- Penn State (11-9, 2-5 B1G) travels to Ohio State (12-8, 4-3 B1G) for a Monday night contest on BTN.
The Nittany Lions and Buckeyes are both coming off losses Thursday night with Penn State falling to Wisconsin and Ohio State taking a setback at Purdue.
Penn State and Ohio State have split the last four meetings, 2-2. The Lions swept the 2013-14 matchups with the Buckeyes winning both last season.
Three Nittany Lions are scoring in double-figures: Brandon Taylor (16.2 ppg), Shep Garner (14.1) and Payton Banks (10.8) with Taylor controlling the boards (6.0) and Garner also leading in assists (2.9).
Following the game Monday, the Nittany Lions will take part in the first Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader at Madison Square Garden Saturday, Jan. 30. Penn State-Michigan hoops will tip at noon with both men's hockey teams facing off at 7 p.m.

CHAMBERS AVAILABILITY

All interview requests for head coach Patrick Chambers should be directed to Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office. Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Alissa Clendenen. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8. Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Alissa Clendenen one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

RADIO NETWORKS

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided one phone line and one ISDN line.

PRESS ROW SEATING

To access the press seating area, turn left out of the media room, walk down the hallway and take the elevator to the Concourse level. Please allow several minutes when taking the elevator to the press room or the media room. When leaving the elevator, turn right. The press area is at Portal 23.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

The Buckeyes enter Monday night after dropping back-to-back games against Maryland (100-65) and Purdue (75-64). They have an overall record of 12-8 on the season, including a win over Kentucky, and a 4-3 league mark. Marc Loving leads four scorers in double-figures with 13.7 ppg. Jae-Sean Tate is the leading rebounder with 6.4 rpg to go with 11.0 ppg. Freshman JaQuan Lyle earned Co-Big Ten freshman of the week after recording Ohio State's fifth triple-double (16p/12r/11a) in a win over Rutgers.

SERIES HISTORY

- » Ohio State leads the all-time series 33-15 and is 18-4 when playing in Columbus. The teams have split the last four meetings, 2-2.
- » This is the lone regular-season meeting between the teams this season.
- » Penn State snapped an 18-game losing streak to the Buckeyes in 2013-14, sweeping the season series for the first time since 1998. The Lions won 71-70 Jan. 29, 2014, in Columbus and took a 65-63 win Feb. 27, 2014, in the Jordan Center.
- » Three meetings in the series have gone to overtime, the second most for Penn State vs. any Big Ten opponent behind Northwestern.

CURRENT ROSTER VS. OHIO STATE

Seven current members of the Nittany Lions have seen action against Ohio State, led by Shep Garner's 11.0 ppg in two career meetings. Brandon Taylor has the series high scoring effort among current players with 19 points in the overtime win in Columbus Jan. 29, 2014.

LAST TIME VS. THE BUCKEYES

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (March 4, 2015) - Despite leading by as many as nine points in the first half, Penn State fell short in a 77-67 decision to No. 23 Ohio State on Senior Night at the Bryce Jordan Center. Seniors D.J. Newbill (17 points) and Ross Travis (14) led Penn State (15-15, 3-14) during their final home game for the Nittany Lions. Newbill eclipsed the 2,000-point mark for his career; he has 2,011 points and is one of nine active DI players to achieve the mark. Freshman Shep Garner chipped in 13 points. D'Angelo Russell scored 28 points and coach Thad Matta tied the school record for wins in No. 23 Ohio State's victory over Penn State.

NOTABLE GAMES IN THE SERIES

Jan. 29, 2014 (PSU, 71-70 ot) - Newbill hit a pull-up jumper over Aaron Craft with 2 seconds left in overtime, lifting Penn State to a 71-70 victory over No. 24 Ohio State and ending an 18-game losing streak vs. the Buckeyes.

Feb. 27, 1999 (PSU, 98-85): Joe Crispin turned in arguably the most explosive :50 seconds of basketball in PSU history by scoring eight unanswered points to start overtime as Penn State downed No. 10 and eventual Final Four team Ohio State 98-85 in overtime at the BJC. Crispin ended the game with 29 points.

Feb. 28, 1998 (PSU, 89-85): The Lions completed the season sweep of Ohio State with an 89-85 overtime win at St. John Arena. Michael Redd had 32 for Ohio State, but Pete Lisicky had 24 points to pace the Lions in a comeback win.

