SCOUTING REPORT

- Youngstown State will play its final road contest of 2021 on Sunday as it heads to Penn State to take on the Nittany Lions. Tipoff at the Bryce Jordan Center is set for 2 p.m., and the game will be broadcast live on 570 WKBN, iHeartRadio and B1G+.
- The Penguins head to Happy Valley with an 8-0 record following a narrow 69-66 victory at Canisius on Wednesday that left them plenty of things to improve upon. The Golden Griffins had the best shooting effort by any foe this season, shooting 46.5 percent overall and 41.2 percent from 3-point range. None of YSU's first seven opponents shot 40 percent overall or from beyond the arc.
- YSU is 8-0 for the third time in program history and the second time in Head Coach John Barnes' nine seasons. In the two previous seasons that the Penguins won their first eight games, they went on to start 10-0. Youngstown State was 6-0 coming into the last contest it played at Penn State in 2015.
- Fifth-year senior Chelsea Olson stepped up in a big way by scoring a career-high 28 points to lead the Penguins to victory at Canisius. She surpassed 1,200 career points in the win, and she was the first Division I player in the country this season to reach both 700 career rebounds and 400 career assists.
- Olson is one of four Penguins averaging double figures in scoring at 12.8 points per game. Lilly Ritz leads the team with 18.4 points per contest, while Malia Magestro (10.2 ppg) and Paige Shy (10.0 ppg) are also averaging double digits. YSU has stayed unbeaten despite Ritz missing the last three games and Magestro missing the first two Horizon League contests.
- The Penguins have a new-look roster in 2021-22. There are 15 players on the team, and nine of them are in their first year at Youngstown State. Three transfers – Callahan, Ritz and Shy – have carried a heavy load. Callahan and Shy have started every game, and Ritz is averaging 18.4 points and 8.4 rebounds per game.

PROGRAM STAPLES

- **Shooting 3s:** Youngstown State has led the Horizon League in 3-pointers per game in each of the last seven seasons. A Penguin has ranked in the top five of the conference in 3s per game in each of the last 10 seasons.
- **Strong In The Post:** The Penguins have had a post be named to the Horizon League's first team, second team or freshman team in six of the last eight seasons and 11 times in the last 14.
- Sharing The Ball: A Penguin has led the Horizon League in assists per game in five of the last six years.
- Academics: YSU has appeared on the WBCA Academic Top 25 Honor Roll 10 times in the last 11 years. The Penguins have been in the top 10 for four straight years.
- **Postseason Play:** YSU has played in the WNIT or the WBI in five of the last nine years.
- Strength at the Stripe: YSU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in free-throw percentage in four of the last seven seasons. The Penguins have shot at least 70 percent from the free-throw line in nine straight years.

A WIN WOULD...

- Improve YSU's record to 9-0 this season, which would be its third 9-0 start to a campaign and its second perfect record through nine games under John Barnes.
- Give the Penguins a 5-0 record on the road.
- Be the first over Penn State in four meetings.
- Be YSU's first against a Big Ten opponent since Dec. 8, 1990 (Michigan).
- Give YSU its first win over a team from a Power Five conference Nov. 13, 2018, when it beat Pitt.
- Be YSU's 22nd win in its last 29 non-conference games.
- Be the 292nd in Barnes' career and his 136th at Youngstown State.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- Penn State is 5-5 overall and 1-1 in Big Ten games following a 52-48 victory over Rutgers on Thursday evening. The win over the Scarlet Knights stopped a four-game losing streak.
- Junior guard Makenna Marisa ranks second in the Big Ten in scoring at 20.8 points per game, and she has scored at least 20 points in six of Penn State's 10 games. She leads the Nittany Lions in scoring, 3-pointers (22), assists (50), steals (18) and minutes (34/game). Forward Ali Brigham averages a team-high 5.3 rebounds and is second behind Marisa in scoring with 12.5 per contest.
- Penn State finished 11th in the Big Ten in 2020-21 with a 6-13 record against the conference.

