BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• For just the second time in conference history, 10 Big Ten schools were selected for bowl competition, including two teams earning berths in one of the six College Football Playoff bowls in Ohio State and Michigan State. The Big Ten's total of 10 bowl teams equals the conference record for most bowl berths in a season, matching the 10 postseason teams following the 2011 campaign.

• Big Ten Champion Ohio State was selected to participate in the inaugural College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 4 by the College Football Playoff selection committee and will face No. 1 Alabama on Jan. 1. The winner of the Sugar Bowl will meet either No. 2 seed Oregon or No. 3 seed Florida State in the College Football Playoff National Championship to be played at 8:30 p.m. ET on Jan. 12 in Arlington, Texas.

• Ohio State was crowned Big Ten Champion following its victory over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. With the win, the Buckeyes claimed their 35th Big Ten Championship and their 11th consecutive victory.

• Ohio State (12-1), Michigan State (10-2) and Wisconsin (10-3) have claimed at least 10 victories so far this season, marking the third time in the past four seasons that three conference teams have reached the 10-win plateau. A victory by Nebraska would give the Big Ten four teams with at least 10 victories for the first time since 2003.

• The Big Ten will feature the largest and most diverse postseason lineup in conference history this season, with six teams making their first or second appearance in their assigned bowl. Illinois, Michigan State, Minnesota, Penn State and Rutgers will each make their first trip to their destinations while Iowa will visit the TaxSlayer Bowl for the second time in program history. In addition, Big Ten teams will take part in the Foster Farms Bowl for just the second time and the Holiday Bowl for the first time since 1994. Wisconsin will play in the Outback Bowl for the first time since 2008 and Ohio State will make its first official trip to the Sugar Bowl since 1999. Michigan State's Cotton Bowl appearance will mark the first by a Big Ten team since 1987.

• Big Ten teams will once again take on one of the nation's toughest bowl lineups this postseason, facing five programs that appear among the top 25 of the final College Football Playoff rankings. Fourth-ranked Ohio State State squares off against top-ranked and SEC Champion Alabama in the Allstate Sugar Bowl, while eighth-ranked Michigan State takes on fifth-ranked and Big 12 Co-Champion Baylor in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl. No. 25 Minnesota will face No. 16 Missouri in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, No. 18 Wisconsin will take on No. 19 Auburn in the Outback Bowl and Nebraska will meet No. 24 USC in the National University Holiday Bowl.

• The Big Ten set a new single-season attendance record during the 2014 season with 6,359,218 fans attending home games. In addition, nine Big Ten schools produced increases in average attendance, including a boost of more than eight percent for Maryland and Rutgers.

BIG LIFE. BIG STAGE. BIG TEN.

The Big Ten administers nearly \$200 million in direct financial aid to almost 9,500 student-athletes for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on 350 teams in 42 different sports.

BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- Three Big Ten players and one coach took home national individual honors following the conclusion of the regular season. Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon claimed the Doak Walker Award as the top running back in the country. Iowa's Brandon Scherff collected the Outland Trophy, awarded to the nation's most outstanding interior lineman. Maryland's Brad Craddock was named the Lou Groza Award recipient as the nation's top place kicker. Ohio State offensive coordinator Tom Herman claimed the Broyles Award, given annually to the top assistant coach in college football.
- At least 19 conference standouts were named to various All-America squads, including 11 that earned first-team distinction from at least one organization. Indiana's Tevin Coleman, Iowa's Brandon Scherff, Ohio State's Joey Bosa and Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon each earned first-team status from at least seven different organizations. Other conference standouts to earn first-team status from at least one outlet include Maryland's Brad Craddock, Michigan State's Jack Allen and Kurtis Drummond, Minnesota's Maxx Williams, Ohio State's Michael Bennett and Wisconsin's Kyle Costigan and Rob Havenstein. - Six Big Ten student-athletes were named Capital One Academic All-Americans. The Big Ten has now led all Football Bowl Subdivision conferences in Academic All-Americans for 10 straight seasons, with 78 honorees over that time span. The Academic All-America first-team honorees from the Big Ten are Indiana's Mark Murphy, Michigan State's Mike Sadler, Minnesota's Maxx Williams and Rutgers' David Milewski. Iowa's Mark Weisman and Ohio State's Jacoby Boren earned Academic All-America second-team accolades. To be eligible for the award, a player must be in at least his second year of athletic eligibility, be a first-team or key performer and carry a cumulative 3.30 grade point average (GPA).
- A pair of Big Ten standouts broke single-season conference offensive records in 2014. Wisconsin running back Melvin Gordon set a new mark for most rushing yards in a season with 2,336 yards. Ohio State quarterback J.T. Barrett was responsible for a record 45 touchdowns this season (34 passing, 11 rushing).