UP NEXT

Penn State will take on Michigan in the Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey Doubleheader at noon Jan. 30 in Madison Square Garden. The men's hockey programs from Penn State and Michigan will meet at 7 p.m. to complete the first of three annual events in MSG. The road swing will wrap up at Iowa Feb. 3. The Nittany Lions have seven of their first 10 Big Ten games away from University Park, including four with

LAST TIME OUT » Ethan Happ had 20 points and 11 rebounds and Wisconsin held off Penn State for a 66-60 win Thursday in the Bryce Jordan Center. Nigel Hayes added 15 points for the Badgers who won their second straight Big Ten game. Brandon Taylor scored 13 for Penn State. Wisconsin (11-9, 3-4 Big Ten) led by as many as 17 in the middle of the second half but Taylor came alive late and helped pull the Lions to within three with :30 to play. [BOX/NOTES: Page 41]

REMEMBERING JOHN BACH » John Bach, former Penn State men's basketball head coach and NBA coaching veteran, died Monday, Jan. 18. He was 91. Bach led the Nittany Lions to a 122-121 record over 10 seasons, from 1969-78. His PSU teams were renowned for their pressure man-to-man defense with four squads ranked in the nation's top 20 in scoring defense. His teams posted back-to-back records of 17-8 and 15-8 in 1972 and 1973 respectively.

WITHOUT REAVES » Penn State is playing without freshman standout Josh Reaves, as it was announced he has mono prior to the Michigan State game and is estimated he will miss about three weeks of action. Reaves saw action in the first 17 games of the season, starting 14 and averaging 6.4 ppg. He is second on the team in both steals (22) and blocks (17).

SOS » According to ESPN RPI figures, prior to the game vs. Northwestern, Penn State's conference strength of schedule was third in the league, trailing only Iowa and Illinois who had played one fewer conference game. The Nittany Lions have played three ranked teams within the first five games of the Big Ten season.

1,000-POINT SCORER » Brandon Taylor became the 32nd Penn State player all-time to pass the 1,000-point mark when he scored 18 against Michigan Jan. 2. He has 1,093 career points and is ranked No. 22 on the Penn State all-time scoring chart. [Page 28]

TAYLOR TRANSFORMATION » Brandon Taylor has more 2-point buckets (83) this season than all of last year (55) and has converted on more than twice as many free throws (67) than were even attempted (30) last season. He is shooting 72 percent from charity stripe, as opposed to 63.3 percent as a junior.

ALL JACKED UP » Over the last two road games at Purdue and Northwestern, senior captain Donovan Jack has averaged 13.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in just 16.5 minutes of action. He has produced and topped his season and Big Ten career scoring high in each game, while also hitting multiple 3-pointers (2 vs. Purdue 1/13) for the first time this season.

BANK ON IT » Payton Banks is third on the team in scoring with 10.8 ppg, showing the biggest increase in scoring among members of the team last year (+9.1 ppg). He has produced double-figure scoring in all but six games this season after tallying career-high point (24), field goal (8), free throw (6) and steal (3) totals against Minnesota (1/5).

FOSTER-ING PROGRESS » Devin Foster has produced 9.5 points and 2.0 assists per game over the last four games, with a career-high 12 points against Michigan State (1/10). He also reached double-figures vs. Wisconsin, finishing night with 10 points.

ROAD WARRIORS » The Nittany Lions will play seven of its first 10 league games away from home, including back-to-back road or neutral games four times in that stretch. Including the final three games of the non-conference schedule, Penn State will take on 10 out of 13 opponents on the road or in a neutral setting. Following the home game vs. Wisconsin Thursday, the Lions have three-consecutive games away from University Park.

VS. RANKED TEAMS » The Nittany Lions are 0-3 vs. teams ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting this season, falling to No. 4 Maryland and No. 5 Michigan State and No. 24 Purdue within the first five Big Ten games. Including Wednesday vs. Purdue, the Lions have seven games scheduled against teams ranked in the Top 25 in the current polls.

LESS THAN 70 » The Nittany Lions are 9-1 when holding their opponents below 70 points this season. The loss to Wisconsin was the first this season to an opponent who scored fewer than 70 points.

SINGLE-DIGIT SEPARATION » Penn State is 8-3 this season in games separated by nine or fewer points after defeating Northwestern by nine, 71-62. The first two losses came within a span of three games, vs. Colorado (-1) and at Maryland (-6), followed by the Thursday setback to Wisconsin. Last season, the Nittany Lions had 24 of 34 games decided by single-digits with the team going 13-11 in those contests (8-1 in non-conference play).

