Nittany Lion Preview

The four-time defending national champion Penn State women's volleyball team continues its quest for yet another championship this weekend when it travels to Lexington, Ky. to compete in the Regional Semifinals at the University of Kentucky's Memorial Coliseum. The Nittany Lions take on ninth-seeded UCLA in the regional semifinal match on Friday, Dec. 9 at 5 p.m. No. 1 seed Texas and Kentucky play in the later match at 7 p.m. The winners of each match are schedule to play on Saturday, Dec. 10 at 4:30 p.m.

The Nittany Lions improved to 25-7 overall after sweeping both Liberty and Delaware in the First and Second Rounds of the 2011 NCAA Tournament at Rec Hall on Dec. 2-3. Penn State defeated Liberty (25-16, 25-16, 25-16) and Delaware (25-12, 25-9, 25-18) to advance in the tournament. Sophomore Ariel Scott (Ridgewood, N.J.) led the team for the week with a combined 28 kills, while sophomore Deja McClendon (Louisville, Ky.) posted 16 kills. Freshman Micha Hancock (Edmond, Okla.) dished out 76 assists and was second on the team with 19 digs. Sophomore Ali Longo (Littleton, Colo.) posted a team-high 29 digs and sophomore Maddie Martin (Tampa, Fla.) was third on the squad with 15. Sophomore Katie Slay led the team at the net with seven total blocks.

For the week, Penn State hit .379 as a team and averaged 15.50 kills per set, 14.67 assists per set, 2.17 aces per set, 17.67 digs per set and 2.50 blocks per set.

Penn State vs. No. 9 UCLA

The Nittany Lions are 4-6 all-time versus the Bruins. Penn State last met UCLA on Aug. 30, 2008 in the Hawaiian Airlines Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. Penn State won the match, 3-0. The match was the 28th win of the Nittany Lions' 109 consecutive match wins. Three of Penn State's four victories against UCLA have come on a neutral court.

Scouting the Bruins

UCLA is 26-6 overall and finished their conference season 17-5. The Bruins faced UMES to open NCAA Tournament play and won, 3-0. UCLA went on to defeat San Diego, 3-1, to advance to the Regional Semifinals in Lexington.

The Series vs. Possible Regional Championship Opponents Penn State vs. No. 1 Texas

Penn State owns a 10-7 record against the Longhorns. Earlier this season, Texas earned its first win against the Nittany Lions since 1989 with a five set win in the Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic hosted by Stanford on Sept. 9-10. Should Penn State and Texas meet in the Regional Championship match, it will be the third meeting in as many years in tournament play for the two squads. The Nittany Lions defeated the Longhorns, 3-2, for the 2009 NCAA Championship and swept Texas in the 2010 National Semifinal.

Penn State vs. Kentucky

Penn State leads the series with Kentucky, 5-1. The squads have not played one another since 1986. Kentucky's lone win against the Nittany Lions came in a 3-0 sweep on Oct. 23, 1983 in Lexington.

Penn State Recap

The Nittany Lions are now 25-7 overall after sweeping both of their opponents in the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Penn State defeated both Liberty and Delaware to advance to the Lexington Regional Semifinals. Sophomore Ariel Scott led the team with 4.67 kills per set. Freshman Micha Hancock paced the offense with 12.67 assists per set and was second on the team with 3.17 digs per set. Sophomore Ali Longo led the team defensively with 4.83 digs per set, while sophomore Maddie Martin was third on the team with 3.00 digs per set. Sophomore Katie Slay led the team at the net with 1.17 blocks per set.

What's Next?

Should the Nittany Lions defeat UCLA on Friday, Dec. 9, Penn State will face the winner of the Kentucky/Texas match on Saturday, Dec. 10 at 4:30 p.m. at Memorial Coliseum. If the Nittany Lions advance, they will travel to the San Antonia, Texas to play in the NCAA National Semifinals in the Alamodome.

Trio of Nittany Lions Earn AVCA All-Mideast Region Laurels

Three Nittany Lions picked up AVCA All-Mideast Region honors in 2011. Sophomores Kan Slay, Deja McClendon and Ariel Scott were three of 14 players named to the all-region squad. The three all-region honors bring Penn State's total number of honorees to 70 in program history. This is the second accolade for McClendon and the first for both Scott and Slay.

