FIRST SERVE



» Should the Nittany Lions defeat the Rainbow Warriors, Penn State will move on to meet topranked Lewis in the NCAA national semifinals Thursday, May 7. The first play-in match features No. 3 seed Loyola Chicago and No. 6 seed Pfeiffer with the winner advancing to the national semifinals to take on No. 2 UC Irvine.

» In addition to an outing earlier this season, Hawaii holds an 14-8 advantage in the all-time series, including a 2-1 lead in NCAA tournament matches against PSU. While the two teams have never met in play-in match, Penn State and Hawaii squared off in the NCAA tournament in 1995, 1996 and most recently in 2002. All of UH's wins from the 2002 season were later vacated.

» Penn State swept past both Princeton and George Mason last week to capture its 27th overall and 17th consecutive EIVA Championship to earn the conference's automatic bid to NCAA post season play. Three-time EIVA Player of the Year Aaron Russell earned EIVA All-Tournament MVP honors, while redshirt senior Connor Curry and sophomore Chris Nugent joined him on the All-Tournament team.

» PSU swept past Saint Francis in three sets to wrap up a perfect mark in EIVA regular season action at 12-0. Penn State's unblemished record marks the third time in the last five years that PSU has gone unbeaten in conference play during the regular season.

» Head coach Mark Pavlik earned his 500th career victory in the 2015 regular season finale on the road at Saint Francis. He's collected all 500+ wins while at the helm of the PSU program.

» Penn State earned a total of five EIVA postseason honors. Senior Aaron Russell highlighted the group with Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year honors, while Mark Pavlik earned Bob Sweeney EIVA Coach of the Year Honors. Russell and redshirt senior Connor Curry earned first team honors, while redshirt senior Nick Goodell and redshirt junior Taylor Hammond were second team honorees.

» Russell joined José Quiñones (2000-02) as the only Penn State men's volleyball student-athletes to repeat as EIVA Player of the Year in three consecutive seasons. He's also the 16th conference player of the year selection in Nittany Lion program history.

» The Nittany Lions clinched their 31st EIVA/ECVL regular season title in program history two weeks ago with a pair of wins against Harvard and Sacred Heart.

» Penn State has remained solid at No. 7 in the AVCA Top 15 Coaches Poll. PSU has been in the top 15 the last seven consecutive weeks since spending a month receiving votes. The Nittany Lions saw a total of 11 ranked teams during the regular season.

» PSU is still slotted sixth in the latest release of the RPI rankings. The Nittany Lions are one of two EIVA teams represented in the RPI top 20, with Harvard (19), George Mason (21), Princeton (27), Sacred Heart (30), Saint Francis (31), and NJIT (34) all coming in behind PSU.

» Penn State is ranked among the top 10 nationally in kills per set, averaging 13.01, which is slated seventh in the country and leads the EIVA. Senior Aaron Russell's contributing a teamhigh 4.70 kills per set, which ranks second in the nation and first in the league. He's reached double figure kills in all but two matches this season.

» PSU is ranked in the top 15 nationally in digs per set, averaging 9.45, which is slotted 12th in the nation and second in the EIVA. Redshirt senior Connor Curry's leading the way with a teamhigh 2.49 digs per frame, which ranks seventh in the nation and first in the league. Curry's 1,027 digs also ranks second all-time on the PSU career record list.

» With 196 career aces, senior Aaron Russell leads all active NCAA players with the most aces. On the Penn State record list, he's ranked second all-time. On the year, Russell is averaging 0.57 aces per set, which ranks second nationally and second in the EIVA standings. As a team, Penn State's 1.50 aces per set ranks sixth nationally and second in the conference.

NITTANY LIONS CAPTURE 17TH CONSECUTIVE EIVA CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE

Top-seeded Penn State swept past third-seeded George Mason in three sets (25-16, 25-17, 25-17) to capture its 27th overall and 17th consecutive EIVA Championship title. A trio of Nittany Lions led the offense with double figure kills. Senior EIVA Player of the Year Aaron Russell led the group with 15 kills on .619 hitting, adding six digs and two aces to earn EIVA Championship Most Outstanding Player honors. Sophomore Chris Nugent and senior Connor Curry also earned EIVA All-Tournament team honors.

