ACROSS THE BENCH

THE PENN STATE SERIES

Michigan and Penn State will meet for the 24th time in program history, with the series beginning in 2014. The Wolverines lead the overall series 13-10-0 and are 3-6-0 in State College. The two teams last met Jan. 19-20, 2018 in Ann Arbor where the Wolverines earned a weekend sweep, 4-0 and 3-2.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Finishing at 18-15-5 (9-10-5 B1G) last season, the Lions were among the top teams in the Big Ten conference and made their way into the Big Ten Semifinals where they narrowly lost to Notre Dame, 3-2.

Penn State's roster lost two of their top points leaders from last season in Andrew Sturtz (14 G, 28 A) and defenseman Trevor Hamilton (6 G, 23 A). Four of their top six point scorers are returning this year in Brandon Biro, Nate Sucece, Denis Smirnov, and Chase Berger.

The Nittany Lions are led by head coach Guy Gadowsky, who is in his seventh season at the helm and 20th overall season as an NCAA DI head coach. Gadowsky has led Penn State to two consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, and in 2016-17 led PSU to its most successful season in program history, compiling a record of 25-12-2 and winning the 2017 B1G Tournament. Prior to Penn State, Gadowsky was the bench boss at Princeton (2004-11) and Alaska-Fairbanks (1999-2004).

PENN STATE THIS YEAR

The Nittany Lions are hosting the Wolverines after starting their season 8-1-0. The Lions have had a consistently strong season, winning their first six games of the season until an overtime loss to Arizona State. They added two more wins to their season this past weekend against Robert Morris.

Junior forward Nikita Pavlychev and sophomore forward Alex Limoges lead PSU in points with 16 each; both players have seven goals and nine assists so far this season. Senior goaltender Chris Funkey (.905 SV%) has started four of the team's games and posted a 4-0-0 record. Junior goalie Peyton Jones (.919 SV%) has started the other five games and has a 4-1-0 record.

MICHIGAN NOTES

LAST WEEKEND

The Wolverines hosted No. 6 Notre Dame this past weekend (November 9-10). Michigan got off to a strong start, defeating the Irish Friday night, 2-1, before falling 6-2 on Saturday evening. Freshman netminder Strauss Mann earned the win on Friday in net while recording 26 saves.

NO JOSHIN' AROUND

Josh Norris sits at fifth in scoring points in the Big Ten conference and is tied for seventh in the country with 13 (6 G, 7 A). Norris has recorded points in eight out of the nine games so far this season.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAIN

Joe Ceconi's nine assists heading into the weekend are tied for fifth most amongst defensemen in the country and most amongst BIG defensemen.

SLAKE AND BAKE

Jake Slaker has recorded points in six out of the nine games this season, giving him a total of nine points (5 G, 4 A). The junior forward has had a strong season so far and scored one of the two goals in Friday's game.

POINT BLANK

Nick Blankenburg had a memorable Saturday night when he recorded his first collegiate goal. The blue-liner joins classmate Jack Olmstead in scoring their first goals in the Maize and Blue.

MANN HANDLING OPPONENTS

Strauss Mann got his third collegiate win this past Friday with 26 saves and increased his save percentage to .889 and goals against to 2.83.

THE 'SNL' LINE

Michigan's top line of Jake Slaker, Josh Norris, and Will Lockwood have accounted for 48% (14/29) of the team's goals thus far and have recorded a combined 29 points.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Michigan continues to show its scoring depth this season as twelve different Wolverines have found the back of the net for the teams 29 total goals heading into the weekend.

SUFFOCATING THE COMPETITION

Michigan heads into the weekend holding opponents to an average of 24.56 shots per game, the lowest average in the BIG and the tenth lowest in the country. On the other side of the ice Michigan is peppering opponents with an average of 35.11 shots per game, the third most in the country. That combination has led to U-M outshooting their opponents by 95 shots this year the fourth highest margin in the country.

YOUNG GUNS

Michigan's average age of 20 years, 294 days to start the season is the fifth youngest in the nation, trailing Boston University, Boston College, Denver and Wisconsin.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Wolverines freshman class of 10 is tied for the third largest in NCAA DI Men's Hockey, tied with Alaska, Michigan Tech, RIP and St. Lawrence.

