

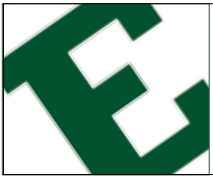

EMU LEADS THE ALL-TIME SERIES:  
1-0

- Saturday marks the second time that Penn State and Eastern Michigan have met on the hardwood
- EMU defeated PSU in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, 71-68, March 17, 1991 on its way to the Sweet 16
- Penn State is the backend of two Big Ten opponents for the Eagles this season
- Since Rob Murphy took over, EMU is a 2-6 versus teams from the Big Ten Conference
- Saturday's contest is the second game of a stretch where the Eagles play 4-of-5 games on the road
- Last season, the Green and White was 1-1 against opponents from the Big Ten

**YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com)** -- The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team is rolling, winning its last three games, including its most recent triumph with an 80-73 victory on the road at the University of Nebraska Omaha Tuesday night. Coming off their first road win of the 2015-16 season, the Eagles (5-2, 0-0 MAC) look to win their fourth-straight game Saturday, Dec. 5, when they travel to State College, Pa. to square off with Pennsylvania State University. Tipoff from the Bryce Jordan Center is slated for noon.

The Nittany Lions (4-2, 0-0 Big Ten) are hitting the floor following a 67-58 victory over Boston College Wednesday, Dec. 2, as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. PSU has split its last four games, but holds a 3-1 record inside the Bryce Jordan Center during the 2015-16 campaign, with its only loss coming to Radford, Nov. 20.

**FINDING THE GAME AT HOME:** The Eastern Michigan versus Penn State matchup can be found both on the radio and on television Saturday. Fans can dial into 89.1 FM or listen over the internet at WEMU.org to hear the smooth sounds of veteran play-by-play voice, **Chad Bush**. Joining Bush on the call this season will be analyst Assistant Athletic Media Relations Director **Sean Hostetter**. Coverage on 89.1 WEMU will begin 10 minutes prior to the tip of each game this year.

In addition to the WEMU broadcast, the Eagles' game at the Bryce Jordan Center will be broadcast live on the Big Ten Network. The play-by-play man for Monday's action will be Wayne Randazzo, while Jon Crispin will breakdown the game alongside Randazzo. For those who cannot get to the TV set, the game can be streamed live via BTN2Go.com or the BTN2Go app on your mobile devices if you have a television subscription to the Big Ten Network.

**ALL-TIME VERSUS THE NITTANY LIONS:** Saturday's noon contest with the Nittany Lions will be just the second time that Penn State and Eastern Michigan will square off on the hardwood. The only other time the Green and White took on PSU was back in the 1991 NCAA Tournament when Eastern Michigan dispatched the Nittany Lions, 71-68, to advance to its first and only Sweet 16 appearance.

The No. 12-seeded EMU squad took on the No. 13-seeded Nittany Lions on March 17 at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. **Marcus Kennedy** led the way, with 21 points, while **Lorenzo Neely** went off for 18 as Eastern Michigan took care of business and moved on to the Sweet 16 after a 71-68 victory. EMU fell to the No. 1 overall seed, North Carolina, 93-67, in its next game.

**MURPHY VERSUS THE BIG TEN:** Already dropping a contest to Big Ten Conference member Michigan State this year, Nov. 23, Head Coach **Rob Murphy** looks for a different outcome versus Penn State this weekend. Murpy has shown success against the Rosemont, Ill.-based conference, picking up a pair of victories in his first four seasons. Overall, Murphy holds a 2-6 record versus Big Ten opponents.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The EMU men's basketball team hit the road for just the third time this season, but the first time exiting the state of Michigan when the squad traveled to Nebraska Omaha, Dec. 1. In fact, the Eagles will be flying across the country over the next three weeks, playing four of its next five games away from Ypsilanti. In total, the Green and White will travel 3,930 miles between Monday, Nov. 30 and Monday, Dec. 21, going as far west as Omaha, Neb. and traveling to the east coast to Baltimore, Md.

**RETURN OF RAVEN:** After serving a suspension for a violation of team rules, redshirt-junior guard **Raven Lee** made his return to the hardwood for the Eagles Tuesday, Dec. 1, in Eastern's 80-73 victory over Nebraska Omaha. In his first game of the 2015-16 season, Lee showed why he was a preseason All-MAC awardwinner. The 6-foot-3 combo guard went for 17 points, five assists and three rebounds. Despite shooting just 3-of-11 from the floor, the Detroit, Mich. native was successful in driving the lane, drawing contact and getting to the free throw line. Lee went 9-for-10 from the charity stripe on his way to leading the Eagles in scoring in their first road win of the 2015-16 campaign.

**FRESHMAN PHENOM:** EMU's **James Thompson IV** is making waves and an early push to be considered the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year. Thompson is the only freshman in the conference who ranks in the top-20 in scoring at 10th (14.3 ppg), while he is also leading the conference in rebounds (11.4 rpg) as the only freshman in the top-20 in that category as well. In addition, the Baton Rouge, La. product leads the MAC in blocked shots (2.4 bpg) and is second in the league in field goal percentage (64.2 percent). On top of those gaudy numbers, he is the only student-athlete in the MAC to average a double-double. Not only is Thompson making waves in the Mid-American Conference, but his statistics have shown up in the national rankings as well. Currently, Thompson is 21st nationally in field goal percentage, while he ranks 13th in rebounds per game and 10th in total rebounds (80). He is 29th in blocked shots per game and 30th in total blocks (17), while his three double-doubles rank 27th and his 4.71 offensive rebounds per game are good for seventh nationally.

**IN THE SHADOWS:** With **James Thompson IV** flourishing in the early goings of his Eagle career, there has been an unsung hero down low for the Green and White. Senior forward **Brandon Nazione** has put together a solid season thus far for Eastern Michigan. The Howell, Mich. native is averaging 11.1 points and 7.7 rebounds per game. His scoring output ranks 29th in the MAC, while he is also eighth overall in rebounding.

**BECAUSE OF THE BIGS:** Despite having quite the guard-heavy roster, the Eagles owe a large part of their success this year to the big boys down low. The starting frontcourt of **James Thompson IV** and **Brandon Nazione** are posting 25.4 points and 19.1 rebounds per game this season. In addition, the duo is grabbing seven offensive rebounds per game between the two of them, allowing for second chance opportunities. In fact, the Green and White have scored 19.5 percent of their points on second tries.

