Holtmann, Buckeyes Support Fight for Literacy

Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Buckeyes, and the entire Ohio State men's basketball program have partnered with Coaching for Literacy (CFL) for the first time to raise awareness about the issue of illiteracy in America and to provide support for young children struggling to read in Columbus. The Buckeyes will host Coaching for Literacy's Fight for Literacy Games initiative Thursday when the Penn State Nittany Lions visit Value City Arena. To raise awareness about the issues connected to illiteracy, the Ohio State coaching staff will wear Coaching for Literacy's Green for Literacy showcasing a green tie, a green lapel pin and wrist band.

Starting Five

- The Ohio State men's basketball team traveled to Spain for 11 days over the summer. The Buckeyes played a total of three games, one in each stop during the trip, which began Aug. 1 with a flight to Madrid. Three days were spent in Madrid (W, 93-61 vs. Madrid Generals), Valencia (W, 95-63 vs. Valencia All-Stars) and Barcelona (W, 68-66 vs. Catalan All-Stars) before the team returned to Columbus Aug. 11. The team also experienced several cultural tours, team meals and excursions.
- Six Buckeyes are shooting better than 70 percent from the foul line this season. Freshman Luther Muhammad upped his foul shooting percentage with a 7-of-8 effort at Nebraska. He is shooting at a 71 percent clip to date (34-48). Guards C.J. Jackson and Keyshawn Woods shoot 79 percent and 82 percent, respectively. Brothers Kaleb Wesson (74 percent) and Andre Wesson (75 percent) join freshman Jaedon LeDee (76 percent) in the frontcourt.
- Opponents are shooting 40.8 percent from the field against the Ohio State defense (467-1,145). Foes are connecting on just 32.9 percent from

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 159-28 (.850) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 14 with 146 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 174 wins over 205 games (174-31). The Buckeyes also have played the 11th-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 136 (57 wins) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

beyond the 3-point arc (141-429).

- The Buckeyes have four wins in eight tries in 2018-19 vs. teams that made the 2018 NCAA Tournament. Ohio State defeated two of those teams on the road (Cincinnati, 64-56/Creighton, 69-60), lost at No. 5 Michigan (65-49) and took down UCLA (80-66) on a neutral court. At home, the Buckeyes fell vs. Syracuse (L, 72-62), No. 8 Michigan State (86-77) and Purdue (79-67) and have a win over Bucknell (W, 73-71). Ohio State has at least two games remaining vs. teams that made the 2018 NCAA Tournament: at Purdue and at Michigan State.
- Ohio State will play 12 games against teams among the *Associated Press* Top 25 or receiving votes for Top 25 consideration. Six of those games will be played away from Value City Arena. The Buckeyes face No. 7 Michigan (away), No. 9 Michigan State (home/away), No. 15 Purdue (home/away), No. 19 Wisconsin (home), No. 20 Iowa (home/away), No. 24 Maryland (home/away) and No. 25 Cincinnati (away) among teams currently in the Top 25. Against those receiving votes, Ohio State faced Syracuse (home).

All Andre Wanted for Christmas...

Andre Wesson lost two of his front teeth and cracked another in a collision during the Bucknell game Dec. 15, 2018 at Value City Arena. Wesson went hard to the floor and had an opponent fall

on him resulting in hard contact with the court. Wesson was whisked back to the training room by Ohio State basketball athletic trainer Jeff Deits and team physician Grant Jones. Deits, a former athletic trainer for the Ohio State men's hockey team, issued Wesson a mouth piece that allowed him to return to the game. Wesson immediately received dental care following the game and will receive additional dental care to repair and replace the lost and damaged teeth. In another recent game vs. Youngstown State, Andre's younger brother, Kaleb, briefly left the game vs. the Penguins after getting an elbow to the face causing one of his teeth to puncture his upper lip. Deits and Dr. Jones again administered treatment, this time a lone stitch, allowing Kaleb to return to the game and ultimately score a game- and careerhigh 31 points.

Kaleb Wesson Earns First B1G POW Honor

Sophomore Kaleb Wesson averaged 23 points and 9.5 rebounds in wins over Youngstown State and vs. UCLA to earn his first Big Ten Conference Player of the Week honor Dec. 24, 2018. Wesson scored a career-high 31 points vs. the Penguins and then added 15 points and a career-best 12 rebounds in the win over UCLA in the CBSSports Classic in Chicago Dec. 22.