PRO BLUE

With Cooper Marody set to make his NHL debut, Michigan has now had 98 alums make at least one appearance in the NHL. U-M had 21 alumni make an appearance during the 2017-18 season (third most in NCAA), including Jon Merrill, who played in the 2018 Stanley Cup Finals with the Golden Knights. Michigan also has alums represented in the AHL and in the ECHL. Additionally, multiple alumni are continuing their pro careers in Europe.

NHL PIPELINE

Michigan is one of 43 schools to have at least one NHL Draft pick on its roster, while its nine draftees ranks fifth in the nation behind Minnesota, Boston University, Boston College and Providence.

FIRST ROUNDERS

Michigan is one of two schools (Boston University, 4 total) to have at least two NHL first round draft picks on its roster (Quinn Hughes, 7th overall, 2018, Vancouver and Josh Norris, 19th overall, 2017, San Jose).

COLLEGE CONNECTION

Jason Botterill '97 is one of 11 NHL general managers to have played NCAA College Hockey.

HONORING A LEGEND

Red Berenson will be the sixth Wolverine to be inducted in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame, joining Vic Heyliger (1974), Willard Ikola (1990), John Matchefts (1991), Wally Grant (1994) and John MacInnis (2007). on Dec. 12 in Nashville, Tenn.

GOOD OLD HOCKEY BARN

Yost Ice Arena is tied with Baker Rink (Princeton) as the second oldest arena in college hockey, trailing Northeastern's Matthews Arena. *Yost did not serve as a hockey rink until 1973

HOME SWEET HOME

Last season, U-M scored 73 goals at home this season, putting them seventh in the country. An average of 3.84 goals per game at home put the Maize and Blue sixth in the country in home goals per game.

UP AHEAD

The Maize and Blue will host Wisconsin in a two-game series at Yost Ice Arena (November 23-24). The two teams have met 145 times in history, with Michigan taking the series 75-59-11. Puck drop is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. for both contests.

THE PEARSON FILE

- Mel Pearson was named the ninth head coach in University of Michigan hockey history on Monday, April 24, 2017.
- During his first season as the Michigan Head Coach, led the team to a 22-15-3 record, and a Frozen Four birth . He was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award.
- The Wolverines only suffered losses to three teams following the annual Great Lakes Invitational, which concluded January 2, 2018. Michigan won its last five regular season games in regulation before heading off to the Big Ten Tournament.
- Pearson led the Wolverines to an NCAA Northeast Regional Championship, defeating Northeastern and Boston University to return Michigan to the Frozen Four for a record 25th time.
- Pearson became the first coach in history to lead two different programs to NCAA Tournament berths in consecutive seasons and one of five coaches to lead a team to the Frozen Four in their first season at the helm in the past 20 years.
- Pearson returned to Ann Arbor following an impressive six-year stint as head coach at Michigan Tech. There, he led the Huskies to two NCAA Tournament appearances in his last three years while winning a WCHA regular-season title and a WCHA Championship in that span.
- Under Pearson's leadership, the Huskies finished the 2016-17 season ranked in the top 20 for a third consecutive year, all of them featuring 20-win campaigns. Pearson also earned two WCHA Coach of the Year honors in his time at Michigan Tech, which claimed the program's first-ever No. 1 national ranking on Nov. 17, 2014.
- Pearson served as a U-M assistant coach from 1988-89 through 1998-99 and as associate head coach from 1999-2000 through 2010-11. He played an integral role in developing the Michigan program into one of the most successful in the country.
- During his first tenure in Ann Arbor, U-M posted a 667-243-71 record while capturing 11 Central Collegiate Hockey Association regular-season titles, nine CCHA Tournament crowns, two NCAA championships (1996 and 1998), and making 11 NCAA Frozen Four appearances.
- After he helped Michigan to the 1999-2000 CCHA regular-season championship, Pearson was awarded the Terry Flanagan Award by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, which honors an assistant coach's career body of work. Pearson also served as a coach with the 1996 United States World Junior Championship team, and helped the Americans to a silver medal, the country's second-best finish at the event.
- Pearson's prep (Willard Ikola) and college (John MacInnes) mentors earned varsity letters as goaltenders at Michigan. Pearson was a standout high school player for Ikola (1952-54) at Edina East (Minn.) High School, while playing his collegiate career out at Michigan Technological University under MacInnes (1946-50), one of college hockey's legendary coaches.