UNDER 40 PERCENT » Eight of Penn State's 11 wins this season have come when holding opponents below 40 percent shooting. Foes are shooting at a 38 percent clip in PSU victories with the Nittany Lions hitting 43 percent of shots in the same games. Penn State holds a 44-17 record under head coach Patrick Chambers when limiting opponents to a sub-40 percent field-goal percentage, and an 8-2 mark this season, after the losses to Colorado and Maryland.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES » Brandon Taylor tallied his third double-double of the year against Maryland Dec. 30 with 15 points and 10 rebounds. He previously tallied double-double vs. Eastern Michigan Dec. 5 with career highs in points (27) and rebounds (12) and Bucknell (19/11). His previous double-double was vs. Drexel last season (12/20/14) with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

LINEUPS » Penn State has used five different starting lineup combinations this season and over 70 in-game combinations. The lineup of Shep Garner, Josh Reaves, Payton Banks, Brandon Taylor and Jordan Dickerson started in nine games this season. [Page 11]

BOSTON THREE PARTY » Shep Garner's performance at Boston College Dec. 2 produced eight 3-pointers, the second-most in a single game for a Nittany Lion in program history, trailing just Pete Lisicky's nine tallied vs. Penn in 1996. The effort tied the Conte Forum record, set previously by two players.

COMEBACK » Penn State battled back from a 17-point deficit against Drexel Dec. 19 in Philadelphia, its largest comeback for a win in at least 15 years. Since the 2000-01 season, the Nittany Lions have come back from at least 14 points down to win 10 times, three under head coach Patrick Chambers.

CENTURY MARK » Brandon Taylor played in his 100th career game against Bucknell Nov. 28 and has now seen action in 115. He has started 92 games, the most of any current Nittany Lion, and is averaging 9.2 points per game over his four-year career. Donovan Jack saw action in his 100th career game against Michigan Jan. 2 (104). He has 42 career starts over his four-yr career with a scoring average of 4.3 ppg.

CLOSE CALLS » Penn State's four-point win over Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 12 was the eighth-consecutive win in non-conference play decided by five points or fewer, dating back to last season. The Nittany Lions had six non-conference games separated by 1-5 points in 2014-15, winning each of them, and are 2-0 so far this season, also winning vs. Bucknell (62-58). The loss to Colorado ended that streak.

B1G OPENERS » Penn State is 7-17 in conference lidlifters with the last opener win coming Dec. 27, 2010 at Indiana, 69-60. This was the sixth time in the last seven years the Nittany Lions have opened the conference slate on the road and the second-consecutive season they have done so vs. the No. 4 team in the country.

EARLY-SEASON TOURNEYS » Penn State is 76-89 in early-season tournaments after going 3-1 in the Las Vegas Classic to finish in third. The Lions have participated in at least one each season since 1981 and have captured 10 tourney championships, 12 second-place and 27 third-place finishes.

IN THE CHALLENGE » With the win over Boston College Dec. 2, Penn State moves to 6-3 in its last nine Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and has won four of its last five Big Ten/ACC Challenge road games. The Lions hold a 7-8 record in 15 Challenge appearances.

SEASON NOTES

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SUITS AND SNEAKERS

Head coach Patrick Chambers will don suits and sneakers for every game during the 2015-16, in honor of the 20th season of Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State. The school's chapter of CVC is consistently ranks among the Top 10 CVC organizations in the nation. It was started in 1995 under then head coach Bruce Parkhill and raises funds to support the American Cancer Society as well as the Bob Perks Fund (BPF), a local initiative that provides direct support for community members and families fighting cancer. Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State has raised nearly \$2.5 million to date through a series of year-round events. To get involved please visit CVC.PENNSTATE.ORG or call 814-234-1023.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Penn State basketball program recently moved into new training table and video room facilities in the Bryce Jordan Center. The \$1.2 million project was propelled by a generous gift from Peter and Ann Tombros and allows the Nittany Lions to utilize state of the art technologies. The concourse of the BJC also got a makeover in the offseason, and features Nittany and Lady Lion basketball graphics surrounding the circumference, as well as at the main entrances.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players – Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack - were selected team captains for the season by a player vote. Combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, the group makes up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reaves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zengulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reaves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reaves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zengulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson entered the season tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor was 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. In the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State took part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas, falling to Colorado by one, 71-70, before defeating Kent State, 75-69, in the consolation game. Each team played four games in the Classic – the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series. The Lions finished the tourney 3-1.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

TWENTY SEASONS IN THE BJC

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.

120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, who they will face for the fourth-consecutive season and the 102nd time overall. Penn State has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 27 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

SEASON OPENERS

Penn State has won its last 11 season openers dating to 2005, including all five under Patrick Chambers. The Lions are 89-30 overall in season openers and 79-10 in home season openers.

