KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Fifth-seed Wisconsin (13-16-5, 9-10-5-2 B1G) opens the postseason with a trip to fourth-seeded and No. 18 Penn State (19-13-2, 11-12-1-1 B1G) for the Big Ten tournament's best-of-three, first-round playoff series. Friday's game begins at 7 p.m. CT, while Saturday is a 5 p.m. start. If necessary, the teams will meet in a deciding game on Sunday at 5 p.m.
- The Big Ten tournament starts this weekend with three best-of-three series. The three teams that advance will join regular-season champion Ohio State in next week's one-game semifinal games at the home of the two highest-remaining seeds. The championship game will also take place at the home of the highest remaining seed the following weekend.
- This weekend's playoff series at Penn State will mark the first postseason meeting between the two schools since the Badgers fell, 2-1, in double overtime to PSU in the 2017 Big Ten Tournament title game at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit.
- This is the sixth year of Big Ten hockey and the Badgers are 3-5-0 all-time in Big Ten tournament games, including 2-0 during the inaugural 2014 season that ended in UW winning the first Big Ten hockey tournament title.
- The Badgers enter the postseason riding a three-game-winning streak, which is equal to their season-long string. That streak started at Penn State on Feb. 23 in a 7-3 road victory.
- Last week, Wisconsin closed out the regular season with 5-4 and 4-3 overtime victories at the Kohl Center over Michigan.
- Penn State split at Notre Dame, dropping a 5-4 overtime contest, before grabbing a 3-2 win over the Fighting Irish.
- The Badgers back-to-back overtime wins at the Kohl Center marked the first time UW accomplished the feat since David Hukalo tallied overtime game-winning goals on consecutive nights Jan. 14-15, 2000, against North Dakota. Steve Reinprecht assisted on Hukalo's goal the first night for the 3-2 win, while Reinprecht and Dany Heatley had assists on the second-night tally in a 6-5 victory.
- Last weekend's overtime victories marked UW's first in overtime since a 4-3 win at Michigan State on Feb. 4, 2017, and the first at the Kohl Center since a 4-3 triumph over Colorado College on Dec. 14, 2013.
- The Badgers were 0-5-8 in their last 13 overtime games since their last win in extra time.



Senior forward Seamus Malone became the 74th Badger in school history to reach 100 points with his first assist last Friday against Michigan. Now with 101 points he shares 67 on UW's all-time list with Ted Pearson, Tyler Barnes and Joe Pavelski.