BILL MUCKALT

THE MUCKALT FILE

- Muckalt is in his second season as associate head coach for the Wolverines. A four-year letterwinner (1995-98) and two-time national champion at Michigan, Muckalt returned to his alma mater after spending two seasons as head coach and general manager of the Tri-City Storm of the United States Hockey League.
- In his two seasons with Tri-City, Muckalt's team was 49-46-16-9 and captured its first Clark Cup in franchise history in 2015-16.
- In 2014-15 alongside Pearson, Muckalt helped guide Michigan Tech to a 29-10-2 record, which tied for the most wins in college hockey, and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Huskies earned their first No. 1 national ranking since 1976 that year.
- Began his coaching career at Eastern Michigan with its American Collegiate Hockey Association DI team in 2006-07 before moving up to head coach the following season.
- Had a five-year NHL career with the Vancouver Canucks, New York Islanders, Ottawa Senators and Minnesota Wild. Muckalt tallied 97 career points (40 goals, 57 assists).
- In four years, he helped the Wolverines to 133 wins and two national championships while posting 105 career goals and 226 total points.
- Ranks seventh in U-M history in points, sixth in goals, and ninth in assists (121). First-team All-American and a Hobey Baker Award finalist as a senior in 1997-98.
- A Surrey, British Columbia, native, Muckalt graduated from Michigan in 1998 with a degree in sports management and communications.

BRIAN WISEMAN

THE WISEMAN FILE

- Brian Wiseman is in his eighth season as an assistant coach for Michigan. A standout center for the Wolverines from 1990-94, Wiseman returned to Michigan in June 2011 after spending the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach for the American Hockey League's Houston Aeros.
- In 2015-16, he coached Michigan's nation-leading power play unit, as the Wolverines nished the season 48/150 (32.0%) on the man advantage.
- In 166 career games for Michigan, Wiseman recorded 348 points, which ranks third all-time at U-M; his 164 assists are second-best.
- Wiseman was a member of U-M's first CCHA regular-season championship team (91-92) and its first CCHA Tournament winner (94); he won a second CCHA regular-season crown in 1993-94
- Wiseman's four years at Michigan started the school's streak of 21 consecutive Tournament berths, a national record. His teams reached the 92 and 93 Frozen Four. As a senior captain in 93-94, he led U-M in scoring (19-50- 69), was a Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist and first-team All-American
- A selection of the New York Rangers in the 1991 NHL Entry Draft, Wiseman debuted the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1996-97. He had six strong seasons between the IHL and AHL. In 446 career minor league games, he totaled 515 points (145 goals, 370 assists). In 1998-99, he was the IHL's leading scorer and MVP, leading the Aeros to the Turner Cup
- Wiseman holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in physical education. A native of Chatham, Ontario, Wiseman and his wife, Brandee, reside in Ann Arbor with their two daughters Chloe and Cameron.

THE SHIELDS FILE

- Steve Shields is in his fourth season on Michigan's staff. e first NCAA goalie to reach 100 career wins (111), Shields helped lead the hockey program back to prominence as part of the first class in Red Berenson's tenure to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament four straight years..
- With Shields in net, Michigan won two regular-season Central Collegiate Hockey Association titles and made back-to-back Frozen Four appearances in 1992-93. Shields earned All-CCHA first team and All-America second team honors as a junior and senior.
- A Buffalo Sabres draft pick, Shields played 12 years of professional hockey, including 10 seasons as an NHL goalie (1996-2006)
- A North Bay, Ontario native, he played for six NHL teams (Buffalo, San Jose, Anaheim, Boston, Florida, Atlanta), appearing in 246 games with an 80-104-40 career record, a 2.67 goals-against average and .907 save percentage.
- Shields was taught by four of the hockey world's most respected goaltending coaches: Mitch Korn (Buffalo), Warren Strelow (San Jose), Wayneomas (San Jose) and Francois Allaire (Anaheim)
- Shields served under Pearson as a volunteer assistant coach at Michigan Tech from 2011-13 before joining the Florida Panthers as a goaltending consultant in the summer of 2013.
