#### Coch Washington's Availability

All interview requests for head coach Coquese Washington should be directed to Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will hold weekly press conferences during the season. A schedule is available by calling the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

#### Player Interviews

All player interviews must be arranged through Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Coquese Washington's weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off.

Players will return phone calls only upon clearance with the Strategic Communications office. They may also be scheduled for one-on-one interviews in person. Player phone numbers will not be released.

Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the post-game media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

#### Credentials

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Greg Campbell. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8.

#### Photographers

A photo pass must be issued to gain courtside access at the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Greg Campbell, one week in advance for photo passes.

Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

#### Radio Networks

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting stations are provided one phone line and one ISDN line, and are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area.

#### Press Row Seating

To access the press seating area, turn left out of the media room, walk down the hallway and take the elevator to the Concourse level. Please allow several minutes when taking the elevator to press row or the media room.

When leaving the elevator, turn right. The press area is at Portal 23. Final statistics and a running play-by-play will be available in the media room following the game.

Game notes will be provided at least one day in advance of each game. Penn State, Big Ten and opposing team game notes will be available in the media room two hours prior to each game. - » Minnesota enters the game with a 12-11 overall record and a 3-7 mark in Big Ten play.
- » The Golden Gophers are averaging 75.5 points per game and own a narrow plus-0.6 scoring margin on the season.
- » Though the rebounding margin is slight, Minnesota ranks No. 6 nationally in rebounding at 44.7 rebounds per game. The Gophers also sit No. 2 nationally with 16 offensive boards per game.

- » Penn State is 3-2 overall in the last five games, averaging 76.0 points per contest, while allowing 70.4 points, making the scoring margin plus-5.6 points per game
- » The Lady Lions are plus-4.6 on the boards over the last five games, averaging 41.2 rebounds per game, including 12.8 rebounds on the offensive glass.
- » Penn State has 70 assists, 35 steals and 22 blocked shots over the last five games.
- » **Teniya Page** is averaging 20.4 points per game over her last five contests - all starts - and has added 22 assists (4.4 apg) and 18 boards (3.6 rpg).
- » Page is shooting 23-of-24 from the free throw line (.958) and 13-of-26 from 3-point range (.500).

**B1G Winning Streaks**

- » Penn State extended its winning streak to 12 games vs. Northwestern with a 74-58 victory on Sunday, Feb. 5, 2017.
- » The Blue and White own just three winning streaks of 10-plus games in the 25 seasons in the Big Ten Conference, including the current streak vs. the Wildcats.
- » The other two streaks include a pair of 12-game winning streaks: vs. Minnesota from Feb. 19, 1995-Jan. 6, 2003 and against vs. Northwestern from Jan. 30, 1998-Feb. 1, 2004.
- » Penn State also owns nine-game winning streaks against Indiana and Wisconsin during their time as conference opponents.

- » The 1994-95 squad turned the ball over six times at Northwestern (2/12/95) and nine times vs. Iowa (2/17/95), while the 2003-04 team had nine missteps each vs. Minnesota (1/22/04) and Ohio State (1/25/04).

- » On Monday, Jan. 16, Penn State topped Wisconsin, 76-46, for a 30-point margin of victory.

- » Penn State played its sixth game all-time on New Year's Eve at Rutgers, falling 61-45, to fall to 2-4 on the final day of the year.

- » **Teniya Page** is not going to dominate the ball or force many shots, but the sophomore has the ability to take over a game on a moments notice.
- » The ability to score in bunches and do so in spurts has helped the Chicago area product to quickly move into the upper echelon of scoring leaders in Penn State history.
- » Her 16.8 points per game in 52 career games - all starts - ranks her tied for No. 5 on the all-time scoring average list with Tyra Grant (2007-10). **MORE ON PAGE 10.**

### Reaching Double Figures

- » In 53 career games, **Teniya Page** has reached double-figures in the scoring column on 45 occasions, including a streak of nine-straight games from Nov. 25-Dec. 28, 2016. **MORE ON PAGE 14 & 36**

- » Overall, Page has led the team in scoring on 24 occasions and paced the team in assists in 30 contests.

**Tough Down the Stretch**

Moore Is Better

- » Senior **Sierra Moore** missed the entire 2015-16 season due to injury, meaning her last on-court appearance before the 2016-17 season opener came on March 3, 2015 in the Big Ten Tournament.
- » Her absence spanned 617 days before she returned on Friday, Nov. 11, 2016 at Drexel.
- » Against the Dragons, Moore tied for the team lead with 15 points, connecting on 7-of-8 shots from the floor and 1-of-2 attempts from the free throw line. She added four rebounds and two assists in 32 minutes on the floor.

Starting Five

- » After missing all of 2015-16 due to injury, **Sierra Moore** made her first start of the season at Rutgers on Jan. 31, 2016 and has started four games in 2016-17, so far.
- » Her last start had come vs. Indiana on March 4, 2015 at the Big Ten Tournament, a start that made her the only Lady Lion to start all 30 games in 2014-15.
- » She scored 14 points for the Lady Lions and grabbed five rebounds, with two steals and one assist.
- » Moore has seen her name in the starting lineup in each of the last seven games, averaging 11.0 points and 5.8 rebounds during that stretch.

