**Coach Washington's Availability**  
 All interview requests for head coach Coquese Washington should be directed to Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will hold weekly press conferences during the season. A schedule is available by calling the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

**Player Interviews**

All player interviews must be arranged through Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Coquese Washington's weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off.

Player phone numbers will not be released.

Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the post-game media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

**Credentials**

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Greg Campbell, the women's basketball contact. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8.

Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

**Photographers**

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Greg Campbell (gxc35@psu.edu), one week in advance for photo passes.

Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

**Radio Networks**

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided one phone line and one ISDN line.

**Press Row Seating**

Please allow several minutes when taking the elevator to the press room or the media room. When leaving the elevator, turn right. The press area is at Portal 23. Iowa's Erinn Reed got a shot off to tie the game, but it rimmed out.

January 21, 1997 | Iowa City, Iowa

// Iowa's Tiffany Gooden hit a jumper over Jamie Parsons to give the Hawkeyes a 60-58 lead with 3.2 seconds left in regulation. However, Tara Macciocco had other ideas as she connected on a 25-foot buzzer-beater to give the Lady Lions a 61-60 win at Carver-Hawkeye Arena to snap a five-game losing streak in the venue. Macciocco finished the game with 21 points in 31 minutes, while Angie Potthoff had 15 points, 15 rebounds and four steals.

February 1, 2009 | Iowa City, Iowa

// The Lady Lions and the Hawkeyes tangled in a battle for the ages at Carver-Hawkeye Arena as the squads combined for the longest women's basketball game in arena history, a 97-89 triple overtime win for Iowa. The Lions rallied from 11 points down with 6:01 remaining to force the first extra frame and had a chance to win the game in the first overtime with Janessa Wolff at the line with nine seconds left, but the sophomore was unable to make either attempt. After a back-and-forth second overtime, the Hawkeyes dominated the third extra period, scoring the first eight points and 10 of the 12 tallies the period. Tyra Grant tied her career high with 33 points to go along with five rebounds, four assists and two blocks.

// Through 27 games, true freshman **Teniya Page** has moved herself into some rare company among rookies in Penn State history.

// At Northwestern (2/17), Page become the third PSU freshman to ever score 400 points and hand out 100 assists as a rookie. She joins Suzie McConnell (415p, 321a) and Corinne Gulas (411p, 235a) on the list.

// The rookie currently ranks No. 5 on Penn State's freshman scoring list with 422 points and is No. 8 on the rookie assist charts with 106.

**NCAA Rookie Ranks**

// Freshman **Teniya Page** is having an outstanding freshman campaign for the Lady Lions and is among the top rookies in the NCAA.

// Page is the only Division I freshman to average at least 15 points and 3.5 assists per game this season. She sits No. 8 among rookie scorers at 15.6 ppg and No. 12 among freshman in assists with 3.9 app.

// Her 106 assists are 13th nationally and make her the only rookie in the NCAA with 400 points and 100 assists this season.

// Of the 16 freshmen to crack the 100-assist mark, Page ranks No. 3 in fewest turnovers with 72 on the season.

// Page also ranks among the overall NCAA leaders in a variety of statistical categories, sitting among the top-125 in assists (108th), total points (115th), free throw attempted (99th) and made (91st), as well as minutes played per game (9th).

**Page in Crunch Time**

// In the fourth quarter in Penn State's five Big Ten wins, freshman **Teniya Page** is averaging 6.6 points per game (33 points).

// The rookie is shooting 11-of-17 from the floor (.647), including 3-of-4 from three-point range. She has also hit 8-of-11 free throws (.727).

// In her first career Big Ten game, Page scored seven points, handed out one assist and didn't turn the ball over in the fourth quarter to help the Lady Lions to a win over then-No. 14 Northwestern.

// At Michigan State, Page scored eight points in the final 2:50 of the fourth quarter - including the go-ahead jumper with 1:01 remaining - to help PSU rally from a 14-point third quarter deficit for the win.