Wesson connected on 60 percent of his field goal attempts for the week (15-25) and on 71 percent from the foul line (15-21). He also added five assists. Of his 19 total rebounds, 11 were on the offensive end

The honor is the first for the Westerville South alum and the first for the Buckeyes since Keita Bates-Diop earned the recognition, his fourth of the 2017-18 season, Feb. 5, 2018 after Ohio State wins over Illinois and Indiana.

The Ohio State vs. Penn State Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with the Nittany Lions 34-27. Ohio State owns a 17-5 record in Columbus and is 13-9 in State College. The teams have played on a neutral court seven times with the Buckeyes winning four. C.J. Jackson and Andre Wesson each have faced Rutgers four times in their careers to lead the Buckeyes in appearances vs. the Nittany Lions. Jackson averages 8.0 points and 2.3 rebounds. Kaleb Wesson has faced Penn State three times and has averaged 7.3 points and 3.7 rebounds.

Scouting the Nittany Lions

Penn State enters the game vs. the Buckeyes with an 8-14 overall record and a 1-10 mark in Big Ten Conference player after a win at Northwestern Monday. Lamar Stevens averages 18.9 points a game to lead a pair of Nittany Lions in double figures offensively. Sasir Bolton (11.8 ppg.) also contribute double digits. Mike Watkins averages a team best 8.4 rebounds along with 8.5 points a game.

Ohio State vs. the Big Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 821-723 against current league members. Chris Holtmann is new to the Big Ten but no stranger to Big Ten competition. He faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes last year. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs. conference foes. He is 23-17 vs. conference opponents in eight years as a head coach.


Holtmann Elected to Taylor University HOF

Taylor University, the alma mater of Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Buckeyes, inducted the second-year Buckeye into its hall of fame October 13 in Upland, Indiana. Holtmann graduated from Taylor in 1994, following a standout two-year career on the hardwood for the Trojans. The guard collected NAIA All-America honors as a senior. Holtmann helped the Trojans to the NAIA's No.

Last Time vs. Penn State Game 32

Penn State 69, No. 13 Ohio State 68 March 2, 2018, New York

New York -- Tony Carr found Josh Reaves for a game-winning layup with 3.1 seconds to play and Penn State picked up a 69-68 victory over secondseeded Ohio State in the quarterfinals of the 2018 Big Ten Tournament. Carr had 25 points and the seventh-seeded Nittany Lions scored the final five points in beating the 13th-ranked Buckeyes for the third time last season. Lamar Stevens added 15 points and Shep Garner had 13 and a crucial steal from Big Ten Conference Player of the Year Keita Bates-Diop with 21 seconds to play. The Nittany Lions did not call time out after the steal and Carr made a pass from the foul line to a wide-open Reaves underneath. Ohio State had a chance to win after calling a timeout, but a last-second shot by C.J. Jackson was not close. Bates-Diop carried the Buckeyes in the second half, scoring 17 of his 25 points. Kam Williams and Jae'Sean Tate each added 10 points for the Buckeyes.

Jallow played in 33 games as a freshman with the Buckeyes last year. He bypassed his senior year of high school at Bloomington (Ind.) North by graduating early to begin his collegiate career in 2017-18 at Ohio State.

Holtmann Earns Third Coach of the Year Award-In **Third Conference**

Chris Holtmann led Ohio State to a 25-9 overall record in his first season in Columbus in 2017-18. The Buckeyes finished second in the Big Ten regular-season race with a 15-3 record. His efforts led to the league coaches and media naming him the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year. Holtmann was the Big East Coach of the Year in 2017 at Butler and the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year while at Gardner-Webb.

- · Creighton hosted the Buckeyes Nov. 15 in Omaha, Nebraska. The game was part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents. Ohio State won the game 69-60.
- Two Big Ten Conference games were played in early December this year in what will become the norm going forward with the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate. Ohio State hosted Minnesota Dec. 2 (W, 79-59) and then traveled to Chicago for a neutral-site game vs. Illinois Dec. 5 (W, 77-67) at the United Center. Ohio State has started the league season 2-0 in each of Chris

Holtmann's campaigns in Columbus.