Benching It

- » Through the first 16 games of 2016-17, senior **Sierra Moore** made just one start, but that was not something the fifth-year college player was going to let have an effect on her game.
- » Mostly coming off the bench, Moore ranks No. 3 on the team in scoring and No. 4 on the team in rebounding.
- » Her efforts and example have led to one of the most productive benches in recent years for the Blue and White. This season the Penn State reserves are averaging 24.7 points per game, nearly 12.0 points per game better than the opposition.

Different Degrees of Moore

- » Senior guard **Sierra Moore** walked across the stage at the Bryce Jordan Center last April as a member of The Pennsylvania State University's graduating class of 2016.
- » The Hanover, Pa., native accepted her diploma, a B.A. in broadcast & journalism, and is now working on a master's degree in human resources & employment relations.
- » Moore missed the 2015-16 season due to injury (knee), after averaging 12.1 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.8 assists in 2014-15.

Loving the Game

- » In three-plus seasons on the University Park campus, senior **Sierra Moore** has appeared in just 40 games, but that is not a reflection of her skill or ability on the court.
- » Moore began her collegiate career as at Duke University and played in 25 games as a true freshman.
- » She transferred following the 2012-13 season and sat out the 2013-14 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules.
- » After being the only player to start all 30 games during the 2014-15 campaign, Moore missed the entire 2015-16 campaign due to injury (knee).
- » **Perspective:** In her first 1,095 days on campus, Moore had played in only 30 basketball games.

### Careful Carter

- » Early on as a collegiate basketball student-athlete, **Amari Carter** is already making an impact in the right ways.
- » Her 2.83 assist to turnover ratio is No. 3 in the Big Ten and sits No. 14 in the NCAA.
- » Her 4.4 assists per game are tops on the team and No. 10 in the Big Ten.
- » In 23 games, the floor general has 11 games with at least five assists and two-or-fewer turnovers.
- » Overall, Carter has 19 games with two-or-fewer turnovers and 11 games with at least five assists.

### Turtle Power

- » **Amari Carter** honed her skills at St. John's College High School in Washington D.C., with her high school gym just nine miles from the University of Maryland's XFINITY Center.
- » On Jan. 11, she played her first collegiate game in front of her hometown faithful and delivered one of the finest performances of her career.
- » Against the Terps, Carter netted a career-high 22 points on 11-of-19 shooting, added a game-high-tying eight assists and only posted two turnovers in a career-high 39 minutes on the court.
- » She pulled down four rebounds and added one steal to her stat line vs. the Terps.

### Helping Hand

- » Amari Carter is looking to become the fourth different player in the last four years to lead the team in assists.
- » It would be the first time in school history that four different players topped the assist charts in consecutive seasons. From 1983-84 to 2012-13 (30 years), only nine Lady Lions led the team in assists, with seven of them doing so for four-straight years.
- » Carter looks poised to become the next in the long line of Point Guard U protégés, averaging 4.4 assists per game through 23 contests.
- » Her 102 assists on the season sit No. 10 on the Penn State freshman charts, passing Tina Nicholson's total of 100 from 1992-93 in 28 games for the tenth spot.
- » She has led the team in assists on 12 occasions this season, including 10 games with at least five helpers.



### Green No Longer

- » Your true freshman season is a time of growth. It is a time to develop your game and show the coaches that you are prepared to play at a high level and that is just what **Jaida Travascio-Green** has done.
- » After coming off the bench during the non-conference slate, Travascio-Green made her starting lineup debut on Jan. 3, 2017 vs. Iowa on the Big Ten Network.
- » She responded with a 16-point effort and has continued to progress her game since then.
- » She has started each of the last nine games and vs. Wisconsin posted 10 points to help the Blue and White to a 30-point win over the Badgers.

- » Travascio-Green ranks tied for No. 7 on the freshman 3-pointers made charts entering the game with 36 connections from deep, equaling teammate Teniya Page's 36 makes from last season.
- » She needs just four makes from distance in the last five games to move into the No. 5 spot, trailing **Tyra Grant** (39, 2006-07) and teammate **Lindsey Spann** (37, 2014-15).
- » The rookie also sits among the top-10 in freshman history in 3-point efficiency, checking in at No. 8 with a 36.0 percent connection rate from distance.

### JTG Breaks Out at San Juan Shootout

- » True freshman **Jaida Travascio-Green** enjoyed her finest week on the collegiate stage, averaging a team-best 13.0 points per game and shooting 80.0 percent from the field while at the San Juan Shootout.
- » The rookie connected on 6-of-8 shots from 3-point range on the weekend.
- » Travascio-Green poured in a career-high 18 points and grabbed a career-best six rebounds against Georgia State, shooting 5-of-7 from 3-point range.
- » Against Georgetown, she scored eight points and didn't miss a shot. She was 2-of-2 from the field - including one triple - and hit all three of her free throws. She added four more rebounds vs. the Hoyas.

