

INSIDE THE GAME

NITTANY LIONS CONTINUE HOMESTAND AGAINST SAN DIEGO STATE

The third game of a five-game homestand will bring a first-time opponent to Beaver Stadium, as the San Diego State Aztecs of the Mountain West Conference will take on Penn State in a 3:30 p.m. contest that will be televised on the Big Ten Network.

Penn Štate is returning to non-conference play after a thrilling win in its Big Ten opener against Rutgers in primetime. The Nittany Lion faithful again proved that they were the best in the nation as a near-capacity crowd of over 103,000 perfectly executed a "Stripe Out" of Beaver Stadium; alternating sections of fans donned either blue or white. Penn State pride runs deeper than good looks though, as the student section's passion and energy made a direct impact on Rutgers' very first offensive play. Pinned on their own 2-yard line right in front of the screaming students, a Scarlet Knight twitched early for a false start. The Penn State defense only allowed Rutgers to reach the red zone once. The Scarlet Knights were able to get a field goal out of that drive, but the Lions held them out of the end zone, doing so for the first time against a Big Ten opponent since 2011.

Freshman Saquon Barkley added to the fireworks with a 195 of Penn State's 330 rushing yards on the night and two touchdowns. Akeel Lynch broke through for a 75-yard touchdown run, while DeAndre Thompkins continued a trend of wide receivers contributing to the ground game with night's first score.

Penn State will face an unfamiliar opponent in San Diego State. Not only has Penn State never played the Aztecs, but Penn State has played just four games against the current alignment of the Mountain West in its history. Three of those games were against Air Force and the most recent meeting with a MWC foe was against Utah State in 1977. The Nittany Lions prevailed in all four games, while San Diego State is 2-14 all-time against Big Ten opponents.

Penn State is in its 129th season of intercollegiate football and owns a 851-377-42 record, to rank eighth nationally in all-time victories.

Penn State is one of just eight programs to pass the 850-win milestone, four of whom are Big Ten members: Penn State, Michigan, Nebraska and Ohio State.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 348 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 20 in 2014, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 192-71 (.730) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572.

LIONS IN THE NFL

25 NITTANY LIONS ON ACTIVE NFL ROSTERS

A total of 25 Penn State football alumni are populating the active rosters of 19 National Football League teams. The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL.

The Jacksonville Jaguars boast a league-high four former Nittany Lions, including nine-year veteran and 2013 Pro Bowl linebacker Paul Posluszny and 2014 second-round pick Allen Robinson. Veterans Jared Odrick (Miami) and Stefan Wisniewski (Oakland) signed with Jacksonville during the offseason as free agents.

The Chicago Bears (Adrian Amos and Robbie Gould, Dallas Cowboys (Jack Crawford and Sean Lee) and Seattle Seahawks (Garry Gilliam and Jordan Hill) - each have two PSU alums.

Three players from Penn State's 2014 squad landed on active rosters - Amos (Chicago), Jesse James (Pittsburgh) and Donovan Smith (Tampa Bay). Another three from 2014 were named to practice squads; Brad Bars (New York Giants). Mike Hull (Miami) and Deion Barnes (New York Jets).

Penn State has had 39 NFL Draft picks since 2006, including 17 in the first three rounds, and at least three NFL Draft picks 17 times since starting Big Ten Conference competition in 1993. A total of 338 Nittany Lions have been selected all-time in the NFL Draft. Eleven-year veteran and Chicago Bears All-Pro placekicker Gould is Penn State's elder statesman in the NFL. Kansas City Chiefs All-Pro linebacker Tamba Hali, who is entering his 10th professional season, is second in longevity, followed by Posluszny (nine years) and seven-year professionals Jordan Norwood (Denver) and Cameron Wake (Miami).

For the 44th time in the Super Bowl's 49-game history, at least one Penn State alumnus was a member of one of the participating teams (18 times in last 20 years). Thirty-six former Nittany Lions have earned a total of 53 Super Bowl rings, most recently Hill and since-retired running back Michael Robinson with Seattle in 2014. A total of 105 Nittany Lions have been on Super Bowl rosters.

football head coach James Franklin Penn State announced on Aug. 10 that Christian Hackenberg, Jordan Lucas, Angelo Mangiro, Von Walker and Anthony Zettel will serve as team captains for the 2015 season. Hackenberg is a team captain for the second consecutive year.

"This group of guys was selected by their teammates and coaches because they are outstanding ambassadors for our program," Franklin said. "They are leaders in the classroom, in the community, in the locker room and are important influencers for our team."

Entering 2015, Hackenberg had started all 25 career games under center and ranked No. 3 in career passing yards (5,932), attempts (876) and completions (501), and was No. 4 in career total offense (5,770).

An honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection last season, Lucas is the unquestioned leader of the secondary. His 58 stops in 2014 ranked third on the team and his nine pass. breakups ranked among the best in the Big Ten.

Mangiro was the leader of a young offensive line corps in 2014, starting every game and making starts at three different positions. He made 10 starts at center, two at right tackle and one at left guard. His efforts up front helped Penn State amass over 300 yards of total offense on seven occasions in 2014, including 453 yards vs. Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

Walker earned a scholarship in April after two seasons as a walk-on, including a move from running back to linebacker during 2014 spring practice. Walker appeared in 12 games last season and made his first career start versus Northwestern. He was also a major contributor on special teams, ranking third on the team with five special teams tackles, including four on kickoff coverage. He has also excelled in the classroom, earning Academic All-Big Ten honors last year.

After moving from defensive end to defensive tackle in 2014, Zettel enjoyed his most productive season on the field in the blue and white. A fourth-team All-America selection by Athlon Sports and an All-Big Ten first-team pick by both the coaches and media, Zettel logged career-best totals with 17 tackles-for-loss and 8.0 sacks. Zettel was the only FBS player to rank among the national leaders in sacks and interceptions per game in 2014. Zettel is on a number of different awards watch lists.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11.2014.

From Langhorne, Pa., Franklin vowed to "Dominate The State" and raise the bar in the team's academic achievement and community service during his introductory news conference. During his short tenure in Happy Valley, he has electrified Nittany Nation with his passion, vision for the program and ability to recruit premier student-athletes from across the nation. Franklin has assembled a coaching staff featuring a record of success, tremendous chemistry and familiarity with each other, Penn State and the region.

"I can't tell you how excited I am to come home, Franklin stated at his introductory press conference. "I grew up watching Penn State football and now to be at the helm of such a storied program is a tremendous honor. It's important to me to be a part of a University that strives for excellence in everything they do.

"When football student-athletes come to Penn State, they have a unique opportunity to receive a premium education while playing at the highest level of competition."

Since Day 1, Franklin has reinforced his four core values in an effort to return the Penn State program to national prominence.

The passionate, positive and driven Franklin is in his fifth year as a collegiate head coach, leading his first four squads to a bowl game, earning post-season victories the past three years. He owns a 33-22 career record, with three consecutive winning seasons.

His first season as the Nittany Lions' head coach began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland in Penn State's first-ever international game. The 2014 campaign ended with an equally dramatic comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. The Nittany Lions overcame a 14-point deficit late in the third quarter, tying the largest comeback in Penn State's bowl history.

With the Pinstripe Bowl win, Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012). In leading the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, Franklin also joined Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

In February 2015, the Nittany Lions' highlyregarded class of 25 signees was ranked in the Top 15 nationally by the four major recruiting services.

During Franklin's first fall semester on campus, the Nittany Lions delivered a record-setting academic performance. The football student-athletes set program records with 25 student-athletes earning Dean's List recognition (3.5 GPA), 57 players owning a cumulative 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) or higher after the 2014 fall semester and 21 true freshmen posting a 3.0 GPA or better. Additionally, 51 squad members compiled at

least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2014, the second-highest semester total in program history. The spring of 2015 saw continued academic success with 51 studentathletes compiling at least a 3.0 GPA, marking the first time in program history with 50 or more 3.0s in a spring semester. Additionally, 18 squad members were at a Dean's List-level GPA for the spring semester.

Penn State's 87 percent football graduation figure was second-highest in the Big Ten Conference and No. 5 among all public FBS institutions, according to NCAA data in October 2014. The Nittany Lions' 87 percent graduation rate was 16 points higher than the 71 percent FBS average.

"We take a great deal of pride in our academic performance and we are committed to a high level of success and achievement in the classroom and on the field," says Franklin, who is in his 21st year in coaching. "I have been so impressed by the dedication, work ethic and pride our players have demonstrated with all their academic and team responsibilities. We want our players to have the complete student-athlete experience at Penn State!"

From June to December 2014, the Nittany Lions completed a program-record of more than 1,900 total hours of community service. Members of the football program participated in more than 30 community service events, including 23 events from the time training camp started in August. The volunteer events began with the Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games on June 6 and ended on Dec. 26 with a visit to Sloan-Kettering Memorial Hospital in New York. Many squad members also traveled to the Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital in July, visiting with patients and their families.

The engaging and enthusiastic Franklin is a popular speaker and media interview subject. For the second consecutive year, he was a guest analyst on ESPN's coverage from the site of college football's National Championship game, spending a day appearing on various ESPN platforms from Fort Worth, Texas.

This past February, Franklin was the lone college head coach among the speakers and panelists at the prestigious MIT Sloan Sports Analytics Conference in Boston. He was a panelist for the session, "The Formula to Win: College Football Analytics," which was moderated by CNN anchor/reporter Rachel Nichols.

"Coach Franklin is a great relationship builder and has a tremendous connection with his student-athletes, the Penn State student body and our community. stated Sandy Barbour, Director of Athletics. "James aptly applies his football expertise and uses his high energy, passionate approach, and ability to listen and learn, to motivate the student-athletes in the program. You can see it in their effort, preparation and 'never give up' mentality. Penn State football has outstanding tradition, a really proud past and a very bright future under Coach Franklin's leadership and I'm excited to see our progress.'

"Our primary focus was to identify someone who shared our commitment to integrity, academics and winning championships," then-Director of Athletics Dave Joyner said at Franklin's introductory news conference. "Coach Franklin is a highly regarded coach and tremendous leader, but more importantly, he shares the same vision for Penn State football that we, and our fans, have for the program. His record shows that he takes great pride in the academic and athletic success of his studentathletes.

