

FIVE-TIME BIG TEN CHAMPIONS



Penn State has qualified for its 32nd NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014. In 2013, PSU went 2-1-0 falling in the third round at New Mexico. For the Nittany Lions, it was the second time **Bob Warming's** side reached the Sweet 16 (2010, 2013).

Penn State is 27-30-1 all-time in the tournament with a 21-7-1 record at Jeffrey Field and a 5-22-0 mark in away games. Last year's second-round win at UCSB was Penn State's first NCAA road win since Nov. 22, 1998, a 1-0 win at Connecticut.

By knocking off the 10th-seeded Gauchos, Penn State eliminated the highest seed in the tournament's second round. Penn State, Connecticut, Coastal Carolina and Stanford were the lone remaining unseeded teams to make the Sweet 16.



SCOUTING THE HAWKS

Hartwick College (6-9-4) finished first in both the Sun Belt Conference's regular season and conference tournaments. The Hawks capped off a 3-1-1 conference schedule with a sweep of Appalachian State and Georgia Southern in the postseason tournament. Hartwick did not allow a goal during the two-match tournament and its 1-0 win over Ga. Southern in the title game gave the school its first NCAA berth in nine years.

The Hartwick defense was stingy in Sun Belt conference play during the 2014 season, only surrendering three goals in seven matches, including the postseason tournament. All together, the Hawks have not allowed a goal in six contests this season and carry a three match shutout streak into their tilt with Penn State. In goal for Hartwick is redshirt junior Tom Buckner who's 1.25 goals against average is second in the conference.

The Hawk offense is anchored by sophomore Mike Rood, whose 11 points is tops on the team. The only other player with at least four goals on the Hartwick attack is freshman Marc Berry, who boasts nine total points.

THE ROAD TO THE COLLEGE CUP

Penn State opens the 2014 NCAA Tournament, Thursday at 7 p.m. as it hosts Sun Belt Conference champion Hartwick, in the first round. The Nittany Lions face the Hawks for the 28th time in program history, but for the first time in postseason play.

PSU secured one of 24 at-large bids to the 48 team field and will be making its 32nd NCAA Tournament appearance. The Lions are 27-30-1 all-time during the NCAA's and hold a 27-7-1 mark at home during the postseason.

SERIES HISTORY

Penn State and Hartwick have played a total of 27 times prior to Thursday's match, with the Hawks owning a 13-10-4 record over the Lions. The last time these two schools played on the pitch was Aug. 27, 2006 when PSU defeated the Hawks 2-1 at the Ohio State Nike Classic in Columbus. Penn State is currently riding a five match win streak heading into the NCAA's, which dates back to 2001.

BREAKING DOWN THE BRACKET

Penn State is one of six teams in its portion of the NCAA bracket. The winner of the Lions and Hawks match on Thursday will play at Syracuse (who was awarded a first round bye), Sunday in New York. The other two schools facing off in the first round in PSU's bracket are Old Dominion and St. Francis (Brooklyn) who also play in New York. The winner of that match will travel to D.C. to take on Georgetown on Sunday.

COMMON ENEMIES

Penn State and Hartwick share two common opponents this season, Maryland from the Big Ten and Bucknell out of the Patriot League.

In non-conference play, Penn State defeated Bucknell 2-0 in Lewisburg on Oct, 1. Mikey Minutillo and Brian James did the scoring for the Lions as they improved to 9-0-1 and secured their sixth straight victory. Against the Bison, Hartwick fell 2-0 in Lewisburg on Aug. 31. The Hawks record at that point in the season was 0-1-1.

In Big Ten conference play the Nittany Lions fell to the Terps, 4-0 at College Park on Oct. 12. It was PSU's first loss of the season, dropping its record

to 10-1-1 overall and 4-1-0 in conference play. Hartwick faced a similar fate in College Park, as the Hawks fell by a 502 score to the Terapins on Oct. 28. It was Hartwick's ninth loss of the season, pushing its record to 3-9-4 before its regular season finale.

LIONS LAST TIME OUT ...

The No. 23 Penn State men's soccer team was unable to solve the No. 21 Michigan State Spartans in a 1-0 loss at Jeffrey Field on Sunday in a Big Ten Quarterfinal. MSU's Tim Kruetz hit a one-time volley in the 54th minute for the game-winning goal.

In a game of limited scoring opportunities, it was a defensive miscue and a pinpoint strike that allowed fifth-seeded Michigan State (11-4-4) to advance to the Big Ten Semifinals at top-seeded Maryland.

"I think both teams had game plans to try to stop the other," head coach Bob Warming said. "The big factor to me is that both teams were just tired. We got to here and I would say I don't think we had a lot of juice today. I just talked to all the guys about it and I told them I was really proud of their effort this week. They worked hard this week, as much as they had in them."

