GAME NOTES AT ROBERT MORRIS (FEB. 22-23)

SCOUTING THE COLONIALS

The season for Robert Morris (11-14-3, 7-10-1 CHA) has been a tale of two halves. RMU opened with a 9-3-2 overall mark and 5-1-0 in the CHA to top the conference. Since then, the Colonials have gone 2-11-1, falling to a tie for fourth with Lindenwood in conference with 15 points. Despite the struggles, one of the two wins was at No. 7 Mercyhurst, 4-2, on Feb. 8 before a 9-1 loss to the Lakers the next night. Then came a sweep at Lindenwood 3-2 (OT) and 4-2.

As a whole, the Colonials have struggled to find the back of the net, converting just 7.7 percent of their shots into goals. The Colonial attack is led by Rebecca Vint (14g, 15a) who has 29 points. The defense is anchored by goaltender Kristen DiCiocco who has a 2.40 GAA and a .914 save percentage. DiCiocco owns a 9-12-3 record with the team's lone shutout, which came in the season opener against Yale on Oct. 19.

LAST TIME VS. RMU

Robert Morris stormed by Penn State, 7-1, on Friday, Nov. 10, 2012 at Greenberg Ice Pavilion behind five Rebecca Vint goals, which tied an RMU record. Shannon Yoxheimer tallied a goal in her seventh-straight game in the loss, while Nicole Paniccia made 36 saves.

The next day, Penn State played gutsy, but fell 4-1. RMU raced out to a 3-0 lead in the first period, but Micayla Catanzariti with seven minutes left in the third period to cut the advantage to two. Moments later, Penn State nearly made it 3-2, but RMU goalie Delayne Brian made a big stop and the Colonials added an empty-netter for the final score line. Paniccia was excellent in net making 49 saves for Penn State.

CHA PLAYOFFS LOOMING

Three of the six seeds for the College Hockey America Tournamnet have been set. Mercyhurst clinched the regular season title and hosting the semifinals and finals, while Syracuse earned a bye and will be the second seed. Penn State will be the sixth seed and travel to RIT or Lindenwood. RIT is in the driver's seat for the third seed and needs just a point at Mercyhurst to clinch the spot, while Lindenwood needs RIT to lose both games and win both of its own games to earn third. Robert Morris can finish fourth or fifth depending on the results of this weekend.

The first round is a best-of-three series at the higher seed starting Friday, March 1. The winners of those two series will travel to Mercyhurst and round out the four-team semifinals and finals. The winner of the CHA does not earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Robert Morris is the defending CHA Tournament champion.

PENN STATE FEATURED ON BTN

On Thursday, Feb. 14, the Big Ten Network ran a five-minute feature on the Penn State women's hockey program. Produced and narrated by Kara Lentz, BTN cameras follows the team during its

home-opening series against Syracuse and uses footage from Penn State's historic win over Vermont on Oct. 6. Head coach Josh Brandwene, junior captain Taylor Gross, junior goaltender Nicole Paniccia and freshman forward Shannon Yoxheimer recount their experiences through the beginning of the inaugural season.

LAST TIME OUT

Penn State struggled to find an offensive rhythm on Friday night, falling at RIT's Ritter Arena, 3-1, in a College Hockey America matchup on Friday, Feb. 15. Nicole Paniccia was called upon to make 42 saves, while junior captain Taylor Gross scored Penn State's lone goal in the third period.

On Saturday night, a barrage of second-period shots from RIT led to a comfortable three-goal margin as the Tigers defeated Penn State 4-0 at Ritter Arena. Paniccia did all she could, stopping 41 shots as PSU was more than doubled in shot attempts, 45-20.

LIONS MAKE FIRST TV APPEARANCES

Penn State women's hockey appeared on TV for the first time in program history at RIT on Feb. 15-16. Time Warner Cable Sports, channel 26 or channel 1026 in Central New York, broadcasted both games live from Ritter Arena.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

As is expected with a brand new varsity program, there are many freshmen on the team-17 in all. All 17 freshmen have made an appearance on the ice this season and have accounted for 75.0% of the goals scored (48 of 64).

