# PENN STATE HOCKEY

## THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

Penn State makes it's first-ever trip to South Bend to battle the No. 3/4 Notre Dame Fighting Irish. Both games will be available on NBCsports.com with Saturday's contest airing live across the nation on NBCSN at 7:05 p.m.

## LAST TIME THEY MET

The teams split last season's series with the Irish taking the opening game, 7-4, before the Lions came back to capture the finale, 5-3.

- Sophomore **Alec Marsh** collected three goals during the weekend series while senior **Dylan Richardson** added a pair of his own and classmate **Ricky DeRosa** potted the eventual game-winning tally in the finale.

## BECOMING A MORE FAMILIAR FOE

This weekend's series marks just the third and fourth times that Notre Dame and Penn State will meet on the ice. However, this will be the last time the two squads meet up as non-conference opponents. With the Irish entering the Big Ten at the conclusion of the season the teams will begin to see each other four times a year beginning with the 2017-18 campaign.

## FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

- In their previous four seasons as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks, no Nittany Lion player had ever scored a goal in three consecutive games to open the season.
- That all changed Friday night when sophomore **Andrew Sturtz** scored his team-leading third goal of the campaign as he showed off tremendous speed to blow past a defender and finished with some flash on a back hand flick into the top left corner of the net.

- With his three tallies Sturtz is tied with teammate **Nate Sucese** for the team lead which is also tied with three other players for the Big Ten lead after the opening two weekends of games.

## JONES EARNS BIG THIRD STAR

- After collecting his first collegiate shutout against Mercyhurst last weekend, freshman goaltender Peyton Jones was named the Big Ten Conference's Third Star of the Week. The rookie made 20 saves including 12 in the third period and 11 during the penalty-kill.

## YOUTH IN NUMBERS

- With more than half of this year's roster being composed of 10 freshmen and eight sophomores it comes as no surprise that those two classes are leading the way in the scoring department.
- The freshmen lead the team with six goals between them while the sophomores have added five. Each class has combined for 13 total points over the first three games.

## SHOTS FIRED

- After leading the NCAA in shots on goal per game last season (41.55), the Lions have continued their ferocious pace of shooting the puck and currently sit

second nationally (42.67) only behind RIT (44) over their first three games.

## HIGH-OCTANE OFFENSE

- After the first two weekends of regular season competition both Notre Dame and Penn State rank fourth and sixth, respectively for goals per game. The Irish are averaging 4.75 while the Lions are standing at 4.67.
- Notre Dame stands one goal shy of Minnesota-Duluth for the nations lead as they have lit the lamp 19 times this season while Penn State comes into the weekend in a tie for 11th nationally scoring 14 goals in their three games.

## RECAPPING MERCYHURST

Penn State led early and often during a 7-0 shutout victory in the first ever meeting between the two Pennsylvania based schools.

- The shutout marked the first for the Nittany Lions since defeating Vermont, 4-0, last November during the Philadelphia College Hockey Face-off.
- It was also the first road shutout for Penn State since their inaugural season when they defeated Fredonia State, 4-0, on December 11, 2012.

- The freshman class continues to shine as two more rookies collected their first collegiate goals as **Nikita Pavlychev** and **Denis Smirnov** found the back of the net. Junior transfer **Trevor Hamilton** also collected his first goal of the season and assisted on Pavlychev's score and his four points currently tie him for second on the team.

- Sophomore **Chase Berger** collected his first multi-point game of the season and fifth of his career. He notched his first goal of the season during a first-period power-play and also added a pair of assists for three points. He now leads the team and is tied for third in the Big Ten with five points.

- Penn State swept the three stars with **Nate Sucese**, **Chase Berger** and **Peyton Jones** going 1-2-3.

- The Nittany Lion's recorded their second short-handed goal of the season when Pavlychev's goal inched across the goal line.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Penn State power-play is beginning to heat up and after an 0-for-5 showing in the season opener they have scored two and three PPG's, respectively over their next two contests. The Lions currently rank 10th with a 20.8% success rate (5-for-24).

