QUICK NOTES

- Duquesne, coming off a 76-62 loss to Pitt in the annual City Game on Friday, heads to State College for a matchup with a Penn State team that is riding a six-game winning streak. Penn State (8-1), which is 4-0 at home, is off to its best start since 2000-01 (9-1).
- This will be the 46th meeting between the Dukes and Nittany Lions. This is the fifth consecutive season the two have met.
- Duquesne, which began the week ranked first nationally in 3-point field goal percentage (.458), has shot above 50 percent from the arc in three of five games. Junior Derrick Colter (16-25, .640) leads the nation in individual 3-point percentage through Sunday's games.
- Three different players have hit at least six 3-pointers in a game this season. Derrick Colter went 7-of-8 (26 pts.) in the opener vs. Bluefield State, Jordan Stevens hit 6-of-9 3-point attempts (27 pts.) off the bench at Abilene Christian and Micah Mason was 6-of-7 (18 pts.) from 3-point vs. NJIT.
- Freshman TySean Powell has been the surprise of the young season. The 6-6 forward began the week leading the nation in field goal percentage at .765 (26-34). Powell leads the team in double-digit scoring games (4, the last four in a row), dunks (11) and conventional three-point plays (4 in 4 attempts). He is also 14-of-18 from the foul line.

2014-15 QUICK HITS

- Building quality depth has been a priority of head coach Jim Ferry since his arrival at Duquesne. Through five games, DU's bench has outscored the opponent bench 192-82 (an average of 22 ppg.). The DU bench, which posted a high of 67 points at Abilene Christian, was outscored for the first time this season vs. Pitt (31-22).
- Micah Mason, who led the nation in 3-point percentage (.560) while playing exclusively at shooting guard last season, has made the move to the point in 2014-15. Through five games, the junior has 21 assists with 11 turnovers and is shooting .531 (17-of-32) from the 3-point arc. Colter, who played the point for the past two years, is shooting .543, including a nation-leading .640 (16-of-25) from 3-point, since moving over to the two-guard spot. Mason missed last year's Penn State game with a broken hand.
- Duquesne was picked to finish 11th in the 14-team Atlantic 10 in the annual poll of league coaches and media. National media outlets pegged the Dukes to finish anywhere from 7th (*Basketball Times & College Basketball Madness*) to 12th (*Athlon*).
- The Dukes return four starters junior guards Derrick Colter (9.1, 2.5 in 2014) & Micah Mason (10.6, 2.8), junior forward Jeremiah Jones (6.3, 3.4) and senior forward Dominique McKoy (9.7, 7.2) from last year's 13-17 team (5-11 in the Atlantic 10, tied for 10th place).
- Duquesne's roster consists of one senior, six juniors, three sophomores and five freshmen. The Dukes have four first-year scholarship players.
- DU's lone senior, forward Dominique McKoy, saw a streak of 31 consecutive games played snapped at Abilene Christian. McKoy underwent a medical procedure that prevented him from making the trip to Texas. He returned to lead the Dukes in rebounding with five in 17 minutes vs. NJIT.
- Derrick Colter became the eighth player in school history to hit seven or more 3-pointers in a game when he went 7-of-8 from the arc in scoring a careerhigh 26 points in the opener vs. Bluefield State. Colter's seven makes were one shy of the school record shared by three players (last by Aaron Jackson who went 8-of-13 in scoring 46 points in a double-overtime NIT 116-108 loss at Virginia Tech on Mar. 18, 2009).
- Colter solidified himself as Mr. Opening Day with his 26 points vs. BSC. In three openers, the junior is averaging 22.0 ppg. on .636 shooting (17 at Albany as a freshman & 23 vs. Abilene Christian last year).
- First-year JC transfer Jordan Stevens picked up where Colter left off in game two at Abilene Christian. Stevens went 6-of-9 from 3-point in scoring 27 points in 28 minutes off the bench. The Columbia, Mo. native, who was held out of the season opener (team suspension), added 16 off the bench vs. NJIT.

POINTS OFF THE PINE

First-year junior college transfer Jordan Stevens made an impressive debut, hitting 6-of-9 3-point attempts in scoring 27 points in 28 minutes off the bench at Abilene Christian. Stevens' point total was the seventh-highest by a DU player off the bench in the past 23 years:

Duquesne, which is shooting an NCAA-best .458 (54-of-118) from the 3-point arc, has had three different players hit six or more 3-pointers in a game this season:

He had nine points and five assists in 22 minutes off the bench vs. Howard and added 15 points, three assists and two steals vs. Pitt.