- Wisconsin is on a three-game winning streak entering the playoffs. UW's last longer winning streak lasted five games, from Jan. 21 through Feb. 4, 2017.
- Last weekend, UW posted its third Kohl Center sweep of the season (Boston College, Michigan State).
- Last Friday, sophomore forward Sean Dhooghe scored two goals and an assist, including the game-winning goal with less than 27 seconds left in overtime to help the Badgers to a 5-4 win.
- Dhooghe's three-point game marked the second of his career. He previously had a goal and two assists against then-No. 1 Notre Dame at the United Center on Jan. 21, 2018, in a 5-0 UW win.
- The game was Dhooghe's third two-goal game this season and the third of his career. He has points in three consecutive contests and five of his last six games (3 goals, 4 assists).
- Senior forward Matthew Freytag made ESPN SportsCenter's top 10 plays for his goal last Friday against Michigan, scoring on a rebound with his back to the goal and shooting through his own legs.
- Freytag scored again last Saturday to post goals in three consecutive games and to extend his career-long point streak to five contests (4g, 1a).
- This is the second time in his career he's had goals in three consecutive games, matching Dec. 5-12, 2015, when he scored four goals in three games against Michigan (2) and Michigan State.
- The end of the season is similar to last year for Freytag when he tallied in four of the last six games on the way to a nine-goal season.
- Senior forward Seamus Malone recorded a pair of primary assists last Friday to become the 74th Badger in school history to eclipse 100 career points. Now with 101 points in 139 games (33 goals, 68 assists), he also took over the team scoring lead from freshman defenseman K'Andre Miller, who has missed seven games this season. Malone has eight goals and 23 points in 34 games this season. He now shares the team lead with sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk and sophomore forward Linus Weissbach.
- His 101 career points are tied for 67th on UW's all-time scoring list with Ted Pearson, the brother of Michigan head coach Mel Pearson, as well as Tyler Barnes, the most recent skater to hit 100 points back in the 2013-14 season and Joe Pavelski, who hit the mark in two years.
- Sophomore defenseman Josh Ess has three goals and four points in the last three games after opening the scoring last Friday against Michigan. Ess' current run accounts for half his career goal total of six in 67 career games. With four points in his last three games, he has four goals and 12 points this season, and six goals and 16 points for his career.
- Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk has points in six of the last eight games, including the lone assist on last Friday's overtime game-winning goal by Sean Dhooghe, and his ninth goal of the season last Saturday against Michigan. One more goal would make him the first UW defenseman to reach double figures in goals since two-time Stanley Cup champion Justin Schultz tallied 16 during the 2011-12 season.
- Kalynuk has two goals and four assists over his last eight games. That gives him 23 points for the season to share the team lead.
- Freshman goaltender Daniel Lebedeff has now started eight consecutive games in goal. UW is 4-4-0 in those contests, but also 4-2-0 in the last five.
- The eight-game starting streak in goal for Lebedeff is the longest since Matt Jurusik started 27 consecutive games from Oct. 17, 2015 through Feb. 27, 2016.
- Freshman Mick Messner has points in four consecutive games (1 goal, 3 assists) for the first time in his career, while linemate junior forward Max Zimmer has assists in four of the last five games. They are skating with Matthew Freytag, who has four goals and five points in the last five games.
- The Badgers' sweep last weekend against Michigan helped them clinch their first winning season at the Kohl Center since the 2013-14 team went 17-2-1 at home. The Badgers are currently 9-7-1 in games at the Kohl Center this year, with an outside chance of playing there again for the Big Ten tournament semifinals and final, if they make it that far.

BIG TEN TOURNEY

- Ohio State clinched the No. 1 seed and a first-round bye for the Big Ten tournament by winning the regular-season title.
- The regular-season winner gets a bye into the semifinals, while the remaining six programs will play in the first round best-of-three series March 8-10 at the home of the second, third and fourth-place teams. The four top remaining seeds will host a single game semifinal the weekend of March 16, while the single-game championship will take place the weekend of March 23.
- The winner of the Big Ten tournament earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

- The Badgers went 5-for-6 on the penalty kill last weekend against Michigan.
- Sophomore forwards Sean Dhooghe and Linus Weissbach shared the team leading for scoring in Big Ten play with 15 points each, though Weissbach missed eight games due to injury. Freshman defenseman K'Andre Miller was one point back, though he missed six league contests.

- With 36 goals and 96 points through 34 games, the Badgers' talented freshmen class accounts for 37.1 percent of Wisconsin's scoring this season.

- Wisconsin's freshman class ranks third in the nation with 96 points.

- UW's freshmen corps ranks first in both scoring and points-per-game among Big Ten rookie squads, averaging 2.83 points per contest in conference tilts. The class' 27 goals and 68 points by rookies also leads the league.
- Weissbach boasts five goals and 12 points over the last 12 games and shares the team lead with 23 points in just 24 games. His 0.96 point-per-game scoring average is tops on the team, fractions ahead of freshman defenseman an team leading scorer K'Andre Miller, who has 22 points in 26 games played.

SHOT AND A GOAL

- Wisconsin has held the shot advantage in 10 of its last 14 games, Despite the edge in shots, UW is 5-7-2 during that stretch.
- The Badgers rank 10th in the country with an average of 32.94 shots per game, but skate against the top shot-taking team in the nation this weekend in Penn State (40.41 shots per game).
- The Badgers are +2.18 in shots per game this season to rank 21st in the country. Penn State is +7.35 to rank eighth.

