STORYLINES

• The No. 17 Maryland men's basketball team hits the road for its final road game of the regular season as it faces Penn State at the Bryce Jordan Center Wed., Feb. 27, at 6:30 pm on Big Ten Network. The Terps are 5-4 on the road this season, with four of those wins coming by double figures.

• The Terrapins are 14-9 all-time against the Nittany Lions in a series that dates back to 1960, and 5-2 since joining the Big Ten Conference. Maryland defeated Penn State in its Big Ten opener on Dec. 1, 66-59, as **Jalen Smith** posted 16 points and eight rebounds and **Anthony Cowan Jr.** added 15 points.

• Junior **Anthony Cowan Jr.** needs eight points to become just the sixth player in Maryland history to record 1,300 points and 400 assists in a career. He would join an impressive group that includes Greivis Vasquez, John Lucas, Johnny Rhodes, Walt Williams and Melo Trimble.

• Maryland came away with a methodical 72-62 victory over Ohio State Feb. 23, as **Anthony Cowan Jr.** scored 19 points and **Bruno Fernando** notched his 18th double-double of the season. Cowan has quickly returned to form over the last two games, averaging 18.0 points and shooting 8 of 14 from 3-pt (.571).

• According to NCAA.com, Maryland has played the 16th toughest schedule in the country and is expected to play the 13th toughest by regular season's end. The Terrapins have already surpassed their win total from last season despite boasting the third youngest team in the country (351 of 353) according to KenPom.com.

• Sophomore **Bruno Fernando** has recorded a double-double in nine of his last 10 games after posting 14 points and 10 rebounds against Ohio State. Fernando's 18 double-doubles on the season are tied for the fifth-most in program history and rank fifth nationally. A 19th double-double would tie Fernando with Buck Williams (1980-81) for fourth-most in program history.

• The Terrapins now rank 13th nationally in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to 39.2 percent shooting. Maryland has held four of its last five opponents under 37-percent, and ranked 19th overall in adjusted defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com.

• The Terps remain one of the best rebounding teams in the nation, ranking fourth in the country and first in the Big Ten Conference in rebound margin (+9.4). **Bruno Fernando** ranks second in the conference in rebounds/g (10.6), while Fernando and **Jalen Smith** combine for nearly six offensive rebounds/g.

• **Bruno Fernando** was named one of 10 players to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award list (top center), becoming the first Terp to be named to the list since its inception in 2015. Also on the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Midseason List, Fernando currently leads the Big Ten Conference (7th nationally) in field goal percentage (.651), ranks second in rebounds/g (10.6) and is fourth in blocks/g (1.9).

• Terp Tendencies: Maryland has won all 21 games it has played when leading with 5:00 to play; Maryland is 14-0 when holding opponents under 40-percent shooting; Maryland is 16-2 when **Jalen Smith** scores 10+ points.

2018-19 TERPS: BY THE NUMBERS

3: The Terps feature the third-youngest team in the NCAA according to KenPom - 351 out of 353. Of the eight players in the rotation, five are freshmen (53% of minutes).

5: The Terps have won five road games in-conference, including four by double-digits.

7: Maryland was predicted to finish seventh in the Big Ten Conference, and is currently in line for a double-bye in the Big Ten Tournament.

16: The Terps' strength of schedule is ranked 17th in the country to this point, and is projected to finish the regular season at 13th.

21: Maryland has won 21 games this season, already surpassing its win total from last season. It is on pace for the second-biggest turnaround in conference win total (Iowa).

21: According to KenPom, the Terrapins rank 18th nationally in defensive efficiency and 22nd in offensive efficiency. The only other programs that rank in the top-22 in both categories are: Virginia, Duke, Kentucky, Michigan State and North Carolina.