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Is the youngest of 12 children
- Has 3 of 11 siblings who graduated from Penn State.
- Spent 10 years as a highly-successful salesman and part owner of his family's printing business in Philadelphia.
- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 19 points and Donovan Jack had 14 as Penn State beat Northwestern 71-62 on Saturday night. Payton Banks added 10 for the Nittany Lions, who shot 9-for-21 from 3-point range. Tre Demps had 22 points and Bryant McIntosh and Dererk Pardon added 12 apiece for Northwestern. Jack completed a 3-point play with 15:23 left for a 38-27 Penn State lead. Garner and Taylor each nailed a 3 to extend the lead to 48-31. Demps then hit Northwestern's first 3-pointer with 10:21 remaining to snap the Wildcats' 0-for-17 skid from beyond the arc. But Jordan Dickerson answered on the other end with a dunk to keep Penn State ahead 50-34. Jack hit a jumper to give the Nittany Lions their largest lead at 18.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Three Nittany Lions led the offense with double figure scoring for the 12th time this season, led by 19 points from Brandon Taylor. Donovan Jack finished second on the team with a Big Ten career-high 14 points, while Payton Banks added 10.
- The senior class - Taylor, Jack, Devin Foster and Jordan Dickerson - combined for 66 percent of the team's scoring.
- Penn State highlighted the night with its best 3-point shooting of the Big Ten slate, finishing 43 percent (9-21), with triples from six of 10 Nittany Lions to see the court.
- PSU held Northwestern to just 62 points on the night, which is nearly 15 points below their season average of 76.8 points per game heading into the matchup. Penn State is 7-0 on the year when holding its opponent to less than 70 points in a game.
- The Wildcats also ended the game shooting 47.3 percent from the field and 37 percent from behind the arc, with an average of 9.1 triples per game. Penn State held Northwestern to 39 percent (26-for-67) from the field and just 11.5 percent from 3-point range (3-for-26). NU missed each of its first 17 attempts from beyond arc. Penn State owned a 42-34 rebounding advantage against Northwestern, helped out by at least five rebounds from five different Nittany Lions. Penn State is 8-1 on the year when out-rebounding its opponent.
- Penn State improves to 29-16 in the all-time series against Northwestern and 13-10 all-time when playing in Evanston.
- The Nittany Lions have defeated Northwestern on the road in three of the last four trips to Evanston.
- Each of the last four meetings in the series and six of the last eight have taken place in Evanston. Northwestern will make first trip to University Park since 2013 on March 2.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Ethan Happ had 20 points and 11 rebounds and Wisconsin held off Penn State for a 66-60 win. Nigel Hayes added 15 points for the Badgers who won their second straight Big Ten game. Brandon Taylor scored 13 for Penn State. Wisconsin (11-9, 3-4 Big Ten) led by as many as 17 in the middle of the second half but Taylor came alive late. Although Penn State's leading scorer attempted just one first-half shot, he scored nine of Penn State's final 11 points including his lone 3-pointer with 6:20 to play. It sparked a 12-3 run to pull Penn State within five with 3:16 left. Devin Foster drilled a 3-pointer to cut Wisconsin's lead to 63-60 with 30 seconds left. Happ secured the win with three free throws.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State battled back from a deficit as large as 17 to shrink the gap to three with :30 to play, but the late rally fell short in a 66-60 loss to Wisconsin Thursday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Four Nittany Lions reached double digits in scoring for the fourth time this season, led by 13 points from Brandon Taylor. Payton Banks finished second on the team with 11 points, while Devin Foster and Shep Garner added 10 points each. At least three Nittany Lions have produced 10 or more points in 13 games this season.
- Three Nittany Lions were perfect from the free throw line as Penn State shot 74 percent (20-27) from the charity stripe against the Badgers. Garner finished 6-for-6, while Taylor and Moore were both 4-for-4.
- Eight of nine Nittany Lions to see the court grabbed at least one rebound, led by a career-high 10 boards from Julian Moore. Banks finished second on the team with six, while Taylor added four.
- Penn State shot 40 percent (6-15) from 3-point range for the second consecutive outing, helped out by multiple treys from Banks and Foster. Banks and Foster both matched career-high marks knocking down three and two triples, respectively. Five of the Lions' six 3-pointers came in the final 6:20 of the game.
- Penn State returns to the road next week, traveling to Ohio State to square off against the Buckeyes Monday, Jan. 25 at 7 p.m. on Big Ten Network.
- Ten of the last 11 meetings against Wisconsin have been decided by 10 or fewer points.
- Penn State moves to 10-34 in the all-time series against the Badgers and 8-17 when playing at home in the Bryce Jordan Center.

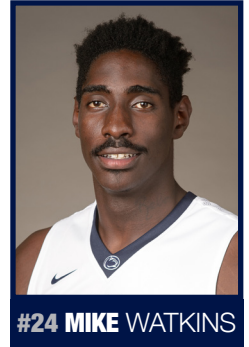

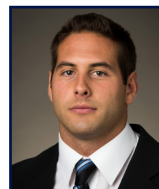
