- Penn State will conclude its season-high three-game homestand with its regular-season home finale against Lafayette.

ALL-TIME VS. LAFAYETTE

- The Nittany Lions, who have won 15 straight games against the Leopards, are 20-2 all-time against Lafayette.
- The Leopards last defeated Penn State April 9, 1991 (9-8).

LAST SEASON VS. THE LEOPARDS

- **Tatum Coffey** led Penn State with four goals as the Nittany Lions defeated Lafayette, 14-10, Feb. 25, 2012.
- **Mackenzie Cyr** totaled three points (2g, 1a), while **Katie Guy**, **Lizzy Carney** and **Maggie McCormick** netted two goals each.
- Final Stats (PSU-LAF): Shots (38-18), Ground Balls (17-11), Turnovers (11-20), Saves (3-7), Draw Controls (10-16), Caused Turnovers (7-3).

SCOUTING LAFAYETTE

- The Leopards have won two of their last three games, which included victories against Penn State foes Lehigh (6-5) and

Bucknell (13-8).

- Senior attacker Addie Godfrey ranks seventh in the NCAA in goals (47) and 26th in points (56), while junior midfielder Ana White ranks 10th in draw controls per game (5.2) and caused turnovers per game (1.87).

MOSKETTI EARNS THIRD ALC HONOR

- Freshman midfielder **Jenna Mosketti** earned her third ALC Rookie of the Week honor after helping lead Penn State to victories against Lehigh and Ohio State.
- The Fallston, Md., native tied for the team lead with four caused turnovers, while also collecting three goals, four draw controls and four ground balls.
- The midfielder leads all conference freshmen in caused turnovers per game (1.31) and ground balls per game (1.85).

LIONS OUTLAST OHIO STATE

- Led by a six-point (5g, 1a) outing from sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick**, Penn State downed Ohio State, 14-12, at the Penn State Lacrosse Field April 14.
- Sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** netted her third hat trick of the season, while **Molly Fernandez** and **Jenna Mosketti** added two goals each.

CYR ENTERS TOP-10

- Junior attacker **Mackenzie Cyr** notched three assists against Ohio State to up her career total to 63, good for a tie for ninth on the program's all-time list.
- The Westminster, Md., native has recorded at least one point in a team-high 20 straight games.

McCORMICK SETS CAREER HIGH

- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick**, who leads Penn State with 33 strikes, set a new career high for goals in a season after scoring five goals against Ohio State.
- In 2013, McCormick set a single-game high with six goals against James Madison, while matching her personal-best eight points in the same game.
- The Eldersburg, Md., native recorded her 100th career point against Drexel March 22 and notched a career-high five assists against Duquesne Feb. 27.

DEFENSIVE ANCHOR

- Defender **Katie Guy** has flourished during her senior season as she has set career highs in both ground balls (33) and caused turnovers (24).
- The Whitby, Ont., native is also eight draw

HOME SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions, who are 6-0 at home, are looking for their first undefeated regular season at home since 1991.
- Penn State has completed 12 undefeated home campaigns during the regular season (10 when including postseason).

UNDERCLASSMEN THRIVING

- Penn State has started as many as eight underclassmen during the 2013 season.
- Freshmen and sophomores have combined for 128 goals, good for 74 percent of the Nittany Lions' scoring.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** leads Penn State in goals (33), assists (23) and points (56), while sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** paces the squad with 32 draw controls.
- Freshman **Emi Smith** has been the goal-keeper of record for each game (9-4).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- In 2013, nine Nittany Lions have recorded at least 10 points, while Penn State boasts one 50-point scorer, one 40-point performer and four 20-point players.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** (33g, 23a) and junior **Mackenzie Cyr** (24g, 17a) are the only Lions with double-digit goals and assists.
- Five Lions - **Kelly Lechner** (14gb, 32dc, 11ct), **Tatum Coffey** (18gb, 25dc, 10ct), **Jenna Moschetti** (24gb, 24dc, 17ct), **Madison Cyr** (12gb, 16dc, 10ct) and **Katie Guy** (33gb, 22dc, 24ct) - have recorded at least 10 ground balls, draw controls and caused

turnovers.