- Micah Mason, who led the nation in 3-point shooting percentage in 2014 (65-116, .560), hit a career-high six 3-pointers in seven attempts vs. NJIT on Nov. 29. Mason has now hit five or more "3s" in a game six times (four at Duquesne and two as a freshman at Drake). Mason, who missed five games last year with a broken hand, was one assist shy of leading the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio as well. (He had 74 assists and 13 turnovers in 25 games for a 5.69-to-1 ratio. The minimum to qualify is 3.0 assists per game, Mason finished at 2.96). Through five games, he has 21 assists and 11 turnovers and is 17-of-32 from the 3-point arc.
- Duquesne, which led the A-10 in assists per game (15.2) and assist/turnover ratio (1.4-to-1) last season returns over 70 percent of its assists. DU's top three assist men Derrick Colter (101), Micah Mason (74) and Desmond Ridenour (59) are back. DU is averaging 17.8 apg. on the young season.
- DU's 11.0 turnovers/g. last season was the lowest mark in school history (previous was 11.5 in 1995). Returning guards Mason (74/13), Colter (101/54) & Ridenour (59/41) combined for 234 assists and 108 turnovers (a 2.2-to-1 ratio) in 2014.
- DU will face an 18-game conference schedule, including nine home games, marking just the second time since 1972 that the Dukes will have 16 regular-season home games. Duquesne will host five of the six A-10 schools that made an NCAA tournament appearance last season, in addition to first-year Atlantic 10 member Davidson, which earned an NIT bid as the regular season champion of the Southern Conference in 2014.
- DU will play Davidson (2014 Southern Conference regular-season champion/NIT), Dayton (2014 NCAA Elite 8), George Washington (2014 NCAA Second Round), St. Bonaventure and Saint Louis (2014 NCAA Third Round) twice in Atlantic 10 play. Davidson, Dayton, George Washington and Saint Louis all won at least 20 games last year. Duquesne and George Mason are the only schools facing four teams that made post-season appearances in 2014 in their five-team home-and-home pod.
- Five players posted 40-plus inch running vertical jumps in July testing. The five highest-leaping Dukes are: Jeremiah Jones (42.0"), Derrick Colter (41.0"), Eric James (41"), L.G. Gill (40") and Desmond Ridenour (40.0").

Was one of five Dukes (Derrick Colter, L.G. Gill, Eric James and Jeremiah Jones are the others) to post a 40+ running vertical jump in July testing ... set a M.A.C.K. Academy single game record with 40 points vs. Mont Clare Prep ... played HS ball at Cleveland Benedictine ... led the 2013-14 Dukes with 28 steals and was third on the team with 59 assists ... has played in 34 of a possible 35 games at DU.

2 ERIC JAMES 6-5 • Freshman • G Westerville, Ohio (8.2, 4.2) FG .500, FT .500

Cited as the No. 3 small forward in Ohio by Triple Double Prospects ... Named a 3-star recruit by Scout. com ... received offers from a number of Mid-American Conference schools including Ohio, Toledo, Kent State and Western Michigan ... was one of five Dukes to post a 40-inch vertical jump in July 2104 testing ... his 41" effort tied Derrick Colter for second-best on the team ... has three double digit scoring games off the bench.

33 L.G. GILL 6-7 • Sophomore • F Chesterfield, Va. (9.2, 4.4) FG .514, FT .500

Helped Richmond Benedictine College Prep to the VISAA Division I state championship ... full name is Charles A. Gill, Jr. ... was given the nickname "L.G.," short for "Little Gill," shortly after he was born ... late-bloomer who played JV as a freshman and soph. before backing up current VCU guard Jordan Burgess on Benedictine's 2012 state semifinalist ... wears a size 17 shoe ... scored a careerhigh 19 points (5-6 3pt) at Rhode Island as a freshman.

THE ATLANTIC "14"

For the third consecutive season, the membership of the Atlantic 10 has undergone a change. VCU and Butler joined the league in 2012-13. The next year, Xavier (Big East), Butler (Big East), Temple (American) and Charlotte (Conference USA) departed and George Mason (formerly of the CAA) became a league member. The conference will compete as a 14-team league in 2014-15 with 2014 Southern Conference champion Davidson in its first A-10 season. In the current make-up, each team will play a home-and-home with five schools and face every other team once in an 18-game schedule. DU's partners for 2014-15 are Davidson, Dayton, George Washington, Saint Louis and St. Bonaventure. In addition, all 14 conference members will compete in the Atlantic 10 Championship at Brooklyn's Barclays Center on March 11-15.