PENN STATE TOTALS FIVE ALL-EIVA POSTSEASON HONORS

Four Nittany Lions earned EIVA postseason honors. Senior Aaron Russell highlights the group with his third consecutive Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year honor, making him just the second Nittany Lion in program history to earn the award three times. Additionally, head coach Mark Pavlik earned Bob Sweeney EIVA Coach of the Year honors. Redshirt senior Connor Curry and Russell each earned First Team All-EIVA honors, while redshirt senior Nick Goodell and redshirt junior Taylor Hammond earned second team accolades.

Russell joins José Quiñones (2000-02) as the only Penn State men's volleyball student-athletes to repeat as EIVA Player of the Year in three consecutive seasons. Russell's award is also the 16th time a Nittany Lion has been honored as the league's Player of the Year. The four All-EIVA honors brings Penn State's all-time number of conference selections to 198 since 1972. Pavlik's Coach of the Year laurel marks the fifth time he's been selected for the award, as was previously honored in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2013.

PAVLIK ACHIEVES CAREER MILESTONE

In his 21st year at the helm of the program, head coach Mark Pavlik reached the 500 career wins milestone with a 3-0 victory on the road at Saint Francis in the 2015 regular season finale. Pavlik has earned all 500 of his career victories while at Penn State.

RUSSELL EARNS SECOND STRAIGHT EIVA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK NOD

After guiding Penn State men's volleyball to its sixth consecutive win against Ohio State, senior Aaron Russell was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week. The honor is the second consecutive for Russell, who has collected the award a total of three times this season. He led the team with his second 30-kill performance of the season against the Buckeyes, totaling a match-high 30 kills on .458 hitting. He added 14 digs for his second double-double of the season to go along with three blocks and two aces.

PENN STATE SWEEPS EIVA WEEKLY AWARDS

Following a 3-0 week on the road that featured a pair of wins against two top 10 teams, Penn State swept the EIVA Weekly Awards. Senior Aaron Russell was selected as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week, while redshirt sophomore Matt Callaway was named the Defensive Player of the Week.

Russell guided PSU to a 3-0 victory at No. 7 USC with 20 kills, hitting .720 with two errors on 25 swings. Against Cal State Northridge, he recorded his first double-double of the season with 16 kills and 10 digs. He capped off the week with 19 kills in a straight set win against No. 8 LBSU with a team-high 19 kills to go along with Asics Invitational MVP honors. Call-away led the team with 1.44 blocks per set during the week, totaling 13 blocks in the trio of wins. He highlighted the weekend with a career-high seven blocks in the win against the eighth-ranked 49ers. Offensively, he put down 13 kills on .458 hitting on the week. Callaway was also selected to the Asics Invitational All-Tournament team.

RUSSELL NAMED AVCA/SPORTS IMPORTS DI-II NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior Aaron Russell earned AVCA Sports Imports DI-II National Player of the Week honors after leading PSU to an undefeated spring break trip with wins at No. 7 USC, CSUN and No. 8 LBSU. The honor is the first of Russell's career and the 15th time a Nittany Lion has been selected for the weekly award. Russell is the first Nittany Lion to earn the award since Joe Sunder was tabbed Player of the Week in 2011.

THREE EARN ASICS INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM HONORS

Three Nittany Lions earned Asics Invitational All-Tournament team honors after Penn State knocked off No. 8 Long Beach State to capture the event title. Redshirt junior Taylor Hammond and redshirt sophomore Matt Callaway earned Asics Invitational All-Tournament team honors, while senior Aaron Russell was named the Most Valuable Player.

Callaway led the team with 10 total blocks across both matches, matching a career-high mark with seven against the 49ers. Hammond set the team to a .244 hitting percentage, averaging 12.33 assists per set. Russell amassed 35 kills against both teams, highlighting the weekend with 19 kills on .414 hitting at LBSU.

RUSSELL EARNS EIVA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After helping the team to a pair of wins against Mount Olive and Saint Francis, senior Aaron Russell earned EIVA Offensive Player of the Week honors. The award is the first of the season for Russell. Russell led the team with 4.17 kills per set during the 2-0 week, averaging a squad-best .513 hitting percentage. Defensively, he finished second on the team in blocks per set (0.83), while also tying for second on the team in digs per set (1.83). Against Mount Olive, he tallied eight kills, eight digs and two aces in the 3-0 victory, before highlighting the weekend with a match-high 17 kills on .625 hitting against Saint Francis.

