PENN STATE HOCKEY

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

• Penn State returns home to Pegula Ice Arena as Big Ten play rolls on with a pair of games against Michigan State on Friday and Saturday.

• This weekend marks the 15th and 16th meetings between the two schools with the Spartans holding the 6-5-3 series advantage. However, Penn State swept the season series last year outscoring MSU 18-6 over the four games.

LAST TIME THEY MET

• The two teams played their tightest game of the season in the series finale last season on February 13, 2016. After 65 minutes, the score was tied 2-2, but the Nittany Lions secured the extra point with a shootout win as Ricky DeRosa lit the lamp and Eamon McAdam stopped all three chances by the Spartans.

RANKING SHAKEDOWN

• Penn State has been ranked in both the uscho.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine national polls for ten consecutive weeks, which is a new program-best.

• They have been in the top-10 of the polls for seven consecutive weeks, including the last five weeks inside the top-5.

• Last week Penn State reached an all-time program high with a No.2 ranking in each poll and this week they set new program records for first-place votes receiving six in the uscho.com poll and eight in the USA Today poll.

• The Nittany Lions have also been consistently in the No. 1 or No. 2 spot in the PairWise rankings for the last few months.

RECORDS ARE MEANT TO BE BROKEN

• In just 17 games played this season freshman Denis Smirnov has already broken two Penn State single-season freshman records for assists (18) and points (28).

• The Rookie broke the latter with his assist on Chase Berger's empty net goal to ice the victory for the Nittany Lions against Ohio State last Saturday.

• Smirnov currently leads all freshman in the country with his 28 points, which also ranks first in the Big Ten and 12th in the nation. He has nine multi-point games on the season and has only been held off the scoresheet twice.

• His 18 assists also lead the conference and place him 11th nationally, but first amongst first-year players while his 10 goals are tied for third in the nation for freshman and lead the Big Ten.

TURN UP YOUR AUTO

• Junior defenseman **Erik Autio** caused a defensive zone turnover before skating into the offensive end where he fired a wicked wrist shot beating OSU goaltender Christian Frey over the glove, off the post and in for a third period goal during Saturday's 4-2 victory.

• The goal, just the fifth of his career and second of the season, gave the Finn 36 career points placing him on a clear of teammate **Vince Pedrie** for second all-time for Penn State blue liners trailing just Luke Juha '16 (60).

OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

• Not many d-man shoot the puck more than **Vince Pedrie**. In fact averaging 5.06 shots per game, the sophomore ranks third in the country and is the only blue liner in the top-20 nationally. His 86 shots on goal lead the team and rank fifth in the nation.

• Pedrie is also third on Penn State's all-time scoring list for defenseman with 35 points on 13 goals and 22 assists. His 13 goals rank second all-time for his position at Penn State as he is just two back of Luke Juha '16 for the all-time record.

JONES EYEING MCADAM

• Freshman **Peyton Jones** secured his 12th win of the season against Ohio State on Saturday and he now sits just a single victory away from tying **Eamon McAdam** for the Penn State single-season record which he achieved last season.

• The freshman's 12 wins are already a Penn State freshman record and rank tied for fifth in the nation.

• Jones also ranks seventh in the country with a 1.98 goals against average while his .919 save percentage ties for 18th nationally. The rookies GAA tops the Big Ten while his save percentage is good for second behind Michigan's Hayden Lavigne.

KILL OR BE KILLED

• The Nittany Lions possess the best penalty kill in the nation holding opponents off the score board 90.5 percent of the time with the man-advantage.

• Penn State even killed off two 5-on-3 power plays in Saturday's win against No. 11 Ohio State, however, when trying to kill a third such situation they surrendered their first PPG in their last 21 chances.

WE'VE GOT THE POWER "PLAY"

• Penn State ranks 11th in the country on the power play scoring 21 times in 95 chances (22.1 percent) in their first 17 games averaging more than 5.5 power-plays per game.

• In conference play Penn State has converted 5-of-15 (33 percent) man-advantage chances into goals.

