HOME OF HOCKEY VALLEY: PEGULA ICE ARENA

Pegula Ice Arena, which opened on September 9, 2013, features two ice surfaces: a main rink, home to Penn State's varsity hockey programs, and a community rink. The main arena seats 5,704 fans, including a 1,000-seat student section.

The two-sheet facility is home to the Nittany Lions. The building hosts a 5,000-square foot weight room, hydrotherapy training room, steam room, team lounge and locker room area. It has the best of amenties for student-athletes and coaches alike.

When visitors come to Hockey Valley, they will experience some of the best amenities college hockey has to offer. Pegula Ice Arena has an interactive history of Penn State Hockey, as well as concession stands, suites, loge boxes and club seats.

Additionally, the arena's ability to house state-of-the-art media and broadcasting facilities will allow it to host National Hockey League and American Hockey League games, bringing hockey's best to Hockey Valley. September 26, 2016 will serve as the first NHL event inside Pegula as the Buffalo Sabres will host the Minnesota Wild in an exhibition game.

The Centre County community is also able to take advantage of the community rink, which will be open nearly 360 days per year for public use. The rink seats 300 fans and features eight locker rooms in order to host local youth hockey, university recreation and skating programs.

The facility was brought to fruition by an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—from **Terry and Kim Pegula**, who, through their gift, helped Penn State realize its goal of Division I hockey. At the ceremonial groundbreaking on April 20, 2012, the Pegulas added \$14 million to the project to lift the total donation to \$102 million.

Pegula Ice Arena is located at 250 University Drive near Curtin Road across from the Bryce Jordan Center.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 17th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2016-17. Gadowsky is currently coaching his fifth Penn State varsity team.

AT PENN STATE

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions rise continued as Gadowsky led Penn State to their best finish since making the leap to NCAA Division I status. The Lions secured their first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

Those 2015-16 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign had gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten teams (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL arena (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had a won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, presented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also

named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

While at Princeton, Gadowsky had more than 20 players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalemba (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, who were ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

In addition, Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

MEET COACH FISHER

Keith Fisher enters his fifth season with the Nittany Lion varsity program for the 2016-17 season. Fisher has 18 years of coaching experience in college and junior hockey.

AT PENN STATE

Fisher's recruiting and coaching acumen has been vital to the recent rise of Penn State hockey including its first 20win campaign in 2015-16. With a team of Fisher's and fellow assistant Matt Lindsay's recruits, the Lions have improved their win total each of the past three seasons while advancing to the Big Ten semifinals twice in those three years.

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions set numerous offensive records including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

In 2014-15 Fisher was also able to witness the best individual single-season performance for a Nittany Lion as Casey Bailey tallied 22 goals and 40 points to lead the Big Ten in scoring. Bailey parlayed his successful junior season into a two-year NHL contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs.

During the 2013-14 campaign, Fisher helped guide the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, highlighted its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten Quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, the assistant coach helped lead the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. Fisher helped guide Penn State to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Before his time at PSU, Fisher spent the previous six seasons on the staff at Princeton from 2005-2011. With the Tigers, he helped lead the team to a pair of NCAA tournament berths (2008, 2009) and the 2008 ECAC and lvy League Championships. The 2009 Princeton Tigers also set the school-record for wins in a season with 22, a record which still stands to this day.

The Minnesota native headed up the Princeton recruiting which saw three All-Americans, two Hobey Baker Award Finalists, two ECAC Player of the Year recipients (the only 2 in the history of the program), one ECAC Rookie of the Year, one ECAC Defenseman of the Year and one ECAC Goaltender of the year come through the program.

Fisher's teams also combined for 48 Academic All-ECAC players, five NHL players, four First-Team All-ECAC players and three First-Team All-Ivy players.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Prior to his time at Princeton, Fisher spent five years with the USHL's Omaha Lancers' coaching staff, helping the team to the Clark Cup championship in 2001 and Anderson Cup regular-season championships in both 2002 and 2005.

In Omaha, he served as the team's recruiting coordinator and academic advisor, in addition to other responsibilities of on-ice coaching, video breakdown and game analysis.

Fisher helped coach and recruit NHL first-round draft picks Keith Ballard and Nick Petrecki, 11 NHL players, including Matt Carle and Paul Stastny, and USHL Goaltender of the Year and USA Hockey Junior Player of the Year Jeff Lerg. He also helped develop 54 NCAA Division I scholarship players and 12 NHL draft picks and served as associate coach for Team USHL at the USHL Prospects/All-Star game during his final season.

Prior to his arrival in Omaha, Fisher served two seasons with St. Cloud State University's hockey program as an undergraduate assistant coach. During his time with the Huskies, Fisher helped develop five players for the NHL and in 2000 they advanced to just the second NCAA tournament in program history.

PERSONAL LIFE

A graduate of St. Cloud State University, Fisher has a bachelor's degree in communications. Prior to coaching, Fisher played two seasons at Hibbing Community College, participating in the NJCAA national tournament during his tenure there.

For the 2013-14 campaign, Lindsay aided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, the assistant coach helped lead the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. Lindsay helped guide Penn State to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin).

A 2012 graduate of Utica, Dawes enters his fourth season at Penn State. Prior to his time with the PSU women, he served as assistant coach/ director of hockey operations for the Pioneer men's team from 2009-13.

Dawes will serve as the coordinator of all internal and external video efforts, while coordinating travel plans, working with opposing teams and their video efforts and assisting the coaching staff in all pregame and postgame preparation.

With the Penn State women, Dawes was a member of the on-ice coaching staff whose main responsibilities included working with the defensemen, the penalty kill and video coaching. He also oversaw the day-to-day operation of the program including game scheduling, away trip management, home game day coordination and hockey technology.

