Storylines

Up to Bat

Penn State concludes its 2017 season against a Big Ten baseball title contender as No. 22 Nebraska makes its first ever visit to Medlar Field at Lubrano Park to open a three-game series Thursday at 6:30 p.m. The series continues Friday at 6:30 p.m. and concludes Saturday at 11 a.m.

Six Seniors Donning Blue and White for Final Time

- RHP Dakota Forsyth will conclude his Penn State career with the third-most appearances in school history, as he is currently tied with Jeff Emerich (1993-96) with 76. In his 76 appearances, Forsyth has pitched 170.0 innings with a career record of 9-10 and a 4.24 ERA. Five were starts and he has earned two saves. This season, he has set career highs for appearances (23), innings pitched (43.2), wins (4) and strikeouts (46).
- IF Christian Helsel has been 113 starts in 131 games in his three seasons since transferring from Ole Miss. Helsel drew regular starts at first, second and third bases. This season, he is the team leader in games played and started, only not appearing in the season opener. His four home runs and 24 RBIs are also career highs and enter the weekend tied for the team lead. Helsel received the team's inaugural "We Are" Award for best exemplifying what it means to be a Penn Stater with involvement in the community. He was recognized for his efforts for Wyatt Shaffer. Wyatt joined the Lions in 2015 through Team IMPACT, an organization that helps children facing life threatening and chronic illnesses get drafted by local college teams.
- C Alex Malinsky has been a leader on-and-off the field, appearing in 102 games and starting 68. He owns the team's highest GPA and was recently recognized as this year's Penn State "True Grit" award for bouncing back after suffering a serious injury in preseason practice. Malinsky had a tendency for the dramatic, hitting a walk-off double against Purdue last season, setting career highs with three hits, two doubles and three RBIs in his first start this season after returning from injury against Cornell (3/29), and driving in the game-winning runs with a double in the eighth against Villanova (5/16) in the Lions' most recent outing.
- RHP Tom Mullin has made 46 appearances and three starts over his four-year career, making 13 appearances out of the bullpen this season. As a sophomore he posted a teambest 4-0 record, and his junior campaign was highlighted by a career-best 5 1/3 inning relief appearance against No. 10 TCU, surrendering just two hits and a walk.
- OF Nick Riotto has been one of the team's leading hitters the past two seasons, and he
 enters the weekend with 134 starts in 161 games, and a .259 career average with five home
 runs and 57 RBIs. An injury sustained in the season-opener at No. 1 TCU hampered his start
 to this season, but over the previous 20 games entering the weekend he leads the team with
 a slash line of .324/.393/.423, 12 RBIs and nine walks. His 21 RBIs and eight stolen bases
 this season are career highs.
- RHP Tim Scholly, a local State College product has been the ultimate team player during his
 career, leading on and off the field. He missed his sophomore season due to injury, but has
 pitched a career-high four times this season, tossing three scoreless appearances.

Program Notes

First Varsity Sport

Baseball was Penn State's first varsity sport, playing its first games in 1875.

Five College World Series Appearances

Penn State has made five trips to the College World Series, placing as high as second in 1957. The Nittany Lions reached the CWS in 1952, 1957, 1959, 1963 and 1973. Penn State has reached the NCAA Tournament 19 times

1996 Big Ten Champions

The 2016 season marked the 20th anniversary of Penn State's first Big Ten Championship.

Nittany Lions in Cuba

Penn State participated in a weeklong, fourgame tour of Cuba, Nov. 21-28, 2015. The Nittany Lions went 1-3 in the "Cuba Baseball Friendship Tournament." The Lions played against teams from Cuba's top "professional" league, the National Series, becoming the first United States team to play multiple teams from the league and the first to earn a victory.

The team also participated in lectures about Cuban baseball, Jose Marti and the history of Cuban sports and U.S. relations.

Penn State first played Industriales in Havana's Estadio Latinamericano, falling 2-1. With the game, Penn State became the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division I baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba.

Penn State next played Ciego de Avila, the league's defending champion. Starting pitcher Victor Garcia had pitched for Cuba in the 2009 World Baseball Classic, and the Lions were defeated, 2-0.

Penn State earned the first victory for a United States team at any level over a Cuban National Series team in game three, defeating Mayabeque, 9-3.

Nittany Lions in the Pros

According to Baseball-Almanac.com, 27 Nittany Lions have gone on to play Major League Baseball, A total of 74 have been drafted. Most recently, junior third baseman Jim Haley and senior closer Jack Anderson became the first baseball student-athletes drafted out of Penn State since 2012. The Tampa Bay Rays selected Haley in the 19th round with the 570th overall pick, while Anderson was tabbed by the Seattle Mariners in the 23rd round with the 687th pick.

Did vou know?

O.J. McDuffie is mostly known for his stellar career on the gridiron for Penn State and in the NFL, but he also played baseball in 1990. He stole 20 bases (t-3rd, single season-school history) on 21 attempts (96 percent clip), hit .336 and had a .969 fielding percentage. He was drafted by the California Angels in the 41st round of the 1991 MLB June Amateur Draft.

Medlar Field at Lubrano Park

Situated in the shadow of Beaver Stadium, the facility -- completed in June of 2006 -- is arguably one of the premier collegiate stadiums in the country.