### 2016 Pink Zone at Penn State

- » The 11th Annual Play4Kay Game benefitting Pink Zone at Penn State is slated for Sunday, February 26 in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » The 2016 contest was the highest scoring affair in the 10 years of the event, with the two teams combining for 178 points.
- » The 2016 fundraising efforts finished at \$220,000, moving the streak to \$200,000 funds raised to five-straight years.
- » 640 cancer survivors attended the game vs. Michigan, with 4,203 years of survivorship gathering on the court during the halftime celebration.

### An Event Like No Other

- » Penn State was the first team in the NCAA to don pink uniforms, debuting the threads on Feb. 4, 2007 against Wisconsin at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » The Lady Lion program has been honored as the Play 4 Kay Division I initiative winner twice in program history, winning the award in 2013 and 2014.

### More Than Just a Game

- » The Lady Lions own a 6-4 record in Pink Zone at Penn State games, including a five-game winning streak from 2010-2014.
- » Pink Zone at Penn State has raised nearly \$1.6 million in funds through its first 10 years, including a record \$310,000 in 2014.
- » The event began in 2007 with \$20,490 raised and 31 cancer survivors in attendance and has grown into an event that annually raises over \$200,000 (five straight years) and welcomes over 600 cancer survivors.
- » In 2016, Penn State raised \$220,000 and 640 cancer survivors joined the Lady Lions in the BJC.
- » This year, Pink Zone's six beneficiaries include; Mount Nittany Medical Center, Penn State Cancer Institute, Kay Yow Cancer Fund, PA Breast Cancer Coalition, JC Blair Memorial Hospital and Geisinger-Lewistown Hospital.

- » Penn State's turnover margin of +2.74 ranks No. 4 in the Big Ten and No. 60 nationally.
- » Merely forcing turnovers hasn't been enough for the Lady Lions, as they have turned those turnovers into 477 points, or an average of 20.7 points per game.

### Bench Warmers

- » The Penn State reserves have given the team a huge lift this season and are averaging 24.7 points per game, which is more than double it's average from a season ago.
- » As a team, Penn State holds a plus-12.0 points per game average in bench scoring, 24.7-12.7.
- » Senior **Sierra Moore** was a catalyst off the bench before moving into a starting role, averaging 8.2 points per game in 15 appearances off the pine.
- » Five players average better than 5.0 points per game when coming off the bench this season.
- » Senior **Peyton Whitted** at 6.4 ppg in 21 games as a reserve, while true freshman **Jaida Travascio-Green** was adding 5.6 points when coming off the bench, prior to moving into the starting five.
- » More recently, junior **Lindsey Spann** and senior **Kalayah Mitchell** have moved into a bench role. Both are making an impact, averaging 8.6 and 8.7 points per game, respectively.
- » **Perspective:** In 2015-16, Penn State's bench scored just 10.6 points per game and only **Candice Agee** averaged better than 5.0 points per game for the season.

### 3-Point Prowess

- » Penn State has shown a tendency to connect on the shot from distance this season, averaging 6.5 makes per game from 3-point range.
- » Penn State currently ranks No. 5 in the Big Ten and No. 108 nationally in 3-pointers made per game (6.5 mpg).
- » The Lady Lions have connected on at least eight 3-pointers in 10 games in 2016-17.
- » The Lady Lions are on pace to move into the upper echelon in school history for makes from 3-point range in a single season.
- » Penn State is on pace to make over 190 3-point shots this season, which would rank among the top-5 in school history.

### 30-Point Pair

- » Sophomore **Teniya Page** and junior **Lindsey Spann** have done something no other Penn State tandem has ever done: produce 30-point games in the same season twice.
- » The duo became just the second set of teammates to post 30-point games in the same season during the 2015-16 campaign, joining Maren Walseth (35; vs. Michigan, 1/27/2000) and Lisa Shepard (31; vs. St. Joseph's, 11/27/1999) during the 1999-2000 season.
- » Page scored 31 points vs. Michigan on Jan. 17, 2016, while Spann had 30 points at Minnesota on Jan. 3, 2016.
- » The pair has combined for three 30-point games so far in 2016-17, with Spann pouring in a career-high 31 points vs. Saint Peter's on Nov. 13 and Page going for 31 points vs. Marshall on Dec. 3 and 30 vs. American on Dec. 18.

### Scoreboard Workout

- » Penn State wanted to make sure they played at the pace that head coach **Coquese Washington** wanted and to be sure all of the scoreboard's lights were working with a 106-point effort vs. Saint Peter's.
- » The 106-50 win marked the 49th time in program history the Lady Lions hit the century mark and their 106 points are tied for 19th on the all-time single game scoring list.
- » Furthermore, Penn State scored 64 points in the first half, marking the first time the Lady Lions scored over 60 points in a half since November 8, 2013 vs. Saint Francis (Pa.).
- » The 106-point game against Saint Peter's was the first time the Lady Lions scored over 100 points since beating Saint Francis (Pa.), 117-77 in 2013.
- » The Lady Lions won by 56 points, the largest margin of victory since a 101-44 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2, 2012.

