- » 16-seed Penn State (24-9) advanced to the Regional semifinal following victories over LIU Brooklyn, 3-0 (25-8, 25-16, 25-6) and Pitt, 3-1 (20-25, 25-16, 25-13, 25-18), in the opening weekend of the NCAA tournament. The Nittany Lions are now slated to face the top-seeded Nebraska Cornhuskers (29-2) on Friday, Dec. 9 at 12 p.m. ET. The match is set for broadcast on ESPNU, with Paul Sunderland and Karch Kirlay on the call.
- » With a win over the Cornhuskers, Penn State would advance to the Regional Final, facing the winner of eight-seed Washington (28-4) and Arizona (20-14).
- » With the selection as a host seed, Penn State has now served as a first and second round site in each of the past 27 seasons. With the selection to the NCAA tournament Penn State, along with Stanford, is one of just two programs to make appearances in all 36 NCAA tournaments.
- » The AVCA announced its All-Region award winners on Tuesday. Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington earned spots on the All-Region Team, while Frantti was named an honorable mention.
- » Penn State saw four members of the team land postseason Big Ten honors, with juniors Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington both earning unanimous All-Big Ten honors, while freshmen Tori Gorrell and Kendall White made the All-Freshmen Team.
- » Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti eclipsed the 900 career kill benchmark with nine kills in the most recent outing against the Ohio State Buckeyes. She is now just 32 kills short of becoming the 26th member of Penn State's 1,000 kill club. Frantti enters Friday's match after posting 16 kills last
- » Following a 14 kills performance against Pitt, Simone Lee earned the third spot on the Penn State single season kills leaderboard during the 25-point rally scoring era.
- » Juniors Haleigh Washington and Simone Lee both rank among the nation's best in statistical categories at the end of the regular season. Washington ranked second in the country in hitting percentage (.435), while Lee's 4.17 kills per set ranked 37th in NCAA Division I. Both Washington and Lee's numbers lead the Big Ten conference.
- » Three Penn State players in Lee, Washington and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell all have chances to place among the top-five during the 25-point rally scoring era in single-season statistical categories. Lee (average kills/set) and Washington (hitting percentage) would rank third and tied for fifth, respectively, in their categories if the season ended today. Gorrell (total block solos, 22) is poised to crack the top five as well.
- » PSU finds itself among the top 35 in the country in a pair statistical categories as a team at the end of the regular season. The Nittany Lions have hit the ball at a .290 clip entering the tournament, coming in first in the Big Ten and third nationally. Penn State averages 2.53 blocks per set, coming in fourth in the Big Ten and 35th among Division I programs.
- » Penn State enters the weekend with a 10-18 record all-time against the Cornhuskers. Nebraska


has been the winner of the past three, with Penn State pushing the team to five sets in Rec Hall earlier this season before being swept by Nebraska in the Bob Devaney Sports Center last time the two sides faced one another.

» If Penn State wins Friday afternoon, the team will face the winner of No. 8 Washington and Arizona. Penn State is 2-2 all-time against the Huskies and hold a 2-1 edge in matches against the Wildcats. » A win would also give Penn State a 16-5 record in Regional semifinal matches all-time.

NEWS & NOTES

TOURNAMENT ROUNDUP: PENN STATE PASSES LIU BROOKLYN, PITT

Penn State advanced to the Regional round of the NCAA tournament after taking down LIU Brooklvn (3-0) and Pitt (3-1) in the opening weekend of postseason play. Junior Simone Lee led the way for the offense with 26 total kills, while classmates Ali Frantti and Haleigh Washington added 16 kills each. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell added 13 kills on a team-best .550 hitting among the team's regular attackers. Washington led the team with nine blocks while Gorrell added eight.

Through the first weekend of postseason play, PSU ranked second among the 64 teams included in both opponent hitting efficiency (.068) and total blocks (23.5). Junior setter Abby Detering led Penn State to a .351 hitting percentage, good for seventh among the tournament teams. With five aces in two matches played, Detering ranked second among all players in the tournament.

HOW SWEET IT IS

Penn State makes its 21st appearance in the round of 16 against top-seed Nebraska on Friday afternoon, with a 15-5 record in the Regional semifinals all-time. Penn State has been 4-1 in the last five sweet 16 appearances, with the lone loss coming last season in a 3-0 sweep by Hawaii last season.

FIRST ROUND FACTS

PSU hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA tournament for the 30th time since 1981, welcoming three teams to Rec Hall for the 27th consecutive year. Penn State improved to 31-5 all-time record in opening matches of the tourney following its sweep of LIU Brooklyn. The Nittany Lions have not surrendered a single set to a first round opponent since 1989, having posted sweeps in its last 27 consecutive first-round victories

STATE IN THE SECOND ROUND

Penn State improved to 22-5 all-time in round two last year of the NCAA tournament after a 3-1 win against Pitt last time out. The win against the Panthers also marked PSU's 13th consecutive second-round victory since 2002, when Temple knocked PSU out of the tourney.

LEE, WASHINGTON, FRANTTI GARNER AVCA ALL-REGION RECOGNITION

A trio Penn State women's volleyball juniors were named to the AVCA Northeast Region team on Tuesday morning, as announced by the organization's office. Outside hitter Simone Lee and middle blocker Haleigh Washington were both named to the regional team, while classmate Ali Frantti was named an honorable mention.

Lee paced Penn State's offense throughout the season, averaging 4.15 kills per set, good for best in the Big Ten. The junior had a standout season on offense, posting 481 total kills, ranking third in single season kills during the 25-point rally scoring era. She also added 182 digs, 60 blocks and 17 service aces over the season. Lee was also named the ESPNW National Player of the Week on Oct. 12 following a 30-kill performance against then No. 1 Minnesota. The honor marks Lee's first AVCA recognition.

Washington continues to be one of the most consistent hitters in the college game, leading Penn State and the Big Ten while ranking second in the nation in hitting percentage with a startling .435 clip. The percentage is also the best among all players from Power Five institutions. Washington has led the team in blocks, posting 133 total while adding 281 total kills, good for second on the team. The Colorado Springs, Colorado native added 71 digs on the season and 24 service aces, good for second best on the team. The selection marks Washington's third AVCA end-of-year distinction - she was named to last year's All-Region list before also being named a first-team All-American.

After a slower start than she had anticipated, Frantti turned around the season in the second half as she launched up the offensive ranks to finish third on the team in kills with 274 this season. Frantti finds herself just 32 kills shy of the 1,000 kill club now, with 968 to date. The junior outside has also added 204 digs, 56 blocks and 16 service aces this season. Frantti is no stranger to earning AVCA awards - the Spring Grove, Illinois, native was named the AVCA's National Freshman of the Year in 2014 along with second team All-America distinctions and a spot on the All-Region team that year. Frantti also earned All-Region honors in 2015 before going on to earn an honorable mention for All-America status.

FOUR NITTANY LIONS GARNER POSTSEASON B1G HONORS

Penn State saw four members of the team land postseason Big Ten honors, with juniors Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington both earning unanimous All-Big Ten honors, while freshmen Tori Gorrell and Kendall White made the All-Freshmen Team.

The honor markeds Lee's first time being names to the All-Big Ten Team. Washington's selection marks her fourth annual Big Ten honor – she was a unanimous All-Big Ten selection in 2015 and named B1G Freshman of the Year as well as a member of the All-Big Ten Team in 2014.

Gorrell, a redshirt freshman middle blocker, earned a spot on the All-Freshman team after posting 185 kills and a team second-best 110 total blocks. With 21 solo rejections, Gorrell leads the team and is just three short of ranking tied for fifth in the 25-point rally scoring era for Penn State. Gorrell's 110 blocks were also good for second best among freshmen in the Big Ten.

White started all of the 2016 season at libero for the Nittany Lions, leading the team's back row defense with 438 total digs. Averaging 4.18 digs per set in conference play, White finished third in the conference behind Illinois' Brandi Donnelly and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year Justine Wong-Orantes. White added 69 assists and 11 aces during the regular season of her rookie campaign.

Junior setter Abby Detering earned her second career Big Ten Setter of the Week distinction on Tuesday, Nov. 29, after guiding PSU to a pair of wins over Northwestern and Illinois.

Detering helped guide Penn State to a collective .348 hitting percentage in wins over Northwestern and Illinois. The Mentor, Ohio native averaged 13.00 assists per set, dishing out 91 helpers over the course of the seven sets played. She added 14 digs and a team-best six aces over the weekend. In Penn State's win over Illinois, Detering helped lead Penn State to 65 team kills - the most in a fourset match in 2016. She also tied her career-high for aces with four against Northwestern.

MR. 1,200

With a 3-0 win over Michigan State on Sept. 30, Russ Rose became the first active Division I volleyball coach to reach the 1,200-win mark. Rose holds the title of winningest coach in Division I, tallying a 1,213-195 record to date. Rose is joined by only Hawaii's Dave Shoji in active coaches with 1,200 or more wins.

LEE ETCHES MARK IN SINGLE SEASON RECORDS

With her seventh kill against Northwestern on Nov. 25, junior Simone Lee etched her name in the Penn State record books, cracking the top-five for single season kills in the 25-point rally scoring era. Lee has since climbed to 481 total kills on the season. With 14 kills against Pitt, Lee sprang into third place on the single season leaderboard. She now sits 40 short of tying for second place.

Having impressive seasons thus far, junior classmates Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington are both on-track for seasons that rank among the best during the 25-point rally scoring era. Lee, averaging 4.15 kills per set currently, would rank third during the era for single-season kills per set. Washington, currently hitting at a .435 clip, would finish fifth in single-season hitting efficiency if the season ended today.

Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell has a team-best 22 solo stuffs so far in 2016. With just two more she could match Haleigh Washington's output from 2015 with 24 to tie for the fifth-most in the 25-point rally scoring era.

FRANTTI CLOSING IN ON 1,000 KILL CLUB

After logging 11 kills in the second round of the NCAA tournament against Pitt, junior Ali Frantti finds herself 32 kills away from being the 26th Nittany Lion with 1,000 career kills. Currently averaging 2.75 kills per set over her career, Frantti will likely break the milestone next season, but could do so with a few big games or a deep tournament run. Frantti would become the first Penn State volleyball player to join the 1,000 kill ranks since Megan Courtney did so last season, ending her career with 1,154 kills.

NITTANY LIONS AMONG THE NATION'S ELITE IN EFFICIENCY

Penn State has been extremely successful keeping its offense among the top in the country. Following the regular season, the Nittany Lions rank first in the Big Ten and fifth in Division I in hitting efficiency, attacking a .290 clip. Junior Haleigh Washington continues to be one of the most consistent offensive threats in the country in 2016, ranking among the best in the nation in hitting efficiency. Hitting at a .438 clip in all matches this season, the Colorado Springs, Colorado, product leads the Big Ten and ranks second among NCAA Division I players in hitting percentage.

The Nittany Lions not only excel at having one of the most efficient offenses in the country, but also at limiting those of the opposition. PSU ranks 48th nationally and ranks second in the Big Ten in limiting opponents hitting, holding foes to a .173 clip. The team also has contributed an impressive blocking performance thus far, finishing regular season action averaging 2.53 blocks per set, good for fourth in the conference and 35th nationally.

LEE'S OFFENSE GUIDES NITTANY LIONS

With double-figure kills in all but six matches this season, junior Simone Lee's 4.15 kills per set leads the Big Ten standings and places 37th nationally. Lee also ranks 43rd in points nationally, logging 4.61 per set. Lee posted a record-setting 30 kills against Minnesota on Oct. 5 before posting another 27 against Michigan. Lee has exceeded 20 kills in four matches this season. With 481 kills thus far, Lee has accounted for nearly 31% of the Penn State offense.

PSU MIDDLES A FORCE TO BE RECKONED WITH

The duo of Penn State starting middle blockers junior Haleigh Washington and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell has become one of the most talented tandems in the Big Ten conference. Washington ranks ninth in the Big Ten with an impressive 1.15 blocks per set, while Gorrell finished second in blocks per set among all Big Ten freshmen, averaging 1.02 per frame.

WASHINGTON NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington earned Academic All-District honors, as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Thursday afternoon. It was Washington's second time being honored as a part of the Academic All-District team, as the Colorado Springs, Colorado, native was named to the All-District team last season, before going on to earn Second Team Academic All-America honors. In the classroom, Washington is a double major in philosophy and psychology, boasting an impressive 3.83 grade point average. In total, 56 student-athletes from the Division I ranks are selected to the Academic All-District teams. All members of the All-District teams are eligible for Academic All-America consideration, which will be announced on December 8

WEISKIRCHER, DETERING SPLITTING TIME LATE IN SEASON

Junior transfer Abby Detering (Florida) and redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher split time early in the non-conference slate at the setting position. It looked as if Detering would be the solution, starting 18 consecutive matches, before the staff decided to start Bryanna Weiskircher at setter for the first set of the match at Minnesota. Detering resumed the setting role in the second set, logging 26 assist in the final two sets – Weiskircher posted 12 in her single set of action. Penn State then reverted to Weiskircher halfway through its first meeting between the Nittany Lions and Nebraska. The duo split time again last weekend, as Weiskircher started for the Maryland match before Detering took the helm for Penn State's five-set thriller against the Ohio State Buckeyes. Weiskircher started Penn State's most recent match against Nebraska before Detering finished it out. Detering has started the past five matches for PSU.

PENN STATE INVITES IOWA TO BLOCK PARTY

Penn State put together one of its most dominant blocking performances of the season on Nov. 5, when PSU notched 14 blocks in the three-set sweep of lowa. The 11-block margin was the largest of the season for the Nittany Lions, as was the 4.67 block per set team average. Additionally, despite being a three-set match, the 14 total block output was the second largest this season by Penn State.

15-STRAIGHT

After opening the season at 2-3, the Nittany Lions put together its longest win streak of the past two seasons, winning 15 straight matches spanning from Sept. 9 until Oct. 22, when Penn State dropped a tough five-setter to then-No. 16 Michigan. The 15-match win streak was the second longest in the country during the span, topped only by No. 5 San Diego (16 straight). During the win streak, Penn State dropped only three total sets, knocking off five ranked opponents during the span including then-No. 1 Minnesota. Additionally, the streak beat the team's longest win streak in 2015, in which Penn State won its first 13 matches.

THELEN SETTLES IN AT RIGHT SIDE

After limited time on the court in her first two seasons, junior Heidi Thelen has found her niche, moving to the right side this season. The move has paid dividends, with Thelen ranking fourth among starters on the team in both hitting percentage (.276) and kills (203).

WHITE LOCKED IN AT LIBERO

With the regular season in the books, freshman defensive specialist Kendall White has made a name for herself, starting each match at libero. Since, the Indianapolis, Indiana product has been exceptional, leading the team with 4.09 digs per set, good for sixth in the conference. The rookie posted her most impressive performance to date in the five-set match with Nebraska in which she posted 32 digs. It marked the first time since Nov. 27, 2010 that a player has registered 30 or more digs. Averaging 4.18 digs per set in conference play, White finished third in the conference behind Illinois' Brandi Donnelly and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year Justine Wong-Orantes.

AVCA POLL UPDATE: RELEASE 15

Penn State rose two spots to No. 13 in the country in the most recent release of the AVCA poll. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 9, with rankings spanning from No. 9 again three weeks ago and as low as No. 20. PSU has seven opponents represented within the top 25, including three among the top three. Including the Nittany Lions, a total of six Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 25. Ohio State and Purdue are also receiving votes on the ballot. For the first time in 2016, Penn State received a first-place vote after downing then-top ranked Minnesota.

LEE, DETERING EARN B1G WEEKLY HONORS

After another impressive weekend, Penn State junior Simone Lee was named the Big Ten Player of the Week, while classmate Abby Detering earned the title of Big Ten Setter of the Week, as announced by the league office Monday, 0ct. 10.

Lee paced the Nittany Lions in offensively in both its matches, logging her 14th and 15th outings in which she led the team in kills. She posted 30 kills against Minnesota and 11 kills in the match against Rutgers. The Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, native also added 12 digs and five blocks in the

Detering earned Big Ten Setter of the Week honors after a weekend in which she led the Nittany Lions to a .346 hitting clip as the team averaged 16.00 kills per set in the wins over No.1 Minnesota and Rutgers. Detering logged 101 assists while adding 15 digs, eight kills, three blocks and three aces. The Mentor, Ohio, native logged her fourth double-double of the season with 61 assists and 10 digs in the upset of Minnesota. She guided four players to log double-figure kills in the match.

LEE NAMED ESPNW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Following the record-setting performance against Minnesota and earning Big Ten Player of the Week honors, ESPNW also recognized Lee as the nation's top performer for the Week of Oct. 5-11. Lee is just the third Nittany Lion to ever win the award - Dominique Gonzalez and Micha Hancock earned the honor in 2014.

DOWN GOES NO. 1!

Penn State logged its biggest win of the 2016 season to date on Oct. 5, taking down the No. 1 Minnesota Golden Gophers in five, 3-2 (29-27, 21-25, 23-25, 25-14, 15-10). The Nittany Lions took the first set in extra time, trailing by eight, 11-3, early on.

Four players notched double-figure kills, with Simone Lee paving the way, scoring 30. In addition to Lee's outburst, Heidi Thelen and Haleigh Washington scored 14 each. Thelen led the team with five blocks while Washington added three and a service ace. Classmate Ali Frantti logged her second double-double of 2016 with 13 kills and 13 digs. With 80 kills as a team, the Nittany Lions logged the second-most kills in a match during the 25-point rally scoring era - the first was also against Minnesota, when PSU notched 81 on Nov. 27, 2010.

LEE POSTS RECORD DAY IN WIN OVER GOPHERS

Junior Simone Lee had an incredible outing on Oct. 5, leading the offense in the win over No. 1 Minnesota, charting 30 kills in the outing. It marked the first time a Nittany Lion had 30 or more kills in a match since Nicole Fawcett did so against Cal Poly on August 31, 2007. The 30-kill outing also marked a new record for kills in a five-set match during the 25-point rally scoring era.