A pair of valiant efforts weren't enough to upset the No. 7 Mercyhurst Lakers this past weekend (Feb. 1-2), falling 5-2 and 4-1. Penn State's three-goal deficit on Friday was too great to overcome, but PSU matched Mercyhurst 2-2 over the course of 56 minutes between the second period of Friday and Saturday's game. Celine Whitlinger was outstanding in net on Friday night, making a career-high 59 saves o keep the Lions in it. Hannah Hoenshell beat MU's goaltender with a nifty move and Jordin Pardoski netted a power-play goal off a Laker skate.

On Saturday, **Nicole Paniccia** was tasked with stopping the Mercyhurst onslaught and saved 46 of 50 shots. **Jill Holdcroft's** late third period goal on the power play ended the shutout and PSU dropped the season series 0-4-0 to the CHA leaders.

LIONS FALL PREY TO TIGERS

Penn State skated against Princeton for the first time on Tuesday night (Jan. 29) and dropped a 3-0 decision at Greenberg Ice Pavilion. The Tigers tallied a goal in each period, while goaltender **Nicole Paniccia** made 27 saves for the Nittany Lions. Princeton out-shot Penn State 30-19 for the game.

LIONS FALL IN SYRACUSE

Penn State dropped both games to Syracuse in its return to CHA play. In the Friday, Jan. 25 matchup, Nicole Paniccia's 45-save performance wasn't enough as a first-period Orange goal was the difference, 1-0. The next day, Celine Whitlinger had to stand tall in net, making 51 saves in a 4-1 loss to Syracuse. The Orange opened the game with three goals in the first 11:29, but Penn State outscored the Orange 1-0 until a last-minute empty-netter capped the scoring. Jill Holdcroft tallied her eighth of the year and her team-leading fourth power-play goal. Shannon Yoxheimer and Jess Desorcie fed the Holdcroft goal.

LIONS DROP ONE GOAL GAMES AT UNION

Penn State dropped both ends of a two-game series (Jan. 11-12) at Union in one-goal fashion, 1-0 and 2-1. **Celine Whitlinger's** career-high 48-save performance kept PSU in the opener before a late third-period goal propelled the Dutchwomen. Union took a 2-0 lead in the series finale, but **Jess Desorcie** cut the lead in half. Nevertheless, the Dutchwomen held on for the slim win.

PENN STATE SWEEPS CHATHAM

The Nittany Lions trounced an overmatched Chatham team on Friday-Saturday, Jan. 4-5, winning 10-0 and 4-0. The weekend saw every Nittany Lion see ice time as PSU out-shot Chatham 119-33, scoring 14 times, tallying 22 assists, 36 points and a plus-65 rating. Additionally, Penn State posted back-to-back shutouts for the first time in the young history of the program.

In Friday's game, Penn State scored five in the first, four in the second and added one more for the 10 spot. **Shannon Yoxheimer** scored the first two goals of the game and **Hannah Hoenshell** tallied a school-record four points as Penn State eased by the Division III Cougars.

Penn State set new records for most goals in a game (10), most goals in a period (5, in the first) and most assists in a game (17). Hoenshell tallied a two-goal, two-assist effort, while **Jeanette Bateman** became the first Nittany Lion to register three assists. **Jordin Pardoski** added a three-point game of her own behind a goal and two assists to celebrate her 19th birthday.

The game also featured a couple of firsts as **Tess Weaver** scored her first varsity goal at the end of the first period and freshman **Darby Kern** notched her first point on an assist in the first period. In all, 15 Nittany Lions earned a point.

Kendra Rasmussen tallied her first multi-goal game of her career and **Jill Holdcroft** tallied two points on a goal and an assist. In all, 16 of 18 Nittany Lion skaters tallied a point.

The goaltending trio of **Nicole Paniccia**, **Celine Whitlinger** and **Brooke Meyer** combined for Penn State's second shutout of the year. Paniccia and Meyer made six stops, while Whitlinger saved five.

On Saturday, Junior assistant captain **Jenna Welch** scored twice and linemate **Katie Zinn** posted three points behind her first collegiate goal and two assists.

Penn State out-shot Chatham, 71-16, peppering the Cougar net. Zinn scored the opening goal in the first, Welch doubled the lead in the second and added another in the third before Holdcroft finished off the scoring. Paige Jahnke had two helpers and Madison Smiddy added her sixth assist of the season in the game.