**Toppling Rocky Top**

- » Penn State came close last season in Knoxville, but Tennessee was able to hold on for a victory on Nov. 18 in Thompson-Boling Arena, but on Nov. 20, 2016, the Lady Lions came through with a 70-56 defeat of the Lady Vols.
- » The Blue and White picked up its first double-digit win over a top-25 team since it defeated No. 23/22 Iowa 87-71 Jan. 5, 2014.
- » The Lady Lions improved to 2-9 all-time against Tennessee, with both wins coming at home. The victory Saturday was preceded by a 79-74 victory in Rec Hall on Jan. 27, 1985.
- » Head coach **Coquese Washington** now has 22 wins over ranked opponents in her 10 seasons at the helm of the Lady Lion program.

**900 In the Books**

- » In its 53rd season playing women's basketball, Penn State became just the 16th program in Division I women's basketball to earn 900 victories in program history with a convincing win over Saint Peter's, 106-50, on Sunday, Nov. 13.
- » Penn State joins Big Ten brethren Ohio State, Maryland and Rutgers in the exclusive 900-win club.

**Starting Strong at Home**

- » Penn State won each of its first seven home games, marking the 15th time in program history started with at least seven victories to open the home slate.
- » Head coach **Coquese Washington** won the first seven games of a home slate in three of her 10 seasons.
- » The Lady Lions have 10 unblemished seasons at home, including the 2012-13 squad that went 14-0 and the 2002-03 which won a school-record 16 games.

**Opening on the Road**

- » Penn State opened a season on the road for the first time since the 2010-11 season (at Dayton) with an 83-60 loss at Drexel on Friday, Nov. 11.
- » Since 2006-07, Penn State has now opened on the road four times; at Dayton (2010-11) and at Drexel (2016-17, 2009-10 and 2006-07).
- » Starting its 53rd season on the road, Penn State has opened with a true road game on 18 occasions. The Lady Lions are 11-7 in those contests, with the season-opening loss to the Dragons snapping a three-game winning streak.

**First Timers**

- » The 2016-17 season brings five new teams to the Lady Lion record books, with four of the five games being played at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » Penn State posted a 5-0 record against teams it met for the first time; defeating Akron, Georgia State, Iona, Marshal and Saint Peter's.

**BALL CONTROL**

- » Penn State picked up right where it left off during the 2015-16 season: limiting turnovers. After becoming just the fifth Lady Lion squad to average under 15.0 turnovers per game last year, they are sitting among that company again this season.
- » Of the top-10 seasons in fewest turnovers, four of them have come under head coach **Coquese Washington**.

- » Mitchell secured her 500th rebound in the opening game of the 2016 Big Ten Tournament vs. Illinois and corralled career rebound No. 600 vs. Wisconsin on Jan. 16, 2017, just 19 games later.
- » Mitchell currently sits No. 20 on the career rebound charts with 632 caroms.
- » For Whitted, she notched rebound No. 500 vs. Georgetown on Nov. 25 in Dayton Beach, Fla., thanks largely to her 256-rebound season in 2015-16.
- » Overall, Whitted ranks No. 25 on the list with 594 rebounds.

### Boykin Strong in Debut

- » Redshirt-freshman **De'Janae Boykin** waited a season and a half for the day to come. After transferring from Connecticut last season and missing the first 10 games of 2016-17 due to NCAA Transfer rules, Boykin finally suited up for her first collegiate basketball game vs. American on Dec. 18.

### #WePlayOn

- » Penn State ended the WNBA season with three players on active rosters, including **Tanisha Wright**, who helped the New York Liberty to the third-best record in the league.
- » Wright ended her 12th season in the league with 6.7 points and 3.6 assists per game.
- » Her assists-per-game average ranked 16th in the WNBA and she moved into No. 13 in league history with 1,231 helpers in 393 career regular season games.
- » **Alex Bentley** finished her third season in Connecticut and ranked among the top-30 in the WNBA in scoring average (22nd, 12.9), minutes played per game (25, 28.8), 3-pointers made (8th, 48) and assists (29th, 85).
- » Bentley was an All-Star in 2015, scoring a team-best 23 points off the bench for the East to go along with five assists.
- » **Maggie Lucas** missed the 2016 season due to injury (knee), after seeing action in 30 games during 2015, helping the Fever to an Eastern Conference title and a WNBA Finals.

