Eagle Nation Storylines, Streaks and Sidebars

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (EMUEagles.com) -- The Eastern Michigan University football team leaves the state of Michigan for the first time in 2013 Saturday, Sept. 7, to play its second non-conference contest of the season against Penn State University. Game time is scheduled for noon at Beaver Stadium in University Park, Pa.

The contest will be shown on the Big Ten Network with Scott Graham providing the play-by-play and Chuck Long serving as the analyst. WEMU (89.1 FM) will provide audio coverage of the game with Matt Shepard and Rob Rubick calling the action on the field.

» EMU VS. PENN STATE: EMU and Penn State will take the field against each other for the third time in history, and the Nittany Lions have had the upper-hand in the previous two contests. The series opener, Sept. 19, 1992, featured a 52-7 Penn State victory in 'Happy Valley.' In that contest, EMU was guilty of three interceptions to go along with four fumbles in the setback to 10th-ranked PSU. Nearly two decades later, the Nittany Lions would once again claim a win on its home turf against Eastern, taking down the Eagles, 34-6, Sept. 24, 2011.

» GOING FOR TWO IN-A-ROW: When Eastern hits the field for Saturday's contest against Penn State, it will be looking for its second straight non-conference victory over a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent. Last year, the Eagles defeated Army, 48-38, snapping a winless streak against non-conference FBS teams that dated back to 2005.

A victory at Penn State would give EMU back-to-back victories against non-conference FBS foes for the first time since 1987 when Coach Jim Harkema led the then-Hurons to a 10-2 record that included a Mid-American Conference Championship as well as a win in the California Bowl over San Jose State. Along with San Jose State, Eastern also defeated Northern Illinois earlier in the year. During that time, NIU was not a member of the MAC.

» BENZ IN THE END ZONE: Making his 10th career start for the Green and White, quarterback Tyler Benz completed 19-of-26 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns in the 34-24 victory over Howard, Aug. 31. With the touchdown tosses against the Bison, Benz has now found a receiver in the end zone in nine of his 10 starts. The only game the redshirt junior quarterback did not throw a touchdown pass was the Oct. 27, 2012, matchup at Bowling Green.

» RETURN TO THE KEYSTONE STATE: The EMU roster features six players from the state of Pennsylvania. Brandon Bossard is from Eagleville, Pa., Ryan Brumfield is from Chester Springs, Pa., Dustin Creel is from Industry, Pa., Kevin Johnson is from McKeesport, Pa., David Pulliam is from Philadelphia, Pa. and Mike Steals is from North Braddock, Pa.

Requests must be received at least two days prior to the game. Passes that are not mailed will be available at the Will Call window at the Convocation Center. Parking is free and on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Practice Procedures

Most practices are open to the media. However, all media are recommended to make an advance call to the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office to check on the status of practice for a particular day. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue.

Head Coach **Ron English** is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings. Coach English will be available on the Mid-American Conference weekly conference call on Monday mornings. Individual players are available for interviews Monday-Wednesday. Please contact the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office at least 24-hours in advance to set up interviews. Players should not be contacted for interviews at their residences, on their cell phones, via e-mail, Facebook, Twitter and all other social networking entities.

During regular season practices, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot only during pre-practice individual drills, which usually last approximately 10 minutes at the beginning of practice.

Media members covering practices or scrimmages will not be permitted to report any scouting information (formations, personnel groupings, etc.) without first speaking with a member of the EMU coaching staff or the media relations office. Failure to adhere to this guideline could result in the closing of all practices and scrimmages to the media.

First-year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media <u>only</u> after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion.

Interview Policies (Postgame)

Post-game interviews for EMU will be conducted in Media Room A in the Convocation Center at the south end of Rynearson Stadium. The visiting coach will do interviews outside their lockerroom. Both head coaches will be available to the media after a 10-minute cooling off period. Individual players <u>may be</u> available for interviews at the conclusion of the game. <u>The lockerroom is closed to the media at all times</u>.

In conjunction with NCAA and College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) policies, there is to be absolutely no cheering and/or criticizing players, coaches or other game officials at any point before, during or after the contest. Failure to abide by this will result in your removal from the press box.