FINAL COUNTDOWN

• Penn State has been great at finishing teams off this year as they hold a 13-0-1 record when leading after the second period.

• The Nittany Lions are outscoring their opponents 26-14 during the final 20 minutes on the season. This past weekend at Ohio State, PSU held a 17-3 shot advantage in the final period as they tried to erase a two-goal deficit on Friday night. On Saturday they netted three third period goals to pull away and secure the victory.

• Last Friday marked just the second game all season that Penn State hasn't scored a third period goal. The other was during a 3-3 tie against Notre Dame on October 21, 2016.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE



Michigan State enters the weekend losers of seven straight games and besides a 5-1 victory over the USA Under-18 team, the Spartans haven't beaten an NCAA opponent since a 4-3 upset at North Dakota on November 26, 2016.

• MSU is being outscored 33-13 over their seven-game losing streak including a pair of 5-1 setbacks last weekend at Wisconsin.

• Michigan State is led by Winnipeg Jets draft pick Mason Appleton with eight goals and nine assists for 17 points. Only freshman Taro Hirose has also registered double-digit points so far this season as he has 11 (3G, 8A).

• The Spartans are only averaging 2.22 goals per game which ranks them 52nd in the nation while they are allowing 4.00 goals per game by their opponents to rank 56th nationally.

• The Spartans also struggle on special teams as they possess the worst penalty kill in the nation stopping just 69.8 percent of the opposition's man-advantage chances while only scoring on 13.8 percent of their own power play opportunities to rank 46th in the country. Their 13 PPG's this season also ranks tied 50th ahead of just six other teams.

• MSU hasn't found consistency between the pipes this season after losing Jake Hildebrand to graduation. Junior Ed Minney has seen the majority of action appearing in 15 games with a 4-9-1 record, 3.54 goals against average and a .882 save percentage. Freshman John Lethemon has made four appearances with a 0-4-0 record, 4.76 goals against average and a .842 save percentage.





ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END

• Friday night's loss broke a number of current streaks for Penn State including their program-best 13-game unbeaten streak and 11-game winning streak.

• The loss also snapped a seven-game streak of scoring first in games and when doing so Penn State holds an 11-0-1 record this season.

DEFENSIVE DANDY

• Junior defenseman **Trevor Hamilton** has rattled opposing offenses with powerful hip checks and a team leading 38 blocked shots.

• With an assist during Saturday's victory, the junior is now just three assists shy of tying Luke Juha '16 for the Penn State single-season record by a defenseman with 16 during the 2015-16 season.

• Hamilton is currently second on the team in points with 16, which tie for the Big Ten lead for defenseman. His blocked shots total also tie for third in the conference.

A CLASS OF THEIR OWN

• Penn State is led by their freshman class with 75 points, which ties for the national lead in freshman scoring. The rookies have potted 30 goals and added 45 assists. This accounts for 36 percent of Penn State's total offense.

• The sophomore class is second with 58 points (28G, 30A). Together the two classes combine for 65 percent of PSU's total offense and an eye-popping 75 percent of goal scoring. Safe to say the future is in good hands!

RECAPPING OHIO STATE

• After 34 days off Penn State was shutout, 3-0, in the opening game of the series. This was the first time since a 5-0 loss at Minnesota on March 13, 2015 that the Nittany Lions had been held without a goal.

• Penn State fell to just 1-4 in their first game back from winter break since making the leap to the Division I ranks during the 2012-13 season.

• The Nittany Lions came back to earn a split with a 4-2 victory on Saturday night. Penn State outshot Ohio State 99-47 for the series.

• Freshman **Brandon Biro** collected the first multi-point game of his career while senior **Ricky DeRosa** potted the fifth shorthanded goal of the season for Penn State and it proved to be the game clinching tally.

RECAPPING 2015-16

Penn State put together its best season during it's young existence earning the first 20-win campaign for Guy Gadowsky as the Nittany Lion Bench Boss with a 21-13-4 record while posting their second-straight winning season in Big Ten play (10-9-1-0).

• Penn State set 7 new single-season program standards during 2015-16 including most wins (21), most points (366), most goals (140), most assists (226), most shots (1,579), most shots/game (41.55) and most goals/game (3.68).