"I'm incredibly excited to get to know the students, alumni, and fans who have demonstrated such loyalty to the University as a whole and to the football program in particular," Franklin added. "I've worked my way through every division of football and no other school boasts a fan base like we do. We Are...Penn Statel'

Franklin directed Vanderbilt to consecutive Top 25 finishes for the first time in the 124-year history of the program. The Commodores finished the 2013 season No. 24 in the Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the USA Today Coaches survey. The 2012 Vanderbilt squad finished No. 23 and 20, respectively, marking its first AP final ranking since 1948. Franklin's 24 wins tied Dan McGugin for the most by a Vanderbilt coach in his first three seasons.

Franklin led Vanderbilt to a bowl game in each of his three seasons in Nashville, with the last two years resulting in wins over North Carolina State (Music City Bowl) and Houston (BBVA Compass Bowl). The Commodores had played in four bowl games all-time in the 121 seasons prior to his arrival, none in consecutive years.

Vanderbilt has posted four nine-win seasons in program history, with Franklin's last two teams comprising half of the total. Over the last 20 games during the 2012-13 seasons, the Commodores' 16-4 record was second-best in the SEC to Alabama's 17-3 mark.

Franklin inherited a Vanderbilt team that finished 2-10 in both 2009 and 2010. including a 1-15 SEC mark. From 1983-2010, the Commodores had just one winning season (2008) prior to his arrival. His drive, coaching acumen and enthusiasm drove a quick turnaround in Vanderbilt's fortunes, as the team posted a 6-6 regular-season record and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl during his first season. The 2011 bowl berth was Vanderbilt's second since 1983 and running back Zac Stacy broke the Commodores' season record with 1,193 rushing yards.

The Commodores had a breakthrough campaign in 2012 under Franklin, finishing on a seven-game winning streak (longest since 1948) to post a 9-4 mark, Vanderbilt's most wins in 97 years. A victory at Missouri sparked an 8-1 finish, which included three consecutive SEC road wins for the first time in program history. The Commodores were 5-3 in SEC play, winning five SEC games for the first time since 1935, and posted two shutouts for the first time since 1968. Vanderbilt defeated N.C. State, 38-24, in the Music City Bowl and Franklin was among five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year. Stacy became the first player in Vanderbilt history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, gaining 1,141 yards to finish with a school-record 3,143 yards and 30 rushing touchdowns. Stacy started 12 games and ran for 973 yards and seven touchdowns as a rookie with the St. Louis Rams in 2013. Wide receiver Jordan Matthews broke the Vanderbilt season receiving record with 1,363 yards on 94 catches.

Vanderbilt continued its historic rise under Franklin during the 2013 season, capping a school-record second consecutive 9-4 campaign with a 41-24 win over Houston in the BBVA Compass Bowl. The Commodores defeated Florida, Georgia and Tennessee in the same season for the first time in history, winning in Gainesville and Knoxville. Franklin helped Matthews develop into a two-time All-American and the SEC's career leader in receptions and receiving yardage, having compiled 262 career receptions for 3,759 yards and 24 touchdowns. Matthews broke the SEC season record with 112 receptions for 1,477 yards and seven touchdowns in 2013, becoming the first SEC receiver to make 100 catches in a season. Tackle Wesley Johnson also earned first-team All-SEC honors from the coaches and the Associated Press.

Franklin began his coaching career as the wide receivers coach at Kutztown (Pa.) University (1995) and was a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, East Stroudsburg (Pa.) in 1996, working with the secondary. He then was the wide receivers coach at James Madison (1997), a graduate assistant (tight ends) at Washington State in 1998 and the wide receivers coach at Idaho State (1999).

In 2000, Franklin was named the wide receivers coach at Maryland under head coach Ron Vanderlinden, who would go on to coach the Penn State linebackers from 2001-13. Franklin continued in that role under new head coach Ralph Friedgen in 2002 and '03 and helped the Terps to three consecutive 10-win seasons, including an appearance in the 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl. In 2003, Franklin added duties as recruiting coordinator and directed back-to-back recruiting classes ranked in the Top 25 nationally. Franklin and former Nittany Lion head coach Bill O'Brien (running backs) were Maryland assistant coaches in 2003 and '04 under Friedgen.

After five successful years at Maryland, Franklin was named wide receivers coach on Mike Sherman's Green Bay Packers staff in 2005. During that season, Green Bay ranked third in the NFL in receptions (383) and seventh in receiving yards (3,766). Donald Driver was among the top receivers in the NFL, ranking second in receptions and eighth in receiving yards, with a then-career-high 86 catches for 1,221 yards.

Franklin served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Kansas State during the 2006-07 seasons under head coach Ron Prince. In 2006, he helped the Wildcats to their first winning season in four years. Franklin coached quarterback Josh Freeman and oversaw an offense that produced a 3.000-vard passer (Freeman). 1,500-yard receiver (All-American wide receiver Jordy Nelson) and 1,000-yard rusher (James Johnson) during the 2007 season, a first in school history. Freeman would go on to become the Wildcats' highest NFL offensive draft pick since 1954 when the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected him 17th overall in the 2009 NFL Draft.

Franklin returned to Maryland in 2008 as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He helped the Terrapins to victories in the 2008 Humanitarian Bowl and the 2010 Military Bowl. The 2010 squad was among the national leaders in scoring offense at 32.2 points per game and was led by ACC Rookie of the Year quarterback Danny O'Brien. He threw for 2,438 yards, 22 touchdowns and only eight interceptions in 2010, with All-ACC receiver Torrey Smith making 67 catches for 1,055 yards and 12 scores.

In 1998, Franklin began his participation in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program, starting with a stint with the Miami Dolphins and working with Hall of Fame guarterback Dan Marino. Franklin also worked with Donovan McNabb of the Philadelphia Eagles (1999) and Minnesota Vikings (2008) in the NFL program.

Franklin was a four-year letterman at quarterback and a two-time All-PSAC selection at East Stroudsburg. He set seven school records as a senior to earn team MVP honors and was a Harlon Hill Trophy nominee as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. Among the season records he set were for total offense (3,128 yards), passing yards (2,586) and TD passes (19). Franklin graduated having broken or tied 23 school records.

Franklin graduated from East Stroudsburg in 1995 with a degree in psychology and earned a master's degree in educational leadership from Washington State University. Franklin graduated from Neshaminy High School in Langhorne.

Franklin and his wife, Fumi, have two daughters, Shola and Addison.

GAME RECAPS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Saquon Barkley rushed for 195 yards and two touchdowns to lead Penn State past Rutgers, 28-3, in the Big Ten opener on a rainy Saturday night in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions took command of the game in the second guarter with three touchdowns in front a "Stripe Out" crowd of 103,323.

Penn State led Rutgers 21-0 at halftime and did not allow the Scarlet Knights to reach the red zone until doing so once in the fourth quarter, yielding a field goal. The three points allowed was the fewest for the Nittany Lions since 2011 against Iowa.

The Nittany Lion ground game keyed the offense totaling 330 of 471 total offensive yards, with 174 coming in the first half. It was the most yards gained on the ground for the Lions since 2009 when they totaled 338 and the first time they broke the 200-yard mark in consecutive games since the same year.

Barkley posted his second consecutive game of more than 100 yards, finding the end zone twice and totaling his season-high 195 yards on 21 carries, the most yards for a PSU true freshman rusher since 1998 and the most for any PSU rusher since Bill Belton totaled 201 in 2013. Barkley was particularly strong in the second half, totaling 140 yards and a touchdown on 11 rushes.

Fellow running back Akeel Lynch also broke 100 yards, totaling 120 on 10 carries, with nine carries and 115 yards coming in the first half, including a career-best 75vard touchdown run. It was the first time Penn State had two 100-yard rushers in a game since Lynch and Belton accomplished the feat in 2013.

The Nittany Lion defense forced Rutgers to punt on its first five possessions before Grant Haley hauled in an interception on the sixth and final RU drive of the first half.

John Reid hauled in his first interception and recovered a late fumble, as the Lions pulled in a season-high three turnovers. The Blue and White continued to penetrate the backfield as well, totaling 9.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. Defensive tackle Austin Johnson led the team with 2.0 backfield stops, including a sack. Carl Nassib continued his strong start, tallying his team-best fifth sack as part of 1.5 backfield tackles. Safety Marcus Allen led the team with 11 tackles, including seven solo stops.

Christian Hackenberg completed 10-of-19 passes with one interception for 141 yards, and was not sacked for a second consecutive game. His top target was DaeSean Hamilton who totaled 81 yards on four catches in the first half, and finished with five for 86 yards. Chris Godwin also caught four passes, totaling 49 yards.

Rutgers guarterback Chris Laviano completed 27 of 42 passing attempts for 251 yards with two interceptions.

Josh Hicks led the ground game with 49 yards, but the Scarlet Knights only totaled 43 for the game, the fewest Penn State had allowed since holding Maryland to 33 last season. Carlton Agudosi led 10 Rutgers pass catchers with six receptions for 80 yards.

PENN STATE

After playing the field position game on its first two drives of the game, pinning Rutgers on its own 2- and 10-yard lines, respectively, with punts from Chris Gulla, the Penn State offense found the end zone on its third possession, driving 80 yards on 12 plays in a season-long six minutes, two seconds. Hackenberg found Godwin along the right sideline for a 30-yard gain on the first play, and then the Nittany Lions pounded the ball into the red zone with eight consecutive running plays. On 3rd-and-3 from the 17, Hackenberg found Hamilton for a 13-yard gain to the 4-vard line, setting up an end-around to redshirt freshman wide receiver DeAndre Thompkins from two yards out for his first career touchdown with 12:10 remaining in the second quarter.

The Lions went three-and-out on their next possession, but scored on their next two.

Starting at the Penn State 10, the Lions drove 90 yards on eight plays for their longest drive of the season. Hackenberg found Hamilton with a short pass in the middle of the field that Hamilton was able to turn into a 48-yard gain to the Rutgers' 42. The Nittany Lions then handed off to Barkley on six of the next seven plays, and he capped the drive with a 15-yard touchdown run with 2:06 remaining in the half.

After another Rutgers' punt, Penn State took over on its own 25 with 1:14 on the clock. Lynch broke through a hole in the middle and ran 75 yards to the end zone.

Rutgers assembled the longest drive of the scoreless third quarter, advancing 54 yards on seven plays before Reid ended it with his first career interception.

Rutgers reached the red zone for the first time with just under 12 minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, capping a 16-play, 71-yard drive with a 34-yard field goal. The drive took 7:13.

