THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

• Penn State returns to the NCAA Tournament for the second-consecutive year making its second Tournament appearance in the six year history of the program.

• Penn State is 1-1 all-time in the NCAA Tournament as they dispatched Union last season 10-3 before falling to Denver in the Midwest Regional Final by a score of 6-3.

• This marks just the second meeting between the two programs with both taking place in the NCAA Tournament.

• All three players who registered a goal last season against the Pioneers were freshman as Denis Smirnov, Nikita Pavlychev and James Gobetz each tallied in the defeat.

• Troy Terry registered a hat-trick against the Nittany Lions in last season's meeting while Henrik Borgstrom collected three assists and Jarid Lukosevicius scored twice including the game-winning goal.

• Penn State has had 11 hat-tricks scored against them in its history and are 3-8-0 all-time when an opposing player nets three goals in a single contest.

21 JUMP STREET

• Should he start on Saturday, sophomore Peyton Jones will tie his career record for consecutive starts with 21-in-a-row.

• Jones has started 70 of a possible 76 games since stepping foot on campus last year compiling a 40-22-6 record with his 40 wins being a new Penn State standard set earlier this season. Jones needs just four more starts to set the Penn State record for career starts and just eight more appearances to set the Nittany Lion appearance record, both are currently held by Matt Skoff '16.

• Over his last six starts, Jones is 5-1-0 with a 2.68 goals against average and a .924 save percentage.

• Jones also set a new Penn State single-season goal-tending record with four assists to lead the entire nation this season. His six career helpers are also a Penn State record for a goaltender.

SENSATIONAL SOPHOMORES

• After leading the nation last season as freshmen with 64 goals and 93 assists for 157 points, the Penn State sophomore class hasn't missed a beat in 2017-18.

• Penn State's sophomore class ranks first in the nation again with 68 goals and 159 points this season led by four players with 20-plus points including the career-high 31 by Brandon Biro.

• Three of those sophomores, Smirnov, Nate Sucese and Liam Folkes have registered double-digit goals with 15, 14 and 12, respectively, while Biro and Nikita Pavlychev have added nine goals each.

BIG MAN ON DEFENSE

• Senior Trevor Hamilton was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year earning the first-ever major conference award by a Penn State Student-Athlete. Head Coach Guy Gadowsky was named Big Ten Coach of the Year following the 2014-15 season.

• Hamilton leads all Big Ten defensemen in points with

29 this season on six goals and 23 assists. His 29 points are also tied for 14th nationally among blue-liners while his 104 blocked shots lead the nation. The senior also led the nation last season when he set a single-season Penn State record with 107 blocked shots. Hamilton's 211 total blocks in his two years at Penn State is also a program record for a career.

• Hamilton's 23 assists are also the most in a single-season by a Penn State defenseman in the six-year history of the program.

HAPPY VALLEY FIVE-0

• Penn State has scored at least five goals in four of its last five games and 14 times all season posting a 13-0-1 record when doing so.

• All-time Penn State is now 52-0-2 when scoring at least five goals in a game and 51-94-15 when scoring less than five goals.

• The Nittany Lions are second in the nation averaging 3.70 goals per game after setting a single-season record and leading the entire NCAA last season scoring 4.10 goals per contest. Penn State trails only the 3.87 goals per game of Minnesota State.

• Penn State has also scored at least four goals in 19 of its 37 games this season posting a 16-1-2 record when doing so.

SHOTS, SHOTS, SHOTS, SHOTS

• For the fourth consecutive season Penn State once again leads the entire nation in shots on goal averaging an eye-popping 40.49 shots per game, which is 5.41 clear of its nearest competitor.

• Even with that high total it marks the lowest in three years since averaging 39.24 for the 2014-15 season. Last season the Nittany Lions set a single-season program record averaging 44.08 shots per game breaking its record from the year prior when they averaged 41.55 shots per game.

• Penn State is just two shots shy of reaching 1,500 shots on goal for the third consecutive season. In 2016-17 Penn State set a single-season program record firing 1,719 shots on goal over its 39 games played.

• Junior Andrew Sturtz leads the team with 138 shots on goal this season and became just the second Nittany Lion to reach 400 shots for his career as he ranks second all-time behind Casey Bailey with 400 career shots. His 138 shots is also the fifth most in a single-season in program history.

• Along with Sturtz, Chase Berger (106), Nate Sucese (101) and Liam Folkes (101) have each recorded over 100 shots on goal this season with Denis Smirnov just one shy of the century mark at 99.

#ANDYVALLEY

• Junior Andrew Sturtz has registered a career-high 40 points this season to rank tied for fifth in the Big Ten and 28th in the nation.

• Sturtz became just the second Nittany Lion in program history, joining David Goodwin '17, to reach the 100-point

SCOUTING DENVER



• The defending National Champions lost their first game in a best-of-three NCHC quarterfinal playoff series, but have won four-straight to capture the 2018 NCHC Tournament Championship. Denver currently ranks third in the latest USCHO.com poll and are 22-9-8 on the year.

• The Pioneers possess one of the top lines in all of college hockey featuring Henrik Borgstrom, Troy Terry and Jarid Lukosevicius who have registered a combined 126 points this season, which is 36 percent of the Denver scoring.

• Borgstrom leads the team with 50 points ranking fifth in the nation as he has scored 22 goals while adding 28 assists. He is one of just 16 players across the nation to hit the 20-goal mark so far this season. Borgstrom leads all current sophomores in the NCAA with 93 career points in just 75 games while his 1.24 points per game average for his career leads all active Division I players. The sophomore is 19 points clear of Tanner Laczynski and Marc Michaelis as the next closest sophomores with 75 points each. Denis Smirnov ranks fourth among sophomores with 74 career points.

• Terry has added 13 goals and 31 assists for 44 points on the year. His assist and point totals rank tied for sixth and tied for 13th in the nation, respectively.

• Lukosevicius ranks second on the team with 19 goals including 10 powerplay tallies to rank tied for sixth in the nation.

• Second line center Dylan Gambrell has added 13 goals and 29 assists for 42 points to make Denver one of just three teams in the nation with three 40-plus point scorers joining Northeastern and Northern Michigan.

• Denver has the third best scoring defense allowing just 2.05 goals per game this season while scoring 3.31 goals per contest to rank ninth in the nation offensively.

