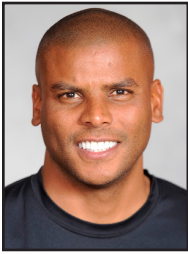
THE OPENING KICK

TERPS TRAVEL TO PENN STATE THURSDAY

- Maryland dropped its last match to Michigan, 1-0, on Thursday night. **Alex Anthony** led the Terps with four shots in the loss.
- Penn State leads the all-time series 8-4-0. The Nittany Lions won the inaugural meeting in the Big Ten last season, 1-0.
- Maryland has recorded 16 or more shots in four games this season. The squad's 30-shot performance against Yale is the second highest single game shot total by a Big Ten team this season.
- Senior defender **Shannon Collins** picked up her third assist of the season against Yale on Sept. 13. Collins now has 17 career assists, good enough for 11th in Maryland history.
- Collins notched the game winning goal in Maryland's 1-0 win over La Salle. It was Collins' first goal since Oct. 1 2012 in a game against Boston College.
- Freshman midfielder **Cassie Phillips** made her first career start against La Salle and has started a total of eight games. Phillips has played 614 minutes, the most of any Maryland newcomer. She also ranks third in shots with 13.
- Junior **Hope Gouterman** tallied her first career goal with a sensational 18-yard strike in the 79th minute against Yale. The goal came on Gouterman's first shot of the season.
- Head coach Jonathan Morgan announced his six-member leadership group for the 2015 season on Aug. 4. Seniors **Sarah Fichtner**, **Shannon Collins**, **Erika Nelson**, **Rachelle Beanlands**, **Riley Barger** and sophomore **Alex Anthony** make up the unit.
- Senior goalkeeper **Rachelle Beanlands**, senior midfielder **Sarah Fichtner** and senior defender **Erika Nelson** were named to the Big Ten players to watch list.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- No. 11 Penn State sits at third in the Big Ten with a 3-1-1 record in conference. The Nittany Lions have scored 13 goals in Big Ten play, the most of any team.
- Frannie Crouse leads Penn State and ranks t-5 in the Big Ten in goals with six. Mallory Weber has provided the Nittany Lions with three game winning goals, the fourth-best mark in the conference.
- Head coach Erica Walsh is in her ninth season and is a three-time (2009, 2012, 2014) Big Ten Coach of the Year. She led the Nittany Lions to the NCAA College Cup final in 2012.



JONATHAN MORGAN

HEAD COACH • THIRD SEASON AT MARYLAND • ROWAN '95

Jonathan Morgan was promoted to the head coach of the Maryland women's soccer program on February 10, 2012 after helping lead the Terrapin team to three-straight NCAA tournament appearances.

He continued Maryland's string of successful seasons in his first as the Terrapins' head coach, leading the team to a second-place finish in the ACC and a runner-up finish in the ACC tournament. The 2012 senior class also became the first graduating class to have defeated every ACC program during their collegiate careers. The Terps earned their fourth-straight bid to the NCAA tournament in Morgan's first season as head coach as a No. 4 seed.

Morgan's 2013 Terrapin team was highlighted by the brilliance of senior Hayley Brock, who culminated her three-year Maryland career by finishing among the top 10 on the career points, goals, assists, shots and game-winning goals lists.

Prior to taking over as head coach, Morgan served as an assistant coach with Terrapins for five seasons (2007-11) and helped lead a resurgence that saw the Terps earn two trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2009, 2011), the program's first-ever No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament (2010) and a berth in the ACC tournament championship game (2010).

In the five seasons Morgan served as an assistant coach at Maryland, the Terrapins boasted a record of 57-33-13 (.617), including a mark of 44-14-9 (.724) over the last three seasons, while playing in the nation's premier women's soccer conference.

Morgan was instrumental in recruiting the 2012 freshman class, which was ranked No. 5 in the nation by TopDrawerSoccer.com and includes two state Gatorade Players of the Year. He also led the recruiting effort for the 2008 freshman class, which was ranked No. 14 in the nation and featured All-American Jasmyne Spencer and Ashley Grove, who each finished among the top 10 in career goals and points at Maryland.

During his five seasons as a Terrapin assistant, Morgan has been primarily responsible for coordinating and training the team's defense, which included 2010 ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year Caitlin McDowell. He also helped coordinate the overall administration of the program, including academic support, scheduling, maintaining the operating budget, equipment, financial aid and fundraising.

Morgan also serves as the head coach of the Bethesda Soccer Club U17 girls, which is currently ranked No. 3 in the nation by Gotsoccer.com. During his tenure with BSC, Morgan has coached several players who have gone on to play with U.S. Youth National and USYSA Regional Teams.

Prior to coming to College Park, Morgan spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State (2005-06) where he was primarily responsible for recruiting and working with the Buckeyes' offensive attack. Under Morgan's tutelage the Buckeyes finished third in the Big Ten in points per game with a 4.84 ppg average.