Whitlinger won her first collegiate game with 12 saves in 52:34 of game time. Meyer polished off the shutout with four stops in the final 7:26.

HOENSHELL EARNS ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward **Hannah Hoenshell** collected College Hockey America Rookie of the Week laurels, the conference office announced Monday, Jan. 7. The award is the first of her career for the Plano, Texas, native, who tallied four points on a pair of goals and assists in a 10-0 win over Chatham Jan. 4.

STROEMEL TO LEAD USA UNIVERSITY TEAM

Penn State women's hockey director of operations and video coach **Mo Stroemel** will lead the 2013 U.S. Women's National University Team at the 2013 World University Games in Italy announced on Jan. 9. Stroemel was also in charge of the inaugural 2011 team that placed fourth in Turkey. Stroemel's 2011 squad featured current Nittany Lion assistant captain **Lindsay Reihl** and current equipment manager **Graham Pepperman**.

SAINTS ESCAPE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State battled St. Lawrence Friday night (Dec. 7), but ultimately fell to the Saints, 3-1, on the road in Canton, N.Y. Freshman Jill Holdcroft netted her fifth goal of the season on a power play in the second period, but St. Lawrence responded with a two-goal final frame to put away the Nittany Lions. Celine Whitlinger, in her third start of the season, denied a career-high 45 shots in goal, besting her previous record of 40 set against Vermont Oct. 7. Whitlinger was aided by a stingy Nittany Lion defense that totaled 17 blocked shots to hold St. Lawrence to just a pair of goals before an empty-netter sealed the final score at 3-1. Jenna Welch led the way by getting in front of three attempts.

On Saturday, Dec. 8, Penn State pulled within

one late in the third period, but could not complete the comeback against St. Lawrence as the Saints skated to a 4-2 victory to earn the series sweep. **Jess Desorcie** scored early, assisted by **Taylor Gross** and **Shannon Yoxheimer** for a 1-0 lead. Down 3-1, **Hanna Hoenshell** scored her fifth of the season midway through the third period. SLU managed a power-play goal with less than two minutes to play for the 4-2 final. **Nicole Paniccia** made 54 saves in goal for the Lions.

CHA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH HONORS TO YOXHEIMER

Freshman forward **Shannon Yoxheimer** was named College Hockey America's Rookie of the Month for her performance during November. Yoxheimer led the Nittany Lions with nine points and helped lead Penn State to a 3-4-0 record last month.

Yoxheimer was Penn State's most powerful weapon offensively, accounting for 39 shots, four goals, five points and nine points during the varsity program's second month. Her four goals were tied for a team-high, while her five assists and nine points were each team bests.

AT THE MERCY OF THE LAKERS

Penn State dropped both games at No. 4 Mercyhurst last weekend (Nov. 30-Dec. 1), but still put forth positive efforts. Friday night's 5-0 loss highlight was **Celine Whitlinger's** strong third period that yielded one goal in 29 shots as the freshman netminder made her return to the ice. Her last appearance was Oct. 14 vs. Syracuse.

In Saturday's game, Penn State took a 1-0 lead on a **Jess Desorcie** marker off **Taylor Gross's** breakaway attempt 8:29 into the contest. The play was set up by **Shannon Yoxheimer**, who caused a turnover at the blue line and allowed Gross to streak in uncontested for the second time in minutes. Mercyhurst tied the game 1-1 before the period was out and held a 3-1 advantage after two periods as the Lakers won 7-1. **Nicole Paniccia** was named third star of the game by setting a new school record with 64 saves.

CHA SPLIT AT LINDENWOOD

Penn State women's hockey earned another inaugural milestone on Saturday, Nov. 17, defeating Lindenwood 3-2 for its first College Hockey America victory. Freshman forward **Emily Laurenzi** struck for the game-winning goal to complete a comeback at Lindenwood Ice Arena. Fellow classmate **Jill Holdcroft** and junior captain **Taylor Gross** each notched their fourth goals of the season for the Nittany Lions. Freshman forward **Shannon Yoxheimer** had two assists to aid the Nittany Lion attack.