// At Illinois, Page scored 13 fourth quarter points to help PSU complete the come-from-behind win.

// She played 48 minutes in those five games, handing out five assists to three turnovers.

// Overall in the fourth quarter of Big Ten games, Page is 27-of-72 (.375) from the field and 9-of-19 (.474) from three-point range. She also has 14 assists, seven steals and 11 turnovers in 16 games.

**Page Among Top Rookie Elite (Pt. 2)**

// Page's 31 points vs. Michigan make her just the fifth freshman in school history to ever post a 30-point game.

// Page's .423 three-point shooting percentage would rank No. 4 on the freshman list and No. 8 on the single season charts (min. 50 attempts).

// Her 37.6 minutes per game are tied for No. 2 on the career charts, and ranks No. 1 on the freshman list. Her mark is two minutes more than Jess Strom (2001-02) played in her freshman season, which ranks No. 2 on the rookie charts.

**Going the Distance**

// Freshman **Teniya Page** played every minute over a four-game stretch from Jan. 30 - Feb. 11 for Penn State.

// She played 50 minutes vs. Purdue, and 40 minutes at Nebraska, vs. Rutgers and at Michigan State.

// On the season, Page has six games of at least 40 minutes this season, including playing all 50 minutes in a double overtime contest vs. Purdue on Jan. 30.

// This season, Page has played at least 38 minutes in 16 of 27 games.

// **Perspective:** Page's 16 games of at least 38 minutes are more than the rest of the team combined. Only four other players (12 times) have played at least 38 minutes in a game, with only three other 40-plus minute efforts.

// Page has not fouled out of a game this season, reaching four fouls in only six times. She is averaging 2.1 fouls per game.

**On the Right Page**

// True freshman **Teniya Page** reached double figures in the scoring column in each of her first eight career games, a feat not accomplished by Penn State's top two career scoring leaders, Kelly Mazzante and Maggie Lucas.

// Against Michigan on Jan. 17, Page netted 31 points to become just the fifth freshman in program history to eclipse the 30-point mark in a game.

// Her six 20-point games lead the team lead.

// Page opened her career with seven straight 10-plus point, four-plus assist efforts and has 15 such efforts this season, including a 10-point, career-high eight-assist outing at Northwestern (2/17).

// Page is one of just three freshmen nationally averaging better than 37 minutes per game. Her 37.30 average leads the Big Ten and is No. 9 in the NCAA.

- // The Victorville, Calif., native enjoyed a 13-game streak with at least on blocked shot in 2014-15. She rejected shots in each game from Jan. 6 - Feb. 26, 2015.
- // Agee recorded a career-high five blocks in a win over Rider on Dec. 14, 2014.
- // Agee is looking to become just the 10th player in Penn State history to register 1.0 blocks per game for a career. She is currently at 1.00 bpg.

### Spann Finds Her Stride

- // After leading the team in scoring last season as a redshirt-freshman, **Lindsey Spann** reached double digits just twice in her first six games.
- // After her two-point performance vs. BYU, Spann reached the 10-point mark in five straight games, including a pair of 20-point efforts.
- // Spann has scored 10-plus points in 19 of her last 22 games, including three 20-point efforts and one 30-point game.
- // Her first 20-point effort of the season came vs. Virginia Tech on Dec. 3, pouring in 20 points before adding 23 points vs. Sacred Heart on Dec. 20.
- // She reached the 20-point mark in Big Ten play for the first time in 2015-16 and third time in her career with 21 tallies against No. 6/7 Ohio State.
- // Spann's seven three-pointers at Minnesota are the most in a single game this season for Penn State.
- // She connected on at least two three-pointers in six straight games from Jan. 10 - Jan. 27, before going 0-for-3 against Purdue (1/30).