**DOUBLE VISION:** A rare feat at EMU and in college basketball in general, but we're seven games into the season and the Eagles have five student-athletes averaging 10-or-more points per game. **Raven Lee** leads the way with 17 points per contest. Lee is followed by **Willie Mangum IV** (15.4 ppg), **James Thompson IV** (14.3 ppg), **Ty Toney** (11.4 ppg) and **Brandon Nazione** (11.1 ppg). This is the first time for EMU to have five averaging double-figures in scoring at least seven games into the season since the 2004-05 season. After seven games that year, **Daryl Garrett** notched 14.4 points per game off the bench, followed by **John Bowler** (13.0 ppg), **Michael Ross** (10.9 ppg), **James Jackson** (10.7 ppg) and **Markus Austin** (10.4 ppg). EMU finished that season with four student-athletes averaging double-figures. Austin led with 13.8, Bowler notched 13, Garrett added 11.9 and Ross totaled 10.6.

**THOMPSON, ON A TEAR:** True freshman center **James Thompson IV** just needed a few games to get his bearings at the NCAA Division I level. The Baton Rouge, La. native put together three-straight double-double performances, first going for a career-best 32 points and 13 rebounds versus Marygrove, Nov. 25. Following that performance, the 6-foot-10 center notched 23 points and another career-high 15 rebounds. In addition, he scored 16 points, while matching his career-high 15 boards versus Omaha, Dec. 1. Overall, the last three games Thompson is averaging 23.7 points and 14.3 rebounds per contest. For the season, Thompson is averaging 14.3 points and 11.4 rebounds per game, while knocking down 64.2 percent of his field goal attempts.

**CAUSING HAVOC IN THE ZONE:** EMU Head Coach Rob Murphy preaches defense, defense, defense and its evident in the exceptional 2-3 zone run by Eastern. The Eagles have forced each of its 2015-16 opponents into double-digit turnover numbers. In fact, No. 3/4 Michigan State and Oakland are the only two squads to keep that number underneath 15. On the year, EMU is forcing 19.1 turnovers per game, while ranking 15th in the NCAA in turnover margin, forcing 5.9 more turnovers per game than its opposition. In addition, the Green and White rank sixth in the country in steals per game, picking the opponents' pocket 11 times per contest.

**NEW CREW:** Despite the absence of EMU's top leading scorer from a season ago through the first six games of the season, Eastern has found some scoring in new places. Of the 562 points scored this season, 298 have been scored by student-athletes who are new to the EMU men's basketball program. That number is 53 percent of the scoring by the 2015-16 Eagles. Leading the charge for the newcomers are junior college transfer guards **Willie Mangum IV** (15.4 ppg) and **Ty Toney** (11.4 ppg). In addition, freshman center **James Thompson IV** is adding 14.3 points per contest for the Green and White.

**QUARTERBACKING THE OFFENSE:** To most EMU fans, **Tim Bond** was known more for his high flying abilities but the Eagles have called upon Bond for another form of offense. It looks as though the sophomore guard will be taking over the point guard role in **Rob Murphy's** offense. It has been evident that since Bond took on that role prior to the Eagles' game with Marygrove, he has flourished as the point man. In his first two games at the helm of the offense, Bond has accumulated 14 assists, good for seven per game.

**A LOOK AHEAD:** Following the weekend contest with the Nittany Lions, Dec. 5, the Eagles will return home for a game with its final non-NCAA Division I opponent this season. Tuesday, Dec. 8, the Green and White will square off with Rochester College from the Convocation Center at 7 p.m.

**A LOOK AT THE CONFERENCE LEADERS:** Eastern Michigan has positioned itself near the top of multiple statistical categories in the Mid-American Conference as of Dec. 4. Let's take a look...

**MID-MAJOR SUCCESS:** Since taking over the EMU men's basketball program, head coach **Rob Murphy** has shown sustained success versus other NCAA Division I mid-major programs. Over the last four seasons, Murphy holds a 20-10 record versus mid-majors in non-conference play. Since the beginning of the 2013-14 season, Murphy has gone 13-1 against mid-major programs in non-conference play.

**THAT DIDN'T TAKE LONG:** Head Coach **Rob Murphy** is in his fifth season at the helm of the Eastern Michigan men's basketball program. Since taking over prior to the 2011-12 season, Murphy has amassed 78 wins which is good for the fifth-most by an EMU coach. Ben Braun set the mark in his 10-plus years, recording 185 as EMU's head man.

**BREAKING 100:** Eastern's offense was blazing against Marygrove on Wednesday afternoon. The Green and White walked away from the Convocation Center with a 108-64 victory over the Mustangs, Nov. 25. It was the first time EMU scored 100-plus points since Dec. 29, 2014 in a 100-42 win over Concordia University (Mich.) and the most points scored by an EMU team since the 2008-09 season when EMU put up 119 against Marygrove, Nov. 14.

**THEY'RE HEATING UP:** In the Eagles' victory over Marygrove, they shot at a scorching 53.4 percent (39-of-73) from the floor. It was the second time that EMU has shot better than 50 percent from the floor this season and it was also the best shooting percentage by Eastern since the 100-42 victory over Concordia in the non-conference finale last season, Dec. 29.

**DISHING OUT THE ROCK:** Sophomore guard **Tim Bond** has the rare ability to play three different positions in Head Coach **Rob Murphy's** system. In the Nov. 25 matchup with Marygrove, Bond played the point guard position primarily and did not disappoint. The 6-foot-7 Baltimore, Md. product dished out a career-high nine assists. That number was the most by an EMU player since **Mike Talley** recorded 10 versus Miami, Jan. 10, 2015.

**SHINING ON THE BIG STAGE:** Eastern Michigan junior guard **Ty Toney** showed out against No. 3/4 Michigan State Monday, Nov. 24, when he had his second 18-point outburst of the 2015-16 season, knocking down a career-best eight field goals, including his first three-pointer as a member of the EMU basketball program. The Alpharetta, Ga. native led all-scorers in the game.

**MURPHY VERSUS NON-DI OPPONENTS:** Although it comes as no surprise, EMU Head Men's Basketball Coach **Rob Murphy** has led the Eagles to a cool 17-0 record in both exhibition and regular season games against non-NCAA Division I opponents during his tenure. Last season, the Eagles went 4-0 in regular season games versus NAIA opponents.