40: The Terrapins are on pace to average nearly 40 total rebounds for the season. It would be just the second time since 2004-05 a Maryland team averaged 40 rebounds/g. Conversely, Maryland opponents are averaging just 30.3 rebounds/g, a mark on pace for the fewest since 1985-86.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- Sophomore **Bruno Fernando** has secured 18 double-doubles in 28 games this season, which is tied for the 5th-most in Maryland single-season history (see chart right.)
- His 18 double-doubles rank fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten Conference behind Wisconsin's Jordan Murphy (19).
- The Luanda, Angola, native had a streak of seven consecutive double-doubles from Jan. 18 to Feb. 12, which was tied for the third-longest streak in program history.
- Fernando is averaging a double-double on the season with 14.4 points and 10.6 rebounds, while posting 13.8 points and 11.6 rebounds in 17 conference games.
- Fernando has joined Jordan Williams (2010-11) as the only players in the 21st century to record at least 15 double-doubles in a single-season for the Terps.

SECOND HALF COMEBACKS

- Maryland is 6-3 when trailing at halftime this season, including a 5-2 mark when behind at the half of Big Ten games.
- The Terps' most recent theatrics came against No. 12 Purdue on Feb. 12, when they trailed by eight at halftime in College Park before outscoring the Boilermakers by 22 points in the second half.
- The five wins when behind at half are the second most during Mark Turgeon's tenure at Maryland, while the five come-from-behind conference wins are the most-ever for a Terrapin team under Turgeon.

COWAN JOINS 1200-POINT CLUB

- Junior Anthony Cowan Jr. became the 35th 1200-point scorer in program history this season when the Bowie, Md. native eclipsed the milestone with an 18-point outburst against Illinois on Jan. 26.
- Cowan leads the Terrapins in scoring for the second straight season, and will continue to climb the all-time list as the season progresses.
- The 2018 Third Team All-Big Ten honoree averaged a team-best 15.8 points per game last season while leading the Big Ten in minutes per game (37.0).
- Cowan became the 46th Terrapin to finish with 500 points in a season last year, totaling 504 during his sophomore campaign. Cowan is one of three players under head coach Mark Turgeon to score 500 points in a season, joining Melo Trimble (568 – '14-'15 & 534 – '15-'16) and Terrell Stoglin (690 – '11-'12).
- The preseason All-Big Ten selection also finished as one of the league's most efficient free throw shooters, hitting 84.8% on his attempts (162-of-191) which ranked third in the B1G. Cowan got to the line better than almost anyone in college basketball last season, as he ranked fourth nationally among major-conference point guards in free-throw rate (56.8).

ROAD WARRIORS

- Maryland is 6-4 on the road this season, including a 5-4 mark in Big Ten Conference play.
- Four of Maryland's road victories have come by double-digit margins: Rutgers (14), Minnesota (15), Ohio State (14) and Nebraska (15).

GLASS MASTERS

- Maryland currently boasts one of the top rebounding teams in the country, ranking first in the Big Ten and fourth in the nation in rebounding margin (+9.4).
- Maryland has out-rebounded all but three teams so far this season, with Loyola-Chicago (-4), Michigan State (-2) and Iowa (-6) being the outliers.
- The Terps are led by the inside presence of sophomore Bruno Fernando (10.6/g) and freshman Jalen Smith (6.6/g). Both have been particularly effective on the offensive glass, with Fernando and Smith ranking inside the top-five in the Big Ten averaging nearly 6.0 per game combined.

FERNANDO FANTASTIC FROM THE FIELD

- Sophomore Bruno Fernando has established himself as one of the country's most efficient scorers this year, shooting 65.1% from the floor (151-of-232).
- Fernando's 65.1% shooting clip leads the Big Ten Conference and ranks seventh nationally. Fernando shot 59.2% from the field last season – good for sixth in the B1G.
- Fernando finished 8-for-8 from the floor in Maryland's win over Hofstra on November 16, marking just the 12th time in school history a player was perfect from the floor with at least eight attempts and the first since Sean Mosley was 8-of-8 against Longwood in 2010.
- Additionally, Fernando is near the top of the Big Ten in blocked shots per game (1.9 – 4th) and rebounding (10.6/g – 2nd).