MSU's Adam Montague played a right-winged cross into the penalty area that was touched away by a Penn State (12-5-1) defender, but the ball landed to Kreutz who one-timed the volley opportunity to the lower left corner of the net in the 54th minute.

The Nittany Lions proceeded to dominate ball possession and chances the rest of the way, but Michigan State was game for the chances. Fourth-seeded Penn State out-shot MSU, 7-3, in the second half and 12-8 for the game.

In the 66th minute, Mason Klerks (Corona, Calif.) deftly played a long ball from midfield over the top of the MSU defense to a running Connor Maloney (Harrisburg, Pa.). Maloney's chance was met by Spartan goalie Zach Bennett and the chance went wide right.

In the 84th minute, Maloney again had a chance

as Brandon Savino (Glen Ridge, N.J.) crossed in from the left wing, but the forward's open header went high of frame. Savino would then get a chance from 20 yards out with a good look, however, his shot went high of net.

JEFFREY FIELD DOMINANCE

Penn State has enjoyed success at Jeffrey Field with more than 300 victories at the famed field. Impressively, the Nittany Lions have never posted a losing season at Jeffrey Field, going 315-81-34 all-time for a winning percentage of .772. Last season, PSU went 8-1-1 and since 2012 the Nittany Lions are 24-6-3 (.772) with a pair of Big Ten titles. Penn State is 9-3-0 this year at home and 17-4-1 the past two seasons. The Lions are 26-6-1 (.803) playing at Jeffrey Field in the NCAA Tournament.

JEFFREY FIELD FAITHFUL

In the 42-year history of the stadium. Jeffrey Field has welcomed 532,678 fans through its gates, including a season-high 4,052 in a 1-0 win over Temple (Sept. 5). PSU welcomed 5,944 fans on opening weekend in wins over Oakland and St. John's, while nearly 2,000 saw Penn State defeat Ohio State. PSU's 1-0 win over Rutgers had 2,532 fans on hand, which was the fourthhighest total of the season. Against Michigan State, 1,878 fans braved cool, wet conditions to cheer on the Nittany Lions. Penn State is averaging 1.816 fans per match in 12 contests with 21,795 fans coming to Jeffrey this year.

WOLVIE WATCH 2014

The Nittany Lions feature one of the top goalkeepers in the nation with senior Andrew Wolverton patrolling the goal area. The 2013 Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year and NSCAA All-Great Lakes First Team honoree has returned with a pair of career Penn State records in his sights, one of which was achieved Sept. 28 at Michigan.

Wolverton currently sits first in PSU records in goals-against average (0.78) and shutouts (32). Already the single-season record holder in shutouts (12 in 2012), Wolverton eclipsed the career record in front of his family on Sunday, Sept. 28 with a clean sheet against Michigan.

As for GAA, Wolverton looks to break Whit Gibson's mark of 0.78 set during his two seasons in Happy Valley (1998-99). Wolverton's save percentage is also impressive at .797 to back up a 37-22-8 career record in net.

This season, Wolverton has racked up shutout streaks of 321 minutes, 22 seconds and 517 minutes, 42 seconds. The latter streak was to open the season as Wolverton was the final starting goalkeeper in Division I to allow a goal, which occurred on Sept. 24. He is 11-5-0 this season with nine shutouts.

COACHING CLOUT

Among the elite coaches in the sport for the last three decades, head coach Bob Warming is back for his fifth season at Penn State. Warming has an incredible coaching pedigree, including 440 career Division I victories -- third all-time among active DI coaches and ninth all-time at D-I. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after leading PSU to a pair of league titles.

At Penn State, Warming picked up win No. 50 as the Lions won 3-0 over Saint Francis on Tuesday, Sept. 16. He is 57-33-11 at Penn State.

Entering his fifth season as Penn State's 11th coach in its storied history, **Bob Warming** has made his impact known in his first four years. Twice named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 by leading the Nittany Lions to back-to-back Big Ten titles, Warming has added a pair of trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2010, 2013) as well.

In 2013, Warming's charges relied on stout defense, timely scoring and guile to capture its fifth Big Ten regular-season title in outright fashion. Ultimately, the Nittany Lions won NCAA Tournament games against St. Francis Brooklyn and 10th-seeded UC Santa Barbara to reach the Sweet 16. The Lions finished with a 13-6-2 record and a 5-1-0 mark in Big Ten play.

Following a pair of strong seasons to begin his career at PSU, Warming's 2012 squad accumulated a 3-1-2 conference record to capture the team's first Big Ten regular season championship in seven years. The Nittany Lions held opponents to just over one goalper-game during the season, as they went unbeaten in their final four regular season conference contests.