A 40-yard rush by Barkley keyed Penn State's ensuing drive, but a Hackenberg pass from the Rutgers' 28 was intercepted by Anthony Cioffi at the 1-yard line with 7:57 remaining.

Rutgers reached midfield on their first two plays, but three consecutive sacks by Nassib, Jordan Lucas and Johnson, respectively, moved Rutgers back to its own 21.

Barkley responded on the ensuing possession, breaking off a 54-yard run to the Rutgers' 16 on the first play, and rushing into the end zone on the next for the final margin.

SERIES NOTES

SDSU HEAD COACH ROCKY LONG

- In 2011, Rocky Long became the first San Diego State head coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his debut campaign.
- Long has also amassed the most victories of any Mountain West head coach since the league's inception in 1999.
- In 2011, Long replaced Brady Hoke, who left SDSU to become the head coach at Michigan. Long led the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, highlighted by a 42-24 victory over Washington State, which snapped a 19-game losing streak vs. Pac-10/12 foes and a 23game skid against schools from automatic BCS qualifying conferences.
- · He was named Mountain West Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in 2012 after guiding the Aztecs to a 9-4 record and their first conference championship since 1998. SDSU also set a school record with its third consecutive bowl appearance.
- In 2013, Long directed SDSU to an unprecedented fourth straight postseason appearance, capped by an impressive 49-24 victory over Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- Last season, San Diego State advanced to its fifth straight bowl game and finished in a tie for first in the Western Division of the Mountain West.
- · The Aztecs finished in the top 20 nationally in early every defensive category, including scoring defense (13th) and total defense (16th).
- · He came to San Diego State to be the team's defensive coordinator in December 2008.
- · Arrived at SDSU after serving as head coach at New Mexico from 1998-2008. He was tabbed the league's Coach of the Year in 2002.
- Compiled a New Mexico-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- · As a player, originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned the team's most-valuable-player honors three times and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.

SCOUTING THE AZTECS

- SDSU won its season opener over FCS-level San Diego, but suffered a loss at California the following week and fell in overtime to South Alabama this past week.
- · Maxwell Smith has completed 31-of-66 passing attempts with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Donnel Pumphrey leads the team in rushing with 249 yards on 68 attempts two touchdowns, and also has a team-high nine receptions. Eric Judge leads the team in receiving yards with 101, followed by Pumphrey's 92.
- On the other side of the ball, linebacker Calvin Munson has been a standout, leading the team with two interceptions returned for touchdowns, 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Athlon Sports named Munson the preseason Mountain West Conference Player of the Year.
- The Aztecs finished 2014 at 7-6, losing the Poinsettia Bowl vs. Navv. 17-16.

NITTANY LION FROM CALIFORNIA

LB Koa Farmer is the only Nittany Lion from California, hailing from Lake View Terrace, which is north of Los Angeles. He attended Notre Dame High School.

PENN STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Not only has Penn State never played the Aztecs, but Penn State has played just four games against the current alignment of the Mountain West in its history. Three of those games were against Air Force and the most recent meeting with a MWC foe was against Utah State in 1977. The Nittany Lions prevailed in all four games, while San Diego State is 2-14 all-time against Big Ten opponents.

SDSU NOTES

FIVE IN A ROW AT HOME

The Nittany Lions are playing the third of five consecutive home games, as they are in the midst of their first fivegame homestand since 1922 and the third in program history. Wins over Buffalo (27-14, Sept. 12) and Rutgers (28-3, Sept. 19) have opened the slate. San Diego State (Sept. 26), Army West Point (Oct. 3) and Indiana (Oct. 10) are next.

Penn State last played five consecutive home games in 1922, going 5-0 with wins over St. Bonaventure (54-0), William & Mary (27-7), Gettysburg (20-0), Lebanon Valley (32-6) and Middlebury (33-0).

The Nittany Lions also hosted five-straight home contests in 1920. Penn State also was perfect in those games with wins over Muhlenberg (27-7), Gettysburg (13-0), Dartmouth (14-7), NC State (41-0) and Lebanon Valley (109-7). The 109 points scored against Lebanon Valley still stand as the program's game scoring record.

While Beaver Stadium has never seen five consecutive home games, it has hosted four in a row five times, doing so in 1977, 1982, 1986, 2002 and 2009.

BARKLEY NAMED BIG TEN CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK AGAIN

Freshman running back Saquon Barkley was named the Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week for the second consecutive week, as he managed to surpass his breakout game against Buffalo with a 195-yard, two-touchdown performance against Rutgers in his Big Ten debut.

- · It was the most yards for a PSU true freshman rusher since Eric McCoo (206 yds. vs Michigan State) in 1998 and the most for any PSU rusher since Bill Belton (201 yds. at Illinois) in 2013. Barkley was particularly strong in the second half, totaling 140 yards and a touchdown on 11 rushes.
- Barkley ran for 119 vards on seven carries in the fourth quarter, marking second-straight game that he had a quarter with 100 or more yards.
- His first touchdown run in the game came in Penn State's 21-point second quarter from 15 yards out. The Scarlet Knights tried to claw back into the game in the fourth quarter with a field goal to make the game 21-3, but Barkley answered with a 54-yard run on the first play of the ensuing drive and a 16-yard touchdown run on the very next play. Barkley also had a 40-yard run in the game.
- Barkley turned in a 115-yard performance against Buffalo. He became the first PSU true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in a game since Silas Redd had 131 vards on 11 carries and scored one touchdown against Northwestern in 2010.
- Barkley helped swing the momentum in Penn State's favor on their first possession of the fourth quarter, as he broke off back-to-back runs totaling 50 yards.
- Barkley provided a spark off of the bench in the second half for the Nittany Lions, averaging 9.6 yards per carry in the win over the Bulls. He reeled off 101 of his 115 yards on eight fourth-quarter carries. He later found the end zone for the Lions final score and his first collegiate touchdown.

GROUND FORCE

- · The Nittany Lions have had great success moving the ball on the ground the past two games against Buffalo and Rutgers, totaling 530 yards. That two-game effort equates to the most rushing yards in consecutive games since 2009 when Penn State racked up 623 yards at Illinois (338) and vs. Eastern Illinois (285).
- Both Saquon Barkley (195 yards) and Akeel Lynch (120) rushed for more than 100 yards against Rutgers, marking the first time Penn State had at least two 100yard rushers since Lynch (108) and Bill Belton (108) passed the century mark against Eastern Michigan in 2013.

- · It was also the first Big Ten Conference game that Penn State had two 100-yard rushers since Evan Royster (134) and Silas Redd (131) topped the mark vs. Northwestern in 2010.
- The wide receivers are helping the run game, as well. WR DeAndre Thompkins rushed for a touchdown against Rutgers and WR Brandon Polk did the same against Buffalo. Penn State now has two wide receivers with rushing touchdowns in the same season for the first time since 2008 when Derrick Williams and Chaz Powell both had rushing touchdowns
- · Polk ranks third on the team with 101 rushing yards on iust six carries.

BARKLEY BREAKS OUT

- · Saquon Barkley ranks second in the nation in yards per carry, averaging 9.15 yards per carry to rank second in the country.
- Barkley's yards per game average of 103.7 is skewed since he only received one carry for one yard in the season opener against Temple. However, he still ranks 35th in the nation in the category.
- Ten of Barkley's 34 rushes have gone for double-digit gains, with his longest runs of 54 and 40 yards coming against Rutgers. Three of his 12 rushes against Buffalo went for double-digits, while seven of 21 rushes went for double-digits against Rutgers. Twenty-four of his 34 rushes have been for at least three yards, and just four have been for no gain or less.
- · His 310 rushing yards in the last two games is the highest two-game total by a Penn State back since Zach Zwinak had 314 in a two-game span vs. Indiana (135) and Wisconsin (179).
- . It is also the highest total by a true freshman RB in a two-game span since D.J. Dozier had 359 in 1983 (vs. Rutgers and Alabama). Barkley and Dozier are the only the true freshman to have back-to-back 100-yard games (Dozier had four in a row in 1983).
- Additionally, Barkley's 195 rushing yards against Rutgers were the most by a Penn State true freshman since Eric McCoo had 206 against Michigan State in 1998. Barkley is the third true freshman at Penn State to have two or more 100-yard rushing performances (5, D.J. Dozier - 1983; 3, Eric McCoo - 1998).
- · Against Buffalo Barkley became just the seventh PSU true freshman to rush for over 100 yards in a game, joining, Matt Suhey (1976), Curt Warner (1979), D.J. Dozier (1983), Eric McCoo (1998), Austin Scott (2003) and Silas Redd (2010).
- He is also the first PSU player to rush for 100 yards in a quarter since Tony Hunt vs. Akron in 2004. Larry Johnson rushed for more than 100 in a quarter four times in 2002.
- Barkley is only the third player since 2000 to rush for 100 in a guarter, and it has now only happened seven times since 2000.

LYNCH AIDS GROUND GAME

Junior running back Akeel Lynch has started the first three games of the 2015 season in the back field.

- · Lynch led Penn State on the ground in the 2015 season opener at Temple with 78 yards on 10 carries, including a 42-yard touchdown run.
- . The Toronto, Ontario, Canada native now has five career 100-yard rushing efforts after crossing the century mark against Rutgers. His performance included a career-long 75-yard touchdown run.
- It was his first 100-yard effort since back-to-back games over the century mark versus Temple (11/15) and at Illinois (11/22) in 2014. He is among the 21 Nittany Lions with five or more career games of 100plus rushing vards.
- · His 1,280 career yards rank 32nd at Penn State. He trails Gary Brown (1,321 yards) for 31st place.
- Lynch ultimately led the Nittany Lions' ground attack in 2014 with 678 rushing yards on 147 carries (4.6 ypc). He finished the 2014 season in impressive fashion with 393 yards and three touchdowns during the final four contests.
- · He surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for his career against Boston College in the Pinstripe Bowl, rushing for 77 yards. He is 32nd on PSU's career rushing yard list with 1,280 yards.

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

- Through the first three games of the season, Penn State ranks fourth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with 10.3 tackles for loss per game, and third in the nation and second in the conference with 4.33 sacks per game after totaling five more against Rutgers.
- Penn State leads the nation in both tackle for loss yardage (159) and sack yardage (115). Last year's Pinstripe Bowl foe Boston College is second in TFL yardage at 134, while Penn State is the only team with over 100 sack yards; Pittsburgh is second with 90 yards.
- Penn State's 15 tackles for loss against Temple were the second-most in the country during the opening week, trailing only Colorado State, which racked up 16 against FCS-level Savannah State. Eleven different Nittany Lions were credited with at least an assist, led by Carl Nassib, Brandon Bell and Anthony Zettel with 2.5 TFL each, while Trevor Williams had 2.0.
- Nassib was again a force in the backfield against Buffalo, racking up three of Penn State's six sacks on the day. Austin Johnson added 1.5 sacks and totaled 2.5 TFL against the Bulls.