The ballpark's signature is the breathtaking view of legendary Mt. Nittany, a local landmark that is near and dear to the heart of every Penn Stater. With the stadium opening to the east, spectators can peer unencumbered down the Nittany Valley for miles and on a clear day Tussey Mountain Ski Resort can be seen from 10 miles away.

Seating capacity for Medlar Field is 5,406 and 20 luxury suites allow area companies to treat clients and friends to an unmatched baseball experience. A party deck along the right field line provides a good place for friends to gather and the picnic pavilion beyond the left field fence is perfect for birthday parties and aroup outinas.

Much like the rest of the park, the dimensions of the playing field are unique as well. A relatively short 325 feet to the left field pole stretches out to the deepest part of the park, the 410 foot nook in left center field. Straightaway center is 399 feet and the 320 foot right field fence is made more daunting with an 18.55 feet high wall, which commemorates the year Penn State was founded.

A 2,500 square foot press box can accommodate traveling and local media and has private broadcast booths for up to three radio teams. A large video scoreboard towers above the left field wall capable of providing up to the minute stats and video replays.

The stadium is named for 1982 Penn State graduate Anthony Lubrano and former Nittany Lion Head Coach Charles "Chuck" Medlar. Lubrano chose to honor Coach Medlar with a generous financial gift toward the realization of the long-discussed project. Coach Medlar served at the helm of the Penn State program for 19 years and guided the Lions to two College World Series appearances.

Team No. 129

Penn State is playing its 129th baseball season in program history, but will honor its previous 128 teams this season, mounting a No. 128 jersey in the dugout each game.

Series Notes

All-Time vs. Nebraska

Penn State and Nebraska have met only seven times, with Nebraska holding a 6-1 lead all-time. The first meeting came in 2012 in the Big Ten tournament, and the Nittany Lions visited Lincoln in 2014 and 2016, earning their first win last season. This will be Nebraska's first baseball trip to Happy Valley.

Head Coach Darin Erstad

Darin Erstad was named the 23rd head coach of the Nebraska baseball program - and the fifth since 1947 - on June 2, 2011. The Huskers have played in a conference tournament each of Erstad's first five seasons, including a pair of runner-up finishes, and the NCAA tournament twice. A two-time Major League All-Star and three-time Gold Glove winner, Erstad was also, one of the most decorated players in Nebraska baseball history, Erstad was a first-team All-American in 1995, before embarking on a 14-year career in Major League Baseball. Erstad wrapped up his professional career in the fall of 2009, after playing for the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim (1996-06), Chicago White Sox (2007) and Houston Astros (2008-09). He was the No. 1 overall pick in the 1995 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Scouting Nebraska

Nebraska enters the final regular season weekend in the thick of a Big Ten title hunt, trailing league-leading Minnesota (14-6, .700) by a mere .010 in winning percentage (14-6-1, .690.) The Cornhuskers are ranked in four different polls, led by a No. 22 ranking in Baseball America, and they have won nine out of their last 12 Big Ten games. Pitching and defense has been Nebraska's specialty this season. Boasting a team ERA of 3.56, the Huskers ranks second in the Big Ten and 30th in the NCAA. They also rank second in the Big Ten and ninth in the NCAA with 1.08 double plays per game and fourth in the Big Ten and 24th in the NCAA with a .978 fielding percentage. Scott Schreiber leads the team with a .344 batting average, five home runs and 41 RBIs, while Jake Myers is a dual threat with a .301 batting average, team-best .422 on-base percentage and the Sunday starting pitching role. On the mound, he owns a 3.34 ERA, 7-1 record and team-high 72.2 IP with just nine walks.

Last Series May 13, 2016

LINCOLN, Neb. - LHP Nick Hedge was strong in seven innings and Greg Guers hit his second three-run home run in as many games, as Penn State defeated Nebraska, 7-4 on Hawks Field in Haymarket Park.

Guers hit his third home run in three games. He went 1-for-3 with a sacrifice fly in addition to the three-run blast for a season high-matching four-RBI night. The homer came in the eighth inning and gave Penn State insurance runs it would need. Designated hitter Tyler Kendall also had a big night at the plate going 3-for-4 with a double and walk. Additionally, centerfielder James Coates walked three times to reach 101 for his career, stole a base and scored twice. Catcher **Ryan Sloniger** went 2-for-5 with an RBI, and right fielder **Nick Riotto** went 2-for-5 with two runs and a diving catch in the outfield.

Hedge (5-2) enjoyed one of the finest outings of his career, allowing three runs on seven hits and four walks with a season high-matching five strikeouts in seven-plus innings pitched. He kept Nebraska scoreless through the first six innings in his first Big Ten and weekend start of the season.

RHP Jack Anderson (13) worked the final two innings, allowing one run on three hits with one strikeout. He extended his single-season and career records (25) in the category, as well as his career appearances record (96). His 26 appearances on the season tie him for sixth all-time at Penn State, trailing a pair of his previous seasons as he appeared 29 times (t-2nd) in 2015 and 27 times (t-4th) in 2014.