LEFTOVERS FROM PITT: Leftovers from Duquesne's 76-62 loss to Pitt on Friday: Duquesne cut a 15-point deficit to six with 6:12 left and trailed by the same margin with 2:53 to go, but could get no closer as the Panthers outscored the Dukes 11-3 over the final 2:52 to pull out the win ... freshman TySean Powell and first-year JC transfer Jordan Stevens - who were both playing in their first City Game - led the Dukes with 15 points each ... Derrick Colter - who hit three 3-pointers in a span of 2:48 of the second half to help the Dukes get back in striking range - finished with 13 ... Duquesne was held to season lows in points (62), field goals (25), field goal percentage (.373), 3-pointers made and attempted (7-22) and 3-point percentage (.318) ... DU's bench was also outscored

for the first time this season (31-22) ... forward L.G. Gill led the Dukes with a career-high five assists ... Gill also paced the team with seven rebounds ... Pitt, which led 39-27 at the half, took the lead for good at the 16:49 mark of the first half ... the Dukes, who were outrebounded 45-37, committed 14 turnovers to 10 for Pitt ... the Panthers outscored the Dukes 20-11 from the foul line.

ON THE ROAD: DU, which won 17 road games in 10 seasons from 1997 through 2006, has posted 43 road Ws over the past nine years. Of the 43 wins, 30 have come by double digits. From 1997 through 2006, Duquesne posted a total of three double-digit road victories. DU went 7-6 on the road last season, tying the 13thhighest road win total in school history. It was just the third time since 1971 that DU posted a winning road record. The Dukes are 10-18 on the road (6-6 non-conference) under Jim Ferry. DU has won its last three road games (at No. 10 (AP) Saint Louis and at George Mason to end last season and at Abilene Christian this year) ... Duquesne was one of only 16 Division I schools with a better winning percentage on the road (.538) than at home (.400) last season. DU's home vs. road pct. gap (.138) was the largest in the country. DU won three of its last four road games.

EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS

Last year, based on the 2013-14 A-10 Preseason Poll, George Washington, Duquesne and St. Bonaventure ranked among the top three in exceeded expectations. GW, which was picked to finish 10th, finished third for an improvement of seven spots. Duquesne, picked to finish 13th, ended up 10th and the Bonnies, picked 12th finished 9th. The Dukes and Bonnies showed three spot increases.

NON-CONFERENCE: Duquesne is 230-237 (.493) in non-conference games since 1976-77 as members of the Eastern 8/Atlantic 10 and Midwestern Collegiate Conference (1992-93 only), including a 150-73 mark at home (59-123 on the road & 21-41 neutral). The Dukes have not had a losing non-conference record since 2006-07. DU is 18-15 in non-league play under Jim Ferry: 12-5 at home (11-4 at Palumbo Center, 1-1 at CONSOL Energy Center), 6-6 on the road and 0-4 neutral.

DUKES SIGN ONE: Duquesne signed 6-8, 225-pound forward **Nakye Sanders** (**Staten** Island, N.Y./Tottenville) (pronunciation: nah-KYE; like "eye") to a National Letter of Intent during the November early-signing period. Sanders, rated as a 3-star recruit by rivals.com and 247sports. com, averaged 19.0 points and 21.0 rebounds as a junior for Tottenville High School in Staten, Island, N.Y. "We began the recruiting process very early with Nakye," said Duquesne head coach Jim Ferry on Nov. 12. "His recruitment was unique in that everybody we came in contact with at his high school - from the principal, to his guidance counselor, to the football coaches - had nothing but great things to say about his leadership skills and the quality of person he is. He is a wonderful kid from a great family. He also has a great foundation basketball-wise, having played for Chris Alesi in the New Heights AAU program well as for John Woodman at Tottenville. Signing players who receive outstanding coaching and who have played in winning programs is something that's really important to us. We're really excited about Nakye's versatility. He is a tenacious rebounder who is skilled both inside and out. He is also still very young and has a lot of room to grow both physically and as a basketball player. We look forward coaching him here at Duquesne." Sanders, who turned 17 on November 1, earned first team New York State Sportswriters Association Class AA all-state honors in leading Tottenville (18-9, 12-2) to a Public Schools Athletic League Staten Island division co-championship and spot in the PSAL Class AA playoffs. It was just the second division title in school history. Sanders, who enters his senior season with over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds, averaged 14.2 points and 15.1 rebounds as a sophomore. He began playing varsity as a 6-foot-4, barely 14-year-old freshman when he averaged 10.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game. Sanders, who played AAU ball for highly-regarded New Heights, helped lead the 16U program to a No. 1 national ranking by both Fivestarbasketball.com and Indihoops.com this summer. New Heights, which compiled a 39-3 record, won five championships including the prestigious Under Armour Finals in Suwanee, Ga. in July. The New York native had over 20 scholarship offers, including St. John's, Seton Hall, Temple, La Salle and Old Dominion prior to committing to Duquesne.

