Nittany Lions Host Illinois for Three in Home Finale:

Penn State baseball (24-24, 10-8) hosts the Illinois Fighting Illini in its final home series of the 2012 season beginning on Friday. The Nittany Lions currently sit in a three-way tie for third place in the Big Ten standings and are just a game out of second place. The top six in the conference will play in the Big Ten Tournament in Columbus, Ohio two weeks from now.

Media: Sunday's noon game will air live on the Big Ten Network. All of this weekend's contests can be heard on ESPN Radio 1450 State College with Loren Crispell and Brian Tripp calling the action. Live stats will be available via a Gametracker link on GoPSUsports.com. In addition, fans can follow @psubaseball on Twitter for up-to-the-minute updates.

Most Recently: Penn State is coming off a rain-shortened contest, as it dropped a 7-3 game to the Maryland Terrapins on Wednesday evening in five innings. The game was marked official since 4.5 innings were completed. Senior Sean Deegan cracked his eighth homer of the season and senior Joey DeBernardis drove in two runs in the loss. This comes after Penn State took two of three games from the Minnesota Golden Gophers last weekend in Minneapolis.

Scouting Illinois: Illinois enters the week-end with a 26-21 overall record, a 9-9 mark in Big Ten play, and just a game back of the Nittany Lions in the conference standings. The Illini are a very dangerous team at the plate, hitting .284 collectively as a team and feature a lineup that does not have a batter hitting worse than .262. In fact, the Illinois

lineup has five players that are hitting .280 or better. Jordan Parr leads the way with a .360 batting average, five homers and 39 RBI. Willie Argo leads the way on the bases, as he has stolen 96 career bags, which is fifth all-time in the Big Ten. The Illini rank 34th in the nation in steals and are first in the country in turning double plays (1.34 per game). Illinois will send RHP Kevin Johnson (7-4, 3.79), RHP John Kravetz (7-3, 4.94) and RHP Drasen Johnson (1-0, 6.37) to the mound this weekend.

All-Time vs. the Golden Gophers: Penn State leads the all-time series with a 26-24 record between the two clubs. The Lions are 12-11 in games played in Happy Valley against the Illini. Penn State has won the last two contests, but the last six games between the two teams have been split at three.

Nittany Notes (entering Friday):

- Joey DeBernardis is riding a seven-game hit streak. During the streak, he is 10-for-28 (.357).
- Luis Montesinos has a hit in 13 of his last 17 games. He is 21-for-61 (.344) during that span.
- JC Coban has recorded a hit in nine of the last 10 games he has played.
- Joe Kurrasch sports a 1.91 ERA in Big Ten play this season.

- Dave Walkling hasn't allowed a run since April 14. Over his last 6.1 scoreless innings, Walkling has allowed just five hits, one walk and has punched out 11 hitters.
- Mike Franklin has six strikeouts and just one walk in three relief appearances.
- Sean Deegan is hitting .322 with runners in scoring position and has a team-best 18 two-out RBI.

Quite a Climb: The Nittany Lions have won 11 of their last 15 contests and jumped to two games over .500 this past Saturday. Penn State, which started the season 7-18 overall, has gone 17-7 in its last 24 games and 21-10 in its last 31. The last time a Penn State baseball team was double-digit games under .500 and made it back

to equal or go above .500 was the 2007 squad. That team started the year 2-12, but finished with a 31-26 overall record and a 20-10 mark in Big Ten play.

The Weekend Trio: Penn State will send sophomore Joe Kurrasch (San Juan Capistrano, Calif.) to the mound on Friday, followed by junior Steven Hill (Colleyville, Texas) on Saturday and junior John Walter (Haddonfield, N.J.) on Sunday. Kurrasch has allowed just eight earned runs in his last seven starts, posting an ERA of 2.06 on the season. The sophomore earned a no-decision last Friday, as he went seven strong innings while striking out six. On Saturday, Hill was



dominant on the mound for the Nittany Lions. The junior picked up his fifth win, and his fourth win in his last five starts. Hill went 7.1 innings, striking out seven batters and allowing just seven hits. The one run he gave up was unearned. Walter is growing back to normal form as of late, earning no decisions in his last two starts while striking out nine hitters in just over 10 innings. The trio through their last 15 starts have combined for an 8-4 record and a 2.47 ERA in 98.1 innings, while giving up just 74 hits and striking out 81.

Steranka Chasing the Hits Record:

Jordan Steranka, who sits alone in second place all-time on the Penn State hits list, currently has 279 hits and trails Michael Campo by 16 hits for first. With seven guaranteed games left, this is what Steranka will need to do to break the school hits record:

Hits Needed: 16

Games Remaining: 7

Needs to Average: 2.3 hits

Hits/game this year: 1.4

Last 10 games: 1.2 hits

Steranka is also tied for second place all-time on the Penn State RBI list with 176. Steranka already holds the at bats record and is approaching more including, runs (third), doubles (second, five behind first) and triples (tied for third). With a homer against Iowa, Steranka moved into fifth in the school annals.

Not Your Average Joes: Third baseman Joey DeBernardis has been Penn State's best hitter in conference play. What most do not know though is his extreme amount of success when his teammate Joe Kurrasch starts on

the mound. In games that Kurrasch has started this season, DeBernardis is hitting .452 with seven extra-base hits, six runs and five RBI. DeBernardis sports a 1.256 OPS in those eight games. Penn State's next leading hitter in Kurrasch starts is batting at a .281 clip.

The Great Walls of Medlar: Penn State's pitching staff has done a great job of keeping the ball in the yard this year, giving up just seven long balls. The Nittany Lions have hit 13 homeruns at Medlar Field and have given up none. Penn State has hit 14 homeruns in Big Ten play while allowing just two.

