Nittany Lions Play a Trio at UNC Greensboro: The Penn State baseball team heads to UNC Greensboro this weekend for a three-game set with the Spartans. The Nittany Lions will be taking on Greensboro for the first time in program history. Penn State is coming off a 1-2 weekend at the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge in Clearwater, Fla.

Last Time Out : Coming off tough back-to-back losses to Seton Hall and West Virginia, the Penn State baseball team fought back from a 3-2 deficit and defeated the Cincinnati Bearcats on Sunday afternoon by a score of 5-2. Senior **Jordan Steranka** put together a 2-for-5 effort, which included the game-tying homerun in the eighth inning.

The homer by Steranka was the spark for the Nittany Lions, as the bats came alive afterwards. Senior **Joey DeBernardis** followed Steranka's at-bat with a double. Senior **Sean Deegan** then responded with a big, go-ahead RBI triple to give Penn State a 4-3 lead. Junior **Luis Montesinos** capped off the rally with an RBI single to score Deegan.

Sophomore **Joe Kurrasch** came in to relieve junior **Steven Hill** and was phenomenal, tossing three innings of two-hit and no run ball. Kurrasch escaped a big bases loaded jam in the eighth inning, as he struck out Cincinnati's two-hole hitter looking.

Scouting the Spartans: The Spartans of UNC Greensboro are off to an impressive 4-0 start, earning three wins over Delaware State last weekend and a mid-week win over UNC Asheville on Tuesday afternoon. Through their first four games, the Spartans have scored a total of 44 runs (11.0 per contest), including scoring 13 in three of those games.

UNC Greensboro has allowed just 10 runs through its first four games as well. In two of the three wins over Delaware State, the Spartans won by scores of 13-0 and 13-1, while allowing four and five runs in the other two contests.

The Spartans, who are hitting .366 through its first four games, have three players that have slugging percentages over 1.000 including, Andrew Spleth (1.167), Kris Richards (1.154) and Zach Leach (1.222). Leach and Richards have two homeruns each to go along with eight and six RBI respectively. Trevor Edwards leads the team with three homeruns in the first four games.

On the mound, the Spartans have a team ERA of 2.50. Tyler Hollstegge, who earned a start last weekend for UNC Greensboro, went five innings, giving up one hit in a combined shutout effort against Delaware State.

All-Time vs. the Spartans: This will be the first ever matchup between UNC Greensboro and Penn State.

THIS SEASON: Earned the start against West Virginia (2/18) in the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge ... After a slow start, settled down to strike out seven batters in just four innings of work.

AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011: Pieced together an outstanding sophomore campaign, earning third-team All-Big Ten honors after going 6-4 with a 3.19 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 84.2 innings of work ... Held his opposition to a .234 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the conference ... Also ranked among the top-10 pitchers in wins, ERA, innings pitched, and strikeouts ... Allowed two runs or less in nine of his first 10 outings during the year ... Picked up his first win of the season after limiting NC State to one run on four hits over 5.1 innings of work on March 5 ... Continued to shine against top-notch competition after recording seven strikeouts while holding No. 26 Wichita State to just one hit over five innings on March 20 ... Posted another seven strikeouts during six shutout innings against Le Moyne on March 27 ... Put together his finest start of the season against Illinois on April 2 after setting a career-high with nine strikeouts while allowing just one run during a complete game effort ... Allowed just two runs in each of his next three starts, highlighted by a six-inning, one-hit effort against Purdue on April 17 and an eight-inning, five-strikeout performance against Ohio State on April 23 ... Earned his sixth win of the season after striking out seven while allowing just three hits over 6.2 innings against Iowa on May 7 during a nationally televised game on the Big Ten Network ... Wrapped up conference action with a 4-0 record, 3.06 ERA, and 36 strikeouts ... Started the first game of the Big Ten Tournament against Purdue, firing five innings with two strikeouts on May 25 ... Only qualifying pitcher in the Big Ten that did not allow a single home run during the year ... Honored with the Ed Drapcho Award as Penn State's most improved player ... Cut his ERA in half and allowed 12 fewer hits despite firing nearly twice as many innings as he did during his freshman campaign ... Named Third Team All-Big Ten ... Also named Academic All-Big Ten.