### Mitchell's Double Digit Streak

- // After not reaching the scoring column in the season opener vs. Holy Cross, junior **Kaliyah Mitchell** secured double figures in each of the next five games.
- // She has 15 double-figure scoring games this season after notching 12 points at Michigan (2/20) and ranks fourth on the team with 9.9 points per game.
- // Mitchell led the team in scoring at USF with 18 points, just two points shy of her career-best effort.
- // Mitchell posted her first double-double of the season on Tuesday, Dec. 8 against Youngstown State with 16 points and a game-high 12 boards.
- // The junior added 15 points and 11 rebounds on Dec. 20 vs. Sacred Heart for her second double-double of the year.
- // Her 10-point, 11-rebound effort against Purdue was her third double-double of the season and the eighth of her career.

Banks Depositing 20's

- // Senior **Brianna Banks** is making the most of her only season on the court for the Blue and White, posting 20 double-digit scoring games in 25 tries.
- // Banks reached the 10-point mark in 12 straight games from Dec. 6 - Jan. 23, before she had just eight points vs. No. 5/5 Maryland.
- // She poured in 22 points and added a career-high-tying seven rebounds in a double-overtime loss to Purdue on Jan. 30.
- // The Big Ten opener featured a 25-point, seven rebound, three steal effort for the Newnan, Ga. native.
- // On Dec. 12 at St. Bonaventure, Banks netted a career-best 26 points on a personal-best 10 field goals.
- // She made her Penn State debut on Nov. 13 vs. Holy Cross and promptly tied her then-career-high with 20 points, following that with a 22-point showing against Fordham.
- // Banks has reached double figures in 20 of the 23 games she has completed, missing most of four games due to injury.
- // Her five 20-point games are tied for second on the team this season (Spann). She entered the season with just one 20-point game on her resume.

Bucking The Trends

- // Penn State kicked a couple of trends during Big Ten play, including earning its first wins of the season away from home.
- // The win at Iowa on Jan. 20 was the first road win of the season for the Lady Lions, who also won the first game of 2016, snapping a five game losing streak.
- // The win at Iowa was the first time Penn State led wire-to-wire in a Big Ten game since beating Minnesota, 83-53, on Jan. 26, 2014.
- // Penn State won its first game in 2015-16 when being out rebounded in a game. The Lady Lions entered the game 0-9 when losing the battle of the boards.
- // The Lady Lions had been 0-11 when tied or trailing on the scoreboard with 5:00 to play before rallying for the win at Illinois on Jan. 23. PSU trailed by two points, 51-49, when the clock hit 5:00 in left in the game.
- // Trailing by 11 with 5:11 to play in the third quarter, Penn State rallied for the win at Illinois. It was the first double-digit deficit overcome for Penn State since rallying from the same margin (11) vs. Wichita State on March 23, 2014.
- // Ironically, the last time Penn State trailed by 10-plus points before coming back to win a Big Ten contest was Jan. 9, 2014 at Illinois (down by 12 at 12:46 in 1st half). They eventually claimed an 82-76 decision.

- // The Lady Lion program has been honored as the Play 4 Kay Division I initiative winner twice in program history, winning the award in 2013 and 2014.

More Than Just a Game

- // The Lady Lions own a 6-4 record in Pink Zone at Penn State games, including a five-game winning streak from 2010-2014.
- // Pink Zone at Penn State has raised over \$1.5 million in funds through its first 10 games, including a record \$310,000 in 2014.
- // The event began in 2007 with \$20,490 raised and 31 cancer survivors in attendance and has grown into an event that annually raises over \$200,000 (five straight years) and welcomes over 600 cancer survivors.
- // In 2016, Penn State has currently raised \$161,000 (final total announced later this year) and 640 cancer survivors joined the Lady Lions in the BJC.

// Penn State rallied from double-digit deficits twice this season in Big Ten play, with both comebacks happening on the road.

// Penn State trailed by 11 points, 35-24, with 5:11 to play in the third quarter at Illinois on Jan. 23, 2016 before rallying for a 65-56 win over the Illini.

