THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

• Penn State returns home after back-to-back road weekends as the Nittany Lions host the fifth-ranked Notre Dame Fighting Irish in a pair of Big Ten Conference matchups this weekend.

• Penn State went 0-4-1 last season against the newest member of the Big Ten Conference after entering 2017-18 with a 2-1-1 record against the Irish as non-conference foes. The teams will meet for the 10th and 11th time this weekend with Notre Dame holding the 5-2-2 advantage in the all-time series including a 2-1-1 mark at Pegula Ice Arena.

• In nine career games against the Irish, senior Alec Marsh leads the team with four goals and three assists for seven points while classmate Chase Berger is right behind with three goals and three assists for six points.

SIMPLY THE BEST, BETTER THAN ALL THE REST

• The trio of junior Liam Folkes and sophomores Evan Barratt and Alex Limoges continued their torrid pace to open the season scoring five of the team's eight goals last week against Wisconsin while adding eight assists for 13 total points.

• With 28 goals and 42 assists for 70 points on the season, the line has as many or more points than 11 NCAA Division I teams while having as many or more goals than 14 teams.

• Averaging 4.67 points per game the trio is the highest scoring line in all of college hockey and has scored at least one goal in 16-straight games dating back to last season.

TOPPING THE CHARTS

• Sophomore Evan Barratt maintains his national lead with 25 points on the season while his 12 goals rank tied for tops in the nation. Barratt has also registered 10 multi-point efforts already this season and has only been held off the scoresheet twice while scoring at least one goal in nine of his last ten games.

• Linemate Alex Limoges is keeping pace and is tied with Barratt for the national lead with 25 points after securing five assists in the two games last weekend against Wisconsin. Limoges 17 assists also pace the nation.

• Limoges tied the Penn State single-game record for assists last Saturday with helpers on the first four goals of the game including three-straight primary apples in the second period to set a new single-game program record for most assists in a single period.

• The last teammates to finish 1-2 in the national scoring race were Michigan's Kyle Connor and J.T. Compher in 15-16.

• Folkes, the other member of the line, also hit the 20-point mark last weekend with a four-point effort in Madison as Penn State becomes the first team in the nation with three 20-plus point players already as no other team even has two players with 20-plus points.

• While both Barratt and Limoges have already set career-high point totals this season, Folkes is just three points shy from tying his career-best total of 23 from last season.

DON'T YOU, FORGET ABOUT ME

• After being held with just one assist over his four games prior to last weekend junior Nikita Pavlychev slipped from his spot atop the national leaderboards, but with a goal in each game against the Badgers the big Russian forward has now tied his career-high with nine goals on the season.

• With 19 points so far this season, Pavlychev has also already set a new career-high and ranks tied for ninth in the nation and tied for fifth in the Big Ten. Pavlychev's nine goals also tied for third in the Big Ten and tenth in the nation.

CHASE-ING WATERFALLS

• Senior Chase Berger registered his first point in six games last Saturday with the secondary assist on Sam Sternschein's power-play tally giving him 98 career points.

• Berger is now just two points shy of becoming only the third member of the 100-point club at Penn State and given his success at Pegula Ice Arena and against Notre Dame fans could be in for a treat this weekend.

• The senior currently ranks tied for ninth among active players with 98 career points.

BEST IN THE WORLD

• Earlier this week both Barratt and freshman Aarne Talvitie were each named to their countries preliminary rosters for the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship set to begin later this month in Victoria and Vancouver, British Columbia.

• Both players appeared for their countries this summer at the World Junior Summer Showcase where Talvitie wore the 'C' for Finland.

• Expected by many to serve as Finnish Team Captain, Talvitie led all Big Ten freshman with nine points on three goals and six assists during the month of November while his 14 points this season rank second in the Big Ten for rookies behind the 15 of Wisconsin's K'Andre Miller and are tied for fifth nationally among first-year players.

