#### **Orange Coming Into The Game**

- ▶ The Orange clinched a first round bye in the College Hockey America tournament with a win against RIT on Feb. 18. Down only two points to Robert Morris, they remain in the hunt for first place in the
- ▶ Syracuse is coming off a sweep of RIT last weekend with a 5-2 win in Rochester and a 2-0 win in Syracuse on Senior Day. Six different Orange members scored against the Tigers with Jessica Sibley being the only one with multiple goals.
- ▶ Sibley currently has a six-game point scoring streak dating back to Jan. 27.
- ▶ The Orange are led by their junior class on offense with Stephanie Grossi, Alysha Burriss and Emily Costales being the top three point scorers. Grossi leads all with 26 points on 13 goals and 13 assists. Burriss comes in second with 22 points (10 goals, 12 assists) and Costales is third with 21 points (8 goals, 13 assists).
- ▶ Since the New Year, 12 different Orange members have scored 38 goals, including seven goals from Stephanie Grossi and six from Emily Costales. Alysha Burriss also has added five goals.

#### **About the Nittany Lions**

- ▶ Penn State is currently in fourth place in CHA standings, one point behind third-place Mercyhurst. With two games remaining in the regular season, the Nittany Lions are guaranteed third or fourth place.
- ▶ The Nittany Lions are coming off a split weekend at No. 8 Robert Morris last weekend. Penn State won the first matchup, 3-2, but fell 2-0 the next day.
- Penn State has won three of their last four games with a win against RMU and a sweep of Lindenwood.
- Laura Bowman leads Penn State with 31 points this season on 18 goals and 13 assists. That mark is the third highest in the league.
- ▶ Amy Peterson and Brooke Madsen also have 20+ points for the Nittany Lions. Peterson has 29 on the season, with 13 goals and 16 assists and has a four-game point scoring streak. Madsen has 20 points on six goals and 14 assists.
- ▶ Hannah Ehresmann and Daniela Paniccia have played in 17 games each this season. Ehresmann has a 2.67 goals against average for the season with a .922 save percentage. Paniccia has a 2.87 GAA and .909 save percentage.

#### **Series History**

- ▶ The two programs have met 20 times in series history. The Orange own a 16-1-3 record against the Nitanny Lions, including a 6-1-1 record in University Park.
- ▶ Earlier in the season, Syracuse and Penn State squared off in Syracuse on Jan. 13 and 14. The Orange picked up a pair of 3-1 and 4-1 wins.
- In the first game, Emily Costales scored two goals and Stephanie Grossi added the other. Costales also had an assist in the game, giving the junior three points.
- The second game featured two goals from Allie Munroe and one from Laurence Porlier and Brooke

## SYRACUSE (13-12-5, 12-4-2 CHA) vs. PENN STATE (9-18-5, 8-8-2 CHA)

#### Where The Orange Rank

- ▶ Syracuse has been tight on defense this year, holding opponents to 1.87 goals per game. That mark is the best average in College Hockey America and the 12th best in the country. Overall, the Orange have allowed 56 goals this season, the least in the league by nine goals.
- ▶ The Orange also has the 12th best penalty kill in the country with an 88.5 percent mark.
- ▶ Junior goaltender Abbey Miller has the best goals against average (1.70) in the CHA and 14th best in the country. She is tied for fourth nationally in shutouts with seven this season and her .919 save percentage is the third best in the league.
- ▶ Stephanie Grossi is sixth in the league in points with 26 this season, fifth in goals (13) and tied for tenth in assists with 13.
- ▶ Alysha Burriss ranks seventh in the league in points with 22 and is tied for ninth in goals with 10.
- ▶ Emily Costales is tied for eighth in the CHA with 21 points and tied for 10th in assists with 10.
- ▶ Allie Munroe is tied for 10th in assists in the conference with 10 and is the third highest scoring defenseman in the CHA with 18 points this season.
- ▶ Heather Schwarz is tied for ninth in CHA with 10 goals in the 2016-17 campaign.
- ▶ Jessica Sibley's 14 assists on the season is tied for the sixth most in the league.
- Savannah Rennie has the fourth most points among CHA freshmen with 14 points. She is also tied for the 10th most power play goals with three this season.
- Senior Larissa Martyniuk is tied in ninth place in the CHA among defensemen with 11 points this year.
- Redshirt freshman Lindsay Eastwood has 10 points this season, eighth most among freshmen in the CHA.

#### **Blank Score**

- ▶ Syracuse has held eight opponents scoreless this season, including seven in conference play. The eight shutouts is the tied for the most in program history also reached in 2012-13. The seven conference shutouts is the most by an Orange team, doubling the previous season-high of three reached in 2012-13 and 2015-16.
- Abbey Miller has been responsible for seven of the team's eight shutouts. That mark is a new Syracuse single-season record. The career high in Syracuse history is eight, recorded by both Billadeau and Jenesica Drinkwater.