• Youngstown State has played at Penn State three times in the series history, and the first two meetings came in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament. The Penguins lost 94-71 to the Nittany Lions in YSU's first-ever postseason game on March 15, 1996, and Penn State won 83-63 on March 17, 2000. In the only regular-season contest in the series, YSU fell 68-51 at the Bryce Jordan Center on Dec. 8, 2015.

LAST MEETING VS. PENN STATE

- YSU stayed within striking distance for the first 28 minutes, but Penn State went on a 12-0 run to pull away for a 68-51 win on Dec. 8, 2015, at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- YSU went 4-for-23 from 3-point range and was just 3-for-4 from the free-throw line in the contest, but it trailed just 48-41 with 2:06 remaining in the third period. That's when the Nittany Lions' 12-point burst gave them a 60-41 lead, and YSU got no closer than 13 the rest of the way. Penn State also went on a 15-0 run in the first half.
- Sarah Cash posted her first career double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds. She was 9-of-13 from the field in the game. Nikki Arbanas was also in double figures with 10 points, and Indiya Benjamin recorded seven assists.

YSU VS. BIG TEN AND POWER FIVE OPPONENTS

- Big Ten: YSU is 1-11 all-time in games played against Big Ten opponents with the win coming against Michigan on Dec. 8, 1990, at Beeghly Center. All-time, the Penguins are 1-1 against Michigan, 0-1 against Minnesota and 0-3 versus Indiana, Ohio State and Penn State. The most-recent meeting against a B1G foe came at Indiana on Dec. 15, 2019, when the Hoosiers were ranked 12th in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. YSU led by seven twice in the second period and trailed just 41-38 at halftime before IU shot 75.9 percent from the field in the second half to pull away for a 93-56 victory.
- Power Five: Youngstown State has played a team from a Power Five conference in 13
 of the last 14 years (since 2007-08) with the lone exception being last season. Eight of
 those 13 contests have come against Pitt, and YSU has beaten the Panthers twice in
 2012-13 and 2018-19. YSU is playing a Big Ten team for the third time in the last seven
 years.



DEC. 12 IN YSU HISTORY

- Youngstown State is 1-4 all-time in games played on Dec. 12, and all five contests have been against teams from the Mid-American Conference.
- In the most recent game for the Penguins played on Dec. 12, they beat Kent State 91-61 for their largest margin of victory ever in the 45-game all-time series with Kent State. YSU scored 18 straight points as part of a 25-2 run to take control. The Penguins had 29 assists on 31 field goals, and Indiya Benjamin had 15 of those assists. Nikki Arbanas made seve of YSU's 15 3-pointers.