• Talvitie becomes the first European born player in program history to earn an invite to a WJC camp as this marks the second-straight season Penn State has sent at least one player to camp as sophomore Cole Hults was named to Team USA's preliminary roster last season, but did not make the final roster.

WE'VE GOT THE POWER(PLAY)

• Penn State has scored at least one goal on the man-advantage in 11-of-15 games this season including eight of its last nine games seven-straight games going 10-for-28 (35.7 percent) over that stretch. The Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten and rank sixth in the nation at 28 percent (14-for-50) on the power-play this season and are 7-for-16 (43.8 percent) in Big Ten play.

• Barratt leads the team with three power-play tallies while Folkes, Pavlychev, Sam Sternschein and Denis Smirnov each have a pair. Penn State has seen eight different players register a power-play goal.

SCOUTING NOTRE DAME



• Notre Dame enters the weekend at No. 5 in the national polls with a 10-4-1 record and is currently second in the Big Ten with a 4-2-0 record and 12 points. The Irish made it all the way to the National Championship game last season before falling to Minnesota-Duluth and finishing the year with a 28-10-2 overall record. ND won both the regular season Big Ten Championship and the tournament title in its first season as an affiliate conference member.

• Notre Dame lost its top three point producers from the Frozen Four team including leading scorer Jake Evans (46 points) to graduation while leading goal scorer Andrew Oglevie (15 goals, 39 points) left school early to pursue his NHL dream and is currently playing with the Rochester Americans of the AHL. Leading defenseman Jordan Gross also graduated after a stellar 10 goal and 20 assist senior campaign.

• Cal Burke is leading the team so far this season with nine goals and 17 points while Bobby Nardella has chipped in five goals with a team-best 11 assists. The Irish are very veteran heavy as their top six scorers are either a junior or senior.

• Back between the pipes is 2018 Mike Richter Award Winner and Hobey Baker Finalist Cale Morris who ranks fourth nationally with a .939 save percentage while his 1.83 goals against average places him tenth in the nation. Both marks are good for second in the Big Ten. Morris has won each of his last four games allowing just four goals during that stretch with a .965 save percentage.

• Also receiving three starts this season with a perfect 3-0-0 record, a .965 save percentage and a 1.00 goals against average is sophomore Dylan St. Cyr.

• Notre Dame has struggled with the man-advantage converting just 9-of-58 chances (15.5 percent) to rank last in the Big Ten and 45th nationally.

• The Irish defense is tied for the best in the nation with Bowling Green allowing just 1.67 goals per game. Notre Dame has allowed just 16 even-strength goals in 15 games, which is tied for the second lowest total in the nation with Yale who has only played nine games. Bowling Green leads the nation having only allowed 15 even-strength goals all season.

BEST OF THE BEST OF THE BEST, SIR

• Whether shooting the puck or passing this season, the Nittany Lions lead the nation in most offensive categories including goals (77), assists (140), points (217), goals per game (5.13) and shots on goal (40.47) as well as leading the nation with 270 blocked shots and 18.00 blocks per game.

PERIOD TO FORGET

• For the third time in six games the Nittany Lions allowed four third period goals during an 8-5 setback at Wisconsin last Saturday night. Penn State is now being outscored 16-3 in the third period during Big Ten play.

• PSU has held the lead entering the third period in 4-of-6 conference games while the other two the teams were tied entering the final frame and Penn State is just 2-3-1-1 in conference games this season. Overall the Nittany Lions are 9-3-0 when leading or tied after two periods.

• Last Saturday also marked the first time in 61 instances since the program was established prior to the 2012-13 season that the Nittany Lions lost a game when scoring at least five goals. Penn State is now 58-1-2 all-time in such games.

CLASSMATE CHASE

• With 37 career goals apiece juniors Denis Smirnov and Nate Sucece are tied for sixth on the Penn State all-time list and just one goal shy of Eric Sheid for fifth.

• Smirnov currently sits in fourth on the Penn State all-time scoring list with 82 points while Sucece is three points back and only one point shy of tying Casey Bailey for fifth.