AND TWO MORE WAITING IN THE WINGS: Duquesne also has two transfers sitting out the 2014-15 season. Six-two Butler transfer Rene Castro, who was recruited to Indianapolis by former BU and current Boston Celtics head coach Brad Stevens, averaged 3.3 points in 8.8 minutes per game before receiving his release in early February of 2014. He was ranked as the No. 6 prospect in New England and top player in Massachusetts by New England Recruiting Report following his senior season at Worcester Academy - the same prep school that produced Duquesne 1,000-point scorers Bill Clark (2008-11) and Aaron Jackson (2006-09). Castro will have three seasons of eligibility remaining beginning in 2015-16. Duquesne added 6-5 guard Mar'Qywell Jackson in late July. Jackson, a consensus 3-star recruit, signed an NLI with UTEP and attended classes in El Paso prior to deciding to transfer. The Detroit native was ranked 53rd on the 2014 Hoop Scoop Top 100. Both Castro and Jackson are practicing with the team this season.

FOUR WITH FIVE

THE 52-50 WIN AT IOWA Nov. 17, 2009 Carver-Hawkeye Arena

Bill Clark buried a 3-pointer from the left wing with 11.7 seconds left to give Duquesne a dramatic 52-50 victory over Iowa in the CBE Classic. The win was the Dukes' first over a Big Ten team since 1973, and was also DU's first victory in 10 tries in a Big Ten arena. Clark finished with a game-high 20 points for the Dukes. Damian Saunders added 16 points, 16 rebounds and a career high-tying six steals. Anthony Tucker led Iowa (0-2) with 16 points. D u q u e s n e trailed, 50-49, when Clark came off a double screen and squeezed of a shot. The ball circled the rim twice before dropping through. Tucker missed a short shot for Iowa with two seconds left, but the Hawkeyes scrambled for the loose ball and got a timeout with eight-tenths of a second remaining. B.J. Monteiro blocked Eric May's shot at the buzzer to preserve the victory. Iowa took its first lead since the 4:55 mark of the first half on a Matt Gatens 3-pointer with 2:51 left. Jason Duty ended a nearly four minute scoring drought with a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 1:45 remaining. Saunders fouled out when Iowa's Brennan Cougill converted a three-point play to put the Hawkeyes up 50-49 with 41 seconds left, setting the stage for Clark's game-winner.

RECAP

Allen Roberts came off the bench to score 15 points as Penn State limited Duquesne to 27 percent shooting in a 68-59 win at CONSOL Energy Center. Ovie Soko had 19 points in 22 minutes before fouling out with 5:37 left and Dominique McKoy posted a 12-10 double-double for the Dukes. Penn State also got 13 points from D.J. Newbill and 11 points and 13 assists from Tim Frazier. Duquesne, which shot a Jim Ferry Era-best 59.6 percent in its last game, a 94-88 win over UMBC, shot a Ferry Era low against the Nittany Lions. Duquesne which fell behind 30-19 on a Roberts 3-pointer with just over six minutes left in the first half, rallied to cut the lead to 30-25 on a Jeremiah Jones fast break layup two minutes later. PSU built its lead back to 35-26 at the half. The Nittany Lions stormed out of the blocks to take a 43-28 lead just over three minutes into the second half. McKoy scored five-straight points to pull the Dukes within nine. A pair of Soko free throws made it 47-40 with 10:40 to go. Desmond Ridenour threaded the needle to Isaiah Watkins for a layup to make it a five-point game. Roberts ended the mini-run with a 3-pointer that made it 50-42. The Dukes trailed by six when Soko, who had 18 points and 9 rebounds at the time, picked up his fourth foul with 7:52 left. Newbill hit a 3-pointer on PSU's next possession and Donovon Jack followed with a layup off a pass from Frazier to push the lead back to 11. Ross Travis added another 3-pointer to make it 58-44 with just under six minutes left. Soko re-entered the game, and fouled out after hitting a free throw with 5:37 to go and the Dukes down 58-45. Roberts hit a jumper off a pass from Frazier to make it a 19-point game with 2:14 to go. A steal and dunk by McKoy with 27.8 seconds left capped a frantic Duquesne rally that made it 67-59, but the Dukes could get no closer as Frazier added a free throw for the final margin.