HILL OVER THE CENTURY: Junior running back Bronson Hill led the EMU rushing attack in the win over Howard, pounding out 101 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries. The Grand Rapids, Mich. native exceeded the century mark on the ground for the fourth time in eight career starts in the EMU backfield.

<u>CAREER-HIGH FOR KURTZ:</u> Senior linebacker **Sean Kurtz** did not miss a beat coming into the 2013 campaign. The Anaheim, Calif. native ended last season with a career-high nine tackles against Northern Illinois, Nov. 23, 2012. In the 2013 season opener against Howard, Kurtz carried the EMU defense, recording a personal-best 13 tackles while also grabbing the first interception of his career. The interception came at a crucial moment in the game. With the Eagles trailing, 24-20, Kurtz picked off a Bison pass, returning it 25 yards into the red zone, setting up the EMU offense for the go-ahead touchdown.

NEW FACES STARTING: Head Coach **Ron English** sent seven Eagles out to make their first career starts in the season-opening win versus Howard. Three new faces headed out on offense, while the defense saw four of its first-string group making their debut starts. Redshirt freshmen **Cole Gardner** and **Andrew Wylie** along with junior college transfer **Kent Collins** hit the field first on offense. Coach English's defense brought out junior college transfer **Willie Creear**, redshirt sophomore **Great Ibe**, as well as sophomores **Pat O'Connor** and **Ike Spearman**, to begin the game.

FRESHMAN FIND THE FIELD: Eight "true" freshmen and six redshirt freshmen found the field to open the 2013 campaign. The true freshmen that saw time on the turf at Rynearson Stadium for the first time in the season lid-lifter were: **Nathan Adams, Duwhan Alford, Austin Barnes, Jaleel Canty, Chris O'Risky, Quan Pace, David Pulliam and Mario Swann.** Redshirt freshmen making their collegiate debut included: **Amos Houston, Jake Hurcombe, Juwan Lewis, Darien Terrell, Matt Thornton** and **Anthony Zappone**.

FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACK: Down 11 points to Howard with 4:20 to play in the third quarter, Eastern Michigan roared back with 21 unanswered to claim a 34-24 non-conference victory, Aug. 31. The EMU win was the first fourth quarter come-from-behind victory for the Green and White since the 2011 campaign. In that contest, EMU rallied from a three-point deficit to knock off Western Michigan at Rynearson Stadium, Oct. 22, 2011. **Javonti Greene** notched a 50-yard touchdown scamper with 7:46 remaining for the go-ahead score.

Additionally, the EMU win over Howard marked the first time since Nov. 16, 2007, that EMU won a game after trailing entering the fourth quarter. Eastern Michigan overcame a 10-point hole to start the fourth quarter at Central Michigan to escape with a 48-45 triumph.

NEW RULE HITS THE EAGLES: In order to increase safety measures in college football, the NCAA initiated a new rule for the 2013 season. Starting this season, when a player targets a defenseless player above the shoulders, that player will be immediately ejected from the game in addition to the 15-yard penalty that will be assessed. According to the NCAA, "The new rule in football means that discipline for those players flagged for violations will mirror the penalty for fighting. If the foul occurs in the first half of a game, the player is ejected for the remainder of the game. If the foul occurs in the second half or overtime of a game, the player is ejected for the remainder of the game and the first half of the next contest."

The new rule was enforced in the Eagles' 34-24 victory over Howard, Aug. 31. In the second half, EMU safety **Donald Coleman** was flagged for roughing the passer. Because contact occurred above the head, officials ruled that Coleman targeted a defenseless player and would not be allowed to return to the game. Moreover, Coleman will be suspended for the first half of the team's next game, Sept. 7, against Penn State.

RON ENGLISH

FIFTH YEAR AT EMU • CALIFORNIA, 1990

Ron English has prepared for a lifetime to call a football program his own and he has not wasted any time in putting his stamp on Eastern Michigan University football.

After serving as an assistant football coach at four of the nation's top football

schools, English was named the head football coach at Eastern Michigan University, Dec. 22, 2008.

"When we began this search for a new head football coach at Eastern Michigan University we wanted someone that we felt could take our program in a new direction," former EMU Director of Athletics Dr. Derrick Gragg said at the press conference announcing English as Eastern's new head football coach. "After going through an exhaustive search process we selected Ron English to lead our football program. He has proven himself as a tremendous defensive coordinator over a long career and we feel that he is prepared to take over our football team as a head coach."