Hancock Honored as AVCA Mideast Region Freshman of the Year

Freshman Micha Hancock was named the AVCA Mideast Region Freshman of the Year. Hancock is the third member of the 2011 squad to earn the award. It is also the sixth time in the last nine years a Nittany Lion has been honored.

Penn State and the NCAAs

Penn State is one of just two teams, the other being Stanford, to be selected to every NCAA postseason event since its inception in 1981. The Nittany Lions have an overall record of 74-25 in NCAA Tournament play, including nine trips to the National Semifinals ('93, '94, '97, '98, '99, '07, '08, '09, '10), seven berth in the NCAA title match ('93, '97, '98, '99, '07, '08, '09, '10) and five National championships (1999, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010).

Five Lions Earn Postseason Conference Awards

Penn State now has 65 First Team All-Big Ten selections after the conference released the 2011 list on Nov. 29. Four Nittany Lions earned All-Big Ten status, with three first team honorees. Sophomores Katie Slay, Ariel Scott and Deja McClendon all earned First Team accolades, while freshman Micha Hancock was a unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. Redshirt freshman Maggie Harding was Penn State's Big Ten Sportsmanship honoree.

Hancock Picked as Big Ten Freshman of the Year

Freshman Micha Hancock was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year on Nov. 29. The award is the 10th in program history and the ninth in the last 10 years. Hancock is the third Freshman of the Year honoree on this year's squad as redshirt sophomore Darcy Dorton was selected in 2009 and McClendon was picked in 2010. Hancock is a three-time Freshman of the week selection and has been the starting setting in 29 of 30 matches.

Slay Earns Defensive Player of the Year Accolades

Sophomore Katie Slay was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year on Nov. 29. The award is the second in program history, as current assistant coach Kaleena Davidson earned the award in 2005. Slay led the conference with 1.44 blocks per set, ranking 10th nationally. Slay leads the team with 163 blocks and is third on the team in kills with 240.

Hancock Named Co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week

Freshman Micha Hancock was named the Co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Nov. 28. It was her third honor of the season. She shared the honor with Northwestern's Yewande Akanbi. Hancock was integral in Penn State's two victories to close out the regular season last week. The Nittany Lions defeated Ohio State, 3-1, on Nov. 23 before beating Michigan State, 3-1, on Nov. 26. For the week, Hancock paced the Nittany Lion offense to a .271 attack percentage while tallying 89 assists, averaging 11.12 assists per set. Hancock also posted nine kills, two aces, 15 digs and three blocks.

Longo and Hancock Garner Big Ten Weekly Accolades

Sophomore Ali Longo was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and freshman Micha Hancock was named Co-Freshman of the Week on Nov. 21. Hancock shared the honor with MSU's Kori Moster. It was the first honor of Longo's career and the second for Hancock.

For the weekend Longo average 5.3 digs and 6.1 service receptions per set. Against Indiana, Longo had 11 digs and 18 successful reception in 19 attempts to help Penn State hit .385 against the Hoosiers. Longo went on to total a career-high 26 digs against Purdue and converted on 22 of 24 reception attempts. Hancock posted 12.1 assists and 2.1 digs per set for the weekend. On Friday versus the Hoosiers, Hancock dished out 38 assists and added three aces and eight digs. She followed the performance up with 47 assists, seven digs and two aces against the Boilermakers on Saturday. Hancock guided the Nittany Lions to a .385 hitting percentage against the Hoosiers and a .285 hitting percentage against Purdue.

20 Wins and Counting

With a win vs. Indiana on Nov. 18, the Nittany Lions reached 20 wins in a season for the 35, time in program history. The Nittany Lions have recorded at least 20 wins every season under head coach Russ Rose.

McClendon & Hancock Pick Up Big Ten Weekly Awards

Sophomore Deja McClendon was named Big Ten Player of the Week and freshman Micha Hancock earned Co-Freshman of the Week laurels on Nov. 14. Hancock shared the honor with Michigan's Lexi Dannemiller. It was the first player of the week award for McClendon and the first weekly honor of Hancock's career.