D.J. Newbill had 23 points and 12 rebounds and Nick Colella added a careerhigh 15 points off the bench as Penn State (8-4) held off hard-charging Duquesne (7-7) to post an 84-74 win at Bryce Jordan Center. The Dukes, who trailed by 22 with under 10 minutes left, cut it to five in the last minute before Penn State hit 5-of-8 free throws in the last 39 seconds to pull away. Sean Johnson scored all of his team-high 19 points in the second half for DU. Quevyn Winters had 14 and Derrick Colter added 13 for the Dukes. Duquesne, which trailed 39-28 at the half, cut it to eight on a pair of Jerry Jones free throws with 16:38 left, before managing just one field goal - a Johnson three-point play - and four free throws over the next 7:13 as PSU built its lead to as many as 22. The Dukes chipped away behind Johnson and Colter, who scored 10 in the second half, to cut it to seven with just over a minute remaining. Winters hit a 3-pointer with 55 seconds left to cut the lead to 79-74, before Newbill hit one of two free throws. Colter, who went 3-of-7 from the arc, missed a 3-point attempt and Newbill was fouled and missed both, but PSU's Akosa Maduegbunam grabbed the long rebound and converted a pair of free throws to make it an eight-point game. Newbill added a pair of free throws with six seconds left for the final margin. Penn State led by 11 with under three minutes left in the first half before the Dukes cut it to five on a Jerry Jones jumper at the 1:24 mark. Colella - who hit a career high five 3-pointers - drilled a three from the right corner to make it 34-26. Jerry Jones was then called for an offensive foul and head coach Jim Ferry was assessed a technical foul. Newbill hit one free throw before the DU bench was tagged with another technical 10 seconds later. Newbill hit both free throws and Sasa Borovnjak scored on a driving layup to make it a 13-point game. On DU's next possession, a double technicals were called on Jeremiah Jones and Borovnjak before Winters hit a pair of free throws to make it 39-28 at the half.

NOTES

There were 54 fouls called in the game that lasted nearly two hours and twenty minutes ... four Dukes and two Nittany Lions fouled out ... the two combined for 65 free throw attempts - including 53 in the second half ... Jim Ferry

Head Coach • Third Season at Duquesne 17th Season Overall

Jim Ferry, who led LIU Brooklyn to back-to-back NCAA Championship appearances in 2011 and 2012, is in his third season as head coach of the Dukes.

The Elmont, N.Y. native, who came to the Bluff with over 250 wins as a head coach at the Division I, Division II and Division III levels, is the 16th head coach in the 96-year history of Duquesne basketball.

Ferry's inaugural Dukes team, which finished 8-22, managed to post the school's first win at Temple in 18 years as well as produce Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team member Derrick Colter.

In 2014, Ferry guided a roster that opened the season with eight first-year scholarship

players to 13 wins. The Dukes notched seven road victories for just the fifth time since 1955, including the school's first road win over a Top 10 team in 52 years - 71-64 at No. 10 (AP) Saint Louis on February 27.

Ferry transfer recruits Ovie Soko (UAB) and Micah Mason (Drake) had outstanding seasons. Soko led an Atlantic 10 Conference that sent six teams to the NCAA Tournament in scoring on his way to earning third team all-league honors and Mason became the first Duquesne men's player to lead the nation in a statistical category when he shot an NCAA-best .560 from the 3-point arc.

Ferry came to DU after engineering one of the top rebuilding projects in NCAA Division I basketball at LIU.

He took over a 5-22 Blackbirds team in 2002-03 and guided it to 52 wins, including a 34-2 record in Northeast Conference play, in his final two seasons. In the process, Ferry's LIU teams consistently ranked among the top scoring squads in the country.

In 2011, the Blackbirds were the fourth-highest scoring team in the nation in finishing 27-6. The 27 wins were the most by an LIU team since 1937.

LIU ranked second nationally in scoring at 81.4 points per game in posting a 25-9 record in 2012. It was the first time since 1941 & 1942 - then under legendary head coach Clair Bee - that LIU won 25 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

Ferry left the Brooklyn campus with a 27-game home win streak - second only to 2012 national champion Kentucky's 52 consecutive home victories at the time. He also left behind four returning starters including 2011-12 NEC Player of the Year Julian Bond to come to Duquesne. The 2013 Blackbirds went on to make a third consecutive NCAA appearance under former Ferry assistant Jack Perri.

Ferry earned a number of accolades during his time at LIU including a pair of NEC Coach of the Year honors (2005 and 2011). His players also received numerous honors including NEC Player of the Year (Julian Bond) and NEC Rookie of the Year twice (James Williams & Julian

Bond). In all, Ferry coached 11 all-conference honorees and eight all-rookie selections in 10 seasons at LIU. Among his top recruits was guard Jason Brickman, who finished his career as one of only four players in NCAA history to accumulate 1,000 assists.

Prior to taking over at LIU, Ferry was highly successful at the Division II level where he led Adelphi University to an 82-11 record in three seasons from 1999 through 2002. He led the Garden City, N.Y. school to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2000 and NCAA Elite 8 appearances in 2001 and 2002 and was named NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Division II Coach of the Year all three seasons.

Ferry's Adelphi teams went 62-4 in winning three-straight New York Collegiate Athletic Conference championships. His 2001 Panthers won 31 consecutive games in posting a school record 31 wins (31-1).