BIG TEN BOWL BREAKDOWN



ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF SEMIFINAL

Ohio State was granted the No. 4 seed and will take on top-seeded Alabama in the Allstate Sugar Bowl. The game will be contested at 8:30 p.m. ET on Jan. 1 in New Orleans, La. The Buckeyes will be making their 44th official appearance in postseason competition, having last appeared in the 2014 Orange Bowl. Ohio State will take part in the Sugar Bowl for the fourth time, most recently a victory over Texas A&M in 1999. Big Ten programs have played in six Sugar Bowls, most recently following the 2011 season.



GOODYEAR COTTON BOWL

Michigan State heads to the Goodyear Cotton Bowl where it will face Baylor at 12:30 p.m. ET on Jan. 1 in Arlington, Texas. The Spartans will be making their first appearance in the Cotton Bowl and only the second by a Big Ten team, as Ohio State earned a Cotton Bowl win following the 1986 season. Michigan State has advanced to a program-record eight straight postseason contests and is making its 25th bowl appearance in team history.



BUFFALO WILD WINGS CITRUS BOWL

Minnesota will take part in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl at 1 p.m. ET on Jan. 1 in Orlando, Fla., against Missouri. The Gophers will be making their 17th postseason appearance and third straight bowl trip. The game will mark Minnesota's first appearance in the Citrus Bowl, the Big Ten's second-oldest current bowl partner behind only the Rose Bowl Game. Big Ten teams have played in 24 Citrus Bowls, including each of the last 22 seasons.



OUTBACK BOWL

Wisconsin will play in the Outback Bowl for the first time since the 2007 season in a game that will take place at Noon ET on Jan. 1 in Tampa, Fla., against Auburn. The Badgers are taking part in postseason play for a school-record 13th straight season and are making their 26th bowl appearance. Wisconsin will make its fifth trip to the Outback Bowl. The Outback Bowl is the Big Ten's third-oldest current bowl partner and has been affiliated with the conference since the 1993 season. Big Ten schools have played in 25 Outback Bowls, including each of the last 21 seasons.



NATIONAL UNIVERSITY HOLIDAY BOWL

Nebraska earned an invitation from one of the conference's newest bowl partners, the National University Holiday Bowl, which will take place at 8 p.m. ET on Dec. 27 in San Diego, Calif., against Southern California. The contest will mark the Huskers' fourth appearance in the Holiday Bowl and first since the 2010 campaign. Nebraska will be making its 51st bowl appearance and eighth straight postseason contest. Big Ten squads have played in the Holiday Bowl on nine occasions, most recently after the 1994 campaign.



TAXSLAYER BOWL

Iowa makes its sixth bowl appearance in the last seven seasons and will take on Tennessee in the TaxSlayer Bowl at 3:20 p.m. ET on Jan. 2 in Jacksonville, Fla. The Hawkeyes will play in their 28th postseason outing overall, the 10th appearance by a Big Ten school in this bowl game and fifth straight. Iowa will participate in the TaxSlayer Bowl for the second time and first since the 1983 season, when it was called the Gator Bowl.