PENN STATE INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After three sweeps of Rhode Island, Howard and Clemson, the Penn State Nittany Lions placed three members of the squad in juniors Haleigh Washington, Abby Detering and Heidi Thelen on the All-Tournament team. Washington was named the most outstanding player after a phenomenal performance, notching 27 kills on .610 hitting and adding a team-high 15 blocks in three sets. Detering guided the team to .354 hitting as a unit, notching 91 assists, 14 digs, seven kills and three aces. Thelen posted 21 kills with a team second-best .447 hitting and added four blocks.

PENN STATE CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Junior Simone Lee and freshman Kendall White were both selected to the Penn State Classic All-Tournament team following their performances in a 2-1 opening week at home. Lee led the team with 3.73 kills per set while White averaged 3.45 digs per frame. White had at least 16 digs in two matches, while Lee posted double figure kills in two of three matches, including 23 kills vs. North Carolina.

PENN STATE RANKED NINTH IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State women's volleyball earned the No. 9 ranking in the 2016 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Nittany Lions are among seven Big Ten schools to be ranked within the AVCA Top 25 and one of four conference programs to be voted within the top 10.

Nebraska earned the No. 1 overall ranking with 60 of a possible 64 first place votes. Minnesota and Wisconsin are next at three and four, respectively. Outside the top 10, Illinois was ranked 14th and Ohio State was 15th. Purdue rounded out the group at No. 20. Michigan and Michigan State also represented the league in the poll, as both received votes.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH IN BIG TEN POLL

Penn State opens the season ranked No. 4 in the Big Ten Preseason Poll, released by the conference early this week. The Big Ten Preseason poll is selected by votes from all 14 conference head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

Juniors Haleigh Washington and Ali Frantti have been named to the 2016 Preseason Big Ten Volleyball Team. The pair of Preseason All-Big Ten honors are the second straight for Washington and Frantti, who each earned the honor in 2015. Washington is also among a group of just four honorees to be voted to the team by a unanimous decision.

ROSE ENTERS YEAR 38 ATOP THE NCAA ALL-TIME WINS LIST

With an all-time record of 1213 - 195, few have come close to matching head coach Russ Rose's impressive win total. Rose and Hawaii head coach Dave Shoji went back and forth throughout the year, but Penn State's run to its seventh NCAA national championship in 2014 vaulted Rose 11 wins ahead of Shoji, placing him firmly atop the active division I career standings at the conclusion of the season with 1.161 wins.

Prior to topping the list of DI winningest active coaches by victories, his .865 career winning clip has ranked first on the percentage chart for the last several years. Now at the top of both lists, he's one of just two active NCAA DI coaches to amass more than 1,200 career wins and one of four active coaches across all three divisions to join the 1,000 victories club.

On the list of winningest coaches of all time, Rose's 1,213-195 tally is unmatched at first place. Along with Shoji and former UCLA head coach Andy Banachowski, the three are the only DI coaches in

PENN STATE IN SEASON-OPENERS

Penn State is 33-7-1 all-time in season-openers after sweeping past West Virginia at Rec Hall this season. The win against the Mountaineers marks the fourth consecutive season-opening victory.

OUICK SETS

- From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten conference in 1991, Penn State has played in 890 total matches, winning 788. Since 2008, Penn State has earned 220 of its 276 victories in three sets (80%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%). In 2015 Penn State won 22 of its 34 total matches by way of a 3-0 sweep.
- Since the 2001 season, the Nittany Lions have only lost 65 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated Penn State BYU, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Carolina, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Michigan and Michigan State) have been able to beat Penn State three times. Since 2001, Penn State has compiled a 269-65 mark against all 21 teams to have beaten PSU within the stretch.

NITTANY LIONS MONTH - BY- MONTH

- Penn State is 51-6 (.895) during the month of August under the direction of head coach Russ Rose (since 1979), following a 2-1 weekend at home in the Penn State Classic. Defeating the Mountaineers, the Nittany Lions have not dropped a season-opening match since losing to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against No. 2 USC the next evening. Penn State's first two season-opening losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 against Nebraska and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State, 3-2, in the opening round.
- With head coach Russ Rose at the helm of the program, Penn State is 380-55 (.874) during the month of September, dating back to 1979. The Lions are 222-21 (.914) during the month of September dating back to the 1995 season and 62-11 (.849) since 2010.
- PSU is 395-48 (.892) during the month of October during Rose's tenure (since 1979). Penn State has posted a 132-21 (.863) mark in October since the 2000 season, and a record of 88-11 (.888) dating back to 2006, without losing a match during the month from 2006 to the end of the 2009 season.
- Penn State is 299-51 (.854) during the month of November since 1979, including a 126-16(.887) mark since the end of 2000. The Nittany Lions posted a four-year streak from 1996-1999 where they did not lose a match in the month. Since 2010, Penn State is 49-8(.859), since the end of the 2010 season, having not dropped a match in the month for three straight years from 2012-14.

NITTANY LIONS ON TV

There's no need to worry this year if you can't follow Penn State on the road or make it to every home match. A CLOSER LOOK AT 2016

WHO'S GONE AND WHO'S BACK

Perhaps Penn State's biggest challenge this year will be replacing the offensive power generated from All-American seniors Aiyana Whitney and Megan Courtney. While the offensive gap is just one piece of the puzzle, Penn State does return a few other key pieces in different areas. The Nittany Lions finished the 2015 season ranked third nationally and first in the Big Ten in blocks per set, led by First Team AVCA All-American Haleigh Washington, who led the team with 1.38 blocks per set, which closed out the year ranked third in the conference. A unanimous All-Big Ten selection, Washington also logged 13 double-figure kill performances, finishing the year with .442 hitting efficiency that ranked third nationally and first in the league.

Other key offensive returners include AVCA All-America Honorable Mention Ali Frantti, and Simone Lee, who closed out the year starting 18 of the final 21 matches of the year. The Nittany Lions also received significant contributions from Bryanna Weiskircher, who helped set the team to a .295 hitting percentage in her first season at setter, good for fifth nationally in the final standings.

Despite the graduation of seniors Kendall Pierce and Lara Caraway, the Nittany Lions have the most depth in terms of numbers at defensive specialist. Keeton Holcomb is among a group of five returners at the position with the most experience. Holcomb played in 32 matches during her first season in the Blue and White, making 28 starts. She led the team with 3.05 digs per set, highlighting the season with a pair of 20-dig performance in the same day in wins against Mississippi State and Notre Dame.

TRANSFER TIME

Joining Weiskircher and Rivera at the setting position is Abby Detering and Caroline Graham. Both Detering and Graham transferred to Penn State having previously attended Florida and UCLA, respectively. Detering spent the last two seasons at Florida and enters 2016 as a junior on the Nittany Lion roster.

Graham transferred to Penn State after spending a year at UCLA, but did not play on the volleyball team. Graham attended Lycee Alexandre Dumas, serving as team captain from 2014-16. She played club volleyball with AS Tigresses (Tigers), helping the team to a national championship in 2015 and a second-place finish in 2014 and 2016.

Outside hitter Clare Powers rounds out the transfer group. Powers ranked third on the team in kills per set with 1.93 and finished fourth in digs per set with 2.19 in her first season at Saint Mary's before an injury cut her sophomore season short. She transfers to Penn State as a redshirt sophomore on the roster.

WHO'S NEW

Outside of the trio of transfers, Penn State's true freshman class features five newcomers including Emily DeMure, Allison Farrell, Kristin Krause, Emily Sciorra and Kendall White.

Emily DeMure » A four-year letterwinner at Granite Bay, DeMure helped the Grizzly Bears to a DI state championship during the 2013-14 season, as well as an All-League title in the same year. She also helped Granite Bay to a NorCal All-Section title in 2015, served as team captain. She was selected as team MVP at Granite Bay in 2015 and played club volleyball for Gold Cal Juniors.

Allison Farrell » A four-year letterwinner at Glenbard East, Farrell helped the Rams to a regional title during the 2014-15 season. She also earned Upstate 8 All-Conference and All-Area honors in 2015 and played club volleyball with Sports Performance.

Kristin Krause » Krause joins older sister Taylor on the Nittany Lion roster. A four-year letterwinner at Parkland High, Krause set the Trojans to back-to-back East Penn conference, district and Pennsylvania state championships in 2014-15. Selected as Pennsylvania's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16, she played club volleyball with East Coast Power, where she was coached by her father, Mike Krause.

Emily Sciorra » Sciorra was a four-year letterwinner at Chantilly, where she helped the Chargers to a Conference 6A championship in 2013 as the team's libero. Sciorra played club volleyball with Metro Volleyball Club of Washington D.C., helping her team to gold in the Sports Performance National Junior Classic Open.

Kendall White "White was four-year letterwinner at Cathedral, White helped the Irish become the first Indiana 4A team to post an undefeated record (36-0) in 2015 on the way to an Indiana Class 4A state title as the team's libero. Among numerous honors, she was named Indiana's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16 and selected as the Indy Star Player of the Year and Cathedral's High School Female Athlete of the Year.



RUSS ROSE AT A GLANCE ...

It's been nearly four decades since Russ Rose arrived on campus. Entering his 38th season, the AVCA Hall of Fame head coaches' record-setting seven NCAA national titles and 16 Big Ten championships speak directly to the confidence and character he's passed along throughout his career.

As each year passes, his list of accomplishments continue to swell, but a quick snapshot of his legendary tenure might read something like this: The leader of a women's volleyball powerhouse who's kept his program among the nation's elite for nearly 40 years, guiding his teams to a record-setting seven NCAA national titles, including an unprecedented four consecutive championships from 2007-10. Along with 16 Big Ten titles, his program is one of only two women's volleyball schools to compete in all 36 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball National Championship events. He's produced four AVCA National Players of the Year, 13 Big Ten conference Players of the Year and at least one AVCA All-American in 35 of 36 seasons. His student-athletes excel in the classroom as well, with an outstanding 156 Academic All-Big Ten selections and five Academic All-Americans.

Penn State holds the four of the top five winning streaks in Big Ten history. Penn State's most recent record-setting streak of 65 consecutive matches began on Nov. 11, 2006 and ended on Sept. 24, 2010 at Illinois. It is the longest streak in league history. Penn State's other two conference winning streaks were 49 matches and 41. Penn State's 33-match winning streak, dating back to Oct. 17, 2014 was snapped during the 2015 season in a 3-2 loss to then-fourth-ranked Nebraska.

NITTANY LION ALUMS EARN BRONZE WITH TEAM USA

Penn State women's volleyball All-American alums Alisha Glass and Christa (Harmotto) Dietzen earned a Bronze medal with the United States Women's National Team at the Olympic Games in Rio.

Having played key roles for Team USA throughout the event, Glass and Dietzen helped the United States to a 3-1 (25-23, 25-27, 25-22, 25-19) win against the Netherlands to clinch The Americans' second Bronze medal since the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. Team USA went 6-0 through Pool play before a close 3-2 loss to Serbia in the semifinals moved the United States to 6-1 heading into the Bronze medal match

Penn State women's volleyball now has four Olympic medalists in Nittany Lion program history as Glass earns her first and Dietzen picks up her second consecutive. Having previously earned Silver with the U.S. at the 2012 Games in London, Dietzen is Penn State's first women's volleyball alum to win two Olympic medals as a member of the 12-woman roster.

From Hopewell Township, Pa., Dietzen was a two-time first-team All-American and the 2008 CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year in women's volleyball. From Leland, Mich., Glass also was a two-time first-team All-American for the Nittany Lions. Glass was a member of the initial three national title squads and Dietzen was a member of the first two squads, playing for Hall of Fame Coach Russ Rose.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Juniors Haleigh Washington and Simone Lee powered the offense with 10 kills apiece, with Washington leading the team with a .714 hitting efficiency (10-0-14).

Penn State shot out to an 8-2 lead in the first set to take control of an early advantage. The Mountaineers looked to cut off the run with a kill, 8-3, but the Nittany Lions regrouped with a 4-2 stretch to make it 12-5. West Virginia looked once again for an opportunity following a kill, 19-10. The Nittany Lions did not let the Mountaineers get any closer though, using a 6-3 run capped off by two kills from Washington to close out a 25-13 win in the second set.

Trailing by one in the third set, 4-3, a kill from Frantti and two more from Washington opened up a 7-1 stretch that sent Penn State ahead by as many as five, 10-5. The Mountaineers came battling back with a 4-1 run to narrow the gap to two, 11-9. Penn State regrouped and followed with a 6-2 streak, capped off by a solo stuff from Gorrell to make it 17-11, forcing WVU to call its second timeout.

The Nittany Lions came out of the break with two more kills from Lee and another from Gorrell to widen the advantage to as many as eight, 11-3. North Carolina answered back with a 4-2 stretch to trim the gap to six, 13-7. Penn State earned an opportunity off a UNC service error, 13-6, but could not find momentum as the Tarheels continued to match the Nittany Lions point-for-point to remain with six, 17-11.

Penn State rebounded with a 4-1 stretch to make it 20-11, but the two teams continued to trade points until Penn State reached set point, 24-15 off a kill from Frantti. North Carolina held off one attempt before another Frantti kill secured a 25-16 win in the first set. The Nittany Lions and the Tarheels battled back and forth throughout the first half of the second set, tying the score four times.

Trailing by two, 17-15, Penn State called a timeout to regroup. The Tarheels came out of the break with a service error before a block from Thelen and Gorrell tied the score, 17-17. Two more North Carolina attack errors quickly put Penn State back in front by two, 19-17, causing UNC to call a timeout. North Carolina came storming back with three unanswered points, but Penn State followed with a kill and an ace from Lee to pull ahead, 21-20, forcing another UNC timeout. The Nittany Lions looked to continue momentum out of the break following a Tarheel attack error, but Penn State failed to sustain the momentum as UNC rattled off the next five consecutive points to take set two, 25-22, evening the match at 1-1.

Trailing by four in the third set, 5-1, kills from Washington and Lee sparked a 5-2 run that pushed the Nittany Lions within one, 7-6. Penn State continued to fight point-for-point, using a 2-1spurt to tie the score, 8-8. Penn State and North Carolina continued to trade points tying the frame three more times, 11-11, until a kill from Washington and an ace from Rivera lifted PSU ahead, 13-11. From there, the Nittany Lions managed to maintain at least a two point edge, until a pair of late Tarheel kills brought UNC within two for the final time at 23-21. Penn State responded with a kill from Lee before a North Carolina ball handling error gave the Nittany Lions a 25-21 win in the third set to put PSU on top, 2-1.

The Tarheels jumped out to another 5-1 lead in the fourth set. A UNC service error opened a 4-1 streak that lifted Penn State ahead by one, 6-5. Unable to maintain the advantage, PSU and UNC traded points to tie the score, 8-8. UNC looked to pull away with a kill and a block, 10-8, but PSU followed with a 5-2 streak to maintain a one-point lead, 13-12. North Carolina followed with a kill to tie the score, 13-13, but Penn State put together a 7-3 run to expand the advantage to four, 20-16.

North Carolina looked to cut off the run with a kill, 20-17, but Penn State used another 3-1 strike capped off by kills from Thelen and Frantti to make it 23-18. Unable to sustain the momentum, things quickly turned for the Nittany Lions as the Tarheels charged back with seven unanswered points to force a fifth and deciding set.

Down by two, 4-2 early in the fifth frame, a UNC attack error and a kill from Lee tied the score at 4-4. UNC responded with a 7-3 scoring streak to pull ahead, 11-7, forcing Penn State to call a timeout. The Nittany Lions came out of the break with back-to-back blocks to arrive within two, 11-9. Penn State once again could not continue to its offensive rhythm, as North Carolina used a 4-0 run to secure a 15-9 win in the final set to end the match.

BOULDER, Colo. - Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell turned in a career-high 14 kills and five blocks, but it was not enough as No. 13 Penn State dropped a five-set (25-22,20-25,19-25,25-20, 3-15) decision at Colorado Saturday evening in the first match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge at the Coors Events Center.

After forcing a decisive fifth set with a come from behind 25-20 victory in the fourth Penn State had the momentum. However, it was Colorado who came out fired up and rattled off six consecutive points for the early 6-0 margin. Lee stopped the run as she split the block with a kill, but the Buffaloes came right back with a kill and a service ace for the 8-1 lead. Lee added another kill, but Penn State could not silence the Colorado attack as they cruised to the 15-3 set victory and the 3-2 match win.

A back-and-forth opening set saw the teams trade momentum as early on Lee connected on an ace to tie things at 3-3 and a few points later Washington skied for a solo block during a 4-point Lion spurt for the 8-7 edge. Midway through the set Gorrell sparked the Nittany Lions with a huge kill to tie the score at 13-13. Gorrell had four kills in the opening set to pace the team while hitting at an 80 percent clip.

The teams continued to trade points with neither holding more than a two-point advantage at any time until PSU used a 4-0 spurt to close the set after an attacking error off a serve from freshman Kendall White for the 25-22 set victory. PSU hit .414 in the opening set. The Buffaloes came out in the second set fired up jumping to an early 3-0 lead before Penn State came right back with three straight points of their own with kills by Lee, Gorrell and Washington, in that order. However, a pair of attacking errors by the visitors and some big kills for Colorado pushed the host lead to 10-4, the biggest of the game for either team.

The Lions came clawing back, however, following a timeout and were able to rattle off seven of the next nine points to cut the deficit to 12-11 after the soft touch of junior Heidi Thelen resulted in a kill and prompted a Buffalo timeout. Colorado fought back again out of the break with a pair of quick points and wouldn't let Penn State get close enough to grab the momentum as a pair of late service errors and a closing block by Joslyn Hayes gave the Buffaloes the 25-20 second set win.

Behind Frantti and Washington the Nittany Lions came out of the ten-minute break and started the third set on fire jumping out to a 5-2 lead after a huge solo-block by Washington and a big swing by Frantti. The Buffaloes regrouped and came surging back scoring 13 of the next 20 points to grab the 15-12 lead at the media timeout. CU continued to roll scoring two more quick ones out of the break on a pair of attack errors to grab their largest lead of the set 17-12. Junior Lainy Pierce sparked a comeback off the bench as she served up a pair of points while Lee and Gorrell both hit the double-digit kill mark as PSU scored six-of-eight points prompting a timeout trailing just 19-18. However, Colorado used the energy of the crowd and rattled off six of the final seven points for the 25-19 set victory.

