## SCOUTING REPORT

- Youngstown State (8-11) will play at Penn State (7-10) on Tuesday at 6 p.m. before opening a three-game weekend series at West Virginia (10-8) on Friday. After opening their series on Friday at 6:30 p.m., the Penguins and Mountaineers will proceed to play single games on Saturday at 4 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m.
- Tuesday's game at Penn State will be broadcast live on Big Ten Plus while all three games at West Virginia will be broadcast live on ESPN+. Live audio for all four games this week will be available at YSNLive.com. Live stats for all four games will be available through links on YSUsports.com. Fans can also follow @YSUBaseball on Twitter for live updates.
- Sophomore right-hander Nick Perez will his first start of the season on Tuesday at Penn State. Senior right-hander Jon Snyder will take the ball on Friday for the series opener at West Virginia while senior right-hander Travis Perry will start game two on Saturday. Junior right-hander Matt Brosky is scheduled to start the series finale on Sunday.
- YSU will be playing Penn State and West Virginia for the first time since the 2019 season. The Penguins will be looking for their second win against a Power Five opponent this season after defeating Pitt 5-2 on Wednesday.
- The Penguins have won six of their last nine games after going 3-1 this past week. YSU won 5-2 at Pitt on Wednesday before opening Horizon League play with a 4-0 victory at Purdue Fort Wayne on Friday. The Penguins fell 8-7 in game one of a doubleheader on Sunday before bouncing back with a 12-6 win in game two.
- Senior right-hander Jon Snyder was named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on Monday after a stellar outing on Friday at Purdue Fort Wayne. Snyder allowed just one hit and struck out a season-high 10 batters over 6.1 scoreless innings to lead the Penguins to a 4-0 victory. He was also named a national Top-30 Pitcher by D1Baseball.com for March 18.
- Junior outfielder Andre Good was named a national Top-30 Hitter by D1Baseball.com for March 20 after going 2-for-5 with two home runs and three RBIs in game one of Sunday's doubleheader against Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Youngstown State was picked fourth in the 2022 Horizon League Baseball Preseason Poll. Wright State edged out UIC as the preseason favorite in a vote of the league's head coaches while Milwaukee was selected third. The Penguins were picked to finish third in the league by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and fourth by D1Baseball.com.

## QUICK NOTES

- YSU entered the 2022 season looking to build on a historic 2021 season that saw the Penguins post their best record in 26 years.
- Last season, the Penguins went 32-24 overall to reach the 30-win plateau for just the second time in program history and for the first time since going 37-17 in 1995. YSU also reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 2010.
- YSU went 24-16 in Horizon League play in 2021 to set new program records for Horizon League and conference wins. The previous record of 16 Horizon League wins was set in 2006 while the previous mark of 18 conference wins was set in 1995 when the Penguins were in the Mid-Continent Conference.
- The Penguins finished the season with a winning record for the first time since 2005, and they secured a winning record in league play for the first time since 2008.
- YSU finished the 2021 season with a 19-4 record at Eastwood Field to set a new program record for home wins. The previous mark of 18 home wins was set in 1977.
- There are 40 players on YSU's roster in 2022, and 24 of them were with the program last year. The Penguins return 20 letterwinners from last year's team and have 16 newcomers to the roster.
- The Penguins will be looking to replace some key pieces from last year's squad as 13 letterwinners departed the program. Four of the departing players were all-league selections including 2021 Horizon League Pitcher of the Year Collin Floyd. Starting infielders Phillip Glasser (Indiana) and Jeff Wehler (Pitt) each transferred to Power-Five schools following the 2021 season.

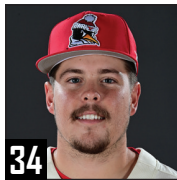

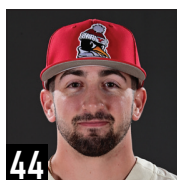

## A Win on Tuesday Would...

- Give YSU its second straight win and its seventh victory in the last 10 games.
- Be YSU's second win over a Power Five opponent this season.
- Be YSU's eighth victory over a Power Five opponent in the last seven seasons.
- Snap a five-game losing streak to Penn State.
- Give the Penguins their first win over a Big Ten opponent since 1996.
- Be the 323rd in head coach Dan Bertolini's career and his 94th at Youngstown State.