Under Dawes, the Nittany Lion defense has improved each year in goals allowed, goals against average and shutouts. The Nittany Lions have also increased their penalty kill percentage from .719 in 2013-14 to .813 in 2014-15 to .847 during the 2015-16 season.

In addition to his duties with the Nittany Lions, Dawes served as video coach of the U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team for the 2015-16 season, winning a gold medal at the 2016 IIHF World Championships. He produced scouting reports, pre and post-game meeting packages, and assisted in all areas of hockey technology.

While at Utica, Dawes primarily oversaw the day-to-day operations of the men's hockey team and helped develop scouting reports and video breakdowns.

Additionally, Dawes assisted in Utica's recruiting efforts and the team's expenditures. During his time at UC, the Pioneers improved every season, going from an 8-14-4 record in 2009-10 to a 21-6-1 record in 2012-13 en route to the NCAA Division III Semifinals. NITTANY LION HOCKEY HISTORY

EARLY YEARS

LATE 1800s-EARLY 1900s

Many of Penn State's 300 students play pickup hockey on flooded outdoor rinks.

1906-09

Students primarily from the Pittsburgh area organize a hockey team with the intent to seek official approval for an intercollegiate varsity team by the University's Athletic Association, which oversaw all Penn State sports.

DECEMBER 1909

On Christmas night, the first Penn State hockey team, led by captain **Herb Baetz**, plays its first-ever intercollegiate game against Carnegie Tech at the Duquesne Gardens in Pittsburgh. Less than a week later, Penn State travels to the Duquesne Gardens once more, and falls to Pittsburgh, 2-1.

JANUARY 21, 1910

University's Athletic Association rejects an official bid to sponsor ice hockey as an official varsity sport. Penn State students fight to elevate the program for the next two decades.

WINTER 1938

Eight members of the Sigma Phi fraternity form an independent hockey team.

FEBRUARY 1938

On Feb. 12, the team plays an exhibition game against Lakemont, an independent amateur team, in Altoona, Pennsylvania, with **Al Hook**, a physical education professor, serving as team coach. Ten days later, the squad suits up for its first intercollegiate game against Pittsburgh at the Duquesne Gardens, losing 4-0.

1938-39 SEASON

Prior to the start of the 1938-39 campaign, **Dr. Carl P. Schott**, Dean of the School of Physical Education and Athletics, approves appropriations of \$100 for the team.

Dr. Arthur F. Davis, who also coached the first four seasons of varsity hockey at Penn State, is named the team's head coach. In the beginning of the season, the team practices indoors at the Armory building or outside on the pond at Whipple Dam, and plays three games.

1939-40 SEASON

Penn State joins the Pennsylvania Intercollegiate League with the University of Pennsylvania, Hershey Jr. Cubs, Lehigh and Lafayette.

During the season, Rec Hall becomes the team's indoor practice facility. The team's "home" rink was more than 100 miles away in Hershey. Penn State plays its first true home

contest Jan. 27, when the team was finally able to play on flooded tennis courts. Three hundred bleachers were also put in for the event.

The team competes in 11 games during the season and compiled a 3-8-0 record.

THE FIRST VARSITY ERA

MARCH-MAY 1940

Hockey and skiing are put before the students at the All-College Elections. Two months later, hockey is voted as an official varsity sport as the Athletic Association approved the measure by a 651-35 majority vote.

DECEMBER 6, 1940

Penn State plays its first game as a varsity sport at the Shaffer Ice Palace in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. The Nittany Lions defeat Carnegie Tech, 3-1, with **John Dufford** scoring the first goal in Penn State varsity history.

After the first season, the University's Athletic Advisory Board granted hockey full status with full financial support. Up until that time, the team was able to make its own schedule and handle its own finances. The team uses Rec Hall as its practice facility as several attempts for an outdoor rink throughout the years is unsuccessful.

1940-44 SEASONS

Although there is on-ice success, the United States' involvement in World War II, combined with the lack of availability of ice on campus,

O

has a devastating effect on the viability of Penn State Hockey.

With many teams dropping the sport, Penn State only plays four games during the 1942-43 season, including just two collegiate contests.

Ravaged by the war, Coach Davis and Penn State prepares for the 1943-44 season with only three members from the previous year's squad after losing most of its members to military and civilian enrollment.

With the effects of the war being felt throughout the University, the Athletic Association announces that the suspensions of six sports as a war-time economy measure: hockey, cross country, swimming, gymnastics, tennis and golf.

1946-47 SEASON

Following the end of World War II, the team returns for one final season. **James O'Hora**, a new addition to the football coaching staff, is selected to lead Penn State for the 1946-47 season. The Nittany Lions are scheduled to play seven games, but four contests are eventually cancelled due to warm weather.

Following the season, the Athletic Association drops hockey once more, citing limited facilities.

It will be 25 years until organized hockey returns to Penn State.

ICERS ERA

NOVEMBER 19, 1971

Penn State Hockey returns at the club level as the Icers defeat the Hampden Leafs, 8-6. The team makes its long-awaited comeback after a petition is signed by more than 3,000 members of the community.

1970s

Larry Hendry serves as the team's first coach and, during the early 1970s, teams are comprised of undergraduates, graduate students and faculty members before more stringent eligibility rules are put into place.

JANUARY 16, 1981

The Icers edge Upsala, 6-5, in their first game at Greenberg Ice Pavilion, which serves as Penn State Hockey's home for 32 years, including the inaugural NCAA season in 2012-13.

During their return to campus, the Penn State Icers call three different arenas home. From 1971-78, the team competes at the original Ice Pavilion, which opened in 1955, and located near the current location of the Lasch Football Building. Following two and a half seasons (1978-81) of travelling to Mechanicsburg, Penn State returns to campus and the Greenberg Ice Pavilion.