NASSIB BREAKING THROUGH

Senior defensive end **Carl Nassib** has rewarded the Nittany Lions for putting him in the starting lineup, as the former walk-on is enjoying a breakout season by breaking through opposing offensive lines.

- Through the first three games, Nassib ranks in a tie for third nationally in sacks per game, averaging 1.67 after picking up his team- and Big Ten-leading fifth quarterback takedown against Rutgers. He also ranks in ties for fifth nationally and second in the conference with 2.3 tackles for loss per game.
- Nassib made a career-high 10 tackles in the season opener at Temple. His previous high was four stops on October 5, 2013 at Indiana. Nassib also recorded his second career solo sack, good for a 12-yard loss in the second quarter, and his 2.5 tackles for loss were a career-best.
- Nassib made even bigger plays the following week against Buffalo, recording three sacks, including backto-back sack-fumbles to stiffe a UB comeback. He also hauled in an interception deep in UB territory after senior defensive tackle Anthony Zettel tipped a pass from the quarterback.

PUTTING THE "D" IN DEFENSE

Penn State's defense continues to shine under Defensive Coordinator Bob Shoop. The Nittany Lions have forced 16 three-and-outs this season on 39 drives, equating to 41 percent of the time that Penn State has not allowed their opponents to gain a first down on a drive.

- vs. Rutgers 5 three-and-outs in 13 drives.
- PSU has forced three-and-outs on the opponent's first offensive possession in each game this season.
- Penn State's average of 5.33 three-and-outs ranks in a tie for 18th in the country.
- The unit is climbing in the national rankings in multiple categories, led by its prolific defensive line. See National Nits on Page 16
- In 2014, Penn State ranked in the Top 10 in the FBS in fewest first downs allowed (2nd, 190), pass efficiency (2nd, 101.14), total (2nd, 278.7 ypg), rushing (3rd, 100.5 ypg), third down (6th, 30.2) and scoring defense (7th, 18.6 ppg).

OUR ZONE

- Penn State held Rutgers to just three points, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten game since defeating Iowa, 13-3, in 2011. That game was also the last time PSU did not allow a touchdown to a Big Ten foe.
- The three points by Rutgers were tied for the fewest allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten opener. The Nittany Lions beat Minnesota, 56-3, in the 1994 Big Ten opener.
- Penn State held Rutgers to 43 yards of rushing, the fewest since giving up just 33 yards to Maryland last season.

AVOIDING TURNOVERS AND SACKS

Minimizing turnovers and sacks are extremely important to the success of an offense, and the Nittany Lions were able to avoid both against Buffalo. Penn State had zero turnovers for the first time since having none against Massachusetts last season, and did not allow a sack for the first time since the win at Wisconsin in 2013. The 2013 Wisconsin game was also the last time Penn State posted zeroes in both categories.

Penn State surrendered an interception against Rutgers, but avoided giving up a sack for a second consecutive game - a feat not accomplished since 2011 against Ohio State and Wisconsin.

SPECIAL TEAMS ARE SPECIAL

- Chris Gulla took over the starting punting job for the Nittany Lions against Rutgers and helped Penn State to control field position as he averaged 41.0 yards per punt. He also dropped all five of his punts inside the 20-yard line.
- The punting average was the highest for the Nittany Lions since averaging 48.8 yards per punt against Akron last season.
- His five punts downed inside the 20-yard line equal the total number by the Nittany Lions last season and are the most in a single game since having six punts inside the 20 against Nebraska in 2013.
- Penn State saw success in all three phases of the game in its win over Buffalo, including a pair of big returns on special teams. The game had an electrifying start as redshirt freshman Nick Scott returned the opening kickoff 58 yards to the Buffalo 42. It was the longest kickoff return for Penn State since Chaz Powell had a 92-yard return against Purdue in 2011.
- Classmate DeAndre Thompkins returned a punt 58 yards, on which he was barely tripped up by UB punter Tyler Grassman on a diving play, preventing him from reaching the end zone. It was the longest punt return by a Nittany Lion since Derrick Williams' 63-yard punt return for a TD at Wisconsin in 2008.
- Thompkins' return was also the longest non-scoring punt return since Mike Archie had a 62-yard return at Michigan State in 1993.
- The last time that Penn State had both a punt return and kick return of at least 58 yards in the same game was against Notre Dame in 2007. In that game, Derrick Williams had a 78-yard punt return for a touchdown and A.J. Wallace had a 68-yard kickoff return.

HOLDING ON TO THE ROCK

Penn State is one of 22 FBS teams yet to have lost a fumble so far this season.

LUCAS HONORS WARTMAN-WHITE WITH NUMBER SWITCH

One point of confusion for the Nittany Lion faithful against Rutgers may have been seeing a No. 5 lineup in the defensive secondary. No. 5 on defense belongs to **Nyeem Wartman-White**, but the junior suffered a season-ending injury early in the opener against Temple. Teammate and roommate **Jordan Lucas** wanted to honor his close friend, so he asked to wear Wartman-White's No. 5 for the remainder of the season. The pair lived in the same dorn, and have lived together since their sophomore year.

WINS LEADERS

In its 129th season of varsity football, Penn State has amassed 850, becoming just the eighth program nationally to reach the milestone. The Nittany Lions are one of just 10 programs with 800 wins and currently hold an official all-time mark of 851-377-42.

GODWIN LEADS RECEIVING CORPS

Sophomore wide receiver **Chris Godwin** has caught at least four passes in the first three games for a teambest total of 14 for 205 yards. He now has at least one catch in 15 of 16 career games and three career games with five-or-more grabs, joining his seven-catch night vs. Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Averaging 4.7 catches and 6.3 yards per game, Godwin ranks in the Top 10 in the Big Ten.

HACKENBERG'S RESUME

- Hackenberg had 144 yards of total offense against Rutgers (141 passing, 3 rushing), giving him 6,090 for his career and moving him into third place at Penn State, passing Tony Sacca (6,000 yards). He trails Daryll Clark (6,361 yards) for second place.
- Hackenberg has completed 526-of-928 career passes (56.7 percent), for 6,163 passing yards and 33 touchdown passes in 27 career starts.
- He is closing in on Matt McGloin's 6,385 yards from 2009-12 for No. 2 on the career list, and Zack Mills' 7,212 yards from 2001-04 for the all-time record.
- He is just the fourth player in Penn State history to surpass the 6,000-yard passing mark, the eighth to surpass the 5,000-yard passing mark and one of 10 to eclipse the 4,000-yard passing mark.
- With his 14 completions against Buffalo, he moved past Matt McGloin for second place in the Penn State record books in the category all-time. He now trails only Zack Mills (606 completions).
- He passed McGloin (894) for second on the career passing attempts list at Temple in the season opener, and now has 928.
- The third-year signal caller owns the freshman passing yardage record with 2,955 yards through the air in 2013, and the sophomore passing record with 2,977 yards last season. Zach Mills previously held both the rookie record (1,669) and the sophomore mark (2,417)
- He owns the overall, freshman and sophomore single game passing records.
 - Set the freshman single game record twice in 2013. He threw for 340 yards at Indiana on Oct. 5 after a 311-yard effort against Eastern Michigan on Sept. 7. Zack Mills twice threw for 280 yards (USU & Southern Miss) in 2001.
 - His 454 yards passing vs. UCF in the 2014 opener broke Mills' school & sophomore record of 399 yards vs. Iowa in 2002.
- Hackenberg threw for 773 yards in his first two games of 2014 to break the Penn State consecutive game passing record. He eclipsed Zack Mills' record of 686 yards from 2002.
 - Hackenberg compiled 454 yards vs. UCF and 319 against Akron.
 - Mills threw for 399 yards vs. Iowa and 287 at Wisconsin.
- His nine games with at least 200 yards in 2013 broke Mills' freshman record of five from the 2001 season.
- Hackenberg has 15 200-yard passing games, which ranks fourth in school history and trails only McGloin (18), Collins (16) and Mills (16).
- His eight 300-yard passing games (25 games played) put him atop the list of only four quarterbacks in PSU history to post multiple 300-plus yard passing games.
- Hackenberg's 55 passing attempts at Indiana in 2013 and 50 attempts against Boston College in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl marked just the fourth and fifth times in PSU history a signal caller amassed 50 passing attempts in a game. Hackenberg surpassed Collins' school record of 54 in 1992 at BYU.
- Eleven of his 32 scoring strikes are 40 yards or longer, including a career-long 79-yard touchdown pass to Geno Lewis in the 2014 season opener vs. UCF.
- Hackenberg has thrown for at least 250 yards in 10 of his 26 career games, including seven 300-yard efforts and one 400-yard contest.
- He had 14 completions of 40-plus yards or longer in 2013, which tied for eighth nationally and tied for tops among freshman QBs in the NCAA (Winston, FSU).
- On the awards front, Hackenberg is a preseason candidate for the Maxwell, O'Brien, Walter Camp and Manning Awards.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- True freshmen have accounted for half of Penn State's eight touchdowns this season, as Saquon Barkley has rushed for three and wide receiver Brandon Polk has one. Redshirt freshman DeAndre Thompkins also has a rushing touchdown. Junior running back Akeel Lynch (two rushing touchdowns) and sophomore DaeSean Hamilton (one receiving) are the only upperclassmen to find the end zone.
- Two of Penn State's three touchdowns against Buffalo were scored by true freshmen playing in just their second games. It was the first time since 2005 that a pair of true freshmen were able to find the end zone in the same game. Barkley had the Nittany Lions' final touchdown against UB, while Polk had the first.
- Polk had demonstrated on the very first play of the season at Temple that he was a threat in the running game, and continued to be so against Buffalo, running for a 22-yard score for the Nittany Lions' first touchdown of the game. Polk has gained 101 yards on six carries (16.8 avg.) in the first three games.
- On the other side of the ball, against UB, true freshman linebacker Jake Cooper, who was supposed to redshirt this season until injuries in the season opener pressed him into action, made a season-high three stops, including a sack.
- True freshman John Reid and sophomore Grant Haley both hauled in interceptions against Rutgers.