That patience in learning the game at several stops has paid big dividends for the highly energetic English as he begins the task of rebuilding the EMU football program in all phases of the operation.

Just minutes after finishing the press conference, the 44year-old English was on a mission to hire a staff. He hit the road to begin the task of signing his first recruiting class as a head coach and developing the blueprint for success.

That dedication to detail in his early days reflects one of English's strongest traits and is reflected in his theme for his first EMU season: Embrace the Process.

After two years of laying the foundation, the 2011 campaign re-established the Eagles as a force to be reckoned with.

The team finished the 2011 season with a 6-6 overall mark and a 4-4 record in Mid-American Conference play, snapping a 15-year streak of losing seasons. EMU finished nationally in the top 50 statistically in seven categories to go along with eight top five rankings in the MAC standings. English was named MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Offensively, the Green and White rushed for 2,620 yards and 16 touchdowns on 575 carries for the 14th-best ground attack in the nation. The total was the second most in program history trailing only the 1987 team that captured the MAC title by running the ball 610 times for a total of 2,701 yards. It marked just the second time in school history that the Eagles rushed for more than 2,000 yards in back-to-back seasons.

Defensively, EMU ranked 34th nationally and third in the MAC in total defense. The Eagles gave up just 350.33 yards per game, an improvement of 103.8 yards per contest. Additionally, the team averaged nearly six tackles for loss per game, the squad's highest total since 2001 when they had 82.

English accepted the challenge of developing a winning atmosphere at EMU after spending the previous 15 years learning the college football trade at the University of Louisville, the University of Michigan, Arizona State University and San Diego State University.

English spent the 2008 season as an assistant football coach at Louisville and just prior to that was a member of the University of Michigan football staff from 2003-07 where he coached the defensive backs for his first three seasons and served as the football program's defensive coordinator in his final two seasons under legendary Head Coach Lloyd Carr.

In 2007 English oversaw an aggressive Michigan defense that was the nation's eighth-ranked pass defense and 17th in pass efficiency defense. The Wolverines were also 23rd in scoring defense and 24th in total defense.

English was named Rivals.com National Defensive Coordinator of the Year during his initial season as the defensive signal caller at Michigan in 2006. That Wolverine defense rated among the nation's best, finishing first against the run, fourth in sacks, seventh in third-down defense, 10th in total defense and 15th in scoring defense.

The U-of-M defensive secondary collected 36 interceptions during his three seasons overseeing the entire corps and turned four of those picks into touchdowns. In addition, the Wolverines yielded just 37 touchdown passes by the opposition during that time, including an NCAA-leading nine in 2003.

English became the first coach in NCAA history to have two defensive backs earn consensus All-America honors in the same season, since the organization began incorporating both an offensive and defensive team in 1965, as cornerback Marlin Jackson and safety Ernest Shazor earned the recognition following the 2004 season. During his tenure on the Michigan staff he coached an All-Big Ten defensive back in every season and had two All-Conference selections in four of his five seasons.

English made an immediate impact on the Wolverine secondary during his first season as an assistant coach when U-M tied for the national lead in fewest touchdown passes yielded with nine, and finished ninth in pass efficiency defense. The secondary collected 13 interceptions and returned two for scores.

English began his collegiate coaching career as the defensive backs coach at Mt. San Antonio College (1993) in Walnut, Calif. after coaching for one season at Ganesha High School (1992), his alma mater, in Pomona, Calif.

English also tutored the secondary for two seasons at San Diego State (1996-97) and served as the outside linebackers coach at Northern Arizona for the 1996 spring practice.

He then went on to spend five seasons (1998-2002) as an assistant football coach at Arizona State University. He coached the secondary all five years with the Sun Devils, the final two years with the cornerbacks and the previous three seasons mentoring the safeties. He helped ASU to three bowl appearances: the 1999 and 2000 Aloha and 2002 Holiday bowls. His first stint at ASU was as a graduate assistant coach handling the defensive line during the 1994-95 seasons.