McClendon averaged 6.2 kills per set and 2.2 digs per set on .395 hitting after a 3-0 setback to Illinois and a 3-0 sweep of Northwestern. McClendon pounded 17 kills on .350 hitting with three digs, an ace and a block against the Illini. She went on to tally a double-double against the Wildcats with 20 kills on .439 hitting with 20 digs. Hancock averaged 12.8 assists, 1.5 digs and 0.8 aces per set against the Illini and Wildcats. Against Illinois, Hancock notched 35 assists and three aces before helping the Nittany Lions to a .346 attack percentage with 42 assists and eight digs at Northwestern.

Hancock Breaks Penn State Single Season Aces Record

Freshman Micha Hancock broke the Penn State single season aces record on Nov. 4 at Minnesota. The setter, who has a left-handed jump serve, had 70 going into the match with the Gophers. She finished the match with three aces to break the record. She now holds the single season record for aces with 90. She currently ranks fifth in Big Ten single season records.

Penn State Upends No. 1 Nebraska

After defeating Iowa, 3-1, on Oct. 28, the Nittany Lions continued to improve their conference record with a 3-1 (25-17, 25-15, 17-25, 25-17) win against then No.1 Nebraska. It was Nebraska's second visit to Rec Hall and its first as a member of the Big Ten. The win improved Penn State's record against Nebraska to 7-13 overall and 1-1 on the Nittany Lions home court. The Nittany Lions out-hit, out-dug,, out-served and out-blocked the Huskers. Sophomore Deja McClendon had a match-high 18 kills, freshman Micha Hancock had a match-best six aces, sophomore Ali Longo led all players with 17 digs and sophomore Katie Slay put up eight total blocks.

Big Ten Home Streak

The Nittany Lions final historic streak came to an end on Oct. 8, 2011. Penn State won a record 68 consecutive Big Ten matches on their home court in Rec Hall leading up to their Oct. 8 match with top-ranked Illinois. The streak began on Oct. 29, 2004 with a 3-0 win against Indiana. Since that date, the Nittany Lions have won seven of their 14 Big Ten titles and own a conference record of 131-8. The program also went undefeated in league play four times.

Big Ten in the Poll

The Big Ten leads the nation with six teams ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. Nebraska leads the conference at No. 2, Illinois is sitting at No. 7, Purdue is eighth and Penn State is ranked No. 9. Minnesota checks in at No. 19, while Michigan follows at No. 22. Michigan State and Ohio State are receiving votes in the latest poll.

Slay Picks Up Big Ten Weekly Award

Sophomore middle hitter Katie Slay picked up the second weekly honor of the season as the week's Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week. In Penn State's 3-0 sweep of Wisconsin, Slay had eight kills in nine swings and had a match-high five total blocks, including two solo stuffs. She followed up that performance with nine kills in 12 attempts against the Gophers. Slay was a wall at the net with a match-best seven total blocks, including two solo. For the weekend, Slay was second on the team with 17 kills on a team-high .714 attack percentage. She also led the Nittany Lions with 12 total blocks. Slay averaged 2.83 kills per set and 2.00 blocks per set.

Scott Posts Career-High at Nebraska

Sophomore Ariel Scott had a strong night offensively on Sept. 21 in Penn State's Big Ten opener at Nebraska. Scott posted a career-best 23 kills on .360 hitting, while also tallying five digs and four blocks. She followed up that performance with a match-high 18 kills on Sept. 24 vs. lowa.

Slay Named Co-Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week

Sophomore middle blocker Katie Slay (Raleigh, N.C.) was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 19. This is the second honor of Slay's career. She shares the honor with Ohio State's Sarah Mignin. The Hampton Inn Classic MVP, Slay averaged 1.90 blocks per set in three matches over the weekend as the Nittany Lions defeated Long Island, Rutgers and Florida Gulf Coast. Slay totaled 19 blocks for the weekend, including tying her personal best with 10 vs. FGCU. She also finished second on the team with 27 kills, averaging 2.70 kills per set on a team-best .561 hitting.

Ace!

The Nittany Lions rank seventh nationally and first in the Big Ten with 1.74 aces per set. Freshman Micha Hancock leads the Big Ten and ranks second in the nation with 0.76 aces per set. Against FGCU, the Nittany Lions totaled a program-best 11 aces (rally scoring-era only) including three from Hancock and two each from Kristin Carpenter, Ali Longo and Lacey Fuller.