- On the penalty kill, however, Penn State is one of just three teams who remain perfect as they are 15-for-15 on the PK.

- Notre Dame features the nations seventh best PP, 27% (10-for-37), as their 10 goals are second only to Western Michigan's 12. The Irish PK is also solid ranking 12th nationally at 91.3% (21-for-23).

## SCOUTING NOTRE DAME



This marks the second straight season that the Nittany Lions and Fighting Irish will square off.

- Notre Dame posted a 19-11-7 record last season including a 15-5-2 conference mark and 11-6-3 record at home, but they were bounced on home-ice in two games by Northeastern in the Hockey East Quarterfinals. The Irish managed to earn an at-large bid to the NCAA tourney, but had a quick exit in the opening round falling to Michigan 3-2 in overtime.

- Last season saw the two teams split the season series at the Pegula Ice Arena. Notre Dame took the first game 7-4 before Penn State came back to capture a 5-3 victory the following night.

- Jordan Gross netted the eventual game-winning tally at 5:01 of the third while Dylan Malmquist added an insurance goal just 55 seconds later.

- Notre Dame returns five of their top six scorers from last season's roster including leading scorer Anders Bjork who collected 35 points off 12 goals and 23 assists. Jake Evans, Jordan Gross, Mario Lucia and Bobby Nardella also return to join Bjork as 20+ point getters from a season ago.

- The Irish did, however, graduate three double-digit goal scorers following last season including leading goal scorer Thomas DiPauli who potted 14 goals during the 2015-16 campaign. Steven Fogarty and Sam Herr were also lost to graduation after tallying 10 goals apiece.

- Back between the pipes is Buffalo Sabres draft pick Cal Petersen who started all 37 games last season for the Irish. He compiled a 19-11-7 record with a 2.20 goals against average and a .927 save percentage. In four games so far this season he is 3-1-0 with a 2.21 GAA and .917 save percentage.

- Bjork leads the team and the entire country with 10 points (5G, 5A) through the first two weeks of the regular season. Malmquist is currently second on the team and in the nation with eight points off three goals and five helpers. Connor Hurley leads the Irish with six assists while Gross, Nardella, Andrew Oglevie and Bo Brauer have also registered multiple goals early in the season.

- Notre Dame is currently tied with Western Michigan for second in the country with 19 goals, only trailing Minnesota-Duluth with 20 for the nation's top spot.

- The Irish enter the 2016-17 season with eight NHL draft picks on their roster, five forwards, two defensemen and one goalie.

- Net-minder Cal Petersen will don the 'C' this season for the Irish while Bjork, Evans and Luke Ripley will serve as alternates. It is believed this marks the first time in the history of Notre Dame hockey that a goaltender will serve as team captain.





**THOMPSON SET FOR 100TH GAME**

• Assuming he is in the lineup this weekend senior **David Thompson** will appear in his 100th career game donning the Blue and White.

• He will become the 10th player in the Division I era to log at least 100 career games played. Tommy Olczyk '16 holds the record with 132.

**RECAPPING 2015-16**

Penn State put together its best season during its young existence earning the first 20-win campaign for Guy Gadowsky as the Nittany Lion Bench Boss with a 21-13-4 record while posting their second-straight winning season in Big Ten play (10-9-1-0).

• Penn State set 7 new single-season program standards during 2015-16 including most wins (21), most points (366), most goals (140), most assists (226), most shots (1,579), most shots/game (41.55) and most goals/game (3.68).

• For the third straight season the Nittany Lions won their opening Big Ten game by defeating Michigan State at home, 4-2. They followed that up with a 6-1 victory the following night to earn a sweep in the first conference series for the second straight season after doing the same to Wisconsin in 2014-15.

• Nittany Lions climb to as high as No. 14 in the uscho.com poll on numerous occasions while also earning their first-ever USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine ranking debuting at No. 15 in the December 14, 2015 poll.

• Penn State sweeps Wisconsin January 15-16, 2016.

• Penn State beats Minnesota, 5-3, at Mariucci Arena marking the first Nittany Lion victory in Minneapolis, February 6, 2016.