The 2011 campaign presented a major milestone for Warming as he became the 31st NCAA Division I men's soccer head coach to capture 400 career victories after the Nittany Lions downed Florida International, 1-0, in the team's fourth game of the season. Penn State struggled through the Big Ten regular season, but hit its stride in the conference tournament, earning the distinction of being the first No. 7 seed to reach the title game.

The Nittany Lions switched roles from a high-powered offense in 2010 to a shutdown defense in 2011. The team allowed just 14 goals, the fewest since the 1977 squad surrended 12 scores. Rookie goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton set school records for the most shutouts in a season (12) and led the Big Ten in GAA (0.60) and save percentage (.821).

Warming led the Lions to 14 wins in 2011, the most by a PSU team since 2002, a Big Ten Tournament title game appearance, and the program's first NCAA postseason victory in five years.

Penn State boasted one of the nation's most prolific offenses in 2010, totaling 144 points (45 goals, 54 assists) in 23 games. Junior forward Corey Hertzog posted the most productive season by a Nittany Lion in 55 years, recording an NCAA-leading 20 goals and 46 points. Senior midfielder Matheus Braga led the nation and shattered the Big Ten single season record in assists, registering 17. Both players earned NSCAA Second Team All-America honors.

Also successful in the classroom, Penn State received the NSCAA Team Academic Achievement Award in 2010, earning the honor with a 3.07 team GPA.

Warming's three-plus decades as a head coach have been marked by distinction, achievement, and success. The six-time finalist for national coach of the year and 2008 winner of the award (according to FieldTurf Tarkett) holds a lofty place in the NCAA record book, ranking third among active Division I head coaches and ninth in Division I history with 438 victories. Warming is also one of only two active coaches in Division I to take two different programs to the College Cup.

Warming, whose distinguished career spans 35 years, came to Happy Valley from Creighton University, where he took over a previously dormant program and developed it into a conference and regional power and national title contender.

In 14 total years in Omaha, served in two different stints (1990-94, 2001-09), Warming, the winningest coach in program history, led the Bluejays to 190 victories, seven Missouri Valley Conference regular season and tournament championships, 11 NCAA Championship appearances, and the 2002 College Cup. His teams proved nearly unbeatable at home, compiling a 107-18-15 record in Omaha. In recognition of his dominance in league play, Warming, a three-time Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honoree, was named the MVC All-Centennial Team Coach in 2006.

An ardent believer in giving back through charitable works, Warming's 2009 Creighton squad won the community service award for performing over 1,500 hours of volunteer activities, including working on Habitat for Humanity projects, reading to elementary school students, and helping out at hospitals. Warming has also served as the honorary chairman of the Boy Scouts of America for Nebraska and as the honorary chairman of the Omaha Children's Crisis Center annual fund raiser.

Warming has not only built successful teams on the field, but also assisted with the design, fundraising, and construction management of three collegiate soccer stadiums, including, most recently, the \$13 million, 6,000-seat, state-of-the-art Michael G. Morrison, S.J., Stadium at Creighton. He and his winning teams helped fill the stands at Morrison Stadium, as Creighton led the MVC and ranked in the NCAA top 10 in attendance each of his last seven seasons in Omaha.

In honor of significant contributions made to the athletic program at the university, Warming was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in April 2011, becoming just the seventh head coach to earn the honor in its 43-year history.

In between his tenures at Creighton, Warming served as head

coach at Saint Louis University, where he guided it to four Conference USA championships, three NCAA Championship berths, and the 1997 College Cup. His Billiken teams also finished ranked in the top 20 in all four seasons.

Warming also previously held head coaching positions at Old Dominion (1996), Charlotte (1982-88), Berry College (1977-81), and Transylvania University (1976). His career coaching record stands at an impressive 438-209-75 (.659).

Warming has also produced numerous professional prospects, as at least one of his players has been selected in every MLS Super-Draft or supplemental draft. He has seen a total of 28 of his players drafted since the league's inception in 1996. Most recently, John Gallagher was selected with the 30th pick in the second round of the 2013 MLS Supplemental Draft. In 2011, Corey Hertzog was selected by the New York Red Bulls with the No. 13 pick in the first round of the SuperDraft, while Drew Cost was a supplemental draft choice of Real Salt Lake.

A 1975 graduate of Berea College (Ky.), Warming was a four-sport varsity letterwinner, starring on the golf, swimming, tennis, and soccer teams. As a starting goalkeeper, he posted a 28-2-2 record. Warming also holds a master's of science degree in sport administration from Eastern Kentucky University.

Warming and his wife, Cindy, have four children - Emily, Bess, and twins Grant and the late Audrey. Grant played for four seasons at Penn State (2010-13).