The Huskers were led by right fielder Jake Meyers, who went 3-for-5 with a run and RBI. Third baseman Jake Placzek went 2-for-5 with a run and three others had an RBI each. RHP Derek Burkamper (5-2) went five innings, surrendering three runs on six hits and four walks with one strikeout.

After two scoreless innings to start the game, Penn State scored twice in the third inning. Sloniger and Riotto singled to lead-off the inning and were sacrificed over a base by third baseman Jim Haley, and then Guers flied out to centerfield to drive in Sloniger. Riotto then scored from third on a controversial strikeout-wild pitch. As first baseman **Willie Burger** left the batter's box after swinging and

missing, he inadvertently kicked the ball. Since it was not a batted ball and Burger's contact was unintentional, everyone was ruled safe.

Coates drew his 99th career walk to lead off the fourth inning and was sacrificed to second by shortstop **Conlin Hughes**, putting him in scoring position for Sloniger. Sloniger delivered with another single up the middle to score Coates for a 3-0 lead. Coates' 100th career walk in the fifth loaded the bases, but a fly out ended the inning.

Nebraska got on the scoreboard in the seventh inning. Hedge walked a pair and pinch-hitter Jesse Wilkening singled to right center to drive in one. The Lions turned a sensational 5-4-3 (Haley to **Christian Helsel** to Burger) double play to end the inning though.

The Lions added important insurance runs the next frame on Guers' three-run shot. The Huskers had Penn State down to its final outs when the top of the order came up, but Riotto and Haley both singled and Guers battled a 1-2 count into a full count before launching the ball beyond the right field fence for a 6-1 lead.

The Huskers did not go quietly though. A walk and two singles in the bottom of the eighth resulted in another run and chased Hedge. Anderson surrendered a single up the middle to the first batter he faced to allow another run to score and make it a three-run game. Anderson struck out the next batter and appeared to be out of the inning on the next, but an error extended the inning and loaded the bases. Hughes, Helsel and Burger were able to turn a 6-4-3 double play to end the inning though.

May 14, 2016

LINCOLN, Neb. – Penn State was unable to replicate the previous night's offensive performance, as Nebraska kept the Nittany Lions in check for a 6-0 victory.

RHP Matt Waldron (6-2) enjoyed a career best outing for Nebraska, tossing a complete game shutout in which he allowed just four hits and struck out six.

Designated hitter Tyler Kendall was one of three for Penn State muster a hit. He went 2-for-4 with a double. On the mound, RHP Sal Biasi (5-5) went five innings for the Nittany Lions, allowing three runs on four hits and a walk with six strikeouts.

First baseman Ben Miller paced the Cornhuskers' offense, going 3-for-4 with a double, two RBIs and two runs.

Nebraska took a 2-0 lead in the first inning on a two-RBI single by Miller. The score remained the same until the fourth inning, as Miller led off with a double and catcher Jesse Wilkening followed with a one-out single to left-center to score him.

Miller led the sixth off with a base hit, and a two-out walk and wild pitch put two Huskers in scoring position. Second baseman Jake Schleppenbach then delivered with a two-RBI single to centerfield for a 5-0 lead. The Huskers took advantage of an error in the seventh for the final margin.

May 15, 2016

LINCOLN, Neb. -- Strong starting pitching, early runs and a four-run seventh for Nebraska overcame a four-hit day for Penn State's Greg Guers and led the Cornhuskers to an 8-1 victory over the Lions.

Guers led Penn State (27-25, 11-10 Big Ten), accounting for four of its five hits. He went 4-for-4 with a triple and the lone run. First baseman Tyler Kendall had the lone RBI.

For Nebraska, LHP Jake Meyers (5-1) went 7 2/3 innings, allowing just one run on four hits with five strikeouts. First baseman Ben Miller and right fielder Scott Schreiber powered the Huskers offense, combining to go 7-for-8 with six RBIs. Schreiber went 4-for-4 with two home runs and three RBIs, while Miller went 3-for-4 with a double and three RBIs.

Nebraska scored a run each in four of the first five innings. Guers answered in the seventh with a leadoff triple and he scored on Kendall's groundout, but Miller and Schreiber drove in four runs in the bottom half for the final margin. Miller hit a two-run double and Schreiber sent the very next pitch over the left field wall.

Biasi Poised to Rank Among Team K Leaders

- RHP **Sal Biasi** leads the Nittany Lions with a career-high 82 strikeouts this season, which are the most by a Penn State pitcher since T.J. Macy struck out 91 in 2009.
- Biasi needs five more strikeouts to crack the school's top-10 list for single-season strikeouts, as Sean Stidfole is tied for 10th with himself as he posted back-to-back 87 strikeout seasons in 2004 and 2005.

Biasi Leads Rotation

- RHP **Sal Biasi** boasts a 3.34 ERA, a career-high 82 strikeouts, and a career-high matching five wins to lead Penn State. His 67.1 innings pitched are a career high and rank second on the team.
- Biasi's 82 strikeouts rank third in the Big Ten and 82nd in the nation, while his 10.96 strikeouts per nine innings rank third in the league and 41st nationally.
- His 3.34 ERA ranks 11th in the Big Ten.