Penn State found itself down twice to Lindenwood and each time fought back to knot the game. With 5:50 left in the third period in a 2-2 game, Laurenzi tucked home her second goal of the season as the Nittany Lions held off LU for the final portions of the game. Paige Jahnke and Hannah Hoenshell assisted on the power-play goal.

The previous day did not go as well for the Nittany Lions. Lindenwood scored twice in the second period to break a 1-1 dealock and went on to win, 5-1, for the Lions' first win of the season. Holdcroft scored a power-play goal from Yoxheimer and Gross.

WEEKEND SWEEP BY RMU

Penn State faced the 2012 CHA Tournament champion Robert Morris in a two-game series (Nov. 10-11), falling 7-1 and 4-1. **Shannon Yoxheimer** scored in the opener off a **Taylor Gross** faceoff win, but RMU's Rebecca Vint scored five times to pace the Colonials.

In the second game, it was more of the same early as Robert Morris staked out a 3-0 lead through two periods, but Penn State held the Colonials scoreless in the second. That turned the momentum around as Penn State went toe-to-toe with the defending champions in the third. Micayla Catanzariti scored a goal with 6:19 remaining to spark the Lions. Birdie Shaw and Jill Holdcroft were credited with assists. Twentythree seconds later, Yoxheimer's shot was saved by Delayne Brian and Taylor Gross's attempt was stopped by Brian to keep it a two-goal game. With 2:23 left, RMU took an interference penalty as Penn State had a 6-on-4, but couldn't convert before RMU tallied an empty-net goal with 13 second remaining. Nicole Paniccia made 49 saves in Sunday's loss.

YOXHEIMER FINALLY STOPPED

Penn State's leading scorer. Shannon Yoxheimer, has been on a roll over the past four weeks, scoring eight of her teamhigh 10 goals. In that stretch, Yoxheimer scored in sevenstraight games after a three-game drought. The seven-game streak started at Sacred Heart as she scored PSU's only goal and has continued with a career day vs. SHU on Nov. 3 as she scored a goal and career-high two assists. Yoxheimer also accounted for Penn State's first two game-winning goals, notching two goals at Vermont (Oct. 6) and the goahead goal at SHU (Oct. 20). Yoxheimer scored against Robert Morris on Saturday, but we held scoreless for the first time since Oct. 14 in the Sunday matchup.

EIGHT FROM EIGHT IN WIN OVER SHU

Penn State earned its first series sweep in program history, defeating Sacred Heart, 8-2, on Saturday (Nov. 3) afternoon at Greenberg Ice Pavilion. Eight different Nittany Lions tallied a goal with Jess Desorcie, Taylor Gross and Shannon Yoxheimer notching three-point days.

Yoxheimer opened the scoring before SHU tied it up early in the second period before Gross, Kendra Rasmussen and Jill Holdcroft scored successive goals for a 4-1 lead midway through the period.

After another SHU tally, PSU would rally off the last four goals, this time coming from Desorcie, Jenna Welch, Madison Smiddy and Emily Laurenzi. Welch, Smiddy and Laurenzi scored their first goals of the season for Penn State.

Nicole Paniccia made 23 saves in net for the Nittany Lions to improve to 4-3-1 on the season. Penn State dominated the game in the faceoff circle, 54-25, which led to a 64-25 shot advantage.

FIRST HOME WIN, SHUTOUT & HAT TRICK

Friday night, Nov. 2 at Greenberg Ice Pavilion was historic for Penn State as the women's hockey team won its first home game, 6-0, over Sacred Heart. The program's first shutout featured the first hat trick by Hannah Hoenshell. Shannon Yoxheimer scored twice and Jill Holdcroft scored her first ever goal in the rout.

Hoenshell opened the game's scoring seven minutes into the contest, which highlighted a 22-2 Penn State advantage in shots over the Pioneers.

The Nittany Lions would light the lamp three times in the second as Hoenshell, Yoxheimer and Holdcroft stretched the lead to 4-0.

In the third, Penn State would make it 5-0 just 10 seconds

The Nittany Lions out-shot the Pioneers 66-18 as goaltenders **Nicole Paniccia** (11 saves) and **Brooke Meyer** (7 saves) combined for the school's first shutout.

