THE STORYLINE

Harvard men's lacrosse, receiving votes in both the USILA and Media polls, wraps its three-game homestand with No. 3/3 Penn State Saturday, March 11 at 12 noon. The game will be broadcast on the Ivy League Digital Network with Scott Sudikoff and Ben Altsher on the call.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Through four games, Morgan Cheek has registered 6.75 points per game, sitting second in the country. The junior also ranks No. 2 in goals per game (4.00) and sixth in the nation in assists per game (2.75).
- Three players have tallied hat tricks this season, Morgan Cheek (four times) and Ryan Graff and Joe Lang against UML.
- Junior goalie Robert Shaw made a career-high 21 saves in the 11-7 win over UMass and ranks second in the Ivy League with 12.75 saves per game.
- The Crimson has started 4-0 in each of the last two seasons
- Cheek was named to the 2017 Tewaaraton Award Watch List, the pre-eminent lacrosse award that honors the top male and female college lacrosse player.
- Captaining the team this year will be midfielder Sean Coleman, defenseman Ryan Norton and long stick midfielder Matt Ryan.
- The Crimson graduated three of its top five point getters from a year ago, including leading scorer Devin Dwyer. Juniors Morgan Cheek and Joe Lang ranked 2-3 with 60 and 39 points, respectively. Cheek found the back of the net 36 times, while Lang connected on 22 shots.

LAST TIME OUT

Harvard improved to 4-0 Saturday, outscoring the visiting Catamounts from Vermont, 7-1, in the second half, to rally for the 13-10 victory. Entering the third quarter trailing, 9-6, Harvard's defense and goaltending played shutdown lacrosse for nearly the final 30 minutes of the game. Vermont scored just once the entire half with 2:48 left in regulation.

FRESH FACES

Three rookies have earned starts this year, as Ryan Graff and David Strupp both started each of the first four games. Rookies account for 18 points. In total, seven rookies have seen action this year.

BACK IN ACTION

The Crimson returns 27 letterwinners from a season ago and three players that started 10-plus games. Offensively, two of the top three point-getters are back. Starting goalie Robert Shaw returns between the pipes.

THAT'S A 10-4

A year ago, the Crimson's magic number was 10, posting an 8-2 record when reaching double-digit goals. Harvard was 0-6 when scoring nine goals or less. This season, Harvard is 4-0 when scoring 10-plus.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

Harvard is 33-14 at home under Chris Wojcik '96, The Frisbie Family Head Coach for Harvard Men's Lacrosse, including a 6-2 record over the last two years. The Crimson is 14-10 in Harvard Stadium with Wojcik at the helm, and boasts an 19-4 record at Jordan Field.

HOT START

Harvard is 4-0 for the second-straight year. The Crimson started 4-0 a year ago, tied for its best start since going 5-0 to begin the 2000 season. In the 126 years of the program's history, this marked only the sixth time that Harvard had started 4-0. The best start in program history came in 1961 when the team opened with a 10-0 start.

AGAINST TOP TALENT

Harvard has defeated 15 ranked opponents under head coach Chris Wojcik '96, including five wins over top-10 teams. The Crimson defeated three ranked teams last season.

JUST CHEEKY

Junior Morgan Cheek returns for 2017 after scoring 36 goals and dishing out 24 assists for 60 points in 16 games a year ago. To start the year, Cheek owns 27 points on 16 goals and 11 assists, posting a 22-game point streak.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State, checking in at No. 3 in both the coaches and media polls, owns a 6-0 record heading into Saturday, including wins against Ivy foes Cornell and Penn. Freshman Mac O'Keefe and sophomore Grant Ament pace the team with 29 points apiece, as O'Keefe has found the back of the net 26 times and Ament owns 14 goals and 15 assists. Penn State's starting attack line has accounted for 47 goals and 79 points.

In his seventh season in State College, head coach Jeff Tambroni ranks ninth among all active Division I coaches in career win percentage and was the 2009 USILA Coach of the Year and served as the men's national team assistant coach in 2014.

NOW IN GOAL

Robert Shaw owns an 11-8 career record in goal, with three of his victories coming in overtime. The junior, who started every game a year ago, sports a .546 career save percentage while allowing 10.41 goals against. He made double-digit saves in 13 games and at least 15 saves in five games over his career.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS HOST

The NCAA, Gillette Stadium and Harvard University announced that the 2017 and 2018 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championships will be played at Gillette Stadium, the home of the National Football League's New England Patriots and Major League Soccer's New England Revolution. The Division I, II and III Men's Lacrosse Championships, as well as the Women's Lacrosse Division I Lacrosse Championships, will be played over Memorial Day Weekend, on May 27-29 in 2017 and on May 26-28 in 2018.