• Sucece is also just outside the top-10 all-time in assists with 42 trailing Taylor Holstrom '15 and Trevor Hamilton '18 who each have 43 to their name and are tied for ninth in program history.

• The Nittany Lions close out the opening semester of play with a quick trip to Philadelphia to battle Princeton at Wells Fargo Center next Saturday with puck drop slated for 7:30 p.m.

SMIRNOV AND SUCECE NAMED B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Junior classmates Denis Smirnov and Nate Sucece were both named to the Preseason Big Ten Players to Watch list.

• This marks the second-consecutive season that Smirnov has made the list as he enters the 2018-19 season second on the team in career points with 74 in just 69 games while Sucece ranks not far behind with 65 points in 74 career games played. The duo has combined for 65 goals over the past two seasons.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

• Senior Chase Berger was named the sixth captain in program history for the 2018-19 campaign after serving as an alternate last season. Fellow senior Kevin Kerr and junior Brandon Biro will serve as his alternates.

RECAPPING 2017-18

• Penn State is coming off its second-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance after finishing the 2017-18 season at 18-5-5 with a 9-10-5-2 mark in Big Ten, good for a fourth place finish with 34 points in league action.

• The Nittany Lions led all Big Ten teams with 138 goals and 374 points last season ranking third and fourth in the nation, respectively, in each category. Penn State returns 109 of those goals and 274 points each topping the Big Ten while ranking first and fourth in the NCAA to open the 2018-19 season.

• The Nittany Lions have 20 players returning from last season's roster as they welcome six newcomers to the 2018-19 squad.

• Andrew Sturtz became just the third player in program history to reach the 40-point mark in a season as the junior scored 14 goals while adding 26 assists. Sturtz then became the fourth Nittany Lion to ink a professional contract signing a two-way NHL deal with the Ottawa Senators forgoing his final season in Hockey Valley.

• Penn State had six players register double-digit goals while two others fell one goal shy of that mark. The Nittany Lions ranked first in the Big Ten and third in the nation averaging 3.63 goals per game during the 2017-18 season.

• Brandon Biro had a career-year for the Blue and White ranking second on the team with 31 points on nine goals and 22 assists. Fellow classmates Nate Sucese and Denis Smirnov were also top-5 in points for the Nittany Lions with 29 and 27, respectively while Smirnov led the team with 15 goals and Sucese one behind with 14. Liam Folkes also had a career-year with 13 goals and 10 assists for 23 points.

• Senior Trevor Hamilton became the first Penn State player to earn a major conference honor as he was recognized as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year after scoring six goals while adding 23 assists for 29 points and leading the nation in blocked shots for the second-consecutive season with 109.

- A pair of Nittany Lion juniors hail from Russia by the way of Pennsylvania as both **Nikita Pavlychev** (Yaroslavl) and **Denis Smirnov** (Moscow) become the first Lions to wear the Blue and White from the Motherland.

- Both forwards migrated to the U.S. and to Pennsylvania in their early teen years, playing youth hockey in the Keystone State.

- The Nittany Lions also have a pair of freshman from Finland as goaltender **Oskar Autio** is following in his brothers footsteps joined by longtime friend and New Jersey Devils draft pick **Aarne Talvitie**. Both players are from Espoo and grew up playing for the Esspo Blues.

- Graduate transfer **Ludvig Larsson** becomes the program's first-ever Swedish born player as he hails from Malmo, Sweden by the way of Merrimack College (Hockey East).

PACKING THE PEG

- Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 97-of-101 home games, including all 17 regular season contests during the 2017-18 season.

- More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 66 occasions including 12 games last season.

- In 2017-18, Penn State ranked fifth in average attendance (5,906) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (102.2 percent).

- Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 112,221 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena.

WELCOME HOME

- Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

- The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

- The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

- The Big Ten is in its sixth season entering 2018-19. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 24 league games, including 12 home contests.