### Naming Captains

- » After a summer of growth and improvements on and off the court, the Penn State women's basketball team named seniors **Kaliyah Mitchell** and **Peyton Whitted**, and sophomore **Sarah McMurtry** as tri-captains for the 2016-17 season.
- » Mitchell won't be the first to raise her voice, but her actions on the court and in the classroom speak loud enough. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten performer, she also ranks among the school's career leaders in rebounds and free throw percentage.
- » Whitted's leadership role continued to expand following her breakout junior campaign. Whitted is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten performer that spent the summer interning with WPSU Penn State as a member of their video production unit and leading workouts with younger players.
- » Every team needs someone that continually places team before self, and McMurtry embodies what it is to be a great teammate. After joining the team as a walk-on in October 2015, she quickly stood out as one of the hardest working and most respected players in the program.

### McDonald's All-Americans

- » The Lady Lions have a pair of McDonald's High School All-Americans suiting up this season in redshirt-freshman **De'Janae Boykin** and graduate student Sierra Moore.
- » Boykin was a part of the 2015 game, while Moore was among a pair of current or former Lady Lions to suit up in the 2012 contest, joining Candice Agee.
- » Prior to **Coquese Washington** taking the reins, the Lady Lions only had one McDonald's High School All-American in program history, but now boast seven total.
- » Since arriving in Happy Valley, Washington has attracted six McDonald's All-Americans;

### Robinson Bestowed Silver Anniversary Award

- » Lady Lion legend Susan Robinson Fruchtl was selected as one of six recipients of the 2017 NCAA Silver Anniversary Award, bestowed upon outstanding former student-athletes on the 25th anniversary of the end of their intercollegiate eligibility.
- » The Silver Anniversary Awards will be presented at the Honors Celebration in Nashville on January 18.
- » Robinson Fruchtl is the first Big Ten women's basketball student-athlete to earn the Silver Anniversary Award.
- » After four seasons on the court for the blue and white, graduated in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in exercise and sports science. She also earned a master's degree in higher education from Penn State in 1998 and a master's degree in secondary guidance from Slippery Rock University in 2000.
- » The fourth Penn State student-athlete to receive the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award, Robinson Fruchtl joins Mike Reid (1995), Dave Joyner (1997) and Todd Blackledge (2008) as honorees to don the blue and white.
- » Robinson is one of only two players in Penn State history to score 2,000 points and record 1,000 rebounds.

Upon arriving on the University Park campus as the fifth head coach in Penn State women's history - and first female African-American head coach in Penn State history - Coquee Washington quickly returned the program to national prominence with her up-tempo, aggressive style of play. Entering her 10th season on the sideline in Happy Valley, her passion for creating a winning culture, predicated on innovative coaching techniques, tireless recruiting, cultivating meaningful relationships with student-athletes and an unmatched enthusiasm for teaching the game she loves, Washington is in the conversation as one of the nation's top head coaches.

Washington has seen success at every level of basketball and in every role she has filled on the sidelines. She became the first player at Flint Central High School to earn a starting position all four seasons and helped her squad to the program's first Saginaw Valley League and district championships, while earning all-state honors on two occasions.

She went on to earn four varsity letters at the University of Notre Dame, leading the team in steals four times and assists on three occasions, before moving on to professional basketball where she was a member of the 2000 WNBA Champion Houston Comets squad.

On the sidelines, she has appeared in the postseason 13 times, with 12 of those being NCAA Tournament appearances. She helped the Lady Lions to four straight berths in the NCAA Tournament - including a pair of Sweet Sixteen appearances - and was an assistant coach on Notre Dame's 2001 NCAA National Championship team. Her three straight Big Ten Championships make her one of just four coaches in Big Ten history with three-or-more consecutive Big Ten regular season championships (Jim Foster, Ohio State; C. Vivian Stringer, Iowa & Tara VanDerveer, Ohio State), taking home outright crowns in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the 2014 title.

### Growing the Game

The professionals that are most successful often share one trait; they are thinkers, and Washington is no different. As a student-athlete at Notre Dame, Washington earned her degree in just three years. After her collegiate career was complete, Washington went on to earn her Juris Doctorate from her alma mater, while simultaneously playing in the professional ranks for the American Basketball League's (ABL) Portland Power. Her passion for learning is matched only by her love of family and basketball.

Washington has served on the WBCA Board of Directors since becoming Penn State's head coach, currently holding the role of President with the organization that is tasked with solving issues, preserving the history and growing the game of women's basketball. She was also the Vice President/President-Elect from 2013-15.

Her service to the game also includes time with USA Basketball, the Kay Yow Cancer Fund and the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She won a gold medal with Team USA in Kazan, Russia at the 2013 World University Games and served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Committee from 2009-12. Her work with the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors ran from 2012-15 and she served five years on the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

Of her many accomplishments, Washington was the founding President of the WNBA Players Association in 1999 and was a primary force in negotiating the association's first two collective bargaining agreements.

### Recruiting Premier Talent

The recruiting trail has always been a place of success for Washington, with the Lady Lions signing four top-25 recruiting classes - including three top-15 classes - since her arrival in Happy Valley. Her top-25 recruiting classes have included a pair of 14th-ranked classes (2009, 2013), one that sat at No. 15 (2015) and one that came in 22nd nationally (2010).