English was a four-year letterman (1987-90) and senior starter at safety for the University of California Golden Bears football squad. He also started on special teams all four seasons at California. English finished his career with 134 tackles and seven sacks and participated in the 1990 Copper Bowl against Wyoming. His identical twin brother, Don, also played for the Golden Bears.

A 1990 graduate of the University of California-Berkeley with a bachelor's degree in social sciences, English earned his master's degree in education administration from Arizona State in 1995.

English will be one of eight African-American head coaches in the 120-school NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision ranks in 2013.

English and his wife, Sophia, have three children: Simon (14), Sydney (9) and Seth (8).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (EMUEagles.com) — The Eastern Michigan University football team closed out its 2011 non-conference schedule with a 34-6 setback to the Nittany Lions of Penn State University here Saturday, Sept. 24. in Beaver Stadium.

The loss evened EMU's record at 2-2 while the win boosted Penn State to 3-1 on the year.

EMU's six points came off the foot of **Kody Fulkerson (Zanesville, Ohio-Maysville)** who booted field goals of 21 and 22 yards.

The EMU offense was led by junior quarterback Alex Gillett (Green Springs, Ohio-Clyde) who completed 18-of-31 passes for 202 yards while gaining 22 yards on the ground.

Redshirt sophomore **Nick Olds (Columbus, Ind.-East)** hauled in four passes for 49 yards and **Garrett Hoskins (Grand Rapids, Mich.-Creston)** grabbed four aerials for 44 yards.

The Penn State quarterback duo of Rob Bolden and Matt McGloin accounted for 335 yards through the air with McGloin completing 14-of-17 for 220 yards with Bolden going 7-of-13 for 115 yards.

Penn State was first to put points on the board when place-kicker Anthony Fera booted a 29-yard field goal at the 4:18 mark of the first quarter. That field goal, the first of his career, finished off a seven-play, 45-yard drive after the Nittany Lions recovered an EMU fumble at the Penn State 43-yard line.

The Nittany Lions increased their lead to 10-0 when backup quarterback McGloin connected with wide receiver Joe Suhey on a 27-yard touch-down pass at the 8:19 mark of the second quarter. Fera added the PAT kick. That drive consisted of five plays for 63 yards.

The EMU defense came up with a big play in the late stages of the second quarter when junior linebacker Justin Cudworth (Monte Nido, Calif-Agoura-College of the Canyons) forced a fumble on a pass reception at the EMU goal line, with the ball rolling out of bounds in the end zone, giving the Eagles possession on the PSU 20-yard line with just 2:43 left in the first half.

Penn State would counter that turnover, however, intercepting a Gillett pass at the EMU 31-yard line just one minute later.

The home squad would make that pick pay off in a 5-yard touchdown pass from McGloin to Derek Moye with Fera adding the PAT kick with just 56 ticks left in the half for a 17-0 advantage.

The EMU defense held tough against the run in the first half, allowing just 34 yards on 10 carries, but the Nittany Lions turned in 189 yards passing in the first half compared to EMU's 80 yards through the air and 39 on the ground.

The home squad struck early in the second half with wide receiver Devon Smith grabbing a short pass from Bolden and racing 71 yards for a touchdown at the 13:59 mark. Fera added the PAT kick for a 24-0 PSU lead

Penn State boosted its lead to 31-0 at the 2:27 mark of the third quarter when McGloin found Moye for a 20-yard touchdown strike. Andy Barrett added the PAT kick.

Senior defensive lineman Brad Ohrman (Adrian, Mich.-Adrian) gave the Eagles a boost at the start of the fourth quarter when he turned in an interception against Bolden on a bull rush in the backfield at the PSU 21yard line.

The Eagles moved to the Penn State five before settling for a 21-yard field goal by Fulkerson for the first points of the game for the Green and White

Penn State upped its lead to 34-3 on a 43-yard field goal by Sam Ficken with 8:32 left in the game.

Fulkerson closed out the scoring on a 22-yard field goal with 3:09 re-

LAST TIME WE MET: The Eagles and Nittany Lions met on the gridiron two years ago, Sept. 24 2011, with the Green and White suffering a 34-6 setback to Penn State in Beaver Stadium. EMU's six points came off the foot of **Kody Fulkerson** who booted field goals of 21 and 22 yards.