- The annual Big Ten Tournament returns to the Midwest this year after playing in Washington D.C. in 2017 and New York in 2018. The United Center in Chicago welcomes the Big Ten March 13-17 this year. Indianapolis will host in 2020, Chicago in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2018-19 plus the exhibition contest vs. UNC Pembroke
- The Buckeyes returned to historic St. John Arena for a game vs. Cleveland State Nov. 23 (W, 89-62). Ohio State is 432-151 all-time in the venue. Ohio State last played a full season at St. John in 1997-98 but have played five times there since Value City Arena opened for the 1998-99 season. The Buckeyes had last played at St. John during the 2010-11 season, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina Dec. 12, 2010.
- Seven Big Ten teams (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers, Maryland, Iowa, Michigan State, Northwestern) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Minnesota, Penn State and Wisconsin) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State travels to face Indiana, Michigan and Nebraska this year.
- The Buckeyes will be making four trips to the Chicago area this season. Three trips will be made to downtown Chicago for games vs. Illinois (Dec. 5, W 77-67), vs. UCLA (Dec. 22) and for the Big Ten Tournament (March 13-17) at the United Center. The other trip will be to renovated Welsh-Ryan Arena on Northwestern's campus in Evanston March 6.
- Ohio State will play 12 regular-season games against 10 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2018. Eleven games are scheduled vs. 2018 NCAA Tournament teams (Creighton W/69-60, Cincinnati W/64-56, Bucknell W/73-71, Syracuse L/72-62, UCLA, Purdue (2), Michigan State(2), Michigan) while two contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2018 NIT squads (Penn State, Nebraska).

• The Buckeyes finished the 2018-19 non-conference schedule with a 10-1 record. The last time Ohio State won 10 or more non-conference games in the regular-season was in 2016-17 (10-3). The Big Ten played an 18-game league schedule that year allowing for 13 non-conference games. This season, with the move to a 20-game non-league slate, Ohio State played just 11 nonconference games.

107 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 106 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2018. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 106 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 28 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

CBS Sports Classic-Year 5

CBS Sports has brought together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams the last four years and will do so again over the next two. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, will again meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC in 2018 and 2019. CBS Sports again televised the doubleheader in 2018 following the first year of the event in Chicago (2014) and the 2015 Classic in Brooklyn. These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of alltime. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBSSPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015, where the Buckeyes knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The teams traveled to Las Vegas in 2016 where the Buckeyes fell to UCLA. Ohio State took on North Carolina Dec. 23, 2017 in New Orleans (L, 86-72). Ohio State defeated UCLA Dec. 22 of this year at the United Center in Chicago. The Buckeyes meet Kentucky next year in Las Vegas.

Residence in Chicago in 2018-19

The Chicago area will be the second home for the Buckeyes in 2018-19 with at least four games scheduled in the Windy City. The Buckeyes defeated Illinois in a neutral-site Big Ten Conference game Dec. 5 at the United Center (77-67). The Buckeyes returned to face UCLA Dec. 22 in the CBSSports Classic (W, 80-66) and then head to renovated Welsh-Ryan to take on Northwestern in Evanston, a Chicago suburb, March 6. The annual Big Ten Tournament returns to Chicago and the United Center March 13-17. The league's media day also was held in Chicago in early October.

The league champion was been determined following an 18-game schedule from 2008 through last season (2018).

Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including the last three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach of the year honors in both the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career (153-101).

Buckeyes In Midst of Best Decade in History

With 247 wins in the last nine seasons (2010-19), Ohio State already has more victories this decade than in any other in the program's history. Ohio State won 189 games from 1980-1989 and 188 contests from 1960-69. The winning percentage of .727 (249-93/342) in the last 10 years is the best previous winning percentage in a decade in Ohio State history. The win total is No. 12 nationally over the last 10 seasons and second only to Michigan State's 256 wins among Big Ten teams.

Holtmann vs. the Ranked

In eight seasons as a head coach, three at Gardner Webb (2011-13), three at Butler (2015-17) and now in year two at Ohio State, Chris Holtmann is 15-22 overall against opponents ranked among the Associated Press Top 25. He was 0-2 at GW and 13-13 at Butler. His teams were 6-9 vs. Top 10 foes at Butler and 3-4 vs. Top 5 opponents. He is 2-7 at Ohio State.