• 2017 Mike Richter Award winner Tanner Jaillett is a main reason why the defense is so stingy as he ranks fifth in the nation with a 1.85 goals against average while his .929 save percentage is good for seventh in the nation.

• Denver's man-advantage is slightly better than Penn State ranking 13th nationally converting 37-of-167 chances (22.2 percent). The PK has also been stellar for the Pioneers allowing just 19 goals during 124 man-down situations killing off 84.7 percent of penalties to rank eighth in the nation.





milestone earlier this season and ranks tied for 26th in the nation among active players in career scoring with 104 points.

- Sturtz is also one of just 15 current NCAA players to have scored at least 50 career goals as he ranks tied for ninth with 54, which is also a Penn State career record he set earlier this season.

- Sturtz's 26 assists this season are also a career-high and rank fifth in the Big Ten and tied for 23rd nationally. He is just two assists shy of tying Denis Smirnov's single-season program record of 28 set last season. The junior's 50 career assists also tie for third in program history.

BEST BERGER IN TOWN

- Along with classmate Andrew Sturtz, junior Chase Berger has been a top offensive weapon for Penn State ever since stepping foot on campus. The junior has registered at least 26 points in each of his three seasons in Happy Valley and ranks tied for fifth on the team with 27 points this season.

- Berger is also third on the Penn State all-time scoring list with 89 points while his 37 goals are good for fifth and his 52 assists rank him second.

- The junior led the team in faceoff win percentage during his freshman and sophomore campaigns including a blistering .578 to rank 21st nationally last season and currently ranks second on the team this season with a .491 winning percentage.

SCORING DEPTH

- Penn State consistently rolls all four lines at every opponent they face and have plenty of depth to make each line dangerous. The Nittany Lions top three lines have produced two double-digit goal scorers each on a team that ranks third in the nation in goals scored with 137.

- Currently on the second line sophomores Brandon Biro (3-2-5) and Nate Sucese (2-3-5) each have four game point streaks while on the third line freshman Alex Limoges has four goals and four assists in his last six games while classmate Evan Barratt has scored four goals and added one assist in his last five games. Then the top line features your leading scorer in Sturtz and oh by the way, Nikita Pavlychev has nine goals as the fourth line center.

TWO-WAY DEFENSE

- A year after finishing third in the nation in defenseman scoring with 117 points on 32 goals and 85 assists, Penn State ranks tied for sixth nationally in that department this season with 19 goals and 81 assists for 100 points.

- The Nittany Lions also rank second nationally in blocked shots with 370 averaging 10.00 per game and are just a single blocked shot behind RIT for the national lead while being 31 blocks clear of third place Nebraska-Omaha.

- Since the turn of the New Year, Penn State leads the nation in blocks with 221 while averaging 13.00 per game, 3.33 more than RIT in second.

WE'VE GOT THE POWER'PLAY'

- Penn State has scored at least one powerplay goal in six of its last seven games and rank 15th in the nation converting at 21.9 percent (30-for-137) with the man-advantage this season.

• Penn State has also scored 12 times this season during 4-on-4 play to lead the nation by a wide margin as they are five clear of Colgate and Northeastern who have seven each.

• Sophomore Brandon Biro leads the nation in 4-on-4 scoring with six points on three goals and three assists.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

• After being held without a goal for 22 straight games, senior James Robinson has scored a goal in three of his last five games and has a new career-high with six goals on the season while adding five assists for 11 points, also a career-best.

THE MORE POINTS THE BETTER

• Junior Andrew Sturtz has registered 13 multi-point games this season and in those games Penn State is 10-2-1. For his career, Sturtz has 30 multi-point efforts and the Nittany Lions have gone 22-7-1 in those games.

STRONG FINNISH

• Senior Erik Autio has played in 137 career games, the most by any Penn State defenseman in program history and the third most all-time.

• Autio's 50 career assists are also the most by a defenseman in program history and rank tied for third all-time at Penn State while his 58 points are two behind Luke Juha '16 for the program record for defensemen scoring.

PERFECT ATTENDANCE AWARD

• Junior forward Chase Berger hasn't missed a single game in his entire Penn State career becoming the first Nittany Lion in program history to reach 100 games without missing a single one. The junior has now played in 114 straight games.

RECAPPING 2016-17

• Penn State finished the 2016-17 season with an overall record of 25-12-2. The Lions finished fourth in the Big Ten during the regular season with a record of 10-9-1 for the second straight season.

• The Nittany Lions became the first conference team to capture the Big Ten Tournament Championship by winning three games in three consecutive nights. PSU defeated Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin to secure its first ever title with the semifinal and final being decided in double-overtime.

• Penn State advanced to its first-ever NCAA Tournament where it defeated Union (N.Y.) 10-3 before falling 6-3 to eventual National Champion, Denver. The ten goals scored against Union tied an NCAA Tournament record for most goals scored by a team in its debut game and where also the most any team has scored since 1990.

• Penn State broke or tied 65 program/individual records last season including the program marks for most wins (25), points (425), goals (160), assists (265), shots (1,719) and shots per game (44.1).

• Andrew Sturtz became just the second 20-goal scorer in program history as he tied Casey Bailey's single-season record of 22 set during the 2014-15 season.

• The Nittany Lions led the entire nation averaging 4.10 goals per contest.

• The Nittany Lions led the nation in freshman scoring with 157 points on 64 goals and 93 assists.

• Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 120,513 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena, which is the most in the facilities short four-year history.

WELCOME HOME

• Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

• The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

• The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

• The Big Ten is in its fifth season entering 2017-18. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 24 league games, including 12 home contests.

• The Big Ten is comprised of seven total universities with the University of Notre Dame becoming an official affiliate member for the start of the 2017-18 season.

• Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a shootout win and one point for a shootout loss.

• Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

• The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only Power 5 conference to sponsor men's hockey.

• The Big Ten tournament will take place at on campus sites for the first time in league history beginning during the 2017-18 season.