## Scouting The Nittany Lions

- Penn State is 7-10 overall on the season after winning two of three games against Milwaukee this past weekend. The Nittany Lions have won four of their last six games after a 3-8 start.
- Junior catcher Matt Wood leads the Nittany Lions with a .345 batting average, 20 hits, four home runs, 14 RBIs, a .655 slugging percentage, 16 runs scored and 12 walks. Junior outfielder Johnny Piacentino earned Preseason All-Big Ten honors after leading Penn State with 15 doubles, eight home runs and 32 RBIs last season.
- Junior left-hander Kellan Tulio will start for Penn State on Tuesday. He has a 1-1 record, a 4.38 ERA and 11 strikeouts in 12.1 innings over three starts. Sophomore right-hander Jaden Henline has three saves and 20 strikeouts in 14.2 innings over six relief appearances.
- Penn State posted an 18-24 overall record while only playing Big Ten opponents last season. The Nittany Lions went 8-8 at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park in 2021.

# RECAPPING LAST WEEK

## at Pitt - Wednesday, March 16 // W 5-2

- Youngstown State hit a season-high three home runs en route to a 5-2 win over ACC-member Pitt on Wednesday afternoon at Charles L. Cost Field.
- Seth Lucero went 2-for-4 with a home run, Braeden O'Shaughnessy hit a three-run blast and Ian Francis added a pinch-hit solo home run.
- Brandon Mikos picked up his second win of the season after tossing a scoreless sixth inning with one strikeout. He was one of 10 YSU pitchers to appear in the contest. Lane Rhodes allowed one run on two hits and had two strikeouts over 2.1 innings in his first collegiate start. Nathan Ball was responsible for one run on one hit in the ninth inning.

## at Purdue Fort Wayne - Friday, March 18 // W 4-0

- Jon Snyder allowed just one hit and had a season-high 10 strikeouts over 6.1 scoreless innings to lead Youngstown State to a 4-0 victory in its Horizon League opener against Purdue Fort Wayne on Friday at Mastodon Field.
- Snyder was masterful on the mound as he did not allow a hit until a one-out single in the bottom of the sixth inning. He retired the first six batters he faced and he faced the minimum in each of the first five frames. The senior right-hander retired the side in order in the first, second and fifth innings. The Springboro, Ohio, native recorded a strikeout in six different innings, and he had multiple punchouts in four different frames as he earned his first victory of the season.
- Seth Lucero went 3-for-5 with a pair of RBI singles, two stolen bases and a run scored to lead the Penguins offensively. Andre Good, Dylan Swarmer and Ian Francis each recorded a base hit and scored a run as YSU outhit Purdue Fort Wayne 7-3. Braeden O'Shaughnessy delivered an RBI single in the top of the ninth.

## at Purdue Fort Wayne - Sunday, March 20 // L 7-8

- Ben Higgins hit a two-out, walk-off infield single to second base to give Purdue Fort Wayne an 8-7 victory over Youngstown State in game one of Sunday's doubleheader at Defiance High School.
- Andre Good went 2-for-5 with two home runs and three RBIs while Lucas Nasonti was 2-for-5 with a double, three RBIs and a run scored. Good hit two homers in a game for the second time in his career. The last time a Penguin hit two home runs in a contest was when Good hit two in his collegiate debut at Houston on Feb. 16, 2020. Seth Lucero and Dylan Swarmer added two hits apiece while Pdraig O'Shaughnessy drew three walks and drove in a run.
- YSU starter Travis Perry allowed three unearned runs on four hits and fanned four batters over five innings of work. After giving up three runs in the bottom of the first inning, Perry settled in to work four straight scoreless innings.

## at Purdue Fort Wayne - Sunday, March 20 // W 12-6

- Youngstown State recorded season highs of 13 hits and 12 runs in a 12-6 victory over Purdue Fort Wayne in game two of Sunday's doubleheader.
- Braeden O'Shaughnessy matched career highs with four hits and three RBIs. The junior finished the game 4-for-5 with two doubles, three RBIs and two runs scored. Lucero went 3-for-6 with a triple, two RBIs and a run scored. Pdraig O'Shaughnessy went 2-for-4 with a double and three RBIs while Nasonti was 2-for-6 with an RBI and three runs scored. D'Eusanio hit a two-run home run while Bucko added an RBI single.
- YSU starter Matt Brosky earned his second win of the season after allowing four runs, three of them earned, on six hits while striking out nine batters over seven innings. Lane Rhodes retired the side in order in the eighth before Brandon Mikos allowed a pair of runs in the ninth.