- In a pair of seesaw games, Wisconsin came out on the winning side in 5-4 and 4-3 overtime games against Michigan last weekend at the Kohl Center.
- Last Friday, UW led 1-0 and 2-1, trailed 3-2, led 4-3, then won with under 27 seconds left in overtime on Sean Dhooghe's second goal of the game.
- Sophomore defenseman Josh Ess opened the scoring with his third goal in two games, while Matthew Freytag and Roman Ahcan also scored goals.
- Goaltender Daniel Lebedeff made 26 saves for the win.
- On Saturday, UW trailed 1-0, led 2-1 and trailed 3-2, before freshman defenseman Ty Emberson tied the game with 1:07 left in regulation. Sophomore forward Linus Weissbach won the game at 2:05 in overtime, after it appeared freshman forward Jack Gorniak won the game moments earlier until a review found UW making an early line change behind the play that wiped out the goal.

athlete who makes significant contributions not only to his or her team but also to the community-at large through leadership in volunteerism.

- Buz' nomination focuses on his work with the Fond Blanc Foundation, a group that works with an orphanage in Fond Blanc, Haiti, that has helped create a school for 450 children, among much other assistance.
- Buz is just the fourth UW skater to be tabbed a finalist for the award, and the first since Andrew Joudrey was nominated as a top-five candidate in 2007. Former Wisconsin winger Erik Raygor won the award in 1998.
- UW women's hockey player Annie Pankowski is also one of the five nominees, whose work focuses on OccuPaws, an organization that trains and pairs service dogs with the visually impaired in Wisconsin and neighboring states.
- Buz scored his first goal in a Wisconsin sweater on Jan. 12 against the U.S. Under-18 Team, though since it was an exhibition, the goal does not officially count in his statistics.
- He has five assists in 31 games in his UW career, not counting exhibition contests.

DEFENSE A STRENGTH

- Wisconsin is one of four schools in the country to boast five NHL draft picks on defense (Minnesota, Notre Dame, Boston University). The Badgers five drafted defensemen include freshmen K'Andre Miller (New York Rangers) and Ty Emberson (Arizona), as well as sophomores Wyatt Kalynuk (Philadelphia), Josh Ess (Chicago) and Tyler Inamoto (Florida).
- The five Badgers' defensemen drafted on the roster is the most for UW since the 2009-10 team had five drafted defensemen on the roster (Justin Schultz, Brendan Smith, Ryan McDonagh, Jake Gardiner, Cody Goloubef). That year, the Badgers had a sixth rear guard, John Ramage, who was drafted following the season.
- Senior captain and two-time honorable mention defenseman Peter Tischke is undrafted.
- The Badgers have 26 goals and 88 points from their blue line. The 26 goals are tied for third in the country, while the 88 points share seventh among the country's defensive corps. The group's 2.59 points-per-game mark is eighth.

- As a freshman defenseman, now sophomore Wyatt Kalynuk produced one of the best offensive seasons for a rookie defenseman in Wisconsin hockey history.
- There have been eight UW freshmen defenseman all-time who have scored at least 25 points.

- Kalynuk's 25 points were the most points for any defenseman at Wisconsin since 2013-14 when Jake McCabe had 25 points (8-17=25).

PETER (AND TYLER AND TY) ON THE BLOCK

- Senior defenseman Peter Tischke is once again among the nation's leaders in blocked shots, sharing 11th in the country with 73 in 34 games.
- First-year rear guard Ty Emberson shares 34th with 60 blocks along with sophomore defender Tyler Inamoto.
- Last season, Tischke ranked 13th in the country with 79 blocks, and 11th with an average of 2.14 blocks per game.
- He was UW's leader for the 2016-17 campaign with 60 blocks.