- The Big Ten is comprised of seven total universities with the University of Notre Dame becoming an official affiliate member at the start of the 2017-18 season.

- Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout win and one point for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout loss.

- The 2018-19 season will be the first season the Big Ten has instituted a 3-on-3 overtime period joining the NCHC and WCHA.

- Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

- The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only Power 5 conference to sponsor men's hockey.

- The Big Ten tournament will take place at on campus sites once again during the 2018-19 season.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 20th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2018-19 and his seventh at Penn State.

AT PENN STATE

Following the most successful season in Penn State history, Gadowsky once again led his Nittany Lions to the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18. Penn State was able to take the short drive down to Allentown, Pennsylvania, as they served as host for the Midwest Regional. However, once again the Nittany Lions' season was cut short at the hands of the Denver Pioneers, 5-1, in the NCAA Midwest Regional semifinal.

Earlier during the 2017-18 season, Gadowsky secured his 100th career victory at Penn State, which in turn, was the 100th victory for the program, a 5-1 victory over Minnesota on February 23, 2018. That victory was the start of the first-ever sweep of the Golden Gophers by the Nittany Lions, which secured home-ice for Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals the following weekend, the first year the conference tournament was held at campus sites. Penn State went on to sweep Minnesota in two games, clinching the series and its fourth B1G Semifinal appearance in five years.

In 2017-18, Gadowsky also saw junior Andrew Sturtz become just the second member of the 100-point club at Penn State as well as becoming the all-time leading goal scorer in program history. Sturtz then graduated early and signed an NHL deal with the Ottawa Senators.

Gadowsky also coached Trevor Hamilton to a Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year award, the first major conference honor awarded to a Nittany Lion. Hamilton also joined Casey Bailey and Vince Pedrie as the only First-Team All-Conference members in program history.

In 2016-17, Gadowsky led Penn State to its most successful season ever, compiling a record of 25-12-2. Penn State won the 2017 Big Ten Tournament and earned its first-ever NCAA

Tournament appearance, falling one game shy of the Frozen Four. The Nittany Lions defeated Union 10-3, tying the record for most goals in a team's tournament debut, before bowing out to eventual national champion Denver, 6-3, in the Midwest Regional final.

Along the way Penn State opened the season 13-1-1 using a program-best 11-game winning streak. The Lions also earned their first-ever uscho.com No. 1 national ranking on Jan. 17, 2017, with a 16-2-1 record. Penn State finished the season as the highest scoring team in the country, averaging 4.10 goals per game.

The 2016-17 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (160), assists (265), points (425), shots (1,719), goals/gm (4.10) and shots/gm (44.1) to go along with the program-best 25 victories.

In 2015-16 Gadowsky led Penn State to its first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6 the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the pre-season, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with

the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign saw gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont at Wells Fargo Arena in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL barn (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second-straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, presented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

Gadowsky had more than 20 Tiger players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalembe (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in each of the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

Gadowsky also competed with the Canadian National Team and played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden during the 1993-94 season.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.