AVCA DI-II COACHES' POLL UPDATE: APRIL 20 (NEXT RELEASE MAY 4)

Penn State has remained solid at No. 7 in the AVCA Top 15 Coaches Poll. PSU has been in the top 15 the last seven consecutive weeks since spending a month receiving votes. The Nittany Lions saw a total of 11 ranked teams during the regular season.

A CLOSER LOOK AT HAWAII

Penn State trails Hawaii 8-14 in the all-time series, having met the non-conference Rainbow Warriors fairly frequently during the regular season. While the two teams have never met in a post season play-in match, both Hawaii and PSU squared off in the 1995, 1996 and 2002 NCAA tournament. At 1-2 in tournament outings, the Nittany Lions claimed a 3-2 win in the 1995 matchup, but fell to the `Bows in three sets in 1996. PSU also lost to Hawaii in four sets in 2002, but the UH wins for the 2002 season were later vacated.

The Nittany Lions and the Rainbow Warriors met earlier this season in the 21st annual Outrigger Resorts Invitational, where Hawaii captured a 3-0 (26-24, 25-19, 25-18) win against Penn State. In the last five years, PSU and Hawaii have met in the Outrigger Invitational four times, with both team claiming wins in two outings apiece.

Hawaii's 2015 season came to a close with a 3-1 loss to Pepperdine in the MPSF Championship semifinals. The Rainbow Warriors finished the season with a 24-6 overall record and an 18-4 mark in MPSF play before earning one of two NCAA at-large bids to make this year's six-team tournament.

RALLYING FOR A CAUSE

Penn State head coach Mark Pavlik helped raise awareness for the EIVA's "EIVA Rallies!" campaign by wearing a fedora in the Nittany Lions' EIVA opener against travel partner, Saint Francis. Each year, Penn State men's volleyball participates in the annual campaign, which benefits the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. During the EIVA Rallies! silent auction, PSU raised nearly \$700 to donate to the cause on behalf of the Nittany Lions. The Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center is one of the largest and oldest private cancer centers. Throughout its history, the center has dedicated more than 100 years to patient care and innovative research.

CAREER DAY ON THE COURT FOR RUSSELL

At Ball State (1/16), senior Aaron Russell led all hitters with a career-high 32 kills on .439 hitting on the road against the Cardinals. Despite the close 3-2 loss, Russell added a team-high three aces to go along with five digs and three blocks. His performance marks the first career 30-plus kill outing for Russell, while also making him the first Nittany Lion since 2011 (Joe Sunder vs. Hawaii) to put down 30 kills in a single match.

1,000 CAREER KILLS CLUB

Both Aaron Russell and Nick Goodell are ranked among the top six in the NCAA DI active career leaders in kills. Russell leads the duo with 1,499 career kills which ranks first in DI and is tops among all three divisions. Goodell is ranked sixth in DI with 1,119 career kills. Russell and Goodell are also two of only 12 active NCAA DI players to reach the 1,000 career kills plateau in their career.

A FORCE FROM THE SERVICE LINE

With 196 career aces, senior Aaron Russell leads all active NCAA players with the most aces. On the Penn State record list, he's ranked second all-time and needs nine more aces to match Max Holt (2006-09). On the year, Russell is averaging 0.57 aces per set, which ranks second nationally and second in the EIVA standings.

EXPERIENCED VETERANS ON THE COURT

Senior Aaron Russell and redshirt senior Connor Curry are leading all active DI players with the most career appearances on the court. Curry's 121 matches ranks first, while Russell's 119 matches ranks second. Additionally, Curry's 1,027 career digs rank second on the Penn State all-time list.

GOODELL EARNS EIVA DEFENSIVE HONOR

Redshirt senior Nick Goodell highlighted the first EIVA Weekly Awards release of the season with EIVA Defensive Player of the week honors for his performances in the first two weeks of the 2015 slate. Goodell recorded at least seven digs in three of the first four matches of the season, while also posting double figure kills in each match. In the Outrigger Invitational, he kicked off the season with 10 kills and seven digs against No. 8 UC Irvine, before returning the next night to lead the team with 14 kills against No. 10 Hawaii.

RUSSELL ON OUTRIGGER INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Senior Aaron Russell earned a spot on the Outrigger Invitational All-Tournament team. Russell recorded back-to-back double-digit kill performances, highlighting the week with a match-high 19 kills in a close 3-2 loss to eighth-ranked UC Irvine. Against No. 10 Hawaii, he tallied 10 kills, while also leading the team with eight digs and three aces.

