COVID-19.

Led by freshman Tre Mitchell, who became the sixth player in team history and first since 2004 to be named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year, UMass earned a first-round bye to the Atlantic 10 Tournament for the first time since 2016 and won 11 games at the Mullins Center. Mitchell set the UMass rookie record for field goals in a season with 206, was nine points away from breaking the program record for freshman points in a season, and was a six-time A-10 Rookie of the Week selection, the most for a Minuteman since 2004.

Jordan arrived at UMass after one year as the director of operations at his alma mater, Albany, in 2016-17. Prior to his time with the Great Danes, Jordan spent three seasons as an assistant coach nearby at Siena College, where he helped the Saints to a pair of CBI berths.

Before helping guide the Saints for three years, Jordan was the director of operations at James Madison University during the 2012-13 campaign. While working with the Dukes, Jordan oversaw team operations as James Madison won the CAA Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round.

Jordan was formerly the coach of the Albany City Rocks AAU Team in 2010 and 2012 while he also guided the Green Tech Charter High School freshman team.

Jordan was a two-time co-captain of the Great Danes and key cog in the 2005-06 team's success as Albany won the program's first-ever America East Tournament. The America East All-Conference selection finished his career that also spanned two seasons at Loyola (Md.) with 1,418 points. After graduating with a degree in communication and sociology, Jordan traveled overseas and competed in the Netherlands for the Emmen Eagles while he also laced up for the Albany Patroons of the Continental Basketball Association from 2006-09.

The Capital Region standout played scholastically at Colonie Central and was inducted into the Capital Region Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010.

Fifth Season | Florida '15

Jacob Kurtz enters his first season as an assistant coach after spending multiple seasons as the Director of Scouting/Video on Matt McCall's staff. Kurtz spent his first two seasons as the Assistant Director of Operations/Assistant to the Head Coach before being promoted at the start of the 2021-22 season.

Prior to arriving at UMass, Kurtz spent two seasons on McCall's staff at Chattanooga as the Mocs' video coordinator. While at Chattanooga, Kurtz was responsible for the breakdown of team video throughout the season. He filled the role of assistant to the head coach during both of McCall's seasons leading the Mocs.

Kurtz's tenure in Chattanooga marked his second stop with McCall as Kurtz was a student-athlete at Florida during McCall's time with the team. Third Season | Rhode Island '98


Tyson Wheeler enters his second season as an assistant coach on Matt McCall's staff in 2020-21. Wheeler arrived in Amherst following 10 seasons at Fairfield, including eight years as an assistant coach.

During his first year as an assistant coach in 2019-20, Wheeler helped guide the Minutemen to a three-win improvement from the prior campaign with a 14-17 overall record, including an 8-10 mark in league play to finish the year with their most conference wins since the 2014-15 season to earn the No. 8 seed in the A-10 Tournament, its highest seed since 2015. UMass was playing some of its best basketball of the season, with wins in four of its final six games of the regular season, until the Atlantic 10 Tournament was cancelled due to COVID-19.

Led by freshman Tre Mitchell, who became the sixth player in team history and first since 2004 to be named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year, UMass earned a first-round bye to the Atlantic 10 Tournament for the first time since 2016 and won 11 games at the Mullins Center. Mitchell set the UMass rookie record for field goals in a season with 206, was nine points away from breaking the program record for freshman points in a season, and was a six-time A-10 Rookie of the Week selection, the most for a Minuteman since 2004.

Wheeler spent two of his 10 years at Fairfield as the Director of Basketball Operations after a standout career at the University of Rhode Island, where he was a two-time Atlantic 10 First-Team selection as a junior and senior. He helped lead the Rams to an Elite Eight appearance during the 1998 NCAA Tournament and was named to the Rams' All-Century team in 2005. As a collegiate player, Wheeler was a candidate for the John Wooden Award and was named the New England Coaches Association Bob Cousy Award winner.

After wrapping up his career at Rhode Island, Wheeler was drafted by the Toronto Raptors in the 1998 NBA Draft and played for the Denver Nuggets during the 1998-99 season. Wheeler also played professional in the CBA, the ABA and overseas from 1998-2008.



Ricky HarrisDirector of Operations

First Season | UMass '10

Following a standout career at UMass and an 11-year professional career overseas, Ricky Harris is coming home. The 2010 Massachusetts alum returrned to Amherst as the in 2021 and was elevated to the Director of Operators role prior to the 2021-22 season.

"When you talk about wanting to get guys who want to be here, Ricky Harris embodies that," McCall said. "He was one of the best guards to ever play at UMass and just announced his retirement after a phenomenal professional career. He was contacting me as soon as he made his decision to stop playing and wanted to come to UMass.

"He brings positivity, energy and a want to be here, and we couldn't be more excited to have him. He has a passion and a love for this university, and he will be a tremendous resource for our players."

Harris was a four-year letterwinner with the Minutemen from 2006 to 2010, helping the program to a 73-58 record during his career including a pair of NIT appearances during his freshman and sophomore seasons.

"I'm very excited to be returning to my alma mater and I am thankful to Coach Matt McCall and Ryan Bamford for this tremendous opportunity," Harris said. "I had an incredible experience at UMass as a student-athlete, and I'm looking forward to being back on campus helping our players and our program succeed. We have a very talented roster this season, and I can't wait to be back in Amherst as our team begins to build towards our goals in 2021-22."

The Baltimore, Md. native played in 129 career games, including 93 starts, and is third all-time at Massachusetts in scoring with 1960 points trailing only Jim McCoy and Monty Mack. Harris lit it up from deep during his career, shooting nearly 35% (276-of-795) from beyond the arc in four seasons, and still owns school records for most three attempted in a game (19 on Mar. 3, 2010), most threes made in a season (278 in 2007-08), and is tied for the school record for most threes made in a game (8 on Mar. 3, 2010).

Harris is also seventh all-time at UMass in career field goals made (643), third in three-point field goals made (276), fifth in steals (148) and tied for ninth in games played (129).

After coming off the bench during his freshman season in 2007-08, Harris burst on to the scene during his sophomore campaign in 2008-09, averaging 18.2 points per game and shooting 37% from three en route to Atlantic 10 Most Improved Player honors. He was named to the NIT All-Tournament Team after leading Massachusetts to the championship game, averaging 20.4 points in five NIT games including 27 points in NIT Championship game against Ohio State in Madison Square Garden. His 104 made threes that season were, at the time, tied for best season in UMass history with Carmelo Travieso.

Following a coaching change entering the 2008-09 season, Harris continued to put up numbers as a junior. He once again averaged better than 18 points per game and shot nearly 39% from beyond the arc (87-of-225), and was named to the Atlantic 10 Third Team. Harris led the team in scoring 18 times during the 2008-09 campaign, reaching double-figures in 28-of-30 games, and became the 40thplayer in team history to reach 1000 career points.

Harris went out with a bang during his senior season, averaging 19.8 points per game to conclude his career as the Atlantic 10 active leading scorer. Harris passed the likes of Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and Lou Roe on UMass' all-time scoring list that season, and was again named to the Atlantic 10 Third Team. He capped his Mullins Center career by hitting a game-winning three with 3.5 seconds left to send UMass to the A-10 Tournament as part of scoring game-high 28 points against Rhode Island on Senior Day.