- Chelsea Olson scored a career-high 28 points, and Jen Wendler scored all 10 of her points during a momentous 20-4 run in the second half as Youngstown State beat Canisius 69-66 on Wednesday in Buffalo.
- YSU led for more than 34 minutes, and the margin was 63-50 with less than three minutes left in the game. The Golden Griffins went on an 11-2 burst to get within 65-61 before YSU made four free throws and forced a turnover to close out the win. Canisius leading scorer Dani Haskell, who YSU held scoreless in the first half, hit a 35-footer at the buzzer to shave a six-point margin to three for the final.
- Olson went 12-for-16 from the field (including 10-for-11 inside the arc) and 2-for-2 from the free-throw line. It was the highest scoring total by a Penguin this season and the most by a YSU player in a road game since Alison Smolinski scored 29 at Canisius on Dec. 1, 2018.
- Olson's career-high in scoring came on 12 field goals. No Penguin guard had made 12 field goals in a game since Heather Karner had 12 in the opening game of the 2006-07 season against Cincinnati (Nov. 10, 2006). It was just the fifth time a YSU guard made at least 12 field goals in the last 25 years.
- Olson became the 17th player in program history to reach 1,200 career points. She now ranks 16th all-time at YSU with 1,226 points in her 120 career games.
- Wendler had her first double-digit scoring game since the home game against Cleveland State her freshman year on Feb. 15, 2020. She was 3-for-5 from the field and 4-for-5 from the free-throw line in the second half, and YSU was plus-11 in the scoring column in the second with her on the floor.
- Even without leading scorer Lilly Ritz, the Penguins held a 30-16 scoring edge in the paint. The 16 points by Canisius tied for fewest by opponent this season.
- The Penguins set new season highs with 14 second-chance points and 25 bench points. Jen Wendler and Malia Magestro combined for 19 of those bench points.
- After starting the game 2-for-17 from the field, YSU was 24-for-43 (55.8 percent) over the final 32:15 of the game. Canisius didn't make a field goal for the final 7:26 of the first period, but it went on to shoot 52.9 percent over the final three quarters.
- Fouls were a big storyline in the game. YSU was whistled for a season-high 24 fouls, and Canisius held a 25-5 edge in free-throw attempts over the first 38:30 of the game. The 19 made free throws and 29 free-throw attempts by Canisius were both the highest totals by an opponent in 2021-22 and season highs for the Golden Griffins. Starting Penguin guards Mady Aulbach and Megan Callahan played a combined 7:26 in the first half due to being called for two fouls apiece.
- The Golden Griffins had the best shooting effort by any foe this season, shooting 46.5 percent overall and 41.2 percent from 3-point range. None of YSU's first seven opponents shot 40 percent overall or from beyond the arc.

- Youngstown State has won eight straight games to start a season for the third time in program history and for the second time in Head Coach John Barnes' nine seasons. Previously, YSU was previously unbeaten through eight games in 1978-79 and 2014-15. The 1978-79 team, which competed at the Division II level, won its first 17 games, and the 2014-15 squad started 10-0. The Penguins were 6-0 when they traveled to Penn State in 2015-16 and fell 68-51.
- In Horizon League play, YSU is 4-0 for the third time, and all three times have come in the Barnes era – 2013-14, 2018-19 and 2021-22. YSU's best start to Horizon League competition was 6-0 in 2013-14.
- After an 0-3 start, the Penguins went 10-5 the rest of the 2020-21 season. With the 8-0 start in 2021-22, YSU is 18-5 over its last 23 contests. They led in the fourth quarter in four of those five losses, including both regular-season games at IUPUI and at Milwaukee in the second round of the Horizon League tournament.

WINNING WITH A DEFENSIVE MINDSET

- Youngstown State's 8-0 start has been fueled by its defense. After allowing 67
 points at Eastern Michigan in the season opener, YSU has held five of its last seven
 opponents to 58 points or fewer. The defense has helped offset some offensive
 struggles as YSU has won three times when scoring fewer than 65 points.
- Through eight games, YSU is allowing 59.4 points per game and holding opponents to 35.4 percent from the field. That is currently a school-record pace for best fieldgoal percentage defense, and opponents have shot under 38 percent just four times in the 42 seasons of available statistics. Canisius was the first team to shoot 40 percent overall or from 3-point range against Youngstown State this season.
- The defense has been much-improved compared with the last two seasons. Teams averaged 63.5 points and shot 40.5 percent last season, and the Penguins surrendered 67.8 points and allowed teams to shoot 41.3 percent in 2019-20.
- Defense has been a strength since John Barnes became YSU's head coach in 2013-14. Of the top-seven scoring defenses in the 40 full years of Division I basketball at Youngstown State, five have come in Barnes' eight seasons. The 2021-22 team currently has the third-best mark.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- YSU has possessed the second-best grade point average in the country in each of the last two years. YSU had an all-time program-best GPA of 3.874 in 2020-21, and it was just 0.011 behind South Dakota for the top mark in the nation in 2019-20.
- Youngstown State has appeared on the WBCA's Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll 10 times in the last 11 seasons. No other program has appeared on the prestigious list 10 times since 2010-11, and YSU has now been in the top 10 in five of the last six seasons.