Pitchers Set Strikeout Record

- Penn State's pitchers have combined for 409 strikeouts this season, breaking the record of 407, set in 2012.
- The Lions have been led in the category this season by RHP Sal Biasi, who has totaled 82 this season for the most by a Penn State pitcher since T.J. Macy in 2009 (91).
- The Lions boast five pitchers with more than one strikeout per inning: Biasi (82 in 67.1 IP), Nick Distasio (48 in 43.0 IP), Dakota Forsyth (46 in 43.2 IP), Eric Mock (45 in 40.0 IP) and Taylor Lehman (30 in 28.1 IP).

Injury Bug Bites Offense

- Seven of Penn State's nine Opening Day starting position players have missed multiple games due to injury. The seven have missed a combined 120 man-games.
- Infielder Conlin Hughes and catcher Ryan Sloniger were the latest to get bitten by the injury bug, but both have returned.
- Leading hitter and outfielder **Jordan Bowersox** has been out of the lineup since Apr. 15. Bowersox led the team with a .333 batting average, .418 on-base percentage, and .480 slugging percentage. He is still tied for the lead in stolen bases with nine.
- Freshman centerfielder Mason Nadeau was mostly out of action for over a month, but has been a big part of Penn State's offense since his return off the bench against Pitt (4/18). Nadeau was the team's best hitter and best at getting on-base during the first five games of his return, going 7-for-17 (.412) with a .545 on-base percentage. He also had his first career home run, three RBIs, four walks and a stolen base. For the year, Nadeau is batting .316 with 13 RBIs in 31 starts and 32 games.

- Freshman shortstop Joe Weisenseel missed the Michigan series and has not played since the opening game of the Ohio State series (4/8). Weisenseel managed just four hits in his first 17 games, but was just starting to heat up with eight hits in his last six games, batting .500 (8-for-16).
- Senior outfielder Nick Riotto played in just two games in the opening month of the season after running full speed into a wall in the season opener at TCU. He led Penn State with a .405 on base percentage in 2016 and batted .307. After struggling to bat .200 upon his return, Riotto has raised his batting average 78 points over the last 19 games.
- Sophomore infielder **Connor Klemann** has been out since the end of February and will miss the remainder of the season. He batted .260 in 28 games in a freshman season that was also limited by injury.
- Additionally, senior catcher Alex Malinsky missed the first month of the season recovering from an injury suffered in preseason training.

Youth Movement

- The average Nittany Lion starter this season is a sophomore, as the average class year (Freshman = 1 ... Senior = 4) across all 10 positions through 52 games is 2.1.
- Penn State has started an average of 3.4 freshmen per game in the 10 lineup card spots, but has started less than four just once in the last 16 games.
- For the 2016 season, the Lions averaged 2.25 years in the starting lineup with a youthful 1.96 on the mound and a deceptive 2.49 at the dish as the Lions started two to five freshmen per game.
- Penn State only has three upperclassman position players on the roster.
- A total of 11 Nittany Lions have made their debuts this season.

Offense Erupts Against Villanova

- Penn State scored the game's last nine runs against Villanova (5/16), highlighted by a seven-run eighth inning, to erase a three-run deficit and earn an 11-5 victory in the nonconference finale.
- Penn State had six batters post multi-hit games to total a season-high matching 15 hits for the game, while six also posted at least one RBI.
- Senior catcher Alex Malinsky drove in the go-ahead runs with a two-RBI double in the eighth, while right fielder Braxton Giavedoni led the offense with a career-high matching 3-for-5 night and was one of five Nittany Lions with two RBIs. First baseman Willie Burger reached base four times going 2-for-3 with two runs, a double, stolen base and two walks. Second baseman Christian Helsel (Altoona, Pa.) also doubled as part of a 2-for-4 night that included two RBIs and a walk.
- RHP Schuyler Bates earned the win with four innings of relief, allowing just a run on four hits and a walk with one strikeout.
- RHP Myles Gayman started and picked up his final eight outs with strikeouts. He finished with a career-high nine.

Cat Fight

 The Nittany Lions went 7-7 this season against fellow big cat schools, playing the Pacific Tigers (2-1), Columbia Lions (2-2), Pitt Panthers (0-2), Northwestern Wildcats (1-2), Lafayette Leopards (1-0) and Villanova Wildcats (1-0).

Biggest Wins

- Penn State earned its biggest wins of the season, based on RPI, by defeating West Virginia (5/9) and Indiana (5/12) on the road. Both were ranked in the Top 25 at the time.
- West Virginia ranked 20th entering the week and Indiana 33rd.
- The Nittany Lions entered the week without any wins against RPI Top 100 teams.

New Power Sources

- Eleven different Nittany Lions have combined for 26 home runs this season.
- The total of 11 different Nittany Lions with home runs is the most since 1999.
- Six hit their first career home runs, including three sophomores - Conlin Hughes, Jordan Bowersox and Keith Leavitt and four freshmen - Brett Davis, Logan Goodnight, Braxton Giavedoni and Mason Nadeau.
- Christian Helsel hit a grand slam against Pacific (3/5) after going homer-less in 2016.
 He hit one home run in 2015 but has four total this season.
- Willie Burger hit just one home run as a freshman, but hit two in the third game of the season at No. 1 TCU (2/19) and has added two since.
- Nick Riotto has two home runs after hitting two last season. He is the only Nittany Lion who returned with multiple home runs hit the season prior.
- Burger and Helsel and Hughes are the team power leaders with a career-high four home runs each and 24 RBIs each.