- Senior right-hander Jon Snyder was named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on Monday for his stellar performance in YSU's 4-0 victory over Purdue Fort Wayne on Friday.
- Snyder allowed just one hit and struck out a season-high 10 batters over 6.1 scoreless innings to earn his first win of the season. The Springboro, Ohio, native did not allow a hit until a one-out single in the bottom of the sixth inning. He retired the first six batters he faced and he faced the minimum in each of the first five frames. He retired the side in order in the first, second and fifth innings. Snyder recorded a strikeout in six different innings, and he had multiple punch outs in four different frames.
- Snyder was also recognized nationally by D1Baseball.com, as he was included among the website's Top-30 Pitchers for March 18.
- Snyder has a 2.96 ERA, 34 strikeouts and a .179 opponent batting average in 27.1 innings over five starts through the first five weeks of the 2022 season. He was named the Horizon League Preseason Pitcher of the Year by Perfect Game before the season after earning Second-Team All-Horizon League honors in 2021.

**Brosky Shines in First Career Starts**

- Junior right-hander Matt Brosky has shined this season in his first collegiate starts. The Strongsville, Ohio, native has posted a 1.50 ERA, a team-high 42 strikeouts and a .173 opponent batting average in a team-high 36 innings over five starts.
- Brosky picked up his first victory of the season on Feb. 20 when he led the Penguins to a 10-9 series-clinching victory at Bethune-Cookman. He struck out nine batters with one walk and allowed only one earned run over six innings pitched in his first collegiate start.
- On Feb. 27 at Belmont, Brosky suffered the hard-luck loss after allowing only two unearned runs on two hits and striking out eight batters over 7.1 innings pitched. He retired an impressive 14 straight batters between the third and eighth innings. After a two-out walk in the bottom of the third, Belmont did not have a baserunner until a one-out error in the eighth. After allowing a leadoff single in the top of the first, Brosky did not allow a hit until a one-out single in the eighth.
- On March 6 at UT Rio Grande Valley, Brosky allowed two runs, one of them earned, on five hits and struck out six batters over seven innings in another quality outing. After giving up an RBI single in the third inning, Brosky did not allow another hit until a one-out single in the seventh. He recorded a strikeout in four different frames, and he retired the side in order in the fourth.
- In the series finale at New Orleans on March 13, Brosky suffered another hard-luck loss after putting together another brilliant outing for the Penguins. He allowed one run on four hits and set new career highs with 10 strikeouts and 8.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk. He retired the first 16 batters he faced before allowing a one-out single in the sixth inning.
- Brosky earned his second win of the season after allowing four runs, three of them earned, on six hits and striking out nine batters over seven innings in YSU's 12-6 victory over Purdue Fort Wayne in Sunday's series finale. He has pitched at least six innings and struck out at least six batters in each of his five starts this season.
- Brosky, who transferred to YSU from Ohio University, has transitioned into a starting role after primarily serving as a reliever over his first few years as a collegiate pitcher. Last season, he made eight relief appearances for the Penguins, finishing with an 0-1 record and a 10.12 ERA in 10.2 innings.
- As a freshman for Ohio in 2019, Brosky posted a 1-1 record and a 10.22 ERA in 12.1 innings over 11 relief appearances. He actually earned his first career win against Youngstown State on April 23, 2019, at Eastwood Field while with the Bobcats.

**O’Shaughnessy Stepping Into Larger Role**

- Junior infielder Braeden O’Shaughnessy has been YSU’s top-producing hitter through the first five weeks of the 2022 season. The Poland, Ohio, native leads the Penguins with a .333 batting average, 24 hits, four doubles, three home runs, 15 RBIs, a .407 on-base percentage and 37 total bases.
- O’Shaughnessy matched career highs with four hits and three RBIs in YSU’s 12-6 win in the series finale on Sunday at Purdue Fort Wayne. The Poland, Ohio, native finished the game 4-for-5 with two doubles, three RBIs and two runs scored. The junior has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games including six straight from March 11 to March 18. O’Shaughnessy has already set new career highs with four doubles, three home runs and 15 RBIs.
- O’Shaughnessy was named to Perfect Game’s Horizon League Preseason All-Conference Team after batting .297 and slugging .378 with one double, one triple, one home run and 12 RBIs over 30 games played in 2021.
- O’Shaughnessy has started all 19 games for the Penguins in 2022, making 12 starts at second base and seven at third base. He made 17 starts last season – nine at third base, four at first base, three as the designated hitter and one at second base.
- As a freshman in 2020, O’Shaughnessy played in nine games and made six starts – three at second base and three at third base. He had two hits including a three-run home run in his collegiate debut at Houston on Feb. 16, 2020.