 YSU had 11 student-athletes record a 4.0 in at least one semester during the year.
- YSU seniors Mary Dunn and Chelsea Olson were voted to the five-person 2020-21 Horizon League All-Academic Team for their combined accomplishments on the court and in the classroom.
- The Penguins have had 13 academic all-league selections in the last 11 seasons, including a league-high 10 in eight seasons under head coach John Barnes. In the last eight seasons, only YSU (10), Green Bay (9) and Detroit Mercy (6) have had more than five players earn academic all-league honors.

NEW PIECES, SAME FORMULA

- While the faces are very different in 2021-22, the style of play remains largely the same at Youngstown State: pound the ball inside, surround the posts with dangerous shooters, pass unselfishly, play sound defense, and try to exert more effort than opponents.
- The transfer portal defined the offseason for many college programs, and it certainly reshaped YSU's. The Penguins had four players

transfer to new programs, but five players came to YSU to give the roster a chance at a reset. Add in four freshmen, and Youngstown State has nine newcomers on the roster.

- YSU lost a pair of all-league forwards in Mary Dunn (Pitt) and Nneka Obiazor (UNLV), plus guards McKenah Peters (Division II Nova Southeastern) and Maddie Schires (Division II Bemidji State). That group accounted for 821 points last season or an average of 45.61 points per game.
- The Penguins replaced that quartet with Division I transfers Megan Callahan (Robert Morris), Lindsey Linard (Duquesne), Lindsey Mack (Fairleigh Dickinson) and Paige Shy (Marshall), and Division II All-American Lilly Ritz (Wheeling). Callahan and Shy have started each game, Linard has started the last three games, and Ritz is the team's scoring and rebounding leader.
- Even with Ritz out the last three games, the transfers have accounted for 47.6 percent of YSU's scoring this season. YSU's four freshmen, on the other hand, have one game of action combined as Haley Thierry made her debut against LIU. Athena Hocevar and Tenleigh Phelps are out indefinitely with lower-body injuries, and Kayiona Willis is a planned redshirt.

RESTOCKING THE POST POSITION

- The Penguins have depended on solid post play throughout John Barnes' stint at YSU. Posts have been first, second, or third-team All-Horizon League selections in six of his eight seasons. Going back even further, YSU has now had a forward earn first, second or all-newcomer/freshman-team honors in 11 of the last 14 years.
- While YSU lost two all-conference posts to the transfer portal, Division II All-American Lilly Ritz has played a leading role in the offense this season. Ritz ranks among the Horizon League leaders in scoring (18.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.4 rpg). Over her last three games, Ritz is averaging 23 points and eight rebounds while making 30-of-38 from the field for 78.9 percent. She was named the Horizon League Player of the Week on Nov. 22. Ritz has missed the last three games.
- Over just two seasons at Wheeling University in West Virginia, Ritz totaled 1,054 points and 800 rebounds, and she had a double-double in each of her final 33 games. She led the nation in rebounding in 2019-20 and 2020-21, and she ranked second in the country in scoring in 2020-21 with 23.6 points per game.
- Lindsey Linard also transferred in from Duquesne as another post. The 6-foot-4 Linard played in 11 games for the Dukes last season, and she was a Special Mention All-Ohioan at Division I (largest schools) her senior year. Linard has started in Ritz's absence the last three games and is averaging 5.6 points over the last five contests.

OLSON CONTINUES TO REACH MILESTONES

- As the only player on the roster who has been with Youngstown State more than three seasons, Chelsea Olson is the undisputed leader of the program in 2021-22. She entered the season with more points, 3-pointers, rebounds, assists, blocks, steals and minutes than the rest of YSU's returners combined.
- Olson reached two historic milestones on Nov. 26 against LIU as she surpassed 700 career rebounds and 400 career assists. At the time of the achievement, she was the only active Division I player with at least 700 rebounds and 400 career assists. Danielle Carson (1982-86) is the only other Penguin to reach those numbers.