STIX SINKS GAME-WINNER

- Freshman **Jalen Smith** made the biggest shot of his young Terrapin career against #24 Nebraska on January 2, sinking a driving layup with 3.8 seconds left to lift Maryland to a 74-72 win.
- It was the first last second game-winning shot by a Terp since Melo Trimble drilled a tiebreaking 3-pointer with 1.1 seconds left to deliver a 63-60 win for Maryland over Michigan State on March 4, 2017.
- Smith scored Maryland's final seven points in the win for Maryland – its first over a ranked team since February 6, 2016 over No. 18 Purdue (72-61).

SMITH IN RARE AIR AFTER DOUBLE-DOUBLE DEBUT

- Jalen Smith's double-double performance in his Maryland debut against Delaware on November 6 placed the Baltimore, Md. native in elite company for a Maryland freshman. Smith became the first Terrapin freshman to record a double-double in his debut since Buck Williams posted 10 points and 13 rebounds against Bucknell on November 24, 1978 in UMD's season opener.
- Additionally, Smith's 19 points were the most by a freshman in his Maryland debut since Joe Smith scored 26 in the Terps' season opener against Georgetown on November 26, 1993.
- Smith was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on November 12 for his efforts that week averaging 15.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in 25.0 minutes of action in the wins against Delaware and Navy. Smith is the first Maryland player to claim conference freshman of the week honors in the opening week of the season since Exree Hipp in 1992.

TERPS CELEBRATE 100TH SEASON IN 2018-19

- The University of Maryland basketball program will celebrate its 100th varsity season in 2018-19, and will honor the program's rich tradition and history with several initiatives throughout the year.
- Maryland played its first full varsity season in 1910-11, sporadically fielding teams over the next 11 years before returning to stay in 1923-24. During its storied history (thru 2017-18), the program has won 1,548 games, advanced to 27 NCAA tournaments and captured the 2002 National Championship.
- A commemorative 100 Seasons logo was unveiled in honor of the program's centennial season, which and is featured on the team's jerseys this year.

FERNANDO FIRED UP FOR SOPHOMORE SLATE

- Bruno Fernando elected to return for his sophomore season at Maryland after participating in the 2018 NBA Scouting Combine last spring.
- A rising sophomore, Fernando was named to the All-Big Ten Freshmen Team after a breakout first-year campaign on the court for the Terrapins. The Luanda, Angola native averaged 10.3 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game for the Terps, and was twice named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week during his rookie campaign. Fernando's 6.5 rebounds per game and 57.8% shooting percentage led all Big Ten freshmen, while his 1.2 blocks per game ranked third among all first year players in the conference.
- Fernando's electrifying dunks turned heads nationally throughout the year, with three of them earning a spot in the SportsCenter Top-10 from December to February. Fernando became the third Terp to be selected to the All-Freshmen team since Maryland joined the Big Ten in 2014-15.

FEROCIOUS FRESHMEN

- Mark Turgeon's highly lauded top-10 recruiting class has been as good as advertised this season, as Maryland's freshmen have accounted for more than 40% of the team's points, rebounds and assists. Jalen Smith is averaging double figures for the Terps, while Eric Ayala is second on the team in assists.
- Maryland currently plays one of the youngest lineups in the country, ranking 351st of 353 teams in KempPom's experience metric. Maryland has started at least two freshmen in 27-of-28 games this season, while three freshmen average over 24 minutes a game and five average at least 10 minutes a game.
- Additionally, Serrel Smith Jr. and Ricky Lindo Jr. have seen significant minutes for the Terps. Smith Jr. posted 11 points and two steals at Rutgers in a season-high 21 minutes. Lindo Jr. put together one of his most effective game of the season against NC A&T on November 12, finishing with seven rebounds, four assists and three steals. Only three other Terps since 2011 have recorded at least 7 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 steals in a game: Dez Wells, Anthony Cowan Jr. and Justin Jackson.

