Nittany Lion Preview

Penn State started off the season successfully with three 3-0 sweeps in the Active Ankle Challenge in Louisville, Ky. The Nittany Lions defeated Morehead State (25-18, 25-15, 25-14), Western Kentucky University (25-10, 25-22, 25-22) and Louisville (25-20, 25-17, 25-18). Junior Ariel Scott (Ridgewood, N.J.) pounded 3.78 kills per set to lead the Nittany Lions offensively. Juniors Deja McClendon (Louisville, Ky.) and Katie Slay (Raleigh, N.C.) both averaged 2.78 kills per set. Slay hit .500 for the weekend. Sophomore Micha Hancock (Edmond, Okla.) averaged 11.00 assists per set and a team-high 1.00 aces per set. On defense, sophomore Dominique Gonzalez (San Antonio, Texas) had 3.89 digs per set, while McClendon averaged 3.33 digs per set. Slay was a wall at the net with 1.78 blocks per set, while Scott had 1.44 and sophomore Nia Grant posted 1.11 blocks per set.

For the weekend, the Nittany Lions hit .345 and averaging 15.00 kills, 14.11 assists, 1.89 aces, 14.78 digs and 3.50 blocks per set.

Penn State vs. Stanford

The Nittany Lions are 6-7 all-time versus the Cardinals. This will be the third meeting in three years between the two teams. Stanford has won the last two meetings, both in the Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic, first at Florida, 3-0, in 2010 and at Stanford, 3-1, in 2011.

Scouting the Cardinal

The ninth-ranked Cardinal is 2-1 so far this season after competing in the Hawaii Invitational on Aug. 25-26. Stanford defeated both Saint Mary's and Albany in three set sweeps, but suffered a 3-1 loss to host Hawaii. Jordan Burgess leads Stanford offensively with 3.33 kills per set and a .500 hitting percentage. Karissa Cook is the team's setter and she averaged 10.30 assists per set in the first weekend. Defensively, Carly Wopat was a strong presence at the net with 11 total blocks. The Cardinal will face No. 18 Florida on Saturday afternoon at 4 p.m.

Penn State vs. Texas

The Nittany Lions lead the series with the Longhorns, 10-7. The Longhorns won the last meeting on Sept. 10, 2011, 3-2. Previously, Penn State had defeated Texas 10 straight times, including in the 2010 NCAA National Semifinals and the 2009 NCAA Championship.

Scouting the Longhorns

No. 2 Texas is 3-0 after the first weekend of action. The Longhorns swept LSU, Cal Poly and San Diego in the 26 West Longhorns Classic on Aug. 24-25. Haley Eckerman is the offensive leader for Texas so far and she averaged 3.89 kills per set on .337 hitting. The Longhorns run a 6-2 offense with Nicole Dalton and Hannah Allison sharing setting duties. They're averaging 5.44 and 5.33 assists per set, respectively. Texas averaged 4.44 blocks per set in their first weekend with Molly McCage putting up 12 (2.00 blocks per set), while Sha'Dare McNeal, Khat Bell and Dalton posted 10 blocks apiece. The Longhorns face Florida at 4:30 p.m. on Friday.

Penn State Recap

The Nittany Lions opened the 2012 season going 3-0 in the Active Ankle Challenge hosted by Louisville. Penn State defeated Morehead State, Western Kentucky University and Louisville. Junior Ariel Scott led the Lions with 34 kills, while juniors Deja McClendon and Katie Slay posted 25 kills each. Sophomore Micha Hancock was the starting setting in all three matches and totaled 99 assists and a team-best nine aces. Sophomore Dominique Gonzalez took over the libero position and recorded 35 digs, while McClendon wasn't far behind with 30. At the net, Slay had a team-high 16 blocks, Scott totaled 14 and sophomore Nia Grant had 10.

What's Next?

Penn State is back on the road with a trip to Chicago on Sept. 8-9. The Nittany Lions face DePaul and Oregon State on Sept. 1 at 11 a.m. and 8 p.m., respectively. Penn State faces UIC at 2 p.m. on Sept. 9.

Slay Selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week

Junior Katie Slay was honored as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 27. It was the fourth honor of her career.

Slay was a threat on both offense and defense in Penn State's three matches over the weekend. Slay helped Penn State to a 3-0 record in the Active Ankle Challenge hosted by Louisville. The Preseason All-Big Ten honoree tied for second on the team with 25 kills for the weekend on .500 hitting, while also contributing a team-best 16 blocks. She was named to the Active Ankle Challenge All-Tournament Team for her performance.