MARCH 10, 1984

Penn State captures its first national championship with a 7-5 victory against Arizona coached by Jon Shellington.

The Icers capture seven total titles, including six ACHA titles during (1984, 1990, 1998, 2000-03) during their 41-year history.

OCTOBER 30, 1987

Joe Battista begins his 19-year tenure (1987-2006) as head coach with a 5-4 victory against Conestoga. Battista records a 512-120-27 mark behind the bench and leads Penn State to its last six club national titles.

1997-98 SEASON

Following runner-up finishes in 1993 and 1995, the lcers capture their third national championship with a win over Ohio to finish 31-5-1.

MARCH 5, 2001

In its fourth straight national title game, Penn State wins its fifth championship overall, and second in a row, with a 7-2 win over Delaware in Tucson, Arizona. Penn State scores 28 goals in four games with a plus-18 goal margin en route to the title.

MARCH 3, 2002

Penn State wins an unprecedented third straight ACHA title with a 4-0 shutout of Illinois in Laurel, Maryland. Penn State wins its final three games of the tournament by a combined 28-4.

MARCH 3, 2003

The Icers cap their fourth straight, and final of seven national titles, with a dominating 30-3-1 final record. For a second straight tournament, Penn State wins its title game in shutout fashion, this time 5-0 over long-time rival Ohio on the Bobcats' home ice.

MARCH 3, 2007

Penn State reaches its 10th consecutive ACHA championship game with a 5-2 win over Delaware in Youngstown, Ohio. The Icers fall to Oakland the next day in the program's final national title game appearance.

During their history, two Icers-Alon Eizenman (2000) and Neal Price (2002)-are

named ACHA Plaver of the Year, while Penn State boasts 23 ACHA First Team All-Americans and, since 1995, 62 ACHA Academic All-Americans.

Eizenman is also one of three people with Penn State ties inducted into the ACHA Hall of Fame, along with builders Josh Brandwene, a former Icers defenseman and head coach of Penn State's women's ice hockey team, and Battista.

SEPTEMBER 17, 2010

2016-17 PENN STATE HOCKEY

The Penn State Board of Trustees announce the largest private gift in University history—an \$88 million donation from **Terrence M. and Kim Pegula** to fund a state-of-the-art arena and establish an NCAA men's hockey program. By April 2012, the Pegulas contribute another \$14 million for a sum total of \$102 million. The team is set to compete for the 2012-13 season as an independent and move to Pegula Ice Arena for the 2013-14 season.

MARCH 21, 2011

The Big Ten Conference announces its intention to sponsor men's hockey beginning in the 2013-14 season. The Big Ten will comprise of Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin.

APRIL 24, 2011

Longtime collegiate coach **Guy Gadowsky** is named the first head coach in program history. Gadowsky joins Penn State after successful stints at Princeton and Alaska.

The bench boss hires his two Princeton assistants—**Keith Fisher** and **Matt Lindsay**—to serve the same roles while selecting former Penn State Icer **Bill Downey** as director of operations. The staff oversee the Icers' final season in 2011-12.

HOCKEY VALLEY TIMELINE

SEPTEMBER 5, 2011 Coach Gadowsky announces the first four members of the Division I era: Taylor Holstrom, Nate Jensen, Bryce Johnson and Justin Kirchhevel.

Holstrom goes on to end his PSU career first in varsity assists (43), second in points (67) and third in goals (24). Jensen finishes tied for first in defenseman goals (7) and second in points (29) and assists (22).

FEBRUARY 2012

Ground breaks for Pegula Ice Arena—the \$90 million, multi-purpose arena that serves as the home to Penn State Hockey.

OCTOBER 12, 2012

Penn State competes at the NCAA level for the first time and drops a 3-2 overtime decision to AIC at Greenberg Ice Pavilion.

Redshirt-sophomore **Max Gardiner** takes the first faceoff, while freshman **Casey Bailey** (4:37, 2nd) scores the team's first goal. Classmate **Matthew Skoff** makes 26 saves in his debut.

OCTOBER 13, 2012

The Nittany Lions capture their first win with a 4-3 overtime victory against American International at Mohegan Sun Arena in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania.

Freshman **David Glen** scores the winning goal 38 seconds into the extra frame, while sophomore **PJ Musico** turns aside 32 shots for the win.

FEBRUARY 25, 2013

Forward **Taylor Holstrom** scores with 34 seconds left in overtime to lift Penn State to a 4-3 overtime win over Wisconsin in the team's season finale. The win is the team's first against a ranked opponent.

JUNE 30, 2013

Incoming freshmen **Eamon McAdam** and **Mike Williamson** become the first Nittany Lions to be chosen in the NHL Draft. McAdam is selected by the New York Islanders in the third round (70th overall), while Williamson is the Vancouver Canucks' sixth-round choice (175th overall).

Penn State opens the brand-new Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 victory against Army in front of a sellout crowd of 6,370.

Defenseman **Nate Jensen** scores the first goal in the facility at 3:02 of the first period, while **Matthew Skoff** earns the victory with 25 saves.

DECEMBER 6, 2013

The Nittany Lions play their first Big Ten Conference game, falling to Wisconsin by a 7-1 score in Madison.

JANUARY 12-13, 2014

Penn State welcomes No. 1 Minnesota for its first Big Ten home series at Pegula Ice Arena.

FEBRUARY 8, 2014

Goaltender **Matthew Skoff** earns his third career shutout as Penn State shuts out No. 10 Michigan, 4-0, at Pegula Ice Arena for the team's first conference victory. The win is also the first over a top 10 program.

FEBRUARY 21, 2014

After forward **Casey Bailey** ties the game with five seconds left, freshman **David Goodwin's** overtime marker lifts Penn State to a 5-4 victory against No. 10 Michigan for the team's first Big Ten road win.