// Over the last 15 minutes, Penn State outscored Illinois, 41-21, to earn the come-from-behind victory.

// The Lady Lions connected on 12-of-16 shots (75.0%) from the field over the final 15 minutes of the game after shooting just 8-of-35 (22.8%) from the field over the first 25 minutes.

// Trailing 42-28 with 7:25 to play in the third quarter, Penn State began its comeback at No. 15/17 Michigan State.

// Penn State shot 12-of-33 (.363) with 12 turnovers in the first 24 minutes. The Blue and White connected on 15-of-25 shots (.600) with only three turnovers during the final 16 minutes.

// **Teniya Page** stepped up when the Lady Lions needed her most, as she netted eight points in the final 2:50 of the fourth quarter, including the go-ahead jumper with 1:01 left in the fourth quarter.

**B1G Highlights**

// Penn State is in its 24th season as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

// The Lady Lions own an all-time mark of 252-144 in conference play.

// All-time, Penn State is 147-52 at home in Big Ten conference games, while owning a 105-92 mark in road games.

// Penn State's eight regular season championships since 1992-93 are the most won by any Big Ten team. Ohio State (7) and Purdue (6) are next on the list.

// The Lady Lions also own a pair of Big Ten Tournament titles, winning in 1995 & 1996.

// Freshman **Teniya Page** earned her first career weekly honor when she was tabbed as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 4, 2016.

// The rookie posted a pair of double-digit scoring efforts, including a career-high 27 points in the Lady Lions' conference opening victory over No. 14/15 Northwestern. She added a 16-point effort at Minnesota.

// Penn State owns an overall mark of 333-200 against the current members of the Big Ten, including an overall winning record against 10 of the 13 teams in the conference.

// Her senior season included just six games - averaging 21.5 points per game - before she was sidelined due to injury, however, her efforts still earned her McDonald's All-America honors and was the No. 23 ranked player in the country according to ESPN/HoopGurlz.

// Boykin's career also included extensive USA Basketball experience, including three gold medals in international competition. Boykin won gold at the 3-on-3 competition at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games in Nanjing, China. She started all seven games for Team USA at the 2014 FIBA U-17 World Championships and started all five games at the 2013 FIBA Americas U-16 Championships, winning gold medals at both competitions.

# COQUESE WASHINGTON

Head Coach • Ninth Season  
Notre Dame '92 • Flint, Mich.



Coquese Washington enters her ninth season at the helm of the Penn State women's basketball program. She was introduced as the fifth head coach in the history of the program on April 23, 2007 and is the first female African-American head coach in Penn State history.

The recruiting trail was once again fruitful for the Lady Lions, as Washington and her staff inked its fourth top-25 class and third top-15 class since arriving in Happy Valley. The class featured a pair of five-star guards and two highly recruited post players, earning the No. 15 ranking from ESPN.com/HoopGurlz. The crop of newcomers also got a boost from Connecticut transfer Brianna Banks, who sat out 2014-15 due to NCAA transfer rules.

The 2014-15 season saw the emergence of a pair of first-year players for Penn State, guards Lindsey Spann and honorable-mention All-Big Ten guard Sierra Moore. Spann, who missed 2013-14 due to injury, stepped right into a starting role and responded with double-figure scoring games in each of her first eight career contests, a feat not accomplished by Penn State's top two career scoring leaders, Kelly Mazzante and Maggie Lucas. She ended the season ranked No. 7 on the Penn State freshmen scoring list, with her 37 made three-pointers ranking No. 6 all-time on the freshmen charts. Moore enjoyed success in her first season in the blue and white, starting all 30 games and averaging a team-best 34 minutes per game. Moore ranked among the team leaders in nearly every category, averaging 12.1 points, 5.1 rebounds, 3.8 assists, 1.2 steals and 0.5 blocks per game.

