Up to Bat: Penn State's Big Ten Baseball tournament hopes are still alive, as the Nittany Lions will conclude the regular season with a three-game series at Purdue starting Thursday at 5 p.m. live on the Big Ten Network. Friday's 5:30 p.m. game will be broadcast on BTN Plus, and the series finale will start at 1 p.m. Saturday. Audio for all three games will air on State College's ESPN 1450 and GoPSUsports.com

The Road to Target Field: Barring any games being canceled, **IF** Penn State wins all three games over Purdue **AND** No. 2 Illinois extends it winning streak to 27 by defeating Nebraska three times **AND** Minnesota loses at least one game to Michigan State, the Lions will slip into the tournament by a half-game over Nebraska and Minnesota.

All-Time Series vs. Purdue: The Nittany Lions and Boilermakers have met 71 times on the diamond all-time, with Purdue holding a 42-29 advantage. Penn State won two out of three last season after winning just two of the previous 10 matchups. The Lions are 14-23 all-time in West Lafayette.

Purdue at a Glance: The Boilermakers are last in the Big Ten but took two-of-three from Nebraska over the weekend after winning just two of 18 league games prior this season. It was also their first B1G series win since 2013. The Nebraska series was pushed back a day, so Purdue ended up playing four games in four days when it traveled to Valparaiso Tuesday, but the Boilermakers won, 6-4, to extend their winning streak to three games. Kyle Wood and Kyle Johnson lead the team with .332 and .283 batting averages, while both have six home runs and 32 RBIs each.

Last Time Out: The Lions won the series opener over Michigan State Friday, but suffered a pair of heartbreaking losses Saturday and Sunday. LHP **Nick Hedge** went 6 1/3 innings, allowing just eight hits and three runs (one earned) in the Friday, 5-3 win. Late miscues were costly Saturday and Sunday though, as the Spartans rallied for a 5-4 walk-off win Saturday, and scored three runs in the seventh inning for a 3-1 win Sunday. RHP **Dakota Forsyth** worked a career-high 6 2/3 innings, allowing the three runs on six hits and a walk with two strikeouts. Forsyth would have escaped the seventh unscathed though if the Lions had successfully turned a routine double play. LHP Jeff Kinley (4-2) was stellar on the mound as well for Michigan State, allowing just one run on three hits and two walks in seven innings of work with five strikeouts

Blue and White Submarine: RHP **Jack Anderson** has established himself as Penn State's top pitcher, impacting games with strong innings out of the bullpen. His 2.38 ERA leads the team and ranks seventh in the Big Ten, while his 53 innings pitched rank second on the team. With 12 career saves, he is third in program history. Drew O'Neil (2007-08) is the record holder, while Clint Eury (2002-05) is second with 15.

Anderson Again: RHP **Jack Anderson** was called upon in six consecutive

games from 4/29-5/9. He threw 14.0 IP, posted a 1.93 ERA and 1-1 record with three saves and struck out seven, while allowing eight hits, four runs, three earned runs, four walks and two hit batsmen. The unearned run resulted in his only loss.

Anderson Again, Part 2: With a career-high 27 appearances on the season entering the weekend, **Jack Anderson** ranks in a tie with Jeff Emerich (1995) for the fourth most in a Penn State single season. The record is 36, held by David Lutz (2010). Matt Ogrodnik (29, 2007; 28, 2006) owns both second and third on the list. Anderson has 67 career appearances, tying Greg Young (1987-90) for fifth all-time at Penn State. Greg Welsh (2011-14) is next on the list with 68 career appearances, then Ogrodnik (74, 2005-07), Emerich (76, 1993-96), and Lutz (85, 2007-10)

Streiking: **Greg Guers** saw his team-best 16-game hitting streak end at Michigan State (5/14). He hit .348 with two doubles, a triple, five home runs, 16 RBIs and five stolen bases. **Aaron Novak** had previously tallied the longest hitting streaks on the team. From Mar. 27-Apr. 12, he tallied hits in 11-straight games, going 17-for-46 (.370) with three doubles and five RBIs, a .420 on-base percentage and .500 slugging percentage. From Feb. 14 (Game 2) at Elon to Mar. 11 at No. 7 South Carolina, Novak assembled a nine-game hitting streak, batting .548

(17-for-31) with three homers, three doubles and 10 RBIs. His on-base percentage was .611 and his slugging percentage was .935.