The 2006 Buckeyes boasted the Big Ten conference's statistical individual leader in goals, goals per game, points per game, assists and assists per game in Lara Dickenmann, a two-time NSCAA All-American.

While in Columbus, Ohio, Morgan was the head coach of the Ohio Premier (OP) U15 girls club team.

Prior to coaching at Ohio State, Morgan spent three seasons as a volunteer coach at Rutgers, where he helped the Scarlet Knights to postseason appearances in 2002, '03 and '04. Among his responsibilities were assisting the coaching staff in developing and organizing all individual and team training sessions, as well as helping with recruiting, including the planning and directing of all official visits. During his tenure at Rutgers, Morgan helped coach Carli Loyd, a three-time NSCAA All-American, four-time first team All-Big East selection and full U.S. National Team player.

From 2001-05 Morgan was a staff coach for the Players Development Academy (PDA). During his time at PDA he coached four different teams between the ages of U12-U18. He had the privilege of coaching more than 40 future Division I student-athletes, three U.S. Youth National Team players and 10 USYSA regional team players.

A native of Dover, Del., Morgan was a four-year starter at Rowan College in Glassboro, N.J., serving as team captain his senior season with the Profs. After he finished his playing career, he broke into the college coaching ranks with his alma mater in 1995, helping the Rowan men's team to a 17-1-3 mark, a No. 4 national ranking and an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

He has also been involved with the Olympic Development Programs in Delaware and New Jersey, leading the New Jersey ODP girl's U-17 team to the Region 1 ODP championship in 2001. The team earned a trip to the ODP National championships and placed third. During his time with the New Jersey ODP program, Morgan helped coach U.S. Women's National Team players Heather O'Reilly and Jillian Loyden.

Morgan's ODP experience also includes being a part of the USYSA Region 1 staff from 2002-05.

A USSF "B" licensed and KNVB Dutch Certificate coach, Morgan graduated from Rowan in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in law/justice. He currently resides in Laurel, Md.

GAME NOTES

BEANLANDS CONTINUES TO SHINE

- Senior goalkeeper **Rachelle Beanlands** made her 70th start on Thursday. The Canadian now owns the all-time program record, breaking Cailin Mullins' (1990-93) mark on Sept. 24 against Northwestern with her 67th start. She is tied with Mullins for the all-time record in games played by a goalkeeper with 70.
- Beanlands holds a 1.11 goals against average for her career. That sits at fourth in program history.

ANTHONY PROVIDES A CUTTING EDGE

- Sophomore **Alex Anthony** scored her second penalty kick goal of the season and her seventh total against Illinois. Anthony is tied for second in the Big Ten with seven goals and is first in the conference in game winning goals with four.
- The Littleton, Colo., native tallied two goals and added an assist against Yale. Anthony is the first Terrapin since 2012 to notch two multi-goal games in a season (Hayley Brock, Becky Kaplan).
- Anthony has created many chances for the Terps this season. She leads the Big Ten in shots per game with 5.00 and has 60 total shots. Her 13 shots against Yale is the best single game total by a Big Ten player this season and she has the two highest totals (12 vs. Navy).
- Anthony's goal against Navy in 13 seconds is the fastest goal in Maryland history and t-20 in NCAA history.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Dating back to its 10-0 win over Mount St. Mary's in 2008, Maryland has lost only nine times in its last 57 matches vs. non-conference opponents. The Terps have outscored its non-conference opposition 142-35 in those 53 matches.
- The Terps recorded 20 straight wins over non-conference foes before tying Georgetown, 1-1, in second round of the NCAA tournament in 2010. Maryland is now 41-11-5 (.786) in its last 53 non-conference games. The Terps had been unbeaten in 31-straight non-conference games prior to losing, 1-0, at Oklahoma State in the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA tournament.
- The Terps are 11-3-0 at home against non-conference foes under Jonathan Morgan.

MARYLAND IN LUDWIG FIELD OPENERS

- Ludwig Field opened in 1995 and Maryland has enjoyed remarkable success at the venue (see below). But even that success pales in comparison to how the Terps have fared in home openers at Ludwig Field.
- Since 1995, Maryland is an astounding 16-2-3 (.825) in home openers at Ludwig Field. All-time, including the first eight seasons when the Terps played at Denton Field, Maryland is 19-7-3 (.696) in home openers.
- Maryland is 8-0-0 in home openers since 2008 and has outscored its opposition 33-0 in those six matches. Prior to that the Terps were 0-0-3 from 2005-07 with 0-0 double-OT ties against Towson in 2005 and 2006 and Eastern Kentucky in 2007.
- The only two losses the Terps have sustained in home openers at Ludwig Field came in 2003 (a 3-0 loss to No. 13 Penn State) and 2004 (a 2-0 loss to Virginia Tech).
