SERIES HEADLINES

HOT STREAK

Sophomore first baseman Kristina Brackpool had a banner weekend in Starkville vs. Mississisppi State as she went 5-7 (.714) with a double, three RBI and two runs scored while drawing a walk and reaching base another time on a hit-bypitch. She is currently first on the team with 11 runs batted in, second in hitting with a .353 average and is tied for the team lead in home runs with three Brackpool slammed home runs with three. Brackpool slammed a total of two dingers last season and is on pace for more than a dozen in 2015.

CUTS LIKE A KNIEF
Junior Lexi Knief's ability to cut through opposing pitching this year has been remarkable. Despite missing four of the first five games of the season due to injury, she leads the team in batting average for player with at least 10 at-bats this season with her .360 average. She is also tied for the team lead in doubles with two and her pair. Her three RBI is tied for fourth most on the team.

COLLECTING TWO AND PASSING GO

COLLECTING TWO AND PASSING GO Back in the starting line-up for the first time since the team's opening series in Boca Raton, redshirt freshman Mia Monopoli made the best of her time at DP this past weekend down south. The catcher turned designated player went 2-5 (.400) with two singles and an RBI, her second this season. The San Francisco native started the final two games of the series in the DP slot and raised her season average even with the Mendoza Line.

TRIPLE DOUBLES
A total of three Penn State players have accumulated double-digit hit totals this season as Kristina Brackpool (12), Macy Jones (11) and Alyssa VanDerveer (11) account for almost half (34 of 76) of all the PSU base knocks in 2015.

STIFF OPPOSITION

STIFF OPPOSITION
This weekend Penn State will square off against not one but two different ranked opponents in the SEC's Georgia and Missouri. UGA is currently garnering a No. 8 ranking in both national polls with its 12-2 record, while Mizzou coasts in at No. 20 in both the NFCA/USA Today and ESPN/USA Softball polls. The Tigers are 8-2 this season with their freshman pitcher Paige Lowary most recently garnering conference Lowary most recently garnering conference pitcher of the week honors.

WE'II BE SEC'EEING YOU

WE'II BE SEC'EEING YOU
Penn State has played a total of six games against SEC opponents this season and will add to that total this weekend when it takes on Georgia and Missouri. So far the Nittany Lions have mustered a 2-4 mark against opponents from the Southeastern Conference in 2015 with a 1-0 record against Arkansas, a 1-1 mark vs. Texas A&M to go along with an 0-3 tally vs. Mississippi State. PSU is 1-4 all-time vs. Missouri and holds a 1-3 record vs. Georgia. This will be the Lions' first contest against the Tigers as a member of the SEC. a member of the SEC

FRESHMEN FAST STARTS

Penn State freshmen have started off their first season in the Blue and White on the right foot as a number of them got off to hot starts. This past weekend catcher Alyssa VanDerveer added to her home run of the season and first-year pitcher Jessica Cummings now leads the team in innings pitched with 25.1. Fellow freshman Mollie Sorenson ranks third on the team with four RBI, while Gianna Arrizurieta is tied for the team lead in doubles with a pair.

TRAVEL TESTED
Penn State will play its first 24 games on the road before the weather warms up and it's able to play the season's first games at Nittany Lion Softball Park at beard Field. Last season the Lions were 6-15 through their first 21 games on the road, featuring stops in Arizona, Mississippi, Florida and Virginia before returning to Happy Valley.

NEW NAMES AND NUMBERS

2015 brings with it a new season but also some new names and numbers to the Penn State program. This season a half-dozen freshman litter the Lion lineup and roster as Jessica Cummings (#1), Mia Monopoli (#13), Rebecca Ziegler (#15), Gianna Arrizurieta (#21), Mollie Sorenson (#22) and Alyssa VanderVeer will all call Happy Valley home for the first time. Junior transfer Erin Pond (#2) also makes her debut in the Blue and White.