Scott Named Active Ankle Challenge MVP

Three members of the women's volleyball team were selected to the Active Ankle All-Tournament Team. Junior Ariel Scott was named the Active Ankle MVP, while juniors Katie Slay and Deja McClendon were all-tournament team selections. Scott led Penn State with 34 kills, averaging 3.78 kills per set on .308 hitting, after the first three matches of the season. Scott was also second on the team in blocks with 13, averaging 1.44 blocks per set.

Season Opening Record

Three Nittany Lions made their collegiate debuts in the Active Ankle Challenge in Louisville, Ky. Freshmen Megan Courtney, Lara Caraway and Kendall Pierce all saw their first collegiate action. Courtney started at outside hitter against Morehead State, where she led the team with nine kills, and Western Kentucky. Pierce and Caraway came in as serving and defensive specialists vs. Morehead State. Pierce tallied an ace.

McClendon's High School Jersey Retired

On Thursday, Aug. 23, junior Deja McClendon was honored by her high school DuPont Manual Magnet in Louisville, Ky. McClendon's high school honored McClendon by retiring her No. 8 high school jersey. A two-time All-American, McClendon was a four-year letterwinner at DuPont Manual. She was the Kentucky Gatorade Player of the Year and was named Miss Kentucky Volleyball.

Season Opening Record

Under head coach Russ Rose, the Nittany Lions are 28-6 in season openers. Penn State's Aug. 26, 2011 loss to Oregon was the Lions' first season-opening loss since 2005 when the Nittany Lions suffered a 3-2 setback to Stanford, also in the AVCA Showcase. All six times the Nittany Lions have lost their season opener, they have rallied to win their second match. Penn State has never opened the season 0-2.

Leading Lions

The team captains for the 2012-13 season are senior Kristin Carpenter, junior Katie Slay and sophomore Dominique Gonzalez.

Nittany Lions Debut At No. 3 in the AVCA Preseason Coaches Poll

The five-time national champion Penn State women's volleyball team heads into the 2012 season ranked No. 3 in the 2012 AVCA Preseason Coaches Poll. The Nittany Lions are one of two Big Ten teams to crack the top five, with Nebraska coming in at No. 4.

UCLA, the defending NCAA Champion, took the top spot with 54 of the 60 possible first place votes, while Texas was ranked No. 2 and was one of four other teams to receive first place votes. Following Nebraska to round of the top five was USC.

Penn State Chosen to Finish Second in the Big Ten

The Nittany Lions were picked to finish second in the Big Ten by the league coaches. Nebraska, the defending Big Ten Champion, was picked as the conference's preseason favorite. Purdue was slated to finish third, while Minnesota sits in fourth and Illinois in fifth. Ohio State rounded out the poll at sixth.

Three Nittany Lions Earn Big Ten Preseason Honors

A trio of Nittany Lions has earned Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches. Juniors Deja McClendon, Katie Slay and Ariel Scott all picked up preseason accolades. McClendon was a unanimous selection for the second straight season, while it was the first honor for Scott and the second for Slay.

Streaks

Penn State holds the top three winning streaks in Big Ten history. Penn State's most recent streak of 65 consecutive matches began on Nov. 11, 2006 and ended on Sept. 24, 2010 at Illinois. It is the longest streak in league history. Penn State's other two conference winning streaks were 49 matches and 41. Illinois owns the fourth (40) and fifth (25) longest conference winning streaks.

Nittany Lions By Month

Penn State is 35-5 (.875) all-time during the month of August. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State 3-2 in the opening round. Most recently, the Nittany Lions suffered a season opening loss to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against nationally-ranked USC.

Penn State is 350-54-4 (.863) all-time during the month of September. Amazingly, the Lions are 174-15 (.921) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 47-7 (.870) over the last five years.

The Lions are 379-67 (.850) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 79-11 (.878) mark in October over the last 10 seasons, a record of 43-3 (.935) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010 .

Penn State is 275-57 (.828) all-time during the month of November, including a 77-8 (.906) mark over the last 10 seasons. The Lions had a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and over the last five seasons, Penn State has a 38-3 (.927) mark in November.

Quick Sets

- During a period from Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State had won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten for the 1991 season, Penn State has played in 731 total matches, winning 646. Amazingly, 513 of those 646 wins, or 79%, have been three-game sweeps. Over the last six years, Penn State has won 166 of its 199 victories in three games (83%), including 37 out of 38 (98%) in 2008 and 32 out of 38 in 2009 (84%).

- Over the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 55 matches. And of those 21 teams that defeated the Lions – Brigham Young, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only eight of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 277-54 (84%) mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.