#### Close Games

- ▶ The Orange have been in many close games this season. Of their 12 losses, seven have come from one-goal decisions.
- The game-winners in four of those one-goal losses came in the third period.
- Syracuse has also been in several close games that ended in ties this season. The Orange have five ties this season, which is the third most in a season in program history.

#### **CHA Weekly Honors For 'Cuse**

- ▶ Junior Alysha Burriss won CHA Player of the Week on Dec. 12 for her play against No. 4 Clarkson. She scored the game-tying goal with 1:59 left in the game against the Golden Knights and then assisted on the lone Syracuse goal in Potsdam the next day.
- ▶ Sophomore goaltender Maddi Welch won her first conference award, earning CHA Goalie of the Week honors for the week of Dec. 5 for her shutout performance at RIT on Dec. 3. The Orange picked up a 3-0 win behind Welch's play, the second shutout of her career.
- ▶ Junior goalie Abbey Miller earned CHA Goaltender of the Week (Oct. 24) for her play against No. 5 Colgate. In the second game of the series, Miller secured a career-high 35 saves. On the weekend, she had a combined 49 saves in the two games. Four of the five goals scored by the Raiders were scored on the power play. Miller won Goalie of the Week honors again on Jan. 23 after posting back-to-back shutouts for the second time against Lindenwood.
- Allie Munroe also earned Player of the Week following the Lindenwood series. The sophomore had a career night in the first game, posting four points, being a part of all but one of the Orange's goals that evening. The four points were the second most in a single-game in Syracuse history.
- Savannah Rennie claimed Co-Rookie of the Week honors after scoring her first career game-winner in the first game against Lindenwood. She also had two assists on the night, registering a career-high three points.

## ...And CHA Monthly Honors For The Orange

- ▶ Juniors Abbey Miller and Stephanie Grossi each received monthly conference awards for their play in January. Miller was named CHA Goalie of the Month and Grossi was tabbed Player of the Month.
- ▶ Miller held opponents to only nine goals in eight games in January, posting a 1.35 goals against average in nearly 400 minutes in net. During the month, she had consecutive shutouts against Lindenwood and had a 178:17 scoreless streak going, the longest streak in Orange history.
- ▶ Grossi led the Orange, and the league, with 11 points in the month of January, doubling her point total for the season. She had five goals and six assists during the month and had a game-winning goal against Penn State. She also assisted on both game-winners at Lindenwood.

#### **CHA Tournament History**

▶ Syracuse has never won the CHA tournament title. However, the Orange have advanced to the championship game five-of-eight times, including the past two years (2014-15 and 2015-16).

#### First time for everything

- ▶ So far this season, freshmen Savannah Rennie and Kelli Rowswell have each scored the first goal of their Syracuse career. Rennie's came against Northeastern on Oct. 14 on the power play. Rowswell found the net on Oct. 21 against No. 5 Colgate.
- Lindsay Eastwood scored her first career goal in Syracuse's 2-1 loss at Robert Morris on Nov. 5. She also has three assists on the season in her first 14 games suiting up for the Orange. She scored her first game-winner at No. 7 North Dakota on Nov. 25 on the power play in the first period.

#### The Orange in Non-Conference

- ▶ Syracuse played a tough non-conference schedule in the 2016-17 season. Of the Orange's seven non-league opponents, three were ranked at the time of the game, six were ranked at some point this season and all seven have received votes this season.
- ▶ The Orange finished with a 1-8-4 out-of-league record.

#### **Syracuse Picked as CHA Favorites**

- Syracuse was voted as the favorites to win the 2016-17 College Hockey America (CHA) regular season championship for the second consecutive season in the preseason poll.
- ▶ The Orange received five of the six first place votes, earning 25 points in the poll, edging out Mercyhurst, the defending champions.

#### **Last Season**

- ▶ The Orange finished last season with a 19-14-3 record and a program-high 14 wins in conference play.
- ▶ Syracuse returns 17 letterwinners from last season and brings in eight newcomers, including six freshmen, a transfer and redshirt freshman Lindsay Eastwood.
- ▶ In the CHA tournament, Syracuse advanced to the championship game for the fifth time in program history and second consecutive year. The Orange fell to Mercyhurst 4-3 in overtime.

#### Returning from 2015-16

- ▶ Syracuse returns 70 percent of its scoring offense and 66 percent of its assist production.
- ▶ CHA First-Teamer Stephanie Grossi returns for her junior season after leading the team with 36 points a season ago.
- ▶ Senior Jessica Sibley returns after earning CHA second team honors with 30 points in 2015-16. Grossi and Sibley both earned scoring trophies for their play last season.
- ▶ Megan Quinn, one of the conference's top defenseman, returns for her junior year. Quinn was a CHA second team selection in 2015-16.