Hampton Inn Classic All-Tournament Selections

Slay was named the Hampton Inn Classic MVP, while sophomores Ali Longo and Ariel Scott were named to the Hampton Inn Classic All-Tournament Team. Joining the trio on the all-tournament team was Brittany Bozzini of Rutgers, FGCU's Jill Hopper and Kaitlin Holm and Long Island's Hanna Gibeau.

Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic All-Tournament Accolades

Sophomore Deja McClendon was named to the Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic All-Tournament Team. McClendon led the team with 42 kills during the weekend, including tying her career-high with 25 vs. Texas. Joining McClendon was Stanford' Carly Wopat, Rachel Williams and Karissa Cook, Florida's Kelly Murphy and Kristy Jaeckel and Texas' Hayley Eckerman.

Pittsburgh Invitational All-Tournament Team

Junior libero Kristin Carpenter, sophomore outside Deja McClendon and freshman setter Micha Hancock were all named to the University of Pittsburgh Invitational All-Tournament Team. For the weekend, McClendon led the team with 30 kills on .333 hitting, while Carpenter had a team-best 31 digs (3.44 digs per set). Hancock was the starting setter in all three matches and totaled 89 assists (9.89 assists per set), a team-high 10 aces, including six vs. New Hampshire and was second on the team with 20 digs (2.22 digs per set). Joining the trio on the all-tournament team were Miami's Jenn Caylor, New Hampshire's Amy Keding and Pittsburgh's Jasmine Dittrich and Lindsey Zitzke.

AVCA Showcase All-Tournament Honors

Sophomore Deja McClendon and freshman Micha Hancock each earned a spot on the AVCA Showcase All-Tournament team. McClendon combined for 40 kills, averaging 4.44 kills per set, on .341 hitting. Hancock was the starting setter against USC. For the weekend she guided the Nittany Lions to a .303 attack percentage, had eight kills in nine errorless swings, and tallied 56 assists. She also had six aces against the Trojans. Joining the pair on the all-tournament team were Minnesota's Ashley Wittman and Jessica Granquist, Oregon's Alaina Bergsma and USC's Alex Jupiter.

Season Opening Record

Under head coach Russ Rose, the Nittany Lions are 27-6 in season openers. Penn State's Aug. 26 loss to Oregon was the Lions' first season-opening loss since 2005 when the Nittany Lions suffered a 3-2 setback to Stanford, also in the AVCA Showcase. All six times the Nittany Lions have lost their season opener, they have rallied to win their second match. Penn State has never opened the season 0-2.

Freshmen Debuts

Four Nittany Lions newcomers made their collegiate debuts in the AVCA Showcase on Au 26-27. Freshmen Dominique Gonzalez, Micha Hancock and Lacey Fuller all subbed in during Penn State's match with Oregon on Aug. 26. In addition, Hancock and Nia Grant both made their first starts on Aug. 27 vs. USC.

Nittany Lions Debut Atop AVCA Coaches Poll

The four-time defending national champion Penn State women's volleyball team heads into the 2011 season as the preseason favorite in the AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. The eight-time defending Big Ten Champions earned 1,486 total points and 54 of 60 first place

USC is ranked second heading into 2011 having garnered 1,424 points and five first place votes. Following the Trojans is California (No. 3), who Penn State defeated in the 2010 National Championship match, Texas (No. 4) and Nebraska (No. 5).

Penn State Chosen as Preseason Favorite

For the seventh consecutive season and the eighth since 2001, the Nittany Lions have topped the preseason list as the favorite to win the Big Ten. Illinois and Nebraska tied for second in the preseason poll and Purdue was slated fourth. Minnesota was picked to finish fifth and Michigan State rounded out the poll at sixth.

Big Ten Dominance

With a 3-0 victory against Iowa on Nov. 26, 2010, the Nittany Lions clinched their eighth straight and 14th overall Big Ten title since joining the league for the 1991 season. The streak is unprecedented in the league in women's volleyball. The squad earned the conference title in 1992, 1993, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2010. Evert senior class at Penn State since 1992 has claimed at least on conference championship and the last five graduating classes have earned a conference title each year of their career.