**MANNING THE MIDDLE:** Currently averaging 2.8 blocks per game, which leads the Mid-American Conference and is in the top-20 in the NCAA, **James Thompson IV** has proven his defensive dominance through the early goings of 2015-16. Thompson has recorded at least two blocks in every game thus far and is on pace to swat 81 shots during the regular season.

**ALL THINGS CONSIDERED:** Despite a 3-2 start, when you look inside the numbers, EMU's offense has been more successful than many may have thought to this point. Averaging 80.6 points per game, the Green and White is scoring more points than it did last season (69.4). With that being said, over 50 percent of last season's offensive output is no longer with the team due to graduation. In addition, **Raven Lee** has yet to play during the 2015-16 campaign, which leaves this season's squad with just 24 percent of the Eagles' scoring from a year ago.

**THE EERIE NUMBER 80:** Since taking over the EMU men's basketball team, Head Coach **Rob Murphy** has prided himself on his team's defense and for good reason, considering his squad has only allowed the opposition to score 80-or-more points on 10 occasions. On the flip side, everytime the Green and White have allowed 80-plus, they've ended up on the wrong side of the ledger, including a pair of losses this season.

**LOOKING AT THE POSITIVES:** Despite dropping an 89-65 contest to No. 3/4 Michigan State Monday, Nov. 23, there were a few bright spots to take away from the contest. The Eagles won the turnover battle with the Spartans, 4-13, while also grabbing five more steals than Michigan State.

**GOTTA GUARD THE LINE:** After four games this season, the Eagles may have found an Achilles heel in the defense. Although teams are only shooting 31.3 percent from beyond the arc this season, the Green and White is just 2-2, due in large part to hot shooting from three-point land. In both of Eastern's losses, the Eagles' opponents have shot 38.7 percent and 45 percent from the long line.

**MURPHY AND THE STATE OF MICHIGAN:** EMU Head Coach Rob Murphy has had many chances to square off with Michigan-based NCAA Division I institutions in his four-plus seasons in Ypsilanti. The Eagles' boss holds an 11-15 record versus NCAA Division I schools from the state of Michigan. Murphy has squared off with Central Michigan and Western Michigan most frequently, boasting a 3-6 and 5-4 record, respectively.

**MURPHY AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS:** Ranked teams have been a thorn in the side of EMU and head coach **Rob Murphy**. The Nov. 23 contest with the Spartans was the ninth time the Green and White square off with a ranked opponent since 2011-12. In their first eight meetings with ranked squads, the Eagles are 0-9.

**MANGUM MAKES HISTORY:** Willie Mangum IV finished the Eagles' game with Siena Heights with a career-high 29 points on 12-of-15 shooting (80 percent). The hot shooting percentage tied a school record for field-goal percentage in a game, making 10-or-more field goals, with fellow teammate **Raven Lee**, who also shot 12-of-15 from the field on his way to scoring 38 points vs. UT Arlington, Nov. 23, 2013. The 29 points were also the most scored by an Eagle since Lee's 32 points versus Akron, Feb. 14, 2015.

**DEFENSE, DEFENSE, DEFENSE:** Eastern Michigan's men's basketball team prides itself on defense, which it showed during its contest with Siena Heights, Nov. 20. The Eagles held SHU to just 34 points, a number which was the fewest given up by EMU since a 42-25 victory over Northern Illinois, Jan. 26, 2013. In addition, Eastern's defense forced 25 turnovers including 15 steals, scoring 29 points off of them. The 25 turnovers were the most the Green and White have forced since Western Michigan made 26 miscues against the Eagles in a 56-37 win at the Convocation Center, Jan. 14, 2014.

**GIVING IT AWAY:** Oakland forced the Eagles into 19 turnovers in the loss at the O'rena. Although there were 19 EMU giveaways, the Golden Grizzlies recorded just three steals in the contest, meaning the Eastern Michigan turnover issues were often caused by unforced errors by the Eagles. The last time EMU had 19-or-more turnovers was when the Green and White defeated Akron, Feb. 14, 2015.

**THE THOMPSON EFFECT:** In the Eagles' first two contests of the year, freshman center **James Thompson IV** found himself in foul trouble during the first half of those games. Against Vermont, Thompson left the first half with 14:50 remaining. From that point on, the Catamounts outscored by 11 points to take a lead into the half. In the game versus Oakland, Thompson again exited the first half early with just over eight minutes left to go. The Golden Grizzlies took advantage to the tune of a 23-7 run, allowing OU to regain the lead despite trailing by nine points at the time of Thompson's departure. In all, the Eagles have been outscored by their opponents by 27 points when Thompson exits the first half due to foul trouble.

**GETTING CRAFTY:** EMU newcomer **Ty Toney** showed why he was a junior college all-american honorable mention award winner in the Green and White's contest at Oakland. The junior from Alpharetta, Ga. put together an exceptional game, shooting 7-of-13 from the floor for a team-high 18 points, while pulling down seven rebounds and dishing out eight assists. The eight dimes were the most by an Eagle since Mike Talley dropped 10 versus Miami, Jan. 10, 2015.

**FROM DOWNTOWN:** The Eagles game at Oakland saw them jack up 30 three-point tries. In the Rob Murphy era, this was the first time that an EMU squad attempted more than 28 from beyond the arc. Eastern ended up converting on just seven of its triple tries.

**STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT:** Beginning the 2015-16 season by taking on an NCAA Division I institution for the first time since the 2011-12 campaign, Head Coach **Rob Murphy** and his squad didn't take a step back against a higher level of competition, defeating Vermont, 70-50, Nov. 13 at the Convocation Center. Trailing by three, 27-30, at halftime, the Eastern offense sparked in the second half, in large part to junior **Willie Mangum IV**. Shooting at a 51.9 percent clip, the Eagles tamed the Catamounts by a 43-20 margin in the second half, while Mangum grabbed 13 of his 18 points in the second half, 11 of which came in the final nine minutes of the game.