**Penguins Among the League Leaders**

- On the mound, the Penguins lead the league with five saves and a team ERA of 4.32. YSU’s pitching staff has allowed the second-fewest hits (137) and the second-fewest earned runs (75) in the league through the first five weeks of the season. The Penguins also lead the league with 154 strikeouts and a .237 opponent batting average. Offensively, Youngstown State leads the Horizon League with 87 walks.
- Individually, junior infielder Braeden O’Shaughnessy ranks tied for second in the Horizon League with 24 hits and tied for sixth with three home runs. He also ranks tied for sixth in the league with four doubles and 10th with a .333 batting average.
- Senior first baseman Pdraig O’Shaughnessy leads the Horizon League with 19 walks while senior catcher Dylan Swarmer ranks tied for fifth with 10 walks. Junior outfielder Andre Good ranks tied for sixth in the league with three home runs while sophomore infielder Seth Lucero ranks tied for seventh with 13 runs scored.
- Junior right-hander Matt Brosky leads the Horizon League with a 1.50 ERA, 42 strikeouts and 36 innings pitched. He is tied for the league lead with two wins and he ranks second with a .173 opponent batting average. Senior right-hander Jon Snyder ranks second in strikeouts (34), third in opponent batting average (.179), fourth in ERA (2.96) and sixth in innings pitched (27.1).
- Junior left-hander Nathan Ball paces the league with four saves. Senior right-hander Travis Perry ranks seventh in innings pitched (24.2), seventh in opponent batting average (.244) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (21).

**Lucero Making a Major Impact**

- Sophomore infielder Seth Lucero has made a major impact in his first season as a Penguin. The Dawson Community College transfer is tied for the team lead with a .333 batting average, and he leads the squad with 13 runs scored. He also ranks second on the team with 19 hits, 29 total bases and three stolen bases.
- Lucero has hit safely in 11 of the 15 games he has played in this season including each of the last four. Seth Lucero batted .500 and slugged .850 with 10 hits in 20 at bats over four games played this past week. He recorded two doubles, a triple, a home run and five RBIs. He also registered six runs scored, 17 total bases, a .500 on-base percentage and two stolen bases in two attempts.
- Lucero went 2-for-4 with a double, a home run and two runs scored in YSU’s 5-2 win at

Pitt on Wednesday. He then went 3-for-5 with two RBIs, two stolen bases and a run scored in YSU's 4-0 win at Purdue Fort Wayne on Friday. The Arvada, Colo., native went 2-for-5 with a double and two runs scored in game one of Sunday's doubleheader before going 3-for-6 with a triple, two RBIs and a run scored in YSU's 12-6 victory in game two of the doubleheader.

- Lucero has made 14 starts so far this season for the Penguins – nine at shortstop, four at second base and one as the designated hitter. He has batted in the leadoff spot eight times and in the two-hole on three occasions.

**Three Penguins Named Top Players to Watch**

- Senior outfielder Dominick Bucko, junior outfielder Turner Grau and senior pitcher Jon Snyder were named Top Players to Watch in the Horizon League by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper in its 2022 preview edition.
- Bucko was named First-Team All-Region and Second-Team All- Horizon League in 2021 after batting .344 and slugging .600 with eight doubles, four triples, 10 home runs and 53 RBIs. He became the first Penguin since 2010 to record at least 10 home runs and 50 RBIs in the same season.
- Grau is coming off a breakout 2021 season that saw him bat .295 and slug .541 with 13 doubles, seven triples, eight home runs and 42 RBIs. With seven triples last season, he tied the single-season school record that was set by Lou Vassalotti in 1994. Grau's seven triples led the Horizon League and ranked second in the nation.
- Snyder was named Second-Team All-Horizon League after having the best season of his career in 2021. He finished the season with a 6-2 record, a 2.76 ERA, 88 strikeouts and a .202 opponent batting average in 71.2 innings over 15 appearances and 14 starts.

**Looking to Build on 2021**

- Youngstown State entered the 2022 season looking to build on a historic 2021 season that saw the Penguins post their best record in 26 years.
- Last season, the Penguins went 32-24 overall to reach the 30-win plateau for just the second time in program history and for the first time since going 37-17 in 1995. YSU also reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 2010.
- YSU went 24-16 in Horizon League play to set new program records for Horizon League and conference wins. The previous record of 16 Horizon League wins was set in 2006 while the previous mark of 18 conference wins was set in 1995 when the Penguins were in the Mid-Continent Conference. The Penguins finished the season with a winning record for the first time since 2005, and they secured a winning record in league play for the first time since 2008.

- Youngstown State's pitching staff set a new school record with 447 strikeouts in 2021. The Penguins surpassed the previous mark of 431 that was set in 2003. It marked just the fourth time in program history that YSU recorded at least 400 strikeouts in a season.
- YSU's 88 stolen bases in 2021 rank as the third most in a season in school history. After stealing 86 bases in 2018 and setting a new school record with 113 steals in 2019, the Penguins have now recorded three of the five-highest single-season stolen bases totals in program history over the past four seasons.