Prior to Washington's arrival, Penn State had only signed one McDonald's All-American in program history, but the seasoned recruiter has brought six to campus in her nine years as head coach. Candice Agee (2012), Brianna Banks (2011), De'Janae Boykin (2015), Maggie Lucas (2010), Sierra Moore (2012) and Dara Taylor (2009) have all donned the McDonald's All-American uniform before matriculating to the University Park campus.

Led by the All-American duo of Indiana native Alex Bentley and Lone Star State product Nikki Greene, Washington's 2009 class also included all-state performers Gizelle Studevent (California) and Marissa Wolfe (Pennsylvania), along with transfer Mia Nickson (Virginia), who was a top-100 recruit coming out of high school in 2008. In 2010, Washington landed a pair of Pennsylvania's top players in shooting guard Maggie Lucas and forward Talia East, while the three-person class was boosted by New York wing and WBCA High School All-American Arielle Edwards.

In 2013, Washington and her staff inked a seven-person class that included four ESPN HoopGurlz Top-100 players, including the Georgia duo of Kaliyah Mitchell and Peyton Whitted, and Maryland guard Lindsey Spann. The 2013 class was also bolstered by the addition of Duke transfer Sierra Moore, who was a top-50 national recruit in the class of 2012.

A pair of five-star guards in Chicago native Teniya Page and Maryland product Amari Carter led the way for the class of 2015. Adding to a strong recruiting haul was the highly recruited post pair of Kentucky's Ashanti Thomas and Boston-area product Jaylen Williams.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater. One of the top recruiters in the country, Washington was instrumental in helping the Irish secure eight consecutive top-25 recruiting classes, a feat only accomplished by two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee).



**WNBA: Pioneer and Pupils**

A pioneer in advancing the WNBA both on and off the court, Washington continues to supply the league with top notch talent, including six Penn Staters play in the world's most competitive professional league.

Alex Bentley and Maggie Lucas are two of Washington's pupils succeeding on the grand stage, with Bentley playing in the WNBA Finals as a rookie and earning WNBA All-Star status in 2015. Lucas also competed in the WNBA Finals, helping the Indiana Fever to the WNBA Championship series against the Minnesota Lynx during the 2015 season.

In 2014, Lucas was selected with the 21st overall pick (second round) by the Phoenix Mercury, then was traded to the Indiana Fever during training camp. In her third year as a professional, Lucas saw her court time increase each season, before suffering a season-ending injury in the fourth game of the 2016 campaign. Also in 2014, Ariel Edwards inked a free agent contract with the Tulsa Shock.

In 2013, for the third time in program history, the Lady Lion program saw a pair of student-athletes selected in the WNBA Draft. Alex Bentley went 13th overall to the Atlanta Dream and Nikki Greene was selected 26th overall by the Phoenix Mercury. Bentley has found a home with the Connecticut Sun after competing one season for the Atlanta Dream, and playing in the WNBA Finals that year. A WNBA All-Rookie selection in 2013, she was among the MVP candidates in 2015 before missing the final nine games of the season with an injury.

Greene played two years in the league, suiting up for the Los Angeles Sparks in 2014 before teaming up with Bentley in Connecticut during the 2015 season.

Tyra Grant capped off her career by being selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the 2010 WNBA Draft, and Washington was also instrumental in helping Kam Gissendanner sign a free agent contract with the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks following in the 2008 campaign. Ariel Edwards and Zhaque Gray have also signed free agent contracts with WNBA teams, inking deals with the Tulsa Shock and Chicago Sky, respectively, in 2014.

During her time at Notre Dame, Washington saw seven players earn roster spots on WNBA teams.

**Dancing Shoes**

In 17 years as a collegiate coach, Washington has laced up her dancing shoes and headed to the postseason on 13 occasions, including 12 trips of the NCAA Tournament. While coaching the Blue and White, Washington has guided the program to four NCAA Tournament berths and one appearance in the WNIT.

From 2011-14, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament each season, reaching at least the second round on all four occasions. The 2012 and 2014 squads moved on to the Sweet Sixteen with a pair of postseason wins, before falling to top-five ranked opponents.

In their fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, the 2014 squad hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament inside the Bryce Jordan Center for the 14th time in school history. Wins over Wichita State in the opening round and a 22-point rout of Florida in the second round sent the program to its 13th Sweet Sixteen. A date with No. 5/6 Stanford awaited in Palo Alto, as the No. 3 seed Lady Lions fell to the No. 2 seed Cardinal at Maples Pavilion to close out a 24-8 campaign, which included a Big Ten regular season title.

In 2013, Penn State again advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a win over Cal Poly in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The 26-6 campaign ended with a loss to LSU on their home court. Lady Lions advanced to the 2012 Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU in Baton Rouge before falling to No. 3/3 Connecticut en route to a 26-7 overall record.