MILLEN ON BTN BROADCAST TEAM

Former Penn State and NFL standout Matt Millen will be calling Saturday's meeting between the Nittany Lions and Aztecs.

Millen earned first-team All-America honors as a junior in 1978, helping the unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Nittany Lions earn a berth vs. Alabama in the dramatic 1979 Sugar Bowl for the national title. Millen was a team co-captain in 1979, but missed most of his senior year with an injury. He also helped Penn State earn the first of two consecutive 11-1 records in 1977, capped by a win in the Fiesta Bowl.

The Oakland Raiders selected Millen the second round of the 1980 NFL Draft to begin a 12-year career that would see him earn four Super Bowl rings. Millen played for the Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders (1980-88), San Francisco 49ers (1989-90) and Washington Redskins (1991). He was a Pro Bowl selection in 1988.

Millen began his broadcasting career in 1992, working NFL games for CBS and then FOX. The Lehigh Valley native left broadcasting in 2001 and was team president of the Detroit Lions for the next eight years. Millen returned to broadcast booth as a college football and NFL analyst with ESPN and the NFL Network in 2009. He joined Fox Sports and BTN in 2015.

SOLD OUT ARMY WEST POINT GAME TO KICK AT NOON ON ESPNU

The Penn State-Army West Point game on Saturday, October 3 will kickoff at noon on ESPNU.

It's the first sellout of a non-conference game since Alabama visited Happy Valley in 2011. The Nittany Lions host the Black Knights for the first time since 1979 as part of Military Appreciation Day.

The sellout includes tickets requested through the Seats for Servicemembers program. Servicemembers from as far away as California, Texas and Washington have signed up to receive donated tickets purchased by Penn State alumni, fans and businesses. In its fourth year, the Seats for Servicemembers program honors the commitment and sacrifices of veterans, families and loved ones by providing tickets at no cost to active and retired Servicemembers, as well as a complimentary pregame tailgate at Bryce Jordan Center.

More than 6,500 Seats for Servicemembers have been donated by Penn State supporters, members of the community and businesses to date, surpassing last year's total of 5,500.

HACKENBERG, LUCAS LEAD LIONS IN CAREER STARTS

Junior **Christian Hackenberg** and senior safety **Jordan Lucas** lead the team with 28 career starts each, as both have started every game the past two seasons.

Senior cornerback **Trevor Williams** follows with 22 starts each. Trailing the injured **Nyeem Wartman-White** (21 starts) are defensive tackles **Anthony Zettel** and **Austin Johnson** tied with 18 starts apiece.

HAMILTON MOVING UP RECORD BOOKS

DaeSean Hamilton's is already moving up the career charts as a Nittany Lion.

Records Watch on Page 27.

- Hamilton made five catches against Rutgers to give him 91 for his career, ranking him 15th on Penn State's career list. He trails Freddie Scott (93 catches) for 14th place.
- As a freshman, Hamilton led the Big Ten with 82 catches (6.3 rpg) and was fifth in the conference at 69.2 ypg, scoring two touchdowns.
- Against Ohio State, Hamilton hauled in a school record 14 passes, breaking Freddie Scott's mark of 13 catches vs. Wisconsin in 1995.
- His 126 receiving yards vs. Ohio State marked his fourth 100-yard effort of the season to extend his school freshman record.
- His 82 catches shattered the PSU freshman standard for receptions in a season and ranked second in school history, trailing only Allen Robinson (97 in 2013). With the second of his seven catches at Michigan, Hamilton moved past Deon Butler's freshman mark of 37 catches in 2005.
- Hamilton set the freshman single game record in Dublin, Ireland vs. UCF. He caught 11 passes for 165 yards, moving past Deon Butler's 125-yard effort vs. Wisconsin in 2005 and Maurice Humphrey's eight catch game against Northwestern in 2003.
- Hamilton eclipsed Butler's freshman season record of 691 yards in 2005 when he caught a nine-yard pass in the second quarter vs. Maryland.
- Hamilton became the first Nittany Lion freshman wideout to eclipse the 100-yard mark in a game - doing so in the first half - since Butler and Jordan Norwood both accomplished the feat in 2005.
- He was just the fifth freshman to post a 100-yard receiving game; joining Butler (2005, R-Fr.), Jimmy Cefalo (1974, Fr.), Humphrey (2003. Fr.) and Norwood (2005, Fr.)

HOME SWEET HOME

With a 267-71 all-time record in Beaver Stadium (1960), Penn State boasts the seventh-best winning percentage (.790) in its current home venue amongst current FBS schools, and leads the Big Ten. Ohio State ranks eighth overall with a 419-110-20 (.781) mark in Ohio Stadium, which was built in 1922. Only Alabama (.816) and Auburn (.797) boast higher winning percentages than Penn State in facilities older than Beaver Stadium. Baylor leads the country with a perfect 7-0 mark in the brand new McLane Stadium (2014).

Kline has posted a 3.50 GPA or higher in 11 of his 12 semesters on campus, including summer semesters and is a six-time Dean's List selection. He graduated with his degree in finance in December 2014 with a 3.76 cumulative GPA, in just three and a half years. Has begun work on his master's degree in international affairs. Additionally, Kline is a member of the Lion's Paw Senior Honor Society, a prestigious Student-Leadership graduating class.

ZETTEL NAMED CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior defensive tackle **Anthony Zettel** has been selected as one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award for college football. To be eligible for the Senior CLASS Award, a student-athlete must have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

An active member of the team off the field, Zettel is the sergeant at arms of Penn State's Uplifting Athletes, helping the chapter raise more than \$1 million for kidney cancer treatment and research since the first Penn State Lift for Life was held in 2003. A kinesiology major, Zettel is scheduled to complete his degree in December.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact.

The 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one candidate who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced in early January.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

After playing three Big Ten games at night in 2014, Penn State is slated to play at least two this season.

- For the second year in a row, Penn State opened its Big Ten slate with a nighttime victory over Rutgers.
- Penn State and Ohio State played their sixth primetime clash since 2005 last season and were in primetime for the third consecutive year. The streak will be extended this season as the Lions are scheduled to play at Ohio State at 8 p.m. on ABC, ESPN or ESPN2.
- On Oct. 12, 2012 the Nittany Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.
- This year marks the eighth time since 2000 that Penn State will play multiple night games in the same season (Rutgers, at Ohio State).
- Penn State has played at least one regular season night game in 15 consecutive seasons.
- Penn State has a 42-28 on-field record in night games, going 10-10 at home, 20-11 on the road, 1-1 at regular season neutral sites and 11-6 in bowl games, including last season's Pinstripe Bowl.
- The Lions' night games over the past 15 seasons include: Rutgers (2015), Boston College (Pinstripe Bowl), Ohio State, Michigan and Rutgers (2014); Ohio State, Michigan and UCF (2013); Iowa and Ohio State (2012); Northwestern (2011); Alabama, Iowa and Michigan (2010); Iowa (2009); Illinois, Wisconsin and Ohio State (2008); Notre Dame, Ohio State and Texas A&M (2007), Michigan (2006), Illinois, Ohio State and Florida State (2005), Minnesota and Boston College (2004), Nebraska (2002 and '03), Miami (Fla.) (2001) and Indiana (2000).

T **Brendan Brosnan** and QB **Trace McSorley** saw their first career action against Rutgers, bringing the total of freshmen who have played this season to 18 (13 redshirt; 5 true).

COACHING STAFF NOTES

James Franklin assembled a coaching staff with extensive collegiate experience, familiarity and strong recruiting ties to the Mid-Atlantic, South and Northeast regions of the United States. The entire staff has returned for a second season.

Franklin's staff includes seven members of his former staff at Vanderbilt that were instrumental in the Commodores achieving unprecedented success in recent years, a coach who previously worked with Franklin and one of Penn State's greatest all-time receivers, who was a highly-successful high school coach in western Pennsylvania.

- Seven of the assistant coaches were members of Franklin's staff at Vanderbilt, helping the Commodores to historic heights, including nine wins each in 2012 and 2013, two bowl victories and consecutive Top 25 finishes for the first time in program history.
- Charles Huff was an offensive quality control coach in 2011 during Franklin's first season at Vanderbilt and served with Franklin at Maryland in 2009.
- Terry Smith made 108 receptions and 15 touchdown catches at Penn State (1988-91) and was a highly successful head coach at Gateway High School near Pittsburgh from 2002-12.
- All but one member of the coaching staff graduated from a college or university in the Mid-Atlantic or Northeast.

- Nine members of the coaching staff are from the Mid-Atlantic or Northeast, including Philadelphiaarea product Franklin and Dwight Galt, the Director of Performance Enhancement.
- Four members of the coaching staff hail from the Keystone State: Franklin (Langhorne), Pry (Altoona), Shoop (Oakmont) and Smith (Aliquippa).

The coaching staff will be getting extra assistance though this season, as veteran NFL coach **Jim Haslett** will serve as a consultant for the team. In his role, Haslett will work with the Penn State football coaches, staff and program.

The Pittsburgh native was the head coach of the New Orleans Saints from 2000-05 and was also the interim head coach for the St. Louis Rams for part of the 2008 season. Haslett led the Saints to the 2000 NFC West Championship en route to being a unanimous choice for AP Coach of the Year. He also claimed Coach of the Year honors from The Sporting News and Pro Football Weekly after guiding the Saints to their first-ever playoff win.

Haslett was most recently the Washington Redskins defensive coordinator from 2010-14. During his time in Washington, he produced three Pro Bowl linebackers and a second-team All-Pro linebacker in London Fletcher. In Haslett's first four years (2010-13,) the Redskins accumulated 105 takeaways, the team's highest four-year total since recording 110 (2002-05).

Haslett played his collegiate ball at Indiana (Pa.), where he was a four-time Little All-America selection at linebacker and defensive end. He was also an accomplished punter at IUP, where he still ranks second in single-season and career punting average. His son, Chase, is now the guarterback for the Crimson Hawks.

PENN STATE IN 23RD BIG TEN SEASON

After 106 years as an independent in football, Penn State began play in the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and is playing its 23rd season in the conference. The Nittany Lions were Big Ten Champions in 1994, beating Oregon to win the 1995 Rose Bowl, and played USC in the 2009 Rose Bowl.