NEW ERA PINSTRIPE BOWL

Penn State will make the Big Ten's debut in the New Era PinStripe Bowl at 4:30 p.m. ET on Dec. 27 against Boston College. Played at Yankee Stadium in Bronx, N.Y., the Big Ten's partnership with the PinStripe Bowl marks the conference's first bowl game tie-in on the East Coast. The Nittany Lions will be making their 39th official appearance in postseason play and first since taking part in the TicketCity Bowl following the 2011 campaign.



FOSTER FARMS BOWL

Following its first season as a Big Ten member, Maryland makes a bowl appearance for the second consecutive season and will face Stanford in the Foster Farms Bowl, one of the Big Ten's newest bowl partners. The 2014 Foster Farms Bowl will be held at 10 p.m. ET on Dec. 30 in Santa Clara, Calif. The contest will mark the third time that a current Big Ten team will play in the Foster Farms Bowl, including a 2007 appearance by the Terrapins in what was then called the Emerald Bowl. The Terrapins will participate in their 26th postseason contest.



QUICK LANE BOWL

Fellow Big Ten newcomer Rutgers also earned a bowl berth in its first season in the conference and will face North Carolina in the inaugural Quick Lane Bowl at 4:30 p.m. ET on Dec. 26 in Detroit, Mich. The Scarlet Knights will be making their ninth bowl appearance in the last 10 years and taking part in their 10th postseason game overall. Rutgers has won five of its last seven bowl games.



ZAXBY'S HEART OF DALLAS BOWL

Illinois will make its first bowl appearance since the 2011 season against Louisiana Tech in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl, to be held at 1 p.m. ET on Dec. 26 in Dallas, Texas. The Illini have won their last two bowl games and will be making their 18th postseason appearance overall. The Big Ten has taken part in the Heart of Dallas Bowl in three of the last four seasons.

Illinois' Hopkins and Michigan's Griese Honored with Big Ten Ford-Kinnick Leadership and Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Awards

Illinois' Mike Hopkins was named the recipient of the Big Ten's Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award, while Michigan's Brian Griese was honored with the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award. The awards recognize Big Ten football players that have achieved success in the areas of leadership and humanitarianism after their college careers have ended.

Hopkins was a four-year letterwinner for the Illini and a team captain in 1991, earning the Big Ten Medal of Honor while completing an undergraduate degree in aerospace engineering. A distinguished graduate of the Reserve Officers Training Corps, Hopkins earned a Masters of Science in Aerospace Engineering from Stanford University in 1992. That same year, he was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force, working in advanced space system technologies. Hopkins entered the flight test engineering course in 1996, graduating the following year. After posts in Canada and Italy, Hopkins was assigned to the United States Air Force Rapid Capabilities Office at the Pentagon in 2005, serving as a project engineer and program manager. He was selected for Astronaut Candidate Training at NASA in 2009 and graduated in 2011. Two years later, he served as a flight engineer on Expedition 37/38, a 166-day mission to the International Space Station during which Hopkins completed 2,656 orbits of the Earth and traveled more than 70 million miles. Hopkins has risen to the rank of colonel during a decorated career in the Air Force, earning numerous medals for aerial achievement and meritorious service.

Griese led the Wolverines to an undefeated season in 1997 that culminated with a victory over Washington State in the 1998 Rose Bowl and Michigan's 11th national championship. Griese was drafted by the Denver Broncos in the third round of the 1998 NFL Draft and played 11 seasons in the NFL, winning a Super Bowl ring. In 2002, Griese founded Judi's House, named in honor of his mother who succumbed to breast cancer when he was 12 years old. The organization seeks to help grieving children and their caregivers in the Denver area. In 2011, Griese was honored for his work with Judi's House when he was given the Patterson Award for Excellence in Sports Philanthropy, which celebrates and promotes the selfless service of people within the world of sports. He also helped establish what would become the Griese, Hutchinson and Woodson Champions for Children's Hearts golf weekend in May of 2007. The event benefited the capital campaign for construction of the C.S. Mott Children's Hospital, located in Ann Arbor, Mich., as well as the Michigan Congenital Heart Center (MCHC) which resides within Mott. He has also stayed involved with the From the Heart Organization, a relationship that dates back to his playing days at Michigan when he would visit the C.S. Mott Children's Hospital every week. Griese has served as a college football analyst for ESPN since 2009.