Lee opened the fourth set with a big swing, but Colorado came back with five unanswered points for the 5-1 lead taking advantage of three attacking errors by Penn State. The Lions fought back taking advantage of Colorado errors and used back-to-back kills by Frantti for the 9-8 edge. A kill by Washington followed by a block-assist by Frantti and Washington pushed the lead to 11-8, their largest lead since the opening set victory. The Nittany Lions continued to grow that lead grabbing their largest margin of the contest, 20-14, after back-to-back kills by Washington and Frantti. PSU continued to roll in the fourth set as Washington soared for back-to-back blocks for the 22-15 edge late in the frame. Despite a late run by Colorado with three straight points it was Gorrell with the final kill in the fourth set to set up the decisive fifth.

Penn State led in kills, 60-55, but had 33 attacking errors including 12 service errors and Colorado held the .220 to .154 advantage in hitting percentage for the contest.

BOULDER, Colo. - No. 13 Penn State women's volleyball (2-3) fell short in three sets (24-26, 18-25-22-25) to No. 9 Stanford (2-1) Sunday evening in the final match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge at the Coors Events Center.

Junior Simone Lee paced the Nittany Lions with 12 kills while junior Haleigh Washington added nine. Freshman Kendall White led the way with a career-high 22 digs for her first career 20-dig performance. Junior Abby Detering

Momentum began to shift in the opening set about midway through as a back-and-forth pace turned in favor of the Nittany Lions with Detering coming up with a big swing and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell a big block for an 11-11 tie. After Stanford rebounded for a pair of consecutive points it was the Lee sparking a four-point rally which included another Gorrell block and a 15-13 PSU advantage. The Cardinal fought back after a media timeout and used back-to-back service aces from Hayley Hodson to pull ahead 20-18. Lee responded with a huge kill and both Detering and Gorrell skied for a block to knot the score again at 20-20. The teams continued to trade points before Penn State went on a mini three-point spurt to reach set point at 24-22. Stanford battled back, however, rattling off four straight points for the set victory, 26-24. The first set saw 16 ties and five lead changes while Penn State hit .325 and Stanford just .237 with seven errors to the Nittany Lions' two.

The second set started with a fury of Lion points to grab a 3-1 lead before Stanford got back ahead at 5-4. PSU then ran off four straight points with a pair of kills by Frantti and one each by Washington and junior Heidi Thelen for the 8-5 edge. The Cardinal again came back with another 3-0 run to pull even again, 8-8, before Penn State secured six of the next eight points to jump to a 14-10 lead, their largest of the match. Detering had a pair of huge kills while Lee had a big block and kill during the run. Stanford again fought back into things going on a 7-0 run which included a pair of service aces to take the 17-14 lead. The Cardinal continued the pace as they scored 15 of the final 19 points to cruise to the 25-18 set victory.

PSU came out of the break to start the third set with some intensity using a Detering kill to grab a 3-1 lead and a few points late Detering combined with Washington for a block and the 5-3 lead. The Cardinal regained control for a brief portion maintaining a multiple point lead before a service error and a big block by Thelen knotted everything up at 18-18. The Nittany Lions then took a two-point edge, 21-19, after kills by Washington and Frantti, but again the Cardinal came back to tie at 21-21 after a net violation. Out of a timeout the teams then traded points before Stanford collected the final three-straight for the 25-22 set victory.

Penn State held the slim 43-41 lead in kills and the 10-8 margin in blocks, but Stanford used eight service aces and only two service errors to their advantage while hitting .232 to PSU's .227.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - Led by a 20-kill performance from junior Simone Lee, No. 17 Penn State women's volleyball (4-3) took down Hofstra (6-3) in four sets (25-21, 22-25, 25-12, 25-11) Saturday afternoon in the second match of the Syracuse Classic.

Trailing by one, 2-1, a pair of Hofstra errors opened up a 4-0 run that lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by three, 5-2, causing Hofstra to call an early timeout.

The Pride came out of the break with a kill, but the Nittany Lions regrouped with a 7-0 run to take over a nine-point lead, 12-3. Hofstra followed with a kill, 12-4, but Penn State answered with a 3-1 strike in to remain ahead, 15-5. The Pride came storming back, using a 4-0 strike to make it 15-9, causing the Nittany Lions to call a timeout. Penn State came out of the break with two kills from Washington and Lee and an ace from junior Lainy Pierce to rebuild the advantage to nine, 18-9. With the Nittany Lions unable to sustain the momentum, Hofstra responded with a 9-2 scoring streak to narrow the Penn State lead to two, 20-18. Gorrell and Lee cut off the momentum with consecutive kills to lift Penn State ahead, 22-18. Hofstra made one final attempt to mount a comeback with back-to-back kills, cutting the deficit to two again, 22-20. A kill from Gorrell and a Hofstra attack error made it set point, 24-20. Hofstra held off one attempt before a kill from Thelen secured a 25-21 win in the first set.

Penn State and Hofstra battled point-for-point throughout the first half of the second set, tying the score 11 times. Penn State came out of the break with back-to-back kills from Lee and Gorrell before a Hofstra attack error tied the score, 21-21. Penn State could not shift the momentum as the Pride responded with a 3-1 spurt to arrive at set point, 24-22. One more Hofstra killed gave the Pride a 25-22 win in the second set to tie the match. 1-1.

Penn State got out to a fast start in the third set, using a 6-2 run to construct an early lead, prompting Hofstra to call a timeout. Penn State continued to roll out of the break, using a 6-1 streak, capped off by kills from Lee to widen the advantage to as many as nine, 12-3. The Pride looked to break up the momentum with a kill, 12-4, but the Nittany Lions answered back with a 6-4 stretch to send the advantage into double figures, 18-8, causing Hofstra to use its final timeout. A block from Washington and Detering out of the timeout sparked another 6-2 scoring streak that lifted the Nittany Lions to set point, 24-10. SYRACUSE, N.Y. - No. 17 Penn State women's volleyball (5-3) swept past Syracuse (1-6) in straight sets (25-22, 25-17, 25-12) to capture the Syracuse Classic title Saturday evening at the Women's Building.

Penn State and Syracuse kept it close in the early part of the first set. Trailing by one, 10-9, Lee sparked a 3-0 spurt with a kill to bring the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 12-10. The Orange answered with a pair of kills to tie the score again, 12-12. PSU and SU continued to trade points, 14-14, until a pair of Orange errors gave the Nittany Lions a two-point edge, 16-14. Penn State came out of the timeout with a 2-1 spurt to widen the margin to three, 23-20, but Syracuse followed with consecutive kills to arrive within one, 23-22. A Syracuse service error out of a Penn State timeout gave the Nittany Lions set point, 24-22. White followed with an ace to close out a 25-22 win in the first set.

The Nittany Lions jumped out to a 7-3 start in the second set, capped off by a block from Thelen and Gorrell to prompt the Orange to call a timeout. Penn State followed with a 4-2 stretch to widen the advantage to six, 11-5. Syracuse came storming back, using a 6-2 scoring streak to narrow the gap to three, 13-10. Penn State halted the run, using a 5-2 run to build the advantage back to six, 18-12.

A Nittany Lion net violation and an Orange block made it 18-14, but Penn State regrouped with kills from Lee and Frantti, sparking a 4-1 strike that made it 22-15. Syracuse looked to get back on track with a block following a Penn State service error, 22-17, but Washington, Detering and Frantti wrapped up a 25-17 win in the second set with three consecutive kills.

Penn State moved out to an 11-6 start in the third set, led by kills from three different Nittany Lions. The Orange called timeout looking to break up the streak, but Penn State followed with four unanswered points to bolster the advantage to as many as nine, 15-6. Syracuse called its final timeout of the frame and looked for an opportunity off a PSU service error out of the break, 15-7.

The Nittany Lions did not let the Orange any closer than nine as Penn State surged to a 25-12 win in the third set to complete the sweep.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.- The No. 20 Penn State women's volleyball team (6-3) had a dominant performance Friday evening in a 3-0 (25-6, 25-18, 25-13) win against Rhode Island (4-6) inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall.

Penn State had an impressive performance on both ends of the net, hitting at a .375 clip over three sets while limiting Rhode Island to a negative percentage. The junior duo of Haleigh Washington and Simone Lee led the way for the Nittany Lions over the evening. Washington had 11 kills on 14 attempts for a blistering .786 hitting. She added five blocks.

Lee tacked on $10 \, \text{kills}$ for her eighth match this season in double figures. The Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, native added five digs and a pair of blocks.

Penn State rounds out its non-conference slate tomorrow, Saturday, Sept. 17, in a double-header. Back-to-back kills from Washington were followed by a URI timeout when Penn State led, 17-4. URI scored twice more before kills from Washington, Lee and junior setter Abby Detering closed out the first set. 25-6.

The second set proved a tougher challenge. Both sides traded points to 10-10 before the Nittany Lions found their stride. A pair of Washington kills and errors from Rhode Island made it a five-point set and led Rhode Island to call for time at 17-12. The sides traded points once again before a pair of kills from junior Heidi Thelen turned the tide. The two scores gave Penn State a 22-17 advantage, forcing Rhode Island's second timeout. The Nittany Lions had a balanced attack, with four players posting seven or more kills in the match. Once again, junior outside hitter Simone Lee led the way for Penn State, this time with 12 kills. Junior Haleigh Washington posted eight kills on .467 hitting while tacking on a team-best four blocks.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 20 Penn State women's volleyball team (8-3) swept both the Clemson Tigers (5-7) and the Penn State Invitational in Rec Hall on Saturday night after a 3-0 (25-14, 25-17, 25-12) win over its final opponent of the non-conference season.

The trio of Abby Detering, Haleigh Washington and Heide Thelen earned all-tournament team honors after exceptional performances over the weekend. Detering guided the team to a .354 hitting clip in three matches, dishing out 91 assists while adding 14 digs, seven kills, six blocks and three service aces. Washington led the team in both kills (27) and hitting percentage (.610) over the weekend while also posting a team-best 15 blocks. Thelen's transition to right side proved a wise decision, as she came second on the team in kills with 21 while hitting at a .447 clip. She added four blocks, a pair of digs and an assist.

The Penn State standouts were joined by Rhode Island's Audrey Castro, Clemson's Leah Perri and Howard's Khaila Donaldson.

The Blue and White now enter the Big Ten Conference portion of its schedule. The Nittany Lions will kick off league play with a pair of road trips, first taking to Piscataway, New Jersey for a bout with Rutgers on Wednesday at 7 p.m. ET before flying to Evanston, Illinois to face Northwestern on Sunday, September 25 at 1 p.m. ET.

Penn State saw the majority of its offense come from Ali Frantti, Simone Lee and Washington in the first set, with each of the players notching three kills in the opening frame. After a 7-7 tie, the offense erupted for a 4-0 spurt with both Lee and Frantti making their presence known in the burst for an 11-7 lead. A few points later PSU took off for another 4-0 run, with a kill from Tori Gorrell and an ace courtesy of Detering making the score 17-10 when Clemson called its lone timeout of the set. It wouldn't slow the Nittany Lions who expanded the run to 8-0, grabbing a 21-10 lead. Clemson fended off two set points before Penn State took the first. 25-14.

Lee and Thelen posted four kill apiece while Washington added three kills and three blocks in the second frame. PSU did not trail throughout the second set after opening on a 4-2 run. Clemson came within one multiple times before a 4-0 run capped by Thelen's second kill of the scoring session made it 17-12. Clemson came within three at 18-15 before three consecutive kills from Washington launched a 7-2 outburst to win the second, 25-17.

The team held Clemson to -.075 in the final frame of action in a dominant 25-12 victory. The Nittany Lions opened on a 4-0 run and never looked back. Clemson came within one after a 3-0 spurt of their own before a pair of kills from Lee grew the score to 8-4. After kills from Thelen and Washington the crowd erupted in its loudest response of the night as freshman defensive specialist Kendall White struck a back row kill to force a Clemson timeout with a 12-5 edge. From there the lead only grew. PSU closed out the match on an 8-2 run, clinching the win and the perfect weekend.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - The No. 18 Penn State women's volleyball team (9-3, 1-0 Big Ten) rolled past the Scarlet Knights of Rutgers (4-10, 0-1 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-17, 25-17, 25-5), on Wednesday evening inside College Avenue Gym.

Junior outside hitters Simone Lee and Ali Frantti led the way, scoring 13 and 11 kills apiece, hitting .579 and .458 respectively.

As a team, the Nittany Lions opened Big Ten play hitting at an impressive .468 clip, committing just five errors throughout the match. The team also exceeded serving, recording 10 aces in the outing.

The match started with a solo block from Lee before Detering aced the Scarlet Knights for a 3-0 lead. Rutgers scored twice during the span of the next seven points, when an enormous kill courtesy of Frantti forced a Rutgers timeout at 8-2. Rutgers scored three times before a block from Frantti and Washington pushed the Nittany Lions to be the first to 10 points. A kill of the slide from Haleigh Washington the next play edged the PSU lead to 11-5. The two sides swapped points back and forth with nothing between the two sides, as each scored six points. Penn State's lead spanned between five and six points. A kill from middle blocker Tori Gorrell made Penn State the first team to 20, before a solo stuff from Frantti made a 21-14 lead. Washington notched an enormous block with Thelen before an error from Rutgers ended the set. Frantti, Gorrell and Lee each notched three kills in the 25-17 first set victory.

An over pass kill from Washington highlighted the early action in the second, as Penn State jumped to an early 3-1 lead. An enormous swing from Lee made the score 5-2 in the Nittany Lions' favor, when Rutgers responded with two of their own. Penn State responded with a 3-0 run, capped by a kill from Gorrell, before Rutgers put together a 4-0 spurt to tie the set, 8-8. The two sides traded blows, with Frantti posting an electric kill to make the score 12-10 in PSU's favor. There was no separation between the two sides, going back and forth, before Thelen's third kill of the night and an ace from Laura Broerman sparked a 3-0 run, causing a Rutgers timeout at an 18-14 Penn State edge. The stoppage didn't slow PSU, as the Blue and White opened a 4-2 run, finished with a solo stop from Washington to force Rutgers' second timeout at 22-16. Lee hammered down two of her set-best five kills in the final three plays as PSU claimed the second set, 25-17.

A pair of impressive kills from Frantti and Heidi Thelen followed by three consecutive aces from Abby Detering catapulted Penn State to a 6-0 lead to open the third set. Rutgers called timeout and followed with its first point of the set. Lee notched her sixth kill to spark a 4-0 run. Lee committed a service error before following it up with a kill the next play for an 11-2 lead. A pair of hammers from Frantti and one from Washington extended the lead to 14-2. A 4-2 run for the Nittany Lions including an ace from Frantti for the team's ninth of the evening made the score 18-4, prompting Rutgers' second timeout. Lee came out of the timeout hot, scoring on consecutive kills before a block from Washington and Detering and an ace from Carley Muller made the score 22-4. Rutgers scored just once more before Penn State claimed the match with a 25-5 third set victory

 $\textbf{EVANSTON, III.-} The \, \text{No.\,} 18 \, \text{Penn State women's volleyball team} (10\text{-}3, 2\text{-}0 \, \text{Big Ten}) \, \text{earned its secsons} \\$ ond win in league play at Northwestern (7-7, 0-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (27-25, 25-17, 25-17), on Sunday afternoon in Welsh-Ryan Arena.

Penn State held a balanced attack in the match, with five players logging five or more kills. Junior outside hitter Simone Lee led the way once again, posting 10 kills in the match along with eight digs and four aces. Junior right side Heidi Thelen played a key role in the victory, notching nine kills and a team-best four blocks. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell added six kills and matched Thelen's blocking output.

The first set opened with two straight points from Northwestern. A kill from junior outside hitter Simone Lee put the Nittany Lions back on track, as she aced the opposition two points later to tie the match. Northwestern responded with four straight points, forcing a Penn State timeout as the Nittany Lions trailed, 7-3. Junior right side Heidi Thelen hammered down a kill out of the break before an errant attack from Northwestern closed the gap to three at 8-5. NU made a 3-0 run before a pair of Wildcat errors and a block from junior setter Abby Detering and Haleigh Washington led Northwestern to use its first timeout with just a two-point lead. A pair of kills from Lee and errors from the Wildcats brought the match to a 12-12 tie before Northwestern opened a 4-0 run to take the lead once again, 16-12.

A kill from Thelen and an ace from libero Kendall White launched a 4-1 scoring run for the Nittany Lions, prompting a Northwestern timeout at 18-17. PSU took the lead following a block from Detering and Washington for a 20-19 lead. Northwestern scored two in a row after a kill off the slide from Washington knotted the match once again at 21-21. The teams swapped points with Lee tying the set once again at 22-22 with her third kill of the day. A quick kill from the middle gave NU set point, before Lee hammered down yet another kill to tie the match. The junior followed the kill with an ace, but an error tied the set at 25-all. Thelen came up big when needed the most, supplying a pair of kills to close out the opening frame, 27-25.

Back-to-back aces from Detering highlighted a 4-1 run to open the second set. Northwestern called timeout following the initial run, forcing an error before middle blocker Tori Gorrell got on the board with a kill of her own. White added the third ace of the match for a 7-3 PSU lead. A pair of kills from Washington and Lee made the score 10-7. A pair of kills from Gorrell and Thelen made it 12-8 in PSU's favor, causing a Northwestern timeout.

Gorrell struck again out of the break before a 3-0 NU run. Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti looked to turn the tide, striking a ball down the line for a 15-12 PSU advantage. A kill from Washington and a trio of errors from Northwestern opened a six-point gap at 20-14. Northwestern scored twice before two blocks involving Gorrell, Lee and Thelen gave Penn State set point. NU fended off set point once before Lee smashed the winner for a 25-17, set two victory.

Washington, Lee and Gorrell each charted kills in the opening portion of the third. A block from Thelen gave PSU a 4-3 lead before NU responded with a kill. Lee quickly added two more kills and an ace, while Gorrell logged a stuff to give PSU an 8-5 lead and force a Northwestern timeout. Gorrell and Thelen combined for a block before Gorrell hit another kill down the middle for a five-point lead. Northwestern burned its second timeout as PSU led, 10-5.