Kendall Heating Up: Tyler Kendall has made the most of his chance to start the past 12 games. Although his 11-game hitting streak came to an end Sunday, Kendall has batted .354 with his first career home run, two doubles and six RBIs.

Powering Up: Penn State hit just four home runs in its first 22 games, but with eight home runs from Greg Guers, another from classmate Aaron Novak and first career home runs from Nick Riotto, Tyler Kendall and Christian Helsel, PSU has totaled 12 since April began. The Lions only sent five out of the park last season. Guers homered twice in 2014 and was the only Nittany Lion to go deep in spacious Medlar Field, doing so once.

Haley's Comets: Shortstop Jim Haley is Penn State's leading hitter in conference play, batting .346. He has raised his overall average from .265 to .305 over the last seven games, going 15-for-30 (.500) with six doubles a triple, three RBIs and 12 runs scored.

Super Novak: Aaron Novak has been Penn State's top hitter for the season, ranking 14th in the conference in batting (.339). Novak has two four hit games. At Charleston Southern (3/8), Novak became the fourth Nittany Lion to tally eight RBIs in a game (first since 1984), as he tallied two home runs and doubled as part of a 4-for-5 day at the plate. The totals were career highs, and his eight RBIs matched a team record. He also went 4-for-4 in the series opener with CCSU (3/27).

Rotation Change: RHP Dakota Forsyth pitched has pitched the past two Sundays in lieu of RHP Nick Distasio. Distasio had started each weekend this season with the exception of the Indiana weekend when one game was lost to weather. Forsyth has a 3.75 ERA in 12.0 innings pitched the past two weekends.

Rookies on the Mound: Penn State has used nine first-year pitchers so far this season, and they have combined to account for just under half of the innings pitched this season. Up until last week against Rutgers, the Lion rotation included two freshmen, Taylor

Lehman and Nick Distasio. Distasio has since been moved into a relief role. Freshmen Sal Biasi and Marko Boricich are both tied for second on the team with 17 appearances out of the bullpen.

Sacrificing Senior: With 11 career sacrifice flies, Taylor Skerpon ranks in a tie for third all-time at PSU with Dave Hal (1990-94). Cory Wine (2006-09) and Mike DeRenzo (1999-03) hold the record with 13. Skerpon's 25 career sacrifice bunts rank in a three-way tie for third in school history.

Turn It!: Led by the stellar middle infield duo of SS Jim Haley and 2B Taylor Skerpon, the Nittany Lions are fourth in the nation with 1.13 double plays per game, turning a total of 52. They turned four in a 12-inning win at Pittsburgh (3/17).

300: With 299 Big Ten wins, Penn State is nearing its 300th in 24 seasons in the conference.

Break Out the Brooms: PSU earned its first three-game series sweep since May 2012 against Illinois after taking three from Central Connecticut. The sweep of Rutgers marked Penn State's first B1G sweep since the aforementioned Illinois sweep. Trailing Rutgers, 9-1 entering the bottom of the fourth inning of the Saturday game, Penn State scored 11 runs over the next three innings for its largest comeback win of the season to defeat Rutgers, 12-10. PSU scored seven runs in the bottom of the fourth to key the comeback, highlighted by a bases-clearing triple by Greg Guers. The Nittany Lions matched their season high of 18 hits previously set in the season opener, led by Jim Haley, who went 4-for-5 with a triple, double, two singles and three runs scored.

Walk it Off: A perfectly executed hit-and-run in the bottom of the ninth inning scored Jim Haley from third base on an infield single by Ryky Smith, giving Penn State an 8-7 victory and the home-and-home series sweep over Pittsburgh. Penn State was one strike away from sealing a 7-5 victory in the top of the ninth, but Pitt's Eric Hess singled to right field to drive in two runs, tying the game at 7-7.

Close Doesn't Count: The Lions' win over Pitt snapped a frustrating skid in close games. PSU was 0-6 this season in one-run

games and 2-12 in two-run games before the first walk-off victory of the season.