STORYLINES •

- Olson can certainly score when necessary as well. She became the 17th Penguin to reach 1,200 career points on Dec. 8 at Canisius when she scored a career-high 28 points against the Golden Griffins. Olson made 12 field goals in the game, which was the most by a YSU guard since the 2006-07 season opener.
- Olson has led the Horizon League in assists per game in two of the last three seasons. She could become just the third player to lead the league in three different campaigns. The current three-time assist leaders are Mariann Murtaugh (Loyola Chicago, 1990-92) and Olson's former teammate, Indiya Benjamin (2016-18). Olson currently ranks fourth in the league with 3.9 assists per game as she and teammate Mady Aulbach both rank in the top seven.
- Olson ranks 16th in program history in career points (1,226), sixth in career
 3-pointers (184), 10th in career rebounds (717), eighth in career assists (409), fourth in career blocks (109) and fourth in career minutes (3,717).

HORIZON LEAGUE 3-POINT LEADERS

- Youngstown State has led the Horizon League in 3-pointers per game in each of the last seven seasons and eight times in the last 10 seasons.
- The Penguins have made 71 3-pointers in their first eight games and are shooting 36.8 percent from beyond the arc. Both marks are second in the Horizon League behind IUPUI (10.3/game, 38.5 percent).
- YSU's 8.9 3-pointers per game is its highest clip since the 2011-12 season, and YSU has not shot above 35 percent from 3-point range since the 2004-05 season. That's impressive considering the 3-point line moved back one 1-foot, 4-¾ inches prior

to the season. Nationally, Division I teams are shooting 30.8 percent from 3-point range after shooting at least 31.4 percent for each of the last eight years.

- The Penguins played just 18 games in 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which kept them from sinking at least 200 3-pointers for the 11th straight season. Using its 3-pointers per game average, YSU was on track to reach 200 makes in its 29th game in 2020-21.
- Individually, YSU has had a player rank in the top five of the Horizon League in 3s per game for 10 straight seasons. Paige Shy has a team-best 18 3s and ranks fifth in the league with 2.3 3s per game. Malia Magestro has 13 3s in six games and ranks sixth.

STOCKED WITH SHOOTERS

- The Penguins have the ability to surround their posts with four dangerous shooters as four Penguins have made at least 11 3s through the first eight six games.
- Paige Shy, who is in her first season as a transfer from Marshall, leads the Penguins with 18 3-pointers made and 53 attempts. She has made at least one 3 in all eight games, and the junior has made at least three in four different contests.
- Malia Magestro is 13-for-27 from long distance this season over six games, and she was 18-for-35 in 2020-21. That equates to an eye-popping career percentage of .500 over the first 24 games of her career. She made a career-high five 3s versus Green Bay last Saturday.
- Megan Callahan is 13-for-33 from long distance this season, and she was 7-for-14 in the two games last week against Milwaukee and Green Bay. She made 110 3s in 88 games at Robert Morris and shot 36.7 percent for her career as a Colonial.
- Chelsea Olson is 11-for-35 from beyond the arc in 2021-22, and she has made multiple 3-pointers four times. Her career total of 184 is the sixth-most ever at YSU.

EMPTYING THE NOTEBOOK

Captains: Chelsea Olson, Mady Aulbach and Megan Callahan were voted captains by their teammates and coaches for the 2021-22 season. Olson is the longest-tenured member of the program and a two-time Coach Ed DiGregorio Team MVP. Aulbach is a vocal leader and tenacious defender, and Callahan is in her first season as a Penguin since transferring from Robert Morris.

Eligibility Left: While there are four players listed as seniors on the roster, Chelsea Olson is the only who is in her final year of eligibility. Due to the NCAA's granted waiver in 2020-21 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Megan Callahan, Lindsey Mack and Lilly Ritz have two years of eligibility left.