### Snyder Coming Off Stellar Season

- Senior right-hander Jon Snyder will take on the responsibility of being YSU's top starting pitcher in 2022 after a stellar 2021 campaign. The Springboro, Ohio, native was named Second-Team All-Horizon League in 2021 to garner postseason league honors for the first time in his career.
- Snyder finished the 2021 season with a 6-2 record, a 2.76 ERA, 88 strikeouts and a .202 opponent batting average in 71.2 innings over 15 appearances and 14 starts. He tied for the Horizon League lead in opponent batting average while ranking second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts.
- Snyder recorded 11.05 strikeouts per nine innings last season, which ranks as the sixth-best mark in school history and the highest by a Penguin since 2001. Snyder's 88 strikeouts are tied for the sixth most in a season in program history while his 2.76 ERA ranks as the ninth-lowest mark in school history.
- Snyder allowed two earned runs over his final six starts of 2021. He allowed just one unearned run on six hits and struck out 17 batters in 16 innings over his final three starts.
- Following the season, Snyder was named to the Horizon League All-Academic Team and the CoSIDA 2020-21 Academic All-District Baseball Team for his combined performance on the field and in the classroom. He is one of six players in program history to earn Academic All-District honors.

### Bucko Coming Off Breakout Year

- Senior outfielder Dominick Bucko is coming off a breakout year in 2021 in which he batted .344 and slugged .600 with eight doubles, four triples, 10 home runs and 53 RBIs. He also recorded 44 runs, 27 walks, 108 total bases, a .446 on-base percentage and six steals.
- Bucko was named to the All-Horizon League Second Team and to the ABCA/Rawlings East All-Region First Team in 2021.





### Bertolini's Bio

Head Coach • Sixth Season

Dan Bertolini, a Youngstown native with a proven record of winning and recruiting talented players from the region, is in his sixth season as head coach of the YSU baseball program. He is the ninth head coach in Penguins history.

Bertolini came to YSU after spending the previous eight seasons developing the program at Mercyhurst North East into a consistent winner at the national level. The Saints averaged more than 29 wins over his eight seasons and won at least 30 games in four of his last five years. He was the winningest coach in school history.

Most recently in 2021, YSU went 32-24 to post its best record in 26 years. The Penguins reached the 30-win plateau for just the second time in program history and for the first time since going 37-17 in 1995. Youngstown State also reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 2010.

The Penguins went 24-16 in Horizon League play to set a new program record for Horizon League and conference wins. The previous record of 16 Horizon League wins was set in 2006 while the previous mark of 18 conference wins was set in 1995. YSU finished the season with a winning record for the first time since 2005, and it secured a winning record in league play for the first time since 2008.

Bertolini and his wife Bre, who played lacrosse at Mercyhurst, have two daughters named Eloise and Odelia and a son named Hawkins.

- The Saxonburg, Pa., native led the Penguins in slugging, home runs and RBIs. Bucko's 53 RBIs rank as the third most in a season in program history, and they were the most since Jacke Healey set the school record with 59 RBIs in 2010.
- Bucko's 10 home runs last season are tied for the seventh most in a season in program history. He became the first Penguin since 2010 to record at least 10 home runs and 50 RBIs in the same season.
- Bucko recorded 17 multi-hit games and led YSU with 13 multi-RBI performances. He reached base safely in a team-best 19 consecutive games at one point. Bucko batted .469 with runners in scoring position and .347 against left-handed pitching.

### Grau Continues Growth

- Junior outfielder Turner Grau is also coming off a breakout season 2021. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native batted .295 and slugged .541 with 13 doubles, seven triples, eight home runs and 42 RBIs. Grau also recorded 40 runs, 112 total bases, 13 walks and six stolen bases. He ranked in the top five in the Horizon League in triples and total bases.
- With seven triples last season, Grau tied the single-season school record that was set by Lou Vassalotti in 1994. Grau's seven triples led the Horizon League and ranked second in the nation.
- Grau matched his career high with three hits and tied the single-game school record with two triples at Milwaukee on April 11, 2021. He became just the second Penguin since 1988 to triple two times in a game.
- Grau was named Horizon League Batter of the Week on March 2, 2021, after batting .471 and slugging .647 with eight hits including a double and his first-career triple in 17 at bats over four games played at Nicholls and No. 11 LSU.
- Grau will miss the beginning of the 2022 season as he recovers from offseason shoulder surgery.

### Coles Brings Versatility to Pitching Staff

- Senior right-hander Chad Coles will bring versatility to YSU's pitching staff in 2022 as a veteran arm who can start or come out of the bullpen. The North Huntingdon, Pa., native

has made five relief appearances and three starts through the first five weeks of 2022.

