The No. 7 Penn State field hockey team will have its first Big Ten road action of the season, taking on Michigan State in East Lansing, Mich., on Friday, Sept. 26 (4 p.m.) before visiting Ohio State on Sunday, Sept. 28 (1 p.m.).

Michigan State Notes

- The Spartans enter the contest ranked No. 18 in the most recent NFHCA Poll.
- Michigan State is 5-2 this season and 1-0 in conference play. Its only losses came to Duke (OT) and American (2OT). Most recently, the squad defeated Ohio State on Sept. 19, 4-3 (OT). The Spartans have played in five overtime games this season. They are seventh nationally with 9.57 points per game this season.
- Offensively, Abby Barker leads the team in goals (8), assists (6) and points (22). She ranks third nationally with 3.14 points per game and eighth with 1.14 goals per game.
- Defensively, goalkeeper Sierra Patton holds a .742 save percentage.
- Helen Knull is in her fourth season as head coach.

Lions have won the last four in a series that dates back to 1987. Last year, the Nittany Lions picked up a 4-3 shootout win over the Spartans at home.

Ohio State Notes

- The Buckeyes are 3-5 this season and 0-1 in Big Ten play, with the loss coming to Michigan State (OT) on Sept. 19.

- Offensively, Maddie Humphrey leads the team with seven goals and 20 points. She ranks seventh nationally in points per game (2.71) and 10th in goals per game (1.00).

- Defensively, Liz Tamburro is 16th nationally with a .765 save percentage.

- Anne Wilkinson is in her 19th season as head coach.

Series History

Penn State is 34-10-2 all-time

against Ohio State in a series that dates back to 1977. The Nittany Lions have won each of the last two meetings, including a 6-1 win at home last season.

Last Time Out

In a hard-fought Big Ten opener, the No. 6 Penn State field hockey team dropped a 3-2 overtime contest to No. 18 Michigan at the Field Hockey Complex on Sept. 19. Sophomore **Emilee Ehret** (Philadelphia, Pa.) posted a career-high three points, tallying a goal and an assist in the contest. Then, the No. 7 Nittany Lions defeated Lock Haven, 5-1, behind two goals apiece from seniors **Taylor Herold** (Fredericksburg, Va.) and **Amanda Dinunzio** (State College, Pa.). Herold added an assist for five points in the game. Penn State had a season-high 16 corners and 14 points.

Big Ten Road Openers

Penn State is 14-8 all-time in Big Ten road openers, winning each of its last four.

Herold's Heroics

Herold has posted three goals, all in the second half, against No. 14 Princeton on Sept. 12. It marked her first career hat trick. She is first on the team with 19 points and eight goals. Herold has three multi-goal games this season.

Herold Approaching a Hundred

Herold is currently four points away from 100 for her career. She has 42 goals and 12 assists, giving her 96 to this point. Her 42 goals are six shy of tying her for 10th on Penn State's all-time list.

Gebhart on the Assist

Senior **Laura Gebhart** (Mount Joy, Pa.) has started all 71 games since arriving on campus as a freshman. Currently, she has 40 assists, which is three away from tying her for eighth on Penn State's all-time list.

Dazzling Dinunzio

Dinunzio posted the first multi-goal game of her career against Lock Haven, scoring two in the contest. It was a career-high four points for the senior.

Big Ten Honors

Redshirt senior goalkeeper **Kylie Licata** (Mountain Top, Pa.) was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week twice this season. Most recently, she made a career-high 14 saves at No. 3 UConn and shut out Quinnipiac to earn the honor on Sept. 9. Licata earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2), while back **Cori Conley** (Oak Park, Ill.) was named Freshman of the Week following the season-opening wins. Licata made a career-high nine saves against the Lady Monarchs and shut out the Cavaliers. Conley played a key role defensively, helping a unit that held Virginia scoreless in a game for the first time since 2011.

Chrismer Capitalizing

Senior **Jenna Chrismer** (Mountain Top, Pa.) has been impressive offensively. Most recently, she posted a career-high two assists against No. 14 Princeton (Sept. 12) before tying her personal best with two goals vs. Lafayette (Sept. 14). She scored each of the team's goals in the 2-1 win over Old Dominion (Aug. 29), before tallying an assist against Virginia (Aug. 31) and at Quinnipiac (Sept. 7). She is second on the team with 14 points and leads the squad with four assists.

Solid in the Cage

Licata has been a force between the posts, making nine saves against Old Dominion and holding Virginia scoreless, the first time the Cavaliers were blanked since 2011. Then, at No. 3 Connecticut, she stopped a career-high 14 shots. Most recently, she made 10 saves against No. 18 Michigan. She ranks fifth nationally with a .849 save percentage.

Ehret Making Noise

Ehret has scored a goal in each of the

last three games, and posted a goal and an assist in each of the last two games. She has played a key role in penalty corner chances, being the primary player to insert for the Nittany Lions.

Buttinger Breaks Out

Redshirt senior **Natalie Buttinger** (Kitchener, Ontario) scored the first two goals of her career in the 3-0 win over No. 6 Virginia.

Postseason Fixture

The Nittany Lions return after making the NCAA Tournament field each of the last four seasons. Penn State has been at the top of the Big Ten in those seasons as well, being named co-conference regular

season champions in 2013 and the outright winner in 2012. The squad won the Big Ten Tournament in 2011 and 2012.