A pair of kills from Washington and junior Ali Frantti helped guide PSU to a 13-8 lead. The sides swapped points before strikes from Lee and Thelen opened the gap to six at 18-12. UNIVERSITY PARK. Pa. - The No. 16 Penn State women's volleyball team (11-3, 3-0 Big Ten) notched its seventh consecutive sweep on Friday night in Rec Hall, taking down No. 18 Michigan State (12-3, 1-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-22, 25-20, 25-13) in front of a raucous crowd of 3,524.

Penn State once again strung together an impressive match, with a strong .333 hitting efficient on offense while limiting the Spartans to just a .103 clip on 97 attacks. PSU logged 42 kills to the Spartans' 31.

The trio of juniors in Simone Lee, Haleigh Washington and Ali Frantti led the way for the Nittany Lions. Lee logged a team-best 12 kills, with Frantti also scoring double-figures with 10 of her own. Washington had nine kills, an ace and a pair of blocks. Lee added a pair of stuffs as well.

The first set was back-and-forth in the early going, with a host of players in Lee, Washington, Frantti and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell all notching kills to lead to a 15-15 tie. A pair of Michigan State hammers gave the Spartans a two-point lead when Penn State called for time. The break worked, as three consecutive kills from Lee, Washington and Frantti and a Michigan State error caused Michigan State to take its first break of the set with PSU ahead, 19-17. A 3-0 run punctuated by a spike from Gorrell forced Michigan State's second timeout at 23-19. MSU fended off three set points before an error from the Spartans led to a Penn State victory, 25-22.

The second set saw nine ties in the early going before a kill from Washington gave PSU an 11-10 lead. Penn State would not trail again in the set. A block from junior opposite Heidi Thelen and three MSU errors gave Penn State an 18-14 advantage. Michigan State wouldn't back down, pulling within two on a kill at 20-18 when Penn state took its only timeout that set. The Nittany Lions closed out the second set with a 5-2 run, as Gorrell and Lee denied the ball for set point, 25-20.

Penn State came out of the break fired up and put together the most complete set of the evening. Lee, Washington, Gorrell and Frantti all posted kills in the first six points of the match on kills for a 5-1 lead. Michigan State pulled within three at 8-5 when PSU opened a 4-0 run highlighted by a block from Washington and junior setter Abby Detering. MSU called for time at 12-5, but Penn State rattled off three straight points afterwards. A kill for Detering made it 18-8. Lee tacked on a pair of kills before PSU was aced twice. The team called timeout at 23-13 before putting the match away with a MSU error, 25-13.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 16 Penn State women's volleyball team (12-3, 4-0 Big Ten) earned its second top-25 victory of the weekend on Saturday night, taking down the visiting Michigan Wolverines (13-3, 2-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-20, 25-19, 25-15), inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall.

A slew of Nittany Lions contributed on the offensive end as the team notched 47 kills in the match, tying its largest output in a three-set outing this season.

Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti paced the club with 11 kills on .391 hitting, while adding seven digs and a pair of blocks. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell tabbed nine kills and a team-best five blocks, while Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington had eight kills apiece. Washington also tallied five blocks

Opposite Heidi Thelen had six spikes on a team-high .667 hitting clip. Junior setter Abby Detering paced the offense to a .432 clip as a team while accounting for 35 of the team's 44 assists. She added four kills of her own while notching 11 digs for her third double-double of the season.

Michigan pulled within two when an ace from defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb and a kill from Frantti sparked a 4-0 run to make it 13-8 for the Nittany Lions. Gorrell, Frantti, and Lee all knocked down kills in a 5-2 PSU run to open the gap to five at 19-14 when Michigan called its second timeout. Michigan pulled within three at 20-17, prompting a PSU timeout. The Blue and White responded, rattling off five of the final eight points, as a kill from Washington punctuated the first frame, finishing the set at 25-20.

The second was tightly contested early on. With four ties and three lead changes near the beginning, the teams went back and forth before a kill for Detering gave PSU an 18-15 advantage. Two plays later Gorrell slammed down a kill in the middle before Washington and Thelen combined for a block the next play to force a Michigan timeout at 20-16 in Penn State's favor. With a service error from Holcomb the Wolverines pulled within three at 22-19. Penn State called for time. Out of the break PSU took the final three points of the set, with a pair of Washington blocks powering the team to a 25-19, set two victory.

Much like the night prior, Penn State put together its best set of the night in the third. The team opened on a 5-1 tear, with a pair of aces from Washington and a kill from Detering forcing Michigan to call for time. Washington would spike the ball in the middle to make PSU the first to 10. Michigan pulled within three at 13-10 before another kill from Washington and her third ace of the set backed the Wolverines into calling time at 15-10. It seemed from there that for every point Michigan scored, Penn State scored twice. An ace from defensive specialist Lainy Pierce highlighted a 5-3 run for the Nittany Lions, bringing the score to 20-13. Michigan would only score twice more, as kills from Frantti and Washington closed out the match with a 25-15 set three win.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Behind a career-best 30 kills from junior Simone Lee, the 15th-ranked Penn State women's volleyball team (13-3, 5-0 Big Ten) took down the No. 1 Minnesota Golden Gophers (12-2, 4-1 Big Ten), 3-2 (29-27, 21-25, 23-25, 25-14, 15-10) inside a raucous Rec Hall.

It came down to a decisive fifth frame, where both sides tussled back and forth before Penn State took an 8-6 lead to force the break. Minnesota scored before a kill from junior Haleigh Washington and an errant attack from the Gophers' Hannah Tapp made the score 10-7. Minnesota pulled within two at 11-9 before a pair of kills from junior Heidi Thelen and one from Lee made it 14-9. Two points later it was only fitting that Lee put away the final point, logging kill No. 30 to close out the match with a 15-10, set-five win.

Four players notched double-figure kills, with Lee paving the way. Lee's 30-kill outing marked the first time since 2007 that a single Nittany Lion had logged 30 or more kills in a single outing, It also marked the most kills in a five-set match during the 25-point rally scoring era for a single player. The junior added six digs and a pair of blocks in the marathon outing

In addition to Lee's outburst, Thelen and Washington scored 14 each. Thelen led the team with five blocks while Washington added three and a service ace. Classmate Ali Frantti logged her second double-double of 2016 with 13 kills and 13 digs. She added a pair of blocks and two assists.

Setter Abby Detering led PSU to .308 hitting against the Golden Gophers, clocking her fourth double-double of the season with 61 assists and 10 digs. She added five kills and three aces. Redshirt freshman middle blocker Tori Gorrell tacked on three kills and a team-best five blocks.

Freshman Kendall White paced the back row with a match-high 21 digs. She added four assists and a kill. Defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb added seven digs and three assists in the outing.

The Nittany Lions showed incredible resilience in the first set. After trailing 11-3 in the early goings, the team mounted an 11-6 run powered by kills from Lee, Washington and Thelen before an ace from Detering pulled Penn State within three at 17-14. Minnesota then called for a timeout. Minnesota scored two straight before another impressive run for the Nittany Lions, highlighted by back-to-back kills from Washington, tied the match at 22-22. Penn State fended off a pair of set points to tie the match once again at 24-all. The two sides went back and forth before kills from Lee and Frantti locked up the first. 29-27.

Despite seven tie scores, the Nittany Lions ended up on the wrong end of the second set. Lee scored on seven kills in the second frame, while Washington and Frantti added four a piece. White notched eight digs. Penn State was within three at 22-19 before Minnesota pulled away to take the second, 25-21.

One of the most tightly contested sets of the match, Lee and Thelen led the way in the third for the Blue and White with five and four kills, respectively. The two sides had little to separate themselves with 16 ties and six lead changes. Both sides jostled for position, when an ace from Minnesota forced a timeout for Penn State at a 22-21 Minnesota edge. Thelen hammered the ball down to tie the set at 22-all, but a pair of Gopher kills closed out the third, 25-23.

While the fourth set statistically was Penn State's most dominant, Minnesota started strong, opening on a 7-2 run before PSU called for a timeout. A pair of blocks from Gorrell and Thelen powered a 3-0 run before another pair of blocks, this time involving Washington, made it 9-9. A kill from Lee gave PSU a two-point advantage when Minnesota called for time at 11-9. Penn State's momentum was too much, as three consecutive kills from Lee, Gorrell and Thelen widened the gap to four at 16-12. Minnesota called for time before Penn State went on an 8-2 run, with the final kill of the set coming from Frantti. The 25-14 set four win forced the decisive fifth.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Behind a dominant performance on both side of the ball and an enthusiastic crowd of 5,312 inside Rec Hall on Saturday night, the No. 15 Penn State women's volleyball team (14-3, 6-0 Big Ten) made short work of visiting Rutgers (4-15, 0-6 Big Ten), sweeping the Scarlet Knights, 3-0 (25-13, 25-16, 25-10).

Penn State extended its sterling record in conference play by dominating on both sides of the ball. The team was guided to .425 hitting as a group, as junior setter Abby Detering dished out 40 assists to find seven different players who scored. Juniors Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington along with redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell each reached double-figure kills. Gorrell and Lee led the way with 11 kills each, while Washington posted 10 on a team-best .750 hitting.

On the defensive end, the team was equally impressive. Holding the Scarlet Knights to .024 hitting, the Nittany Lions out-blocked Rutgers 9.5-4.0. Washington led the way with five blocks, while Lee, Detering, Gorrell and junior right side Heidi Thelen each added three. Freshman libero Kendall White notched a team-best 14 digs while junior outside hitter Ali Frantti contributed seven and defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb tacked on six digs of her own.

Senior Laura Broerman played a key role in the serving game, accounting for three of Penn State's four aces, including the match-winning point.

Gorrell powered the offense in the first set, posting five kills on six attempts to lead the way, as PSU won, 25-13. After an early 3-3 tie, The Nittany Lions went on a 6-2 run capped by a kill in the middle from Washington. With the score set at 9-5 to PSU's advantage, Rutgers called for time. The break didn't stop the Nittany Lions, as Detering responded with a kill out of the break. Kills from Gorrell and Thelen before a block from the two and Lee gave Penn State a seven-point advantage, prompting the second Rutgers timeout at 17-10. Kills from Lee and Gorrell out of the break gave the Blue and White a 10-point advantage at 20-10. The Scarlet Knights scored three more times before Frantti pounded home the set-securing kill.

The second set was the most tightly contested, as both sides went back and forth to 10-10. From there, Penn State ripped open a 5-0 run, sparked by a pair of kills from Lee and Gorrell. Rutgers scored once before another 4-0 run for the Nittany Lions, with an ace from Broerman highlighting the spurt. Rutgers used its second timeout, before trading points with Penn State. A kill from Frantti made it set point. Rutgers fended off once chance from Penn State before a Scarlet Knights' service error closed out the set at 25-16.

The Nittany Lions hit at a .391 clip and tallied a total of six blocks in the final frame, holding Rutgers to just five kills in the third. With three blocks in the first five points, a Broerman ace made it 6-0, Penn State, and forced the Rutgers timeout. RU pulled within four at 11-7 before the Nittany Lions responded with a 5-1 run, powered by kills from Thelen and Washington. Rutgers scored twice before consecutive kills from Washington and Lee made the score 18-10 in PSU's advantage. Rutgers called for time, but Penn State would complete a 9-0 run, ending with the aforementioned Broerman ace, to earn the win with a 25-10, set three victory.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - The No. 10 Penn State women's volleyball team (15-3, 7-0 Big Ten) took down No. 22 Purdue (11-7, 1-6 Big Ten) behind impressive efforts from junior outside hitter Simone Lee and classmate setter Abby Detering on Friday evening inside Holloway Gymnasium.

Penn State continued to be one of the nation's most efficient offenses, as Detering guided the team to hitting at a scorching. 322 clip. For the 16th time in 2016, junior outside hitter Simone Lee led the offense, pacing the team with 16 kills.

Five players scored on kills, with junior Haleigh Washington coming in second on the team with eight kills on a team-best .583 hitting. The Colorado Springs, Colorado, native added a block. Detering and junior outside hitter Ali Frantti both posted five kills as Detering dished out a team-high 29 assists. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell posted four kills and a team-best three blocks, while junior opposite Heidi Thelen added four of her own.

Defensively, freshman libero Kendall White was exceptional once again, logging 11 digs in the outing. Detering and Frantii added seven and five, respectively. Sophomore defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb added five of

With the win, Penn State extends its winning streak to 13-straight. The streak, third best in the country, matches the team's longest win streak of 2015, in which PSU won its first 13 matches.

The Nittany Lions opened the match vying for position in the early going. Purdue opened on a 5-3 run, with PSU's strongest play in the opening eight points coming on a block from Thelen and Gorrell. Thelen punished the ball and Frantti followed with a kill of her own to tie, 5-5. A huge swing from Detering made the lead three at 8-5. Purdue went on a 3-1 run before a huge kill from Washington ended the spurt. A block by Gorrell and Lee made it a three-point set at 11-8. The Blue and White continued to climb, gaining a five-point, 14-9 lead, when

The two sides went back and forth out of the break, before a block from Washington and Detering gave PSU a five point lead once again at 18-13. Both sides scored twice with a massive kill off the slide courtesy of Washington highlighting the span, as PSU took a 20-15 lead. Purdue used its final timeout of the set. A massive kill out of the break from Lee and another from Detering made it 23-17. Lee hammered down a kill to set up set point before Frantti logged her second of the night to secure the 25-18 set one win.

An impressive kill on the pipe from Lee highlighted the first five points of the second set, as Purdue took an early 3-2 lead. An impressive kill Detering tied the match at 4-4 before Holcomb aced the Boilermakers to make it 6-4 for PSU. Purdue opened a 3-1 run to tie the match at 7-all before an ace from Frantti gave PSU the lead once again. Washington scored again on the slide to make it 10-7 in Penn State's favor, before a kill from Lee the next play forced Purdue to call its first timeout of the set at 11-7.

Lee thundered down an overpass out of the break before Purdue responded with four consecutive points to pull within one, 12-11. The Nittany Lions then made a rally of their own, rattling off four-straight to make it 16-11 in their favor. Lee thumped another ball, forcing Purdue's second timeout at 17-11. Purdue fired back out of the timeout, putting together four points in a row when Penn State used its first timeout with a 17-15 lead. Lee's 10th kill of the evening and an ace from Detering fueled a 3-0 run for PSU make it 21-16 for the Blue and White. Purdue fended off set point once before Lee's 12th kill of the evening secured set two, 25-17.

A kill on the fifth point from Thelen gave PSU its first lead of the third set at 3-2. PSU took the lead again at 5-4 when Frantti pegged a member of Purdue's back line with the ball. Penn State jumped ahead to 9-6 following another hammer by Lee and an ace from redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher. Two plays later PSU forced a Purdue error for the 11-7 lead when the Boilermakers called for a timeout.

Two plays later Lee hammered a kill to make it a 7-1 run for PSU and a 13-7 lead. Gorrell striped one down the middle five plays later for a 15-10 Penn State edge. Purdue called for time a point later, trailing by six. The Nittany Lions didn't slow, tacking on another two points before Purdue scored, making the lead 18-10. A strong cross-body kill from Washington followed by one from Detering made it 20-11. Strikes from Frantti and Lee extended the lead to 22-14. Purdue held off match point three times before PSU won the match, 25-17.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – The No. 10 Penn State women's volleyball team (16-3, 8-0 Big Ten) logged its 14th consecutive win on Saturday evening, disposing the Indiana Hoosiers (13-8, 2-6 Big Ten) on Saturday evening, 3-0 (25-16, 25-18, 25-18) inside University Gym.

Penn State hit over .300 once again, as a balanced attack of six players scoring on six or more kills guided the team to victory. Juniors Ali Frantti and Simone Lee along with redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell scored seven each, while juniors Heidi Thelen and Haleigh Washington each had six. Junior setter Abby Detering added five of her own.

The team's blocking also looked strong, with five members of the team getting involved on the defensive end. Thelen had a team best three blocks, while Frantti had two solo stops. Gorrell and Washington each had a pair of blocks as well.

Freshman libero Kendall White led the back line with a match-best nine digs. Frantti and Detering added six each.

Lee notched an early pair of kills in the first, but a solo block from Indiana gave the Hoosiers a four-point lead, as Penn State called for time, trailing 7-3. After another IU point, an error and a block from Thelen and Washington brought PSU within two, 8-6. Washington notched a solo block the next play to cut the lead to one when Indiana called its first timeout of the set. An IU error tied the match at 8-8. Penn State took five of the next seven points with a kill from Washington giving PSU a 13-10 edge. Indiana pulled within one before a big swing from Gorrell scored to make it 15-13, Penn State. The Blue and White scored twice more, forcing a timeout by the Hoosiers at 17-13.

Gorrell notched another kill out of the break, as Penn State grew the lead to six, at 19-13. IU scored twice in a row before another kill from Gorrell made it 20-15. Thelen got involved on a block and a kill before an error from Indiana capped the set with a 25-16 PSU win.

Kills from Washington and Gorrell and a solo stuff by Lee gave PSU an early 4-2 lead in the second frame. Washington aced the Hoosiers before IU errored and called for time as Penn State led, 6-2. The two groups proceeded to traded points when a hammer from junior Ali Frantti gave PSU a 10-6 lead. Frantti, Detering, Lee and Washington manufactured a 4-0 run for a 14-7 advantage. IU went on a 6-1 run before another impressive swing from Detering made it 16-13 for Penn State. A 3-0 Indiana run resulted in Penn State calling for time, still up, 18-16. Lee and Thelen scored on kills for a 20-17, PSU lead. Thelen scored again to force IU to call for time at 21-17. Frantti logged a solo block to start a 3-0 run. After IU fended off set point once, Frantti closed out the set with a kill for the 25-18 victory.

PSU came out of the break hot, with a kill from Gorrell capping a 5-1 Nittany Lion run. Frantti logged a solo block to take an 8-2 Penn State lead when Indiana called for time. Kills from Thelen and Washington pushed the lead to 11-3. The sides swapped points before an ace from redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher made it 15-6. Indiana didn't go easily, making a 6-2 run when the Nittany Lions used their first timeout of the set with a 17-12 advantage.