The Nittany Lions began Big Ten play against division foe Rutgers for the second straight season, and finish the regular season once again against Michigan State, this time traveling East Lansing for the Nov. 28 game. Penn State will also play divisional opponents Indiana (Oct. 10) and Michigan (Nov. 21) and non-divisional opponent Illinois (Oct. 31) at home.

The road schedule features divisional opponents Ohio State (Oct. 17) and Maryland (Oct. 24), while Penn State also travels to face non-division opponent Northwestern (Nov. 7).

This is the final season of the Big Ten playing an eightgame schedule. The conference will move to a nine-game slate starting in 2016.

RIVALRY RENEWED

Penn State has many long and storied rivalries on the gridiron. The Nittany Lions have played 18 teams 20 or more times in the 129-year history of the program.

- Penn State owns a winning record against 14 of the 18 team's that they have met 20 or more times.
- Seven of those 18 teams are on the 2015 schedule; including Temple (43 meetings), Maryland (37), Ohio State (30), Michigan State (28), Army West Point (25), Rutgers (25) and Illinois (22).
- Six of those 18 teams are current members of the Big Ten: Illinois, Iowa, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State and Rutgers. Eight teams are among the opponents on the 2015 and 2016 schedules.
- Penn State has played since 2012 or has a future meeting scheduled meeting with 11 of the 18 teams (all of the FBS teams except Navy). Those opponents include: Army West Point (2015), Illinois (2014-15, '18), Iowa (2016-18), Pitt (2016-19), Syracuse (2012), Temple (2014-16) and West Virginia (2023-24), while the Nittany Lions will meet yearly with Big Ten East Division opponents Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State and Rutgers.
- Thirteen of the 18 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are among NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are Division III programs.

- Penn State's all-time record in home openers is 115-13-1 and 47-9 in Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State has won 13 out of its last 14 and its last three consecutively, defeating Buffalo, 27-14 (2015); Akron, 21-3 (2014) and Eastern Michigan, 45-7 (2013).

PENN STATE VS. BIG TEN

Penn State owns a 189-94-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.

The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 110-67 mark.

Prior to joining the conference, Penn State played 107 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment and was 79-25-3 in those games.

Maryland and Rutgers joined the Big Ten on July 1, 2014.

B1G OPENERS OVER THE YEARS

Here are some facts and figures about the Nittany Lions' 23 B1G opening games:

- Penn State owns an 11-12 in Big Ten opening contests. Fourteen of the Nittany Lions' 22 B1G openers have come on the road (7-7).
- Penn State has defeated Rutgers in its Big Ten opener in each of the past two seasons. Both contests came in Week 3 of the season, making the games the earliest Big Ten openers for Penn State since it opened the 1993 and 1994 seasons with Big Ten games. They hosted Minnesota on Sept. 4, 1993 (W, 38-20) and won at Minnesota on Sept. 3, 1994 (W, 56-3).
- Penn State has played Wisconsin more than any other team to open Big Ten play. The Nittany Lions and Badgers have met four times to open B1G play.
- The Nittany Lions have also played Illinois (3), Indiana (3), Iowa (3), Michigan (1), Minnesota (3), Northwestern (1), Ohio State (3) and Rutgers (2) in Big Ten openers.

RETURN GAME

Redshirt freshman **Mark Allen**'s four punt returns against Temple were the most by a single Penn State player since Justin Brown returned five punts on Oct. 29, 2011 vs. Illinois. The team's nine returns vs. Temple (5 KO, 4 P) were the most in a single game since returning nine vs. Houston on January 2, 2012 in the TicketCity Bowl.

PENN STATE SEASON OPENERS

The 2015 season marks the 129th in Penn State history, with the Nittany Lions owning a record of 106-21-2 in opening games.

- The 2015 opener was the third consecutive away from home for the Lions. It was also be the first time the Lions have opened the season with a true road game since opening at Minnesota in 1994.
- It was the first time Penn State had opened three consecutive seasons away from Beaver Stadium since the 1971-73 seasons.
- The next four season openers (2016, Kent State; 2017, Akron; 2018, Appalachian State; and 2019, Idaho) will all take place in Beaver Stadium.
- Despite a 27-10 loss at Temple this season, the Lions have still won 12 out of their last 14 openers.
- Penn State's longest streaks of winning their season openers are: 12 (1919-30), 11 (1893-1903), 10 (1973-82; 2002-11), 9 (1909-17), 7 (1942-48).
- Penn State has only lost consecutive season openers twice in school history; 1964-65, 1989-90, 2000-01. They have never lost three consecutive season openers.
- The Nittany Lions went unbeaten from 1909-30, winning 20-of-21 season openers. They tied Wissahickon Barracks, 6-6, in 1918 and the streak was stopped by Waynesburg, a 7-0 setback, in 1931.





KLINE RHODES SCHOLAR NOMINEE

Redshirt senior linebacker Ben Kline has been nominated for the prestigious Rhodes Scholarship. Kline is presently taking graduate level courses in the Smeal College of Business after graduating in December 2014 with a degree in finance. The Rhodes Scholarships are the oldest and most celebrated international fellowship awards in the world. Each year 32 Americans are selected as Rhodes Scholars, through a decentralized process representing the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Penn State University has produced two Rhodes Scholars in its history.

FATHER-SONS

Defensive coordinator Bob Shoop is not the only Penn State coach who's son is helping the team. Shoop's son Tyler is a wide receiver on the team, and Trey Hand, the son of offensive line coach Herb Hand, is serving as a team manager.

SEVEN LIONS HAVE PENN STATE HERITAGE

Seven members of the 2015 Penn State football squad have ties to current or former Nittany Lion players, coaches or staff.

- Redshirt sophomore guard Evan Galimberti is the son of Mark Galimberti, who was a manager for the Nittany Lion football program and graduated in 1988.
- · Junior wide receiver Gregg Garrity's father, Gregg (1980-82), and grandfather, Jim (1952-54), lettered at Penn State. Gregg Sr. made one of the iconic plays in Penn State football history with his diving TD catch to help beat Georgia in the 1983 Sugar Bowl for the Nittany Lions' first National Championship. The youngest Garrity changed his number to 19 during spring practices to honor his father.
- Redshirt senior offensive lineman Kevin Reihner joins the Nittany Lions this season after graduating from Stanford in March. He is the son of George Reihner, who was an offensive and defensive tackle at Penn State (1974-77) and played for the Houston Oilers. Additionally, Reihner's uncle, John, was a kicker for the Nittany Lions (1972-75). Kevin Reihner will don the number 68 in honor of his father.
- Freshman safety John Petrishen's great grandfather, Pop Ellwood (lettered in 1923), and great uncle, Bill Ellwood (lettered 1937-38), played football at Penn State.
- · Freshman wide receiver Tyler Shoop is the son of defensive coordinator Bob Shoop.
- Redshirt sophomore safety Brian Tomasetti is the son of Rich Tomasetti, who played for Penn State.
- Chappie Hill, a letterman on the 1956 Penn State football team, is the great uncle of freshman tackle Sterling Jenkins.

UPLIFTING ATHLETES REACHES \$1 MILLION RAISED FOR KIDNEY CANCER RESEARCH

One Cause. One Program. Together Uplifting Athletes and Penn State have stood the test of time.

- · Under the guidance of current Chapter President Ben Kline and his leadership team, the Penn State Chapter raised a record \$120,000 this past year for kidney cancer research.
- Thanks to the ongoing support of the Penn State and State College communities for the past 13 years, the Penn State Chapter has now raised more than \$1.12 million. Penn State was the first Uplifting Athletes Chapter to reach the \$1 million milestone.
- · Each of the last five Lift for Life events have raised in excess of \$100.000.
- · As the single largest donor to the Kidney Cancer Association, the funds raised from the Penn State Chapter has helped bring eight new treatments to market in the last 13 years.

And what started at Penn State has sparked a movement that is growing nationwide, as 24 other college football programs have formed Uplifting Athletes Chapters - including half the Big Ten, ACC and at least one chapter in each major FBS conference.

ZETTEL NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

Senior defensive tackle Anthony Zettel earned preseason All-America honors from two publications, highlighted by a first-team nod on Phil Steele's Preseason All-America Team. Zettel also took home second-team preseason All-America honors from Athlon Sports.

After moving from defensive end to tackle in 2014, Zettel enjoyed his most productive season en route to fourth-team All-America honors by Athlon Sports and an All-Big Ten first-team pick by both the coaches and media. Zettel logged career-best totals with 17 tackles for loss and 8.0 sacks. His 16.0 career sacks rank tied for No. 15 in Penn State history and his 27.0 career TELs are just five shy of entering the top 15 in the Penn State record books.

Zettel was the only FBS player to rank among the national leaders in sacks and interceptions per game in 2014. The athletic defensive lineman nabbed three interceptions, the most by a Penn State defensive lineman since at least 1959, to tie for the team lead in the category and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and eight pass deflections.

Start typing "Anthony Zettel" into Google, and the search engine is likely to guess you want to search for "Anthony Zettel tree." While the first-team All-B1G made his presence known to opposing offenses last season, he made his presence known on social media this summer.

- The fun started when classmate Jordan Dudas uploaded an Instagram video (https://instagram. com/p/2wcKHVkNnH/?taken-by=dudas_5) of Zettel tackling a tree in May. It went viral amongst many national media outlets.
- · At Big Ten media days, Zettel demonstrated various animal sounds, including a dying pig and a velociraptor (http://espn.go.com/video/clip?id=espn:13423037).
- Zettel went viral again at the start of preseason camp, as freshman Nick Bowers tweeted video (https://twitter.com/Nbowers28/ status/630543701358592004) of Zettel roundhouse kicking a full water bottle held by a teammate near the ceiling of the locker room in the Lasch Building. Luckily, nearby freshman Saquon Barkley was attentive and ducked to avoid the fast-moving object.
- The attention earned Zettel an appearance on SportsCenter with Chris McKendry and Cari Champion in August. He closed the appearance doing a bigfoot impression.

END OF AN ERA

Just six players - Kyle Carter, Ben Kline, Angelo Mangiro, Carl Nassib, Matt Zanellato, and Anthony Zettel - remain on the Penn State roster that played under all three permanent head coaches from 2011 to today. All six redshirted as true freshmen in 2011.

SIXTEEN FIRST-TEAM ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS IN PAST NINE YEARS

Penn State has earned a nation's-best 18 Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-Americans® over the past nine years, with 16 first-team honorees.

In 2013, guard John Urschel become the 11th Nittany Lion to attain first-team Academic All-America honors twice.