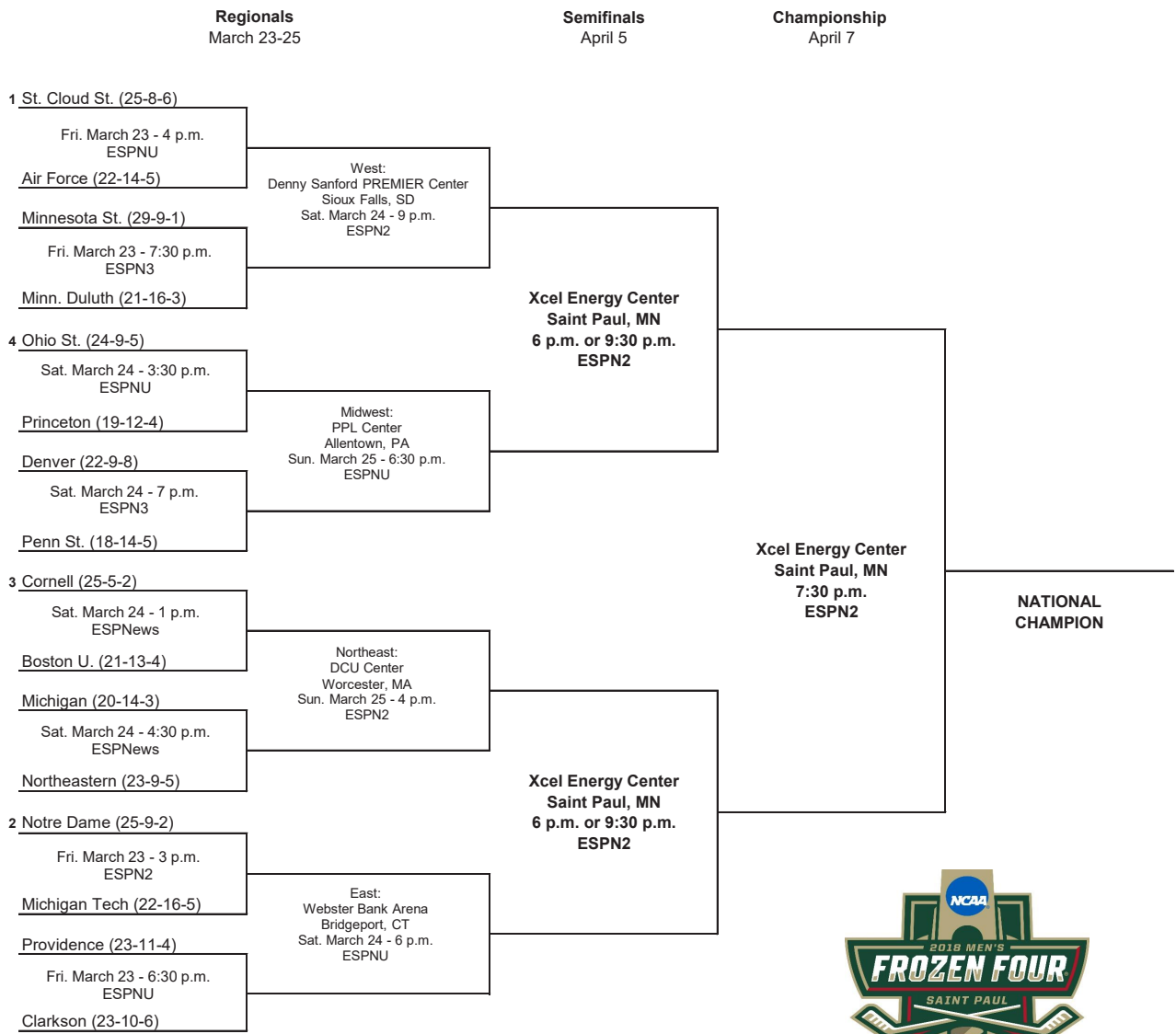

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, the 2017 Big Ten Tournament Champion coach, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 18th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2017-18. Gadowsky is currently coaching his sixth Penn State varsity team.

AT PENN STATE

In 2016-17, Gadowsky led Penn State to its most successful season ever, compiling a record of 25-12-2. Penn State won the 2017 Big Ten Tournament and earned its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance falling one game shy of the Frozen Four. The Nittany Lions defeated Union 10-3, tying the record for most goals in a team's tournament debut, before bowing out to eventual national champion Denver, 6-3, in the Midwest Regional final.

Along the way Penn State opened the season 13-1-1 using a program-best 11-game winning streak. The Lions also earned their first-ever uscho.com



No. 1 national ranking on Jan. 17, 2017, with a 16-2-1 record. Penn State finished the season as the highest scoring team in the country averaging 4.10 goals per game.

The 2016-17 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (160), assists (265), points (425), shots (1,719), goals/gm (4.10) and shots/gm (44.1) to go along with the program-best 25 victories.

In 2015-16 Gadowsky led Penn State to its first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions

knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign saw gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont at Wells Fargo Arena in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL barn (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second-straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first





NCAA tournament berth since 1998, Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, presented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

Gadowsky had more than 20 Tiger players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalemba (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

Gadowsky also competed with the Canadian National Team and played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden during the 1993-94 season.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.

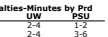

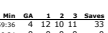

Hamilton Named B1G Defensive Player of the Year

Junior Andrew Sturtz named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention, senior Erik Autio named Penn State's sportsmanship award honoree

ROSEMONT, Ill. – Senior defenseman Trevor Hamilton (Grosse Pointe Farms, Mich.) has been named the 2017-18 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year as announced by the league office earlier Tuesday afternoon.

Hamilton was also named a First-Team All-Big Ten selection while junior Andrew Sturtz (Buffalo, N.Y.) was given honorable mention recognition.

Hamilton becomes the first Penn State player ever to earn a major conference award and it is just the second major conference award Penn State has received after Guy Gadowsky was named Big Ten Coach of the Year following the 2014-15 season.

Hamilton is also just the third Penn State player to earn All-Big Ten First-Team honors joining Casey Bailey (2014-15) and Vince Pedrie (2016-17). The senior leads the Big Ten and ranks tied for 12th nationally among blue-liners with 29 points on the season having scored six goals with 23 assists.

Hamilton's 29 points are just one shy of Pedrie's single-season program record for points by a defenseman of 30 he set last season while his 23 assists are a new single-season Penn State defenseman record.

The senior also leads the entire nation for the second-consecutive season in blocked shots with 104. His two-season total of 211 blocks is a new Penn State career record while the 107 he had during the 2016-17 campaign is a single-season record.