Ferry got his head coaching start at Division III Plymouth State University in Plymouth, New Hampshire where he led the Panthers to a 22-8 record and an appearance in the New England Tournament finals in 1998-99.

He was named New Hampshire Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year following the season.

Ferry reached the 100-win plateau (104-19) in his first four seasons as a head coach.

A 1990 graduate of Keene State College in Keene, New Hampshire, Ferry started his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater in 1990-91.

He served as an assistant coach at Bentley College in Waltham, Mass. for seven seasons prior to taking the head coaching position at Plymouth State. As an assistant, he helped the Falcons to a 1992-93 Northeast 10 regular season championship and trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Ferry, the son of a New York City transit police officer, played one year at New York Tech before transferring to Keene State, where he posted a double-digit scoring average for his career. Ferry led the Owls in scoring as a junior and was team captain as a senior. He earned his undergraduate degree in public safety science.

Ferry and his wife, Kelly, are the parents of four children: Victoria, twins Hannah and James, and Leo.

DUQUESNE BASKETBALL HISTORICAL BITS

WHY DUKES?

The nickname "Dukes" goes back to the changing of the name of the University from the University of the Holy Ghost to Duquesne University of the Holy Ghost in 1911 (the shortened version, Duquesne University, became official in 1935). The name Duquesne was chosen in honor of Ange Duquesne de Menneville, Marquis du Quesne, the French governor of New France who built Fort Duquesne at The Point in Pittsburgh in 1754 and was the first man to bring Catholic observances to the city. Since a Marquis and a Duke dress similarly, the unofficial symbol of the school's athletic teams became a man dressed in a top hat, tails and a sash of royalty across the chest. Dukes being more readily known than Marquis, the name Duke was popularly assigned to the symbol and it has stuck ever since.

IT ALL BEGAN ON JAN. 15, 1913

Duquesne fielded its first basketball team in 1913-14. The Dukes defeated Bethany, 43-28, at home in their first game on Jan. 15, 1913. This is the 99th season of DU basketball.

CUMBERLAND POSEY

Duquesne, which was at the forefront among predominately white colleges in the recruitment of black athletes, lists Cumberland Posey as its first recorded black athlete. Posey, who led the Dukes in scoring for three seasons from 1916-18 under the name of Charles Cumbert, went on to greater fame as the manager and later owner of the fabled Homestead Grays of the Negro Baseball League. On Feb. 27, 2006 Posey was honored for his contributions to the game by being one of 17 Negro League greats selected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame. Prior to his stint at Duquesne, Posey formed the Monticello Rifles - one of the first great black barnstorming basketball teams. The Rifles, under Posey, absorbed all of Pittsburgh's best black players to form the Loendi Big Five, a team that became a dynasty by winning four-straight Colored Basketball World Championships between 1920 and 1923. Posey, along with Harvard grad Edwin Henderson, is considered to have been instrumental in introducing basketball to the black community in the early 1900s.

NIT AND NCAA IN SAME SEASON

The 20-3 1940 Dukes, along with Colorado, were one of the first two teams invited to play in both the NIT (second place) and NCAA Championship (Final Four) in the same season. Duquesne, which was coming off a three games-in-five-days runner-up finish at the NIT in New York City, made the trip to Indianapolis to face Western Kentucky seven days later in the second NCAA Tournament. DU went on to defeat the Hilltoppers 30-29 before falling to eventual national champion Indiana in the national semifinal. Duquesne head coach Chick Davies, who knocked off St. John's Joe Lapchick and Oklahoma A&M's Hank Iba to advance to the championship game of the NIT, added another notch to his belt with the win over WKU-and third Hall of Fame Coach - in E.A. "Ed" Diddle. DU also played in the NCAAs and NIT in 1952. On two other occasions (1941 & '47), Duquesne declined an NCAA bid to play in the NIT.

COOPER MAKES HISTORY

"I don't give a damn if he's striped or plaid or polka-dot, Boston takes Charles Cooper of Duquesne!" were the history-making words of Boston Celtics owner Walter Brown when he made Duquesne's Chuck Cooper the first African-American player drafted by a National Basketball Association team with the first pick of the second round (12th overall) on April 25, 1950. Cooper, who went to Pittsburgh's Westinghouse High School, attended Duquesne on the GI Bill. He led the Dukes to a 78-19 record and two NIT appearances in his four-year career and captained a 1949-50 squad - the first Duquesne team to be ranked for an entire season by the Associated Press - to a 23-6 record and No. 6 ranking. Cooper, who played in the NBA

for six seasons, died on Feb. 5, 1984. His legacy is currently being honored by the Athletic Department with the annual Chuck Cooper Classic.