'KEY' NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Freshman defenseman K'Andre Miller was the first Badger to 20 points this season after posting two assists at Minnesota on Jan. 25-26.
- He's missed the past six games with an injury.
- Should Miller reach 25 points this year, it would mark the ninth time a Badger rookie defenseman eclipsed the mark and would make it two consecutive seasons that a UW rear guard accomplished the feat at Wyatt Kalynuk had 25 points last season.
- Two prior times in UW history, it has had consecutive seasons where rookie defensemen reached 25 points.
- Bob Lundeen (25 points in 1971-72) and John Taft (27 in 1972-73), as well as Brian Engblom (31 in 1973-74) and Craig Norwich (45 in 1974-75), went consecutive season as freshmen defenseman with at least 25 points.
- For the second time in three months this season freshman defenseman K'Andre Miller was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association (HCA) National Rookie of the Month in December. He was also the national rookie of the month in October.
- Miller opened December with a four-point game in the Badgers' 8-5 comeback victory over No. 6 Penn State at the Kohl Center. Miller scored the game-winning goal and tallied three assists to finish with UW's first four-point game since October 2016, and the school's first four-point contest

- by a defenseman since two-time Stanley Cup champion Justin Schultz in January 2012. Miller scored two goals and six points in UW's three games to help the Badgers post a perfect 3-0-0 mark to close out 2018.
- Miller won a silver medal with Team USA at the 2019 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Vancouver and Victoria, British Columbia. He missed the Badgers' series against Denver playing in the tournament.
 - Miller's four-point game against Penn State (1g, 3a) on Dec. 1 marked the first for a UW defenseman since two-time Stanley Cup champion Justin Schultz had two goals and four points against RIT on Jan. 6, 2012, in a 6-3 victory.
 - The Badgers are 7-4-3 when Miller records a point.
 - Miller ranks third in the Big Ten among freshmen with 22 points and shares sixth among all league defensemen.
 - Miller was named the Big Ten First Star of the Week for his five-point weekend against Penn State (Nov. 30-Dec. 1). He had one assist on Friday, then put up a goal and three assists in Saturday's 8-5 win. He scored the game-winning goal in the victory.
 - Miller was the 22nd overall pick by the New York Rangers in this past summer's NHL draft.

MISCELLANY

- Wisconsin has won multiple games in which the opponent scored 5-plus goals. Wisconsin defeated No. 6 Penn State 8-5 on Dec. 1 after knocking off No. 10 Boston College 7-5 on Oct. 13. The Badgers were 1-46-2 allowing 5-plus goals since 2011-12.
- The Badgers have gotten the upper hand to start most games this season, scoring first in 21 of 34 contests. The Badgers are 10-6-5 in those games, but just 3-10-0 when allowing the first goal.

ON THE HORIZON

- Wisconsin signed a six-member recruiting class that includes five forwards and one defenseman. Two of the forwards, Alex Turcotte (Island Lake, Illinois) and Cole Caufield (Stevens Point, Wisconsin), were ranked as first-round prospects for the 2019 NHL Draft by NHL Central Scouting at No. 5 and No. 15, respectively, in the Midterm Rankings, while a third forward, Owen Lindmark (Naperville, Illinois), was ranked at No. 65 among North American skaters. All three of them currently skate with the U.S. Under-18 Team.
- The fourth forward, Dylan Holloway (Bragg Creek, Alberta), will be too young for next year's draft, but is expected to be a top pick in the 2020 NHL Draft. He plays for the AJHL's Okotoks Oilers.
- The latest signee is forward Ryder Donovan, who skates for Duluth East High School and who ranks No. 46 among North American skaters.
- Donovan is one of the 10 finalists for the Minnesota Mr. Hockey Award.
- Defenseman Michael Vorlicky (Edina, Minnesota), who plays for Edina High School, is the sixth signee.
- The three skaters who have signed from the U.S. Under-18 Team skated against the Badgers

on Jan. 12 and combined for three goals and two assists in Team USA's 6-2 win over the Badgers.

- Caufield scored two goals and an assist, and tied Chicago Blackhawks star Patrick Kane for second on the all-time U.S. National Team Development Program scoring list with 84 goals, which he has since eclipsed. Turcotte scored a goal and an assist.
- Though Monday, Caufield leads the U.S. Under-18 Team with 43 goals in 47 games and shares the team lead with 65 points, while Turcotte is fifth on the team with 42 points despite playing just 25 games. His 19 goals are fourth on the squad.
- Holloway leads the AJHL with a 1.7 points per game mark, and ranks second in the league with 88 points in 53 games. He was named the AJHL MVP on Feb. 28.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Five of Wisconsin's top six scorers are made up of underclassmen, including four sophomores and a freshman. That also includes three forwards and two defensemen.