- The fifth-year super senior has made 82 career appearances, 71 of which have come out of the bullpen. Coles' 82 career appearances currently rank tied for third in program history. He recently became just the sixth pitcher in school history to record 80 or more career appearances. Coles' former teammate Joel Hake (2016-21) holds the YSU career record for appearances with 115.
- Coles has made at least 21 appearances in three of his first four seasons as a Penguin. He made eight appearances over 14 games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 campaign. He had 21 appearances and two starts as a freshman in 2018, and he made 22 appearances and six starts as a sophomore in 2019.
- Coles ranked second on the team with a career-high 23 appearances in 2021. He finished the season with a 2-2 record and a 4.33 ERA in 35.1 innings pitched. He struck out a career-high 47 batters while walking only 15, and opponents batted .257 against him.
- Coles is one of eight returning pitchers who made at least eight appearances last season. Jon Snyder (15), Nick Perez (14), Nathan Ball (10), Travis Perry (9), Matt Brosky (8), Kenny Misik (8) and Andrew Russell (8) also return after serving as key pieces of the pitching staff in 2021.

### Schedule Notes

- YSU opened the 2022 season on Friday, Feb. 18, at Bethune-Cookman as part of a three-game series. The Penguins will proceed to play their first 28 games of the season on the road.
- The Penguins' home opener at Eastwood Field is April 6 against Pittsburgh, and the team's Horizon League opener was March 18 at Purdue Fort Wayne. YSU is scheduled for 17 home games, 39 road games and 30 Horizon League contests as part of its 56-game slate.
- The Penguins will play 26 non-conference games including nine games against Power Five opponents. YSU will play a home-and-home with Pitt in addition to road games at Penn State, Michigan State, Ohio State and Michigan. The Guins will also play a three-game non-conference series at West Virginia on March 25-27.
- YSU will spend the first seven weeks of the season away from home.
- The Penguins will also play a non-conference home-and-home with Niagara. YSU will host the Purple Eagles on April 12 before traveling to New York on April 26.
- After playing their first 28 games on the road, the Penguins will return to Eastwood Field for a 10-game homestand from April 6-22. YSU will have 17 of its final 28 regular season games at home including seven of the final 11 contests.
- The Penguins will play seven consecutive road games from April 24-May 3. YSU is scheduled to play games in 13 different states during the 2022 campaign.

### Roster Composition

- There are 40 players on YSU's roster in 2022, and 24 of them were with the program last year. The Penguins return 20 letterwinners from last year's team and have 16 newcomers to the roster.
- The roster consists of 13 seniors, nine juniors, six sophomores and 12 freshmen. The group of 16 newcomers includes 10 true freshmen and six transfers.
- The group of true freshman include Jake Brazzano (Blairstown, N.J.), Eli Brown (Bowling Green, Ohio), Vince D'Eusanio (Willoughby, Ohio), Ian Francis (Poland, Ohio), Jack Johnson (Katy, Texas), Brandon Mikos (Canfield, Ohio), Daniel Morehead (Santa Rosa, Calif.), Lane Rhodes (Salem, Ohio), Mitchell Seymour (New Springfield, Ohio) and Zach Stayduhar (Coraopolis, Pa.).
- The six transfers include AJ Clegg (Northern Kentucky), Austin Earl (Salem University),

**Shane Davis***Assistant Coach • Fourth Season*

Shane Davis, a Youngstown native, will be in his fourth season as the pitching coach for the YSU baseball program in 2021-22. In addition to serving as YSU's pitching coach, Davis added the duties of recruiting coordinator following the 2021 campaign.

After playing collegiately at Eastern Michigan, Davis joined the Eagles as an assistant before moving on to coach at Cleveland State and Western Illinois. He and Head Coach Dan Bertolini were teammates at Poland High School in 2002.

Davis coached Collin Floyd to Horizon League Pitcher of the Year honors in 2021. Floyd became just the fourth player in school history and the first since Aaron Swenson in 2008 to be named conference Pitcher of the Year. He ended his career as YSU's all-time leader in strikeouts (323) and games started (57). Floyd's 323 strikeouts also rank second in Horizon League history.

Davis' pitching staff set a new school record with 447 strikeouts in 2021. The Penguins surpassed the previous mark of 431 that was set in 2003. In addition to Floyd's impressive 108 strikeouts, Jon Snyder had 88 punch outs and Colin Clark recorded 72. It marked the first time in program history that three different pitchers have struck out at least 60 batters in the same season. All three Penguins were named the Horizon League Pitcher of the Week during the 2021 season.