SOPHOMORE SEASON

Although it's been a while since head coach Amanda Lehotak was a sophomore playing at Ole' Miss, she enters her sophomore season on the bench as the leader of the PSU program. In her first season the Lions went 14-35 with a 5-18 B1G mark. Here's a look at how second year coaches have fared at Penn State over the years.

Penn State's 2015 schedule is a challenging one, with 56 games on the slate against opponents in conferences such as the SEC, ACC and the Big 12. The Lions will take on a total of four teams (Michigan, Georgia, Texas A&M and Missouri in the Pre-Season Top 25 as well as another four (Wisconsin, Mississippi State, James Madison, Northwestern) who are receiving Madison, Northwestern) who are receiving votes in both the USA Today/NFCA and the ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls.

NATIONAL PROGRAM

This season the Lions boast a total of 18 players from states other than the Commonwealth. Two from Hawaii, one from Washington and five from California from Washington and five from California dot the western edge of the States, while four from N.Y. and N.J. join other ones from Maryland, Ohio, Virginia and Florida to make-up the eastern part of the country. Three Pennsylvanians (Marlaina Laubach, Christy Von Pusch and Mary Ward) bring some in-state pride to the program while, one from Arizona and another from Texas add unique flair to an already diverse group. group.

A HALF CENTURY OF TRADITION
Penn State softball is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2015, making it the oldest program among the schools in the power five conferences (ACC, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC). The Lions started up in 1965 under head coach Pat McTarsney and went 2-2 in their first season with wins against Elizabethtown and Wilson colleges. PSU defeated both in-state schools by a defeated both in-state schools by a combined 46-4 score. The second oldest program among the power five is Arizona State, which began play just two years later in 1967.

Head Coach • Second Season NEBRASKA-OMAHA '03

RECORD AT PENN STATE: 20-42 (.323) **CAREER RECORD:** 208-248 (.456)

Amanda Lehotak is in her second season as the Penn State softball head coach in 2015.

In her inaugural season at the helm of the program in 2014, Lehotak led the Nittany Lions to a 14-35 overall record with a 5-18 Big Ten record, finishing a spot higher in the conference standings than the year prior. Four players batted over .300 with Lexi Knief earning All-Big Ten second team accolades. Lehotak's team also achieved success in the classroom; nine players were named to the Academic All-Big Ten team and Alicia Walker garnered Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award honors.

Named the seventh coach in program history on July 22, 2013, Lehotak came to Penn State with seven years of head coaching experience under her belt, including the previous two seasons at Texas-San Antonio.

Lehotak guided the Roadrunners to a 27-26 overall record in 2013 to give the program just their second winning overall record in the last seven years. She also led the team to a fifth-place finish and a berth in the WAC Tournament in UTSA's first season in the conference. Additionally, Darian Blake was named to the All-WAC first team.

In her first season at UTSA, Lehotak and the Roadrunners posted a 24-28 overall record and 12-8 mark in Southland Conference play en route to a third-place finish, which was the program's highest finish since 2009. She had five players earn All-Southland honors in 2012, including Freshman of the Year Megan Low.

Prior to her time at UTSA, Lehotak spent six seasons at Jacksonville University, including five as the head coach. The Dolphins improved their win total each of Lehotak's five seasons at the helm, culminating in a 44-16 overall record and 18-2 conference mark in 2011.

That season, Jacksonville won the Atlantic Sun regular-season and tournament titles on its way to the first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history. Lehotak was selected as the 2011 Atlantic Sun Coach of the Year as her squad set school records for home runs, earned run average, shutouts and fielding percentage. Lehotak left Jacksonville with a school-record 137 wins.

In 2010, Lehotak led the Dolphins to a then-second-best win total in program history with a 33-23 overall record. Additionally, a then-program-record five student-athletes earned All-Atlantic Sun recognition under her guidance in 2010.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Lehotak played collegiately at the University of Mississippi for two seasons (2000-01) before finishing her career at Nebraska-Omaha (2002-03). She set the single-season hits record in 2001 at Ole Miss and was a third team All-American at UNO with a pair of first team All-North Central Conference selections. Lehotak earned her bachelor's degree in family science from Nebraska-Omaha in 2003.