PSU EARNS FIRST CHA POINT

Penn State was 89 seconds away from its first CHA victory on Friday, Oct. 26 vs. RIT, but had to settle with a hard-fought 2-2 tie. After a 4-1 loss to RIT on Thursday, Penn State fell to 0-3-1 in CHA play. Goaltender **Nicole Paniccia** and forward **Shannon Yoxheimer** shined for Penn State, providing outstanding defense and offense, respectively. Paniccia made 93 saves last week, including a school-record 59 stops in the 2-2 tie. Paniccia finished the weekend with a .939 save percentage after a 34-save effort in Thursday's matchup.

Yoxheimer scored Penn State's lone goal in the opener and opened the scoring on Friday before Taylor Gross made it 2-0 just seconds later. Paige Jahnke, Madison Smiddy, Yoxheimer and Gross each had an assist in the tie as the Tigers scored once in the first and another in the third. RIT held a 99-36 shot advantage in the series.

YOX NAMED CHA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For her efforts against Sacred Heart, **Shannon Yoxheimer** was named CHA Player of the Week for a three-point weekend and a game-winning goal over the Pioneers (Oct. 19-20). Yoxheimer leads the team with four goals and is tied with Taylor Gross for points with five. Yoxheimer is the first Nittany Lion to receive CHA Offensive Player of the Weeks honors and joins fellow classmate **Micayla Catanzariti** (Rookie of the Week, Oct. 8) on the honor roll.

ANOTHER WEEKEND OF FIRSTS

The second road trip in Penn State women's hockey history resulted in another split result, but it was not without some firsts. The Nittany Lions tallied six goals in a victory at Sacred Heart (Oct. 20), the most in the short history of the program and the largest margin of victory (5). Additionally, the Lions tallied eight assists, which matched the inaugural game.

Individually, **Jeanette Bateman**, **Jordin Pardoski** and **Hannah Hoenshell** scored their first collegiate goals on Oct. 20. **Jess Desorcie** tallied her first Penn State varsity goal, while **Lindsay Reihl** and **Jenna Welch** recorded their first Penn State points on assists. Welch had a two-helper game as did **Madison Smiddy**, who notched her first multi-point game. **Cara Mendelson** and Hoenshell hit the ice for the first time, bringing the total number of Nittany Lions to see ice time to 23.

HISTORIC FIRST WIN

Penn State women's hockey made history on Saturday, Oct. 6 at Vermont's Gutterson Fieldhouse by winning its inaugural game, 5-3. The Nittany Lions scored five goals from three freshmen making their respective debuts as junior goaltender **Nicole Paniccia** made 31 saves in her PSU opener. **Shannon Yoxheimer** and **Micayla Catanzariti** each scored twice for the Nittany Lions.

Down 2-1, Penn State was not to be deterred, reeling off three straight goals to take a 4-2 lead midway through the third period. Despite a Vermont goal with 6:34 left in the third, **Birdie Shaw** scored an empty-net goal to seal the Nittany Lion victory. Junior captain **Taylor Gross** made her Penn State debut known with two assists and was named the first star of the game, Yoxheimer was second.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Penn State had a varsity team debut for the first time since 1994 (women's soccer) when the women's hockey team defeated Vermont, 5-3 on Oct. 6. The successful debut was the first since 1977 when the men's volleyball team defeated East Stroudsburg.

CONTINUING PENN STATE HOCKEY

Eight members of the current varsity team played for the women's club team at some point. Seniors Lindsay Reihl and Kate Christoffersen and sophomores Cara Mendelson, Katie Murphy, Madison Smiddy and Tess Weaver played all of last season for head coach Josh Brandwene in Penn State's last year at the club level. Reihl and Christoffersen played three years for the PSU club team as well. Taylor Gross and Jess Desorcie joined the six players midway through the season in preparation of the 2012-13 season.

PEGULA ICE ARENA ON SCHEDULE

Pegula Ice Arena, a \$90 million state-of-the-art facility, will serve as the home of the Penn State hockey programs in 2012-13. As of Jan. 10, 2013, all the steel has been put in place for the project with installation of glass and some brick on the outside. Additionally, portions of the center-hung scoreboard have been assembled.

The building held its official topping off ceremony on Friday, Nov. 9, 2012. Construction is set to conclude in time for the 2012-13 season as the building will open Sept. 5, 2013.