**DEFENSE COMING FIRST:** As coach **Rob Murphy** always preaches, 'as long as we play defense, the offense will take care of itself.' That was the case in the Green and White's win over Vermont to open the season. The Eagles forced the Catamounts into 21 turnovers, while notching 15 steals and blocking seven shots. For its defensive efforts, the offense was awarded by scoring 25 points off of turnovers. In addition, the Green and White held UV to a 30.8 field goal percentage, the last time an NCAA Division I team shot lower than that was when Eastern dropped Ohio, 76-40, at the Convocation Center, Jan. 27, 2014. Prior to that, the Eagles managed that feat six times during the 2013-14 campaign.

**D-I DEBUTS:** Multiple Eagles made their NCAA Division I debuts in the EMU win over Vermont. junior college transfer **Willie Mangum IV** led the charge with 18 points and four steals, while freshman **James Thompson IV** put together a solid start to his collegiate career with nine points, 11 rebounds and three blocks. In addition, **Jordan Nobles** and **Blake Brown** each saw their first action since participating in the same high school conference (Kensington Lakes Activities Association) two years ago.

**TWO FORMER EAGLES SELECTED IN NBA D-LEAGUE DRAFT:** Former EMU Eagles **Da'Shonte Riley** and **Karrington Ward** were recently selected in the 2015 NBA Developmental League Draft. Riley was picked by the Idaho Stampede in the fourth round at No. 58 overall, while Ward was

**FOR THE 118th TIME:** The EMU men's basketball team kicked off its 118th season of competition Friday, Nov. 13, when the Eagles played host to Vermont. Eastern played its first season in 1897-98 and split games with Detroit. The Eagles are 69-48 in season openers.

**BACK-TO-BACK 20-WIN SEASONS:** With their victory over Miami in the first round of the 2015 MAC Men's Basketball Tournament, March 9, Eastern posted its 20th win of the 2014-15 season, marking the first time since the 1996-97 and 1997-98 campaigns that the Eagles had won 20-or-more contests in back-to-back seasons. The last time the feat was accomplished, the Green and White compiled a record of 22-10 in the 1996-97 season to finish fourth in the MAC before going 20-10 and qualifying for the NCAA tournament in the 1997-98 campaign.

**EMU PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE MAC WEST:** The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team was picked to finish third in the West Division according to the 2015-16 Mid-American Conference Preseason Poll by the MAC News Media Panel. The announcement was made in Cleveland Wednesday, Oct. 28. Along with the preseason poll, EMU redshirt-junior **Raven Lee** was named to the MAC West Division Preseason All-MAC Team.

**AMONG THE ELITE IN EMU SCORING HISTORY:** The 2014-15 season marked an extremely successful and historic year for redshirt-junior **Raven Lee**. The Detroit, Mich. native became just the 29th EMU student-athlete to surpass the 1,000-point marker. Lee currently holds the No. 28 spot with 1,010 points in his career, but Lee still has two more seasons to continue his rise to the top of the all-time EMU scoring charts. Currently, Kennedy McIntosh is the all-time scoring leader with 2,219 and Earl Boykins is second with 2,211. Lee needs to average 604.5 points in the next two seasons to become EMU's all-time leading scorer. Last season, Lee posted the 11th most points in a single season when he recorded 586 over the course of 35 games. That mark was good for 16.7 points per game, which was the second-best scoring average in the Mid-American Conference.

**LEE NAMED TO LOU HENSON AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST:** Eastern Michigan University men's basketball guard **Raven Lee** was selected to the Lou Henson Preseason Player of the Year Award Watch List Monday, Nov. 9. The award is annually given out to the best mid-major student-athlete in NCAA Division I men's basketball. Lee was one of 30 players listed and just one of three from the Mid-American Conference.

**DEFENSIVE GURUS:** Since **Rob Murphy** took over the EMU men's basketball program prior to the 2011-12 season, defense has become the key message to his team and it has proved to be pivotal to the success of the program, including the 2014-15 season. Similar to the previous two seasons, the 2014-15 squad recorded 157 blocked shots, the third-most in EMU history. The only teams to have more were 2012-13 and 2013-14, both of which were under Murphy. In addition, the Eagles grabbed the second-most steals in EMU laurels with 305, good for 8.7 per game. The 8.7 steals per contest proved to be the highest steals average in a single season. The Eagles defensive success continues when contesting shots as well, as for the second consecutive season, the Green and White ranked in the top-10 in the NCAA in field goal percentage defense. Eastern Michigan held its opponents to a 38.6 field goal percentage in 2014-15, Kentucky led the country at 35.4 percent.

**FILLING IN THE BLANKS:** EMU's men's basketball team is losing over 50 percent of the points that were scored during the 2014-15 campaign. Most notably, the Eagles will not return its starting guard, **Mike Talley**, and its starting forward, **Karrington Ward**. Both Talley and Ward averaged 12.5 points per game last season and combined for 36 percent of the Eagles' offense. In addition, the Green and White loses three student-athletes who combined to anchor the center position, averaging 5.7 points per game, as well as 5.5 points per game from **Anali Okoloji**.

**EAGLES ALREADY TABBED FOR TV:** EMU men's basketball has already been scheduled to appear on the Atlantic Coast Conference Regional Sports Network (RSN) and the Big Ten Network (BTN) this season. The Eagles' games at Michigan State, Nov. 23, and Penn State, Dec. 5, will both appear on the BTN. EMU will head to MSU to square off with the Spartans, at 7 p.m. before their noon matchup with PSU. The Dec. 12 contest at the KFC Yum! Center with Louisville will be picked up by (RSN) at 2 p.m.

**RULE CHANGES IN NCAA DIVISION I HOOPS:** The NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved multiple changes to improve the pace of play, better balance offense with defense, and reduce the physicality of the sport prior to the 2015-16 season. The primary change in the rules that would be noticed by fans is the reduced time frame for the shot clock. All NCAA men's basketball contest will use a 30 second shot clock. Key areas of focus for officials this season will be:

- Perimeter defense, particularly on the dribbler
- Physicality in post play.
- Screening, particularly moving screens and requiring the screener to be stationary.
- Block/charge plays.
- Allowing greater freedom of movement for players without the ball.

**LEE EARNS ALL-MAC THIRD TEAM HONORS:** Eastern guard **Raven Lee** was named to the 2015 All-Mid-American Conference Third Team after an exceptional season for the Eagles. The All-MAC teams are voted on by the league's head coaches. Lee earned the honor just one year after **Karrington Ward** was named to the third team in 2014.