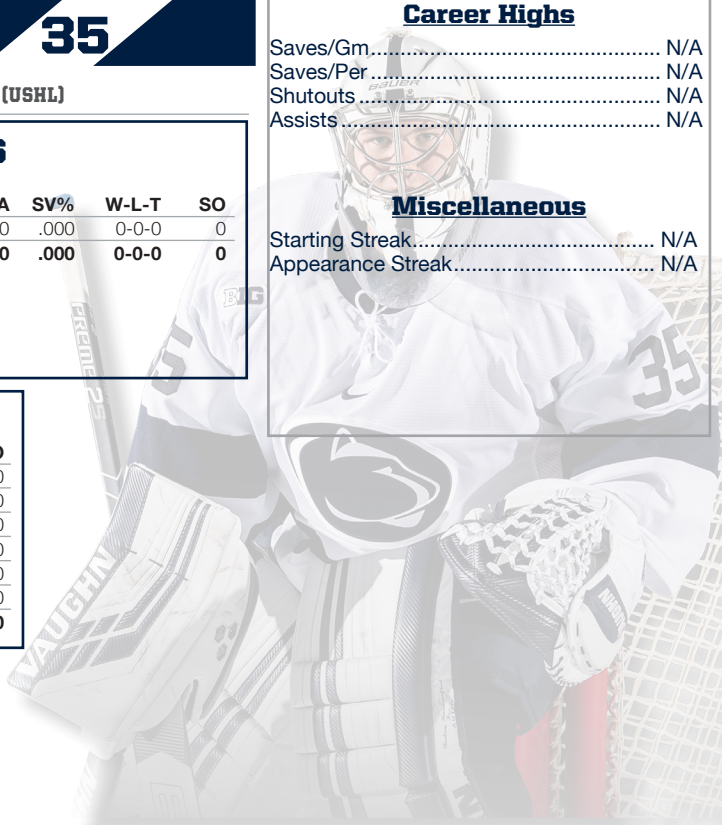

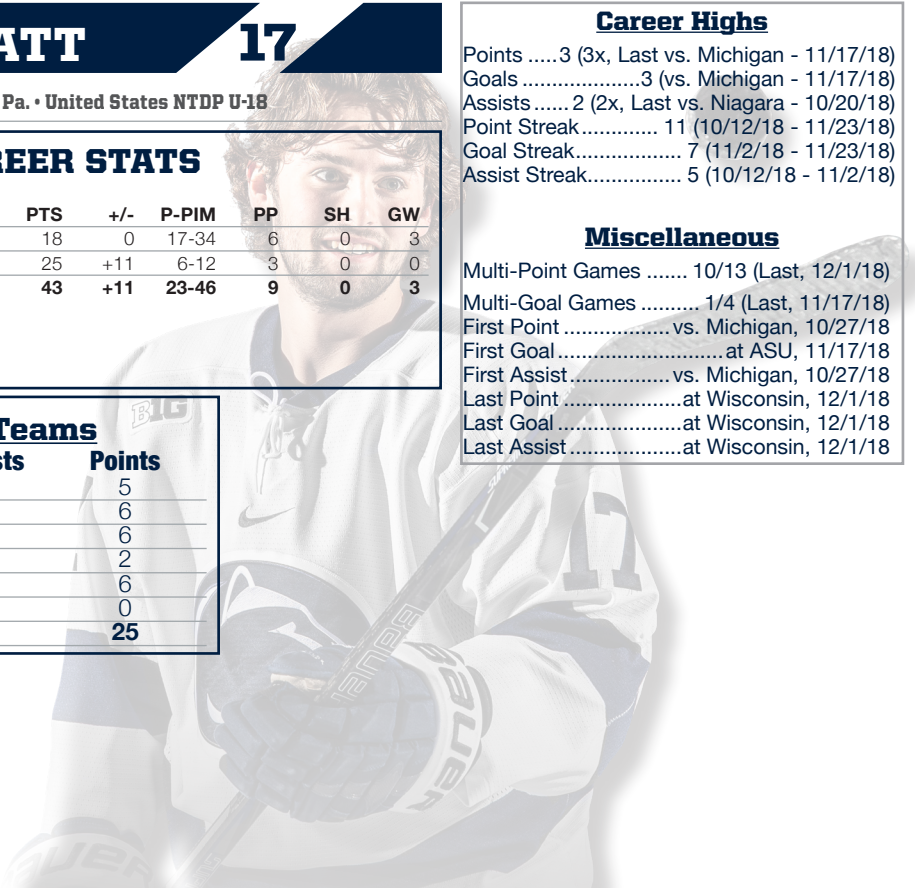

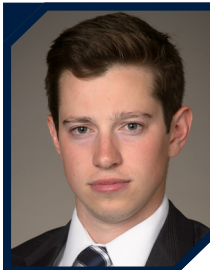