Big Ten Announces 2014 All-Big Ten Teams and Individual Award Winners

The Big Ten announced the 2014 All-Big Ten teams and individual award winners on Dec. 1 and 2.

Wisconsin running back Melvin Gordon was named the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year. Ohio State defensive end Joey Bosa and quarterback J.T. Barrett were tabbed as the Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player and Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year, respectively. Minnesota's Jerry Kill was named the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year by his peers and Dave McClain Coach of the Year by the media.

Gordon is the fifth Badger running back to collect Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year laurels, along with Montee Ball (2011), John Clay (2009), Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne (1999) and Brent Moss (1993). Gordon has amassed a Big Ten and school record 2,336 rushing yards, breaking the mark of 2,109 yards set by Dayne in 1996. Gordon leads the nation with 191.3 all-purpose yards per game, 179.7 rushing yards per game and 26 rushing touchdowns.

Bosa is the ninth Buckeye to receive the conference's top defensive award, and the second in the past three seasons after John Simon claimed the honor in 2012. Bosa leads the Big Ten with 13.5 sacks and 20.0 tackles for loss and is tied for the conference lead with four forced fumbles.

Barrett is the eighth Buckeye to be named Freshman of the Year, and first since fellow signal caller Braxton Miller claimed the award in 2011. Barrett set the Big Ten record for most touchdowns responsible for in a season, accounting for 45 touchdowns, including 34 passing scores and 11 rushing touchdowns.

Kill claims his first Big Ten Coach of the Year laurel, and just the second for a Minnesota mentor since 1972, as Glen Mason was honored in 1999. Kill has guided Minnesota to back-to-back seasons of eight or more wins for the first time since 2002 and 2003. Five Minnesota players earned first-team All-Big Ten status this season.

Michigan State's Kurtis Drummond was named the Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year, one year after former Spartan Darqueze Dennard accomplished the feat. Tony Lippett became the first Michigan State player to earn Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year honors. Minnesota's Peter Mortell was named the Eddleman-Fields Punter of the Year, while teammate Maxx Williams earned Kwalick-Clark Tight End of the Year plaudits. Ohio State's Barrett earned the Griese-Brees Quarterback of the Year honor, marking the third straight season that a Buckeye signal caller has won the award, after Braxton Miller claimed the honor in both 2012 and 2013. The Buckeyes' Bosa was named the Smith-Brown Defensive Lineman of the Year.

Iowa's Brandon Scherff was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year, becoming the seventh Hawkeye to capture the honor and the first since Bryan Bulaga in 2009. Maryland's Brad Craddock earned Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year honors in the Terrapins' first season in the conference. Penn State's Mike Hull was tabbed the Butkus-Fitzgerald Linebacker of the Year, marking the second time in the past three seasons that a Nittany Lion linebacker has claimed the plaudit after Michael Mauti was honored in 2012. Wisconsin's Gordon collected the Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year award, the third time in the past four years that a Badger running back has captured the honor, after Montee Ball won the award in 2011 and 2012.

Four Big Ten players were named repeat selections to the All-Big Ten first-team, including Iowa's Scherff, Michigan State defensive lineman Shilique Calhoun and defensive back Kurtis Drummond and Nebraska defensive lineman Randy Gregory.

The Big Ten also recognized 14 Sportsmanship Award honorees. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. These student-athletes must also be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.