MARCH 20, 2014

The Nittany Lions win the first Big Ten tournament game in league history with a 2-1 double-overtime thriller against Michigan at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minnesota. Freshman **Zach Saar** tallies the game-winner from the left faceoff dot at 12:47 of the frame. **Matthew Skoff** makes a program record 52 saves in a career-high 92:47 of action.

HOCKEY VALLEY TIMELINE

JUNE 6, 2014

Redshirt-senior **Patrick Koudys** is named the second captain of the Nittany Lions' Division I era.

SEPTEMBER 11, 2014

Three minutes: the time it takes for nearly 1,000 Penn State students to purchase their season ticket allottment during an online sale.

OCTOBER 11-12, 2014

Penn State's **Tommy Olczyk** tallies a penalty shot to open the season's scoring during a 2-2 tie with Connecticut. The next day, the Nittany Lions dismantle the Huskies, 7-1, in the largest margin of victory during **Guy Gadowsky's** tenure. PSU matches it the next week with a 7-1 win over Holy Cross.

NOVEMBER 15, 2014

Penn State grabs its biggest win in relation to national ranking by dominating No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1, on the road. The Lions take a 4-0 lead after just 21 minutes behind **Casey Bailey's** two goals and **Taylor Holstrom's** three assists. **Eamon McAdam** picks up his first collegiate win in the upset. **Guy Gadowsky** picks up career win No. 200.

FIRST GAME AT PEGULA ICE ARENA PENN STATE VS. ARMY OCTOBER 11, 2013

DECEMBER 6, 2014

Penn State goes on the road to earn its first Big Ten sweep, taking care of six-time national champion Wisconsin, 5-2 and 4-2, inside the Kohl Center. Penn State enters the winter break in first place with a 3-1-0-0 record.

DECEMBER 15, 2015

For the first time in program history, Penn State receives a national ranking as the USCHO.com slates PSU 20th. The Lions would earn a No. 19 ranking on Feb. 9.

JANUARY 9, 2015

Casey Bailey tallies the second hat trick in the program's Division I era, and the first in one period, leading a four-goal comeback against Ohio State at Pegula Ice Arena. The Buckeyes went on to win in the final minute of overtime.

JANUARY 23-24, 2015

For two special nights, the Nittany Lions staged a pair of three-goal comebacks to earn a 1-0-1 series win over Northern Michigan. On Friday, Penn State overcame 3-0 and 4-1 deficits for a 5-4. The next night, while wearing special THON jerseys, PSU again overcame a three-goal deficit for a 5-5 tie.

JANUARY 31, 2015

Penn State's winning ways continued as senior netminder **PJ Musico** backstopped a 4-2 comeback win over No. 14 Vermont at Wells Fargo Center. Hometown hero **David Thompson's** first collegiate goal was the third and decisive goal as PSU overcame Vermont's 2-0 lead to earn Big Ten Third Star of the Week.

FEBRUARY 6, 2015

PJ Musico improves to 4-0-1 in his last five outings as the Lions again sweep Wisconsin, the first time Penn State wins four straight contests over an opponent. At the time, Penn State leads the Big Ten with 22 points over Michigan (21).

FEBRUARY 21, 2015

Playing in front of a sold-out Pegula Ice Arena crowd, the Nittany Lions jump out to a 3-1 lead on No. 15 Minnesota, looking for the first win over the Gophers. Minnesota stages a comeback, forcing overtime with a shocking goal just 40 seconds shy of defeat. Nevertheless, the emotionally charged Nittany Lions win on **Luke Juha's** seeing-eye shot from the point for the history 4-3 win.

Later that night, the Nittany Lions take the stage across the street inside the Bryce Jordan Center at THON 2015. The men's hockey team earns another win, taking the Pep Rally Dance competition that results in a viral video.

MARCH 7, 2015

Penn State looked to close Pegula Ice Arena in style for the 2014-15 campaign and to send off its seniors in fine fashion. It takes a total team effort as the Nittany Lions hold off Michigan for a 4-3 win and earn a sweep of the Wolverines for the first time. Penn State finishes the season 13-2-3 in Hockey Valley, the second best mark in college hockey.

MARCH 16, 2015

The Big Ten coaches and media select Penn State leader **Guy Gadowsky** as Big Ten Coach of the Year. Gadowsky guides the Nittany Lions to a 10-win improvement overall and in the conference title hunt until the final weekend of the season.

MARCH 21, 2015

Casey Bailey, the Big Ten's leading scorer and Penn State's first All-Big Ten selection, becomes Penn State's first NHL signee. Bailey joins the Toronto Maple Leafs on a two-year entry level contract and plays his first game five days later vs. Florida recording a plus-one rating.

APRIL 10, 2015

Senior goaltender **PJ Musico** is named the Derek Hines Unsung Hero, Penn State's first major individual award. Musico becomes the

first goaltender to win the award in its nine-year history. The award is given in honor of Derek Hines, a former hockey player at Army, who was killed in action Sept. 1, 2005 in Afghanistan. Musico's connection to the award went further than just his on-ice talents as he played youth hockey with Hines's younger brother, Trevor.

APRIL 11, 2015

In the Maple Leafs' regular season finale, **Casey Bailey** makes his sixth appearance of the season. In the first period, Bailey scores his first career goal, redirecting Dion Phaneuf's shot from the point past NHL Hart and Vezina Trophy winner Carey Price.

AUGUST 20, 2015

Senior forward **David Glen** is named the third captain of the Nittany Lion program. Glen's alternate captain is senior **Luke Juha**.

SEPTEMBER 3, 2015

Five minutes: The amount of time it took for nearly 1,000, 16-game student season ticket packages to sell out for the 2015-16 season.