#### **Newcomers**

- ▶ Six freshmen will suit up for the Orange in 2016-17, including Amanda Bäckebo, Ady Cohen, Logan Hicks, Allie Olnowich, Savannah Rennie and Kelli Rowswell.
- Also new to the team is transfer Brooke Avery who spent a season at New Hampshire previously. As a forward, Avery played in 41 games last season registering a goal and an assist.
- Lindsay Eastwood sat out last season, but will play for the Orange this season. Eastwood was a member of the 2014 U18 Canadian team.

#### **Current Orange in the Record Book**

- ▶ Senior Jessica Sibley ranks in the top 10 of the three major career categories for the Orange in points, goals and assists. She comes in fourth in points with 91, sixth in goals with 35 and is tied for fourth in assists with 56.
- ▶ Sibley leads the team with 14 assists this season.
- ▶ The senior is also tied for fourth place in the Orange record book with 19 multi-point games in
- Junior Stephanie Grossi also ranks in the top 10 of those same categories. She is third all-time with 92 points, in fifth place with 36 goals and tied for fourth with 56 assists.
- ▶ The junior is also tied for fourth in program history with 19 career multiple point games.
- Grossi leads the team in points this season with 26 points on 13 goals and 13 assists.
- ▶ Grossi's 22 assists last season were the second most by any Syracuse player in a single season and her freshman total of 21 was the fourth most.
- ▶ Her 33 points last season were the third highest in the CHA.
- ▶ Junior Alysha Burriss cracked the top 10 in career goals for Syracuse with 33 goals.

## **Exhibitions: Montreal and Whitecaps**

#### MONTREAL:

- Syracuse fell to the University of Montreal on Sept. 24 in an exhibition game played at Tennity Ice Pavilion in overtime 3-2.
- ▶ Montreal was the 2016 Canadian National Champions.
- ▶ The Orange outshot Montreal 34-22 and battled back from 2-0 deficit.
- ▶ Stephanie Grossi scored first for the Orange on a Emily Costales assist. Heather Schwarz equalized on a Karleigh Scully assist.
- ▶ Maddi Welsh and Abbey Miller split time in net in the two contests.

#### WHITECAPS:

- ▶ Syracuse hosted the Minnesota Whitecaps for an exhibition series in Syracuse on Nov. 19 and 20.
- In the first game, the Whitecaps defeated Syracuse, 3-1, at War Memorial Arena. A scoreless first period was followed by a two-goal performance from the Whitecaps in the second. Allie Munroe scored for the Orange in the third to bring 'Cuse within one. In an attempt to tie the game, Syracuse pulled goaltender Maddi Welch to give the Orange an extra attacker. The Whitecaps were able to score a goal on an empty Syracuse net to win the game 3-1.
- In the second game, Heather Schwarz was the star of the night with two goals in the contest. She snagged her first in the final minute of the first period to give the Orange a 1-0 lead. The Whitecaps drew even with a breakaway goal in the second period and then took the lead in the third period. A little over a minute later, Schwarz scored the game-tying goal. After finishing regulation still tied 2-2, the two teams played a five-minute overtime period but neither squad
- In the games against the Whitecaps, head coach Paul Flanagan used his backup goaltenders Welch and freshman Ady Cohen. Welch also started in the second game of the season against Bemidji State. She finished with 27 saves in the game. For Cohen, it was the first time on the ice against an opponent in her Orange career. She posted 36 saves in her unofficial debut.

- Jessica Sibley scored the first goal of the season for the Orange on the power play in the first period.

- Abbey Miller started in net for Syracuse and registered 19 saves.

## **Paul Flanagan** Head Coach • 9th Year (18th overall)



Paul Flanagan joined Syracuse in March 2008 as women's ice hockey head coach and over the following eight seasons has built the program from an upstart to a perennial contender in the CHA.

In his eighth year at the helm, Flanagan led the Orange to its fifth CHA Championship Game appearance,

In 2015-16 Flanagan guided a league-high five student-athletes to allconference accolades on the way to a fifth appearance in the CHA finals. He was also named CHA Coach of the Year for the third time.

In 2014-15, Akane Hosoyamada and Melissa Piacentini were named to the All-CHA First Team, Nicole Renault and Jenn Gilligan picked up second team honors and Alysha Burriss and Stephanie Grossi were added to the All-CHA Rookie Team. Grossi also was named CHA Rookie of the Year.

Flanagan also reached the century mark in wins at Syracuse, notching the program's 100th win in program history on Feb. 14, 2015 vs. Lindenwood.

Flanagan coached the squad to its best record in program history, 20-14-3 in 2013-14. In addition, Flanagan also reached a career milestone, becoming the ninth all-time winningest coach in women's college hockey with 332 wins including 102 at Syracuse.