JIM TUCKER ALSO LEFT HIS MARK ON THE NBA

In addition to the first African-American drafted by an NBA team (Chuck Cooper), Duquesne can also claim one of the first two African-Americans to win an NBA title. Jim Tucker (1952-54) and teammate Earl Lloyd were the first two African-Americans to play on an NBA championship team as members of the 1955 Syracuse Nationals. Tucker is also part of another NBA footnote. On February 20, 1955, the rookie forward took just 17 minutes to reach double digits in three statistical categories - the fastest triple-double in NBA history - in a 104-84 win over the New York Knicks. Tucker finished the game with 12 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists.

DUKES FIRST ON TV IN PITTSBURGH

The first televised game in Pittsburgh basketball history was between Duquesne and St. Bonaventure on Feb. 11, 1952 from Duquesne Gardens. The Dukes and Bonnies were the only unbeaten teams in the nation at the time. The game was aired by WDTV (now KDKA) with Ray Scott handling the play-by-play.

POLL POSITION

Duquesne has spent more total weeks (66) in the Associated Press Top 10 than any other Atlantic 10 school. The Dukes were ranked for 36 consecutive weeks from 1953-56.

WE'RE NUMBER 1

Duquesne achieved the No. 1 ranking in both the AP and UPI polls for two weeks from February 16 to March 1, 1954.

1955 NIT CHAMPIONS

All-Americans Dick Ricketts and Sihugo Green led Duquesne to the 1955 National Invitation Tournament title at New York's Madison Square Garden. Ricketts and Green, who were both named consensus first team All-Americans, combined to score all of Duquesne's 35 first-half points - and the first nine points of the second half - as the Dukes defeated ninthranked Dayton 70-58 in the title game on March 19, 1955. Led by head coach Dudey Moore and his assistant Red Manning, the '55 Dukes finished ranked No. 6 in the nation with a 22-4 record and maintained a ranking in the Associated Press Top 10 for 14 consecutive weeks.

BACK-TO-BACK NO. 1'S

In the summer of 2000, ESPN.com researched and posted the all-time list of NBA draft first overall picks. According to their findings, one school - Duquesne - has ever had back-to-back first overall picks: Dick Ricketts by Milwaukee in 1955 and Sihugo Green by Rochester in 1956. Green, the only two-time consensus All-American in school history was selected ahead of San Francisco star Bill Russell. According to a UPI story from that year, teams were wary of Russell for three reasons: "1) He wouldn't be available until late December because of his commitment to the U.S. Olympic team; 2) It was feared that the Harlem Globetrotters would bid high for his services and 3) There was doubt among some pro coaches that Russell would star in the pro game as he did in college."

NORM NIXON

Norm Nixon, who led the Dukes to the first Atlantic 10 (then Eastern 8) Championship in 1977, enjoyed a 10-year NBA career with the Los Angeles Lakers and Clippers. Nixon, who played for two World Champion Lakers teams (1980 & 1982) finished his NBA career with 12,065 points and 6,386 assists.

RECAP

Derrick Colter scored a career-high 26 points in leading Duquesne to a 91-51 season-opening win over Bluefield State at Palumbo Center. The 5-11 junior went 8-of-9 from the field, including 7-of-8 from 3-point in 23 minutes of action. The seven 3-pointers - a career high - were one shy of the school record shared by three players. Micah Mason, making his Duquesne debut at point guard, had 16 points and a career-high nine assists. Freshman Eric James added 14 points and seven rebounds off the bench for the Dukes who shot 54.7 percent. Dajon Reno led Bluefield State with 22. Duquesne trailed 8-4 before James and fellow freshman TySean Powell ignited a 20-4 run. Powell tipped in a Mason miss and Mason followed with a three-point play. Powell then added another bucket and James followed with a dunk to make it 13-8. James and Colter hit back-to-back 3-pointers in a 30 second span to give the Dukes a 24-12 lead with 11:30 left. BSC ended the run with a Reno 3-pointer before Mason, who was 3-of-6 from 3-point, answered with another three to give the Dukes a double-digit lead that grew to 28 when Colter converted a four-point play with just under one minute left in the half. Duquesne shot 55.3 percent with 13 assists and one turnover in the opening 20 minutes. The Dukes led by as many as 41 in the second half.