OCTOBER 10, 2015

Senior forward **Curtis Loik** nets the first goal of the season just 1:33 into the first period, the fastest goal to start a season in program history. Senior captain **David Glen** also notches a pair of goals as PSU defeats Canisius 6-1 in the season opener.

OCTOBER 23, 2015

The first senior class to graduate through the program exacts revenge on AIC, the team who defeated them in their first-ever Division I contest four years prior.

Freshman **Andrew Sturtz** tallies the first two goals of his career including the Top Play of the Week on NCAA.org with a Bobby Orr esque goal at 12:55 of the second period en route to an 8-3 victory. The following night Sturtz tallies the game-winning goal to complete the sweep.

NOV. 13, 2015 - DEC. 11, 2015

The Nittany Lions embark on their longest unbeaten streak in the history of the program going 7-0-2 to close out the first semester of play including a sweep of Michigan State to open Big Ten action.

DECEMBER 14, 2015

Penn State ranked in both National Polls for first time ever opening the USA Today Poll at 15th while improving to 14th in the uscho. com poll, the highest ranking they have ever reached.

JANUARY 30, 2016

Penn State travels to NYC to participate in Big Ten Super Saturday Hoops & Hockey at Madison Square Garden against Michigan. Despite a fast start the No. 15 Nittany Lions eventually fall to No. 6 Michigan 6-3.

FEBRUARY 6, 2016

Junior **Zach Saar** secured the game-winning goal as Penn State upended Minnesota, 5-3, for the first-time at Mariucci Arena.

MARCH 17, 2016

Senior **Eric Scheid** scored two goals and classmate **Luke Juha** added a career-high three helpers as Penn State defeated Wisconsin 5-2 in the opening round of the Big Ten Tournament at the Xcel Energy Center.

MARCH 23, 2016

Junior goalie **Eamon McAdam** becomes the second Nittany Lion to sign an NHL deal as he signed a three-year entry-level contract with the NY Islanders.

APRIL 8, 2016

Senior **David Glen** was named the 2016 Senior CLASS Award recipient for men's ice hockey. The award is presented annually to the most outstanding senior student-athlete in Division I men's hockey.

JUNE 29, 2016

It is announced that Pegula Ice Arena will host it's first NHL contest as Terry Pegula is bringing his Buffalo Sabres to Hockey Valley to face-off with the Minnesota Wild in a preseason contest on September 26, 2016.



THE PEGULAS

On Sept. 17, 2010, Penn State graduate, Terry Pegula, and his wife, Kim, donated \$88 million to his alma mater—the largest private gift in the history of the school—to fund a state-of-theart, multi-purpose arena and to help elevate the University's men's hockey program to the NCAA Division I level. In April 2012, the Pegulas announced they would increase their donation to the Nittany Lion hockey program to \$102 million.

Thanks to their generosity, Penn State added both men's and women's varsity hockey, with both teams beginning play at Pegula Ice Arena in 2013-14. The building includes two ice sheets and serves as the only major ice facility within an 80-mile radius of State College. In addition to providing hockey and figure skating opportunities for the entire Central Pennsylvania region, it is also used for a broad range of campus and community activities.

A native of Rochester, New York, Kim Pegula is a 1991 graduate of Houghton College with a degree in communications and was involved with East Resources since 1991. In 2011, Kim donated \$12 million to her alma mater to support the construction of new athletic facility, the Kerr-Pegula Sports Complex.

Together, the Pegulas have expanded their interests in the sports field by acquiring Atlanta-based France AllPro Athlete Management, a high-profile NFL player agent firm headed by Todd France, in December 2011. The Pegulas also own Impact Sports Performance, an elite athletic training facility in Boca Raton, Florida.

Beyond the sports world, Terry and Kim also founded Black River Entertainment, a country music label based in Nashville, Tennessee. Terry and Kim currently reside in Boca Raton, Florida, and have five children: Michael, Laura, Jessica, Kelly, and Matthew.

EAST RESOURCES

In 1983, 10 years after he graduated from Penn State, Terry Pegula borrowed \$7,500 from family and friends to establish East Resources Inc., an independent oil and gas exploration and development company.

Over the next 27 years, he built it into one of the largest privately held companies in the United States. In July 2010, Royal Dutch Shell purchased the assets of East Resources Inc. for \$4.7 billion. That sale allowed the Pegulas to make their first foray into the hockey world with their transformational gift to Penn State.

BUFFALO SABRES

Back in 1983, Terry Pegula told his business partner, Robert H. Long Jr., "If I ever have more than two nickels to my name, I'm going to buy the Buffalo Sabres one day." Almost 30 years later, Pegula's dream came to fruition.

On Feb. 22, 2011, Pegula became the fourth owner in Buffalo Sabres franchise history. The day Pegula was introduced as owner, the Sabres were 27-25-6 and sat in ninth place in the Eastern Conference—five points out of a playoff spot. Pegula's purchase not only reenergized the fan base, but the players as well. With Pegula now at the helm, the Sabres went on a 16-4-4 run over the final 24 games of the season to finish seventh in the East. This included a 9-1-2 record at home, with every remaining home game selling out.

The momentum of the new era would stretch well into the offseason as the home of the Sabres-renamed First Niagara Center





in August 2011—began a multi-million dollar facelift. The renovations, which were completed in time for the 2011-12 season, included a new, state-of-the-art locker room with updated training and rehabilitation areas, player lounge and coaching offices. Along with the locker room transformation, First Niagara Center underwent several other upgrades with a focus on providing a first-rate environment for players and fans quickly earned Buffalo the label of 'Hockey Heaven.'