**Eric Bunnell***Assistant Coach • Fourth Season*

Eric Bunnell, a Northeast Ohio native, will be in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Youngstown State baseball program in 2021-22. Bunnell will serve as the team's primary hitting coach for the first time in 2022.

Bunnell, who previously worked closely with YSU's catchers, helped coach senior Nick Caruso to a career year in 2021. Caruso set new career highs with a .310 batting average, a .472 slugging percentage, 10 doubles, two triples, three home runs, 31 RBIs and a .375 on-base percentage. He also recorded a .989 fielding percentage with just four errors in 380 chances behind the plate. Following the season, Caruso signed a professional contract with the Westside Woolly Mammoths of the United Shore Professional Baseball League (USPBL).

A native of Conneaut, Ohio, Bunnell earned a bachelor's degree in business and marketing from Mount Union as well as a master's degree in liberal studies from North Central College. Bunnell is married to Alyson (Kieffer) Bunnell and they have a daughter named Everly.

Jake Ellowitz (Fairleigh Dickinson), Seth Lucero (Dawson Community College), Pete Panko (TCU) and Danny Zimmerman (Wabash Valley College).

## Replacing Key Pieces

- Youngstown State will be looking to replace some of the key pieces from its 2021 squad that left due to graduation and the transfer portal.
- 2021 Horizon League Pitcher of the Year Collin Floyd graduated after an illustrious YSU career. Also leaving due to graduation were Joel Hake, Dalton Earich, Nick Caruso, Blaze Glenn and Gary Clift Jr.
- Floyd was named First-Team All-Horizon League and Horizon League Pitcher of the Year in 2021 after having one of the best seasons by a pitcher in YSU history. He finished the campaign with a 9-4 record, a 2.58 ERA and 108 strikeouts over 101.1 innings in 15 starts. He tied school records with nine wins and 15 starts, and his 2.58 ERA was the lowest by a Penguin since Dave Dravecky had a 2.21 ERA over 61 innings in 1977.
- Floyd made a school-record 57 starts for the Penguins from 2016 to 2021. He became YSU's all-time strikeout leader on April 2, 2021, with the 266th strikeout of his career, breaking Aaron Swenson's previous record of 265, which had stood since 2010. He finished his career with 323 strikeouts, which ranks second in Horizon League history.
- Glenn became one of three players in school history to earn all-league honors three times. He finished his career ranking second in program history with 111 walks, fourth with 24 home runs, seventh with 46 steals and eighth with 121 RBIs. Glenn is the only player in YSU history to record at least 20 home runs, 80 walks and 35 stolen bases.
- Hake finished his career as YSU's career appearances leader with 115 while Clift Jr. finished his career ranked tied for fourth in school history with 10 career saves. Earich was key member of YSU's bullpen, making 65 appearances over the last four years. Caruso batted .310 and slugged .472 with 10 doubles, two triples, three home runs and 31 RBIs in 2021 as YSU's starting catcher.
- In addition, All-Horizon League infielders Jeff Wehler (Pitt) and Phillip Glasser (Indiana) transferred to Power Five schools. Wehler is also one of three players in school history to earn all-league honors three times. He finished his YSU career ranked second in school history with 88 career steals. Glasser was named Second-Team All-Horizon League in 2021 after batting .321 with 12 doubles, three triples, five home runs, 28 RBIs and 23 stolen bases.
- Left-hander Colin Clark (Texas Tech) also transferred to a Power Five school after serving as YSU's Friday starter for the past three seasons. He made 52 appearances and 36 starts for the Penguins from 2018 to 2021. Clark finished his career ranking 12th in program history in starts (36) and 15th in both innings pitched (209.1) and strikeouts (172).

## Final Ride for Nasonti

- Super senior outfielder Lucas Nasonti is one three Penguins on the 2022 roster that has been with the program for five years (Chad Coles and Jon Snyder). The Warren, Ohio, native has played in 182 games over four-plus years as a Penguin. He has a chance to break Justin Banks' school record of 218 games played.
- Nasonti was named to the Horizon League All-Freshman Team in 2018 after playing in 42 games and making 33 starts. As a sophomore in 2019, he played in 51 games, making 50 starts in center field. He started all 14 games in center field during the shortened 2020 campaign. Last season, Nasonti tied the single-season school record of 56 games played and made 55 starts in center field. He was the first Penguin since Blaze Glenn in 2018 to play in 56 games.
- Nasonti ranks tied for third in program history with 21 career sacrifice bunts and 15th with 32 career stolen bases. He has started all 19 games in center field this season.