Dominate the State: Penn State went 5-0 against in-state foes this season. PA-native Greg Guers was the hero in the first two, as he drove in the go-ahead runs in the eighth against Villanova, and the deciding runs at Pitt, tying it in the third with an RBI-double, and then singling with runners on the corners in the 12th. The Lions swept Bucknell in a two-games series, with RHP Tom Mullin earning the win in both, once in relief and once with the start. A walk-off infield single by Ryky Smith completed a series sweep of Pitt.

Single Non-Single: Penn State totaled 15 hits against Pitt, of which all were singles with the exception of Greg Guers' solo home run in the eighth inning. Ten of the 11 Nittany Lion batters used in the game recorded a hit, with the lone exception being catcher Nick Graham, who drew the Lions' only two walks on the night. Conversely, seven of Pitt's 13 hits on the night went for extra bases. However, four errors in the field proved costly in spotting PSU a pair of unearned runs.

It doesn't have to be pretty: RHP Jared Fagnano: Failed to get his first career save against Pitt (4/29), but ended up with his first career win. He yielded the game-tying runs in the top of the ninth, but PSU won in the bottom of the ninth.



Midweek Success: Penn State went 8-3 in midweek games this season, winning its last five. Two of the losses were at a then-No. 7 ranked South Carolina.

Bonus Baseball: The Lions are giving fans their money's worth this season, with two 12-inning games and a 15-inning game. Last season, PSU played just one extra inning in a 4-3 win at Gardner-Webb in the finale of the opening series.

Illini Extend Streak: Penn State suffered a three-game sweep against No. 8 Illinois. Penn State's best chance to take a victory was Saturday, the Lions battled the Illini for 15 innings.

Rare Start: Penn State scored nine runs in the first inning and **Taylor Skerpon** went 4-for-5 as the Nittany Lions defeated Kent State, 15-5 (4/21). PSU scored six runs before recording an out, sending 13 batters to the plate in the first. The Nittany Lions scored the 15 runs on 15 hits, seven walks and three errors.

Web Gem: **Taylor Skerpon's** diving grab of a line drive in the series finale against Minnesota made ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 plays. The play was ranked No. 3 until a slam dunk by Blake Griffin knocked it down to fourth in the morning edition.

Big Road Win: **James Coates** scored twice and drove in one run and RHP **Jack Anderson** pitched 3 2/3 innings to earn the save, as Penn State defeated West Virginia, 5-3 Tuesday evening in Monongalia County Ballpark. RHP **Dakota Forsyth** made his first start of the season, pitching four-plus innings and allowing just one run on three hits and two walks with two strikeouts. Coates (3-for-4) and left fielder **Greg Guers** 2-for-4 accounted for five of Penn State's eight hits in the game.

Weather Woes: Penn State has lost five games due to winter weather and one to rain this season. The Lions were scheduled to participate in the USA Baseball/Irish Classic Feb. 27-Mar. 1 in Cary, N.C., but snow forced the cancelation of the entire series. A late-season snow storm only allowed Penn State to face No. 21 Indiana on Sunday, forcing a doubleheader and one cancelation. Snow Mar. 31 cancelled a home game against Binghamton, and Lafayette elected to not

make the trip to University Park Apr. 8 due to the threat of inclement weather.

Breakout Game for Freshmen: Against CCSU in a Sunday doubleheader (3/29) **Taylor Lehman** turned in the finest performance of his young career, carrying a no-hitter through 5 1/3 innings and striking out a collegiate-best eight in a collegiate-high seven innings pitched, allowing just one hit. In the second game, **Nick Distasio** threw a collegiate-best six shutout innings, yielding just four hits and a walk with five strikeouts.

Late Inning Heroics: **Greg Guers** doubled to center in a 1-2 count with two outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the eighth inning to drive in the go-ahead runs for Penn State in a 5-2 victory over Villanova (3/25). **Ryky Smith** then doubled in an 0-2 count with two outs in the eighth inning of the very next game against CCSU (3/27) to break another 2-2 game open with three RBIs. RHP **Jack Anderson** earned the win in both, while RHP **Sal Biasi** earned the save in both.