Excelling with Experience

Penn State brings back six starters and three of its top six scorers from a season ago. The squad returns two 2013 Big Ten first team members in **Laura Gebhart (Mount Joy, Pa.)** and **Kylie Licata (Mountain Top, Pa.)**, while **Taylor Herold (Fredericksburg, Va.)**, who garnered second team honors, also returns. Herold led Penn State with 30 points (13 goals, four assists) last year. Gebhart was a 2013 Longstreth/NFHCA Division I second team All-American.

Seniors **Katie Breneman (Washington Boro, Pa.)**, Gebhart and Herold were each named to the 2014 Big Ten Field Hockey Players to Watch List.

Remaining Elite in the Rankings

The Nittany Lions were selected No. 8 in the 2014 Penn Metro/NFHCA Division I Preseason Poll. The squad holds the second-highest ranking of any Big Ten team in the top 20. Maryland (No. 1) is the only conference foe ranked higher. Penn State plays nine teams ranked that are ranked in the preseason poll.

Gebhart on the National Stage

Gebhart has been competing for the U.S. National Team each of the last two summers. She competed internationally in March, and was one of 30 players on the 2013-14 U.S. National Field Hockey Team.

On the Turf and in the Classroom

The Penn State field hockey program was recognized by Gladiator and the National Field Hockey Coaches Association with the National Academic Team Award for sporting a team GPA above 3.0 in the 2013-14 academic year. In addition, the Nittany Lions placed 12 players on the Gladiator by SGI/NFHCA Division I National Academic Squad.

Katie Andrews, Katie Breneman, Carly Celkos, Amanda Dinunzio, Emilee Ehret, Abby Fuhrman, Laura Gebhart, Kirsten Gochnauer, Jacqueline Kenney, Haley Kerstetter, Lauren Purvis and Whitney Reddig all earned the accolade.

Challenging Schedule

Penn State has again put together a top-tier schedule, facing nine teams that were ranked in the 2014 NFHCA Preseason Poll, including conference-foes Maryland (1), Northwestern (14), Michigan State (16), Michigan (17) and Iowa (20). Along with the conference opponents, the squad also has matchups against Connecticut (3), Virginia (6), Princeton (7) and Old Dominion (9). Seven teams (ODU, Virginia, Connecticut, Quinnipiac, Princeton, Michigan State and Maryland) each made the 2013 NCAA Tournament.

In the Spotlight on BTN

The field hockey squad will receive coverage at Maryland on Oct. 10 at 3:30 p.m., vs. Rutgers on Oct. 17 at 3:30 p.m. and vs. Northwestern on Oct. 31 at 3:30 p.m. Additionally, both Big Ten Tournament semifinal matches and the championship game will be aired live on the BTN.

The longest tenured coach in the Big Ten and the sixth-longest tenured at a single school in Division I field hockey history, Charlene Morett-Curtiss enters her 28th season as head coach of the Penn State field hockey program in 2014. Morett-Curtiss boasts a remarkable resume covering her time as the leader of the Nittany Lions. Over the last six years, Morett-Curtiss has led the Nittany Lions to three Big Ten regular season titles, two Big Ten Tournament championships and five NCAA Tournament appearances.

Morett-Curtiss currently ranks fifth all-time in Division I history in wins with 458 and is one of just six DI coaches to accumulate 400 career wins. She has led the Nittany Lions to the NCAA Tournament in 24 of her 27 years as head coach of Penn State and has helped maintain Penn State's distinction as the No. 3 ranked school in all-time NCAA Tournament appearances with 29.

A seven-time NFHCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year, Morett-Curtiss is an excellent teacher of field hockey. Her players earn national recognition on a yearly basis, 11 of whom have been named two-time first team All-Americans with Kelsey Amy being the most recent. Her teams dominate the national scene, consistently ranking among the Top 10 in the national polls. Penn State was ranked in the Top 10 of the STX/NFHCA poll for 32 consecutive weeks from the first poll of the 2005 season ending with the second poll of 2008. The squad achieved a No. 1 ranking in the STX/NFHCA poll for the first time in program history. From 2005-08, Penn State finished eighth, sixth, ninth and 11th respectively, in the final poll of the season.

Under Morett-Curtiss' tutelage, five of her players have been named Big Ten Athlete of the Year -- Traci Anselmo, Jen Coletta, Heather Gorlaski, Tracey Larson and Kiley Kulina. Six players have been voted the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year -- Natalie Berrena, Dawn Lammey, Larson, Tara Maguire, Allison Scola and Kelsey Amy. In 2012 and 2013, Brittany Grzywacz was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, earning the ninth and 10th Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honors from Penn State, joining Anselmo, Gorlaski, Becca Main, Jill Martz, Jill Pearsall and Jen Long. Long, Anselmo and Grzywacz are the only Lions to be named Defensive Player of the Year twice.

Since Penn State's entry into the Big Ten in 1992, Morett's program has produced more First Team All-Big Ten selections, Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year, Big Ten Athletes of the Year and Big Ten Freshmen of the Year than any other program. Penn State's 10 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honorees are five more than any other school.

With Laura Gebhart, Brittany Grzywacz, Taylor Herold, Ashton Klingler and Kylie Licata earning All-Big Ten laurels last season, Penn State has now totaled 94 All-Big Ten selections since 1992, including 65 first team All-Conference choices, the most of any Big Ten school since Penn State moved to the Big Ten in 1992.
