THE SCENE SETTER

- The Purdue men's basketball team puts its five-game win streak on the line Thursday as it heads to Happy Valley for a tussle with the Nittany Lions.
- The contest will be televised on FS1 with **Lisa Byington** and **Dickey Simpkins** calling the action courtside beginning at 7 p.m. ET. On the radio waves, the contest will be available on the Purdue Radio Network and Tuneln.com with **Larry Clisby** and **Rob Blackman** on the call, beginning with the Purdue Basketball pregame show at 6 p.m. **Wes Scott** will produce the radio broadcast.
- Live stats will be provided on PurdueSports.com, and Twitter updates will be available on Purdue's official account (@BoilerBall).

THE MAIN TALKING POINTS

- 1) Purdue has won a season-best five straight games entering Thursday's tilt with the Nittany Lions. It marks the seventh season under Painter that Purdue has had at least a five-game Big Ten winning streak. In the previous six years, Purdue has finished 2nd, T-2nd, T-1st, 2nd, 1st and T-2nd.
- 2) Purdue's last two wins at Penn State have come in overtime in 2015 and 2017. Purdue is 7-4 in the Bryce Jordan Center under head coach **Matt Painter**. The Boilermakers have won 17 of the last 19 meetings dating to Feb. 11, 2009.
- 3) Purdue is looking for its third Big Ten road win of the season. The Boilermakers are 15-7 in Big Ten road games since the start of the 2016-17 season.
- 4) Purdue is back in the national rankings for the first time since Nov. 27, when it was voted 17th this week. The ranking is the highest of the season. Since 2015-16, Purdue has spent 61 of 70 weeks in the AP poll, including 51 weeks inside the top 20.
- 5) During Purdue's five-game winning streak, the Boilermakers are shooting 56 of 127 (.441) from 3-point range while averaging 79.0 points per game. Defensively, Purdue is holding foes to 63.8 points per game. Purdue's turnover margin during the streak is +5.40.
- 6) Purdue continues to excel on the offensive end, ranking fifth nationally in offensive efficiency. Purdue, Duke and Villanova are the only teams to rank in the top 10 in offensive efficiency in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Purdue finished second a year ago behind National Champion Villanova.
- 7) Purdue is 11-1 in the games following a victory a top-10 opponent. The Boilermakers defeated No. 6 Michigan State 73-63 on Sunday.
- 8) Under **Matt Painter**, Purdue has been one of the best offensive teams in America. The Boilermakers have ranked in the nation's top 25 in offensive efficiency in six of the last nine seasons (lone years not in top 25: 2014-15, 2013-14, 2012-13).
- 9) **Carsen Edwards** ranks sixth nationally in scoring (24.2 PPG). Since the 1992-93 season, just two other Big Ten players (Purdue's **Glenn Robinson 2x**, Michigan State's **Shawn Respert 2x**) have averaged at least 24.0 points per game in a season.
- 10) **Ryan Cline** has sparked Purdue's recent surge, making 24 of 46 (.522) of his 3-pointers over the last seven games.

THE SERIES

• Thursday's meeting marks the 50th meeting all-time between Purdue and Penn State. The Boilermakers lead the series by a 37-12 advantage, including an 11-8 mark at the Bryce Jordan Center.
 • Purdue's last two wins at Penn State have come in overtime in semi-miraculous fashion. In 2015, **Kendall Stephens** grabbed an offensive rebound, dribbled to the corner and buried a falling-away 3-pointer to force overtime. In 2017, Purdue trailed by two in overtime when **Ryan Cline** made back-to-back 3-pointers to give Purdue a four-point win. Both wins were instrumental in Purdue getting to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and winning the Big Ten title in 2017.

• With the win over Michigan State, Purdue is now 13-2 against nationally-ranked teams in Mackey Arena over its last 15 games. The lone losses came to No. 3-ranked Villanova on Nov. 13, 2016 (76-73) and No. 14-ranked Ohio State on Feb. 7, 2018 (64-63).

THE SHOT VOLUME INDEX

• Thanks to ESPN's analytics guru **John Gasaway**, Purdue has found a model of success this year, based on low turnover percentage and high offensive rebounds percentage, which equals Shot Volume Index. Purdue is second in the country behind Virginia.

SHOOTING WINS

• Purdue is 142-15 under Painter when shooting over 48.0 percent, including 6-1 this season. The lone loss came to Virginia Tech (50.8 percent). It was Purdue's first loss when shooting 48-plus percent from the field since a Feb. 2017, loss to Michigan, a streak of 27 straight victories.