TERPS TAKE ITALY

- Maryland basketball experienced an once-in-a-lifetime Italian training tour this summer, spending eight days throughout the European country, which included stops in Rome, Florence, Venice and Como.
- The Terps went 3-0 in games against the Rome All-Stars, the Pisa All-Stars and the Netherlands National 'B' team, gaining valuable time together on the court before the start of the fall semester.
- The Terps had plenty of sightseeing opportunities during the trip, enjoying guided tours of the Coliseum, Roman Forum, Vatican City, and Florence. The travel party also had the opportunity to visit to the Ferrari Museum in Maranello, ride on Venice's famous gondolas and take in the breathtaking views of Lake Como.

Maryland 66, Penn State 59

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- Freshman Jalen Smith scored 16 points, Bruno Fernando had 12 points and 13 rebounds and No. 24 Maryland opened Big Ten play by slipping past Penn State 66-59 Saturday.

Anthony Cowan Jr. chipped in with 15 points, including two clutch 3s in the closing minutes. The last of those long-range jumpers, hoisted as the shot-clock expired, made it 64-59 with 34 seconds left.

Maryland (7-1, 1-0) held on to secure a bounce back victory following a 76-71 loss to No. 4 Virginia earlier in the week.

Penn State (4-3) simply couldn't handle the Terrapins' inside game. Fernando and Smith were dominant in the paint, Maryland finished with a 40-28 rebounding advantage and outscored the Nittany Lions 18-4 at the foul line.

Fernando became the first Terp to notch three straight double-doubles since Jordan Williams in 2011.

Maryland went up 47-39 with 12:53 left when Fernando sent an alley-oop pass to Smith for a dunk. As he headed the other way down the court, Fernando raised his arms and waved his hands, asking the crowd of 15,481 to cheer the Terps on. The enthusiasm waned when Penn State responded with a 9-0 run to move back in front.

Neither team could pull away, which was typical of this budding rivalry. Since Maryland joined the Big Ten, each of the seven games between the teams has been decided by seven points or less.

DRIESELL INDUCTED INTO NAISMITH HALL OF FAME

- The University of Maryland's legendary head coach Charles "Lefty" Driesell rose to his rightful place among the game's greats as he was formally enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 7.
- Heralded for his infectious coaching and recruiting ability, the legendary Driesell transcended the basketball community during his 41 seasons as a head coach, including 17 seasons at the University of Maryland from 1969 to 1986.
- Driesell amassed 786 wins, which ranked fifth among Division I head coaches when he retired in 2003. In 2007 Driesell was named to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. He is the only coach in Division I history to win at least 100 games at four different schools.

THE "MIDNIGHT MILE" RETURNS

- The Maryland basketball team celebrated the start of its 100th season with a nod to the program's past on Monday, October 15, when the team hosted the "Midnight Mile" at Kehoe Track & Field Complex on campus (Ludwig Field).
- Head coach Mark Turgeon spoke to the hundreds of students who flocked to Kehoe Track prior to the midnight run, thanking them for their support while recounting the origin of "Midnight Madness" under newly inducted Naismith Hall of Fame coach Lefty Driesell
- Maryland's players then ran a mile on the track alongside their classmates to a soundtrack of "Chariots of Fire" and "Eye of the Tiger". The event featured photos with the team, pizza, giveaways and a raffle for a road trip for one lucky student this season.

TERPS SURGIN' UNDER TURGEON

- Maryland head coach Mark Turgeon, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has a resume which features a myriad of outstanding accomplishments during his eight-plus seasons at Maryland:
 - The Terps are 83-26 the past three seasons, including a 24-9 mark in 2016-17
 - Posted its best start in school history (20-2) in 2016-17
 - Three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament in '15, '16 & '17
 - Maryland had a school-record 26 regular season wins in 2014-15
 - Terps boasted a 34-2 home record and a 17-1 mark in the B1G at XFINITY in 2014-15 and 2015-16
 - Maryland advanced to the Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2003

TURGEON, THE TERPS AND THE B1G

- Mark Turgeon has secured his 18th winning season in 21 years as a head coach, and extended his current streak of consecutive winning seasons to 16. Turgeon has 157 career wins coming into the 2018-19 season, with 157 coming at the helm of the Maryland program.
- Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns and the first three conference games of the 2005-06 season.
- Maryland has won 24 regular season games on six occasions in program history, including three of the past four seasons under Turgeon (26 regular season games in 2014-15 and 24 regular season games in 2015-16 and 2016-17). He guided Maryland to back-to-back 27-plus win seasons for the first time in program history (28 total wins in 2014-15, 27 total wins in 2015-16).