Fans Back in Beeghly: By Horizon League policy, YSU did not have fans at any of its games in 2020-21. Prior to the Akron game on Nov. 15, only Mady Aulbach, Chelsea Olson and Jen Wendler had played in front of the hometown crowd at Beeghly Center. The game against Akron was YSU's first in front of home fans in 631 days.

Horizon League Openers Under Barnes:

YSU is 7-2 in Horizon League openers under Head Coach John Barnes. The two losses were by a combined seven points. While the 7-2 mark is impressive in its own right, its merit grows significantly compared with YSU's first 12 Horizon League openers. Prior to Barnes taking over in 2013-14, YSU was 3-9 all-time in its first Horizon League game.

Non-Conference Success: Dating back to the final two non-conference games of the 2017-18 season, Youngstown State has gone 21-7 in its last 28 non-league games. YSU won its last two in 2017-18, then went 8-3 in 2018-19 and 7-4 in 2019-20. The Penguins are 4-0 in non-league play in 2021-22.

Preseason Horizon League Poll: Chelsea Olson was voted to the Preseason All-Horizon League Second Team by the conference's coaches. It was the third time in Olson's career that she was named to the Preseason Second Team, and it was the fourth time that she earned a preseason nod. Olson was a thirdteam honoree in the 2020-21 postseason voting. In the team vote, YSU tied for the seventh-most votes with Wright State.

Returning Statistics: YSU returned just 29.7 percent of its points, 27 percent of its rebounds, 39.8 percent of its 3s and 40.8 percent of its minutes from last year's team That was a big difference from 2020-21 when the Penguins had 87.6 percent of its points, 90.7 percent of their rebounds, 94.1 percent of its 3-pointers and 85.6 percent of their minutes back from 2019-20.

Ritz Named HL Player of the Week: Lilly Ritz was named the Nike® Horizon League Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Nov. 22 following the opening week of conference play. She was YSU's first Player of the Week since Jan. 20, 2020. Ritz averaged 24.5 points and 7.0 rebounds while shooting 77.8 percent at Oakland and Detroit Mercy in the first two Horizon League games of her career.

QUICK HITTERS / GAME RESETS

Game 2 vs. Akron (11/15): 57 points was the lowest point total in a win since the Penguins won 56-46 at Saint Francis U on Dec. 7, 2019.

Game 3 at Oakland (11/18): YSU shot 56.3 percent from the field, which was its best effort on the road since shooting 56.4 percent at Milwaukee on Feb. 9, 2017. It was the fifthbest field-goal percentage for a road game in school history. Lilly Ritz went 10-for-12 from the field for an .833 field-goal percentage, which tied for the 16th-best performance in school history. Only six Penguins had made at least 10 field goals and posted a higher fieldgoal percentage.

Game 5 vs. LIU (11/26): YSU finished with 14 steals, which was its most against a Division I opponent in Head Coach John Barnes' eightplus seasons. The Penguins have had 15 twice under Barnes against non-DI teams. Chelsea Olson surpassed 700 career rebounds and 400 career assists.

Game 6 vs. Milwaukee (12/2): YSU led just 15-14 at halftime but went on a 21-2 run and scored 43 points in the second half. The Penguins had a stretch where they made 11of-13 from the field.

Game 7 vs. Green Bay (12/4): YSU made 15 3-pointers, which was tied for the third-most by a Horizon League team this season at the time. It tied for the fourth-most in a game in program history, and it was YSU's most 3-pointers in a game since Dec. 20, 2019. The Penguins beat Green Bay for the fifth time in 48 overall meetings and for the second time in the last three contests at Beeghly Center. Mady Aulbach had a career-high 12 rebounds – double her previous high. **Game 8 vs. Canisius (12/8):** Chelsea Olson went 12-for-16 from the field, including 10-for-11 inside the 3-point arc, and scored a careerhigh 28 points. They were the most points by a Penguin on the road since Alison Smolinski scored 29 at Canisius on Dec. 1, 2018. Olson became the first guard to have 12 field goals in a game since Heather Karner had 12 in the 2006-07 season opener.