Ohio State's last nonconference game vs. a Top 5 opponent was in New Orleans vs. No. 5 North Carolina in the CBSSports Classic (L, 86-72, 12/23/17). Ohio State's last win vs. a non-conference Top 5 opponent was 74-67 in the CBS event over No. 4 Kentucky in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015. Throwback Game at St. John Arena

Ohio State played Cleveland State as part of the 2018 Buckeye Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 23.

played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.

- The Buckeyes had last played at SJA in 2010, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina (12/12/2010).
- The facility is named after former Ohio State director of athletics and men's basketball coach L.W.
- The first game played at SJA was against Butler (12/1/1956), a 98-82 win for the Buckeyes.
- Capacity is 13,276. The CSU game was a sellout.
- · Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams.
- SJA also is filled to capacity prior to each home football game during "Skull Session" where the Ohio State Marching Band practices and briefly welcomes the football Buckeyes on their way to Ohio Stadium.
- · Between 1960 and 1964, the Buckeyes won 50-consecutive games on their home floor.

On the Road in Ohio-Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State is 7-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after a hard-fought 64-56 win. Three of the last five meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament, Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66). The last time Ohio State had opened a season on the road was during the 2016-17 season when the Buckeyes traveled to Annapolis, Maryland, to face Navy in the Veterans Classic. Ohio State won that game 78-68 Nov. 11, 2016. Ohio State and Cincinnati will open the 2019-20 season in Columbus to complete the home-and-home agreement.

Noting Ohio State vs. Ohio teams

- Ohio State improved its record to 235-79 versus teams from Ohio with the 75-56 win over Youngstown State Dec. 18.
- Chris Holtmann has a 9-5 career record versus teams from Ohio.
- Ohio State is 27-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season. The loss was to Dayton in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. The Buckeyes fell 60-59 (3/20/2014) to the No. 22 Flyers.
- Ohio State is 177-30 in Columbus vs. Ohio teams, 50-41 in road games and 8-8 at neutral sites all-time.
- · The Buckeyes played three teams from the state of Ohio this year. In addition to the road game at Cincinnati, Ohio State hosted Cleveland State Nov. 23 and Youngstown State Dec. 18 in Columbus.

Buckeyes Sign Top 10 Class for 2019-20

Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the signing of Alonzo Gaffney, E.J. Liddell and D.J. Carton to National Letters of Intent to play for the Buckeyes starting with the 2019-20 season.

Alonzo Gaffney is a 6-foot-9-inch, 190-pound forward from Cleveland, Ohio. He is currently playing his senior season of high school at the Brewster Academy (Wolfeboro, New Hampshire) after playing previously at Garfield Heights near Cleveland, Ohio.

In his junior year at Garfield Heights, Gaffney averaged 18.2 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.0 blocks. He was a 2018 First Team All-Ohio selection and is rated the No. 29 player nationally

As a sophomore, he helped his team win the 2017 Division III Ohio State Championship while at Villa Angela-St. Joseph High School.

Gaffney is the No. 1 rated Ohio player according to ESPN and was named by Naismith as the one of the Top 50 high school players to watch this season.

E.J. Liddell is a 6-foot-7-inch, 220-pound forward from Belleville, Illinois. He plays for Belleville West High School, the 2018 Illinois State Champions, the first in school history.

After averaging 20.8 points and 8.2 rebounds as a junior, he was named Illinois Mr. Basketball. He was just the second junior in Illinois history to earn Mr. Basketball honors (Jabari Parker).

Liddell is the No. 1 rated player from Illinois, the No. 44 overall player and No. 10 power forward nationally, according to ESPN.

D.J. Carton is a 6-foot-1-inch, 190-pound guard from Bettendorf, Iowa. He plays for Bettendorf High School.

A first team all-state and all-conference honoree as a junior, he averaged a school-record 26.3 points per game a season ago to go along with 5.7 rebounds and 3.3 assists.

A Gatorade Player of the Year finalist last season, he is the No. 2-rated point guard nationally. ESPN ranks him the No. 24 player in the country and the No. 1 player in Iowa.