- Sophomores Sean Dhooghe (12 goals) and Kalynuk (nine goals) are two of UW's top four goal scorers.
- Kalynuk's nine goals through 34 games this season are six more than he scored in 37 games last year.
- Sean Dhooghe's 12 goals in 34 games are six more than the six he tallied in 37 games last year.
- Wisconsin's sophomore (108 points) and freshmen (96) classes are seventh and third in the nation among their peers in scoring, respectively.
- Wisconsin has played all nine of its freshmen this season. So far, seven of the eight skaters have scored goals, while the goaltender boasts 10 victories. The freshmen have combined for 36 goals, 60 assists and 96 points.
- The sophomore class boasts 39 goals and 108 points.
- UW entered the season with 16 of its 25 players as either freshmen or sophomores.
- UW's seven-member sophomore class was its highest scoring group last year with 98 points, which ranked sixth among the nation's freshman classes.
- Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk, UW's lone representative on the Big Ten Preseason Watch List, paced UW rear guards last season with 25 points (3 goals, 22 assists). His 22 assists led all skaters on last year's squad. The 25 points made him just the eighth frosh defenseman at UW to reach 25 points in his first season.
- Kalynuk's 25 points had him ranked fourth in the country among the nation's rookie rear guards, behind Minnesota Duluth defenseman Scott Perunovich (36), Denver's Ian Mitchell and Michigan's Quinn Hughes (29).

- Wisconsin is the third-youngest team in college hockey (source: College Hockey, Inc.).

- Wisconsin's junior class boasts just four goals and 14 points to rank last in the nation in scoring among its peers. UW's junior class includes just one skater in Max Zimmer. Goaltenders Jack Berry and Johan Blomquist are also juniors.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Wisconsin power play has one goal in its last 13 games (2-for-41).
- Special teams have been a big part of UW's results this season.
- The Badgers have two games in which they have three power-play goals, both victories (Oct. 20 at St. Lawrence and Oct. 27 against Michigan Tech).
- Prior to this season, UW's power play hadn't connected three times in a game since going 3-for-7 at Denver on Nov. 26, 2016.
- On Oct. 27, UW scored three power-play goals and added a short-handed goal, which proved the game-winner in a 6-2 win over Michigan Tech.
- UW allowed five power-play goals on eight chances in a 6-2 loss on Oct. 26 against Michigan Tech.
- On Nov. 3, UW was forced to kill two power plays in the first 4 minutes, 30 seconds of play, and nine total. The Badgers killed eight of nine power plays, but finally failed while killing a 5-on-3 in overtime at North Dakota.
- On Jan. 25, UW allowed three power-play goals on four chances in a 9-4 loss at Minnesota.
- UW overcame three power-play goals allowed on Jan. 26 at Minnesota for a 4-3 victory. UW went 2-for-5 on the kill, but 2-for-2 in the third period.
- Notre Dame went 3-for-6 on the power play on Feb. 16 in UW's 5-2 loss. The Badgers went 0-for-3 on the man advantage.

HOME-ICE ADVANTAGE

- Wisconsin is 9-7-1 through 17 games at the Kohl Center this year, the most at home since the 2013-14 season.
- The Badgers have their first winning season at home since going 17-2-1 during the 2013-14 campaign.
- That 2013-14 team posted the second-best home winning percentage in school history (.875).

ONCE A BADGER, ALWAYS A BADGER

- Every member of Wisconsin's coaching staff, as well as its director of hockey operations, are graduates of the University of Wisconsin. That

includes head coach Tony Granato, associate head coaches Mark Osiecki and Mark Strobel, volunteer assistant coach Brad Winchester, and operations director Shane Connelly. No other program in the nation boasts having alumni as its head coach and associate/assistant coaches.