Four Orange were named to the All-CHA team for their regular season performances. Nicole Renault earned a spot on the first team while Melissa Piacentini was voted to the second team. Jessica Sibley and Larissa Martyniuk each

In 2012-13, Flanagan coached the squad to a 20-15-1 record and its highest finish in the CHA at second place with a mark of 13-6-1 in conference play. Flanagan also reached a coaching milestone, earning his 300th career victory and 70th at Syracuse.

Flanagan was named the 2013 College Hockey America Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. During the 2012-13 CHA tournament, the Orange advanced to its third title game before falling to Mercyhurst, 4-1. Akane Hosoyamada and Kallie Billadeau garnered all-conference first team

honors in 2013 while Nicole Ferrara and Margot Scharfe were named to the second team. Nicole Renault was named to the All-Rookie team. Scharfe was named the CHA's best defensive forward for the second-straight year while Hosoyamada was honored as the best defenseman.

Flanagan is one of the most recognized names in collegiate ice hockey, leading St. Lawrence to four consecutive NCAA Frozen Four appearances which places second among active coaches.

With a 4-1 win against Lindenwood on Feb. 27, 2013, Flanagan became just the sixth active coach in women's ice hockey to win 300 career games. The win against Lindenwood was also his 70th as the head coach of the Orange.

After just eight seasons, Flanagan and the Orange have made a name for SU ice hockey and are contending with the nation's best. Syracuse finished the 2009-10 season with an overall record of 18-17-1 and its first post-season victory in program history with a win against Niagara in the semifinals of the CHA tournament, doubling its win total after posting a 9-16-3 record in its inaugural season in 2008

Flanagan has recruited an all-star roster including Syracuse's first Winter Olympian, Stephanie Marty, who competed for her native Swiss National Team at the 2010 Olympics in Vancouver and the 2014 Olympics in Sochi, where she helped earn Switzerland's first-ever medal in women's hockey. Marty's impressive work on and off the ice during the 2009-10 season earned her Second Team All-CHA, CHA All-Academic and ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors.

The 2010 College Hockey America (CHA) Coach of the Year led the Orange to its second consecutive appearance in the CHA Championship game in 2010-11, finishing the year with an

Flanagan's squad boasted three members with CHA honors in 2010-11 led by Isabel Menard, who picked up her second straight selection to the All-CHA First Team list. Defender Akane Hosoyamada and goaltender Kallie Billadeau were both named to the CHA All-Rookie Team, making SU the only team with multiple student-athletes on the list.

Flanagan was the head coach for the St. Lawrence women's ice hockey program from 1999-2008. He led the Saints to the women's NCAA Frozen Four Championship five times in his nineyear tenure, tying him for the most appearances in the country. Flanagan's four-year run (2003-07) of Frozen Four appearances is also tied for best in college hockey.

The Canton, N.Y. native accrued a 230-83-24 record with the Saints. His .692 win percentage is the sixth-best in the nation among active Division I coaches. Flanagan also has the seventh-

While at St. Lawrence, he directed his fleet to the ECAC Hockey Tournament in each of his nine years. Flanagan's 2003-04 team shared the ECAC Hockey regular-season crown and the 2005-06 team won it outright. The 2005-06 Saints became the first squad in any sport at St. Lawrence to win more than 30 games in a season.

#### **Accolades for Accomplishments**

Flanagan made his presence felt in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) hockey league. After Flanagan led St. Lawrence to its first National Championship game in only his second year, he was awarded the 2000-01 ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year and the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Coach of the Year.

Flanagan's student-athletes have garnered numerous awards, as well. Behind the Saints' bench, Flanagan generated 10 All-Americans, three ECAC Goaltenders of the Year, one ECAC Player of the Year, two Sarah Devins Award Winners and more than three dozen ECAC All-Stars. He has coached two Olympians and several members of the Canadian National team.

Flanagan was an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Select and National teams that competed at the Four Nations Cup in Sweden in November and won the gold medal in summer of 2008. Flanagan also assisted the U.S. Women's National team to the World Championship in April held in Harbin, China. Flanagan was on the national coaching staff with Ohio State's Jackie Barto and Plattsburgh State's Kevin Houle.

A 1980 St. Lawrence graduate, Flanagan was a defenseman for the Saints, serving as a team captain his senior season. He began his coaching career as head coach at Canton High School in 1982. Prior to the 1988 season, Flanagan joined the St. Lawrence men's staff as an assistant coach and helped the Saints to two ECAC championships and NCAA appearances in 1989, 1992

Flanagan earned his master's degree in education from St. Lawrence in 1992. Flanagan and his wife, Sharon, reside in DeWitt with their three children, Shannon, Brendan and Connor.