Frantti scored on a kill out of the stoppage before a net violation for IU made the score 20-14 in PSU's favor. A kill from Lee made it a 23-16 advantage, before she struck another two points later for set point. IU delayed Penn State for a point before an error gave PSU the third, 25-18.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 9 Penn State women's volleyball team (17-3, 9-0 Big Ten) won its 15th-straight match on Wednesday evening, taking down No. 19 Ohio State (13-8, 3-6 Big Ten) 3-0 (25-21, 25-20, 25-17) inside of an energized Rec Hall.

The Nittany Lions block was in full force Wednesday evening, as the team out-blocked the visiting Buckeyes, 11.0-4.0. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell paced the team at the net with a total of six blocks while adding five kills on a .500 attacking clip. Juniors Haleigh Washington and Heidi Thelen posted three apiece.

Washington and classmate Simone Lee both contributed double-figure kills. Washington posted 10 on a team-best and season-high-tying .769 clip, while Lee posted 12 kills and added three dies

The Penn State – Ohio State contest served as Penn State's annual "Dig Pink" match. Thanks to the fans' contributions and bids at the team's silent auction, the contingent managed to raise over \$4,000 to the Side-Out Foundation, a support and advocacy organization that unites volleyball players and coaches to work toward the common goal of furthering breast cancer awareness, education and patient services.

PSU opened the first set on a 4-1 tear, with a kill and an ace from Washington powering the spurt. A kill from Lee opened the lead to 6-3 before a 4-0 run from the Buckeyes gave OSU the lead, 7-6. The sides swapped points before Ohio State climbed to a 14-12 lead. The Nittany Lions then rattled off three points in a row, as a kill from Thelen took Penn State into the media timeout with a 15-14 lead.

The Nittany Lions didn't slow out of the break, taking three of the next four points, capped by another kill from Lee for an 18-15, Penn State lead. The lead grew to four after a pair of OSU errors, forcing a Buckeye timeout at 21-17. The teams once again traded blows before a kill from Gorrell made it set point. An Ohio State kill temporarily stalled PSU before a kill from Lee the next play sealed the first, 25-21.

Penn State opened the second set the same as the first, with a 4-1 tear. Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti scored the fifth point before a block from Thelen and Gorrell four plays later made it a 6-3 PSU lead. Ohio State scored before a 4-0 run from Penn State, capped by a kill from Washington. Ohio State cultivated a run of its own, pulling within three, at 11-8, on a 4-1 spurt. Kills from Washington and Gorrell followed by an ace from Detering made the lead six for PSU at 16-10. Ohio State pulled within three again at 17-14 before a 4-0 run powered by a trio of Nittany Lion blocks extended the lead to seven at 21-14.

Ohio State scored five more times before an errant shot by the Buckeyes gave PSU a two-set advantage heading into the break.

A pair of kills and a solo stuff from Washington guided PSU to a 5-1 lead to begin the third. OSU scored three straight before a pair of errors widened the gap to three in PSU's favor, 7-4. Another kill from Frantti made it a three-point set once again at 13-10. The Nittany Lions went on to manufacture a 7-3 run, with three players recording kills and Washington adding an ace for a 20-13 lead. Ohio State pulled within five at 21-16 before Penn State closed out the match on a 4-1 run. Detering hammered the ball down to win the third frame, and the match, 25-17.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. – The No. 9 Penn State women's volleyball team(17-4, 9-1 Big Ten) saw it's 15-match win streak snapped in its first loss of the conference tilt, falling to No. 16 Michigan (18-4, 7-4 Big Ten) on Saturday evening, 3-2 (25-23, 17-25, 29-27, 23-25, 15-9) inside Cliff Keen Arena.

The match came down to a decisive fifth set with both sides even through four. Kills from juniors Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington began the final set, propelling PSU to an early, 2-0 lead. Michigan responded with three kills of its own before Washington logged her eighth of the night to tie the fifth frame at 3-3. The Wolverines extended the lead to 5-3 before a solo block from junior setter Abby Detering cut the lead to one. Michigan continued to score, but Lee and junior outside hitter All Frantti responded with kills of their own to pull within one, 7-6, before the Wolverines took an 8-6 lead into the break. A Wolverines ace the next play prompted a Penn State timeout, trailing three. Michigan tacked on another kill before Frantti responded with a kill of her own to make the score 10-7, Michigan. Detering scored two plays later to make it a three-point game again at 11-8. The Wolverines scored once, with Penn State calling for a timeout, trailing 12-8. The Wolverines countered twice more before a kill from Lee made it 14-9. Michigan killed the ball to win the match the next play.

The first set opened with the two sides tussling for position in the early action, with four ties before Michigan had the match's second lead change and opened the gap to three at 7-4. Michigan extended the run to 5-0, forcing Penn State to call for a timeout, trailing, 8-4. The two sides swapped points out of the break before, closing the gap to three before the Wolverines put together a 6-2 spurt, causing Penn State to call its second timeout, behind 16-9. The teams swapped points on both sides before a block from Washington and junior right side Heidi Thelen changed the momentum. Washington scored on the slide the next play before combining on a block with Frantti to cut the Michigan lead to four. The Wolverines then called for time. The two sides went point-for-point out of the timeout. A quick strike from Gorrell in the middle sparked a 3-0 run for the Nittany Lions. Frantti capped the spurt with a big swing down the line to close the gap to one point, forcing Michigan to call for time, ahead 23-22. The Wolverines scored on the tip out of the break before Frantti responded with another crucial kill to fend off set point. Michigan sealed the first with a kill, 25-23.

The Wolverines opened the second set on a 3-0 run before a kill from Detering broke things up. Michigan would score three more before a kill from Lee closed the gap to three at 6-3. Lee hammered down another kill before two-straight from Michigan prompted a Penn State timeout as the Nittany Lions trailed, 9-4. The break proved effective, as PSU rattled off five straight points, capped by a block from Washington and Frantit to tie the set at 9-all when Michigan decided to use a timeout of its own. Penn State took two more points out of the break on a kill from Frantit and a block from Thelen and Washington. A kill from Thelen two plays later and another block from the duo of Frantit and Washington made it a three-point advantage for PSU at 13-10. Lee's eighth kill of the night made Penn State the first to hit 15 points in the seconds set, before an errant shot and Lee's ninth kill opened the gap to five, forcing a Wolverne timeout at 17-12 in PSU's favor.Penn State ran away out of the break, manufacturing a 5-0 spurt thanks to kills from Lee, Gorrell and Frantit to extend the lead to 24-14. Michigan fought off set point three times, leading to a Penn State timeout at 24-17. Frantit slammed down her ninth kill of the night to secure the set two win, 25-17.

A pair of kills from Lee and errors from Michigan led Penn State to an early 4-2 lead in the third. A 3-1 spurt from Michigan tied the match at 5-all. The two teams vied for position, tying five more times before Michigan pulled ahead by two at 12-10. Lee hammered down a kill to make the score 12-11. Michigan scored before back-to-back kills from Gorrell evened the score at 13-all. Both sides traded blows before kills from Washington, Frantti and Detering gave PSU an 18-16 advantage. Michigan tied the set at 18-18 before a net violation by the Wolverines gave PSU the lead once again. Another powerful kill from Lee made the score 20-18 in Penn State's favor, prompting a Wolverine timeout.Gorrell packed the Wolverines with a solo block out of the break to make the lead three at 21-18. Four plays later, Gorrell found the floor again with her seventh kill for a 23-20 lead. Michigan used its second timeout. A kill from Frantti made it set point before two-straight scores from the Wolverines prompted a Penn State timeout with the 24-23 lead. Michigan scored on another kill to te the set at 24-all, forcing Penn State to use its second timeout. Michigan went ahead by one before Frantti neutralized the threat with a kill to tie at 25-25. The Wolverines scored before a slide from Washington followed by a block from Lee gave PSU set point once again, this time at 27-26. Michigan responded with three in a row, taking the third, 29-27.

Early offense from Lee and Washington helped PSU to an early, 5-2 lead to begin the fourth set. Michigan responded with four straight points to take a 6-5 lead before Lee tied it with her 19th kill of the match. Michigan jumped ahead by two before kills from Lee, Gorrell and Frantti tied the set, 8-all. The two sides went back and forth before Michigan rattled off four unanswered, forcing a PSU timeout as the Nittany Lions trailed, 13-9. Penn State responded by taking two of the next three points to pull within three at 14-11. Two plays later, PSU strung together a 4-0 run, capped by a pair of aces from Washington, to tie the fourth set at 15-all. Lee posted a kill out of the break to give PSU at 16-15 lead. The two sides then went back and forth once again, tying four times before a Wolverine error and a kill from Detering gave PSU the 21-19 lead, causing a Michigan timeout. Frantti scored on a kill out of the break before Michigan added one of its own. The Wolverines rattled off two more points, tying the match at 22-all, when Penn State called for time. The Nittany Lions tied the match again at 23-all bore a kill from Lee and an error from Michigan gave PSU the fourth, 25-23.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Behind one of its finest blocking performances of the season, the 11th-ranked Penn State women's volleyball team (18-7, 10-4 Big Ten) cruised past lowa (18-8, 8-6 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-11, 25-16, 25-17) in just under an hour and a half inside Rec Hall on Saturday afternoon.

The Nittany Lions trailed just twice during the match, as the team out-blocked the Hawkeyes by a staggering 11-block margin, posting 14 to Iowa's three. The 14 blocks were the second most by the team this season, and the most in a three-set match during the 2016 campaign.

Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington posted a season-high and team-best 10 stuffs. Redshirt sophomore setter Bryanna Weiskircher finished second on the team in rejections, posting a career-best-tying six. The effort played a large role in limiting lowa to merely .030

On the offensive end, junior outside hitters Simone Lee and Ali Frantti along with Washington each scored a team-best nine kills. Washington was the most efficient attacker on the team during the sweep, finishing at an even .500 on the night, erring only once in 16

The trio of Weiskircher, Lee and freshman libero Kendall White accounted for 30 of Penn State's 41 digs. White led the team with 13, while Weiskircher and Lee added nine and eight, respectively.

PSU led set one wire-to-wire, with the team registering seven total blocks over the set for a 25-11 blowout. lowa was limited to -.212 hitting, as Washington and Weiskircher combined for nine block assists in the set. The frame opened with a 5-0 run for the Nittany Lions, with four blocks scoring before lowa put up points of its own. Penn State jumped to a 13-7 lead before lowa's first timeout. White had a service error before a 6-0 spurt from Penn State grew the lead to 19-8. Kills from Lee and Washington set up set point, before Gorrell and Weiskircher made the set-winning rejection.

The second set was tied early before tough serving from Lee and a giant swing from junior opposite Heidi Thelen gave PSU a 9-4 advantage. The two sides swapped points before back-to-back kills from Weiskircher and Lee led Penn State to a 15-8 edge, forcing lowa's first timeout. At 17-11, Penn State pushed ahead for a 3-0 run, with a block by Washington and Frantti forcing lowa's second timeout at 20-11. Sophomore defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb was aced at the end of a 4-1 lowa run to force PSU to take its first timeout at 21.15. The break wested as Roan State let up only one more point as route to a 25.16. 21-15. The break worked, as Penn State let up only one more point, en route to a 25-16

Set three stayed the most tightly contested, as both sides tussled back and forth to a 12-10 score. From there, a kill and a block from Washington guided PSU on a 4-1 run. A pair of kills from Lee and one from Frantti widened the gap to five, as lowa took time, down 18-13. Thelen and Frantti pounded kills to force a timeout at 24-17, but it proved futile as Washington slammed down the kill next play to seal the match, 25-17.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - The 10th-ranked Penn State women's volleyball team (19-7, 11-4 Big Ten) got the best of the Maryland Terrapins (10-17, 2-15 Big Ten), 3-1 (21-25, 25-22, 25-18) on Friday evening inside the sold out XFINITY Center Pavilion.

In a group effort, the Nittany Lions defeated Maryland by scoring with a stout blocking presence and double-figure kill outings from juniors Simone Lee and Heidi Thelen. Lee led the team in kills with 17, while Thelen posted 10 of her own, hitting at a 321 clip - the best among Penn State's primary hitters. Thelen added four blocks, good for second best on

The team's defense at the net was impressive, as junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington paced the team with a match-best nine blocks while adding eight kills. Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti and Lee added three blocks apiece.

Redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher assumed the setting role for the evening, posting a double-double with 41 assists and 16 digs. Weiskircher was one of four players to log double-figure digs during the match. Freshman libero Kendall White led the way with 19. Frantti posted 14 digs, while sophomore defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb added 10 of her own. Frantti's 14 marked a season-high in digs.

Lee opened the first set with a kill and followed it up with a second hammer two plays later for a quick 3-0 lead. The Terrapins responded, taking four of the next five points to tie the match, with the lone PSU point coming on another kill from Lee. Washington's first kill of the night tied the set at 6-6 before a monster stuff from her and Weiskircher the next play gave PSU the one-point advantage. The match would the again at 8-8 before a kill followed by acc, both from Washington, made gave PSU a 10-8 edge. After an 11-all tie, Maryland scored three straight when Penn State used its first timeout.

Washington spiked the ball before teaming up with Lee the next play for a monster block, forcing Maryland's first timeout with a 10-4 lead. Maryland scored twice out of the break before PSU responded with three points of its own, highlighted by an ace from Weiskircher to make it 14-8 men State's favor. Penn State went on to lead by seven before a 3-0 run from Maryland threatened Penn State's lead, pulling within four at 16-12.

Penn State responded with a short run of its own. A kill by Gorrell was followed by yet another block from Thelen and Washington gave PSU an 18-12 lead, forcing a timeout from the Terrapins. Maryland responded, coming out of the break on a 4-1 spurt to pull within three at 19-16. Penn State called its first timeout of the set before a crafty tip from Washington put Penn State within five points of taking the second set at 20-17. A kill by Frantti made the score 23-19, before Lee's sixth kill led to set point at 24-20. Maryland fended off set point wice when PSU called for time. Penn State put the set away three points later, as an error from the Terrapins sealed it, 25-22.

Weiskircher opened the third frame in emphatic fashion, hammering down an overpass for the set-starting kill. Lee added her seventh kill two plays later before the two sides came to an early 3-3 tie. A block from Washington and Weiskircher, followed by a sneaky kill from the setter the next play made the score 6-3 in Penn States favor. Penn State took three of the next five points, as kills from Lee and Washington made the score 9-5. Penn State took two of the next three, with a kill from Lee leading to an 11-6 score and pushing the Terrapins to call for a timeout.

Both sides swapped points out of the break before a 3-0 run from the Nittany Lions, capped on an ace from Broerman made the score 16-8. Maryland took three of the next four points before a massive kill from Lee broke up the scoring. The Terrapins erred the next play, calling for time with the score 19-11 for Penn State. At 20-13 Penn State opened up a 3-0 spurt capped by an ace from Washington. Maryland responded with five straight, cutting the lead to five at 23-18. Maryland committed a service error before Weiskircher aced the Terrapins for the win, 25-18.

Frantti scored on the Terrapins with a tricky serve to open the fourth frame. The two sides swapped points early, tying three times with three lead changes, when a kill from Thelen pulled PSU within one at 7-6. Lee hammered a ball off the Maryland block to tie the set at 9-all. The two sides traded blows, tying four more times to get to 13-13. Penn State then opened things up, as a kill from Thelen and a block by Washington and Frantti guided PSU to a 16-13 lead. Maryland then used its first timeout of the set.

Weiskircher scored after a long rally following the timeout. A bad set from Maryland the next play would force a Terrapins timeout as PSU led, 1.8-1.3. Frantti and Lee each posted kills to make the score 20-15 before Frantti hammered down another ball the next play. Weiskircher and Washington stuffed the ball before a big swing from Washington set up match point. An errant serve from Maryland wrapped up the match, as the Nittany Lions won the fourth set, 25-18.

COLUMBUS, Ohio - COLUMBUS, Ohio. - Despite a spectacular offensive performance from junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington, the 10th-ranked Penn State women's volleyball team (19-8, 11-5 Big Ten) split the season series with the Ohio State Buckeyes (17-11, 7-9 Big Ten), falling in a five-set heartbreaker 3-2 (23-25, 25-15, 25-19, 22-25, 16-18) in St. John Arena Saturday evening.

The match came down to the fifth set for the sixth time in 2016, as Ohio State took the opening point. A pair of kills Washington tied the fifth set at 3-3, before the Buckeyes scored on back-to-back plays. A kill from junior outside hitter Simone Lee and an ace from junior setter Abby Detering tied the match at 5-all, before Lee tooled the block the next play for a 6-5 lead. Three plays later senior defensive specialist Laura Broerman aced the Buckeyes defense to take an 8-6 lead into the set five break.

Ohio State pulled within one before a crucial kill from junior right side Heidi Thelen pushed the lead to two. Washington stuffed the Buckeyes next play for a 10-7 lead, prompting a timeout from Ohio State. The Buckeyes came out of the break firing, taking three of the next four points to force a Penn State timeout as the Nittany Lions led 11-10.

Ohio State tied the decisive set at 12-all, when Lee pounded her 17th kill of the match, for a 13-12 lead. The Buckeyes then scored two straight, forcing a Penn State timeout. Lee would extend the match, scoring a pair of kills that would fend off two set points and tie the set 16-16. Ohio State's Luisa Schrimer then scored the final two kills, dropping the Nittany Lions, 18-16.

Washington paced the team's offense with a team-best 19 kills on a scorching-hot. 621 attacking clip, while posting a match-best four blocks. She was joined in double figure scoring by Lee and Thelen, who posted 19 and 11 kills, respectively. Lee tacked on four digs, while Thelen posted a pair of blocks.

Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti posted nine kills and nine digs in the setback. With her fifth kill of the match she surpassed

Detering led the team's setting efforts, dishing 55 assists and leading PSU to a .297 hitting clip. She added a match-best

Freshman libero Kendall White led the team in digs with 23. Sophomore defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb was the only other PSU player to post double-figure digs with 12 in the match.

After Lee opened the match with an electric kill, the two sides tied at 3-all. OSU scored three straight before a kill from Thelen helped pull the set within one at 6-5 for the Buckeyes. Ohio State responded with three straight, leading to a Penn State timeout at 9-5 in the home team's favor. The break worked, as Penn State took five of the next seven points on a pair of kills from Washington and closed the gap to one. Ohio State then rattled off six of the next nine points for a 17-13 lead.