The Grosse Pointe Farms native has 55 points on 12 goals and 43 assists in 76 career games as a Nittany Lion. His point and assist totals rank third all-time among Penn State defensemen while his goals place him fourth.

Sturtz, who became Penn State's all-time leading goal scorer and just the second Nittany Lion ever to reach 100 career points earlier this season, earns the first postseason accolade of his career with a Big Ten honorable mention selection.

The junior leads the team with his career-high 40 points to rank tied for fifth in the Big Ten and 28th nationally. Sturtz is just the third Nittany Lion ever to register at least 40 points in a single-season joining Bailey and sophomore Denis Smirnov (Moscow, Russia) who set the Penn State single-season record with 47 points last season.

Sturtz is also tied for second nationally with three shorthanded goals to lead the Big Ten as he became the first player this season to register three shorthanded scores. Sturtz's plus-14 rating leads the team and ranks tied for sixth in the Big Ten. Hamilton is second on the team and tenth in the conference at plus-13.

The junior's 26 assists this season are also a career-high and are just two shy of Smirnov's single-season record of 28 set last season.

Senior Erik Autio (Espoo, Finland) was named the team's sportsmanship award honoree.

Penn State is currently waiting on a possible at-large bid to its second-consecutive NCAA Tournament where as the host school they would participate at the Midwest Regional in Allentown, Pa. on March 24-25. The entire 16-team NCAA Tournament field will be announced during the selection show live on ESPNU on Sunday, March 18 at 12 p.m.

PENN STATE'S 'MAYOR' MAKES THINGS HAPPEN

Junior Sturtz Brings Infectious Attitude to Nittany Lions

It's Oct. 22, 2016 and Denis Smirnov is accelerating down Notre Dame's ice. He's zeroed in on completing a neutral zone transition in overtime, so forgive "the magician" for not noticing his wide open teammate banging a stick against the ice.

The 5-foot-8, 180-pound forward to Smirnov's right just bangs harder. He forces Smirnov to notice him, collects the ensuing pass and flies at the net. Penn State takes down its highest-ranked opponent in history off his backhand 1:20 into overtime.

That's **Andrew Sturtz**, and it's kind of his thing.

Three months later and Sturtz is fielding questions from a melodramatic media scrum after the Nittany Lions dropped two in a row last season. He can sense the tension rising with every question, so he greets it with a smile.

"You gotta have fun. I mean, if you told us we'd be where we are right now in August then I'd be pretty happy," he says, and his smile grows as if he's convincing himself as he goes along. "You know what? We'll get back on track this

week ... We'll go to Minnesota and have some fun."

That's his other thing, and apparently it has been forever. According to his mother, Jill, he's always just worn his heart on his sleeve. She calls his presence "warm and fuzzy"; Call it what you want, it has a momentum-shifting power no matter where he happens to be.

If he's in the Pegula Arena press room, he might be changing the mood from tense to fun. On the ice he's probably doing the same for his team on a shorthanded breakaway — a statistic he perpetually hovers at the top of the NCAA in. If Joe Louis Arena still existed, maybe you'd find him in the same locker room from the intermission before the 2017 Big Ten Tournament's second consecutive night of double overtime. He was double fistfing pizza and laughing, and why shouldn't he do that again? We saw how it worked out the first time.

"He's a clutch performer ... he's an absolutely clutch performer," Penn State coach Guy Gadowsky says. "His emotion is so infectious ... you can't watch him and not want to go out and play."

While there's no exact statistic for clutch, his NCAA-leading three shorthanded goals on the season are a decent starting point. And he's Penn State's leading scorer, ninth overall in the NCAA with 35 points on 12 goals and 23 assists.

It's just that his stats, as impressive as they are, aren't the whole story. They aren't even most of it.

Andrew Sturtz is the boy who once woke up to the news that a small Canadian town had started him a mayoral campaign. He's the player who showed up to his Penn State recruitment trip missing a row of teeth. He's the man who looks you in the eye and shakes your hand if he recognizes you from Pegula Ice Arena, even when you're nowhere near it.

"He's one of the few faces that comes to mind when you think about what it means to be a Penn State hockey player," said Kara Walters, president of the Roar Zone, which is the team's fan club. "When he sees you, he always makes a point to come over and catch up a little bit. Half the time it's not even about hockey, just day to day stuff."

In that way, he's become an unofficial representative of Hockey Valley (or the "mayor" of what his teammates playfully refer to as Andy Valley). The perfect fit is exactly why it's such a shock to find out he's at Penn State on a whim.

Growing up, all the energy pent up in him was ... a problem. It was a bit more than Jill could handle, if she's being honest, and there's a wall in her basement covered in puck marks if you need some proof. Sturtz grew up in Buffalo and his dad's side of the family was big into hockey, so it made sense to put him in Mini Mites at 4 years old.

What makes less sense is the cycle that started then and never really stopped: He overachieved (which is apparently possible in Mini Mites), someone suggested he aim higher, he went for it — "Why not?" — and excelled. This came to a head when a teenaged Sturtz was so painfully bored of bantam hockey that Jill realized two things: Her son actually has a shot at some sort of future in this game he loves, and she'd have to take one hell of a risk to give it to him. Shipping your child off to juniors is hard enough, but Jill knew he'd only reach his full potential on an older team.

"He was just so, so bored with playing with his age group. He needed to play with older hockey players," Jill said. "We put him in Junior B. He was 15 playing with 20-year-olds. We took a lot of heat for that, but I'll tell you what — it was the best thing for him. I think that made him the person he is today."

Sturtz reflected on the whole experience as "kind of fun," and, "a good way to grow up," because that's how he talks, and he talks how he lives. He clarified that he was "just playing hockey for fun" until he got traded to the GOJHL's Fort Erie Meteors in the middle of the 2012-13 season and his teammates convinced him to aim higher.

Why not?

“When I got [to the CCHL], I didn’t even think Division I was in the cards ... I thought I was gonna play one more year [ever],” he said. “Then things started going my way.”

That’s one way of putting what happened. He scored 104 points in 58 games (51-53–104) for the CCHL’s Carleton Place Canadians, so that’s another way of putting it.

Around the time the points started coming, Sturtz also started modeling his game after Montreal’s Andrew Shaw.