Power Bump

- Penn State's 26 home runs on the season are its most since the 2012 team hit 38.
- 22 of the 26 home runs hit this season have come on the road.
- Its 10 home runs in the first 14 games of the season were its most since at least 2002.

Distasio Earns Save

- RHP **Nick Distasio** earned his first save since Mar. 9 by closing out Penn State's win at Indiana (5/12).
- Distasio earned his fourth save of the season by not allowing a hit or walk over the final 1 2/3 innings of the game.
- Distasio has enjoyed a career year, setting highs for wins (3), saves (4), appearances (20), innings pitched (43.0) and strikeouts (47).
- Early in the season, Distasio factored in decisions in four straight appearances, totaling three saves and a win.
- Distasio earned the final two outs vs. Xavier (2/24) for his first career save and then pitched 3 1/3 innings in the series finale (2/26) to earn the win.
- Including the Xavier win, he had three appearances for 3 1/3 innings. He earned 3 1/3 inning saves at Pacific (3/4) in an 11-4 victory and at Sacramento State (3/9) in a 4-2 victory.

Heating Up in Rio

- Outfielder Nick Riotto has been Penn State's leading hitter over the last 20 games, batting .324 with five doubles, 12 RBIs and nine walks for a .393 on-base percentage.
- He has hits in six out of his last seven games.

All-Around the Infield

- Christian Helsel has drawn starts at three infield positions this season.
- He returned to third base for one game against West Virginia (5/10) after starting the previous 16 games at second base.
- He has started all four games since at second base.
- Helsel previously drew 21 starts at third base and eight at first base.
- Helsel currently owns a career-best .966 fielding percentage.

- Saturday starting RHP Justin Hagenman has seen a sophomore surge in strikeouts.
- · During his Freshman All-America campaign last season, Hagenman struck out 39 in 82 innings, but this season he has struck out 67 in 72 1/3 innings.

Home Sweet Home

- The Nittany Lions are in their 11th season in Medlar Field at Lubrano Park, where they hold a 141-96 all-time record and have an 9-11 record this season.
- In 2016, Penn State won a facility record 10 consecutive games en route to totaling 15 wins, its most since 2008.
- · The Lions enjoyed their seventh winning mark in the park and hosted two of the 11 largest crowds in program history.

At Indiana (5/12-14)

lagenman Tosses Complete Game

- RHP Justin Hagenman went the distance for Penn State against Indiana (5/13) for his first career complete game.
- Hagenman allowed five runs on 11 hits with no walks and six strikeouts in eight innings.
- It marks the second complete game of the season, as Sal Biasi tossed one at Maryland (4/16) last month. Penn State last had two complete games in the same season in 2014.

Davis Breaks Out In Win

- RHP Sal Biasi) allowed just one run in seven innings and freshman Brett Davis enjoyed a career day at the plate as Penn State defeated Indiana, 5-2 (5/12).
- · Penn State earned its second win of the week over a top-25 RPI team after defeating West Virginia (5/9), also on the road
- Biasi (5-5) kept the Hoosiers in check for seven innings, allowing just one run on four hits and three walks with six strikeouts.
- Biasi was up to 110 pitches after six innings, but came back out for the seventh and retired the side in order with just eight pitches, striking out the final batter.
- Extra-base hits powered the Nittany Lion offense as third baseman Logan Goodnight tripled and scored, and shortstop Conlin **Hughes** and Davis both hit solo home runs.
- The home run was Davis' first and he also went a career-high 2-for-4 with two RBIs, driving in an insurance run in the ninth.

Vs. West Virginia (5/9-10) Penn State Plays at PNC Park

- · Penn State played in PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates, for the first time in program history (5/10). West Virginia worked out of a bases loaded jam in the eighth to preserve a 4-2 victory over Penn State.
- It was Penn State's first game in a Major League ballpark since May 5, 2012 when it played Minnesota at Target Field, home of the Minnesota Twins. The three-game series also included two games in the Twins' former home, the Metrodome.
- Catcher Ryan Sloniger and third baseman Christian Helsel drove in the Nittany Lion runs, and Helsel joined centerfielder Mason Nadeau and catcher Willie Burger with two-hit games.
- RHP Nick Distasio kept the Nittany Lions in the game, allowing just one hit and striking out four over 3 2/3 in relief.

Big Win

Mountain State native and Penn State freshman Logan Goodnight hit a three-run

- home run in the second inning and the Nittany Lions manufactured the game-winning run in the top of the ninth without getting a hit to defeat West Virginia, 6-5, Tuesday.
- Penn State earned its biggest win of the season, as the Mountaineers entered the game ranking 13th in the NCAA in RPI.
- The Nittany Lions did not trail again after Goodnight gave them a 3-1 lead in the second inning on his first career home run. West Virginia trailed by three after Penn State added two more runs in the fifth, but the Mountaineers battled back with two runs in the sixth and a solo home run by third baseman Cole Austin in the bottom of the eighth to tie the game at 5-5.
- That set the stage for a dramatic ninth inning. With the bases loaded and one out, freshman Mason Nadeau hit a potential double-play ball, but used his speed to beat out the throw to first and allow Helsel to score the go-ahead run.
- RHP Dakota Forsyth kept the Mountaineers at bay in the bottom half, striking out the first two batters and inducing a fly out to end the game after surrendering a two-out single. He pitched the final 2 1/3 innings and struck out, allowing just the home run on two hits and a walk.

