#### LIONS IN THE NCAA

• Penn State ranks 12th in the country in caused turnovers per game (9.56), 13th in scoring offense (13.50), 15th in draw controls per game (13.69) and 17th in points (307).

• Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** ranks 14th in the NCAA in points per game (4.5) and 17th in points (72), while senior defender **Katie Guy** is 16th in the country in caused turnovers per game (1.88).

#### PENN STATE IN THE CONFERENCE

• The Nittany Lions lead the ALC in caused turnovers and ranks second in scoring offense.



• Freshman **Emi Smith** has been the goal-keeper of record for each game (11-5).