Lee earned his first MAC postseason award after averaging the second-most points in the conference (16.7 ppg) while leading EMU in that category. The redshirt-sophomore guard posted nine games of 20-or-more points scored, to go along with two 30-plus point performances. Lee posted the fourth-best free throw percentage in the conference, knocking down 79.5 percent of his free throw attempts, and the 6-foot-3 combo guard was named MAC West Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 23.

**EAGLES ADD EIGHT FOR 2015-16:** After losing five members of the 2014-15 roster, Eastern Michigan University Head Men's Basketball Coach **Rob Murphy** has added eight new faces to the Eagles' basketball family. EMU welcomed freshmen **Daryl Kirkland**, **LaMonta Stone II** and **James Thompson IV**, while **Willie Mangum IV** and **Ty Toney** have joined the squad from the junior college ranks. In addition, **Blake Brown**, **Quaran Jones** and **Nick Madray** have all transferred to EMU from four-year institutions.

**42nd MAC SEASON:** The 2015-16 season will also be the 42nd for the Eagles in the Mid-American Conference. The first year of MAC play for EMU was 1974-75 when the then-Hurons went 12-14 and 4-9 in league play.

Eastern has won three Mid-American Conference championships: 1987-88, 1990-91 and 1995-96. The Green and White captured MAC Tournament crowns in all three of those seasons, in addition to winning the tournament title in 1997-98. In 2011-12, the Eagles captured their first-ever Mid-American Conference West Division title.

**EAGLES FACE FOES FROM 10 LEAGUES:** The 2015-16 EMU men's basketball team will square off against teams from at least 10 different leagues. In addition to its Mid-American Conference schedule that starts Wednesday, Jan. 6, the Eagles will meet teams from the America East Conference (Vermont), Atlantic Coast Conference (Louisville), the Atlantic Sun (North Florida) Big Ten (Michigan State and Penn State), the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (Coppin State), Horizon League (Oakland and Detroit), Summit League (Nebraska-Omaha), Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference (Siena Heights, Madonna and Marygrove) and the United States Collegiate Athletic Association (Rochester).

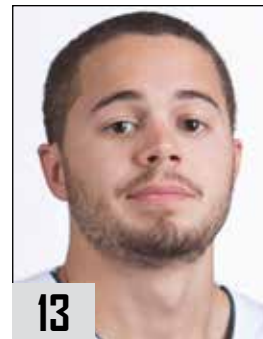

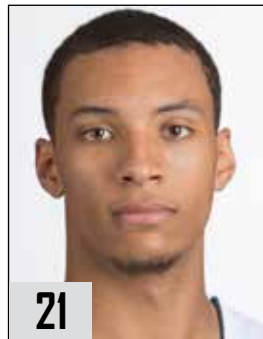

**YPSILANTI, Mich.** – The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team used balanced scoring and scrappy defense to defeat the University of Vermont, 70-50, in the opening contest of the 2015-16 season in the Convocation Center, Nov. 13. It was the fifth-straight season opening victory for the Green and White, as Eastern has yet to lose a lid lifter since Head Men's Basketball Coach Rob Murphy took over the program prior to the 2011-12 campaign. Junior **Willie Mangum IV** led the team in his EMU debut with 18 points and four steals.

The Eagles (1-0, 0-0 MAC) spread the wealth around in the game, with eight different players getting on the stat sheet. Besides Mangum, sophomore **Tim Bond** netted a career-high 15 points, while senior **Brandon Nazione** ended the game with his first career double-double, scoring 10 and grabbing a career-best 10 rebounds for the Eagles. Freshman **James Thompson IV** had a productive game in his EMU debut, finishing one point away from a double-double himself, scoring nine and adding a team-high 11 rebounds. He also led the team in blocks with three.

EMU's vaunted 2-3 zone harassed the Catamounts' (0-1, 0-0) offensive attack early and often in the contest. The Green and White forced 21 turnovers, the most since the Eagles defeated Marygrove last season, 83-52, Dec. 1, 2014. In addition, Eastern Michigan notched 15 steals, the highest total since the Green and White picked Longwood's pocket in a 79-48 victory Nov. 23, 2014. Mangum led the team in steals with four takeaways, while Bond and Nazione had three each. The 21 turnovers allowed the Eagles to grab 25 points off of the Catamount miscues.

As a team EMU was efficient from the field and the charity stripe, shooting 43.1 percent from the floor and knocking down 78.3 percent of their free throws. On the other end of the floor, the Eagles held Vermont to just a 30.8 percentage, while UV managed just a 55.6 mark from the free throw line, including knocking down just 1-of-6 free throws in the second half. The Green and White were dominating in the paint and in the fast break, outscoring the Catamounts, 34-14, down low, while outscoring UV, 14-0, on the fast break.

Two players got into double-digits for the Catamounts, with redshirt-freshman Ernie Duncan scoring a team-high 14 points, while junior Kurt Steidl finished with a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds.

The Eagles stormed out of the gate, jumping all over the Catamounts for a 15-5 lead thanks to five early points from Mangum. EMU brought immense pressure early on, forcing seven turnovers in the first 10 minutes of the game. The early pressure also brought a lot of fouls EMU's way, as Vermont entered the bonus midway through the half. UV was efficient at converting the fouls into points, as they shot 75 percent at the line in the first half.

The Catamounts would begin to take the advantage back at the seven minute mark, going on a 15-0 run to take a 30-25 lead right before halftime. A late layup from sophomore **Ethan Alvano** cut the deficit to three, 30-27, at the half. Bond attempted to cut the lead to one, but a charging call following a floating jumpshot was called, forcing EMU into the locker room down three at the break.

Beginning the second half, the Eagles quickly tied the game up on a free-throw and a Bond tip-in. The teams would then go blow-for-blow most of the half, with three ties and the lead changing hands twice. Neither team had more than a five-point advantage at any point, until the nine minute mark when the Eastern Michigan offense ignited. A three-point play from Mangum, followed by a bucket from Thompson gave EMU its largest lead of the half, 50-42 at the under-eight media timeout.

Following the timeout, the Green and White started to pour it into the Catamounts. Led by Mangum, with six-straight points, the Eagles finished the second half on a 20-8 run, allowing just eight points in the final 9:52 of the season opening, 70-50, victory at the Convocation Center.