“He kinda makes everyone’s life miserable,” he smirked, “And for me and [smaller] guys, if you wanna play at the next level you gotta be a dog on a bone. You’re going to take a beating some nights, but it’ll be worth it.”

Sturtz and his family had barely even considered college an option, and after that prolific season they figured the next step was the OHL. But it turns out ending the season as the league’s MVP, scoring the most goals, scoring the most points and winning a championship all while modeling your game after Shaw will turn some unexpected heads.

The next season (2014-15) was more of the same — a CCHL championship win, First All-Star Team accolades and the CCHL Playoffs MVP title — so the heads kept turning. Sturtz was fielding offers from a few professional teams and colleges at this point, but nothing felt quite right to him.

What do you do when it’s time to make a life-altering decision and none of the options sit well enough? If you’re lucky enough, you call mom.

Her advice was simple: “When in doubt, don’t do it.”

So he didn’t.

“I’m not comfortable doing this, I’m not gonna sign,” he told her. “And don’t worry mom, something better will come along.”

Carleton Place is a tiny town with 10,644 residents about 30 miles west of downtown Ottawa. Take a roadtrip through Canada and you’d probably glaze right over it, but a fiery free agent was somewhere in there tearing it up — of course it was on Matt Lindsay’s radar. The assistant coach and his eye for recruiting is one of many essential parts that made Penn State hockey a success. So, yes, Lindsay knew about Carleton Place. The weirdest part, though, was when he knew about it — exactly one week after Sturtz chose to hold out for “something better.”

If there’s one thing you need to understand about Sturtz, it’s that he cares more about the way he plays — like Shaw, hopefully — than the number of points he racks up. Lindsay caught right on.

“You could tell he was a guy opponents hated playing against,” he said. “There were a lot of pieces in his game that we felt would fit the way we like to play, regardless of whether his offense or stats would translate from the CCHL to the Division I level. ... We liked the fact that he was a competitive kid with a lot of energy and tenacity.”

That was intriguing enough to Sturtz, but when he visited campus in Pegula Ice Arena’s second year of existence, he saw how hard Penn State was playing against then-No. 1 Minnesota. After that, he saw Pegula’s crowd. Sold.

His future head coach was probably all in on him before this. But one time, Sturtz — this 100-plus points scorer, mind you — showed up to Penn State with his mouth all busted up. Gadowsky, who is missing a tooth himself, interpreted Sturtz’s mess of a smile as something more.

“It was just very evident that with him what you see is what you get,” he said. “The fact that he had no teeth and his mouth was all busted up he gives you an idea of how genuine he is.”

Three years later, a four-point weekend against top-ranked Notre Dame has Sturtz one point shy of becoming the second Nittany Lion to reach the 100 point milestone. Gadowsky is still adamant as ever about two things: That’s not the only thing Sturtz can do, and it’s not even the best thing he can do.

“I actually think his infectious quality is probably even more important than the numbers he puts up,” Gadowsky said.

And really, that’s where all the randomness starts to make sense. A hyper kid in a Buffalo basement became a two-points-per-game stud in juniors, but he was still the hyper kid. When Sturtz said he wanted “something better,” did he mean a coach that could see past his ridiculous numbers through to the real player? Did he want someone who could harvest his Shaw factor, and a place to unleash it where it’s appreciated?

Well, rest assured — Andrew Sturtz is still the most annoying player on the ice. And the Roar Zone loves it.



a sophomore, 35 in 29 so far as a junior. What's different about this season's campaign is the uptick in assists — he already has 23 compared to 2016-17's 15.

Zoom out for a second. Sturtz's career is what happens when you ask yourself 'Why not?' and actually go for it, a ride Jill "never thought would go so long" and Sturtz is determined to "enjoy every day" of. With so much focus on the present, a lot of caution to the wind and a little superstition, there's not much room for thinking that far into the future. Luckily for them, Gadowsky and his staff have. It's the driving force behind his assists this season.

"At the next level, he'll have to distribute and collect a little bit better," Gadowsky said. "It [assisting more] was a small suggestion from the staff at the beginning of the season and we think he's taken it to heart."

So, there's a next level?

"I mean, my main goal is to make a good run at it, get my degree, then see what happens," Sturtz started, of course.

But then he actually continued... "I know a lot of people here think I'm a goal-scorer, but my game, to me, is getting under opponents' skin and being a 200-foot player. There's a lot of guys at the next level who were scorers and had to become complete players."

Hear that? "The next level."

The undrafted free agent attended Penguins training camp over the summer, and sources from more than one National Hockey League team say they are interested.

But don't tell him that. The mayor of Andy Valley is a little tied up at the moment. He's got a 100th point to score, a few hands to shake and quite a few opponents to drive insane. Maybe not in that order.

How one number drove Penn State men's hockey's Trevor Hamilton to become one of college hockey's top defensemen

The term “minus-3” rang throughout Penn State defenseman Trevor Hamilton’s head as he trained tirelessly for his senior season.

Hamilton had just won a Big Ten Tournament championship and put up an impressive stat-line of six goals and 20 assists in his first season with the Nittany Lions, but took one number to heart. The Gross Point Farms, Michigan native wasn’t satisfied with his minus-3 goal differential and dedicated his offseason to making sure it didn’t happen again.

“Last year I was minus-3 and most of our team was in the pluses, so that was something I really wanted to change over the summer,” Hamilton said back in November.

That change in mentality has taken Hamilton’s game to new heights in his senior year. No player in the entire country has been on the ice for more goals this season than Penn State’s No. 11.

With four goals and 18 assists through 24 games, Hamilton is already approaching his point total from last season in 15 fewer games. Only two defensemen, St. Cloud State’s Jimmy Schuldt and Bowling Green’s Alec Rauhauser, have more points than Hamilton.



“He’s the kind of guy that picks his head up and picks corners, he doesn’t just fire away,” Penn State coach Guy Gadowsky said. “He’s a unique defenseman.”

More importantly to Hamilton, his goal differential sits at plus-18, which ranks at the top of Penn State and is the sixth-best mark in the NCAA. He has only played six games this season next to his usual defensive partner and best friend off the ice, Kevin Kerr, but that hasn’t stopped him from having a career year.

Gadowsky said that Hamilton has been pivotal in holding together a blue-line unit that struggled early in the season and has since been hit with long-term injuries to Kerr and Erik Autio. On top of his improvement on the offensive end, Hamilton’s 54 blocks lead the team and is tied for fourth-best nationwide.