The EMU offense was led by quarterback **Alex Gillett** who completed 18-of-31 passes for 202 yards while gaining 22 yards on the ground. **Nick Olds** hauled in four passes for 49 yards and **Garrett Hoskins** grabbed four aerials for 44 yards. The Penn State quarterback duo of Rob Bolden and Matt McGloin accounted for 335 yards through the air with McGloin completing 14-of-17 for 220 yards and Bolden going 7-of-13 for 115 yards.

FACING THE BIG TEN: At least one opponent from the Big Ten Conference has appeared on Eastern's schedule every year since 2005. In that span of eight years, the Green and White faced 13 Big Ten foes. The Eagles are still looking for their first victory over a team from the Big Ten Conference. EMU is 0-31 versus current members of the Big Ten (Indiana 0-1, Michigan 0-10, Michigan State 0-9, Northwestern 0-3, Ohio State 0-1, Penn State 0-2, Purdue 0-2, Wisconsin 0-3).

RUTGERS ON THE HORIZON: The Eagles will continue the non-conference portion of the schedule Saturday, Sept. 14, at Rutgers University. The meeting will be the first between the two schools. EMU is 2-11 all-time against members of the American Athletic Conference (Cincinnati 0-1; Connecticut 1-1; Houston 0-0; Memphis 0-0; Louisvile 0-1; Rutgers 0-0; South Florida 0-0; SMU 0-0; Temple 0-5 and UCF 1-3).

CANADIAN CONNECTION: Eastern Michigan is one of just 17Football Bowl Subdivision schools to feature a player from Canada on its roster. Senior **Kalonji Kashama** will be heavy contributor, while **Oliver Kathalay** will seek more playing time.

The other FBS schools to have multiple Canadians on its roster include: Michigan State (4), Iowa (3), UNLV (3), Virginia (3), Boston College (2), Buffalo (2), Connecticut (2) and Rice (2).

COACHING CHANGES FOR 2013: Eastern Michigan University Head Football Coach **Ron English** announced his coaching staff for the 2013 campaign. The Eagles will have four new assistant coaches on staff while shuffling around the responsibilities of others.

On the offensive side of the ball, **Stan Parrish** takes over as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2013. **Doug Downing** remains as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator for his fourth season on staff, while **Mike Hart** enters his second season as the running backs coach. For the fifth-straight season, **Tom Burpee** will coach the tight ends, but will hand off special teams responsibilities to **Ryan Oshnock**. Rounding out the offense, **Brad Wilson** enters his first year as the offensive line coach.

Defensively, **Ken Delgado** enters his fourth season at EMU mentoring the defensive line while **KiJuan Ware** will work with the secondary. **Mark Criner** rounds out the staff and will coach the linebackers.

<u>POWER OF SEVEN:</u> A total of 16 of EMU's 49 games under Head Coach **Ron English** have been decided by seven points-or-less. The Eagles are 6-10 in those contests.

<u>UNDERCLASSMEN SUCCESS:</u> Eastern Michigan's 2011 recruiting class paid major dividends in 2012, as the Eagles' sophomore class accounted for 36 percent of the team's points last season. Bronson Hill led the way for EMU with seven touchdowns for a total of 42 points. Meanwhile Ryan Brumfield had 18 points, Tyreese Russell had 18 and Demarius Reed had six. Defensively, Pudge Cotton also had an interception return for a touchdown.

BY THE NUMBERS: Last year the Eagles ranked 19th in the nation in net punting at 39.35 yards per play and 38th in pass defense at 212.75 yards per game ... EMU was strong inside the redzone, scoring on 83 percent of trips inside the 20 ... Eastern scored touchdowns 55 percent of the time when inside their opponents' 20.

MICHIGAN BORN AND BRED: The Eagles' roster featured 34 players from the state of Michigan. This total ranks second among Michigan MAC schools, trailing Central Michigan (68) and in front of Western Michigan (32).

56 AND COUNTING: Despite the Eagles' recent struggles, an impressive streak has remained intact and is in its sixth season in 2013. EMU has not been held scoreless in a game since a 37-0 home loss to Northern Illinois University, Sept. 27, 2008 - a streak of 56 games.

In fact, the Eagles have only been shut out three times in the past 130 games dating back to the start of the 2002 campaign. Additionally, Eastern Michigan has scored 35-or-more points in a game on 22 occasions during that same span.