• For the third straight season the Nittany Lions won their

- Nittany Lions climb to as high as No. 14 in the uscho.com poll on numerous occasions while also earning their first-ever USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine ranking debuting at No. 15 in the December 14, 2015 poll.

- Penn State sweeps Wisconsin January 15-16, 2016.

- Penn State beats Minnesota, 5-3, at Mariucci Arena marking the first Nittany Lion victory in Minneapolis, February 6, 2016.

- **Vince Pedrie** earns All-Big Ten Second Team honors as well as All Freshman Team laurels.

- **David Goodwin** earns second-straight All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH

- Penn State, entering its fifth season of varsity hockey, was picked fourth for the second consecutive year in the Preseason Coaches' Poll behind Minnesota, Ohio State and Michigan, but ahead of Wisconsin and Michigan State in the preseason poll.

- The Nittany Lions were picked sixth in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. Penn State exceeded expectations last season, leading the Big Ten for stretches of the season and finished third in the regular season and advanced to the Big Ten semifinals.

GOODWIN, PEDRIE NAMED B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Forward **David Goodwin** and defenseman **Vince Pedrie** were among the 13 athletes named to the Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch List on Monday, Sept. 26.

- Goodwin, returns as the leading point scorer from last seasons roster with 38 on 11 goals and a career-best 27 assists. His 27 helpers was also a new single-season program record.

- Goodwin is currently the career leader in points (90) and assists (57) while his 33 goals rank him third all-time. His 90 points in currently 8th in all of college hockey for current players.

- The senior's 72 points over the last two seasons are the most in a two-year stretch in program history as he boasts the second and third best scoring seasons behind Casey Bailey's 40-point outburst in 2014-15.

- A double major in economics and Spanish, Goodwin has been an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention the past two seasons.

- Pedrie, a communications, Arts and Sciences major, missed the final six games last season due to injury, but was still a unanimous pick for the Preseason Watch List by the opposing coaches.

- The strong d-man with a wicked shot returns as the

leading goal-scoring defenseman in conference games last season with seven. He finished the year with eight goals and 14 assists for 22 points, good for eighth on the team.

- On Sept. 8, head coach **Guy Gadowsky** announced that senior forward **David Goodwin** would be the fourth Nittany Lion to wear the 'C' in 2016-17.

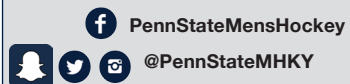

PACKING THE PEG

• Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 54-of-56 home games, including all 18 during the 2015-16 season.

• More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 35 occasions including 15 games last season.

• In 2015-16, Penn State ranked seventh in average attendance (6,093) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (105.4 percent).

• Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 109,681 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena, which is the most in the facilities short three-year history.

WELCOME HOME

• Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

• The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

• The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

• Penn State has 27 players on the 2016-17 roster and after dealing with injuries throughout the majority of last season they are excited about this added depth. With 16 forwards and eight defensemen the internal competition and confidence is high.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

• The Big Ten is in its fourth season entering 2016-17. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 20 league games, including 10 home contests.

• Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a shootout win and one point for a shootout loss.

• Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

• The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only major football conference to sponsor men's hockey.

• The 2017 league tournament will take place at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. with the tournament champion earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 17th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2016-17. Gadowsky is currently coaching his fifth Penn State varsity team.

AT PENN STATE

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions rise continued as Gadowsky led Penn State to their best finish since making the leap to NCAA Division I status. The Lions secured their first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

Those 2015-16 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of

the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign had gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten teams (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL arena (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, pre-





sented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

While at Princeton, Gadowsky had more than 20 players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalembe (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, who were ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

In addition, Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

In addition, Gadowsky spent a portion of the 1993-94 season competing with the Canadian National Team and also played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.

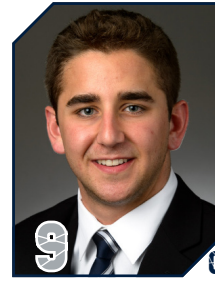