PENN STATE RISING

- The Nittany Lions were ranked sixth in both the IWLCA and deBeer Media polls.
- Penn State is ranked at No. 6 for the first time since the 2007 season.

LOOKING FOR FOUR IN A ROW

- Penn State will search for its fourth straight 10-win season with a victory against Lafayette.

McCORMICK ADDED TO TEWAARATON

- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** was added to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List April 11.
- McCormick joins classmate **Tatum Coffey** as the Nittany Lions' representatives.

LIONS CRUISE PAST LEHIGH

- Seven Nittany Lions recorded multi-point games as Penn State rolled past Lehigh, 16-3, April 10.
- **Maggie McCormick** tallied a game-high four points (2g, 2a), while **Kristin Brent** and freshman midfielder **Erika Spilker** netted their first career goals.
- Final Stats (PSU-LEHIGH): Shots (31-12), Ground Balls (17-13), Turnovers (10-16), Saves (6-7), Draw Controls (13-8), Caused Turnovers (13-8).

LIONS FALL TO NORTHWESTERN

- Seeking its second straight win against a top-five team, Penn State fell to No. 3/4 Northwestern, 11-3, at Lakeside Field April 5.

HIGHEST RANKED WIN SINCE 2007

- The Nittany Lions defeated its highest ranked opponent since 2007 when it knocked off No. 2 Florida, 16-11, at Penn State Lacrosse Field March 30.
- Penn State trailed, 9-6, at halftime but outscored the Gators by a 10-2 margin in the second.
- **Tatum Coffey** recorded a game-high five points (4g, 1a), while six players recorded multi-point games.

TRIO EARNS WEEKLY HONORS

- Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** earned WomensLax.com Co-Player of the Week honors after five points (4g, 1a), two draw controls, one ground ball and a caused turnover against the Gators.
- Freshman **Jenna Mosketti** earned her second ALC Rookie of the Week award. Mosketti scored twice, including the game-winner, and corralled a game-high four draw controls.
- Senior defender **Colleen Shea** was named ALC Defensive Player of the Week for the first time after helping hold Florida to two second-half goals. She also recorded a game-high two caused turnovers.

CYR SENDS LIONS PAST DREXEL

- Junior **Mackenzie Cyr** scored the game-winning goal with 36 seconds remaining as Penn State edged Drexel, 9-8, March 22.
- Drexel erased a three-goal deficit to tie the game with 54 seconds left before Cyr's heroics.
- Sophomores **Tatum Coffey** and **Kelly Lechner** paced PSU with three goals each, while senior **Katie Guy** also scored.

GUY, MOSKETTI HONORED BY ALC

- Senior **Katie Guy** and freshman **Jenna Mosketti** were named ALC Defensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the

Week, respectively, March 19.

- A Whitby, Ont., native, Guy collected six ground balls, four draw controls and five caused turnovers against Cornell and Vanderbilt.
- Mosketti collected seven points (5g, 2a), seven ground balls, five draw controls and four caused turnovers.
- Both Guy and Mosketti were honored for the first time in their careers.

PSU OPENS ALC SEASON WITH WIN

- Penn State opened its ALC campaign with a 20-14 victory against Vanderbilt March 17.
- The Nittany Lions trailed, 3-1, in the first half before taking a 4-3 lead. Penn State kept the lead for the remainder of the game.

- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** recorded six points (5g, 1a), while senior **Molly Fernandez**, junior **Mackenzie Cyr** and freshman **Jenna Mosketti** added three goals each.

PENN STATE FALLS TO MARYLAND

- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** scored a team-high four goals, but Penn State fell to top-ranked Maryland, 20-10, in College Park March 9.
- The Terrapins opened the game on a 5-0 run. Penn State made it a five-goal game with 23:50 left in the second, but Maryland finished the contest on a 7-2 run.

LECHNER EARNS PAIR OF HONORS

- After an eight-point weekend (5g, 3a) against Duquesne and then-No. 6/8 Virginia, sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** was named the WomensLax.com Player of the Week and ALC Offensive Player of the Week.
- Lechner matched her career high with four points in both games. She also tied a personal best with three goals against Duquesne.