The agreement marks the fourth and fifth times the championships will be held at Gillette Stadium, where the event has enjoyed a history of tremendous success. In 2008, Gillette Stadium set attendance records for the Division I final (48,970) and the Division II and III finals (24,317).

Harvard has teamed with the NCAA several times in recent years to host NCAA championship events. In addition to hosting the 2008, 2009, and 2012 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championships, Harvard served as host for the 2006 women's basketball Final Four at the TD Bank Garden, the 2010 fencing championships at Gordon Indoor Track, and the 2013 women's water polo championships at Blodgett Pool.

20-PLUS GOAL SCORERS

Harvard boasted four goal scorers with 20-plus goals last season (Devin Dwyer, 40; Morgan Cheek, 36; Will Walker, 23; Joe Lang, 22). It marked the second-consecutive year that the Crimson completed the feat. Previously under Chris Wojcik '96, the Crimson had never had more than two goal scorers with 20-plus goals in a season.

Dwyer and Cheek were the first Crimson teammates to score 30-plus goals in a season since Jeff Cohen '12 and Dean Gibbons '11 scored 31 goals and 30 goals, respectively, in 2011.

IN THE POLLS

Harvard is receiving votes in both polls this week. Last season, the Crimson ranked as high as No. 8 in the Coaches Poll, its highest ranking since finishing the 1996 campaign ranked sixth. Head coach Chris Wojcik '96 captained that year's team to the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament, earning All-America honorable mention and first team All-Ivy League accolades along the way.

WORKING OVERTIME

The Crimson opened last season with three-straight overtime wins. Based on available information, this is only the second time in NCAA history that a team has won three-consecutive overtime games, matching Fairfield who completed the feat in 2012. Harvard has played a total of four overtime games this season, the most in program history.

IN THE PROS

Stephen Jahelka and Devin Dwyer were selected in the 2016 Major League Lacrosse Draft. The duo became the seventh and eighth players, respectively, drafted from Harvard entering their senior years.

Jahelka was selected in the second round, 14th overall, by the Denver Outlaws, matching Kevin Vaughn '12, who was also taken 14th overall by the Outlaws, for the highest draft slot by a Harvard student-athlete. Jahelka was traded to the New York Lizards in April.

Dwyer was selected in the sixth round, 46th overall, by the Florida Launch. This marked the first time since 2012 that multiple Crimson were in the same draft class.

The duo joins former Harvard standouts Brian Fischer '15 (2015 draft 34th overall, Boston Cannons), Daniel Eipp '14 (2014 draft 32nd overall, Rochester Rattlers), Kevin Vaughn '12 (2012 draft 14th overall, Denver Outlaws), Daniel DiMaria '12 (2012 draft 41st overall, Charlotte Hounds), Jason Duboe '10 (2010 draft 33rd overall, Boston Cannons) and Henry Flood '07 (2007 draft 32nd overall, Washington Bayhawks) in the MLL ranks.

CLOSE CALLS

Harvard is 14-17 in games decided by one goal under Chris Wojcik '96, The Frisbie Family Head Coach for Harvard Men's Lacrosse, including a 5-4 record in overtime.

TEAM USA

Associate head coach Ben DeLuca was named as the assistant general manager for the 2018 Men's National Lacrosse Team. The team will pursue a record 10th gold medal at the 2018 Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Championship in Manchester, England.

HOWDY MYERS MAN OF THE YEAR

Bob Scalise, The John D. Nichols '53 Family Director of Athletics, was selected as the 2015 recipient of the Howdy Myers Man of the Year Award by the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA). The award is given to someone who has contributed to the game of lacrosse in a capacity over and above the normal efforts and in so doing, has shown unselfish and untiring devotion to the game. The award itself is named in honor of Howdy Myers, who coached 17 championship teams at St. Paul's, Johns Hopkins, and Hofstra and was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1971.

The Frisbie Family Head Coach for Harvard Men's Lacrosse
Seventh season | 51-44 overall | 17-19 Ivy League

Chris Wojcik '96 has returned Harvard to the national stage in his six years as the Frisbie Family Head Coach for Harvard Men's Lacrosse.