Nine up, Nine Down: **Sal Biasi** struck out nine consecutive batters over two appearances to earn Big Ten Baseball Co-Freshman of the Week honors (3/16-23). Biasi made his first appearance of the week in the Nittany Lions' home opener Wednesday against Canisius, striking out the side in one inning of work. He then entered the first game against No. 21 Indiana Sunday in the eighth inning with a runner on third base, two outs and a tie score. He struck out that batter and the next five he faced, ultimately pitching through the 11th inning and not yielding a run. For the week he posted a line of 4 1/3 innings pitched, one hit, no runs allowed, three walks and nine strikeouts.

Milestone Win: The Nittany Lion faithful that braved the cold were rewarded with a thrilling doubleheader against No. 21 Indiana, as PSU went 12 innings in the first game, a 5-4 defeat, but rallied from a 7-0 deficit in the second game to win, 13-7. The bullpen yielded two

runs in 12 innings. The Hoosiers had won eight-straight over the Lions and their last 12 overall. PSU was 0-6 in games against nationally-ranked opponents this season and had dropped its last 12. Previously, PSU's most recent win was over No. 19 Purdue on April 1, 2012. It was also the Lions first ranked win at home since defeating No. 24 Pittsburgh on April 13, 2010. For the day, PSU got big performances offensively from **Jim Haley**, who went 6-for-11 with a double and three-RBI triple, **Christian Helsel**, who went 4-for-8 with four RBIs and two walks, and **Aaron Novak**, who went 3-for-8 with three RBIs and three walks.

Strange but True: Penn State's 13-unanswered run, eight Hoosier error, come-from-behind victory over Indiana was far from the typical baseball game: IU made two errors in the sixth, four errors in the seventh and two more errors in the 8th ... Penn State scored four runs on two hits and four errors in the seventh inning, and seven runs on five hits and two errors in the eighth ... both errors in the eighth were on balls put in play by **Alex Malinsky**, allowing him to reach twice on an error in the same inning ... Not as fortunate as Malinsky, **Nick Riotto** recorded two of the three outs with a ground out and fly out, as PSU sent 13 batters to the plate in the inning.

The Whiff: The Nittany Lions struck out 16 batters in their home opener against Canisius, their most since April 8, 2005 at Northwestern when they also struck out 16.

Close, but Not Quite: Penn State lost three games at the Liberty Invitational (3/13-15) by a total of four runs. The Lions suffered a 4-2 setback in the opener against Western Carolina, and then dropped two against Liberty by one run. PSU lost a three-run lead Saturday before battling back and tying the game as **Ryan Richter** hit a two RBI-triple. However, a hit batsmen forced in the winning-run in the bottom of the ninth for the Flames. The Lions were unable to make an early 1-0 lead last beyond the seventh inning Sunday, ultimately surrendering a pair of runs in the eighth that proved to be the difference. PSU scratched one run across in the ninth, but was unable to force the bottom of the ninth.

Put'em On the Board: The 18 runs scored at Charleston Southern were the most for the Lions since April 24, 2010 against Ohio State. Thirteen of the 18 runs scored came with two outs.

11 Signees for 2016: Head coach Rob Cooper received National Letters of Intent from 11 signees, in November. The class, which will begin participation in the 2015-16 academic year, includes five pitchers, three infielders, two outfielders and a catcher. It is ranked No. 44 nationally by Perfect Game.

Rob Cooper enters his second season at the helm in 2015. He was selected as the 14th head coach in Penn State history on August 9, 2013. He came to Happy Valley after nine seasons as the manager at Wright State.

In his first season in 2014, the team posted 18 wins. In a game against Michigan State on May 16, the Nittany Lions became just the second team in NCAA Division I history to turn two triple plays in a game. In the classroom, 15 of Cooper's student-athletes earned 2014 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Since joining the Penn State family, Cooper has already achieved great success in the coaching world. Shortly after Cooper accepted the PSU head coaching position, the California native traveled to Taichung, Taiwan to serve as the head coach of USA Baseball's 18U National Team at the IBAF U18 World Cup. Cooper steered Team USA to an 8-1 record in World Cup play, including seven consecutive victories to win the gold medal. Not long after the triumph, Cooper received one of the highest honors bestowed in the profession, as he was announced as the Rod Dedeaux USA Baseball Coach of the Year. With the honor, Cooper became just the 16th individual in the award's history to receive the accolade, joining the likes of Scott Brosius, Davey Johnson and Tommy Lasorda.