BRONSON HILL BURSTS ON TO THE NATIONAL SCENE: Running back **Bronson Hill** proved to be EMU's big-play threat last fall. Hill carried just seven times in the first five games but took over as primary ballcarrier against Toledo, Oct. 13. In five games after sliding in that role, Hill carried 105 times for 724 yards. He gained just 106 yards in 28 carries in EMU's last two games, but he left his mark in October and early November.

Of the 114 FBS players with at least 140 carries in 2012, only 12 managed to average 7.0 high-light yards per carry, and only seven of those 12 were running backs: Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey, Oklahoma's Damien Williams, Kent State's Dri Archer, UCF's Latavius Murray, Utah State's Kerwynn Williams, Houston's Charles Sims and Hill.

ENGLISH TAKES OVER DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR ROLE: Head Coach **Ron English** will assume the role as the team's defensive coordinator in addition to also helping coach the safeties and special teams. He joins a select group of Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Head Coaches that also serve the coordinator role. That group includes West Virginia's Dana Holgorsen, Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson, Southern Methodist's June Jones, Washington State's Mike Leach, San Diego State's Rocky Long, BYU's Bronco Mendenhall and Penn State's Bill O'Brien.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Eastern Michigan played 11 "true" freshmen during the 2012 campaign. That amount was tied for 18th most nationally and third most in the Mid-American Conference. Texas and TCU led the way with 16 first-year players having seen game action. Meanwhile, Akron was tops in the MAC with 13 freshmen and Miami was next with 12.

NO CUPCAKES: Playing football in the Mid-American Conference leaves little room for error. Just ask EMU Head Coach **Ron English**. EMU's strength of schedule in 2012 was the hardest in the Mid-American Conference and 29th nationally according to the NCAA. EMU's 2012 opponents had a combined record of 64-50 with seven opponents appearing in bowl games and Illinois State advancing to the NCAA FCS playoffs.

SEVEN OPPONENTS PLAYED IN BOWL GAMES LAST YEAR: Seven of the Eagles' 2013 opponents appeared in bowl games in 2012. Central Michigan won the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl with a 24-21 thriller over Western Kentucky; Ohio captured a 45-14 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the Independence Bowl. Meanwhile, Ball State lost to UCF, 38-17, in the Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl, Bowling Green fell to San Jose State, 29-20, in the Military Bowl, Rutgers came up short against Virginia Tech, 13-10, in the Russell Athletic Bowl, Toledo lost to Utah State, 41-15, in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and Northern Illinois dropped a 31-10 decision to Florida State in the Orange Bowl.

EMU DEFENSE TIGHTENS IN RED ZONE: The Eagle defense held its opponents to just 83 percent on their trips to the red zone. EMU's defense allowed its opponents to enter the red zone on 53 drives, but gave up just 29 touchdowns and 15 field goals. EMU ranked 70th nationally in red zone defense.

<u>DYLAN MULDER NAMED TO LOU GROZA AWARD WATCH LIST:</u> Dylan Mulder is among the outstanding kickers who headline the 30-player Watch List for the 2013 Lou Groza College Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

As a "true freshman" Mulder finished the year with the sixth highest field goal percentage of any Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) kicker with at least 10 attempts. He posted three double-digit scoring games, including a 3-for-3 performance in EMU's 29-23 win over Western Michigan.

Mulder appeared in 10 games for the Green and White, making 10 out of his attempted 11 field goals for the season, three of which were beyond the 40 yard line. He also connected on 24 out of his 27 attempted PATs and was the team leader in points scored with 54. Named MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 19, Mulder booted a career-high three field goals, including a career-long 43-yard kick, in the win at WMU, Nov. 17. He also tallied 18 points in the victory over Army, Oct. 20, nailing two field goals as well as six PATs.

He becomes the first Eagle named to the list since **Andrew Wellock** made the list four times in his career. Wellock was selected as an *Associated Press* Third Team All-American after an outstanding 2004 season that saw him finish runner-up for the 2004 Lou Groza Award. He also made the Lou Groza Watch List in his other three seasons, chosen as a semifinalist in 2003, 2005 and 2006.