NOTES

The win gave Duquesne an 82-17 record in season openers, including a 77-4 mark when opening the season at home ... Colter, who played 23 minutes, eclipsed his previous career high of 25 which he reached in back-to-back games vs. Western Michigan and at Louisiana Lafayette as a freshman ... Colter's seven 3-pointers were one shy of the school record set by Tony Petrarca at Pitt on Dec. 18, 1989 (8-12) and matched by Bryant McAllister at Rhode Island (8-13) on Feb. 8, 2006 and Aaron Jackson (8-13) at Virginia Tech on Mar. 18, 2009 ... Micah Mason finished with 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting (3-of-6 from 3-point) in 26 minutes ... his nine assists were two more than his previous career high of seven set in 2014 vs. Fordham ... DU set Ferry Era highs for margin of victory (+40), field goals (35) & 3-pointers (14) and held BSC to Ferry Era opponent low points (51) and field goal pct. (.271).

Jordan Stevens came off the bench to score 27 points - including 18 on 3-pointers - and Duquesne shot 74 percent in the second half to roll to a 102-81 win at Abilene Christian. The win was DU's first 100-point effort under third-year head coach Jim Ferry. Freshman TySean Powell was 7-of-7 from the field in adding 18 points in 18 minutes off the bench for the Dukes who outscored the ACU bench 67-18 in posting their fifth consecutive nonconference road win. L.G. Gill had 13 points and freshman Eric James added 12 off the bench. Jeremiah Jones (10) and Micah Mason (8) both had career rebounding highs for the Dukes who finished with a 40-30 advantage on the glass. Stevens, who missed DU's opener due to a team suspension, went 10of-17 from the field and 6-of-9 from 3-point added a game high-tying 4 assists in 28 minutes. There were six ties and three lead changes before a Stevens 3-pointer gave the Dukes a 32-30 lead with just over four minutes left in the first half. Mason hit back-to-back 3-pointers to up the lead to nine. DU took its first double digit lead on a James free throw at the 15 second mark. ACU, which went 12-of-12 from the line in the first half, made it 46-38 on a pair of Parker Wentz free throws with three seconds left. DU, behind eight points from Gill, maintained a nine-point lead early in the second half before Stevens gave the Dukes a 64-49 lead on another 3-pointer. The Dukes, who had 10 players log double-digit minutes, gradually pulled away. A Stevens free throw gave Duquesne its first 20-point lead with 8:21 left. The lead ballooned to 28 on a Desmond Ridenour layup with 3:42 remaining. DU hit 16 of its first 20 shots in finishing 20-of-27 from the field in the second half. A put-back jumper by James put the Dukes at the century mark with 1:36 left. Duquesne finished at 59.6 percent from the field, including 12-of-23 from 3-point. The Dukes limited ACU to 40.3 percent shooting, including 6-of-14 from the arc.

With the victory, Duquesne extended its school record non-conference road win streak to five ... the Dukes have topped the 80-point mark in winning their past four games in the state of Texas ... senior forward Dominique McKoy did not make the trip (medical).

Damon Lynn scored 27 points and handed out eight assists as NJIT shot 56.9 percent in handing Duquesne an 84-81 defeat at Palumbo Center. Micah Mason hit a career-high six 3-pointers in seven attempts in scoring 18 for the Dukes. There were 10 ties and eight lead changes before Lynn gave the Highlanders a 63-61 lead on his sixth and final 3-pointer of the afternoon. NJIT led by nine with 1:52 left before L.G. Gill began an 8-0 run with a 3-pointer. James Robinson scored a game-high 23 points in leading Pitt to a 76-62 win over Duquesne at CONSOL Energy Center. Pitt held Duquesne, which entered the game averaging 88.8 points, to 37.3 percent shooting in posting its 14th consecutive win the 83-game series. Freshman TySean Powell and first-year junior college transfer Jordan Stevens had 15 points apiece for the Dukes. Pitt led by 15 with under 10 minutes left before Jordan Robinson began a 7-0 run with a dunk. Stevens followed with a 3-pointer and found L.G. Gill on the break for a layup forcing the Panthers to burn a timeout with 8:34 left. Derrick Colter, who finished with 13 points, hit three 3-pointers in just under three minutes to make it 65-58 with 4:13 left. Stevens hit one of two free throws at the 3:22 mark to make it a six-point game, but that's as close as the Dukes would get as Josh Newkirk, who scored 16, hit a big 3-pointer from the wing to make it a nine-point game. Jeremiah Jones missed a contested drive and Jamel Artis followed with a pair of free throws to make it 69-59. DU briefly got it back to single digits on a Powell layup. The Dukes began fouling and Pitt responded by hitting five free throws in the final minute to make it a 14-point game. Duquesne missed 12 of its last 15 shots in falling behind 39-27 at the half. The Dukes, who trailed by as many as 14 late, shot 31 percent in the opening 20 minutes. Robinson scored 15 in the first half for the Panthers, who benefitted from nine DU turnovers. The Dukes held the Panthers to one field goal in the first 6:58 of the second half but could only pull to within seven - on a Stevens jumper with 14:41 left - during that span.