All three recruits are among the Naismith Top 50 high school players to watch list, tied for the most nationally. The trio were invited to The National Basketball Players Association Top 100 Camp last summer.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaing with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-America status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.



Game 1 Ohio State 64, Cincinnati 56 Nov. 7, 2018, Cincinnati

CINCINNATI -- The Ohio State men's basketball team withstood a late run to take a 64-56 win over Cincinnati in its 2018-19 season opener at Fifth Third Arena. Kaleb Wesson led four Buckeyes in double figures with 15 points while C.J. Jackson added 13, Luther Muhammad scored 11 and Kyle Young chipped in with 10 points and a game-high eight boards. Cincinnati's Jarron Cumberland scored all 22 points after the break to lead all scorers. The Buckeyes shut down the Bearcats offensively in the first 20 minutes, limiting Cincinnati to 4-of-29 shooting and 2-of-12 from 3-point range. After Cincinnati scored the opening points on a Justin Jenifer 3-pointer at the 18:59 mark, the Bearcats were able to keep the Buckeyes off the board until a Wesson layup with 16:14 remaining. Ohio State then took the lead on a Keyshawn Woods jumper at the 14:50 mark and were able to push the advantage to 12-6 on a Musa Jallow layup at the 11:02 mark. The Buckeyes held Cincinnati without a field goal for the final 6:38 of the half on their way to a 27-8 lead at the break.

- . The last time Ohio State played at Cincinnati was in 1920. The Buckeyes are now 2-0 when playing at Cincinnati.
- Ohio State improves to 7-4 against the Bearcats all-time.
- The Buckeyes finished with a field goal percentage of 43 percent against Cincinnati, who recorded a 27 percent field goal percentage.
- Ohio State outshot Cincinnati from 3-point range, finishing eight of 20 shots while the Bearcats went 6 for 26.
- Ohio State held the Bearcats to 18 first-half points, the fewest points scored in a half against the Buckeyes since the second half against Minnesota (18) Jan. 20 of last season.
- The Buckeyes held the Bearcats to 27 percent shooting for the game (17-62). The last team that failed to reach a 30-percent shooting percentage was Rutgers (17-59/.288) Jan. 14 of last year.
- Ohio State improves to 56-59 in the first true road game of the season.
- Chris Holtmann is now 2-0 in in the season-opening game as head coach of the Ohio State basketball team.
- Holtmann's record at Ohio State improves to 26-9. He recorded his 140th win of his career as a head coach in the win over Cincinnati
- Holtmann improves to 3-0 against Cincinnati in his career as a head coach
- Kaleb Wesson led the scoring effort for the Buckeyes with 15 points in the contest
- Wesson finished with seven rebounds and went 4 for 6 from the free throw line
- Kyle Young recorded a career-high 10 points for the Buckeyes.
- Young went 6 for 7 from the free-throw line, setting career highs in both makes and attempts.
- Freshmen Luther Muhammad and Duane Washington Jr. along with graduate transfer Keyshawn Woods all made their Ohio State debuts.

Game 2 Ohio State 107, Purdue Fort Wayne 61 Nov. 11, 2018, Columbus


COLUMBUS -- The Ohio State men's basketball team earned a 107-61 win over Purdue Fort Wayne in the Buckeyes' home opener Sunday at Value City Arena. Ohio State's C.J. Jackson led all scorers with a career-high 25 points while Duane Washington Jr. added 20 points off the bench. Jaedon LeDee saw his first collegiate action, recording 16 points, four boards and a game-best four flocks off the bench while Luther Muhammad score 12 points in his second-career contest. John Konchar and Kason Harrell led Purdue Fort Wayne with 13 points apiece. Ohio State shot 57.1 percent from the field in the first half on its way to a 41-34 lead at the break. After a Cameron Benford layup cut the Ohio State lead to 20-18 almost midway through the first half. Ohio State went on a 7-0 run capped by a Jackson layup to push its advantage to 27-18 with 7:27 left to play. Purdue Fort Wayne was able to make it a two-point game with just under three minutes to play in the half but consecutive 3-pointers by Washington Jr. extended the Buckeyes' cushion heading into the half. Jackson paced the Buckeyes with 12 points, five rebounds and four assists in the first 20 minutes while Konchar led the Mastodons with nine points and seven boards. The Mastodons cut the lead to 41-36 on a Matt Holba jumper less than a minute into the second half but it was all Buckeyes from there. An 11-2 Ohio State run over the next 2:26 was spurred on by three-straight Jackson 3-pointers to push the lead to 52-38. The Buckeyes then put it out of reach with a 14-1 run later in the half, capped by a pair of Muhammad free throws, to make it 66-41 with 11:24 remaining and Ohio State never looked back on the way to the home-opening win.