At Maryland (4/14-16) Going the Distance

- RHP Sal Biasi carried a one-hitter into the ninth against Maryland, but home runs on back-to-back pitches with one out gave Maryland a 2-1 victory over the Nittany Lions.
- Biasi finished with the first complete game for Penn State since 2014, going a career-high 8 1/3 innings and yielding the two runs on three hits and a walk with six strikeouts.

- After earning a 2-1 win in the bottom of the ninth against Northwestern (4/23), Penn State now has two walk-off wins on the season.

- The Nittany Lions previously walked-off Bucknell on Mar. 21, as an error allowed the winning run to score in the bottom of the 10th inning.

Bucknell (4/11)Beginners' Luck

- Five of Penn State's wins have come with first-time starting pitchers.
- Most recently, junior RHP Jake Pilewicz made his first career start against Bucknell (4/11) and went five innings, only surrenduring two runs on seven hits and three walks.
- Junior RHP Schuvler Bates earned his first career win in his first start against Cornell (3/29). Bates put together a five-inning, three-strikeout effort, allowing just two hits and two walks and retiring the sides in the third, fourth and fifth innings.
- Penn State also prevailed in the starting debuts of RHP Myles Gayman, RHP Cole Bartels and RHP Eric Mock.

At Pitt (4/4)

Back-to-Back Again

- Penn State slugged back-to-back home runs twice in a span of three games.
- Christian Helsel and Willie Burger went deep consecutively at No. 22 Michigan (4/1) in the fourth inning, and then Helsel followed

a Jordan Bowersox homer with one of his own at Pitt (4/4) in the fifth inning.

In-State Opponent Winning Streak Ends

- Penn State saw its winning streak against Pennsylvania schools end at 13 with a 3-2 loss at Pitt (4/4).
- It was the first loss in the last five meetings with Pitt and the first loss to a Pennsylvania school since dropping one of four at Bucknell in 2014.

Bonus Baseball

- Penn State's first foray into extra innings in 2017 was a successful one, as the Nittany Lions defeated Bucknell (3/21) in the bottom of the 10th.
- Penn State has won its last three extra inning games.

Burger Factors in on Five Runs

- Willie Burger factored in on five of the six runs scored by Penn State in the series finale victory over Sacramento State (3/11).
- Burger went 3-for-5, a triple shy of the cycle, with a three-run home run helping him total four RBIs and two runs on the day.
- Burger drove in the first run in the top of the first inning, hit a three-run home run in the third, and doubled and scored in the ninth.

Two Two-Hitters

- Penn State pitching has combined to earn two, two-hit or less games in the same season for the first time since 2007.
- In 2007, the Lions limited Central Connecticut State to two hits on Mar. 23 and Northwestern to one hit on Apr. 21.
- This season, the Lions have held No. 1 TCU (2/17) and Sacramento State (3/11) to two hits each.
- RHP Cole Bartels recently, Most surrendered two hits in the first 3 2/3 innings against Sac State, but the bullpen held the Hornets hitless over the final 5 1/3 innings.
- RHP Dakota Forsyth was able to induce a pop-up to get out of the fourth, and then he pitched the next two innings. RHP Eric Mock allowed just a walk over 1 2/3 innings and LHP Taylor Lehman was perfect in getting the final four outs.
- The two hits allowed at TCU were the fewest allowed by the Lions since Mar. 29, 2015 against Central Connecticut State (two hits), and the fewest allowed on the road since Apr. 5, 2014 at Purdue (one hit).

Homecoming for Coach

- Penn State head coach Rob Cooper returned to his native Sacramento on Penn State's week-long spring break trip.
- He graduated from El Camino High School and also played at Sacramento City College in the early 1990's and was an assistant coach their from 1999-2003.
- Many friends and family members supported the team throughout the week. They were dubbed "Cooper's Town West."

At Pacific (3/4-6)

Grand Slam

- · Senior Christian Helsel hit Penn State's first grand slam since Louie Picconi hit one on April 24, 2010 at Ohio State.
- Helsel's slam came with two outs in the ninth.

Double-Digit Runs

- Penn State won the first two games against Pacific scoring 11 runs in each.
- It marked the first time since 2014 that Penn

- State scored double-digit runs in back-toback games. The Lions scored 10 in a win over Northwestern (3/29) and 15 in a win over Youngstown State (4/1) in 2014.
- · Penn State last completed the feat against the same team in 2010 against Michigan State scoring 18 and 22 runs in back-toback games.
- · Penn State last completed the feat on the road also in 2010, scoring 18 and 14 runs at Ohio State.