Kickers on the Lou Groza Award Watch List were chosen based on statistics from the 2012 season and 2013 expectations. Ten conferences are represented among the 30 kickers, led by four each from the ACC, Big Ten, Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference, while the Mountain West placed three representatives.

EAGLES PLAN TO LEARN FROM 2012: The 2012 football season brought plenty of ups and downs for Eastern Michigan University. The Eagles, who finished the season with a 2-10 overall mark and a 1-7 record in Mid-American Conference play, had plenty of expectations entering the year, but injuries and inexperience dampened the squad's potential.

Eastern Michigan, which retained the Michigan MAC trophy following a 29-23 victory over Western Michigan, Nov. 17, finished nationally in the top-75 in five statistical categories to go along with a pair of top five rankings in the MAC standings.

Offensively, Eastern Michigan rushed for 1,960 yards and 13 touchdowns on 448 carries for the 61st-best ground attack in the nation. The Eagles have now rushed for more than 1,900 yards in each of the past three seasons.

Defensively, EMU ranked 38th nationally and third in the MAC in pass defense. The Eagles gave up just 212.75 yards per game. Additionally, the team ranked 21st nationally in net punting with an average of 39.35 yards per kick.

For their season-long efforts, nine players were selected for College Football Weekly Performance Awards, four took home All-MAC accolades, three Eagles earned MAC West Division Player of the Week honors and two student-athletes captured MAC Scholar Athlete of the Week distinctions.

MICHIGAN MAC TROPHY BACK TO YPSILANTI: With the 29-23 victory at Western Michigan, Nov. 17, EMU retained the Michigan MAC Trophy for the fourth time, the most out of any of the other competing schools. Created in 2005 by the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame, the Eagles kept the trophy due to each team finishing with 1-1 records against each other.

BEATING THE BRONCOS BACK-TO-BACK: EMU's 29-23 defeat of Western Michigan, Nov. 17, marked the first time Eastern has won consecutive games against the Broncos since the Green and White rattled off three straight wins from 1989-1991.

EAGLES GET IT DONE NON-CONFERENCE STYLE: With a 48-38 triumph against Army, Oct. 20, the Eagles defeated a non-conference Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for the first time since Sept. 10, 2005. That day, EMU rolled to a 31-10 home victory over Louisiana-Lafayette as **Matt Bohnet** racked up two passing touchdowns and a pair of rushing scores.



Second Half Offensive Push Propels Eagles to Victory Over Howard Eastern Michigan football wins first game of 2013 season, 34-24

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – Eastern Michigan University kicked off its 122nd season on the gridiron Saturday, Aug. 31 at Rynearson Stadium against the Howard University Bison. The effort proved to be a successful one as the Eagles took down the Bison 34-24 after an aggressive home opener.

The Eagles improve to 1-0 on the 2013 season while Howard falls to 0-1.

The EMU rushing effort was led by Hill, who ran 101 yards in 28 carries. Hill also added two touchdowns, while Jackson added 64 yards and one touchdown. Benz connected on 19 passes in 26 attempts for 210 yards and two touchdown passes.

On the defensive side, Kurtz added 13 total tackles and two interceptions, while Maughmer and O'Conner each added a sack to the effort.

The Howard offense was led by McGhee, who totaled 75 yards and one touchdown. Half back William Parker had 82 yards on seven carries and one touchback. McGhee was 19-for- 32 with 182 yards and one touchdown pass.

On the defensive front, Cameron Alston and Tabrian Resby led the Bison with 14 and 12 tackles, respectively.

The first quarter played out quickly with just two possession changes in the first 15 minutes. EMU's early offensive efforts were quickly slowed by running into the stone line of the Bison defense before redshirt-junior quarterback **Tyler Benz** was able to help the Eagles break through into Howard territory at the 12:30 mark. Eastern's offense suffered a setback at 11:17, when a long pass from Benz was intercepted by Howard's Amedola Olantuji at the Howard 12-yard line.

EMU's defense answered back with forceful aggression to defend their territory as a sack by junior defensive lineman **Cy Maughmer** on a Howard third down forced a punt by the Bison to return the ball to the Eagles.

The Eagles were able to complete 12 plays and gain 55 yards within the remaining 6:04 of the first quarter, but as the time expired the matchup remained scoreless.