The Lady Lions worked their way back to the "Big Dance" for the first time since 2004-05 and advanced to the second round for the first time in seven years with a win over Dayton in the first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament in front of a raucous Bryce Jordan Center crowd. Washington's first appearances in the tournament as a head coach started with a 75-66 win over Dayton.

Washington's first taste of postseason play as a head coach came against Hofstra in the 2010 WNIT. The Lady Lions hosted the contest on the University Park campus, but the Pride got the best of a young Lady Lions squad in the opening round.

During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame reached the NCAA Tournament each season, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and the 2001 National Championship.

**Trophies & All-Americans**

Washington's competitive side shines brightest on the biggest stages and that is a trait that her teams have taken on as well during her tenure on the University Park campus. Washington's teams have advanced out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in all four of their trips, while earning berths in the Sweet Sixteen twice.

From 2012-14, the Lady Lions claimed three straight Big Ten regular season titles, making them one of just four teams in conference history to win three-or-more regular season titles in a row. Washington's squads took the title outright in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the crown in 2014.

Washington is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2012, 2013 & 2014), a two-time WBCA Region Six Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013) and two-time finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013). She was also selected as the 2011 and 2014 Black Coaches Association (BCA) Female Coach of the Year.

On the national awards front, Washington's players have earned a host of national honors from All-America laurels to honors for community service and selflessness. Maggie Lucas finished her Penn State career as one of the most decorated student-athletes to pass through the Lady Lion program. Lucas was a two-time finalist for the Wade Trophy and Wooden Award, while earning nine All-American honors, including first team honors from the United State Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) in 2013 and 2014. She was a three-time AP All-American, garnering second team (2013), third team (2014) and honorable mention (2012) accolades during her career.

Alex Bentley was a two-time All-American, earning AP honorable mention laurels in 2013, and WBCA naming her honorable mention All-America in 2012 and 2013. One of the toughest defenders in the nation and a scoring threat from anywhere on the court, Bentley was the 2013 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner as the nation's top player under 5-foot-8.

Bentley and Lucas were both named to Freshman All-America teams during their rookie seasons of 2010 and 2011, respectively, while Tyra Grant was Washington's first All-American, garnering honorable mention honors in 2010 from the Associated Press.

On-court accolades are not the only ones celebrated by the Lady Lion program, with Gizelle Studevent and Maggie Lucas each earning national attention for their off-court undertakings, as well. Studevent was a member of the 2013 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team, honoring student-athletes that have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. Studevent was the lifeblood of the anti-bullying program Penn State Athletes Take Action (PSATA). Earning a selection to the 2014 Senior CLASS Award All-American Team, Lucas was one of 10 women's basketball student-athletes to be celebrated for the award that is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School.

During her tenure at Notre Dame, Washington coached five All-Americans in her role as the guards coach, and was directly responsible for developing three All-Americans and two Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winners: Niele Ivey and Megan Duffy. Washington also worked with Alicia Ratay, who is the NCAA's career 3-point field goal percentage leader.

### Big Things Happening

In nine seasons on the sideline, Washington has seen 15 players earn All-Big Ten laurels on 26 occasions, along with three earning Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Big Ten All-Defensive Team honors. Among the All-Big Ten honorees, four of Washington's pupils account for nine first team selections and Penn State has seen multiple players earn all-conference in eight of her nine seasons on the sideline.

Earning Big Ten Player of the Year on two occasions (2013 & 2014), Maggie Lucas was also the 2011 Big Ten Freshman and Sixth Player of the Year. Lucas joins Alex Bentley as three-time All-Big Ten first team selections under Washington, while Tyra Grant (2009 & 2010) and Ariel Edwards (2014) round out the group of first teamers.

Dara Taylor became the first Lady Lion under Washington to win the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, claiming the award in 2014, while also getting the nod to the All-Defensive Team in 2013. Alex Bentley was also a two-time Big Ten All-Defensive Team choice (2012 & 2013), while Nikki Greene earned her selection to the squad for her shot blocking prowess in 2011.

In 2016, Penn State placed three players on the All-Big Ten team, highlighted by freshman Teniya Page's selection to the All-Big Ten second team. Her second team selection makes her just the third Penn State rookie to earn either first or second team honors at season's end, joining Lucas (2nd Team, 2011) and Kelly Mazzante (1st Team, 2001). Adding to the haul of all-conference honors were Brianna Banks and Lindsey Spann, each earning honorable mention selections.

During Washington's first Big Ten Championship run in 2012, her squad put five players on the All-Big Ten squad. Bentley and Lucas each earned first team honors that season, and Greene, Zhaque Gray and Mia Nickson all noted honorable mention accolades. Both the 2011 and 2014 teams placed four players on the All-Big Ten squads, with the 2016 team joining the 2008 and 2013 teams that each had three representatives.

Washington is a stout believer in getting her best players on the floor regardless of position or class, with three student-athletes earning a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman squad. Bentley (2010) and Page (2016) were both unanimous all-rookie picks, and Lucas secured a spot on the 2011 list.