- The contest marked the first time that Ohio State and Purdue Fort Wayne have met.
- The Buckeyes improve to 7-1 in games against opponents in the Summit League.
- Ohio State scored 107 points in the contest. The last time that the Buckeyes recorded more than 100 points in a game was when the team scored 111 points against Marshall (11/25/16). This is the Buckeyes' 76th 100-point game in program history. Ohio State is 75-1 in games that the team scores 100 or more points.

With the win, the Buckeyes improve to 3-0 on the year while the Bluejays suffer their first loss and fall to 2-1. Keyshawn Woods led all scorers with 19 points, his most in a Buckeye uniform, to go along with four assists while Duane Washington Jr. added 12 points. Ty-Shon Alexander paced the Bluejays with 16 points to go along with six rebounds while Davion Mintz scored 12. Creighton jumped out to a 10-2 lead at the 14:36 mark after a 3-pointer by Alexander but Woods caught fire from the field and the Buckeyes forced 11 Bluejay turnovers as Ohio State held a 37-25 lead at the half. After Creighton's early lead, Ohio State went on a 17-4 run over the next 7:05 to take a 19-14 advantage. The Bluejays then made it a 23-21 ballgame after a pair of Jacob Epperson free throws with 4:43 remaining before the break but it was all Ohio State from there as the Buckeyes concluded the half on a 14-4 spurt to go into the half up 12. Woods scored 15 points in the first half while Washington Jr. added eight and Kaleb Wesson poured in seven. Alexander led the Bluejays with eight in the opening half. -- The Ohio State men's basketball team topped Nebraska, 70-60, at Pinnacle Bank Arena. With the win, the Buckeyes improve to 13-6, 3-5 in the Big Ten, while the Huskers fall to 13-7, 3-6 in conference play. Luther Muhammad led all scorers with a career-best 24 points to go along with six rebounds and three steals while Andre Wesson and C.J. Jackson each added 10. James Palmer Jr. poured in 19 while Glynn Watson Jr. scored 18 for the Huskers. Nebraska used a pair of early Ohio State turnovers to open up an 8-2 lead after a Watson Jr. layup at the 18:04 mark but the Buckeyes scored the next seven to take a 9-8 advantage with 16:07 to play in the opening half. The Huskers then went on an 11-3 spurt over the next 6:17 to regain the lead at 19-12 with 9:50 remaining but Ohio State outscored Nebraska 17-5 the rest of the way to take a 29-24 edge heading into the half. The Buckeyes dominated the boards over the first 20 minutes, holding a 25-12 rebounding edge, while limiting the Huskers to 34.5 percent (10-for-29) from the field. Keyshawn Woods and Wesson led Ohio State with seven points apiece at the half while Palmer Jr. paced Nebraska with eight. The Huskers scored the first five points of the second half to knot the score at 29-all and the teams continued to go back and forth until a pair of Palmer Jr. free throws gave Nebraska a 38-36 lead with 15:35 remaining. However, the Buckeyes used four 3-pointers and limited the Huskers to one field goal over the next 7:39 to go on a 20-5 run and take a 56-43 lead. Nebraska scored the next six on the shoulders of Watson. Jr. but a huge 3-pointer from Muhammad at the end of the shot clock pushed the lead back up to 10 at 59-49 with 4:44 left to play. A 3-pointer by Thomas Allen trimmed the Ohio State lead to 62-56 with 1:02 remaining but Muhammad connected on all six of his attempts from the line down the stretch to ice it. For the game, the Buckeyes held a 45-31 advantage on the boards, including 14-7 on the offensive end, and a 14-2 lead in second-chance points.