The Green and White came out in full force with the start of the second quarter, as a three-yard rush was followed up by an 18-yard throw into the end zone to junior tight end **Tyreese Russell** at 14:17 plus an extra point thanks to sophomore kicker **Dylan Mulder** gave the Eagles the 7-0 lead over the Bison.

Where the Howard offense could not seem to make a play happen, their defense proved to be reliable, as their defenders were able to shed the EMU blockers and force another possession change at 10:43.

After what should have been a challenging start on the Howard five-yard line, the Bison offense jumped into gear with a 16-yard pass straight down the middle and a touchdown at 8:34 thanks to a 65-yard sprint by Howard's William Parker. The Bison were able to gain 95 yards within six plays and knot the score at 7-7.

A short punt from John Fleck gave the Bison an advantage as they started their possession within Eagle territory. Sophomore defensive lineman **Pat O'Connor** was able to lead the defense with two consecutive tackles to take the Bison to a third down. An incomplete attempted touchdown pass by Greg McGhee brought Fleck out onto the field, which produced a 43-yard field goal to push Howard to a 10-7 lead with 3:17 left in the half.

With 2:55 remaining and the opposition in the lead, the Eagles started off their final possession of the half with a solid 25-yard return from Allen. Benz completed a series of 10-yard plays, moving the ball from sideline to sideline. With 31 seconds left in the half Benz connected with **Demarius Reed** on a 33-yard touchdown play to give the Eagles a 13-10 lead heading into the locker room.

Howard came out strong in the second half, showing that they were not content with relinquishing their lead as McGhee moved the ball up the field smoothly with five-yard gains before throwing to Jonathan Booker. A 32-yard sideline run from Booker would give the Bison their second lead of the contest over EMU.

The Eagles were unable to create any opportunities with their next possession, gaining only 17 yards in five plays before having to give the ball back over to Howard.

McGhee proved to be the sparkplug of the Howard offen-



sive front as he sprinted toward the Eagle end zone at 6:22 before being stopped by junior defensive back **Darius Scott** on the EMU two-yard line. A series of attempts to run the ball in for a touchdown was seemingly the end of Bison's scoring opportunity, but a penalty on an incomplete fourth-down touchdown attempt gave Howard another chance to run the ball in. McGhee was able to take advantage of the call to complete a 1-yard rush at 4:20 and extend the Bison lead.

Despite the 14-0 scoring run by the Bison, the Eagles' offense returned to the field with intensity and determination as the Eagles traveled 60 yards along the gridiron within four plays. At 1:29, Eastern was able to quench their scoring drought thanks to junior running back **Bronson Hill**, who rushed the ball in two yards for the Eagles' third touchdown of the evening. EMU began to close the scoring gap after a Mulder extra point, bringing Eastern within four of the Bison

The fourth quarter began with the ball in the hands of the Howard offense, but less than 45 seconds into the final frame senior middle linebacker **Sean Kurtz** nabbed his first career interception from Howard's McGhee and ran a 25-yard return. Four plays after Kurz's electric play, Hill found himself in the end zone once more with 12:31 left to play, giving the Eagles a 27-24 lead over the Bison.

The EMU offense was unable to produce the success on their next possession despite a valiant effort, and the ball was once again returned to Howard's side. Senior defensive end **Kalonji Kashama** produced a huge defensive play by taking down Anthony Philyaw at the Howard 21-yard line, and after only gaining one yard in three plays, the Eagles found themselves with a fantastic opportunity to add more to their growing scoring run.

With 3:54 left in the game, sophomore running back **Darius Jackson** showcased his wheels with a 28-yard rush to take the line of scrimmage to the Howard 20-yard line. Just 40 seconds later, Jackson found himself with the ball gripped tightly under his arm again, despite having Howard's Tabrian Resby latched on to his jersey, as he barreled through the field with to end his 19-yard rush with another Eagles touchdown

With the addition of the fourth completed extra point attempt of the evening, the Eagles found themselves with a 34-24 lead, a 21-0 scoring run in over fifteen minutes of play.

Despite an aggressive effort by the Bison, the Eagles were too powerful of a force to be overcome. As the clock ran down, the Bison gave one last effort to score but were intercepted in the end zone by Kurz, recording his second interception of the night. The Eagles closed out the beginning of the 2013 campaign with a 34-24 victory over Howard.