**ROCHESTER, Mich.** – The Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team dropped its first contest of the 2015-16 season in a 91-81 shootout, Wednesday evening, Nov. 18, to Oakland University. The Eagles (1-1) led by as many as nine in the opening stanza, but were unable to spoil opening night at the Athletics Center O'Rena for a Golden Grizzlies (1-0) squad, which finished the first half on a 23-7 run and continued its momentum into the final 20 minutes.

Wednesday's setback was the first for Head Coach Rob Murphy's Eagles in the last three meetings against Oakland, which entered the contest No. 14 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top-25 Poll.

Junior **Ty Toney** found his offensive stride with 14 second-half points for a game total of 18 (7-of-13) to pace the EMU attack. Toney also added seven rebounds and eight assists, which were the most by an EMU player since **Mike Talley's** 10 dimes at Miami University, Jan. 10, 2015.

Junior **Willie Mangum IV** filled 5-of-14 shots from beyond the arc for 15 points before fouling out late in the game and freshman **James Thompson IV** added eight points and eight rebounds in the loss.

Also in double figures were Redshirt junior **Jordan Price** (15 points; 5-of-12) and senior **Brandon Nazione** (11 points; 4-of-9). Price set a career-high with 15 points, while Nazione tied his career-best.

As a team, Eastern Michigan shot 30-of-76 (39.5 percent) from the field and 7-of-30 (23.3 percent) from downtown. At the free-throw line, the Green and White hit 14-of-19 (73.7) shots.

Oakland went to the line early and often in the first half and finished the game 21-of-24 (87.5 percent) from the charity stripe. The Grizzlies converted 12-of-31 (38.7 percent) three-pointers to go with a 29-of-71 (40.8 percent) showing overall.

Kahil Felder finished with a double-double (27 points, 12 assists) for Oakland and was one-of-four Grizzlies to attain double-digit points. Percy Gibson also notched double-double with 25 points and 10 boards. Sherron Dorsey-Walker ended the game with 19 points, while Max Hooper added 12.

Eastern Michigan forced eight Oakland turnovers during the first seven minutes, with Bond taking advantage of one of those OU giveaways by stuffing home a dunk to give the Eagles a four-point edge, 18-14.

Oakland's offense spluttered midway through the half as the Grizzlies managed just 7-of-21 from the field with 7:39 showing on the clock. EMU took advantage with three unanswered buckets including a triple from Mangum. The visiting Eagles pulled ahead, 25-16.

Thompson was forced to take a seat after his second foul with 7:10 to play in the half. After that, the Grizzlies' offense ended the half on a 23-7 run and sent the Eagles into halftime trailing, 39-32. Oakland's run was highlighted by a Hooper three-pointer, which gave the home squad its first lead since early in the game, 39-29.

Despite good looks from the offense, the Eagles struggled to regain their scoring touch while fouls allowed the Grizzlies into the double bonus. Oakland sunk 13-of-34 free throws in the period to go along with 11-of-35 (31.4 percent) shooting.

EMU ended the half 14-of-38 (36.8 percent) from the floor and 3-of-17 (17.6 percent) from long range.

Felder Gibson on consecutive lay-ins to open the second-half scoring. Sophomore **Tim Bond** stuffed another OU scoring chance under the basket for EMU's fourth block of the night, but Gibson completed the possession with another two points.

Following an EMU turnover, Hooper cashed in on another three-ball as Oakland broke out to a 48-34 lead with 17:28 left in the contest.

Toney continued his strong performance on both sides of the ball to get the Eagles back to within 10 points, 60-50. The junior guard forced a turnover and ran the length of the court for the score and his eighth point of the night.

At 6:54, Toney would strike again. He would be followed by Mangum, who buried his fifth triple of the evening to cut what was once a 22-point Oakland lead to nine, 76-67.

Mangum fouled out with 5:47 to play, leaving it up to the rest of the EMU offense to stage a comeback. Contributions from Toney and Price kept the Eagles alive, but the Grizzlies responded on each occasion sending EMU away with the 91-81 setback.

**ROCHESTER, Mich.** – Behind a record-setting shooting performance from junior **Willie Mangum IV**, the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team (2-1, 0-0 MAC) cruised to a 79-34 victory over Siena Heights University Friday, Nov. 20 at the Convocation Center. The 34 points were the fewest given up by EMU since a 42-25 victory over Northern Illinois, Jan. 26, 2013.

Mangum finished with a career-high 29 points on 12-15 shooting (80 percent). The hot shooting percentage tied a school record for field-goal percentage in a game, making 10-or-more field goals, with fellow teammate **Raven Lee**, who also shot 12-of-15 from the field on his way to scoring 38 points vs. UT Arlington, Nov. 23, 2013. The Richmond, Va. native also went a perfect 2-of-2 from three point range, while adding seven rebounds and four steals.

Also having a big day was senior **Brandon Nazione**, who finished with his second career double-double, going for career highs in points (14) and rebounds (11). Seven other Eagles got in the scoring book in the game. Freshman **James Thompson IV**, despite fouling out midway through the second half, had a career-high five blocks in the contest. Sophomore **Tim Bond** also had a career-high four steals.

The Green and White dominated in all facets of the game. Eastern shot 52 percent from the floor (31-of-59), while holding Siena Heights to just 21 percent (13-of-61). EMU's defense forced 25 turnovers including 15 steals, scoring 29 points off of them. The 25 turnovers were the most the Green and White have forced since Western Michigan made 26 miscues against the Eagles in a 56-37 win at the Convocation Center, Jan. 14, 2014. The biggest disparity of the contest was in the paint, as EMU outscored the Saints 46-16 down low.

Eastern Michigan faced a little early adversity, trailing by one at the under 16 timeout. Coming out of the break, Mangum began to take over scoring 14 points as part of a 21-3 run to take a commanding 28-9 lead at the five minute mark. As always, EMU brought immense pressure on the defensive side of the ball. They forced 18 turnovers in the first half, and turned them into 16 of points. As a result of the pressure, EMU took a 39-12 lead into the break.

The 12 points were the fewest allowed in a half by EMU since the 2013 season opener when the Eagles held Albion College to 11 in the first half. The Eagles went on to outscore Siena 32-6 over the final 15 minutes of the frame.