The success of her student-athletes isn't confined to the hardwood, as the Lady Lion program has 42 Academic All-Big Ten honorees over her nine seasons. The 2015 squad set a school record with seven honorees on the list, while her 2009 and 2013 teams each saw six honorees for academic success.

### Play to Your Strengths

Washington's style of play lends itself to being up-tempo and high scoring, which has enabled the program to rise to new heights and return to the national spotlight. As a member of the Big Ten Conference, her teams are playing one of the toughest conference slates in the country, but that doesn't stop Washington from scheduling key non-conference games against the nation's best teams – home and on the road.

In each of Washington's first six years, Penn State improved its Big Ten win total and the Lady Lions posted three consecutive 25-win seasons, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat.

During Washington's first nine seasons, Penn State has topped ranking opponents in seven of those seasons; winning multiple games against ranked foes during each of those campaigns. Her first season in Happy Valley included wins over No. 20 Pittsburgh and No. 10 Duke. The 2011-12 squad traveled to No. 16/13 Texas A&M for a top-20 showdown with the Aggies and walked away with 63-58 victory to snap a 58-game non-conference home court winning streak for TAMU.

The 2016 squad also had its share of success against ranked opponents, pushing No. 4 Tennessee to the brink in an early season road test, before opening the Big Ten schedule with a 79-72 victory over then-No. 14 Northwestern at the Bryce Jordan Center. Avenging an earlier loss to Michigan State, Penn State traveled to East Lansing and handed the then-No. 15 Spartans a 65-61 defeat in front of a national television audience on the Big Ten Network.

The Penn State record books have also been invaded by Washington's teams and student-athletes.

Teniya Page was a catalyst on the court in 2015-16, as she was the only freshman in the NCAA to average at least 15 points and four assists per game. She became just the third rookie in Penn State history to reach the 400-point and 100-assist mark - and first since Suzie McConnell (1984-85).

After reaching the 10-point mark in each of her first eight career games in 2014-15 – a feat not accomplished by Penn State's top two career scoring leaders – Kelly Mazzante and Maggie Lucas – Lindsey Spann moved her name into elite company on Penn State's 3-point list. Spann enters the season ranked No. 14 on the career charts with 102 shots made from distance.

Maggie Lucas finished her career second in school history and fourth in Big Ten history in scoring (2,510) and broke the Penn State and Big Ten records for career 3-pointers made (365) and career free throw percentage (.907). Lucas left Penn State ranked among the top-five on 25 different single season or career charts.

Nikki Greene became the first player in school history to accumulate 1,000 points, 900 rebounds and 200 blocks, while Alex Bentley is one of only two players (Suzie McConnell) in program history with 1,500 points, 500 assists and 250 steals. Brianna O'Rourke closed out her career as an All-Big Ten performer and left Penn State as one of just six players in school history with 1,000 points and 500 assists.

On the team side of things, the 2013-14 graduating class of Maggie Lucas, Ariel Edwards, Dara Taylor and Talia East produced 101 wins, which are the second-most wins by a senior class in Lady Lion history.

The 2010-11 team was a dominating force from the perimeter as the Lady Lions tied the school record with 228 3-pointers and led the NCAA from deep with a .415 3-point field goal percentage.

### Serving the Community

Be it on the hardwood, on the golf course, or out on a speaking engagement, Washington is among the most active Penn State coaches in the community. Her annual efforts include Coquese's Drive for the Centre County Women's Resource Center, championing the fight against breast cancer for Penn State Play4Kay game and supporting her team during their many hours of giving back to the Centre region.

One of the first relationships that Washington established in State College was with the Executive Director of the Centre County Women's Resource Center, Ann Ard. The relationship grew quickly, with the focus shifting to helping the local non-profit find a way to raise funds and provide resources in the fight against domestic violence. In its nine years, Coquese's Drive has raised more than \$170,000 to benefit the CCWRC.

While the event that has spread nationally, Penn State women's basketball were trendsetters in spreading awareness for breast cancer by being the first team in the country to wear pink uniforms. Washington has embraced Pink Zone at Penn State and helped it grow into an annual "can't miss" event for survivors and supporters alike. During her tenure, Washington has seen their Play4Kay game grow in both attendance numbers and funds raised. The 698 survivors at the 2014 game are the most in program history, while the \$310,000 raised that year are a benchmark for years to come.

Along with her community involvement, Washington has appointed Miriam Powell as the Director of Community Outreach for the Lady Lion program. Powell has been charged with creating powerful and impactful relationships for the women's basketball program within the Penn State and surrounding communities, through service and volunteerism. This role was created by Washington to make sure the Lady Lions are serving those who spend much of their own time supporting Lady Lion Basketball on the floor and in the classroom.

### The Personal Side

Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (11), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (7). Raynell is an Adjunct Professor of Law at Penn State Law School and is a former partner at Hicks & Brown Sports Agency, where he represented athletes in the NFL, FIBA, NBA, and WNBA. They reside in Port Matilda.