Harvard reached the title game of the Ivy League Tournament in 2016 after knocking off top-seeded and second-ranked Brown in the semifinal, 13-12. That victory was one of three for the Crimson over a nationally ranked opponent, with Harvard also defeating then No. 4 Duke, 14-9, and then No. 20 Villanova, 13-12. The win over the Wildcats came in the season opener in overtime as the Crimson became just the second team in NCAA history to win three-consecutive games in overtime. At the conclusion of the year Bobby Duvnjak (third team), Devin Dwyer (third team), and Joe Lang (honorable mention) were named to the USILA All-America teams, with a total of six individuals garnering All-Ivy League honors.

In 2014, the Crimson did what no other team had done in 24 years, winning the program's first Ivy League championship since 1990 with a 5-1 conference record. By virtue of its regular season title, the Crimson earned the right to host the Ivy League Tournament at Harvard Stadium, where it advanced to the tournament final for the second time in program history. The feat helped earn Harvard an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament, its first since 2006 and sixth overall, while elevating the Crimson to a ranking of 11th in the nation. Harvard finished the year off with a 10-7 overall record, an impressive 7-1 mark in Cambridge, four wins over ranked opponents, and seven selections to the All-Ivy League teams, the second most in program history. Additionally, Devin Dwyer and Bobby Duvnjak garnered USILA All-America honorable mention honors, and Wojcik was tabbed as the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Coach of the Year.

During his seven seasons at the helm of the Crimson, Wojcik has directed Harvard to a 51-44 overall record, including a pair of 10-win campaigns and 12 wins against ranked opponents. Four members of the Crimson have garnered USILA All-America recognition, while 25 have been named All-Ivy League.

Harvard posted a 7-7 record in 2015 while playing the ninth toughest schedule in the nation. The Crimson faced off against seven programs ranked in the national polls, and picked up three victories versus top-20 opponents. Six individuals received All-Ivy recognition, with five individuals garnering All-New England honors.

In his first season on the Harvard sideline, Wojcik guided the Crimson to a 10-6 overall record, marking the most wins for the program since 1998. Harvard, which earned a spot in the Ivy League tournament final, finished tied for third in the Ancient Eight with a 3-3 mark and earned four all-conference selections, led by Dean Gibbons and Kevin Vaughan who were named to the All-Ivy first team.

During the 2012 campaign, Wojcik led Harvard to as high as a No. 14 national ranking, and the Crimson

began Ivy League play 2-0 for the first time since 1998. Harvard finished the season 5-2 at home and saw three players earn All-Ivy honors, most notably Jeff Cohen and Kevin Vaughan who were tabbed to the All-Ancient Eight first team.

Wojcik, who was an All-American in lacrosse and All-Ivy League selection in soccer for the Crimson before serving as an assistant coach, returned to Cambridge after a two-year stint as the top assistant coach at Penn from 2009-10. In addition to serving as offensive coordinator with the Quakers, Wojcik worked as the team's recruiting coordinator and was able to recruit an outstanding class that included two Under Armour All-Americans.

Prior to his stint at Penn, Wojcik was the offensive coordinator at Bowdoin College in 2008, aiding in the Polar Bears' run to their first NCAA tournament appearance, finishing the season ranked No. 20 nationally and 12-7 overall. Bowdoin's offense ranked first in the New England Small College Athletic Conference that spring.

Previously, he spent five seasons as an assistant coach in Cambridge under former head coach Scott Anderson. As the program's offensive coordinator in 2006, Wojcik oversaw an offense that helped the Crimson earn its first NCAA Championship berth since 1996. Wojcik also spent three years as the team's recruiting coordinator from 2005-07 and was the offensive coordinator from 2006-07.

As a two-sport standout with the Crimson, Wojcik earned lacrosse All-America honors in 1996, captaining Harvard to the NCAA tournament. He led the Crimson to a 15-12 victory against Hofstra in the first round of the tournament before the team fell to Virginia in the national quarterfinals. He completed his career with 134 points on 89 goals and 45 assists, placing him first among midfielders and 15th overall on the program's all-time scoring list.

In addition to his honors on the lacrosse field, Wojcik served as captain of the Harvard soccer team, earning two All-Ivy League honors and leading the team to an Ivy League title and an NCAA tournament appearance in the fall of 1994. Prior to graduation, Wojcik was named the winner of Harvard's Bingham Award, presented to the top male student-athlete in the senior class.

In 2008, Wojcik was a featured speaker at the Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association convention in 2008 for developing offensive personnel and in 2009 for shooting. A member of the New Jersey Lacrosse Hall of Fame and the Westfield (N.J.) High School Athletics Hall of Fame, Wojcik graduated from Harvard with a bachelor's degree in economics. He also earned a master's of education in secondary education/social studies from Boston College in 2007.

Wojcik and his wife, Kathryn, have three children, Jack, Clare and Emily.