In 2012, Pegula looked to make an even bigger impact on the City of Buffalo, using hockey as a catalyst. On Aug. 29, it was announced that the city had selected Pegula and his development team to develop and construct HARBORcenter, a \$172 million multipurpose facility that sits directly across from First Niagara Center in the city's Canalside District. HARBORcenter is anchored by two new NHLsize ice rinks that are open for community use and a 200-room, full-service Marriott hotel. In addition to the ice rinks and hotel, there's an upscale, hockey-themed sports bar and restaurant, additional retail space and a parking structure.

HARBORcenter is now home to Canisius College hockey and helped host multiple international tournaments including the 2015 IIHF U-18 Women's Championship. It is expected to draw more than 500,000 people to downtown Buffalo annually and, coupled with First Niagara Center, will provide a premier destination for hockey fans, right in the heart of 'Hockey Heaven.'

BUFFALO BILLS

On Oct. 11, 2014, exactly a year after Pegula lce Arena debuts, the Pegulas purchased the NFL's Buffalo Bills for \$1.4 billion, saving the franchise from relocating.

THE MISSION

Penn State's historic mission of teaching, research, and public service-launched under the most modest of circumstances more than 150 years ago-now reaches into virtually all parts of Pennsylvania. Consider, for example, that the University now has 24 campuses across the Commonwealth, putting a Penn State education within practical reach of nearly every Pennsylvanian. In fact, nearly 75 percent of Penn State's undergraduates are Pennsylvania residents.

Penn State is Pennsylvania's largest nongovernmental employer and has employees and expenditures in every one of its 67 counties. The University generates a total economic impact across the Commonwealth that surpasses \$8.5 billion annually.

Part of that impact is derived from Penn State's research program, which brings more than \$500 million in federal funds to Pennsylvania each year, and an additional \$100 million from private industry.

Penn State's outreach and online programs -ranging from 4H to Cooperative Extension, from summer camps to public broadcastingprovide educational and service programs to more than a million Pennsylvania households annually.

THE BEGINNING

The University's presence throughout Pennsylvania today contrasts sharply with its humble beginnings. Chartered as a college of scientific agriculture, the institution was located in rural Centre County after James Irvin, a partner in the Centre Furnace iron works (remains of which can be seen today along East College Avenue), offered to donate 200 acres of farmland for a campus.

Founding President Evan Pugh wanted the fledging institution to embody a new approach to higher education that blended classical

studies with subjects that had practical value. He joined similar visionaries in other states in convincing Congress to pass the Morrill Land-Grant Act in 1862. The act gave individual states tracts of federal land to sell; the proceeds supported colleges that agreed to include engineering, science and the liberal arts as well as agriculture in their course of studies. In 1863, the Penn-

sylvania legislature designated Penn State the Commonwealth's sole land-grant institution. The lawmakers in effect bestowed on the privately incorporated college a public character. In return for state support, the institution assumed obligations of teaching, research and service that are normally associated with publicly owned land-grant universities in other states.

By the 1890s Penn State was making its mark. It ranked among the nation's 10 largest undergraduate engineering schools, a distinction it still holds. It established one of the nation's first collegiate agricultural experiment stations, and Professor Whitman Jordan's pioneering research on using fertilizers for soil enrichment had global impact on crop yields.

Penn State in 1871 became one of the first land-grant schools in the Northeast to admit women, graduated its first international student in 1890, and its first African-American student in 1905.

THE 20TH CENTURY


In the early 1900s, President Edwin E. Sparks supported a number of efforts to "carry the college to the people," as he liked to say. Technical institutes were established in various locations statewide for engineering education, beginning with an evening school in Allentown in 1910. In 1912, Penn State helped create a system of county agents in agriculture and home economics. Today, the Penn State World Campus, with its "anywhere, anytime" learning through the Internet, builds on that outreach tradition.

POST-WORLD WAR II

Following World War II, Penn State underwent unprecedented expansion, first to meet the needs of returning military veterans and later to accommodate the Baby Boom generation. Total enrollment at all Penn State campuses climbed to 40,000 by 1970.

The University also emerged on the national scene as a research powerhouse in fields as diverse as dairy science, acoustics, psychology, and diesel engineering. The expansion of research went hand in hand with a steady increase in the number of graduate students. The University awarded its first graduate degree—a master's degree in scientific agriculture—in 1862, and the Graduate School was established in 1922. But overall graduate enrollment remained modest until the 1950s, then swelled steadily. In the past ten years alone, Penn State had awarded more than 30,000 master's, doctoral, and other advanced degrees.

TODAY

The University Park campus is Penn State's administrative and research hub. In addition, there are 19 primarily undergraduate campuses; Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center, including the College of Medicine; the Pennsylvania College of Technology; the Penn State Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle campus; the Penn State Great Valley School of Graduate Professional Studies; and the Penn State World Campus.

To date, Penn State has awarded nearly 750,000 degrees, hallmarks of an educational experience second to none in quality. In addition, Penn State alumni—including 327,000 in Pennsylvania alone—have job- and social-networking opportunities that no other college or university in the Commonwealth can surpass.

NITTANY LION LEGEND

Penn State's athletic symbol, chosen by the student body in 1906, is the mountain lion which once roamed central Pennsylvania.

H.D. "Joe" Mason, a member of the Class of 1907, conducted a one-man campaign to choose a school mascot after seeing the Princeton tiger on a trip with the Penn State baseball team to that New Jersey campus. A student publication sponsored the campaign to select a mascot and Penn State is believed to be the first college to adopt the lion as a mascot.

Since Penn State is located in the Nittany Valley at the foot of Mount Nittany, the lion was designated as a Nittany Lion. In regional folklore, Nittany (or Nita-Nee) was a valorous Indian princess in whose honor the Great Spirit caused Mount Nittany to be formed. A later namesake, daughter of chief O-Ko-Cho, who lived near the mouth of Penn's Creek, fell in love with Malachi Boyer, a trader. The tearful maiden and her lost lover became legend and her name was given to the stately mountain.