HAPPY HOLLIDAY!

- Maryland Sports Radio Network play-by-play announcer Johnny Holliday is in his 40th season of broadcasting Maryland basketball this season.
- In January of 2019, Holliday was named the state of Maryland's sports broadcaster of the year, marking his second time earning the award.
- Holliday has broadcast over 1,500 University of Maryland games during his Hall of Fame career, including 14 bowl games, 10 Sweet 16s two Final Fours and Maryland's 2002 National Championship.
- Holliday's famous "The kids have done it" call as Juan Dixon launched the ball into the rafters of the Georgia Dome as Maryland sealed its 64-52 win over Indiana in the National Championship remains ingrained in Maryland basketball lore to this day.
- Holliday's partner on the call Chris Knoche is also celebrating his 20th season as UMD's color analyst.

MARK TURGEON

428-247 (21ST SEASON) / 178-88 (8TH SEASON AT MARYLAND)

Mark Turgeon is entering his eighth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team after leading the Terrapins to seven straight winning seasons and three NCAA Tournaments during his tenure. Turgeon, who has won 24 or more games in four different

seasons with the Terrapins, won his 400th career game as a head coach and 150th game at the helm for Maryland on December 29, 2017 as the Terps secured a 66-45 victory over UMBC.

He has led three different programs to 12 postseason appearances, which includes the Terps advancing to their first Sweet 16 in 13 years in the 2015-2016 season. Turgeon signed a four-year contract extension through the 2022-23 season on Oct. 27, 2016.

In his first seven seasons at Maryland, Turgeon has compiled a 157-81 (.660) record. He recorded the most wins for a head coach in his first five years in program history (114). Turgeon won 79 games during a three-season span from 2014 to 2017, the second-most wins during a three-year period in school history. He is the first coach in Maryland history to lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons. Turgeon also had the Terrapins ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10. Maryland had previously not been ranked in the top-10 since Feb. 3, 2003, a span of 12 seasons.

Under Turgeon, Maryland has also thrived in its first four seasons as members of the Big Ten Conference, earning three top-3 finishes and compiling a 46-26 (.639) conference record. Turgeon's teams boast a 28-8 home record in conference play, including a perfect 9-0 mark in its inaugural season. He was named the 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Since taking over the program in 2011-12, Turgeon's Terrapins have amassed a 107-22 (.790) home record overall, while recording the most consecutive wins at home in program history (27) from Dec. 6, 2015 - Feb. 13, 2016. Maryland has amassed a 62-10 (.861) mark in home games since joining the Big Ten in 2014-15, tied for the second highest home win percentage in the conference during that stretch.

Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns and the first three conference games of the 2005-06 season.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 17 of his 20 seasons, including a current streak of 16 consecutive winning seasons. The Terps won 27 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history during the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

In 2016-17 Turgeon led Maryland to a 24-9 record, with an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its aforementioned third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Under Turgeon's direction the 2015-16 team finished with 27 victories and featured five All-Big Ten performers en route to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Terrapins also led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in attendance in 2015-16, averaging 17,863 fans per game.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 regular season wins and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament in 2014-15.

Turgeon's winning percentage of .600 (42-28) was the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons, ahead of Bud Millikan (.592) and Gary Williams (.574). After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, he led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the

Year in both 2010 and 2011.

In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

Turgeon has developed eight former players into the NBA: Gal Mekel (formerly of the Dallas Mavericks and New Orleans Pelicans), Donald Sloan (formally of the Brooklyn Nets), Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Alex Len (Phoenix Suns), Jake Layman (Portland Trailblazers), Diamond Stone (formally of the Los Angeles Clippers) and Kevin Huerter (Atlanta Hawks).