Season Notes

Challenging Slate

- Penn State is competing against six teams coming off NCAA Tournament appearances in 2016, opening the season at TCU (Feb. 17-19) coming off its third-straight College World Series appearance and its fourth in the last six years. The Horned Frogs traveled from Fort Worth, Texas to Penn State for a three-game series last May.
- The Nittany Lions faced another NCAA tourney team the next weekend, hosting defending Big East Champion Xavier for a three-game series Feb. 24-26 at the USA Baseball National Training Center.
- Penn State is hosting a total of four reigning tournament teams, including defending America East Champion Binghamton (Mar. 28). The other three comprise three of Penn State's four home Big Ten series: conference champion Ohio State (Apr. 7-9), Minnesota (May 5-7) and Nebraska (May 18-20).

Top 50 Class Inked

- Penn State baseball received National Letters of Intent from seven signees on National Signing Day.
- The class, which will begin participation in the 2017-18 academic year, ranks 50th in the nation and fourth in the Big Ten according to leading baseball scouting service Perfect Game.
- The class includes four pitchers, one twoway player and two position players. Three -- Conor Larkin (Royersford, Pa.), Jeff Taylor (Pequea, Pa.) and Kyle Virbitsky (Media, Pa.) -- hail from Pennsylvania, while another three --Tyler Dearden (Lumberton, N.J), Ralph Gambino (Freehold, N.J.) and Tommy Gibson (Williamstown, N.J.) -- hail from New Jersey. Bailey Dees (Charlotte, N.C.) hails from North Carolina.
- The Nittany Lions will announce additional members of the Class of 2021 later in the academic year.

- · Penn State drew its eighth-largest crowd alltime at Medlar this season with 2,074 Apr. 22 against Northwestern.
- The Lions drew their largest crowd since 2010 to its doubleheader against No. 10 TCU, with a season-high 2,185 fans.



The 2017 baseball season will be Rob Cooper's fourth as head coach of the Nittany Lion baseball program. Not shy about stating his ultimate goal of returning Penn State to Omaha in June, the Lions have made significant strides under his leadership.

Penn State is not only coming off its best season with Cooper at the helm, but perhaps its most unique in program history, as Cooper, no stranger to international baseball, led the Nittany Lions on a historic trip to Cuba in November 2015.

The rare, once-in-a-lifetime experience helped bring a young Penn State team together, and the Lions went on to earn their first winning record since 2012. The starting lineup included at least three freshmen in all but six games and five to six freshmen in 19 games, and took on nine eventual NCAA Tournament teams, including a three-game series at home against College World Series participant TCU. The Lions' 28 wins were a 10-win improvement over the previous season, and its 12 Big Ten wins doubled the 2015 total and was one more than the previous two seasons combined.

The season ended with a 12-inning, walk-off victory, giving Cooper 350 wins for his head coaching career.

Returning players continued to improve under Cooper's guidance to lead the youthful squad, and junior third baseman Jim Haley and senior closer Jack Anderson earned the ultimate honor of being drafted by Major League teams. Haley played all three seasons at Penn State under Cooper, while Anderson dramatically improved over his final three seasons to become Penn State's all-time leader in appearances and saves. Haley and Anderson became the eighth and ninth players, respectively, of Cooper's 12-year head coaching career to be drafted by Major League teams. During a successful nine-year stint as the head coach at Wright State, seven of the players he coached were drafted, including eventual Major Leaguer Joe Smith, and 12 more signed professional free agent contracts.

Haley and Anderson were the first drafted out of Penn State since 2012, and Anderson and senior outfielder Greg Guers became the program's first All-Big Ten picks also since 2012. Infielder Willie Burger and pitcher Justin Hagenman drew All-Big Ten Freshman recognition, while Hagenman also became Penn State's first Louisville Slugger All-American since 1997.

Although Cooper has proven himself to be a great head coach on the field, his strong belief in the first part of the term "student-athlete" is perhaps the top reason he has proven to be an excellent fit at Penn State. Even with state-of-the-art facilities, the chance to take on elite competition and a program history that includes five trips to the College World Series, Cooper cites the value of a Penn State degree as one of the top reasons to join his program. The last message to the team before departing the bus upon return from a road trip – no matter the hour – is often a stern reminder to be in class on time and take care of school work.

The trip to Cuba prior to the 2016 season is perhaps the best example of his commitment to developing truly educated men. The extensive planning for the trip began well before U.S. policy regarding travel to Cuba loosened, and playing baseball was a secondary aspect. Nonetheless, Penn State became the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. team at any level to defeat a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division I baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba. The harmony between academics and athletics was on full display, as multiple professors and a group of journalism students also joined the travel party.

In three years at Penn State, 30 of Cooper's student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, including Jack Anderson, who this past season became the first Nittany Lion in six years to be named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team. As a military history buff, Cooper's speeches to the team often include historical references. He even arranged to have the team visit the headquarters of the Navy SEAL Team VI headquarters and speak with a pair of Navy SEALs – one a Penn State alum –

during a travel day on the team's 2015 spring break trip

Cooper was selected as the 14th head baseball coach in Penn State history on August 9, 2013. He brought an accomplished resume that included three NCAA

tournament appearances as a head coach at Wright State and five more at various stops as an assistant coach, including two trips to the College World Series with Miami (Florida). Cooper was twice named the Horizon League Coach of the Year and guided Wright State to three league tournament championships and two regular season championships after the team suffered six losing seasons in the seven years before his arrival.