- Osiecki won the 1990 NCAA title as a Badger defenseman and was an assistant coach for the team's 2006 NCAA title. He assisted the team during its run to the 2010 NCAA title game, as well.
- Connelly was a goaltender on the 2006 NCAA championships team.

MURDERER'S ROW SCHEDULE

- The Badgers have played the seventh-most difficult schedule, according to USCHO.com's Ratings Percentage Index and the KRACH rankings.
- Wisconsin played 15 of its first 16 games against teams ranked in the preseason polls, and played 29 of 34 regular season games against preseason ranked teams.

CAPTAINS

- Senior defenseman Peter Tischke serves as team captain for the Badgers, while senior forward Seamus Malone serves as alternate captain.
- This marks the first season since 2008-09 that Wisconsin entered a year with only two players as captains or alternate captains. That year, Ben Street and Blake Geoffrion spent the season as co-captains.

THE NHL DRAFT

- Three Badgers were drafted in the first four rounds of the 2018 NHL Draft.
- This marks the third consecutive season in which at least three Wisconsin skaters have been drafted.
- Freshman K'Andre Miller became the 13th Badger to be drafted in the first round when he was selected 22nd by the New York Rangers.
- Rookies Ty Emberson and Jack Gorniak were also drafted, with Emberson going to the Coyotes with the 73rd overall pick in the third round and Gorniak being picked up by the Canadiens in the fourth round as the 123rd overall pick.

- The Badgers have ranked among the top three schools in national attendance average every year dating back to the 1969-70 season, leading the country 38 times over that 49-year span.
- The Badgers are averaging 10,044 fans per game at the Kohl Center this season to rank second in the country.

PELTON-BYCE TO THE WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

- Junior forward transfer Ty Pelton-Byce, who is sitting out this season after arriving on campus for the second semester, was named to the 22-man roster for the 2019 Winter World University Games, which take place from March 1-9 in Krasnoyarsk, Russia. Pelton-Byce played the last two seasons at Harvard, where he had 11 goals and 33 points in 66 games, including 10 goals and 25 points his sophomore season.
- Pelton-Byce is the son of Wisconsin 1990 NCAA champion John Byce and former Badger track and field athlete Alicia Pelton.

MARK JOHNSON TO THE RAFTERS

- Wisconsin retired its first men's hockey jersey during a pregame ceremony on Saturday, Feb. 9. The program's all-time leading goal scorer with 125 goals in 125 games, Mark Johnson watched as his No. 10 jersey was raised in the Kohl Center. Johnson, the leading scorer for the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team with 11 points, scored two goals in the 'Miracle on Ice' game against the Soviet Union, then assisted the game-winning goal and added an insurance short-handed tally in the final game against Finland to clinch the gold medal. Currently the head coach of Wisconsin's women's program, he has directed them to four NCAA titles during his coaching tenure. He led the 2010 U.S. Women's Olympic Team to the silver medal. He holds the USA Hockey record for games played and points at the world championships and ranks second all-time with eight appearances at the event.
- During the ceremony, freshman defenseman Ty Emberson, who wore No. 10 for the first 27 games of his Badger career, handed Johnson his jersey and changed his number to 21. Though he picked 21 because of a relative, the No. 21 was worn by UW head coach Tony Granato, Hockey Hall of Fame defenseman Chris Chelios and NHLer Derek Stepan, among others, when they played at Wisconsin.

- Emberson went on to record the primary assist on UW's lone goal of the game.