“It certainly says a lot,” Gadowsky said. “He’s someone that has the ability to produce on his own. He sees the ice well and he’s a real tough kid. He also can shoot it. He’s got a bit of a goalscorer’s mentality for a guy that’s so defensive and plays so tough.”

Kerr, James Gobetz, Kris Myllari and Derian Hamilton have all lined up to the left of Hamilton this season.

“Obviously [playing] with new partners every week, it’s tough, but I think our D-core meshes well enough that anyone can play with anyone,” Hamilton said.

Hamilton often jokes about how long he’s been in college. He enrolled at Miami (Ohio) back in 2013, only to leave one game into the 2014-15 season to play for the Muskegon Lumberjacks in the USHL.

“I’ve played a lot of hockey in my day,” Hamilton said. “I’ve been in college for a while, so it’s been a long road.”

Unsatisfied with his impact on the physical side of the game and his offensive output of five assists in 30 games — three of them coming in his first two games of the season — Hamilton knew he’d have to dedicate himself to improving his game.

“After leaving Miami, I had to change something obviously, if I wanted to do this long-term,” Hamilton said.

Playing that one game in the 2014-15 season cost Hamilton an entire season of eligibility, but he’s certainly making the most of his time in “Hockey Valley.” Hamilton has stepped up as a key emotional leader for the Nittany Lions, playing in all 63 games over the past two seasons despite various injuries a year ago.

He’s become so vital to the blue and white’s success, that Gadowsky said back in December that he wished he could have Hamilton for 12 more years.

“Even though I don’t have a letter on my chest, I still want to be one of the best leaders I can be,” Hamilton said.





Sophomore forward Brandon Biro brings Alberta grit to Penn State men's hockey

For years, Penn State coach Guy Gadowsky hasn't had to look much farther than the place he grew up when searching for tough, hard-nosed players willing to play his preferred style of hockey.

Gadowsky's physical style of play that emphasizes putting as many shots on goal as possible, traces back to his roots in Edmonton, Alberta.

"If you talk to NHL scouts, they like the grit in Alberta, and we do too," Gadowsky told the Collegian back in 2014.

Even though over 2,000 miles lie between State College and Alberta, five Alberta-natives have headed southeast from the Western-Canadian province to don the blue and white.

Penn State's Alberta pipeline can even be tracked back to a more concentrated epicenter than the province as a whole. All five Nittany Lions hailing from Alberta — current captain James



Robinson, sophomore forward Brandon Biro and former players David Glen, Dylan Richard and Mike Williamson — played in the Alberta Junior Hockey League for the Spruce Grove Saints.

"It's a bit of a hybrid because they have very talented players, but they still, I don't know what it is about Alberta or the Prairies, but they still play a pretty hard-nosed game," Gadowsky said in 2014.

The fifth of those former Saints to come to "Hockey Valley," Biro, is making the case that he's the most talented of them all.

After scoring the first NCAA Tournament goal in Penn State history in a 10-3 victory over No. 7 Union last season, Biro has five goals and 18 assists through 25 games, which combine to rank second on the team in points.

The sophomore's scoring and playmaking prowess along with his ability to play any of the three forward spots have made him a vital piece for a Nittany Lions team looking to defend its Big Ten Tournament title. Even though the 5-foot-11, 160-pound Biro boasts a skillful flair reminiscent of many of hockey's newest generation of players, he checks and battles aggressively in the style of Albertans who have come before him.

Just ask Gadowsky.

"He's just a relentless guy," Gadowsky said. "He's physical. He wins battles."

"His work ethic is just top of the charts. He wants very badly to be a hockey player and he'll do everything in his power to make that happen. Because of that, he's improving so quickly."

Since mid-November, Biro's 17 points lead the team and are tied for third in the Big Ten. He has found that success playing with fellow sophomore Nate Sucece, whose 11 goals are tied for the team lead.

"We trust each other since we've been playing together for so long," Biro said. "We know if we give the puck to one another, we'll get it back. I think we're both pretty fast players and we play well together because we move the puck a lot."

The Nittany Lions started an 11-game unbeaten run on Nov. 17, 2017, but have since dropped three consecutive contests. Gadowsky said he was "100 percent" reluctant to split up the potent duo of Biro and Sucece, but called on the former to jumpstart the blue and white and reverse their recent woes.

Biro moved up to the top line Saturday at No. 17 Michigan to play alongside Chase Berger and Andrew Sturtz.

"[Berger] is a super smart player, he likes to move the puck. He's a guy I like to model my game after," Biro said. "Sturtz obviously, his offense speaks for himself."

Berger, who played with Biro on a few occasions last season, said Penn State's No. 10 is one of his favorite guys to play with.





"Brandon's an unbelievable player," Berger, an alternate captain, said. "His fore-check is so good, he sees the ice really well and I think he's just one of those guys that makes his line-mates better with how he gets on the puck and creates time and space."

It's been a while since one of Biro's teams hasn't made a deep postseason run. With Spruce Grove, Biro led the Saints to a championship in 2014-15, followed by a 10-goal, 10-assist performance in 14 games that resulted in an AJHL finals berth and postseason MVP honors the year after.

Biro's ability to produce in the clutch and Alberta's influence on Penn State were both ever-so-present on the most important goal in program history, Liam Folkes' double overtime winner in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game.

Despite the fatigue of playing 13 periods in three days weighing on his body, then-senior Dylan Richard skated fearlessly back into the defensive zone and knocked the puck away from Wisconsin's Matthew Freytag. The puck found its way over to Biro on the opposite side of the ice, who kicked it in front of him, corralled it and played Folkes through.

Folkes, of course, went onto score to win the tournament and the term "Folkes, from Biro and [David] Thompson," will likely stick in Nittany Lions' folklore until the end of time

With the postseason getting closer and closer with each weekend, Biro is primed to replicate last season's magical run.

"It's not as fun when the games are easy," Biro said. "What we had last year was pretty special and I think we have the guys in this room to do it again this year."



He's not a superstar. But ask anyone: Penn State men's hockey captain James Robinson has helped create the program's culture

Every team in the country searches tirelessly to add guys like James Robinson to its locker room.

