- · Matthew Mackrides tied the game with 1:38 left in the fourth before Danny Henneghan scored the game-winner 1:22 into the overtime frame.

- · Lehigh's 7-1 start continues to match its 1969 squad for best start in program history.
- · The Mountain Hawks are 3-1 against ranked opponents having beaten No. 19 Pennsylvania,
- No. 4 North Carolina and No. 15 Yale.

- · Junior attackman David DiMaria leads the team in goals (11), assists (12) and points (23).
- $\cdot$  Junior midfielder Ryan Snyder has recorded 55 ground balls.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- · Penn State fell to No. 3 Massachusetts, 9-8, in overtime at the Penn State Lacrosse Field.
- · In a back-and-forth game that produced seven lead changes, Matthew Mackrides, who scored three goals, tied the game with 5:30 left before Massachusetts won in OT.
- Mackrides registered a hat trick for the first time
   since a four-goal outing against Drexel on April
   9, 2011.
- · Tom LaCrosse scored twice against the Minutemen for the third straight game.

#### **ALL-TIME IN CONFERENCE OPENERS**

- $\cdot$  Since Penn State joined a conference beginning in the 2000 season, the Nittany Lions are 2-11 in conference openers.
- · Penn State was 1-9 as a member of the ECAC (2000-09) and is 1-2 in the CAA (2010-pres.).

#### PENN STATE IN THE CAA

- · Penn State, which joined the CAA for the 2010 season, is 5-7 all-time in conference games.
- The Nittany Lions were 1-4 in 2010 and improved to 4-2 during head coach Jeff Tambroni's

first season.

 $\cdot$  In 2011, the Nittany Lions clinched home-field advantage for the CAA semifinals.

#### **DENVER RECAP**

- Penn State's three-game win streak was snapped with a 14-6 loss to then-No. 11/13
   Denver.
- · Jack Forster and Nick Dolik scored two goals each. Shane Sturgis and Travis Crane also scored.

#### **DEFENSE DOMINANT IN PAIR OF WINS**

- · Penn State allowed only five combined goals in wins against Notre Dame and Denver.

· Sophomore goalkeeper Austin Kaut was named CAA Player of the Week on Feb. 27 after an 18-save performance against then-No. 2 Notre Dame.

#### MANLEY TABBED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

· Freshman attack Pat Manley was tabbed CAA Rookie of the Week after totaling two points (1g, 1a), a ground ball and caused turnover in Penn State's 16-9 win against Michigan.

#### **MICHIGAN RECAP**

- · Penn State defeated Michigan, 16-9, in the firstever game at the new Penn State Lacrosse Field.
- · After leading 4-2 at halftime, Penn State erupted with nine third-quarter goals en route to the victory.
- · Senior attackman Jack Forster tallied game highs in both goals (5) and points (8).

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

- · The Nittany Lions played their first-ever game at the new Penn State Lacrosse Field on Feb. 18
- · Senior midfielder Matthew Mackrides was the first Nittany Lion to score on the new field with 5:13 left in the first quarter.

#### **SENIOR CAPTAINS**

- · Seniors Ryan Link, Matthew Mackrides and Ryan McGarvey were tabbed captains for the 2012 season.
- $\cdot$  Mackrides is the first two-time captain since Dave Daniecki, Greg Jackson and Tolleison Morriss each served in 1996-97.

#### TAMBRONI IN YEAR TWO

- · Head coach Jeff Tambroni will enter his second year with the Nittany Lions in 2012. At Cornell, Tambroni went from 7-6 in his first year to 11-4 and an NCAA tournament berth in his second season.
- · Tambroni holds a 116-47 career record as a head coach. His .712 winning percentage is good for sixth among active head coaches with a minimum of 100 games.

#### **PLAY FOR PARKINSON'S SERIES**

- · During the fall season, Penn State participated in the Play for Parkinson's Series against Army and Johns Hopkins.
- $\cdot$  The series benefitted the ProjectSpark foundation, which raises money toward finding a cure for the disease.

#### **TEAM RUNS IN THON 5K**

- · Penn State was part of the more than 6,425 people who helped kick off the THON season when it participated in the 11th annual THON 5K on Oct. 24, 2011.
- $\cdot$  The 3.1 mile race supports THON's goal of raising funds and awareness for the fight against pediatric cancer.
- $\cdot$  The Four Diamonds Fund has raised more than \$78 million since its inception in 1973.
- · THON 2012 raised a record \$10.68 million.