Washington led the 2013-14 Lady Lion squad to a feat that no other Penn State team has accomplished, winning three consecutive conference regular-season titles with a 13-3 record in Big Ten action. Led by the play of a strong senior class, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the second time in three years. The graduating class of Maggie Lucas, Ariel Edwards, Dara Taylor and Talia East produced 101 wins, which is the second-highest total by a Lady Lion class. The Lady Lions finished the season 13th in the Associated Press poll and 14th in the USA Today Sports Coaches' Poll.

Along the way to collecting her second Big Ten Player of the Year award, Lucas finished second in school history and fourth in Big Ten history in scoring (2,510) and broke the Penn State and Big Ten records for career three-pointers made (365) and career free throw percentage (.907). She was selected in the second round of the 2014 WNBA Draft by the Phoenix Mercury. Edwards became the 36th member of the 1,000-point club en route to collecting All-Big Ten first team accolades. She finished seventh in the Big Ten in scoring (15.7) and was 11th in free throw percentage (.814). Edwards signed a free agent contract with the WNBA's Tulsa Shock. Taylor also had a stellar senior campaign and collected the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year award after leading the conference in steals. East also earned postseason honors as she was named All-Big Ten honorable mention. In addition, Washington was honored with her third consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year honor.

The Lady Lions continued their run in the national spotlight in 2012-13 as they collected their second-straight Big Ten regular-season title and seventh overall with a 26-6 overall record and 14-2 mark in conference play. In each of Washington's first six years, Penn State improved its Big Ten win total. The Lady Lions posted their third consecutive 25-win season, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat. Penn State also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a win over Cal Poly. The Lady Lions were consistently ranked in the Top 10 for most of the season and finished eighth in the Associated Press Top 25 and 12th in the USA Today Sports Coaches' Poll.

With another stellar campaign, the accolades

continued to roll in for the Lady Lions. Washington was selected as the Big Ten Coach of the Year by the media for the second-straight season and became just the fifth mentor in Big Ten history to win back-to-back Coach of the Year accolades. She was also the WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year and a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year for the second-straight season.

The awards also piled up for Penn State's dynamic backcourt of Lucas and Alex Bentley. Lucas was selected as the Big Ten Player of the Year, was a Wade Trophy Finalist and was an All-America choice by four outlets, including the WBCA (honorable mention), Associated Press (second team), USBWA (first team) and Full Court (second team). She is just the third Lady Lion in program history to win Big Ten Player of the Year honors, joining Helen Darling and Kelly Mazzante. Bentley earned her third-straight first team All-Big Ten award and honorable mention All-America bids from the WBCA and Associated Press. She was also selected as the 2013 recipient of the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award, which is presented to the nation's outstanding female collegian 5-8 and under. Bentley was the third Lady Lion to win the honor, joining Darling and Suzie McConnell. Nikki Greene also capped a stellar career for the Lady Lions with third team All-Big Ten accolades. She also became the first player in school history to accumulate 1,000 points, 900 rebounds and 200 blocks.

Both Bentley and Greene heard their names called on WNBA Draft night. Bentley was selected with the 13th overall pick by the Atlanta Dream to become the highest draft pick for the Lady Lions since Tanisha Wright (12th) in 2005. Greene was the 26th overall selection by the Phoenix Mercury to give Penn State two draft picks for the first time since 2004 (Mazzante, Jess Brungo).

With five graduating seniors in 2012-13, Penn State was stout on the recruiting trail, bringing in a seven-member class that was ranked 14th by ESPN/HoopGurlz. The Lady Lions also added transfer Moore from Duke to complete the eight-player class. The addition of Moore gave the Lady Lions four McDonald's All-Americans on the roster heading into the 2013-14 campaign, with Taylor (2009), Lucas (2010) and Candice Agee (2012).

Washington returned the Lady Lions to Big Ten prominence in her fifth season as she guided Penn State to the Big Ten regular-season title with a 13-3 record in conference play. Additionally, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU en route to a 26-7 overall record. The Lady Lions posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 2002-03 and 2003-04. It was also the first Big Ten crown and Sweet Sixteen berth for the Lady Lions since 2003-04. The Lady Lions were ranked throughout the season and finished ninth in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and 11th in the Associated Press Top 25.