Penn State has had 63 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans® all-time, to rank No. 3 nationally among Football Bowl Subdivision programs.

The Penn State football team has had at least one first-team Academic All-American® in 10 of the past 13 seasons (19 overall first-team selections since 2002).

In 2014, defensive end Brad Bars, safety Ryan Keiser and kick snapper Tyler Yazijian Academic All-District® selection.

The three selections for the Nittany Lions were second-highest among the FBS and FCS institutions in the six states the comprise District II. Penn State led all District II FBS and FCS institutions with nine CoSIDA Academic All-America® nominations.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Head coach James Franklin frequently talks about being successful in all facets of a football program.

Simply put, he wants each member of the program to have the entire package - athletically, academically, spiritually and in the community.

On the heels of ending Franklin's first season with a thrilling 31-30 victory over Boston College in the Pinstripe Bowl and a stellar fall semester academically, the Nittany Lion football program set the benchmark for success off the field during the summer and fall of 2014, completing a program-record of more than 2,200 total hours of community service.

Beginning with volunteer hours at the Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games on June 6 and ending on Dec. 26 with a visit to Sloan-Kettering Memorial Hospital in New York, members of the football program participated in more than 30 different community service events during the summer and fall semesters in 2014.

A pre-season highlight was a trip to Hershey Medical Center on July 23. The entire team boarded buses for a drive to Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital just before the start of training camp. The team visited with patients and their families in different sections of the hospital.

The list of events includes 23 community service engagements during the football regular season. Highlighting the list was the United Way's Day of Caring, which takes place each October in State College. Approximately 50 members of the team used an off day during a bye week to give back to the community by helping with the upkeep of Centre Furnace Mansion.

Additionally, nearly 25 members of the team and LifeLink special education students carved and painted pumpkins on the patio of the Lasch Building on Oct. 16. Approximately a dozen members of the team played games and participated in the Buddy Walk at Medlar Field to help raise awareness for children with special needs and support the Centre County Down Syndrome Society on Oct. 18

In November, the football program adopted Noah Benner through Friends of Jaclyn foundation as an "official" member of the team. Members of the staff gave Noah and his family a tour of the football facility before meeting and speaking with the team at practice.

The Nittany Lions also gave Deven Jackson, a Perry County, Pennsylvania native, an opportunity to tour the football facility and visit with the team at practice. Jackson, who suffered from kidney failure and lost both of his legs to meningitis, inspired the team by competing in youth football with two prosthetic legs.

The week leading up to Thanksgiving was a big time period for community service. The Nittany Lions spent time participating in "Roar for Reading" at local elementary schools, visited The Village, a State College retirement community, spent time with children at the Bellefonte Youth Service Bureau and helped the State College Food bank move more than 2,000 pounds of food.

The team's annual Lift for Life event continued this summer (Uplifting Athletes on Page 15).



51 NITTANY LIONS COMPILE 3.0 OR HIGHER GPA DURING SPRING SEMESTER

The Penn State football team produced a recordsetting academic performance during the 2015 spring semester with 51 squad members earning at least a 3.0 grade-point average. This marks the first time in program history that the Nittany Lions have had more than 50 student-athletes with a 3.0 or better in the spring semester. The 51 Nittany Lions with a 3.0 or higher tie for the second-highest total in program history.

A total of 18 Nittany Lions earned Dean's List recognition in the spring semester with a 3.5 or higher GPA with at least 12 credit hours. Overall, 44 football student-athletes own a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher after the spring semester with 19 posting a 3.5 cumulative GPA or higher.

The 51 football student-athletes with 3.0 semester GPA or higher trails only the record 55 honorees from the 2008 fall semester and ties the mark set in the 2015 fall semester. The mark is also an improvement from the 46 student-athletes with a 3.0 or higher GPA in the 2014 spring semester.

Ryan Keiser, who was a 2014 CoSIDA Academic All-District® selection, posted a perfect 4.0 GPA in the spring while working on his graduate degree. Fellow CoSIDA Academic All-District® selection, Tyler Yazujian notched a 3.90 GPA in the spring to bring his cumulative GPA to an impressive 3.86.

Among the Nittany Lions to make the Dean's List in the spring semester were: Keiser, Yazujian cornerback Kyle Alston, Gordon Bentley, wide receiver Saeed Blacknall, long snapper Sean Corcoran, guard Evan Galimberti, wide receiver Gregg Garrity, tight end/hback Mike Gesicki, kicker/punter Chris Gulla, linebacker Ben Kline, center Angelo Mangiro, linebacker Troy Reeder, fullback Dom Salomone, fullback Brandon Smith and running back Johnathan Thomas.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

- · Penn State's 87 percent graduation success rate was second-highest in the Big Ten and tied for No. 13 overall among the nation's 128 FBS institutions, according to 2014 NCAA data. The figure was tied for the football program's second-highest graduation rate (with 2011);
- The Nittany Lions' GSR was also tied for No. 5 among all public FBS institutions. It was 16 points higher than the 71 percent FBS average and was second to Northwestern among Big Ten institutions, according to the NCAA.

FUTBOL?

Many of the Nittany Lion kicking specialists have strong soccer backgrounds, with two earning opportunities to play Division I soccer.

- Redshirt freshman Joey Julius turned down a Division I soccer scholarship to walk-on as a kicker at Penn State. Julius kicked for the Lower Dauphin H.S. football team, earning all-state honors twice, but also played for a travel soccer team for four years. He started the 2015 opener, converting his lone field goal attempt.
- Redshirt freshman Robby Liebel earned multiple soccer scholarship offers from top Division I programs, received invitations to the U.S. Soccer Development Academy from 2011-14 and was rated as the top goalkeeper in the state of Florida, but elected to walkon at Penn State. Liebel did not receive any formal instruction in football kicking until after his senior season of high school, but served as both a kicker and punter at IMG Academy during his final two prep campaigns.
- Unlike Julius, redshirt sophomore Tyler Davis did not play a snap of football in high school, as the former soccer standout at St. Charles (III.) North High School and two-year member of the U.S. Soccer Development Academy was a highly-touted recruit and even named the Chicago Sun-Times Player of the Year after his junior year. He went on to play at Bradley University, appearing in 12 contests as a freshman in 2013, scoring the game-winning, golden goal in his first career game.
- · Redshirt freshman Nick Boumerhi was a three-year letterwinner in soccer at Philipsburg-Osceola High School, but kicked for the football team as a junior and senior. He was only the full-time kicker during his senior season and garnered first-team all-conference honors.

LASCH RENOVATION PLAN UNVEILED

Plans to renovate the Louis and Mildred Lasch Football Building have been unveiled by Penn State Athletics. The Lasch Renovation, a multi-phased project, will allow Penn State football to provide the resources it needs to recruit and support the nation's most talented studentathletes. The first two phases of this renovation include the addition of a nutrition bar, as well as upgrades to the team auditorium, lobby, locker room, hydrotherapy room and an expanded equipment room.

The Lasch Lobby will have a 21st century design that will be powerful and progressive in a clean, classic Penn State way. The lobby will feature an awards area that will recognize the history and accomplishments of the Penn State football program, while the team auditorium, will showcase the Penn State football core values and team imagery displayed throughout the room.

The locker room concept will continue the classic Penn State theme and feature a new ceiling design with an integrated logo, new carpet, new multi-functional lockers, multi-tiered lighting controls and a video wall.

NO NAMES. ALL GAME.


The Penn State football program announced in July that it will remove the names from the backs of its jerseys beginning this season. In 2012, the Penn State coaching staff felt that something needed to be done to honor those student-athletes who kept their promise to play for Penn State after the NCAA handed down sanctions on the program, and decided to place the name of each player on the back of their uniform. It was something that had never been done in the 126-year history of the program, but was symbolic.

The decision to remove the names from the jerseys was made to pay homage to the history of Penn State football and return to the tradition that represented Penn State for 125 years.









FORTY LETTERMEN RETURN

Penn State returns 40 lettermen from last year's New Era Pinstripe Bowl championship squad - 20 on defense, 17 on offense and three specialists. Additionally, three lettermen return from the 2013 squad after missing 2014. Of the 40 lettermen returning, 29 have starting experience 15 on offense, 13 on defense and the starting punter.

The Nittany Lions lost the services of 18 letterwinners 10 on defense, seven on offense and the starting placekicker.

FIFTEEN STARTERS ARE BACK IN THE FOLD

The Nittany Lions return 15 starters - eight on offense and seven on defense. Fourteen additional players have starting experience - seven on offense, six on defense and a punter.

Among the returning starters are All-American defensive tackle Anthony Zettel, Freshman All-Americans DaeSean Hamilton and Andrew Nelson, along with four others that received honorable-mention All-Big Ten honors: defensive tackle Austin Johnson, cornerback Jordan Lucas, center Angelo Mangiro and cornerback Trevor Williams. That group also includes Big Ten All-Freshman Team honorees safety Marcus Allen, wide receiver Chris Godwin and punter Daniel Pasquariello.

THREE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

Three Penn State players were selected first-team preseason All-Big Ten by national preview publications. Senior defensive tackle Anthony Zettel earned first-team all-conference recognition from Phil Steele, Lindy's and Athlon, while redshirt sophomore wide receiver DaeSean Hamilton was named first-team All-Big Ten by Phil Steele, Athlon and Sporting News. Senior safety Jordan Lucas rounded out the list of first-team preseason all-conference selections with a berth on Phil Steele's team.

Additionally, Hamilton was a second-team selection by Lindy's and Lucas claimed a second-team berth from Athlon, Junior linebacker Nveem Wartman-White, junior defensive tackle Austin Johnson and junior running back Akeel Lynch also garnered preseason second-team allconference accolades.

ATTENDANCE RISES IN 2014

Penn State fans again demonstrated why they are regarded as the best in the nation and their excitement for Coach James Franklin and his squad as they flocked to Beaver Stadium during the 2014 season. Nittany Lion fans boosted the Beaver Stadium average attendance by more than 5,000 per game to keep Penn State No. 5 nationally in average home attendance, according to the NCAA.