LION SHRINE

Penn State's Nittany Lion shrine was dedicated on Oct. 24, 1942, during Homecoming Weekend. Animal sculptor Heinz Warneke and stonecutter Joseph Garatti molded a 13ton block of Indiana limestone into the most recognizable symbol of Penn State. The shrine was chosen from six models submitted by THE LION SHRINE

Warneke.

The shrine is a gift of the Class of 1940 and rests in a natural setting of trees near Recreation Building. The site was chosen because of its accessibility, the surrounding trees and the fact that the sculpture would not be dwarfed by nearby buildings.

BLUE & WHITE

Penn State's student-athletes are instantly identified by their blue and white uniforms but those weren't the original school colors. A three-member committee representing the sophomore, junior and senior classes was appointed in October of 1887 to develop color options from which the student body would select the school's official colors. Dark pink and black was the unanimous choice of the

student body after considering the color com-

binations presented by the committee. Soon many students and the baseball team were sporting pink and black striped blazers and caps. However, problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

2016-17 PENN STATE HOCKEY



Eric J. Barron took the helm of Pennsylvania's flagship public university on May 12, 2014. arriving from Florida State University. where he had been president for four years. No stranger to Penn State, he had served on the faculty of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences from 1986-2002 and as dean of the college from 2002-06.

Dr. Barron returned to Penn State from his presidency at Florida State, bringing with him nearly 35 years of leadership experience in academic administration, education, research and public service, and a track record as a talented manager of fiscal policy within large and complex institutions. Dr. Barron led Florida State to two consecutive U.S. News and World Report rankings as the nation's "most efficiently operated" institution of higher education.

Dr. Barron earned a bachelor of science degree in geology at Florida State in 1973 before moving on to the University of Miami, where he earned master's and doctoral degrees in oceanography, in 1976 and 1980, respectively. Dr. Barron spent 20 years of his career at Penn State, serving as dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences from 2002-06, and as founding director of the Earth System Science Center, one of the first major initiatives focused on the total study of Earth as a system, from 1986-2002. He also had a simultaneous appointment as director of the Earth and Mineral Sciences Environment Institute from 1998 to 2002. In 1999, he was named Distinguished Professor of Geosciences at Penn State, and during his tenure as director, Industry Week magazine ranked him among "50 R&D Stars to Watch."

An accomplished scientist with a long background in atmospheric research, Dr. Barron served as director of the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) from 2008-10 and as dean of the Jackson School of Geosciences at the University of Texas at Austin from 2006-08. Early in his career he was a postdoctoral research fellow and scientist at

the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, Colorado, a federal research center focusing on atmospheric and related science issues. Over the decades, Dr. Barron has lent his significant expertise in the areas of atmospheric science and the geosciences to many national committees and federal organizations. As leader of Penn State, Dr. Barron oversees a research enterprise of more than \$800 million and 24 campuses, including two law schools and a College of Medicine in Hershey, Pa., as well as an internationally recognized online educational enterprise known as the World

Campus. Penn State's current enrollment is approximately 98,000 students, and it boasts the world's largest dues-paying alumni association.

During his tenure as president of Penn State, Dr. Barron has made access and affordability; student engagement; economic development; job creation and student career success; technology and diversity and demographics priorities. His Invent Penn State initiative aims at ramping up investment in economic development and student career success. By leveraging the size and broad research strengths of the University, Dr. Barron has made it a goal that Penn State will be a driver for job creation, entrepreneurship, and economic development, and will accelerate the transfer of new ideas into useful products and processes that encompass a broad range.

Over the past year, Invent Penn State has resulted in the launch of 20 entrepreneurial centers and innovation hubs across Pennsylvania.

SANDY BARBOUR

Sandy Barbour began her leadership of the Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics program on Aug. 18, 2014. President Eric J. Barron named Barbour the Nittany Lions' ninth Director of Athletics on July 26, 2014 after serving 10 years as Director of Athletics at the University of California.

Barbour brings to Penn State more than 30 years of varied experiences as a collegiate administrator and coach, with a demonstrated record of championships, academic success, innovation, facility modernization and revenue growth.

Barbour directs Penn State's 31-sport, broad-based program that supports approximately 850 student-athletes and an Intercollegiate Athletics staff of more than 300.

Serving as the Director of Athletics at Cal since 2004, Barbour guided the Golden Bears through one of the most successful periods in school history. Under her direction, the athletic department became one of the consistently elite programs in the country. Barbour's 10year term as AD was the longest tenure for the department since men's and women's athletics merged into a single entity in 1992.

During her tenure overseeing Cal's 30-sport program, the Golden Bears won 20 team national championships, 97 individual national titles, finished in the top 10 in the annual Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings six times, including a program-best third in 2011, and reached record levels in ticket sales, sponsorships and fundraising.

Cal student-athletes continued their high academic achievement in 2013-14, with numerous programs earning public recognition from the NCAA on the Academic Progress Rate and Graduation Success Rate metrics with 100 percent scores. New coach Sonny Dykes led a resurgence in the football program's academic achievement with a 969 APR score, 18 points higher than the Division I football average, and a record-setting program GPA.

Under Barbour's leadership, the average grade-point average for Cal's 30 teams was nearly 3.0 and the women's golf team achieved the highest team GPA in Cal's recorded history when it posted a 3.54 GPA during the fall 2013 semester. More than 175 student-athletes annually earned academic all-conference notice, and 17 teams received national recognition for their NCAA Academic Progress Rates over the last five years.

Prior to moving to Berkeley, Barbour was the deputy director of athletics at Notre Dame, serving as the university's senior athletic administrator from July 2002 to September 2004. She previously held an associate athletic director position there starting in 2000.