His 10 goals and 10 assists in 90 collegiate games certainly don't jump off the stat sheet. He prefers to leave the flashy side of the game to his teammates.

However, Robinson's traits as a grinder who routinely puts his body on the line to benefit the guys skating next to him are desired on their own.

Add in his pedigree as a born leader, and you've got a potential program-changing player.

There's only one Jimmy Pucks, and he's a Nittany Lion through and through.





“Guys like Jimmy Pucks are essential or else you can't win,” Penn State coach Guy Gadowsky said.

Gadowsky doesn't look for players that simply fit in.

Instead, he searches for players — guys like Patrick Koudys, Ricky DeRosa and David Glen — that understand Penn State's culture and have a desire to elevate it.

From every player, though, Gadowsky demands a certain tenacity, grit and toughness on the ice.

Off of it, he wants them to be as loose as possible, deeming team chemistry as the primary factor in the blue and white's success.

In both areas, Gadowsky looks to Robinson as someone the rest of the team should model their approach after.

The owner of one of the cooler nicknames in all of hockey, Robinson has earned the unconditional respect of his teammates and coaches.

“I've lived with him the past two years and he's a guy I've looked up to and we've all looked up to,” junior forward Alec Marsh said. “He doesn't always need to say something to be respected, but he kind of leads by example in the way he acts and carries himself, which is really huge and what you want to see in a captain.”

He's become the consummate representative of Penn State hockey and it's not just because of the “C” sewn on his blue and white jersey.

If a senior's legacy is ultimately determined by leaving a place better than they found it, then consider Robinson's tenure a rousing success.

The Cochrane, Alberta native committed to a program entering its second season in its entire existence. At the time of his commitment, some thought it would be years before the Nittany Lions were even respectable on a national, or even Big Ten, level.

With Gadowsky — who is known for his ability to make the most out of lesser-talented teams — at the helm and a pristine facility in Pegula Ice Arena to call home, the foundation was in place.

Wherever Penn State went from there, was dependent on the people that followed.

One shift.

That's all it took for the course of Robinson's college career to change drastically.

Seconds prior to Robinson's first shift of his sophomore year, Penn State's 2015-16 campaign got off to a perfect start. The Nittany Lions found their opening goal just 1:33 into the year through Curtis Loik.



Now it was Robinson's job to send a message to the Canisius Golden Griffins that they were in for a long night. These were exactly the kind of shifts that Robinson lives for.

Robinson, a left-handed forward, cut into the slot and started to line up a backhanded shot. He thought he had a clean look at goal, before an opposing defenseman took him out at full-force from behind, which knocked Robinson to the ground.

Usually he bounces right back up, ready to hunt down whoever dispossessed him.

This time was different. Robinson knew almost immediately that his left collarbone was broken.

His season had ended not even a full minute after his skates hit the ice for the first time.

Athletes are given an ultimatum when facing a long-term injury. They can let the gloom of having to spend countless hours on the sidelines consume them.

Or, they can choose to use the injury as motivation to better themselves in other ways.

While he couldn't work on improving his wrist-shot or anything on the ice, he was determined to work as hard as anyone else in the weight room, improve his grades and, more importantly, be the best teammate that he could be.

"I tried to use that season not as a season to dwell on and not to use it as a setback, but to try to promote my game," Robinson said.

"Not having to play every weekend, it gave me an opportunity to just be the best teammate possible."

He added that his advances in the weight room aided any future success on the ice, but earning the trust of everyone on the team was as important as anything he's ever done.

"It gave me an opportunity to, in a way, almost be a cheerleader for the team," Robinson told the Collegian in 2016.

As a team-wide injury bug struck the blue and white to the point where forward Kenny Brooks closed the season playing as a defenseman, Robinson was there to boost the squad's morale.

The Nittany Lions faltered down the stretch and missed the NCAA Tournament. They dropped four of their last five regular season games and exited the Big Ten Tournament in the second round via a 7-2 thrashing at the hands of Michigan.

To those that know him, Robinson's response to the adversity thrown his way wasn't too surprising. The end result however, was unheard of.

The support from Robinson — who earned all-Big Ten Academic honors that season — never wavered. He understood what was needed from him in the locker room and the Nittany Lions took notice of it.





Penn State players voted Robinson as an alternate captain the next year. In that moment, Robinson's "elevation" of the program's culture was officially present to those outside of the locker room.

"That is probably single handedly the most proud accomplishment in my hockey career," Robinson said.

Gadowsky isn't caught off guard very often, but in over two decades of coaching, he hadn't seen anything like it.

He was well aware of Robinson's leadership and how well-liked he was in the dressing room, but to this day, it's pretty safe to assume that Robinson is the only player in NCAA history to be voted as an alternate captain a year after playing less than one minute.

"That fact of him being nominated as a captain after one shift speaks absolute volumes to how the team feels about him," Gadowsky said.

It wasn't like Robinson was a superstar on the ice the year before the injury, either. He had just four goals and four assists in 32 games as a freshman, playing mostly on the fourth line.

"It wasn't a surprise to me," Andrew Sturtz said in 2016. "Jim Robinson, he's a one of a kind guy and I think he was the perfect choice for assistant captain."

And what a choice it turned out to be.

The Nittany Lions enjoyed a record-setting year, putting the puck in the back of the net more than anyone else in the nation and earning a No. 1 ranking in January.

Robinson's leadership and willingness to fill the grinder role allowed skill players like Sturtz, Denis Smirnov, David Goodwin, Vince Pedrie, Chase Berger, Nate Sucece and many others to thrive.

It didn't matter that Penn State was two time zones and over 2,200 miles away. Robinson and his father, Jim, fell in love with the school immediately.

At the time, the Nittany Lions were in their opening season as a Division I program and hadn't even joined the Big Ten.

The pair hadn't been contacted by Gadowsky or assistant coaches Keith Fisher and Matt Lindsay yet, but that didn't deter them from hoping that the opportunity would present itself.

"Lo and behold, it was a week later and [Keith] Fisher [reached out]," Robinson said.

Robinson committed to Penn State without ever visiting the school. He held a strong belief that Penn State was capable of becoming a national powerhouse far more quickly than people thought.



"I knew that I didn't have to come down and see it just from what I had talked to with my junior coaches and what my conversations with Gads and Fisher," he said. "I knew.