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92).

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Head coach Mark Turgeon announced the addition of Matt Brady as the director of player personnel for the Maryland men's basketball program on July 10, 2017. Brady was elevated to the role of assistant coach in June of 2018 prior to his second season on staff for the Terrapins.

Brady, who has nearly 30 years of experience as a coach at the Division I level, including 12 as a head coach, comes to Maryland after serving as an assistant coach at La Salle the past season. Brady will be reunited with Maryland assistant coach Bino Ranson, who was an assistant under Brady while at Marist.

"Matt is a very accomplished head coach and assistant who under his leadership and direction led various basketball programs to unprecedented heights during his tenure," Turgeon said. "His proven track record in player development and his experience as a head coach at the Division I level will greatly benefit our staff and student-athletes. Matt will make a seamless transition to our staff and we are very excited to welcome him to our basketball program."

Prior to La Salle, Brady was the head coach at James Madison for eight seasons, racking up 139 wins, including four seasons with 20 or more victories. In 2013, he led the Dukes to a CAA Championship and an NCAA Tournament bid. He also guided the Dukes to three additional postseason appearances and the 2015 CAA regular season title.

Brady was recognized as State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors in 2013 following his NCAA Tournament campaign and was also tabbed District 10 Co-Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches

Brady inherited a JMU program that finished last in the conference in scoring, field goal and three-point percentage in 2007. The following season, Brady had the Dukes atop the conference in all three statistical categories. While at JMU, Brady coached 10 all-CAA players and four all-district honorees. Brady mentored three of the top 10 scorers in program history as well as three of the top 10 three-point shooters.

Prior to leading the program at James Madison, Brady was the head coach at Marist for four seasons from 2004-08 where compiled a 73-50 record with the Red Foxes and improved their win total during each of his first three seasons with the team. Marist set a program record for wins during its 25-9 season in 2006-07 when Brady was the MAAC and New York City-area coach of the year. Marist had dramatic statistical improvements under his direction, ranking in the top three in the 10-team MAAC in overall field goal percentage, three-point percentage and three-pointers per game during each of his four seasons. While at Marist, Brady mentored MAAC Player of the Year Jared Jordan, who was a two-time NCAA Division I assists champion and the 45th overall choice in the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Clippers.

A 1987 Siena graduate and a native of Haddon Heights, N.J., Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons at Rhode Island (1987-89), Wagner (1989-93) and Saint Joseph's (1993-04).

While Brady was at Saint Joseph's, the Hawks appeared in the NCAA Tournament four times, the NIT three times and won four Big 5 championships and three Atlantic 10 titles.

Saint Joseph's was 27-0 during the regular season in 2003-04, earned a No. 1 national ranking and a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament, ultimately reaching the Elite Eight. Brady was involved in recruiting several of the top players in Saint Joseph's history, including 2004 National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West, an honorable mention Associated Press All-America selection. Nelson, who was selected in the first round of the 2004 NBA Draft and has gone on to play 12 seasons in the NBA, continues to be mentored and trained by Brady during his offseason.

As a player at Siena, Brady appeared in 114 career games, including 92 as a starter. He completed his career as the program's all-time assists leader (593), and he was inducted into the school's hall of fame in 1993. For his career he accumulated 1,106 points (9.7 points per game) and was a 45.9 percent shooter from the field.

Brady was a standout at Paul VI High School in Haddon (N.J.) Township and was named to the 1980s South Jersey All-Decade Team. He was enshrined in the Camden County Sports Hall of Fame in 2012. Brady and his wife Mary have three sons, Logan - who is a freshman at Maryland - and twins Cole and Griffin.

Maryland men's basketball head coach Mark Turgeon announced the hiring of Kevin Broadus as an assistant coach with the program on April 21, 2017. He enters his second season with the Terps in 2018-19.

Broadus has made an immediate impact for Maryland on the recruiting trail, bringing in Serrel Smith Jr. and Ricky Lindo in 2018 to bolster a top-10 recruiting class for head coach Mark Turgeon.