Barbour's career in intercollegiate athletic administration spans more than 30 years, beginning as a field hockey assistant coach and lacrosse administrative assistant at the University of Massachusetts in 1981. She has since served as assistant athletic director at Northwestern and in 1991 was recruited to Tulane as an associate athletic director.

In 1996, Barbour was appointed Tulane's director of athletics at age 36, and during her three years overseeing the program, Green Wave teams won 12 conference championships. In her first year in the position, the school captured four conference titles, a feat never before accomplished in Tulane history. She also hired Tommy Bowden as head football coach during her first year. Bowden proceeded in 1997 to post the Green Wave's first winning season (7-4) in 16 years, and then directed the school to a 12-0 record, a Conference USA championship and a No. 7 national ranking the following season as the 1998 Liberty Bowl champions.

Born Dec. 2, 1959, in Annapolis, Md., Barbour grew up in a military family. Her father was a career aviator in the U.S. Navy, and her family lived in various U.S. locations as well as in Western Europe during her childhood.

Barbour graduated cum laude in 1981 with a B.S. degree in physical education from Wake Forest, where she was a four-year letterwinner and served as captain of the field hockey team. She also played two varsity seasons of women's basketball.

Barbour earned advanced degrees at both Massachusetts (an M.S. in sports management in 1983) and Northwestern's Kellogg School of Management (an M.B.A. in 1991). Between master's programs, Barbour served as assistant field hockey and lacrosse coach at Northwestern from 1982-84. She also held the position of director of recruiting services during that period, before being promoted to assistant athletic director for intercollegiate programs in 1984, a position she held until 1989.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media requests must be placed in writing at least 24 hours in advance of a game. Credentials are available on a season and game-bygame basis for newspaper, online and television outlets. Credentials are granted to media with legitimate working functions at the games.

If requests are granted, credentials can be picked up on a game day at Pegula Ice Arena's media entrance, which is located off University Drive on the south side of the building near the loading dock. Note: children under 13 or prospective student-athletes are not permitted in the press areas.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Coach Guy Gadowsky will be available for a weekly press conference following practice on Monday afternoons around 4:30 p.m. Conferences will take place during all game weeks except over school breaks. Times and days are subject to change.

Select student-athletes can also be made available. Requests should be made before 12 PM on Monday. Student-athletes will speak following Coach Gadowsky.

Practices are open to the media and any taping requests should be made in advance to John Hanna.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interviews may be arranged through John Hanna in the strategic communications office. Requests should be made 24 hours in advance. if applicable, on non-game days. Members of the media are not to directly contact coaches or student-athletes through any means (phone, email, social media, etc.), and doing so could result in revocation of press credentials for the representative's entire media entity.

LIVE STREAMING POLICY

Penn State, the Big Ten and its television partners are the sole providers of streaming inside Penn State athletic venues. Any live streaming service of press conferences and games inside Pegula Ice Arena is not permitted.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Coach Gadowsky will address the media, followed by select student-athletes. Media members should make their student-athlete reguests known by the third period (10:00 mark).

GENERAL MEDIA & GAME DAY INFORMATION

The Big Ten head coaches will precede Coach Gadowsky for a brief press conference. Unless requested, the visiting coach of non-conference foes will not enter the media room. Visiting team student-athlete requests should be made to the team media contact.

PARKING

Parking for credentialed media will be available in the Orange F Lot located at the end of McKean Road between the Tennis Center, Holuba Hall, Lasch Football Building and East Area Locker Room, A limited number of season passes will be distributed in order of relevant coverage and distribution of the team. TV crews will have access to the Yellow H Lot adjacent to Pegula Ice Arena. Season parking requests should be made by Sept. 30.

Single-game and single-weekend parking reguests should be made no less than 24 hours in advance. Parking passes will be distributed via email. ALL passes must be printed and presented to the parking attendant upon arrival to each game. Parking supply may be limited. Additional parking can be found in the Jordan East Lot.

PRESS BOX

The Pegula Ice Arena press box is located in Sections 118-120 and can be accessed on the main concourse. The main press area will have game notes, line charts and stats behind Section 119. Seating charts will be available in Section 119 and in the media room during pre-game meal. If you or your media outlet will not be using your press seat on a given night, please contact the strategic communications office in advance.

Working press, radio, television and coaching personnel will have assigned seats in the press box.

Per NCAA and Big Ten rules, scouts and student-athletes are not permitted in the pres box at any time.

Abuse of working credentials will be grounds for removal and revokation of said credentials.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Three seats will be available for visiting radio on press row in Section 119. Arrangements should be made to the strategic communications office at least 48 hours in advance. POTS and Ethernet are available.

TV/VIDEO FILMING

Local television stations can shoot from the corners on the event level or behind press row in Sections 118 or 120.

VIDEO REQUESTS

Requests for video footage can be made to John Hanna. Please send specifics of video type and size.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers will be able to shoot from the portals on the event level in the corners. Priority to the portals will be given to Penn State Athletics. Photographers are asked to rotate, if possible.

PROFESSIONAL SCOUTS

The Nittany Lions welcome all professional scouts to Hockey Valley on game days by showing their NHL-issued ID at the Pegula Ice Arena ticket office. Prior ticket requests should be made to director of operations Alex Dawes (amd37@psu.edu) 24 hours in advance, when possible.

Line charts will be available in the media room on the event level.

GAME DAY SERVICES

Penn State will provide game notes and line charts prior to all contests. Game summaries will be available at the end of each period and game, which will include stats, shot charts and scores. Wireless internet is available at Pegule Ice Arena with log-in available at your seat. Live stats will be available on StatBroadcast.

Following the game, PSU will produce an APstyle game story with notes for distribution and on GoPSUsports.com.