NHL NOTES

- With a goal against the New Jersey Devils on Oct. 14, the 2006 NCAA champion for the Badgers and current San Jose Sharks captain Joe Pavelski scored his 700th career NHL point.
- Pavelski is the 28th American in NHL history to hit the 700 point mark. Pavelski is also only the fifth player to be drafted 200th or later to reach that mark, joining Dave Taylor, Pavol Demitra, Henrik Zetterberg, and Steve Sullivan.
- Pavelski played in his 900th career NHL game on Tuesday, Oct. 30 when his Sharks took on the New York Rangers.
- Pavelski scored his 20th goal of the season in his 32nd game of the season, giving him six consecutive 20-goal years and 10 20-goal seasons in his NHL career, more than any other Badger in history. He was tied with Dany Heatley at nine seasons.
- As of Tuesday morning, Pavelski shared fifth in the NHL with 36 goals this season.
- Pavelski is a 10-time, 20-goal scorer; a five-time, 30-goal scorer; and owns one 40-goal season in the NHL.
- Pavelski played in his third NHL All-Star Game on Jan. 26, which took place in San Jose, California.
- Former Badger defenseman Ryan Suter played in his 1000th career contest on Oct. 25 when his Minnesota Wild played the Los Angeles Kings in St. Paul, Minnesota.
- Suter is one of 11 American-born defensemen all-time to score 500 points.
- Including Suter, four of the 11 all played at Wisconsin (Chris Chelios, Gary Suter, Brian Rafalski).
- Philadelphia Flyers goaltender Brian Elliott sits two shutouts shy of 40 for his career. Only 43 goaltenders in NHL history have reached the mark.
- Anaheim Ducks' forward Ben Street (31 years, 239 days) became the oldest player in franchise history to score his first career goal when he did so on Oct. 10 against Arizona.
- Arizona forward Derek Stepan played in his 600th career game on Oct. 10, the same game of Street's first career score. That made Stepan the first player selected outside the first round of the 2008 NHL Draft to reach the milestone.
- As of Tuesday morning, Minnesota Wild defenseman Ryan Suter (43 points) ranks 13th, while Tampa Bay Lightning defenseman Ryan McDonagh (33 points) shares 28th and Toronto Maple Leafs defenseman Jake Gardiner (29 points) shares 38th in NHL scoring among rear guards.
- As of Tuesday morning, Nashville Predators forward Craig Smith was four goals shy of his fifth 20-goal season, though he just returned from a stint on the injured reserve list.
- Pittsburgh defenseman Justin Schultz, who recently returned from an injury, has 10 points in 12 games this season,
- Forward Trent Frederic made his NHL debut on Wednesday, Jan. 29 for the Boston Bruins. The 29th overall pick of the 2016 NHL Draft, Frederic became the 84th all-time Badger in the NHL.

HEAD COACH TONY GRANATO

THIRD SEASON

Tony Granato, Wisconsin's fifth head coach since 1966, began a new era for Wisconsin hockey upon his hiring in 2016.

Granato led the Badgers to a 20-15-1 record in his first season at the helm after the program won just 12 of 70 games the previous two seasons. Named the 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year and a finalist for national coach of the year, he saw his team reach the Big Ten Tournament championship game and finish second overall in the conference. Six Wisconsin players received All-Big Ten honors, including Big Ten Freshman of the Year Trent Frederic, while sophomore captain Luke Kunin became a second-team All-American during his season under Granato's tutelage.

Granato accepted a new challenge for the 2017-18 season and served as head coach of the U.S. Olympic Team that finished seventh in the 2018 Olympic Winter Games in PyeongChang, South Korea, falling a shootout short of reaching the medal round.

Having come to Madison directly from an assistant coach position for the Detroit Red Wings, Granato spent 13 NHL seasons as either a head coach or assistant coach, a year after retiring from a 13-year NHL playing career.

The Wisconsin alum was 72-33-17 during his first head coaching stint with the Colorado Avalanche, which included the Northwest Division title in 2002-03 and a runner-up finish in 2003. He owns a 102-78-17 coaching record with the Avalanche when including his 2008-09 season at the helm of Colorado.

The Downers Grove, Illinois, native spent three-plus seasons as an assistant coach with the Avalanche, before five seasons with the Pittsburgh Penguins (2009-14). During his time in Pittsburgh, the Penguins collected at least 101 points in each of his seasons and won a league-best 36 games during the 48-game campaign in 2012-13. The run included three division titles.