He also played a lead role in the recruitment of Makhel and Makhi Mitchell for the class of 2019, securing the signing of the four star twin forwards. Makhel was rated as an ESPN and Rivals Top-100 player for the class of 2019.

Broadus most recently spent nine years at Georgetown and brings more than 20 years of coaching and recruiting experience to Maryland. Georgetown won three Big East championships and advanced to seven postseason tournaments in his nine years with the Hoyas, including a trip to the Final Four in 2007.

Broadus has coached and recruited five high school All-Americans and 12 NBA players during his coaching career, including Kevin Huerter, Jeff Green, Roy Hibbert, Vernon Macklin, DeJuan Summers, Patrick Ewing, Jr., Otto Porter, Chris Wright, Henry Sims, J.R. Pinnock, Pops Mensah-Bonsu, and Mike Hall. Known as a strong recruiter with outstanding local ties, Broadus has coached at five universities in the metro area.

Broadus played college basketball at Bowie State University, where he graduated from in 1990. Upon graduation, Broadus remained at Bowie State as an assistant coach until 1993, before serving as an assistant at the University of the District of Columbia for four seasons. While coaching at UDC, he earned a master's degree in counseling in 1995. Broadus also had coaching stints at American University (1998-2001) and George Washington University (2001) before landing at Georgetown in 2004.

A native of the Washington D.C. region, Broadus played high school basketball at Dunbar in the District and Montgomery Blair in Silver Spring, Md. He began his collegiate career redshirting his freshman year at Grambling State before returning home to attend Bowie State, where he lettered three years and earned a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1990.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Broadus spent two seasons as the head coach at Binghamton University from 2007-2009, leading the Bearcats to the NCAA Tournament in 2009, and worked as a summer camp coach and counselor for both the Philadelphia 76ers and the New York Knicks. Orlando "Bino" Ranson was hired as an assistant coach at Maryland in the summer of 2010 and is now entering his ninth season in College Park, including the eighth on the staff of head coach Mark Turgeon. During his time with Turgeon, Ranson and the Terps have collected 157 wins.

Ranson played a major part in helping lead the Terps to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the Sweet Sixteen during the 2015-16 season. It marked the Terps' longest run in the NCAA Tournament since 2003. In the 2015-16 season, Maryland started 15-1 – the best start in program history and finished the campaign with a 27-9 overall record No. 12 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

"Bino has done an outstanding job in identifying and developing talented basketball players," said Turgeon. "He has strong connections throughout the country and helped expand our recruiting area during our transition to the Big Ten. Bino has worked hard and has developed into a very good coach."

The Terps won 79 games between the 2014-15 through 2016-17 seasons, adding up to the second-most wins in school history over a three-year span. Ranson has helped lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons, while the Terrapins were also ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10.

In their inaugural season in the Big Ten (2014-15), Ranson and the Terrapins posted a school record 26 regular season wins en route to advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Ranson played a major role in helping Maryland sign five consecutive top-25 recruiting classes in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. Ranson was critical in helping Maryland secure a top-10 recruiting class in 2018, leading the recruiting efforts to sign five-star McDonald's All-American Jalen Smith out of Mount Saint Joseph's High School in Baltimore. In addition, Ranson directed the recruiting efforts for Darryl Morsell from the class of 2017, a four-star recruit out of Mount Saint Joseph's.

In 2016, Ranson led the recruiting efforts for consensus four-star forward Justin Jackson, who was selected in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft before signing with the Orlando Magic. Jackson played high school basketball at national power Findlay Prep as a junior before finishing his high school career at Hill Academy in Ontario, where he was named a First Team All-Star in the Ontario Scholastics Basketball Association. He was also a member of the Canadian U-19 national team that participated at the 2015 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

Ranson has strong ties to the Baltimore-Washington area, having coached for two seasons at St. Frances Academy in Baltimore.