Prior to arriving in Happy Valley, Cooper took over a Wright State team that had six losing seasons in a seven-year span. Cooper methodically built Wright State into a perennial contender in the Horizon League with seven 30-win seasons, two Horizon League regular-season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and six Horizon League Championship game appearances. In nine seasons, Cooper accumulated a 286-230 record as the Wright State manager. Over the course of his career at Wright State, he guided the Raiders to a pair of wins over No. 1-ranked opponents in Virginia (3/5/10) and Georgia (3/24/09).

During his tenure with the Raiders, Cooper saw 47 players earn all-conference accolades and 18 garner all-newcomer honors. He has also produced five Horizon League Players of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, three Relief Pitchers of the Year and two Newcomers of the Year. Additionally, Cooper has found success for his players on a professional level, with 21 WSU players signing professional contracts, including seven Major League Baseball Draft picks.

The 2011 season saw Cooper record his 200th coaching victory with an 8-2 decision at home over Youngstown State on March 26. The Raiders won their second-straight Horizon League regular season title with a 16-7 record, claimed the league tournament crown by winning three-straight games and advanced to the NCAA Regionals in College Station, Texas. Cooper won his second-straight Horizon League Coach of the Year award and seven players were named to the All-Horizon League teams. The Raiders claimed

three of four postseason awards.

The 2009 Wright State Raiders compiled a 33-30 overall record, including an 8-5 victory at No. 1 ranked Georgia on March 24. The schedule included four teams ranked among the Top 25 and a handful of national powers that received votes during the season. WSU claimed victories over national contenders Tulane, Kent State and UNC-Wilmington on the road, while facing the No. 1 team five times during the season (four games at Texas A&M, one game at Georgia).

In 2007, Wright State enjoyed one of the most prolific offensive seasons in school history as it broke three career records and 11 single-season school records. Ross Oeder, now a Penn State assistant coach on Cooper's staff, was named the Horizon League Player of the Year.

The 2006 edition of the Raiders set six school records and posted the most season wins in five years. During the '06 slate, Cooper's squad defeated nationally-ranked TCU on the road, topped national-powerhouse Notre Dame in South Bend and was on the brink of an upset against eventual national champion Oregon State in the NCAA Corvallis Regional.

Before WSU, Cooper served as the hitting coach, recruiting coordinator and bench coach at Oral Roberts University. A perennial power of the Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League), ORU advanced to the finals of the NCAA Austin Regional in 2004, beating TCU twice and losing to top-seeded Texas 7-3, and 7-5. The Golden Eagles, who finished with an overall mark of 50-11.

Cooper began his coaching career at national power Miami (Fla.), spending two seasons (1994-95) as a student/graduate assistant on the Hurricanes' staff. While at Miami, Cooper helped lead the Hurricanes to College World Series berths in 1994 and 1995. Cooper spent the 1996 season as an assistant and team academic coordinator at Wake Forest, then moved on to Tulane for the next two seasons, serving as the Green Wave's hitting coach. During his tenure as an assistant coach at Miami and Tulane, his teams advanced to NCAA Tournaments in 1994-95 (Miami) and 1998 (Tulane). In 1997, the Green Wave won the Conference USA regular-season crown.

Cooper left Tulane following the 1998 season and returned to Sacramento City College, where he starred in the early 1990's before lettering at Miami in 1993. In his first season at Sac City, Cooper helped guide SCC to the California Community College State Tournament championship. Sac City was then the runner-up in 2002.

Along with his college coaching experience, Cooper also was an associate scout for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 1990-92 and has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

Cooper earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Miami in 1994 and a master's in sports sciences/administration from Miami in 1996. He is married to his wife, Maureen, and has two sons, Jake and Tyson.