"By no means, I wouldn't have come here if I didn't think that it was going to be four years of just hacking away at this league and not being able to make an imprint and not having a chance of winning."

Flash forward five years, and Robinson is the Nittany Lions' captain.

Robinson has one final task at Pegula Ice Arena: to earn Penn State another weekend at home.

With a sweep over No. 8 Minnesota this weekend, the blue and white would host the Golden Gophers at home again the following week in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament. Winning that series would likely send Penn State back to the NCAA Tournament.

However, any result other than a sweep this weekend and Robinson will have to bid adieu to Pegula Ice Arena on Saturday.

He'll be honored Saturday at Senior Night alongside Erik Autio, Trevor Hamilton and Matt Erlichman. Robinson's family plans on making the trip.

"Especially with Autio coming in and being with him for four years now, we have a really special bond and we've seen this program come a long way in four years," Robinson said. "It's going to be sad to see it go."

Even with high expectations coming in, Robinson said his experience surpassed anything he could have dreamed of.

Something he probably didn't expect, though, was becoming known as "Jimmy Pucks" throughout the college hockey world from his first semester on.

The famed nickname came via a friend who lived in the house next to where a group of the Nittany Lions' upperclassmen lived. He drew inspiration from Calgary Flames — Robinson's favorite NHL team — forward Johnny Gaudreau, aka "Johnny Hockey."

One would think Robinson's name by birth was Jimmy Pucks based off of how Gadowsky exclusively calls his captain by the nickname. It's reached the point where Gadowsky refers to him as "Pucks" more than "James" or "Robinson."

"It was kind of a random thing and the older guys thought it was hilarious so they brought it to the rink and as soon as [Gadowsky] heard it one time, he took off with it," Robinson said. "He's pretty much the only guy who calls me Jimmy Pucks at this point."

With a 14-13-5 record, the Nittany Lions haven't quite lived up to expectations this season.

But the fact that it's reasonable for Nittany Lions' fans to be upset at a top-20 finish, in which the blue and white were ranked almost the entire year, speaks to how far the team has come.





Robinson joined the team when a gritty, underdog style of play which was necessary for Penn State to stay in games.

“We don’t necessarily look at ourselves as the new kids on the block anymore,” he said. “I’ve liked to think that we’ve made an imprint on the Big Ten and the rest of the NCAA.”

The Nittany Lions have earned a winning record in each year since Robinson’s arrival, and as a result, have attracted NHL draft picks and United States National Team Development Program players.

As the school brings in these higher-profile recruits, the number of players who have experience playing a similar style to Robinson have diminished over the years.

“Him being a part of the program, that’s something I think you can follow along the line of guys like Ricky DeRosa, Patrick Koudys, David Glen, you can go on and on, but guys that are so evidently for the team,” Gadowsky said.

Penn State might not be the underdog anymore and guys like DeRosa are gone, but that same resolute and strong-willed style of play has carried on.

Chicago Blackhawks draft pick Evan Barratt can be found fore-checking and back-checking aggressively each game. Even the speedy and diminutive line of Smirnov, Sucece and Brandon Biro isn’t afraid to get physical.

That buy-in can be attributed directly to Gadowsky and Robinson.

The lasting legacy of Jimmy Pucks won’t be a plethora of goals or assists, but rather wins, trophies, stories and ultimately, his impact on others.

“The people. One-hundred percent,” Robinson said, when asked what he’ll miss most when his time is done. “Especially the guys in the locker room. The guys and the relationships that I’ve built with the guys over these four years, they’re relationships that I never thought I would be able to make here and I’m so happy that I did.

“Not just the people obviously that I’ve played with, but the people on the campus and the people in this community, I’m going to miss that for sure the most.”



How the most perfect of circumstances led to Penn State men’s hockey walk-on Matt Erlichman’s Pegula Ice Arena storybook debut on senior night



As the game clock hit 1:07, a moment so perfectly unlikely occurred at Pegula Ice Arena.

Matt Erlichman, Penn State’s third-string goaltender who walked onto the team following two years with the club program, exited the gates of the Nittany Lions’ bench and skated onto the ice.

It was arguably Penn State’s most important game of the year against No. 8 Minnesota.

Home-ice in the Big Ten Tournament and the NCAA Tournament were both on the line.

A loss, and Penn State’s seniors would never take the ice at home again.

And yet, in pure movie-like fashion, Erlichman, the ultimate underdog, finally had the chance to protect his team’s net.

For two entire years, the only time that Erlichman got to leave the bench was before and after games and during intermissions.





Back in December, he said that simply skating out of the tunnel for warm-ups gave him chills.

"It's unbelievable. The fans cheering," he said. "It's just unbelievable being a part of the experience."

He played three minutes against Robert Morris at PPG Paints Arena in December, but hadn't yet played in front of a Nittany Lions' fanbase longing to cheer him on.

Finally, they could. And at last, Erlichman could take it in.

As it turns out, the most storybook moment in a weekend filled with them was set into motion by the way of a complete coincidence.

Friday night at Pegula, fans erupted into chants of "We want Mat[t]" as Penn State led 5-1 over No. 8 Minnesota.

With it being senior weekend, many thought the chants were for Erlichman, who stayed put on the bench.

"Darn it," Gadowsky said with a look of genuine anguish on his face following the game. "I was not on the ball."

As it turns out, the chants were actually directed at Gophers' goaltender Mat Robson, whose services were requested once again by the Penn State faithful after he was pulled for allowing four goals.

The misunderstanding got Gadowsky thinking.

"Fortunately, I got a question last night that reminded me," Gadowsky said. "I felt a little bit bad that I didn't have [handing Erlichman a debut] in my mind last night so that reminded me."

He knew that he had to think of a special way to honor Erlichman, one of his team's most beloved players.

On top of the regular pre-game senior night ceremony, the Nittany Lions went out of their way to show their appreciation for Erlichman before the game, announcing him as a starter with the rest of Penn State's senior class so he could get an ovation.

To Gadowsky, even that wasn't enough. Erlichman worked his way up from unprecedented circumstances, and he deserved a dream ending.

Gadowsky decided that if Penn State held a three-goal lead late in Saturday's contest, the blue and white's goal belonged to Erlichman. Thus, the chances of the senior getting game action were incredibly slim.

Everything had to fall into place for Erlichman to get into the game.