Kills from Lee, Thelen and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell shortened the deficit, making a two-point set score at 18-16 for OSU. Thelen posted her third kill to pull within one, before she and Washington tied the first set at 19-19 with an enormous block. Ohio State followed up the stuff with back-to-back points, causing Penn State's second timeout, behind two at 21-19. Washington answered the call, hammering down a kill on the slide before blocking a ball on the next point for a 21-all tie. Ohio State then called for time. Washington posted another rejection out of the break, before a pair of kills from OSU made the score 23-22 for OSU. Washington struck once more before a kill from the Buckeyes and a Penn State error gave the Ohio State the set one victory, 25-23.

Penn State opened strong in the second set, as an ace from Detering capped an early 4-1 run. A pair of kills from Thelen and another two plays later from Washington opened the Penn State lead to four at 8-4. The Buckeyes responded, puting together a 5-2 spurt to pull within one at 10-9. An ace by Washington and a kill from Lee pelled a 6-1 run to give PSU a 16-10 lead, prompting a Buckeye timeout. Penn State continued to push, with a pair of kills from Lee and an ace by Broerman driving the score to 21-13, forcing OSU's second timeout. Washington and Frantti each posted kills before Ohio State erred for a 25-15 set two win for Penn State.

After an early 3-3 tie, Frantti and Thelen posted back-to-back kills for a 5-3 lead in the third. The two sides traded points to a 10-8 score before a pair of spikes courtesy of Thelen and another from Detering powered a 4-1 run and forced a timeout from Ohio State with a 14-9, Penn State lead. The Buckeyes went on to take four of the next five points, cutting the lead to two, before a kill from Washington made it 16-13. Five plays later, Frantti spiked the ball for her 900th career kill to give Penn State a 19-15 lead. Detering scored on a kill three plays later for the 21-16 advantage, as OSU took its second timeout. Lee would score a pair of kills before a score from Frantti closed out the third, 25-19.

A pair of kills from Lee and a hammer from Detering gave Penn State a 4-2 edge to open the fourth frame. The two sides then traded points, as Thelen's ninth kill gave PSU a 7-5 lead. Ohio State rattled off a 5-1 run to tie the match at 11-all, before a Detering ace and a block by Lee and Gorrell made the score 13-11. Thelen broke up a 3-1 OSU run with a kill, giving Penn State a 15-14 advantage. Washington rocketed the ball down for her 15th kill of the night to make the score 17-15, pushing Ohio State to use a timeout. Another kill from Washington kept the gap at two, 19-17, before three straight points from the Buckeyes forced Penn State to call for time. A kill from Gorrell tied the set at 20-20 before a pair of scores from Ohio State led to Penn State's second timeout. The Buckeyes earned set point, before an OSU attack error closed the gap to two, 24-22. Ohio State would score next play to push the match to the decisive fifth set.

Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti led the way for Penn State, logging seven kills in the outing, while classmates Haleigh Washington and Simone Lee posted six apiece.

The back row defense was highlighted once again by standout play from freshman Kendall White at libero. The Indianapolis, Indiana native posted a match-high 18 digs and was the lone Penn State player to log double-figures in the statistical category.

Junior right side Heidi Thelen started the match with an emphatic kill. The two sides swapped point-for-point, tying six times to a knot the score at 6-all. The Huskers then opened a 3-0 run, prompting the Nittany Lions to use their first timeout. Out of the break Penn State forged a 4-1 run on an ace from Detering, a kill by Thelen and a block courtesy of Washington and Frantti to tie the match at 10-10. UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 15 Penn State women's volleyball team (20-9, 12-6 Big Ten) earned the win in the first of its last three regular season home matches on Saturday evening, dispatching the Purdue Boilermakers (17-12, 7-11 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-17, 25-21, 25-19), in front of 3,560 fans inside Rec Hall.

Penn State flipped the script from Wednesday's match, hitting with tremendous accuracy during the sweep. The Blue and White logged 50 kills, the most in a three-set match this season, on an impressive .386 clip, with three Nittany Lions hitting in double-figures.

The outside hitters were tough for the Boilermakers to stop, as juniors Simone Lee and Ali Frantti led the Penn State offense with 14 kills apiece. Frantti charted the kills while logging a .583 hitting percentage and finishing second the team in digs with eight. She also received the majority of Purdue's serves. Lee added five digs.

Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell was simply sensational, posting 11 kills in the outing on a red-hot .733 hitting. She also posted a team-best five blocks in the match. Junior right side Heidi Thelen posted three kills and four blocks.

Junior setter Abby Detering guided the setting efforts with 41 assists. She added three kills of her own.

Freshman libero Kendall White was impressive once again on the back row, logging a match-high 12 digs.

After opening the match on the wrong end of a 3-1 run, Penn State responded, as kills from Lee and Gorrell paced a staggering 8-1 run for the Nittany Lions, forcing the first Purdue timeout with a 9-4 lead. Purdue tacked on two points before another set of kills from Gorrell, Detering and Frantti pushed Penn State to a 13-7 lead. Gorrell's fifth kill on six swings made the score 17-10, forcing the Boilermakers' second timeout.

Lee scored kills on two of the next three plays. A block from Thelen and Gorrell gave Penn State a 20-13 advantage. Washington, Frantti and Detering pounded the ball to take a 23-15 lead before least three advantages. 15 lead, before Lee thumped home the set-winning kill for a 25-17 victory.

The two sides traded point-for-point in the second, as kills from Lee, Frantti and Washington knotted the match, 11-11. PSU turned the tide, taking a lead that would hold with a 3-0 run. At 14-11 Purdue called for a timeout. Penn State took the next three points out of the break to widen the gap to six at 17-11. PSU continued to hold Purdue back before the Boilermakers pulled within one at 22-21. Thelen thumped the ball before back-to-back kill from Frantti led Penn State into the locker with a two-game lead.

Penn State began the third behind before coming back to the set at 7-7 on an error from the Boilermakers. A pair of kills from Lee and Frantti, followed by a block from Detering and Gorrell led Purdue to call for time as PSU led, 11-7.

Gorrell pounded the ball out of the break before Penn State extended the lead to six. Purdue closed the gap to three at 15-12 before a 3-0 spurt, punctuated by another kill from Gorrell gave PSU an 18-12 lead. Purdue called for time. Penn State led by as many as eight before Purdue pulled within four points at 23-19. Lee thundered down the ball before a Purdue error ended the set, and the match, 25-19.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Behind a combined 20 kills from its junior outside hitters Ali Frantti and Simone Lee, No. 15 Penn State (21-9, 13-6 Big Ten) earned the season sweep of Northwestern on Friday night with a 3-0 (25-23, 25-23, 25-16) victory over the Northwestern Wildcats in front of a crowd of 3,657 inside Rec Hall.

The duo of Frantti and Lee were impressive, hitting a collective .361 and accounting for 20 of Penn State's kills. Frantti led the team with 11 hammers, doing so for the sixth time in 2016. Lee, who totaled nine kills in the match, moved to fifth all-time in single season kills during the 25-point rally scoring era, with 435 total in 2016. Frantti had five digs, while Lee added four of her own.

Penn State hit at a blistering .379 clip in the match. Junior setter Abby Detering guided the offense with 34 assists, seven digs, and four kills of her own. She also boasted an impressive night from the service line, tying her career-high four aces.

Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington finished third on the team in kills, posting eight on .538 hitting. She added three blocks, good for second on the team. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell tacked on six kills and a trio of blocks as well. Junior opposite Heidi Thelen added five kills and a team-best four blocks.

Four Nittany Lions posted seven digs to lead the team. In addition to Detering, freshman libero Kendall White, sophomore defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb and junior defensive specialist Lainy Pierce all finished the night with seven digs. Pierce's performance was good for a new career high.

PSU and Northwestern both jockeyed for position early, with neither team really taking control in the early going A 4-2 run in the Wildcats' favor made the score 16-12, when Penn State used its first timeout. Out of the break, PSU scored four of the next five points, with kills from Frantti, Lee and Washington forcing NU's second timeout as the Wildcats led, 17-16. The break didn't faze Penn State, as Detering tallied a kill the next play and Washington posted a service ace for an 18-17 lead, forcing the Wildcats' second timeout. Northwestern tied the set out of the break before taking a brief lead. Gorrell and Lee posted consecutive kills, and Northwestern would never lead the set again. NU fended off one set point before Frantti sealed the deal with a kill, 25-23.

Northwestern proved tricky again in the second set, as a tough block from the Wildcats helped lead the visitor to a 9-4 lead. Penn State called for time and rallied, stringing together an impressive 7-3 run, capped by a kill from Frantti to close the gap to one at 12-11. Northwestern called its first timeout, and found its footing before a 5-0 Nittany Lion run gave PSU a 17-16 lead. The teams tied six times afterwards, the last coming at 22-22. A kill from Gorrell gave Penn State the lead that would hold, before a pair of kills from Frantti closed the second, 25-23.

Penn State rolled out of the gate in the third, with a 4-1 burst to start the frame. Northwestern called for its first timeout, but would never lead the set again. Kills from Lee, Detering and Gorrell opened the gap to four at 13-9, leading to the second Wildcat timeout. Out of the break, Penn State took four of the next six points, with a pair coming on combo blocks by Thelen and Gorrell. Senior defensive specialist Laura Broerman served the final three points, as a kill from Lee and a handling error from Northwestern concluded the final frame, 25-16.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 15 Penn State volleyball team (22-9, 14-6 Big Ten), took down the Illinois Fighting Illini in its regular season finale, 3-1 (25-18, 26-24, 19-25, 25-21) on Saturday evening inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall.

Four Nittany Lions scored in double figures during the contest, with junior outside hitter Simone Lee leading the group once again. The Menemonee Falls, Wis., native led the squad with 20 kills while adding five digs.

Fellow outside hitter Ali Frantti posted 16 kills, seven digs, three assists, a pair of blocks and ace in the contest. Classmates Haleigh Washington and Heidi Thelen posted 10 kill each. Washington had four digs, a block and an ace, while Thelen posted a team-best two blocks.

Junior setter Abby Detering led the team's offensive efforts, dishing 57 assists for a team hitting percentage of .329. She added seven digs, a pair of aces, and four kills.

Once again, freshman libero Kendall White led the back row defense, posting 16 kills in the outing.

Penn State commanded the first set, cruising to a 9-2 lead and the team never looked back. Lee and Thelen posted four kills each while Washington and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell each had three as PSU posted a .375 hitting percentage in the opening frame. The Nittany Lions also scored on the three aces in the first set of action, as the final one came from Detering to make the score 24-16. Illinois fended off a pair of set points before Thelen's fourth kill sealed it, 25-18.

The second set went back and forth, with the teams tying 19 times and the lead changing six times in the second frame. After tying at 19-19, Penn State pulled ahead twice, forcing Illinois timeouts at 21-19 and 23-20. After the second Illini break, Illinois tied the match at 24-all. After a Penn State timeout, back-to-back kills from Lee and Thelen sent PSU into the locker room up 2-0.

PSU struggled in the third set, with 12 total errors between attacking and the service line costing the team. Lee posted a set-best five kills in the third frame, but Illinois played a clean set to earn the 25-19 victory.

Penn State had to dig itself out of a 4-1 hole in the early going in the fourth, but kills from Washington, Lee and Frantti powered Penn State to a 7-7 tie. The two sides tied six more times before back-to-back kills from Lee and Washington again made it a 15-13 PSU edge. Illinois called for time. Lee tacked on three more hammers for a 19-16 lead, forcing the second Illinois timeout. The Illini came within one before Penn State used a 5-2 run at the end the final set, with Washington's 10th kill making the final set score 25-21.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The 16-seed Penn State women's volleyball team (23-9) breezed through the opening round of the NCAA tournament, taking down LIU Brooklyn (16-15) in straight sets, 3-0 (25-8, 25-16, 25-6), inside Rec Hall on Friday evening.

With the sweep of the Blackbirds, Penn State has now swept its opening round opponent for 27 consecutive seasons, not surrendering a single set in the first round of the post-season since 1989.

The Nittany Lions hit a blistering .403 in the match, committing just seven errors in the entire match. The team saw four players score five or more kills, with junior Simone Lee leading the way with 12. Junior opposite Heidi Thelen added eight on .500 hitting, while junior Ali Frantti and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell added five apiece.

Following her 12 kills, Lee will likely climb the single-season kills leaderboard during the 25-point rally scoring era tomorrow night, needing just two to tie for fourth, three to tie for third, and four kills to hold sole possession third in the standings.

Lee also added five blocks, tying her career best.

Penn State out-blocked the Blackbirds 10.5-2.0 in the match, with four players posting multi-block outings. Outside of Lee's performance, Gorrell and junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington added three rejections each. Thelen tagged on a pair as well.

Setter Abby Detering led the offense, posting a match-high 28 assists and 10 digs for her sixth double-double of the season and her career. Detering led seven different players to score in the match and tacked on a match-best three aces.

Freshman libero Kendall White had a strong performance in her NCAA tournament debut, leading the back line defense with 18 digs and added an ace.

15 total Penn State players made appearances in the match. Outside hitter Clare Powers made an appearance in the third set, finishing with a .600 hitting percentage, good for second among hitters on the team, scoring three kills on her five attempts.

Penn State was dominant throughout, scoring 11-straight after allowing a kill from LIU in the first point of the match. A block from Washington made the score 16-3 in the first, forcing LIU to use its second timeout. Penn State allowed just five more points in the set as Thelen, Lee, Detering and Washington all scored en route to the 25-8 victory.

Lee and Frantti shone in the second set, combining for seven kill on a combined .333 hitting percentage. Following a 15-8 Penn State lead at the media timeout, the two side battled back and forth before back-to-back kills from Frantti and Lee gave Penn State a 19-13 advantage and led to LIU's first timeout. The Nittany Lions kept the lead at six, trading points until LIU called for time again six points later, trialing 22-16. A pair of Blackbird errors and a block from Gorrell, Lee and redshirt sophomore Nia Reed capped the second, 25-16.

Penn State rolled in the third set, scoring 13-straight points to open the frame, with three kills from Lee, two from Thelen, and a pair of aces from Detering to cap the run. Back-to-back kills from Powers made the lead 17-3, leading to LIU's lone timeout in the third. The Blackbirds scored three more times, as a kill from Reed and a final score from Lee sent PSU to the second round with a 25-6 set three victory.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The 16-seed Penn State women's volleyball team (24-9) knocked off the Pitt Panthers (25-9) on Saturday evening inside Rec Hall, 3-1 (20-25, 25-16, 25-13, 25-18), to advance to its 13th straight NCAA Regional appearance.

Penn State rallied after dropping the first set behind a strong blocking performance at the net. Penn State posted 13.0 blocks to Pitt's 5.5, with five players tallying multiple rejections to help account for the steep margin. The block also helped to force 28 errors from the Panthers.

PSU also had another strong showing on the offensive end, as the team hit at an impressive .321 clip while seeing a trio of Nittany Lions reach double figures in the kill column. It marked the 22nd match in 2016 where Penn State hit .300 or better, with PSU owning a 21-1 record while hitting the efficiency benchmark.

Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington had a standout performance, logging team bests in both kills (14) and blocks (six). She added a dig and an assist.

Classmate Simone Lee tied Washington's team-best kills output and came a dig shy of her fourth career double-double with nine. She tacked on a pair of blocks as well.

Fellow outside Ali Frantti posted 11 kills to round out the players finishing with double-figure kills.

Abby Detering guided the offense, posting 42 assists while adding four blocks. She tacked on two aces to lead the team and put up five kills.

Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell logged eight kills on .500 hitting and posted five rejections, while true freshman libero Kendall White put up 18 digs in her second NCAA appearance and added six assists.

After dropping the first set 25-20, the Nittany Lions opened the second on a 6-3 tear, powered by a pair of kills and an ace from Lee. A pair of kills from Frantti and one from Detering extended Penn State's lead to 12-7, forcing Pitt's first timeout.

Pitt pulled within four at 13-9 before PSU went on a 4-1 run in which Lee and Detering added kills. Pitt called for time, trailing by seven at 17-10. Penn State continued to plug away at the Panthers, as Washington capped a 5-2 spurt with a pair of kills to take a 22-12 lead. Pitt scored four more times before a final kill from Washington won the second set, 25-16.

PSU was dominant in the third, posting 7.0 blocks total in the frame. Penn State had a pair of rejections in the first seven points, as Gorrell and Lee paired up for one to cap a 6-1 run. Pitt called for time, but PSU pushed the lead to seven on a pair of strikes from Washington, making the score 12-5. Pitt used its second timeout.

Penn State took three of the next four points out of the break before a block from Thelen and Gorrell and an error by Pitt made the gap 10 at 19-9. Gorrell added a pair of strikes before a rejection from Washington and Detering made it 23-12. Three plays later a spike from Washington sealed the third, 25-13.

The Nittany Lions looked to take care of business in the fourth frame, opening on a 9-5 tear, thanks to kills from Lee, Gorrell and Frantti and a solo block from Detering. Pitt called for time, but PSU responded with three straight points, as Washington slammed down back-to-back kills before a Panthers error. A strike from Frantti made it 13-6 before Pitt made a 3-0 run. Penn State would lead by as much as six, as Frantti thundered down her 11th kill to make the score 20-14. Pitt followed the score with two of their own. Penn State called its first timeout of the fourth set.

Penn State closed out the match on a 5-2 run, with a slam from Gorrell punching Penn State's ticket to the Regional round for a 25-18 fourth set victory.

PENN STATE WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL DROPS PITT IN FOUR SETS IN NCAA SECOND ROUND

For one set, an upset was brewing, the Penn State women's volleyball team looked vulnerable.

But just for a set.

Then the program that has the most NCAA titles in Division I got its game together.

Behind a balanced offensive attack, the 16th-seeded Nittany Lions overcame a sluggish start to drop Pittsburgh 20-25, 25-16, 25-13, 25-18 Saturday night at Rec Hall in the NCAA second round.

"We're excited about the opportunity to advance and play another weekend," head coach Russ Rose said after his team reached the third round for the 14th straight season and 22nd time overall.

"It was pretty intense out there," said Ali Frantti, who posted 11 kills. "Pitt gave us a good run."