AS A FRESHMAN IN 2010: Saw significant action in freshman campaign, going 1-4 with a 7.95 ERA in 18 games (six starts) ... Was sixth on the squad with 43 innings pitched ... Ended the season with strong performance in the finale vs. Michigan (5/22), throwing 1.1 scoreless frames along with two strikeouts ... Allowed three runs in four innings vs. La Salle (4/27) in final start of the season ... Pitched a scoreless inning vs. Mount St. Mary's (4/21) ... Made first Big Ten start vs. Northwestern (4/11), throwing 4.2 innings while allowing four earned runs with five strikeouts, a game the Lions went on to win ... Allowed only one earned run in three innings against Bucknell (4/6) ... Picked up first-career win behind 5.2 stellar innings out of the bullpen vs. Kent State (3/31). Only allowed two runs on four hits with four strikeouts ... Went a career-high six innings in start against Kent State (3/21) while picking up a career-high seven strikeouts ... Showed flashes of brilliance at Texas A&M (3/9) in first-career start. Retired nine of the first 10 batters ... Tossed two strong innings against Lamar (3/6), only allowing one earned run ... AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011: Earned the start vs. Cincinnati in a Sunday showdown in the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge ... Struck out five batters in six inning of work to earn the no decision.

AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011: Pieced together a breakout sophomore campaign, earning second-team All-Big Ten honors while receiving the Charles Medlar Award as Penn State's top pitcher ... Anchored the starting rotation throughout the year, starting 15 games while leading all conference pitchers with a 2.57 ERA ... Fired 101.2 innings, which led the squad and ranked second in the Big Ten ... Tossed at least six innings in 12 starts, including a league-high four complete games ... Opened the year with a season-high eight strikeouts while scattering five hits over 7.2 innings of work against West Virginia during the BIG EAST / Big Ten Challenge on February 19 ... Limited NC State to six hits in 6.2 innings of work while posting five strikeouts on March 5 ... Tossed his first complete game of the season and earned the victory after striking out five while allowing just one unearned run during the second game of a doubleheader against Norfolk State on March 19 ... Continued his hot streak with 7.1 innings of work against No. 26 Wichita State, which earned him his second straight victory ... Picked up another win after surrendering just five hits and two runs while striking out seven during a complete game effort against Le Moyne on March 26 ... Tossed his first shutout of the season after blanking Northwestern during a 12-0 victory in Evanston ... Limited the Wildcats to seven hits while striking out two without allowing a walk ... Fired at least six innings in each of his next three starts, highlighted by an eight-inning effort against Michigan State on April 29 ... Named the Big Ten Co-Pitcher of the Week for his performance against Minnesota on May 13 ... Scattered just four hits and struck out six without surrendering a walk while firing his second shutout of the season against the Golden Gophers ... Wrapped up the regular season with seven shutout innings against Michigan on May 19 to earn his sixth victory of the year ... Surrendered just 12 walks during the season and ranked 17th in the nation with a 1.06 walks-per-nine-innings rate ... Finished the year with a 2.08 ERA in conference action, which was the lowest in the league.

AS A FRESHMAN IN 2010: Appeared in 21 games with eight starts while throwing 68 innings (second on the squad) ... 43 strikeouts were third-best ... Finished the season with sensational start vs. Michigan (5/21), tying a career-high seven innings, allowing only three runs. The Lions went on to a thrilling 6-5 walk-off win in the ninth ... Was the tough-luck loser at Minnesota (5/15), bouncing back from a tough first inning to go 5.2, allowing only four runs with five strikeouts in the Metrodome ... Earned first-career save as part of win over No. 24 Pitt (4/13), throwing 1.1 scoreless innings with two strikeouts ... Picked up second win of the season, coming into a jam against Columbia (3/20) while tossing 1.2 sparkling innings ... Second strong start in as many outings, tossing six innings while only allowing two runs with three strikeouts at Texas State (3/14) ...