• **Vince Pedrie** earns All-Big Ten Second Team honors as well as All Freshman Team laurels.

• **David Goodwin** earns second-straight All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors.

**NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH**

• Penn State, entering its fifth season of varsity hockey, was picked fourth for the second consecutive year in the Preseason Coaches' Poll behind Minnesota, Ohio State and Michigan, but ahead of Wisconsin and Michigan State in the preseason poll.

• The Nittany Lions were picked sixth in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. Penn State exceeded expectations last season, leading the Big Ten for stretches of the season and finished third in the regular season and advanced to the Big Ten semifinals.

• Goodwin, returns as the leading point scorer from last seasons roster with 38 on 11 goals and a career-best 27 assists. His 27 helpers was also a new single-season program record.

• Goodwin is currently the career leader in points (90) and assists (57) while his 33 goals rank him third all-time. His 90 points in currently 8th in all of college hockey for current players.

• The senior's 72 points over the last two seasons are the most in a two-year stretch in program history as he boasts the second and third best scoring seasons behind Casey Bailey's 40-point outburst in 2014-15.

• A double major in economics and Spanish, Goodwin has benn an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention the past two seasons.

• Pedrie, a communications, Arts and Sciences major, missed the final six games last season due to injury, but was still a unanimous pick for the Preseason Watch List by the opposing coaches.

• The strong d-man with a wicked shot returns as the leading goal-scoring defenseman in conference games last season with seven. He finished the year with eight goals and 14 assists for 22 points, good for eighth on the team.

• Penn State will also play five games on BTN, three of which will be at home, while they also welcome the American Sports Network to Pegula for their final home game of the season against Wisconsin on March 4 at 8 p.m. The remaining broadcasts will be

streamed live on BTN2Go.

• There is a stretch through the entire month of February where Penn State will have four straight weekends of television coverage as 7-of-8 contests are available on BTN and BTN2Go.

• For the fourth straight season, the entire Big Ten Tournament will be carried on BTN.

• Penn State will make a pair of appearances in NHL buildings this season, both of which the Lions are familiar with.

• The 2017 Big Ten Tournament is hosted by the Joe Louis Arena in Detroit Michigan, home to the Detroit Red Wings.

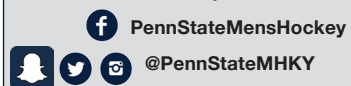

• Both forwards migrated to the U.S. and to Pennsylvania in their early teen years, playing youth hockey in the Keystone State.

## PACKING THE PEG

• Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 54-of-56 home games, including all 18 during the 2015-16 season.

• More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 35 occasions including 15 games last season.

• In 2015-16, Penn State ranked seventh in average attendance (6,093) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (105.4 percent).

• Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 109,681 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena, which is the most in the facilities short three-year history.

## WELCOME HOME

• Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

• The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

• The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

## STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

• Penn State has 27 players on the 2016-17 roster and after dealing with injuries throughout the majority of last season they are excited about this added depth. With 16 forwards and eight defensemen the internal competition and confidence is high.

## THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

• The Big Ten is in its fourth season entering 2016-17. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 20 league games, including 10 home contests.

• Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a shootout win and one point for a shootout loss.

• Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

• The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only major football conference to sponsor men's hockey.

• The 2017 league tournament will take place at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. with the tournament champion earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

### MEET COACH GADOWSKY

**Guy Gadowsky**, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 17th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2016-17. Gadowsky is currently coaching his fifth Penn State varsity team.

### AT PENN STATE

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions rise continued as Gadowsky led Penn State to their best finish since making the leap to NCAA Division I status. The Lions secured their first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

Those 2015-16 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of

the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign had gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten teams (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL arena (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

### AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, pre-





sented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

While at Princeton, Gadowsky had more than 20 players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalembo (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

**AT ALASKA**

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, who were ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

In addition, Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

**BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING**

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

**PLAYING CAREER**

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

In addition, Gadowsky spent a portion of the 1993-94 season competing with the Canadian National Team and also played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden.

**PERSONAL LIFE**

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.