Momentum carried over into the second half for the Eagles, as EMU did not allow a point until the 13:05 mark. By that time the Green and White had extended their lead to 54-15 with seven of the points coming from Mangum.

With the big lead, EMU saw numerous players come off the bench and perform well in the second half. Most notable of which was freshman LaMonta Stone II (Detroit, Mich.-River Rouge), who scored his first career points as an Eagle on a tough layup. Stone, playing in just his second career game, finished with the two points, as well as three assists and a rebound. Down the stretch EMU led by as many as 47 before polishing off the 45-point victory. The differential was the largest margin of victory for the Eagles since the Green and White topped Concordia, 100-42, Dec. 28, 2014.

Eastern now faces its toughest test of the young season as they travel up to East Lansing, Mich. to battle with No. 13/13 Michigan State, Monday, Nov. 23. The Eagles and Spartans will tip off from the Breslin Center at 7 p.m. with the game airing on Big Ten Network.

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** – Behind a red-hot three point shooting performance, the No. 3/4 ranked Michigan State University Spartans ran away from the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team, 89-65, Monday night, Nov. 23, in non-conference action at the Breslin Center.

Junior **Ty Toney (Alpharetta, Ga.-Alpharetta (Georgia Highlands))** led the Eagles offensively, scoring 18 points and tying his season high. Junior **Willie Mangum IV (Richmond, Va.-Marshall (San Jacinto College))** also finished in double digits with 10 points.

The Green and White had a little trouble finding the stroke throughout the game, shooting 34 percent (23-of-68) from the field and 26 percent (5-for-19) from deep. Meanwhile, the other Green and White were lights out all game, shooting 45 percent from three (9-of-20) and 48 percent (31-for-64) from the field.

Despite the big shooting performance, EMU's defense was still able to force pressure on MSU, notching 13 turnovers on the Spartans, and turning them into 15 points. EMU only turned the ball over four times themselves, the fewest since totalling four last season against Concordia University. Of the 15 TO's, seven of them were steals for EMU, with six different Eagles getting in on the takeaways.

The Eagles jumped out initially to a 4-0 lead but the Spartans were quick to respond with an 8-0 run. At the eight minute mark, EMU only trailed by five points before being outscored 20-10 the rest of the way to trail by a 40-25 margin at the half.

Michigan State maintained their steady lead all throughout the first period, led by their three-point shooting. MSU shot 45 percent in the first half, making 5 of 11 opportunities. It was the main difference, as EMU out-played MSU in the paint, outscoring them 16-10. Michigan State also made the most of their free throw attempts, making 13 of 17, compared to EMU who only had two opportunities from the charity stripe, making one.

MSU's three-point assault did not slow down in the second half, as the Spartans hit three more in the first four minutes. This would lead them on a 24-11 run out of the break to take the commanding 64-36 lead. MSU would hold steady and go on to lead by as many as 34 throughout the rest of the second half, cruising to the victory.

In the second half, EMU continued to battle and saw some notable performances from key bench players. Redshirt senior **Jordan Martin (Detroit, Mich.-Chandler Park Academy (Oakland C.C.))** poured in a career-high six points, while redshirt sophomore **Trent Perry (Franklin, Tenn.-Independence)** hit a pair of three-point shots to finish with six as well. True freshman **Lamonta Stone II (Detroit, Mich.-River Rouge)** also reached a career-high in his young with five points.

Eastern now gets back to the Convocation Center on Wednesday, Nov. 25 for a matinee showdown with Marygrove College. Tip-off is scheduled for 2 p.m. and will be broadcast on ESPN3.

**YPSILANTI, Mich.** – Behind a career-day from freshman **James Thompson IV (Baton Rouge, La.-Parkview Baptist)**, the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team cruised to a 108-64 victory over Marygrove College Wednesday, Nov. 25 at the Convocation Center. It was the first time EMU scored 100-plus points since Dec. 29, 2014 in a 100-42 win over Concordia University (Mich.) and the most points scored by an EMU team since the 2008-09 season when EMU put up 119 against Marygrove, Nov. 14.

Thompson finished with an EMU season-best 32 points on 92.8 percent (13-of-14) shooting, as well as grabbing 13 rebounds for his first career double-double. It was the first 30-plus point game by an EMU player since **Raven Lee (Detroit, Mich.-Romulus)** scored 32 against Akron last season, Feb. 14. It was also tied for the sixth-most points scored in a game in Convo history, and the most since Lee put up 38 versus the University of Texas Arlington, Nov. 23, 2013. In addition, Thompson's 26 first half points were the most scored by an Eagle since Lee dropped 31 in the second half of Eastern's 76-73 loss to Ohio University a season ago, Feb. 7, 2015.

Senior **Brandon Nazione (Howell, Mich.-Howell)** and junior **Willie Mangum IV (Richmond, Va.-Marshall)** also finished in double-figures with a career-high 17 for Nazione and 17 for Mangum, while sophomore **Ethan Alvano (Corona, Calif.-Corona)** marked his career-best in points with 13. Meanwhile sophomore **Tim Bond (Baltimore, Md.-City College HS)** finished with a career-high nine assists. The Eagles finished lights out from the field, scoring on 53.4 percent of their attempts. More than half of their points came from inside the paint, as they outscored the Mustangs down low, 62-20. They also out rebounded Marygrove, 53-35.

The EMU defense continued to cause problems for the opponents' offense, as the Eagles forced 23 turnovers while recording 11 steals. Alvano and redshirt senior **Jordan Martin (Detroit, Mich.-Chandler Park Academy)** each had a career-high three takeaways. Sophomore **Isaac Gillum** led the Mustangs with 18 points.

The early game plan for EMU was attack the undersized Marygrove team down low, as they fed Thompson early and often. The freshman surpassed his career-high in points in the first seven minutes of the contest. In total, he made his first eight field goals, all in the paint, and went 10-of-11 finishing with 26 first half points. That marked the most points in a half by an Eagle since Lee versus Ohio last season, Feb. 7.

Despite the dominance by Thompson, the Mustangs would hang around, trailing by only two to four points for the first half of the first period. EMU would continue chipping away thanks to Thompson, and gain its first double-digit lead at the six minute mark. The Eagles would go on to lead by as many as 17 in the half before taking a 51-34 lead into the break.