ONE OF THE NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULES

- Purdue has played one of the nation's most-difficult schedules to date and could rise even higher thanks to a rigorous Big Ten slate.
- According to ESPN BPI and the NCAA NET, Purdue's schedule currently ranks 2nd in the country behind Kansas. The Boilermakers are followed by Louisville, Penn State and Texas.
- In Big Ten play only, Purdue will face a team that was ranked at the time of the game or ranked in the Dec. 31, poll in eight of its first nine league games.
- Purdue has played 15 teams ranked in the KenPom top 100, posting an 9-6 overall record.
- The strength of schedule has helped Purdue to a No. 11 NET rating. The next closest six-loss team not in the Big Ten is Auburn (25th; 12-6).
- During the Painter era, the highest that a schedule has ever been ranked (KenPom) is eighth in 2012; the lowest is 2008 (62nd).

EFFICIENT OFFENSE

- Purdue is one of just three teams to currently boast a top-10 offense in each of the last two seasons.

EFFICIENT OFFENSE, PART TWO

- After ranking No. 2 in last year's offensive efficiency ratings via KenPom.com, Purdue has picked up where it left off last year, ranking sixth midway through this season.
- Purdue is one of five teams to rank in the top 25 of the offensive efficiency ratings in each year since 2015-16.

THE TURNING POINT

- Purdue's turning point may have been the Notre Dame game. The Boilermakers fell 88-80 in Indianapolis and sat with a 6-5 record.
- Since that game, Purdue is 8-1 with the lone loss at Michigan State, avenging the loss to the Spartans on Sunday.
- During Purdue's current nine-game stretch, Purdue has won seven of its eight games by double-digits, including its last four wins by an average of 18.0 points per game.

HEATING UP JANUARY

- Since the start of last year, Purdue has posted a 15-1 record during the month of January with the lone loss coming at No. 6 Michigan State on Jan. 8, 2019. The Boilermakers would avenge that loss with a 73-63 win over the Spartans last Sunday.

THE POWER OF MACKAY ARENA & THE PAINT CREW

- Mackey Arena has been a special place to play basketball and Sunday's atmosphere vs. Michigan State rivaled anything the building has seen.
- With the Paint Crew in attendance, Purdue has won 50 of its last 52 games (losses to Villanova in Nov. 2016, and Ohio State in Feb. 2018).
- Since the start of the 2015-16 season, Purdue's .935 winning percentage (58-4) in Mackey Arena is the second-best home winning percentage in America, behind just Kentucky (.937).
- Purdue is 37-4 at home against Big Ten opponents since the start of the 2014-15 season (losses to Maryland, Iowa, Minnesota, Ohio St.). The record is the best in the Big Ten during that stretch by 3.5 games (Michigan State - 33-7).
- Purdue has won 12 straight games in the arena by an average of 18.6 points per game. Just three games have been decided by single-digits during that span (Penn State last year - 3; Ball State - 9; Maryland - 2).
- The arena reached 115.7 decibels in the win over Indiana last Saturday. The reading did not crack the top six (since readings started in 2009-10). The record is 122.3 dB set against Indiana on Feb. 28, 2017 -- equivalent to a chain saw or oxygen torch. The average human pain threshold for sound is 110 dB.

THE CHANGING OF PHILOSOPHIES

- When **Matt Painter** arrived at Purdue in 2005-06, he carried over **Gene Keady's** mantra of "Defense Lives Here". While still a formidable defensive squad, the Boilermakers have become one of the top offensive teams in America over the last few years.
- In Painter's first 10 years at Purdue, the Boilermakers were in the top 25 of offensive efficiency just twice (2010-11, 2011-12). Over the last four years, Purdue has been in the top 25 all four years and its average ranking is 12.8.
- Almost more impressively is where Purdue's defense has come this year. The Boilermakers were in the mid-70s when the calendar turned to January. Now, Purdue has moved into the top 50.
- The Boilermakers held Michigan State to a season-low 63 points and held the Spartans under 1.00 points / possession for the first time this year (0.97).

- With four Sweet 16 appearances, 10 NCAA Tournament berths, two Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten Tournament title and an international gold medal on his résumé, 14th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter entered the 2018-19 season third on the school's all-time wins list (295) behind legendary mentors, Gene Keady and Ward "Piggy" Lambert, both of whom have been inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged almost 23 wins a season in his 13 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year, the average balloons to 23.8 wins per year over the last 12 seasons.