For her efforts in rebuilding the Penn State program, Washington was honored as the Big Ten Coach of the Year and the WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year, making her a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year. The accolades were not just limited to Washington; all five Lady Lion starters earned All-Big Ten recognition, including first team bids for Bentley and Lucas. Both Bentley and Lucas also garnered honorable mention All-America honors from the WBCA and Associated Press, respectively. Bentley became the 33rd player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau and just the 15th junior to reach the milestone. Lucas also joined the 1,000-point club in 2011-12, becoming just the third sophomore in program history to accomplish the feat.

On the recruiting trail, the Lady Lions' 2012 class earned a Top-20 class from Dan Olson's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. The class included transfer Taylor, who sat out the 2011-12 season due to NCAA transfer rules, and McDonald's High School All-American Agee from

California. Additionally, Agee earned a gold medal with the USA Basketball U18 National Team Trials at the 2012 FIBA Americas Championship in August.

The Lady Lions returned to the national stage in Washington's fourth year with a second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season standings, a runner-up finish in the Big Ten Tournament and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Penn State tallied its 23rd 20-win season with a 25-10 overall record and an 11-5 mark in conference play. The Lady Lions worked their way back to the "Big Dance" for the first time since 2004-05 and advanced to the second round for the first time in seven years with a win over Dayton in the first round in front of a raucous Bryce Jordan Center crowd.

Penn State was a dominating force from the perimeter as the Lady Lions tied the school record with 228 three-pointers and led NCAA Division I from deep with a .415 three-point field goal percentage. Pacing the Lady Lions from downtown was Lucas, who broke the Big Ten three-pointers record with 112 triples to go along with a .426 shooting percentage. For her efforts, Lucas was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year while breaking the Penn State freshman season scoring record (552 pts.). Additionally with Washington's guidance, Bentley became the 11th different player in school history to take home first team All-Big Ten accolades after finishing second in the conference in assists. After outstanding seasons, both Lucas and Bentley were invited to the USA Basketball World University Games Trials.

Washington was also instrumental in the development of Greene, who earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Defensive team and All-Big Ten honorable mention accolades after recording 75 blocks on the year. Julia Trogele also claimed All-Big Ten honorable mention honors to close out her career.

Washington's third season saw the Lady Lions return to the postseason for the first time since 2004-05 with a WNIT berth. The Lions earned their most overall wins (17) and conference wins (8) since the 2004-05 campaign en route to a sixth-place finish in the Big Ten. Penn State picked up a pair of wins over ranked opponents in #15/15 Pittsburgh and #20/23 Michigan State.

Washington led Tyra Grant to back-to-back first team All-Big Ten honors and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America accolades in her senior season. Grant capped off her career by being selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the WNBA Draft. The four-time all-conference pick left Penn State third in school history in scoring with 2,044 points. Washington also guided Bentley to third team All-Big Ten honors, as well as a unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman team.

That year, Washington and the Lady Lions garnered one of the top recruiting classes in the country, finishing 22nd on the ESPN/HoopGurlz recruiting chart. The class included just the second McDonald's High School All-American in Penn State history in Lucas, WBCA High School All-American Ariel Edwards and All-State selection Talia East.

In Washington's second season, the Lady Lions moved up three positions in the Big Ten standings, finishing in a tie for seventh place. Under Washington's guidance in 2008-09, Grant became the 10th different player in school history to earn first team All-Big Ten honors. Grant was also a semifinalist for the Naismith Player of the Year award. Additionally, Brianne O'Rourke closed out her career with All-Big Ten honorable mention accolades and left Penn State as one of just six players in school history with 1,000 points and 500 assists.