LIONS KNOCK OUTLAST VIRGINIA

- After trailing by an 8-5 halftime margin, the Nittany Lions netted 10 second-half markers as it edged No. 6/8 Virginia, 15-14, at Klöckner Stadium March 3.
- Sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** recorded a career-high four points (2g, 2a) for the second straight game, while junior **Mackenzie Cyr**, who added an assist, notched her third three-goal game of the season.

PENN STATE DOMINATES DUQUESNE

- Ten Nittany Lions scored in a 16-9 victory



against Duquesne Feb. 27.

- Sophomore attack **Maggie McCormick** paced the team with six points (1g, 5a), while junior **Mackenzie Cyr** and sophomore **Kelly Lechner**, who matched her career high, scored three goals each.
- Junior **Evan Foulsham** recorded a career-high five draw controls.

LIONS FALL TO LOYOLA

- The Nittany Lions fell to No. 6/10 Loyola, 13-11, at Ridley Athletic Complex Feb. 23.
- Penn State took a 7-6 halftime lead but the Greyhounds opened the second stanza with four straight tallies.
- **Maggie McCormick** (2g, 1a), **Jenna Mosketti** (2g, 1a) and **Mackenzie Cyr** (3a) led Penn State with three points each.

COFFEY NAMED TO WATCH LIST

- Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** was named to the Tewaaron Award Watch List Feb. 22.
- The Tewaaron Award annually honors the top men's and women's U.S. college lacrosse player.

LIONS OPEN 2013 WITH WIN

- The Nittany Lions defeated Bucknell by a 16-goal margin for the second straight season with an 18-2 victory Feb. 20.
- Ten different Nittany Lions recorded at least one point, while goalkeeper **Emi Smith** garnered the victory in her collegiate debut.

STELLAR DEBUTS

- Several Nittany Lions starred in their collegiate debuts. Midfielder **Jenna Mosketti** tallied three goals, attack **Madison Cyr** recorded two points (1g, 1a) and midfielder **Ally Heavens** added a free-position goal.

DUO TABBED ALL-AMERICANS

- Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** and junior midfielder **Lizzy Carney** were tabbed *Inside Lacrosse* Preseason All-Americans.
- Last season, Coffey was the nation's only freshman to be named to an All-America team (third).

OFFENSIVE PUNCH

- With the graduation of only three starting seniors, the Nittany Lions returned 79.9% of their scoring from a season ago.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** led the Nittany Lions with 59 points and 30 assists, while senior **Molly Fernandez** paced the squad with 35 goals.

BACK FOR MORE

- Although still a young team, Penn State returns its category leaders in each major category with the exception of ground balls.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

- Senior midfielder **Katie Guy** and sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** are the only two returning Nittany Lions to record double-digit ground balls, draw controls and caused turnovers in 2012.

FAMILIAR FACES

- Penn State returns 17 letterwinners, as well as eight starters, in 2013.
- The Nittany Lions lost starters **Dana Cahill**, who was the ALC goalkeeper of the year, and midfielders **Aly Adams** and **Theresa Zichelli** to graduation.

SISTER ACT

- Penn State boasts three sets of sisters - the Cyrs, Lechners and Foulshams - on the 2013 roster.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Molly Fernandez** and **Katie Guy** and junior **Lizzy Carney** will serve as the Nittany Lion captains during the 2013 season.

NEWCOMERS

- Penn State welcomes eight newcomers to the squad, including seven freshmen.
- Three Nittany Lions freshmen - **Madison Cyr**, **Heather Harman** and **Ally Heavens** earned US Lacrosse All-America honors during high school.

DOHERTY ENTERS THIRD SEASON

- Head coach **Missy Doherty** enters her third season at Penn State with a 101-61 career record and a 22-15 mark in Happy Valley through 2012.
- Last season, she led the Lions to their first NCAA tournament appearance since 2005.

MATTHEWS JOINS STAFF

- Former Northwestern standout **Brooke Matthews** joined the Penn State staff June 21, 2012.
- As a player, she helped the Wildcats win three national titles (2008, 2009, 2011).
- In 2012, she served as an assistant coach at Mount St. Mary's.