Teams Granato served as head or assistant coach posted winning records in 12 of his 13 seasons in the NHL.

Granato also served as an assistant coach for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Team, where he coached former Badgers Ryan McDonagh, Joe Pavelski, Derek Stepan and Ryan Suter, among other of the world's star skaters. The team finished fourth.

A four-time 30-goal scorer in the NHL, Granato was originally picked in the sixth round, 120th overall by the New York Rangers in the 1982 draft. In his first season in the NHL, during the 1988-89 campaign, Granato put up 36 goals, which still stand as New York's record for rookie goal scoring. His 63-point effort that season got him a spot on the 1988-89 NHL All-Rookie Team.

Granato skated for the New York Rangers, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks during his 13-year playing career. He helped the Kings reach the 1993 Stanley Cup Final, playing alongside Wayne Gretzky. He tallied six goals and 17 points in 24 playoff games during the run. That same year, he recorded a career-high with 82 points (37 goals, 45 assists), one season after posting a career-high 39 goals.

After a serious on-ice injury early in 1996, Granato returned to the ice the following season after a trade to San Jose and played in the 1997 NHL All-Star Game. He went on to win the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy following that season in 1997 for his dedication to hockey.

A member of Team USA at the 1988 Olympic Winter Games, Granato tied for second on the team with eight points, including seven assists for the seventh-place Americans. The seven assists are tied for third all-time for Team USA at one single Olympics. His three assists in a game on Feb. 13, 1988 against Austria are tied for second on the all-time list, one off the team single-game record.

The 1988 Olympics marked Granato's sixth appearance at a major international event for Team USA. He played for the Americans at the 1983 and 1984 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships, and skated at the 1985, '86 and '87 IIHF World Championships. He skated in a seventh major international event for Team USA at the 1991 Canada Cup.

A two-time All-American for the Badgers, Granato was a finalist for the 1987 Hobey Baker Memorial Award after his 73-point senior season. In addition to serving as the Badgers' captain during the 1986-87 campaign, Granato was named the WCHA Student-Athlete of the Year and the team's Spike Carlson MVP award winner. A member of the UW Athletics Hall of Fame, he finished his Badger career as the school's fourth-leading scorer with 220 points, ranking third with 100 career goals.

Granato and his family have strong ties to Wisconsin as his brother and former UW associate head coach, Don, skated for the Badgers (1987-91). A second brother, Rob, also skated for UW (1992-94), as did cousin Kevin (1997-2001). Granato's sister, Cammi, is in the Hockey Hall of Fame as one of the greatest women's hockey players in history. She was recruited to play soccer at Wisconsin before Badger women's hockey began, but instead went on to star with the Providence women's hockey program in the early 1990s. She dropped the ceremonial first puck before the inaugural game of Wisconsin women's hockey in 1999 at the Kohl Center.

Tony and his wife, Linda, reside in Madison. They are the parents of four grown children, including Michael, Nicholas, Dominic and Gabriella.

Granato completed his degree during his first year as UW head coach, graduating in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in human development and family studies.

KOHL CENTER

- The Kohl Center, which opened in 1998, is the second largest on-campus rink in the nation (15,359). The only on-campus facility with a larger capacity is Value City Arena (17,500) in Columbus, Ohio
- Wisconsin has won at least 11 games in a season at the Kohl Center on 10 occasions.
- The Kohl Center played host to NCAA regional action for the first time in 2008 when the NCAA Midwest Regional took place on March 29-30. The building had previously played host to the 1998 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, a 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Regional and a 2007 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Quarterfinal contest.
- The Kohl Center cost \$76.4 million to construct and is named after U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW graduate who donated \$25 million towards the project.
- The Kohl Center ice sheet is 200 feet long by 97 feet wide.
- Some of the names of players from opposing teams who have played in the building include Patrick Kane, Jonathan Toews, David Backes, Duncan Keith, Ryan Miller, Carl Hagelin, T.J. Oshie, Paul Stastny, Matt Carle, Kyle Okposo, Jack Eichel and Auston Matthews, among others.