- Penn State supporters kept the Nittany Lions in the top five nationally in average home attendance for the 24th consecutive season.
- · Led by an electric sellout throng of 107,895 for the primetime, double overtime game with Ohio State, the Nittany Lions drew a total of 711,358 for an average of 101,623 per game during the 2014 season, resulting in an average increase of 5,036 fans per game (5.0 percent) in 2014. Penn State fans bought a total of 35,000-plus more tickets over seven home games.
- · The Nittany Lions' average increase was third-highest among schools in the top 25 in average home attendance whose stadiums did not expand prior to the 2014 season, according to the NCAA. Florida State (6,790 avg.), UCLA (6,365 avg.) and Penn State (5,036 avg.) led the way.
- Beaver Stadium hosted four crowds in excess of 100,000 last season, topped by the energetic Penn State White Out sellout crowd for the Ohio State clash.
- · The Big Ten broke its single-season record for total attendance during the 2014 football season with 6,359,218 fans attending home games. In addition, nine Big Ten schools produced increases in average attendance this year compared to 2013.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted the system for regular season games in 1996.

- · Since then, Penn State has played 11 overtime games, including five over the past two seasons.
- · Seven of the 11 overtime tilts have come at home, two in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Their first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home
- · The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013. Penn State's all-time overtime games:

THE VOICE LIVES ON

The 2015 season is the first without Fran Fisher. The legendary, long-time radio voice of the Nittany Lions passed away in May at the age of 91. Fisher began his five-decade association with Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics in 1966, joining the Penn State Football Radio Network as an analyst, and calling some of the Nittany Lions' most memorable football victories, including the 1983 Sugar Bowl. He was promoted to the Nittany Lions' play-by-play voice from 1970-82 and returned to the booth from 1994-99, working alongside analyst/sidekick George Paterno for the final six seasons. He had continued to do voice for radio and television commercials and voice-overs into 2015.

HAM HONORED

The accomplishments of legendary Penn State football linebacker Jack Ham continue to standout in the annals of college football history, as the Football Writers' Association of American (FWAA) named the Hall of Famer and current Penn State Sports Network broadcaster to its 75th Anniversary All-America Third Team in August.

The team celebrates the FWAA's All-America teams from near the end of World War II through the 2014 season. The FWAA, which was founded in 1941, has picked an annual All-America team since the 1944 season, making it the second-longest continuously selected team in major college football.

As a senior co-captain, Ham earned All-America honors in 1970 after making 91 tackles and intercepting four passes. He still shares a pair of defensive records for blocked punts: four in his career, three in his final season. Ham had 251 career tackles (143 solo).

Ham is the only Penn State product in both the college and professional football halls of fame.

NITTANY LIONS IN NFL VENUES

- In 2015, Penn State will take on Maryland at M&T Bank Stadium, home of the Super Bowl XLVII Champion Baltimore Ravens, to mark the eighth current NFL stadium the Blue and White have played in. Penn State opened the season in Lincoln Financial Field, home of the Philadelphia Eagles, against Temple.
- The Nittany Lions have also played in current homes of the Miami Dolphins (Sun Life Stadium), New Orleans Saints (Mercedes-Benz Superdome), New York Giants/New York Jets (MetLife Stadium), San Diego Chargers (Qualcomm Stadium), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (Raymond James Stadium) and Washington Redskins (FedEx Field).
- The first documented Penn State game in a professional stadium was in 1921 when the Nittany Lions defeated Georgia Tech, 28-7, in front of 30,000 fans at the Polo Grounds in Upper Manhattan in New York City.
- · Excluding bowl games, the Lions have played 38 regular season games in 13 different stadiums with permanent NFL tenants.
- Four regular season games were played in NFL venues in 1983, as the Lions played in Giants Stadium twice (Nebraska and Rutgers), Veterans Stadium (Temple) and Sullivan (Foxboro) Stadium (Boston College.)

PENN STATE SPORTS NETWORK AIRS ALL NITTANY LION GAMES; COACHES SHOW

Nearly 60 radio stations across Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and Ohio will carry Penn State football to fans throughout the Northeast this season on the Penn State Sports Network.

Steve Jones and Jack Ham will team up for their 16th season as the play-by-play voice and color analyst, respectively, on the Penn State Sports Network.

The football broadcasts begin 90 minutes before kickoff with the one-hour "Dietz & Watson Tailgate Show" with host Roger Corey, along with Jones and Ham. "The Penn State Bookstore Kickoff Show." a 20-minute conversation with Head Coach James Franklin follows, before Jones and Ham bring listeners the starting lineups, health reports, field conditions and late-breaking news in the final minutes leading up to kickoff.

The broadcasts conclude with the "Pennsylvania Propane Gas Association Postgame Show" featuring locker room interviews, game statistics, stars and plays of the game, as well as scores from around the nation.



GAME RECAPS

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - P.J. Walker scored the goahead touchdown late in the third quarter to rally Temple to a 27-10 win over Penn State on Saturday. It was Temple's first win over the Nittany Lions in 74 years.

Temple hadn't won in the series since Oct. 18, 1941. Penn State was 38-0-1 since `41 with a 7-7 tie in 1950 the only time the Owls played without a loss.

There were 69,176 fans in attendance at Lincoln Financial Field.

Christian Hackenberg completed 11-of-25 passes good for 103 yards. Chris Godwin hauled in five of those passes for 81 yards to lead the Penn State receiving corps.

Walker made it 17-10 with a 1-yard run late in the third and the Owls cruised from there.

Penn State seemed poised for another rout when it took a 10-0 lead in the first quarter. Joey Julius , Penn State's 5-foot-10, 259-pound kicker, connected from 34 yards and Akeel Lynch scored on a 42-yard run. Penn State had 126 total yards in the first; 43 total over the second and third.

Penn State struggled on offense to sustain drives. The Nittany Lions punted on six straight possessions

once it took a 10-0 lead. Thomas scored his first TD on a 1-yard run in the second and Jones tied it 10-all on a 40-yarder in the third.

On the seventh possession since its last score, Hackenberg's pass was intercepted by Sharif Finch and seemingly returned to the end zone for the go-ahead score. After a quick replay review. Finch was ruled down on the 2 and Walker followed with the TD for the 17-10 lead.

GAME RECAPS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State scored on three consecutive drives starting late in the third quarter en route to a 27-14 victory over Buffalo in the home opener on a rainy Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium.

Buffalo (1-1) pulled within three points, 10-7 with a touchdown late in the third quarter, but a Penn State (1-1) field goal before the end of the third quarter and a pair of touchdown on the next two drives to start the fourth put the game out of reach.

Carl Nassib once again led the defense for Penn State (1-1), hauling in an interception that led to a field goal. posting three sacks and forcing two fumbles. The Nittany Lion defense held Buffalo to 274 yards (69 rushing, 205 passing) of total offense. It was the fewest rushing yards allowed since yielding 68 again Illinois last season.

On the other side of the ball, Penn State totaled 200 yards rushing, led by true freshman running back Saquon Barkley, who totaled 115 yards on 12 attempts with a touchdown. He is the first PSU true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in a game since Silas Redd had 131 yards on 11 carries and scored one touchdown against Northwestern in 2010. Barkley broke off back-to-back runs totaling 50 yards to start Penn State's first possession of the fourth quarter, which led to a touchdown and 20-7 Penn State lead. He also found the end zone with 9:02 remaining in the contest from nine yards out for a 27-7 lead.

Another true freshman, Brandon Polk, totaled 45 yards on three carries, scampering 22 yards for a touchdown for the Lions' first score of the game, and adding another to setup a short field goal attempt late in the third quarter. It marked the first time since 2005 that Penn State had two true freshmen score a touchdown in the same game.

Christian Hackenberg finished with one touchdown and 127 yards passing, completing 14-of-27 attempts in wet conditions. He connected on a 38-yard pass play to Chris Godwin who led the receiving corps with five receptions for 75 yards, to setup Barkley's fourth quarter score. DaeSean Hamilton hauled in a 5-yard touchdown reception on the drive keyed by Barkley's big runs and totaled three catches for 15 vards.

The offense was strongest in the second half, totaling 202 yards, and did not yield a sack in the game for the first time since 2013 in a win over Wisconsin. The Lions did not turn the ball over either for the first time since last season's tilt against UMass.

Contributing on defense in addition to Nassib were Austin Johnson and Troy Reeder. Johnson posted a careerhigh nine tackles, including 2.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks. Reeder also surpassed a career high with seven tackles in his first career start.

The Nittany Lion special teams contributed, as well, returning both a punt return and kick return for at least 58 yards in the same game for the first time since 2007, when they accomplished the feat against Notre Dame.

PENN STATE

Buffalo guarterback Joe Licata completed 24-of-35 pass attempts for 205 yards and two touchdowns, but was sacked six times for 47 yards and picked off once. Ron Willoughby was his top target with eight catches for a touchdown, and Marcus McGill caught four passes for 45 yards and a touchdown. Anthone Taylor added 93 yards on the around with 18 carries.

The game had an electrifying start as Penn State's Nick Scott returned the opening kickoff 58 yards to the Buffalo 42. It was the longest for Penn State since Chaz Powell had a 92-yard return against Purdue in 2011.

A 22-vard touchdown run on a sweep to Polk was the game's first score and gave Penn State a 7-0 lead with 6:57 remaining in the first half. A 58-yard punt return by DeAndre Thompkins, on which he was barely tripped up by UB punter Tyler Grassman on a diving play, setup the two-play scoring drive at Buffalo's 24. It was the longest punt return by a Nittany Lion since Derrick Williams' 63yard punt return for a touchdown at Wisconsin in 2008.

With Buffalo on its own 33 on the ensuing possession, Anthony Zettel burst through the UB line and tipped a Licata pass, and Nassib was able to haul it in with one hand for the interception, which he returned10 yards to the UB 12. Joey Julius converted a 22-yard field goal to cap the drive with 3:58 left in the half.

After the halftime break, Willoughby capped a 11-play, 78-yard drive with a 14-yard touchdown reception to cut Penn State's lead to three.

Penn State converted a field goal on its next possession, and then after a UB three-and-out, Barkley broke free on the first PSU play for 33 yards to the Buffalo 29, and then ran down the middle and leapt over a safety before being brought down after a 17-yard gain. Hackenberg threw for seven yards to Godwin and connected with Hamilton on a 5-yard touchdown reception for a 20-7 lead with 12:04 remaining in the game.

Another three-and-out led to Penn State's final scoring drive, as the Lions drove 74 yards on just six plays, a 15yard pass interference penalty and a 38-yard connection between Hackenberg and Godwin led to Barkley's 9-yard touchdown run.

Buffalo drove 82 yards on 13 plays to reach the end zone on a 10-yard reception by McGill with 4:38 remaining, but two sack-fumbles by Nassib helped prevent UB from mustering another scoring drive.