He came to Maryland after one season as an assistant at Xavier, during which the Musketeers went 26-9 and reached the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. In his lone season on the staff of Maryland head coach Gary Williams in 2010-11, the Terrapins went 19-14. Ranson has had a winning season in each of his 11 seasons as an assistant coach.

He spent two years as an administrative assistant at Loyola University on the staff of long-time Maryland assistant and current Siena head coach Jimmy Patsos.

Prior to Xavier, Ranson was an assistant coach at James Madison for one season, helping the Dukes to a 21-15 mark, the most wins by JMU in a season since 1992-93. The Dukes advanced in the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for the first time since 2003 and their berth in the College Insiders.com Tournament marked their first postseason appearance since 1994.

Ranson also worked for Matt Brady at Marist University for three seasons. The Red Foxes were 62-33 in those three seasons and won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season in 2007. That season, Marist won at Oklahoma State in the Postseason NIT. Ranson coached under current Maryland assistant Matt Brady during his stops at Marist and JMU.

Considered an outstanding recruiter, he helped bring in excellent classes at James Madison, Marist and Xavier. Ranson helped land Jay Gavin at Marist, who went on to become the MAAC Rookie of the Year.

Ranson coached at St. Frances Academy for two seasons before joining the Loyola staff. He handled St. Frances' junior-varsity program, directing the 2003-04 team to a 24-5 record, titles in the MIAA and the Baltimore Catholic League. He also founded Team Baltimore, one of the top AAU programs in the Northeast.

Among the players Ranson worked with at the AAU level are Sean Mosley and Juan Dixon of Maryland, Ricky Harris of Massachusetts, Jermaine Dixon of Pittsburgh and Donte Greene of Syracuse.

A 1999 graduate of Southern New Hampshire with a B.S. in sports management, Ranson completed his collegiate career as one of the top players in the history of the school. He ranked seventh in career scoring (1,899 points), fifth in assists (598) and fourth in 3-point field goals (226) after lettering for four seasons. He was inducted into the school's hall of fame in January 2007.

Ranson and his wife, Shannon, have two sons; BJ and Bradshaw.

Mark Bialkoski was elevated to the role of director of basketball operations in June of 2018 after serving three seasons as the program's video coordinator.

"Mark is very deserving of this promotion, as he's been a great addition to our staff and program over the past three years," said

head coach Mark Turgeon. "He's a tireless worker who is very committed to our team, and will continue to play a major role in our day-to-day activities. Mark has a promising future ahead of him in this business, and we're excited to reward him for his dedication and commitment to Maryland basketball."

In 2016-17, Maryland finished with a 24-9 record, an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In his first season at Maryland, the Terps won 27 games, finished No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2003. Bialkoski spent three seasons as the Charlotte 49ers director of basketball operations. Prior to serving as the director of operations, he spent three years (2009-12) as a program assistant and a graduate manager with the 49ers men's basketball program.

In his three seasons on the staff, the 49ers captured the Great Alaska Shootout and Puerto Rico Tip-Off titles and reached the Charleston Classic championship game. The 49ers defeated No. 10 Butler on the road as well in 2013. The 49ers won 52 games, including a 21 wins season in 2013 which marked the program's first 20 wins season since 2007-08. With another winning season in 2014, the 49ers posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2007. Charlotte made its first postseason tournament appearance since 2008 with an NIT appearance in 2013.

During the 2012-13 season, Bialkoski played a major role in helping set up the first annual Military Appreciation game (the Georgia Southern game) where the 49ers were able to raise over \$600 for military personnel.

As Director of Operations, Bialkoski helped with team travel, budgeting, scheduling and academic support as well as helping run the Alan Major Basketball Camps. In the fall of 2013, the Niners men's basketball team achieved its highest semester grade point average in program history.

While as a program assistant and graduate manager at Charlotte, Bialkoski did advance opponents scouting, assisted in scheduling, and managed all video related tasks for the coaching staff in addition to designing and developing the first Charlotte 49ers Men's Basketball Newsletter. Bialkoski facilitated all pre- and post-game practice set-up, created recruiting mail-outs and was a key resource to all basketball operational functions.