Hill Throws First Penn State No-Hitter in 17 Years: Penn State junior Steven Hill threw a no-hitter in a 2-0 victory over the Iowa Hawkeyes on April 21. Hill is the first Penn State pitcher to throw a no-hitter since Nate Bump did against Duquesne in 1995. Hill is the first Nittany Lion pitcher ever to throw a no-hitter in a Big Ten game. With two outs in the bottom of the ninth and a 1-1 count, Hill forced Jacob Yacinich to ground out to junior shortstop Elliot Searer. Searer made one of many fantastic plays at short on the day by firing a ball to senior Jordan Steranka at first to end the game and make Penn State baseball history. Hill stuck out three batters on the day and allowed a total of just two base runners. The junior threw 105 total pitches, 69 of them for strikes. Hill picked up his fourth consecutive victory and pitched his second complete game of the season. The last Big Ten pitcher to throw a no-hitter was Alex Wimmers of Ohio State in 2009.

Hill Honored Nationally and by the Big Ten: With the no-hitter, Hill has racked up some awards the week of April 23. Hill was named Co-National Pitcher of the Week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers

Association (NCB-WA). This is Penn State baseball's first National Player of the Week award ever. In addition, he was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week. This was Hill's first Pitcher of the Week award since May 16 of last year.

Steranka Tabbed Big Ten Co-Player of the Week: Jordan Steranka was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on April 16.

Steranka picked up a weekly award from the conference for the first time in his career. The last Penn State athlete to be named Player of the Week was Steve Snyder back on May 3, 2010. Steranka came off arguably a career week, as he sported a .571 batting average in four games (eight hits in 14 at bats). He hit three homers and drove in eight runs with an OPS (on base plus slugging) of 2.029. He tied his career-high for home runs on April 14 with two against Michigan. Steranka drove five runs in that game as well, leading Penn State to a 14-1 victory. Steranka gave the Nittany Lions an insurance run with a solo homer in the eighth inning against Michigan on April 15 to give PSU a 6-4 lead.

Wine Wins his 200th: Penn State head coach Robbie Wine earned his 200th career win as Penn State skipper against Michigan. Wine becomes the fifth head coach in school history to eclipse the 200-win plateau, joining Joe Hindelang (389), Joe Bedenk (380), Chuck Medlar (308) and Shorty Stone (216).

Opening the Gates in West Lafayette: After dropping the first two of the series and facing a potential sweep, Penn State closed out the weekend with a season-high 16 runs and 19 hits in a 16-6 victory over the No. 19 Purdue Boilermakers two weekends ago. The Nittany Lions belted four homeruns and had a seven-run third inning. The first four batters in the Nittany Lion lineup collected a total of 11 hits and drove in 10 runs. Senior Sean Deegan started it all with leadoff homerun to begin the game. Senior Jordan Steranka had four hits and drove in three runs. Senior Joey DeBernardis drove in four and belted a two-run homer in the seventh inning. Sophomore Steve Snyder drove in two runs and had three hits as he made his second start of the season in the No. 2 spot. The bottom of the order put together a great performance as well. Sophomore Alex Farkes had a three-hit performance and two RBI, which included a massive home run in the eighth inning. Freshman Aaron Novak belted his second homerun of the season as well. collected two hits and a had a great game defensively in the field. Sophomore Steven Hill picked up his first win of the season as he went 6.2 innings, giving up four runs, three of which were earned. He walked just one batter and struck out three.

More Notes on Game 3 Win at Purdue: The outburst resulted in a number of milestones for some players. Most notably, Alex Farkes homered in his second consecutive game and set or tied career highs five offensive categories. Farkes set career highs in at bats (5) and hits (3) and also tied his career best in runs (2) and RBI (2). Aaron Novak's three RBI that came on his homerun in the third inning are a single-game best for him. In addition, Joey DeBernardis scored a personal best four runs in Sunday's victory. The 16 runs were the most the Nittany Lions have scored since May 1, 2010 when Penn State defeated Michigan State by a score of 22-5.

Solid Pitching Against Nation's No. 1 Offense: Purdue's offense came into the weekend first in the country in hitting, but strong starts from all three Nittany Lion starters dropped Purdue from first to ninth nationally. The Boilermakers scored 18 runs (6.0 per game), which were 2.1 below their season average. Most notably, 10 of those 18 Boilermaker runs were unearned.

Penn State to Have at Least Four Games Televised this Season: The Nittany Lion baseball team will play in four games televised by the BTN starting with the Friday, Apr. 13 matchup against Michigan at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park. PSU's visit to Target Field to play Minnesota will air Saturday, May 5 at 3:00 p.m. as well Illinois' trip to Happy Valley on Sunday, May 13. Penn State's regular season BTN finale at Michigan State is scheduled for Saturday, May 19 at Noon. Should the Nittany Lions return to the Big Ten Tournament for a second consecutive season, their games will once again be shown live on Big Ten Net-

work throughout the week of May 23-27.

Hill Earns Preseason Honors from College Sports Madness: Penn State junior pitcher Steven Hill has been named to the College Sports Madness Big Ten Preseason All-Conference Second Team. Hill is coming off a stellar 2011 season, as he was named Second Team All-Big Ten and Academic All-Big Ten. During 2011, Hill fired four complete games, which equals the total posted by every other Penn State pitcher since the beginning of the 2009 season. His year was highlighted by a pair of shutouts after he blanked Northwestern, 12-0, on April 9 before firing another gem against Minnesota during a 7-0 victory on May 13. In his 15 starts last year, he posted a 6-5 record, including three wins during conference action. Hill held his opposition to three or fewer runs during 10 starts. Incredibly accurate, he averaged just 1.01 walks-per-nine innings, which stood as the 15th best rate in the nation. Overall, he issued just 12 free passes during the year.