Penn State (24-9) will get a rematch with No. 1 seed Nebraska in the regional semifinals Friday. The defending champion Cornhuskers, who won the Big Ten regular-season title and both meetings with the Nittany Lions this year, swept Texas Christian in their match Saturday.

The Nittany Lion offense was paced by 14 kills each from Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington, with Tori Gorrell adding eight. Abby Detering directed the offense to a .321 hitting effort with her 42 assists.

"It's just like any other game, except for just a little bit more pressure," said Kendall White, who led the team with 18 digs. "A little bit more pressure helps us play better because we know that was our last game in Rec Hall ... for this season."

The Nittany Lions had a huge blocking effort to key the defense, winning the battle 13-5.5. It was led by Washington's six, Gorrell's five and four each for Detering and Heidi Thelen. Pitt (25-9) was led by 14 kills apiece for Stephanie Williams and Nika Markovic, 15 digs from Angela Seman, five blocks from Jenna Potts and 38 assists for Kamalani Akeo. The Panthers hit .147.

Pitt raced to a big 9-3 lead to start the match and never let Penn State draw closer than two. The Panthers hit .567 in the set, making just one unforced hitting error.

"I wasn't feeling confident after the first set because I know how good of a team (Penn State) is," Panthers coach Dan Fisher said. "I definitely think playing a hard-fought match (Friday)

night (3-1 over Dayton) helped us come out the way we did in the first set. I've been around the sport enough to know it takes a lot to beat Penn State."

The Nittany Lions bounced back in the second, also making just one unforced hitting error, then posted a 7-1 advantage in stuffs in the third and forced the Panthers into hitting minus-.214.

"Start of the first (set) we were all a little bit high on our block," Washington said. "We came out of that halfway point, we made the adjustment to be a lot lower because Pitt's contact point is low and very strong and very aggressive. If we could bring the contact point down on our blocks, and make sure we're low and over, that was the big adjustment that we made."

The Nittany Lions got more of the same in the fourth set, racing to a 12-5 advantage to cruise. They got to celebrate the win after a quick set to Gorrell in the middle found the floor for a kill.

"We didn't go crazy with losing the first game," Rose said. "Pitt's good. It's hard to win 3-0 all the time."

PENN STATE WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL LOOKING TO WRITE NEW CHAPTER ON SEASON IN NCAAS

There's nothing like setting an impossibly high standard for your program.

The Penn State women's volleyball team was in the rankings all season, will have a couple athletes figuring to make All-American lists and was contending most of the season in the Big Ten.

But losing nine matches — and not being considered one of the favorites to win yet another national championship — drew plenty of concern.

When you have seven national championships on your resume, including six in the last decade, so much is expected.

"We finished fourth (in the Big Ten) and a lot of people were terribly disappointed," head coach Russ Rose said earlier this week. "We had to battle. We had to battle to finish fourth. The players know that they can play at a high level. A lot of the success rests in how they're mentally prepared and rested and how they handle the challenges that other teams have."

The slate is wiped clean and challenge No. 1 comes Friday night.

The Nittany Lions (22-9), seeded 16th for the NCAA tournament, hosts Long Island University-Brooklyn in the first round

at 7:30 p.m. at Rec Hall. Dayton and Pittsburgh meet in the first match at 5 p.m. The winners battle at 6:30 p.m. Saturday.

It's difficult not to compare teams and expect so much, with banners hanging in the rafters and celebration pictures clinging to Rec Hall walls, not that Rose ever likes to worry about past accomplishments beyond knowing there are seven trophies in his office.

"I don't remember last year's run," Rose joked when asked to compare things to his very first NCAA tournament team 36 years ago.

But having such high-quality success in the recent past makes it easy to expect a lot, especially with several current Lions on the last title team in 2014. Should fans think there should be undefeated seasons and six All-Americans in the starting lineup? Maybe not, although Rose wouldn't mind a roster filled with that level of talent every season.

"It's tough for the people that were big fans then," Rose said. "They think, 'My God, you guys have just fallen on incredibly hard times.'"

To raise an eighth banner, the Nittany Lions will have to do a lot of things right.

They will have to play sound defense, get good passing to setter Abby Detering and she will have to make some good decisions where to feed the ball. They also will have to put a lot of pressure on opponents with their serve game, and all of that will have to be done consistently — which is the biggest expectation of them all.

"We've made progress in a lot of areas," Rose said. "I wouldn't say we're a finely tuned machine in any area."

FRANTTI LEADS NITTANY LIONS TO 20TH WIN OF THE SEASON

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Ali Frantti played arguably her best match of the season to help the Nittany Lions to their 20th win of the season, as Penn State topped Purdue in three sets to complete the season sweep of the Boilermakers.

Frantti led all players with 14 kills on 24 error-free swings, doing so in emphatic fashion, with one of the more efficient performances of the season, finishing with a .583 hitting percentage. Frantti was joined by Nittany Lion Simone Lee, who also finished with 14 kills to tie the match-high mark.

The Nittany Lions put down 50 team kills in the victory, marking the most in a three set match so far this season. Penn State also accumulated a .386 team hitting percentage, thanks largely in part to the errorless play of Frantti.

"I thought we passed really well, so we were able to run a three option pass," Frantti said. "Our middles were able to hold the block very well tonight so that gave me some room to take a few good swings."

Frantti was errorless on the attack for the first time since the first match of Big Ten play against Rutgers. For the fifth time this season, Frantti led the team in kills, but maybe more importantly, it came in the later portion of the season as Penn State is just two games away from the end of the regular season. Not only was the win convincing, but more importantly for the Nittany Lions, it answered a disappointing showing at Nebraska just a few nights earlier.

"It was huge for us," Frantti said. "It was a great answer and momentum changer heading in to the last part of our regular season and then the postseason."

Though Frantti led the charge, she was not the only Nittany Lion to help Penn State to its 40th 20-win season in program history.

As mentioned, Lee was also an offensive force for Penn State, but Tori Gorrell had a perfect night too, posting 11 kills with no errors on a match-high .733 hitting efficiency. In terms of a team victory, Penn State put together one of its most balanced performances to date in Big Ten play, a sign that good things could be on the horizon for the Nittany Lions come NCAA Tournament time.

The Nittany Lions are set to close out their season with two more Midwestern opponents, as they welcome Northwestern and Illinois for a Friday, Saturday series this weekend. The Nittany Lions swept past the Wildcats on the road near the end of September, but will host the Illini in the only meeting of the season on Senior Night Saturday at Rec Hall.

THELEN ADJUSTING TO NEW ROLE

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Junior Heidi Thelen has been a middle blocker throughout her entire volleyball career, which began in seventh grade.

However, since the beginning of this season, that's no longer the case.

Thelen changed positions and is now a right-side hitter for the Nittany Lions.

"It's a good move for her," head coach Russ Rose said.
"There are times where I think we'd be better if we had Heidi in the middle because of her ability to block, but having to put the team together with the roster that we had, I thought that that was the move what could still incorporate her hitting

off one foot and two feet, and I think she's done well. Some of the matches that we've played really well are the matches she's played well in."

This season, Thelen has already recorded 148 kills, averaging 1.74 kills per set, with a hitting percentage of .281. She's also notched 66 total blocks for the season, which is third-best for the team. One of her most notable matches this season came when then-No.14 Penn State defeated then-No.1 Minnesota in five sets at home in Rec Hall. During that match, she tied for second-best with 14 kills on .367 hitting.

Most recently, in the five-set thriller against No.1 Nebraska last Friday evening at Rec Hall, Thelen recorded five kills and four blocks. The following match against lowa, Thelen brought out four strong kills, hitting at a .333 clip, while also recording two blocks.

"I thought she would be a better combination over on the right," coach Rose said. "She's a good block, so I think she's transitioned from a position to another position that's slightly similar very well...she's done a nice job."

Middle blockers are constantly on their toes. They always have to be ready to hit, or build a block and stop the opposing middle hitter. On the other hand, the right side hitter is usually a jack-of-all trades, as they are play in both the front and back row. The skillsets between the two are a bit different, but Thelen has been adjusting well to it.

"[The hardest thing] is probably timing with hitting because for middle blockers, you have to be up in the air quick, so sometimes, I'm leaving too early or before Abby sets the ball, so timing has been the biggest part," Thelen said. "We needed someone on the right side and having two quick hitters, me and Tori, at the same time, we can run slides and run cross-plays. I think I'm a decent blocker, so having the right-side block against the left side hitters, who gets set the most, that's an advantage."

But Thelen isn't going through the transition alone, her teammates are helping her along the way.

"My teammates talk to me a lot," Thelen said. "Abby and I go into the gym early a lot just to work on timing. Kendall [White] is really good about telling me what I should be doing on my block, so I like hearing the players, like if I'm giving too much line or other things."

Throughout the changes, Thelen has continued to make a big impact for the Nittany Lions. In the matchup with then-No.3 Minnesota, Thelen logged six kills, hitting .333, while recording two blocks and two digs. Against then-No.4 Wisconsin, she had five kills on .267 hitting percentage and three blocks.

"I like [the right side]," Thelen said. "[The transition] has been tough. I've been a middle my entire life and now, timing is different, blocking is different, so I've had to work on it a lot,

but I like it," Thelen said.

With only six more matches this season, including a threegame road swing beginning with trips to Maryland and Ohio State this weekend, there is still ample amount of time to continue to learn more skills.

"Heidi has a great attitude, works hard and wants to be good," coach Rose said. "She always says, 'say it to me,' which is what I like, that she always identifies that I should be direct with her, tell her the good and the bad equally and not feel like I have to beat around the bush with her. I think that's good. She keeps learning. We play against these really good teams, she sees areas where she needs improvement, and that's part of the process of development for players as well as teams."

HALEIGH WASHINGTON - EXCELLENCE IN EFFICIENCY

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Across the more than two seasons Haleigh Washington has been on the Penn State women's volleyball team, she has been one of the most efficient middles in the country. At a position that demands efficiency, Washington excels at making the most of the opportunities given. Her stats, a career .453 hitting percentage and multiple national accolades speak for themselves, but Washington's play is so much more than just the numbers.

Washington's freshman year was filled with success. She was a unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection. She garnered Big Ten Freshman of the Year recognition and along with that, she was a vital part of Penn State's national championship season. As a sophomore, Washington finished third in the nation in hitting percentage, was a unanimous All-Big Ten selection and also an AVCA First Team All-American. This season, the third of Washington's incredible career, she is once again in line for numerous accolades and paces the Nittany Lions with a .463 hitting percentage, which is third best in the nation. Her stats speak for themselves, but Washington's play is still so much more than just the numbers.

Washington is regarded as a fan favorite on the team. She often receives the loudest cheers during home matches and can be found giving high fives to the entirety of the Rec Hall pep band after matches. For the amount of attention and praise Washington receives, her ability to stay humble and her passion to continuously improve are possibly the most impressive attributes about her. If you ask Washington, she has been good, but she can be so much better.

"I think I got a little bit lucky my freshman season," Washington said. "I just went out there and played volleyball and didn't really 'think the game.' My last season and this one also, I feel like I've been able to "think the game" much better and know when to hit what shots. But even with that there are

some things that I still want to improve on.

Washington credits her ability to "think the game" to much of the success she has had on the court. In both hitting percentage and blocking, Washington is among the nation's elite. However, if you ask the Penn State middle blocker, she doesn't necessarily consider herself one of the most physically dominant players.

"I think there a good amount of middles who are more athletic and who hit harder than me," Washington said. "I've really learned to take what the block is giving me and use that to my advantage. I don't hit the ball nearly as hard as someone like Simone [Lee] so I have to get kills a different way.

Though Washington may not see herself as a top middle in the nation, nearly everyone else, including Penn State associate head coach Salima Rockwell, see Washington as one of the best at her position.

"I think what makes Haleigh so good is not just how smart she is but also her energy," Rockwell said. "You see it on the court when she takes a big swing and you see it in the huddle and even when she comes in for something like film, she always has a great energy about her."

Washington's energy has translated to great success on the court as she is one of the most efficient players in the nation. She also has transformed herself into one of the premier defenders at the net. Coming into college, Washington said her blocking was a big part of her game she wanted to improve on.

"She admittedly was not great at blocking coming in to college," Rockwell said. "But she has improved so much. She moves better laterally. I think she reads the game much better now as well and she gets up and over the net quicker too. That's definitely something she has really improved on."

The transition to college and into one of the nation's best middle blockers has been challenging for Washington. However, this season she is facing what she says might be one of the biggest challenges yet, becoming one of the vocal leaders on court leaders.

"With this year's team, it's not just me playing volleyball," Washington said. "It's me having responsibilities and being a leader and making sure that I'm always doing my job to help the team."

Rockwell also acknowledged the transition for Washington and says that she has done a tremendous job stepping in to the newer role.

"She's trying to figure out how to manage the team and what to say when," Rockwell said. "She's great at saying the right thing and she's getting even better at that when she has to

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - After notching two conference victories on the road at Purdue and Indiana, the Nittany Lions return home to Rec Hall to welcome No. 19 Ohio State on Wednesday evening.

But this matchup isn't a typical match as the Nittany Lions won't be seeing fans in blue and white. Instead, the evening will represent something bigger with pink being featured throughout the stands.

Penn State and the Side-Out Foundation will host its annual "Dig Pink" match for the seventh consecutive year in support of breast cancer research.

"It's just great that people want to participate and contribute to the cause," head coach Russ Rose said. "I think it's great for everybody affiliated with Penn State. I know they have a big program here with basketball, and this is something different that has been in play for a couple of years. We've been involved in it since the first year it started and I hope it continues long after I'm gone."

'Side-out' in volleyball means a team is regaining control of the ball, and that's what the Side-Out Foundation is all about. It's a support and advocacy organization that unites volleyball players and coaches to have them work toward the common goal of furthering breast cancer awareness, education and patient services. Millions of dollars have been raised, which goes towards high-quality support services for cancer patients, their families and scholarships for young students to motivate them to continue achieving their dreams, all while developing treatments so a cure is discovered in the near future.

Having hosted an annual event in Rec Hall in each of the last seven years, Penn State's 2015 campaign once again generated nearly \$4,000 for the Side-Out Foundation, to match a record number, which was originally set in 2014. "Breast cancer reaches and touches lots of people, and anything we can do to raise awareness and funding to help with the various programs and trials that are in play to help the people in the future, we should all be honored to be part of that," coach Rose said.

The match will also hit home for some of the student-athletes, like freshman libero Kendall White.

"I think it's a huge deal," White said. "My grandma is a survivor of breast cancer so it means a lot to me having all the girls support it, having all the fans come in and auction

off our warmup jerseys. It's amazing to be raising money. It's a really great cause and I love it so much that I get to be part of it."

At the match, the Nittany Lions will host a silent auction to bid for the pregame Dig Pink warmup jerseys where proceeds will go directly toward Penn State's "Dig Pink" profile. There will also be free pink shakers, with the first 200 students in attendance receiving free pizza, Dig Pink shirts and pink wRECking crew hard hats.

"Pink is my favorite color, so I think it will be amazing going out there with the team [and seeing all the pink]," White said. "We're just going to come out fighting hard. It's a big game, so I hope it's like every game where the fans come in and cheer us on."

Penn State's Dig Pink event comes at just the right time for the Nittany Lions, who recently returned home from the road, with visits to Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota all looming the future after the mid-week against the Buckeyes at Rec Hall.

"It's a huge deal to have this break in the road trips," White said. "Playing at home is one of our favorite things to do because all of our fans are here. Everyone is supporting us and we are surrounded by people who love volleyball almost as much as we do. Going out and playing here before we go on the road next weekend against bigger teams we have to play is a huge momentum push as we go in."

Penn State enters Wednesday's matchup against the Buckeyes on a 14-match winning streak. After opening the season at 2-3, the Nittany Lions have regrouped to remain undefeated in Big Ten conference play at 8-0.

"What's been clicking with the team is just our chemistry," White said. "More than anything, not even volleyball-related, it's just us. As a team, we've been clicking a lot better. We've been communicating better on and off the court and just fighting. It's our heart and our fight playing into our game."

The Lions hope to match the tenancy and determination of the Side-Out Foundation. When asked what they're goal was for Wednesday evening, White responded with one word.

"Win. That's what we plan on doing."

WITH A KILLER ARM AND A READY SMILE, SIMONE LEE HAS AN UPLIFTING EFFECT AT PENN STATE

Thirty kills, one player -- and her name is Simone Lee.

One of the most dominant hitters in the Big Ten, Lee set a

Penn State record with that mark, recording the most kills in the 25-point rally-scoring era a week ago. More importantly, Lee's effort spearheaded the Nittany Lions' five-set victory over Minnesota, which went into State College as the top team in the nation.

Maybe it was payback for last November when Minnesota swept Penn State while the Nittany Lions were No. 1.

"Winning this match gives us a lot of momentum and helps show us we can do anything as long as we stick together and grind it out," said Lee, the espnW volleyball player of the week. "As long as we do it as a team, we're going to win tough matches."

Penn State improved from No. 15 to 10 in this week's American Volleyball Coaches Association poll and knocked Minnesota from No. 1 to 3.

The Nittany Lions trailed the Golden Gophers 11-3 to open the match, and Lee recalled an intense look from setter Abby Detering that got her pumped. "We are not losing this set," Detering insisted, and Penn State rallied for a 29-27 win.

"Something clicked in all of us," Lee said. "We don't spend hours and hours in the gym, we don't get in extra reps and do all the extra things that are necessary to be in a situation like that and lose."

Sets two and three went to Minnesota, but Lee said she wasn't remotely discouraged.

"It was crazy," she said. "We knew we had more in the tank, and even though we lost those two, we had enough momentum to carry us through the fourth and the fifth sets."

Penn State closed out the fourth 25-14 despite Minnesota starting out 7-2; the Nittany Lions hit nearly .600 in the fifth to win 15-10. Fittingly, a Lee kill closed it out.

Lee, also the Big Ten's offensive player of the week, added six digs and two blocks, hitting at a .333 clip. Her 4.20 kills per set leads the Big Ten, and the 30 kills are the most by any conference player this season. She added 11 more in a sweep of Rutgers on Saturday.

"She's been our top player through the first 15 matches," coach Russ Rose said about Lee.

The Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, native has been patient at Penn State, seeing spot duty as a freshman and starting 18 of the team's 30 matches as a sophomore. With the graduation of elite players Megan Courtney and Aiyana Whitney, the 6-foot-1 junior outside hitter knew this season was her time.

"There's so many great players on this team," Lee said. "I just want to be another one. I want to be a teammate they can

rely on in crunch time. "

Rose said Lee's greatest strength has been her ability to remain calm in times of turmoil -- and a refreshing attitude that leads to regular smiles and winks in the huddle, no matter the stakes.

A six-rotation player, Lee said she never dreamed she'd be a name, let alone a starter, on the Penn State roster. She played basketball first and didn't consider volleyball until her sister's club team needed a tall player to sub in. She was 13 at the time.

She enjoyed it immediately and thought she had a better opportunity of playing volleyball in college than basketball. The 2013 Wisconsin Gatorade Player of the Year is a natural leader and excelled in the academic decathlon as a high school junior.

Lee was one of nine students on a team that competed statewide in eight different categories ranging from art to math to science to music, all specific to the Roaring Twenties.

"I loved it because I love any kind of public speaking," said Lee, who is majoring in broadcast journalism and minoring in African American studies.

Lee isn't shy about being vocal on the floor, either. She's brought energy no matter the record or the predicament this season. When Penn State (14-3) dropped three of its first five matches, she became more intense about correcting the mistakes that can sink a team in volleyball's top conference.

It is dedication that has paid off, as the Nittany Lions have rebounded to win 12 straight behind the Big Ten's top offense. At 6-0, they sit atop the conference alongside top-ranked Wisconsin.

"We're going to do great things," Lee said. "We're meshing so well. We're eating right, we're sleeping all the time, we're doing all the necessary things on and off the court to have a successful season, and I think we'll have one."

LEE, DETERING LIFT PENN STATE PAST NO. 1 GOPHERS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - It was a record-setting night in Rec Hall. More importantly for the No. 15 Nittany Lions, it was arguably their biggest win of the season. Penn State toppled the No. 1 ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers in a five set thriller, battling back from multiple deficits, including a 2-1 hole to take the match (29-27, 21-25, 23-25, 25-14, 15-10).

"We played pretty well tonight, our fans helped out a lot," head coach Russ Rose said. "The crowd and the band played a big part. When you hit .588 in the fifth set against the number one team in the nation you have to feel pretty good."

Two Nittany Lions also produced record-setting performances to help lead Penn State past the Golden Gophers. Simone Lee totaled 30 kills, the most for a Nittany Lion since in the 25-point rally scoring era. Lee, who has led the offense all season for Penn State, took her game to a new level when the team needed it. Not only did Lee collect 30 kills, but she also hit .333, an impressive hitting percentage for the amount of swings the junior outside took.

"I thought that Simone was really good offensively tonight for us," Rose said. "She has been all season and continued to be tonight."

Lee proved key from the very start of the match, as she guided Penn State to a crucial win the in first set with five of the final six Nittany Lion kills, breaking open a tied score, 24-24, to lift PSU to a 29-27 win in the opening frame. She came through again in the clutch during the decisive fifth set, leading the team with four kills on six swings, opening and closing the final frame with a pair of kills.

Along with Lee, Abby Detering set the Nittany Lions better than she ever has before in the Blue and White. Detering collected a double-double with 10 digs and 61 assists. Her tally is good for third best all-time for the Nittany Lions during the 25-point rally scoring era as well. Detering also totaled five kills and three service aces, producing in all areas for a focused and determined Penn State team.

"The setting was great," Lee said. "Abby was great all night and I was set up very well with perfect sets and a lot of single blocks, my team made it very easy on me."

Lee and Detering's record-setting performances were certainly the highlights of a tremendous Wednesday night, but at the same time, Lee and Rose credited the entire team with a fantastic effort throughout the five-setter.

"Ali [Frantti] had a big block for us, Heidi [Thelen] had some really good moments also," said Rose. "I just thought it was a really good team win for us against a really good program."

Though the team did play exceptionally, it would be remiss to fail to highlight the performance of Lee. She now has more than 200 kills for the Nittany Lions on the season and has proven to be an extremely consistent and dynamic offensive option. No match was quite as hypnotizing as the record setting one put forth on Wednesday as Lee surpassed the totals of former Nittany Lion Ariel Scott, who put down 27 kills in a five set match back in October of 2011. In total, Lee is the first Nittany Lion to reach the 30-kill plateau in single match since former Nittany Lion Nicole Fawcett had 31 kills against Cal Poly in 2007.

The win for Penn State marks the 11 consecutive win for the Nittany Lions, who also remain undefeated in a challenging

Big Ten field as well, moving to 5-0.

"It feels great," Kendall White said. "Especially where we were in the beginning of the season. It shows how we grow and how we don't stay in a certain situation. It feels really good."

Penn State is back in action on Saturday, Oct. 8 against Rutgers. First serve is set for 7 p.m. in Rec Hall as the Blue and White will look to remain perfect through the first three weeks of Big Ten Play.

DETERING ADJUSTING TO PENN STATE

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - This time last year, junior Abby Detering was playing volleyball in the O'Connell Center alongside her teammates at University of Florida.

Now, she's wearing blue and white to represent the Penn State women's volleyball team.

"It's been awesome playing for Penn State," Detering said.
"The girls are amazing. I played against some of them in club, so it was really nice coming to a new program where you already know some of the girls, so it was a great welcome to come into it. But it's also Penn State. Playing with such an amazing program and coaches, it just an amazing feeling."

On August 26, Detering made her collegiate debut for the Nittany Lions in Rec Hall against West Virginia. She led the team with 29 assists while posting five digs and three kills. Despite helping the team secure the first win of the season, Detering's setting position wasn't protected. She was still splitting time with redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher. It was after her performance in the Syracuse Classic, recording 108 assists including a career-high 41 against Hofstra, that Detering took over at the setting position.

"Every day, you have to be working hard in this program," Detering said. "It's crazy, it's awesome, it's exactly what I want, I am working hard every day, so to be playing more and seeing an outcome that you want to see, it's awesome.

Starting over is never easy. With Detering only having one summer to get adjusted to Penn State, there was a lot to learn on and off the court, but the transition was made easier with the help of her teammates.

"I thought [the adjustment] was going to be a lot more challenging than what it was, but there are so many supportive people here that they helped me along the way," Detering said. "The girls are the main ones that helped me get adjusted, but not only with volleyball, but with school. They taught me where to go on campus, good places to study, even where my classes are. The girls have been amazing helping me make this an easy adjustment coming from another pro-

gram."

While Detering was at Florida, she played in 36 matches in two years, so collegiate volleyball nothing new to her, but she's also bringing skills and traits that she's learned to help the Nittany Lions.

"You learn this at a young age, but the most important thing that transferred over from Florida to Penn State is just really getting to know your teammates and knowing how to play with them," Detering said. "The biggest thing is about connections for a setter and a hitter and with all your teammates, so the biggest thing coming in is knowing how the players play, how the players react well and figuring each player out to get their best effort. I know that that was a huge thing at our last program because you have to get that. The main goal is to win and you have to get everyone to play at their best. I knew that I had to transfer that right away after I transferred here."

The Mentor, Ohio native first started to get involved in volley-ball because she and her older sister, Lauren, used to play the same sports, like figure skating and softball. When Lauren began to play volleyball, attending a middle school camp, Detering knew that she wanted to play too.

"I was in fourth grade, so I was the youngest kid, but I just loved it," Detering said. "I just liked how it was more of an aggressive sport while ice skating isn't really and it was more of a graceful sport."

Detering's family has supported her all her life, especially in high school when she was selected MVP of the Ohio Division II State Championship game in her freshman year and the 2013-14 Ohio Gatorade Volleyball Player of the Year. By transferring closer to home, her parents, sister and brother have been by her side every step of the way during her first season at Penn State.

"That's the best thing about being here and being in the Big Ten. My parents and my whole family are able to come to all my matches," Detering said. "They've been to every home game. My dad just came to Northwestern, so they're able to go to all my matches, and it's amazing to have them there for my last two years."

Although she always appreciates all the fans on the road, there's no better feeling than playing at Rec Hall.

"When you first go out there, the nerves kick in but now we're getting things down," Detering said. "My favorite moment has been playing at home because the crowd is so amazing and it's a really neat atmosphere. There are so many people there, so when you go, it's just all these people that are cheering for the team so you have a lot of adrenaline, but it's a great feeling."

Aside from volleyball, Detering loves waking up early to go outside to find new coffee shops, go hiking or spend time

relaxing in her ENO hammock. But now, her focus is inside Rec Hall.

"For this season, I want to win a national championship, that's definitely the goal in the end, but we have to be looking at each game, we can't just look at the end game. We have to look at the little things, the little goals before we get to the big goals. Right now, we're focusing on Michigan State and Michigan, and we're going to keep on playing from there. Overall, the big goals are winning the Big Ten and the National Championship, but right now, we want to beat Michigan State on Friday," Detering said.

TORI GORRELL'S UNEXPECTED PATH

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - When redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell was in sixth grade, she already knew that after high school she was going to attend Penn State. How did she know that she wanted to attend Penn State?

A Google search.

"When I was younger, I knew that I wanted to play volley-ball at the top level, so I jokingly went to my dad and asked him who the best team was," Gorrell said. "He Googled it because he had no idea about volleyball, and it said 'Penn State.' The young me said, 'I'm going to go there.' When I got older, I looked into it more and talked to Coach Rose and the other coaches. Then, I came for a visit, and it was nothing I had ever seen before. It's a beautiful campus, Rec Hall is beautiful, the coaches were amazing, the girls were amazing, and that's why I chose Penn State."

Hailing from Ontario, Canada, Gorrell has a longer trip home than the typical Penn State student, while requiring a passport along the way. Her father, Miles Gorrell, is a former all-star offensive lineman who played in the Canadian Football League, but now works as a talent acquisition specialist for the CFL's Ottawa RedBacks. Despite his busy schedule, he organizes his commitments so he and Tori's mother can attend every match in Rec Hall.

"My dad and my mom both attend every home game as long as he's not working," Gorrell said. "It's like a five-hour drive, so it's not that far and they both have weekends off. My dad still works for a professional football team and unless he's at games, he's at every one of my games."

Even though Gorrell's father doesn't know too much about actually playing volleyball, he is always by her side giving sharing advice.

"He knew nothing about volleyball so he just had the athlete's perspective," Gorrell said. "He always comes up with these cheesy inspirational quotes for me and that's all we've gone

off of, like last week, he said, 'Play every game like it's your last.' I always try to follow that."

Before playing for the Nittany Lions, Gorrell helped her high school, Abbey Park, win the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association AAA volleyball championship, the Halton Tier I and Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference AAA titles. She also led the team to an undefeated season.

Gorrell thought all of these accomplishments would allow her to play during her freshman year at Penn State, but she went on a different path and redshirted for the season instead.

"I think the [redshirt season] helped me tremendously," Gorrell said. "At first I was on the fence about it, but then I talked to other girls who were redshirted and they said it really helped them. So I just watched every other girl and learned and I think that gave me a better sense of what I can do to help the team and how to make the team more complete. I think doing the redshirt season was really valuable to me so I could become a better player and be a better teammate for these girls."

Gorrell adjusted to her unexpected position for the season by finding a role model on the team. Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington soon became the teammate that Gorrell could rely on to help her feel more comfortable during that stage.

"My role model this past year would be Haleigh. She's a little crazy, a little funky, so Haleigh is definitely someone I look up to," Gorrell said.

Washington has been by Gorrell's side since she came to Penn State and can notably see how the middle blocker has improved. Her connection and timing with her teammates, especially Abby Detering, has gotten stronger as well as her steps on offense. But more importantly, Washington is happy to finally see Gorrell play in front of the fans at Rec Hall.

"She's a goon. She's so excited when she's on the court," Washington said. "When she does something big, she turns around and does a set move where her mouth gets really big and she's smiley and hyped. It's awesome watching her play. She comes off the court with her head in the game and determined. She's competitive and wants to win, so she's awesome to play with."

Gorrell helped the Blue and White open up the 2016 season in the match against West Virginia. In her collegiate debut, she tailed six kills on nine errorless swings (.667), recorded two solo stuffs and led the team in blocks alongside Washington with three blocks each.

"Playing at Rec Hall for the first time was an amazing experience," Gorrell said. "I have been coming here for quite a few years and watching all of the girls on the court and just saying

'Wow, this is amazing.' Talking to girls like 'Yeah, playing at Rec is one of the greatest feelings you will ever have,' and stuff like that. I was excited to experience it. But then my first time happened and it's like nothing you could ever imagine... All the fans surround you and they're cheering for Penn State volleyball and the band is playing, the coach is talking, the other team is there and it's just super intense. It's a really amazing experience."

Though the environment been surreal at first, Gorrell is planning to leave her own mark on Rec Hall in the years to come. "I would like to be the middle that the other team has to worry about. I don't want the other team to just send two blockers on another player. I want them to focus on me and not automatically think, 'Okay, the ball is going to the outside or the inside or the center.' No, they have to be worried about me getting the ball and not leaving me right away when I get the ball. That's really what I want to focus on - being a threat to the other team."

HALEIGH WASHINGTON HOPES TO HELP PENN STATE TURN THE PAGE

Haleigh Washington cites one obsession in her life, and it's not volleyball.

The Penn State middle blocker loves them all -- big books, little books, thick books, thin books -- from "Dante's Inferno," on her bucket list for years, to childhood favorite "Go, Dog, Go!" Her most recent title: Barbara Kingsolver's allegorical novel "The Poisonwood Bible."

"I love to cuddle up with a good book, feel the pages and crack the spine," the junior philosophy major said. "I love having books all around me and having the possibility of sitting down and leaving wherever I am to escape into a book. As much as I love books, I love reading even more. When I get obsessed with a book, it's pretty much all I talk about." So Washington was given a challenge: Talk about the Nittany Lions' upcoming season using some of her most beloved titles as reference points.

Penn State, winner of a record seven NCAA titles, ranks No. 9 in the American Volleyball Coaches Association preseason poll. It's an atypical spot for one of the most storied teams in the sport, but it's not surprising. Last year came to an unsatisfying end for the two-time defending champion, swept by Hawaii in the regional semifinals; Penn State had started the season ranked No. 1 and had never lost to the Rainbow Wahine. It marked the first time since 2011 that Penn State failed to advance to the elite eight or better.

The sour taste of that defeat -- and the speech that coach Russ Rose made afterward noting that 28-6 is a record most teams celebrate -- fuels these early weeks of volleyball in

State College, Washington said.

The physical and emotional toll that goes into three-a-days "remind me of 'The Things They Carried,'" she said, referring to the Tim O'Brien novel on the pride and sacrifice of Vietnam soldiers and the loads they bear, both physical and emotional.

"When you go to Penn State, the expectation is final four, national championship every year," she said. "When you're 28-6 at Penn State, that is the sky falling."

Washington watched the Hawaii players celebrate as she walked off the court in Des Moines, Iowa. She knew it was the culmination of a season in which Penn State underperformed.

"The worst part about it was we almost thought it was supposed to happen," she said. "We got what was coming to us and realized we lost because we didn't work hard enough, and that's a horrible thing to come out of a Penn Stater's mouth. That's not what we stand for."

No book comes to mind for that reference, she said, but "I can compare it easily to a TV show. It's like 'How I Met Your Mother.' That show started great, was OK in the middle and the ending sucked. That was our season: great start, good middle, horrible ending."

Haleigh Washington says she has improved her serving, defense and her understanding of what it takes to win it all.

Rose agreed that his team, which opens Friday at home against West Virginia, faded down the stretch, noting many of his younger players were worn down by the grind of the long season. As for work ethic, he added, "Sometimes people don't want to hear the truth when they're in the moment. They think they're working really hard and doing everything they can, and in hindsight, when you have time to step back and assess your body of work, you make a declaration of 'Maybe I could have done more.'"

Reassessing was enough to make Washington, who won it all in 2014 as the Big Ten freshman of the year, hungry to restore glory to Happy Valley. She is excited by the early chemistry of the 2016 team, comparing it to yet another of her favorite reads, "The Hunger Games" series.

That trilogy of books, she said, is without a standout chapter -- it's a consistently strong read from beginning to end.

Lamenting Penn State's lack of steadiness a year ago, she said this year's team blends well as a group and understands how crucial it is to compete at the same high level regardless of the circumstances. That's what will be needed, she said, when the conference schedule gears up, particularly during a late-October stretch when the Nittany Lions play three road

games -- Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota -- in a week.

Without Micha Hancock or Megan Courtney this season, these Nittany Lions, she said, don't boast a Katniss Everdeen-type superstar.

"We're all just one great collective unit," she said.

That includes junior outside hitters Ali Frantti, an American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) honorable mention All-American last year, and Simone Lee, who closed out 2015 starting 18 of 21 matches. Both, Rose said, will play larger roles this year along with middle blocker Heidi Thelen. Lefty junior Abby Detering will bring an attacking mentality to the setter position, and prize recruit Kendall White could start right away at libero or be a significant back-row sub.

Then, of course, there's Washington, a reigning first team All-American, whose .442 hitting efficiency ranked third nationally. She's a player who Rose said "is among the most engaging kids I've ever coached."

The 6-foot-3 star from Doherty, Colorado, was part of a 2014 signing class -- along with Frantti, Thelen and Lee -- that was considered the best in the nation.

Washington returns with a stronger serve and improved blocking in addition to more consistent back-row play. "My hitting ability is getting better, too," she said. "Offensively I'm stronger, but the good news is I still have room to grow."

So, too, do her teammates, and Washington alludes to a final book regarding her expectations for a season in which nine Big Ten teams are ranked in the initial poll, including three -- Nebraska, Minnesota and Wisconsin -- among the top five.

"When I think how I want it to end, I think of 'The Help,'" Washington said, referring to Kathryn Stockett's debut novel set in the 1960s in Jackson, Mississippi. "It's a book with the perfect closure -- not what you'd expect to happen, but the ending sums up the book entirely. Whatever happens will be the perfect ending for this team -- whether that be a Big Ten championship, a final four run or maybe ... an NCAA championship."

Now that would be storybook.