Washington's second recruiting class was rated in the Top 20 by many publications, peaking at No. 10 by "Blue Star Basketball." The four-player class featured a pair of All-Americans in Greene and Bentley, as well as All-State performers Gizelle Studevent and Marisa Wolfe.

In May 2009, Washington's protégés Grant and Greene were invited to the USA Basketball Trials for the World University Games and U19 World Championships, respectively.

The Coquese Washington era started in style as the Lady Lions won their first three games of the season, including a win over #20/21 Pittsburgh, to claim the WBCA Classic title. Just three weeks later, Washington guided the Lady Lions to their first ever win over perennial contender and 10th-ranked Duke in the inaugural Big Ten/ACC Challenge, a game that was televised on ESPN2. The

Lady Lions also appeared on CBS, earning a road win over Michigan State to kickoff the New Year. Washington was also instrumental in helping Kam Gissendanner sign a free agent contract with the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater. During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame amassed a 188-69 record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and a National Championship in 2001.

One of the top recruiters in the country, Washington was instrumental in helping the Irish to secure eight consecutive Top 25 recruiting classes, according to "Blue Star Index," a feat only accomplished by two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee).

During her tenure at Notre Dame, Washington coached five All-Americans and had seven players that were drafted into the WNBA. Washington, in her role as the guards coach, was directly responsible for developing three All-Americans and two Frances Naismith Pomeroy Award winners for the nation's top player 5-8 or under, including Niele Ivey and Megan Duffy. Washington also directed Alicia Ratay, who is the NCAA's career three-point field goal percentage leader.

Washington was a four-year starting point guard for Notre Dame under McGraw and was the team captain on Notre Dame's first-ever NCAA Tournament team. She was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference (MCC) selection and led Notre Dame to three MCC Tournament titles. Washington led the team in steals in each of her four seasons and was tops on the squad in assists three times. Washington is first on UND's all-time steals per game list (2.7), third in career steals (307), sixth in assists (554).

The epitome of a student-athlete, Washington graduated from Notre Dame in 1992, a full year ahead of schedule, with a bachelor's degree in history. She went on to attain "Double Domer" status in 1997 after earning her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame Law School.

Washington juggled finishing her law degree with the start of her professional basketball career. She returned to the hardwood as a professional in 1997-98, playing for the ABL's Portland Power before spending a two-year stint with the WNBA's New York Liberty (1998-99). Washington moved to Houston for the 2000 season, where she played an instrumental role in leading the Comets to the WNBA title. She had a solid season in 2001 with the Comets and Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor, finishing ninth in the WNBA in assists and fourth in steals as Houston earned its fifth consecutive playoff berth. Washington started the 2002 campaign with Houston before being traded to the Indiana Fever at the midway point of the season. Washington guided the Fever to their first-ever playoff berth and became the first player in WNBA history to lead three different teams to the postseason. She finished her professional career in 2003 as a member of the Fever.

Utilizing her law degree, Washington was a central figure in helping create the WNBA Players Association (WNBPA), serving as the founding president of the WNBPA from 1999 until 2001. She also served as the Executive Vice President of the WNBPA from 2001 until her retirement in 2003. Washington led negotiations for the association's first collective bargaining agreement as the association's president, and as the executive vice president was a mainstay in the negotiations for the league's second collective bargaining agreement, which brought about the first free agency system in women's professional sports.

In addition to assisting with the efforts of the Pink Zone at Penn State to raise money and awareness for breast cancer, Washington created Coquese's Drive for the Women's Resource Center. Coquese's Drive for the Women's Resource Center has raised more than \$135,000 for the Centre County Women's Resource Center to aid in the fight against domestic violence in its history.

Washington is currently serving as the President of the WBCA Board of Directors/29-member panel, after stints as the Vice President/President-Elect of the Executive

A standout at Central High School in Flint, Mich., Washington was inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame in December 2009.

A native of Flint, Mich., Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (10), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (6). They reside in Port Matilda, Pa.