Since 1985 when double round-robin play was instituted, only nine times has the conference champion gone undefeated, including Illinois in 1986 and 1988 with 18-0 records, Ohio State in 1991 with a 20-0 record and Penn State in 1998, 1999, 2005, 2007, 2008 and 2009 with 20-0 marks.

Three Nittany Lions Earn Big Ten Preseason Honors

A trio of Nittany Lions has earned Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches. Junior Kristin Carpenter and sophomores Deja McClendon and Katie Slay all picked up preseason accolades. McClendon was a unanimous selection and the awards were the first career honors for all three squad members.

The Rec Hall Advantage

Between Sept. 1, 2006 and Dec. 10, 2010 the Penn State women's volleyball team won a record-setting 94 consecutive home court matches. Penn State's 94-match home court winning streak ranks as one of the longest streaks in any D1 NCAA sport. In NCAA team sports of record, only a trio of men's basketball streaks (Kentucky, 1943-55 [129]; St. Bonaventure, 1948-61 [99]; UCLA, 1970-76 [98]) outranks the Nittany Lions' home court run. The women's volleyball program owns two of the top home court winning streaks having won 87 consecutive matches between Nov. 25, 1995 and Sept. 16, 2000. Nebraska's 91-match home court winning streak ranks second all-time.

Leading Lions

The team captains for the 2011-12 season are senior Katie Kabbes, junior Kristin Carpenter and redshirt sophomore Darcy Dorton.

Penn State holds the top three winning streaks in Big Ten history. Penn State's most recent streak of 65 consecutive matches began on Nov. 11, 2006 and ended on Sept. 24, 2010 at Illinois. It is the longest streak in league history. Penn State's other two conference winning streaks were 49 matches and 41. Illinois owns the fourth (40) and fifth (25) longest conference winning streaks.

The Nittany Lions made history in 2010 winning their fourth straight NCAA title. It was the fifth overall for the program and for head coach Russ Rose, the most national championships ever for a Division I volleyball head coach. Penn State's four consecutive NCAA women's volleyball titles are the most consecutive national titles ever for a Division I volleyball squad. The program's five titles (1999, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010) ranks second all-time behind Stanford's six.

Since 1981, only 10 teams have won an NCAA title in Division I women's volleyball, which currently totals 328 programs. The schools include, USC (3), Hawaii (3), UCLA (3), Pacific (2), Texas (1), LBSU (3), Stanford (6), Nebraska (3), Penn State (5) and Washington (1). Only four other teams have made an appearance in the NCAA National Championship, including Wisconsin, Florida, Minnesota and California. In addition, only 10 other teams besides the ones previously listed have earned a spot in the NCAA National Semifinals. These programs include, San Diego State, San Jose State, Illinois, UT-Arlington, LSU, Ohio State, Michigan State, Arizona, Santa Clara and Tennessee.

Nittany Lions By Month

Penn State is 35-5 (.875) all-time during the month of August. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State 3-2 in the opening round. The Lions lost to UCLA in the first round of the NACWAA in 2000 and fell to defending national champion Stanford in the first round of the AVCA/NACWAA Showcase in 2005, hosted by the Qwest Center in Omaha, Neb. Penn State's most recent August loss came to Oregon in the AVCA Showcase on Aug. 26, 2011.

Penn State is 349-54-4 (.862) all-time during the month of September. Amazingly, the Lions are 170-15 (.919) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 58-7 (.892) over the last five years.

The Lions are 376-67 (.849) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 83-13 (.864) mark in October over the last 10 seasons, a record of 47-4 (.922) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010 .

Penn State is 273-57 (.827) all-time during the month of November, including a 81-10 (.890) mark over the last 10 seasons. The Lions had a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and over the last eight seasons, Penn State has a 69-4 (.945) mark in November.

Quick Sets

- During a period from Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State had won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten for the 1991 season, Penn State has played in 698 total matches, winning 621. Amazingly, 497 of those 621 wins, or 80%, have been three-game sweeps. Over the last five years, Penn State has won 149 of its 174 victories in three games (86%), including 37 out of 38 (98%) in 2008 and 32 out of 38 in 2009 (84%).
- Over the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 57 matches. And of those 20 teams that defeated the Lions Brigham Young, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Florida and Michigan State,) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 278-58 (83%) mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.