Out of the break, EMU went on a 17-2 run to take a commanding 68-36 lead. The run was spearheaded by eight Nazione points, including four via thunderous dunks, to put him over his career high. From there EMU coasted down the stretch, outscoring Marygrove, 40-28, in the final 15 minutes and take the victory.


The Eagles will remain at home heading into the weekend with a matchup with Madonna University, Saturday, Nov. 28. Tip-off from the Convo is set for 2 p.m. and will be broadcast on ESPN3.

**YPSILANTI, Mich.** – Behind the second straight double-double from freshman **James Thompson IV (Baton Rouge, La.-Parkview Baptist)**, the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team defeated Madonna University, 79-63, Saturday afternoon, Nov. 28, at the Convocation Center. The 6-foot-10 center went for a game-high 23 points and a career-high 15 rebounds.

Also getting into double digits for EMU was junior **Willie Mangum (Richmond, Va.-Marshall)**, who had 14, and senior **Brandon Nazione (Howell, Mich.-Howell)**, who finished with 11 and a career-high four steals. The Eagles played lock-down defense once again, as they finished with another double digit steal game, notching 13 takeaways and forcing 22 turnovers. To go along with the high turnover rate, they played extremely disciplined, as they only committed 10 fouls throughout the entire game. As a result, Madonna only had five free throws in the 40 minutes. The size advantage was also evident for the Eagles. They outscored Madonna, 44-20, in the paint and out rebounded the Crusaders, 52-31.

The Eagles got it done on both sides of the ball early in the game, running out to a 20-4 lead midway through the first half. EMU forced the Crusaders with early defensive pressure, notching seven steals in the first ten minutes.

EMU continued to play consistently through the rest of the half, as they also forced three more steals, finishing with 10 in the first. To go along with the stifling defense, EMU held Madonna off the free throw line as the Crusaders went 0-for-2 from the charity stripe in the first half, while also holding them to just 25 percent shooting from the field.

Thompson got into double digits in the first 20 minutes, with 12 points, while also snagging seven rebounds. Using these advantages, EMU took a 38-16 lead at halftime.

The second half was more of the same for Eastern, as they extended the lead to 57-31 at the 10-minute mark, with Mangum and Thompson combining for 13 of those points. In all, Thompson went for 11 points in the second half to lead the way.

The Green and White would go on to lead by as many as 25 points, yet Madonna would hit nine second half three point shots to keep it close. The Eagles prevailed in the end though with a 16-point victory.

Eastern will now leave the state of Michigan for the first time this season when it travels to Nebraska to take on the University of Nebraska-Omaha. Tip-off is scheduled for 7 p.m. CT.

**OMAHA, Neb.** – Behind the third-straight double-double from freshman center **James Thompson IV (Baton Rouge, La.-Parkview Baptist)**, the Eastern Michigan University men's basketball team made it three consecutive non-conference wins in a row with an 80-73 victory over the University of Nebraska Omaha Tuesday, Dec. 1. The Eagles (5-2) held the Mavericks (3-4) to 17 points less than its average offensive output.

Eastern Michigan had five student-athletes post double-digit scoring performances with **Raven Lee (Detroit, Mich.-Romulus)** registering a team-best 17 points while dropping in nine free throws and dishing out five assists in his first game of the 2015-16 season. Thompson put together another dominant performance, dropping 16 points, tying his career-best with 15 rebounds, while knocking down 8-of-13 shots. **Tim Bond (Baltimore, Md.-City College)** poured in 13 points, while **Brandon Nazione (Howell, Mich.-Howell)** added 12 more to go along with seven boards. In addition, **Jodan Price (Indianapolis, Ind.-Detroit Country Day)** knocked down three triples en route to a 10-point performance. In total, the Green and White shot at a 39.1 percent clip, while knocking down 36.4 percent of its triple tries.

TréShawn Thurman led the Mavericks with 25 points, while Devin Patterson and Jake White added 16 and 14 points, respectively. Both Thurman and White delivered double-doubles with 11 and 12 rebounds. The Green and White held Omaha to a 37.1 shooting percentage and just a 23.5 three-point percentage. EMU forced ONU into 16 turnovers in the victory.

The Eagles opened up by scoring the first four points of the game in the first minute and a half, but Omaha did not let that deter its offense, taking its first lead at 5-4 with 16:15 left in the opening stanza. Lee stepped foot on the game floor for the first time this season with 15:01 on the clock, prompting Eastern and the Mavericks to trade blows for much of the first half, before Lee dished out a pair of assists on back-to-back trips down the floor as Price and Bond each tripled to put the Eagles ahead, 20-14, with 11:12 remaining.

Again back-and-forth buckets saw the Green and White leading by six, 26-20, but with 8:19 on the clock a three-point shot from Lee sparked an 18-3 run over a nearly six minute span to jump out to its largest lead of the game, 42-23, with 2:05 left in the half. A pair of free throws with just over a minute remaining closed out the scoring for the first 20 minutes of play as Omaha's Patterson brought the Mavericks within 17, 42-25, heading into the break.

In the first half, the Eagles outshot Omaha, connecting at a 39.5 percent clip, while the Mavericks knocked down just 31 percent of its shot attempts. Lee led the scoring charge with 11 points, including a pair of three-balls, while dishing out four assists. In addition Thompson posted a first half double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds, hitting on five of his seven field goal attempts. Omaha's Thurman led the Mavericks' with 13 points and eight rebounds, knocking down six-of-nine shot opportunities.

Omaha jumped back into the game outscoring the Eagles by seven points in the first four minutes of the second half, bringing the game to within 10, 48-38, with 14:52 minutes left in the game. The Eagles responded with five straight points, grabbing a 15-point, 53-38, advantage with 13:05 left.

Eastern and Omaha traded buckets, until a 5-0 Maverick run brought ONU within 10 again, 60-50, at the nine minute mark. Eastern and Omaha continued to throw punches but the Eagles were able to maintain a double-figure lead until six-straight points from the Mavericks made it a 73-67 EMU lead. Eastern pushed the lead back out to 10 and held on through the final minutes until walking off the court with an 80-73 victory for the Eagles' first road win of the 2015-16 campaign.

The Eagles will remain on the road Saturday, Dec. 5, when they square off with Big Ten Conference opponent Penn State University at the Bryce Jordan Center. Tipoff is slated for noon and will be broadcast live on the Big Ten Network.