PENN STATE VOTED EIVA PRESEASON FAVORITE

The 16-time defending EIVA champion Penn State was selected as the 2015 EIVA preseason favorite. The Nittany Lions were voted to capture this year's championship crown by the league's seven head coaches. PSU received six of a possible seven first place votes, while Princeton picked up one. The Tigers are slotted to finish second, while George Mason, Harvard and St. Francis (Pa.) round out the top five in spots three through five.

THREE SIGN FOR 2016

Head coach Mark Pavlik has announced the addition of three future Nittany Lions who have all signed a National Letter of Intent during the early signing period. Joining the team at the start of the 2016 season, the Nittany Lion recruiting class features setter, Luke Braswell (Manchester, Pa.), outside hitter/opposite, Jason Donorovich (Lockport, N.Y.) and opposite, Calvin Mende (Redlands, Calif.).

NITTANY LIONS PICKED THIRD IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State was the only EIVA school to earn a spot on the 2015 AVCA DI-II Men's Volleyball Preseason Poll, coming in a No. 3. Pepperdine earned this year's No. 1 overall spot, while defending national champion Loyola-Chicago claimed the No. 2 position, picking up eight first place votes. UCSB and UCLA rounded out the top five at No. 4 and No. 5, respectively.

STEPPING UP!

Earlier this season, sophomore Chris Nugent highlighted the weekend with a pair of career high performances. In his first career start against Mount Olive, Nugent led the offense with a match-high 16 kills on .500 hitting, adding three aces, five digs and two blocks to earn Mike Anderson Penn State Player of the Match honors. The next night, he set another career-high mark with a match-high seven aces against Saint Francis.

Against Erskine, he tied for first on the team with 12 kills, while also adding two aces and a career-high five blocks. Since earning his first start, he's ranked third on the team with 2.31 kills per set and second in aces per set (0.31) with 26 on the year, which ranks eighth in the EIVA.

Redshirt freshman Jalen Penrose had a career weekend at the Asics Invitational and has continued his stellar play since his debut. He highlighted the event with nine kills, eight digs, four aces and three blocks at No. 8 Long Beach State. He finished second on the team with six kills and six digs the night before against CSUN, adding six digs and three blocks. Penrose logged 19 kills on .230 hitting against No. 11 Ohio State, before registering a career-high 21 kills against NJIT. He's currently ranked fourth on the team with 2.23 kills per set.

RUSSELL JOINS TEAM U.S.A. FOR WORLD QUALIFIER

First Team AVCA All-American Aaron Russell was selected to the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2014 NORCECA Men's World Championship Qualification Tournament this summer. He was one of just four outsides to be selected to the 12-man roster, which also features several Olympians from the 2008 and 2012 Olympic Teams.

RUSSELL, GOODELL EARN OFF THE BLOCK PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS

First team AVCA All-American senior Aaron Russell and redshirt senior Nick Goodell, both picked up 2015 Off the Block/Springbak Preseason All-America honors. Russell was selected as a First Team All-American, while Goodell earned Second Team honors. The duo are just two of 22 student-athletes to earn the honor, which is selected by a nationwide voting committee comprised of coaches from around the country. The Off the Block Preseason All-American teams recognizes the NCAA Division I-II men's volleyball players predicted to perform best during the upcoming season.

WHO'S BACK?

Penn State returns almost all of its starters from a year ago, with graduating senior and 2014 All-EIVA second team honoree, Peter Russell as the only departure. Senior Aaron Russell highlights the group of talented returners as he closed out the 2014 season atop the team standings in almost every category, while also ranking first nationally in aces per set (0.65). The 2014 First Team AVCA All-American also earned his second consecutive Uvaldo Acosta Memorial EIVA Player of the Year award this past season, making him the first Nittany Lion since Joe Sunder (2011-12) to earn back-to-back conference player of the year honors.

NEW FACES IN 2015



The first play-in match features No. 3 seed Loyola and No. 6 seed Pfeiffer with the winner advancing to the NCAA national semifinals to play No. 2 seed UC Irvine (28-4). The winners of both semifinal matches will advance to the NCAA national semifinals Saturday, May 9 at 9:30 p.m. ET in Maples Pavilion. The matchup will broadcast live on ESPNU.