Megan Gibson is in her second season as an assistant coach for the Nittany Lions in 2015. She serves primarily as the pitching coach.

Under her leadership in 2014, Lion hurlers amassed 14 wins to go along with 177 strikeouts, 22 complete games and a pair of shutouts. The Penn State pitching staff also accumulated four saves on the season which was tied for fourth most in the Big Ten.

BEFORE PENN STATE

An All-American at Texas A&M, Gibson joined the Penn State coaching staff after spending two seasons as an assistant under head coach Amanda Lehotak at University of Texas-San Antonio (UTSA). Under Gibson's guidance in 2013, UTSA garnered a formidable 2.76 earned run average while holding opponents to a .254 batting average.

Prior to UTSA, Gibson spent four seasons in the National Professional Fastpitch League (NPF). After leading Texas A&M to a runner-up finish at the 2008 Women's College World Series (WCWS), she was selected by the Philadelphia Force with the No. 2 overall pick of the 2008 NPF Senior Draft. In addition to her time in the league, Gibson spent a season in the Japanese Softball Association.

Along with her career in the NPF, Gibson served under Texas A&M head coach Jo Evans as a graduate assistant in fall 2008 and again as a volunteer pitching coach during the 2011 season. She also spent time as a softball instructor at High Performance Baseball in Tomball and as a volunteer assistant coach at Spring High School in 2010.

Gibson's collegiate career was one of the most decorated in Texas A&M history. Her stellar play in both the pitcher's circle and batter's box earned her National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America honors as a freshman, junior and senior, and she finished as a runner-up the for association's Player of the Year award in 2008. Gibson is the only player in Big 12 Conference history to be named both Player and Pitcher of the Year as a senior and she went on to lead the Aggies to the conference tournament title as the event's Most Valuable Player. She also led Texas A&M to a league crown in 2005 and a WCWS appearance in 2007. In all, Gibson owns six career school records, including doubles (48), home runs (56), RBIs (183), total bases (447), slugging percentage (.717) and walks (172). She also ranks in the program's top 10 in seven other categories. In October of 2014, Gibson was inducted into Texas A&M's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Gibson, a native of Spring, Texas, graduated from Texas A&M in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and a minor in business.



Joe Guthrie is in his second season as an assistant coach for Penn State's softball program in 2015. His primary responsibilities are hitting and the outfield, in addition to serving as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Under his direction in 2014, the Lions belted a total of 13 home runs and amassed 304 total hits. A busy off-season for Guthrie culminated in the fall of 2014 with Penn State claiming the 17th best recruiting class in the nation as ranked by Full Count Softball.

BEFORE PENN STATE

Guthrie joined the Penn State coaching staff after a six-year stint as head softball coach and assistant athletic director at the Marion Military Institute in Alabama. He led Marion to the National Junior Collegiate Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region 22 Tournament three of his last four seasons, in addition to coaching 21 all-conference players.

Guthrie played baseball at Kentucky before transferring to Bevill State. He graduated with an American studies degree from Alabama in 2001. After earning his Master's degree at Jacksonville State University as a Distinguished Military Graduate, he was a member of the U.S. Army from 2002-05. Guthrie earned numerous accolades in the military, and served a one-year combat tour in Iraq.



Four-year Nittany Lion (2011-14) and 2012 second team All-Big Ten honoree Kasie Hatfield joins the Penn State softball team as a volunteer assistant coach in 2015.

The Tampa, Fla., native brings 190 games of experience in the Blue and White to the coaching staff as well as a .245 career batting average with the Lions. Hatfield capped off her career with .309 batting average and a .493 slugging percentage her senior year to go along with 42 hits, 27 RBI and a pair of home runs for 67 total bases.

Hatfield graduated from Penn State with a degree in animal sciences.