# 2022 PRESEASON NOTES

## Preseason Poll Results

- D1Baseball.com picked YSU to finish fourth in the Horizon League in its projected conference standings. 2021 regular season and tournament champion Wright State was tabbed as the preseason favorite while UIC was selected second and Milwaukee was picked third.
- YSU was picked to finish third in the Horizon League in preseason projections by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Collegiate Baseball also picked Wright State to win the 2021 Horizon League title.
- The Penguins were also picked fourth in the 2022 Horizon League Baseball Preseason Poll. Wright State edged out UIC as the preseason favorite in a vote of the league’s head coaches. The Raiders received all six first-place votes.
- In the league’s poll, Milwaukee was picked third while Northern Kentucky checked in one spot behind the Penguins in fifth. Oakland and Purdue Fort Wayne were selected sixth and seventh, respectively, in the poll.

## Three Penguins Named Top Players to Watch

- Senior OF Dominick Bucko, junior OF Turner Grau and senior RHP Jon Snyder were named Top Players to Watch in the Horizon League by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper in its 2022 preview edition.
- Bucko is coming off a breakout season in 2021 that earned him First-Team All-Region and Second-Team All-Horizon League honors. The Saxonburg, Pa., native batted .344 and slugged .600 with eight doubles, four triples, 10 home runs and 53 RBIs. Bucko’s 53 RBIs rank as the third-most in a season in school history, and they were the most since Jacke Healey set the school record with 59 RBIs in 2010.
- Grau is also coming off a breakout sophomore season in 2021. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native batted .295 and slugged .541 with 13 doubles, seven triples, eight home runs and 42 RBIs. With seven triples last season, Grau tied the single-season school record that was set by Lou Vassalotti in 1994. Grau’s seven triples led the Horizon League and ranked second in the nation.

## Snyder Named Preseason Horizon League Pitcher of the Year

- Senior RHP Jon Snyder was named the Preseason Horizon League Pitcher of the Year by Perfect Game in its 2022 conference preview.
- Snyder was named Second-Team All-Horizon League after having the best season of his career in 2021. Snyder garnered all-league honors for the first time in his career. The Springboro, Ohio, native finished the season with a 6-2 record, a 2.76 ERA, 88 strikeouts and a .202 opponent batting average in 71.2 innings over 15 appearances and 14 starts.
- Snyder tied for the Horizon League lead in opponent batting average while ranking second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts. Snyder also recorded 11.05 strikeouts per nine innings pitched, which ranks as the sixth-best mark in school history and the highest since Brad Hennessey posted 12.79 K/9 in 2001. Snyder’s 88 strikeouts are tied for the sixth-most in a season in program history while his 2.76 ERA ranks as the ninth-lowest mark in school history.
- Snyder was named to the 2020-21 Academic All-District® Baseball Team, selected by CoSIDA, for his combined performance on the field and in the classroom. He is one of six players in program history to earn Academic All-District honors.
- Snyder, Bucko and junior IF Braeden O’Shaughnessy were each named to Perfect Game’s Horizon League Preseason All-Conference Team. In addition, Snyder and senior RHP Chad Coles were each ranked among the publication’s top-10 draft prospects for 2022.

## 2021 IN REVIEW

- The Penguins went 32-24 overall in 2021 to reach the 30-win plateau for just the second time in program history and for the first time since going 37-17 in 1995. YSU also reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 2010.
- YSU went 24-16 in Horizon League play in 2021 to set new program records for Horizon League and conference wins. The previous record of 16 Horizon League wins was set in 2006 while the previous mark of 18 conference wins was set in 1995 when the Penguins were in the Mid-Continent Conference.
- The Penguins finished the season with a winning record for the first time since 2005, and they secured a winning record in league play for the first time since 2008.
- YSU finished the 2021 season with a 19-4 record at Eastwood Field to set a new program record for home wins. The previous mark of 18 home wins was set in 1977.
- The Penguins also won 13 road games in 2021, which was their most since winning 14 in 2006. It marked the first season since 2010 in which the Penguins have won at least 10 road contests.
- YSU finished the 2021 campaign with national rankings of second in triples, 23rd in batting average, 35th in hits, 45th in runs, seventh in sacrifice flies and 19th in stolen bases.
- The Penguins set new school records for triples (27), slugging percentage (.463) and fielding percentage (.969). The Guins also posted their best batting average (.298) and on-base percentage (.379) since 2010.
- YSU finished the 2021 season with 51 home runs as a team. That is the second most in school history behind 60 in 2010.
- YSU’s pitching staff set a new school record with 447 strikeouts in 2021. The Penguins surpassed the previous mark of 431 that was set in 2003. It marked just the fourth time in program history that YSU recorded at least 400 strikeouts in a season.