With Cooper seeking to complete yet another program turnaround, the Lions started making gains during his second season in Happy Valley in 2015. Penn State totaled 18 wins against a schedule ranking in the bottom third nationally during his inaugural campaign in 2014, but rose to the challenge the following season, matching the previous season's 18 wins despite playing a schedule that ranked in the upper third in difficulty and involved 10 games against top-25 opponents. The Nittany Lions rallied from a 7-0 deficit against No. 21 Indiana for their first win over a ranked opponent in three seasons and gave eighth-ranked Illinois its biggest scare during its record winning streak, battling for 15 innings. Penn State ultimately won one more conference game than the year before, despite the Bit Ten enjoying arguably its most competitive season to date with a league-record five teams earning NCAA Tournament bids.

A major part of Cooper's scheduling philosophy involves getting the Lions in "NCAA Regional environments" to prepare them for success beyond Memorial Day. The Lions have certainly done that the past two seasons, travelling to traditional powers Texas A&M and South Carolina (twice), while hosting TCU. ACC and Big 12 schools have also dotted the Lions' slate, as the Big Ten as a whole has staked its ground as one of the premier baseball conferences in the country despite notions that Northern schools cannot be successful.

Shortly after Cooper accepted the Penn State head coaching position in 2014, the California native traveled to Taichung, Taiwan to serve as the head coach of USA Baseball's U18 National Team at the IBAF U18 World Cup. Cooper steered Team USA to an 8-1 record in World Cup play, including seven consecutive victories to win the gold medal.

Not long after the triumph in Taiwan, Cooper received one of the highest honors bestowed in the profession, as he was announced as the Rod Dedeaux USA Baseball Coach of the Year. With the honor, Cooper became just the 16th individual in the award's history to receive the accolade, joining the likes of Scott Brosius, Davey Johnson and Tommy Lasorda.

Cooper was also a member of the coaching staff for the 2007 and 2009 USA College National teams. The 2007 team earned a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Fourteen of the 20 players on the 2007 team reached the Major Leagues, including 2013 All-Star Pedro Alvarez. Fourteen of the 22 members of the 2009 team have also reached the Major Leagues, including 2015 All-Stars Gerrit Cole and Yasmani Grandall

Cooper methodically built Wright State into a perennial contender in the Horizon League with seven 30-win seasons, two Horizon League regular-season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and six Horizon League Championship game appearances. In nine seasons starting in 2005, Cooper accumulated a 286-230 record, including a pair of wins over No. 1-ranked opponents Virginia (3/5/10) and Georgia (3/24/09). He was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2011.

Cooper saw 47 players earn all-conference accolades and 18 garner all-newcomer honors. He also produced five Horizon League Players of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, three Relief Pitchers of the Year and two Newcomers of the Year.

The 2011 season saw Cooper record his 200th coaching victory and earn the Horizon League Coach of the Year award for the second consecutive year. The Raiders won their second-straight Horizon League regular season title with a 16-7 record, claimed the league tournament crown by winning three-straight games and advanced to the NCAA Regionals in College Station, Texas. In 2010, the Raiders won the Horizon League regular-season title with a mark of 17-6, the first regular-season conference crown for the program since the 1997 squad won the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. The 2009 Wright State Raiders compiled a 33-30 overall record and returned to the NCAA Tournament following a Horizon League Tournament championship.

At season's end in 2008, Cooper watched as a school and Horizon League-record three players were drafted during the 2008 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft. In 2007, Wright State enjoyed one of the most prolific offensive seasons in school history as it broke three career records and 11 single-season school records. Ross Oeder, now a Penn State assistant coach on Cooper's staff, was named the Horizon League Player of the Year and garnered second-team All-America Honors. The 2006 edition of the Raiders set six school records and posted the most season wins in five years. Cooper's squad defeated nationally-ranked TCU on the road, topped national-powerhouse Notre Dame in South Bend and was on the brink of an upset against eventual National Champion Oregon State in the NCAA Corvallis Regional.

Before arriving at Wright State, Cooper served as the hitting coach, recruiting coordinator and bench coach at Oral Roberts University. A perennial power of the Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League), ORU advanced to the finals of the NCAA Austin Regional in 2004, beating TCU twice before falling to Texas, 7-3 and 7-5. The Golden Eagles finished with an overall mark of 50-11 in 2004 and had five players selected in the Major League Baseball draft, two honored as All-Americans by the ABCA and three named All-Americans by the College Baseball Insiders website.

Cooper began his coaching career at national power Miami, spending two seasons (1994-95) as a student/graduate assistant on the Hurricanes' staff. While at Miami, Cooper helped the Hurricanes to College World Series berths in 1994 and 1995. Cooper spent the 1996 season as an assistant and team academic coordinator at Wake Forest, then moved on to Tulane for the next two seasons, serving as the Green Wave's hitting coach. In 1997, the Green Wave won the Conference USA regular-season crown, and in 1998, they advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Cooper left Tulane following the 1998 season and returned to Sacramento City College, where he starred in the early 1990s before lettering at Miami in 1993.

Along with his college coaching experience, Cooper also was an associate scout for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 1990-92 and has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

Cooper earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Miami in 1994 and a master's in sports sciences/administration from Miami in 1996. He is married to his wife, Maureen, and has two sons, Jake and Tyson.
